River Cats Host Giants as Baseball Season has Arrived

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Spring Training came and went in the blink of an eye for a San Francisco Giants organization determined to make another playoff run. In what has been a busy offseason full of big moves for the club, anticipation and expectations are high.

For the second time ever, the Giants broke camp and headed home – but not to San Francisco, rather Sacramento. The River Cats hosted their big league club in what was a welcoming Saturday afternoon for both players and fans.

Fans tailgated and lined up outside Raley Field early, knowing that it was their best opportunity to catch their favorite players in such an intimate setting. During batting practice Giants players took the time to sign autographs down the right field line for a large group of diehards with Brandon Belt, Hunter Pence, Brandon Crawford and Pablo Sandoval leading the way.

day was talk of the recent injury of ace Madison Bumgarner, who suffered a broken hand from a line drive just one day prior during his final spring tune up. Manager Bruce Bochy addressed the media before the game, broaching the subject that was on everyone's mind.

"It's looking like a couple of months, give or take," said the Giants manager. "Surgery went well." Bumgarner, who suffered an injured shoulder and missed three months last season after a dirt bike accident, was looking like a man with something to prove this spring. "He looked as good as I'd seen him," said a solemn Bochy, who is already down both Bumgarner and starter Jeff Samardzija to begin the season.

But the Giants manager also had some positive things to say about his ace's absence. "I feel good about this club and their ability to handle something like this." Bochy's timetable of an early June Bumgarner return is earlier than initial reports.

As for the rest of the team, the The only downer during the resurgence of Pablo Sandoval

has been one of the biggest stories out of camp. As of Sunday, Sandoval is hitting .314 with four homers and 17 RBIs this spring. "Same old Pablo," Bochy told the media. "Unfortunately we took the bus from San Francisco and had to hear Pablo singing the whole ride."

The additions of Andrew McCutchen and Evan Longoria along with the resurgence of Sandoval and a healthy roster of familiar faces put the Giants in a great position as they head into the regular season.

On the River Cats side of things, Mac Williamson is one of the biggest names who didn't make the big league roster. Williamson tore it up this spring, hitting .318 with four homers and 14 RBIs. But the rejuvenated 27-year-old found himself in a consists of Hunter Pence, newly

crowded outfield that already acquired McCutchen and Austin Jackson plus veterans Gregor

Blanco, Gorkys Hernandez and possibly rookie Steven Duggar. For a team that could hardly put together enough beating hearts for an outfield a season ago, a crowded one isn't a bad thing.


It should be an exciting season for both clubs as they have rosters full of talent – especially offensively. One of the newest River Cats, Saint Mary's High School and College alum Kyle Jensen, has already left his mark, going yard yet again on Saturday. The first baseman is hitting .333 with five home runs and 10 RBIs this spring. Formerly of the Reno Aces, where he hit 30 homers and drove in 120 runs in 2016, Jensen spent last season playing in Japan before coming home and signing with the Giants

organization. The Giants jump right into the thick of things, opening up their regular season in Los Angeles with a four game set against the Dodgers beginning March 29. Their home opener is Tuesday, April 3 as they host the Seattle Mariners in interleague play.

The River Cats start the season on the road against the Tacoma Rainiers on April 5. Their home opener will be against the Reno Aces on Tuesday, April 10.





Early Morning House Fire in Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Early Morning House Fire in Rancho Cordova Sacramento County, CA - Just after 5:30 the morning of March 25, Metro Fire crews were dispatched to house fire on the 2200 block of Maxine Way in Rancho Cordova. First arriving crews reported heavy fire coming from multiple sides of the house and initiated fire attack. Multiple hoselines were used to control the fire, while additional crews performed a search for

Two victims were located with significant burn injuries. One of the first two arriving units was a Metro Fire Suppression Ambulance, with Firefighter/Paramedics operating on an additional hoseline. Once the victims were located, the Ambulance crew quickly began patient care, and transported the most critical victim. An additional ambulance arrived on scene to transport the other

A total of twenty-eight firefighters worked to extinguish the fire and ensured seven occupants were safely evacuated. Arson investigators responded to the scene; the cause is currently





Unsung Heroes Receive Praise

SACRAMENTO REGION. CA (MPG) - Lisa Daniels thought she knew the grandmother who raised her in Fresno. In college, she had to to write a biography of a loved one. She discovered "Gram" (Rita Hernandez) was part of a civilian force that had rivetted the aircraft carrier Franklin D. Roosevelt. "Gram always had great stories," says Daniels. "But I never knew she'd served in WWII."

"I wanted more information about African American war contribution. I was baffled by limited recourses and set out to gather as many first-hand accounts as I could." Her mission taught Daniels (now 53) that many thousands of veterans are unsung heroes. "Most mainstream wartime stories don't include the African American experience," she explains. "I'm trying to get that on record. My work provides a platform for those who were not given a voice. My father, Milton Daniels, served in Vietnam. He's been encouraged by the stories I've heard. He's finally finding the strength to open up about his experiences."

Eighteen years ago, his daughter founded the Unsung Heroes Living History Project. As of today she has archived narratives and pictures from the Civil War, the Spanish-American War and from all 20th and 21st century theaters. Such research is gaining nationwide traction; Last year, Daniels

partnered with Indiana University Southeast in a project where students collected veteran narratives. During African American History Month (February) Daniels presented the "We Also Served" exhibition at Rancho Cordova Library. She also exhibited 50 pictures for basketball audiences at Golden 1 Arena. During the Kings/ Lakers game, the home team presented the curator with the Sacramento Kings Dream Award. "Afterwards, people were reaching out to shake my hand," she said. "Their appreciation was a testament: we all have a story. As time goes on, we'll all grow to appreciate each other."

Daniels' day job is in management of Capitol Heights Academy, Sacramento. After hours, she photographs veterans and gathers memorabilia. Many gems come from family sources. "I'm humbled - as a total stranger - to be welcomed into homes and have families share with me," she said. "I now see the military as extended family. I've adopted every person I've interviewed. I

check up on them constantly."

Important history has come word-ofmouth from WW II survivors. Though trained as a nurse, Sacramento resident Odessa Taylor was assigned to the US Army 6888 Postal Delivery Battalion in 1944. First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt lobbied for black women to have meaningful wartime roles so Odessa and 850 Women's Army Corps recruits were dispatched to Europe. In harsh conditions, they worked around the clock to clear months - even years - of backlogged troop mail. Heroines in England and France, they got handshakes from Queen Elizabeth; they were feted in luxury after a triumphant march through Paris. Returning Stateside, no battalion medals awaited. Official recognition of their value to allied morale waited until

"Odessa Taylor has since passed on," concludes the historian. "Telling her story pays homage to her and others who served. In earlier times, many of these people fought on two fronts. They were honored overseas for what they did fighting for us. Then they came home to mistreatment."

Daniels feels the exhibition provides a vehicle to discuss the impact of African Americans in the military. "It's great when people come in off the street, see the pictures and tell stories that give them pride and identity," she said. "It's also an opportunity for conversation about as us, as a collective people. We're all part of the American fabric."

Time to Rethink the Renewable Fuel Standard

Commentary by Merrill Matthews

Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Scott Pruitt thinks U.S. refiners are forced to blend too much ethanol into their gasoline.

If ever a federal program has outlived its usefulness, it's the government's support for

In 2005, Congress passed the Energy Policy Act, creating the Renewable Fuel Standard. The RFS requires nearly all gasoline to be mixed with ethanol, which is mostly corn-based and increasingly includes other biofuels.

The law mandated that 4 billion gallons of ethanol be mixed into gasoline beginning in 2006. Congress expanded that mandate when it passed the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007, requiring a minimum of 36 billion gallons of ethanol to be mixed into gasoline by the year 2022.

But problems emerged.

To begin with, Congress required a significant increase in cellulosic biofuels -- made from switchgrass and other organic substances. However, the industry had trouble keeping up with the targeted productions of advanced biofuels.

Second, the economic recession, along with more fuel-efficient cars, meant that gasoline usage remained relatively flat for several years,

rather than growing as Congress had anticipated.

Normally, lower-thanexpected gasoline usage would have been considered good news. However, to meet the congressionally imposed mandate requiring more ethanol, refiners would have to increase the percentage of ethanol per gallon of gasoline, which was usually capped around 10 percent and referred to as the "blend wall."

And that predicament led to the third problem. Higher blend levels could harm older car engines, as car manufacturers repeatedly warned.

Then there's a fourth problem, which Pruitt highlighted in his recent comments: The mandate's impact on refiners.

Refiners that don't meet their goal of mixing ethanol have to buy a type of credit, known as RINs, which can be very costly.

For example, the management consulting company McKinsey & Co. recently reported, "For refiners this [the credits] translated into an additional cost of operations of \$3-4/barrel of crude processed. ... For example, Valero energy has projected annual spend on RINs in 2016 could total \$850 million."

In other words, refiners may be out hundreds of millions of dollars complying with federal regulations. Pruitt thinks the RFS program needs to be reformed and he is absolutely right.

It won't be easy. The vast majority of U.S. ethanol is made

from corn. And Iowa, the first state up in the presidential election primary process, is one of our biggest corn producers. And so the ethanol industry works to ensure that every potential presidential candidate is a strong supporter of ethanol and the

But times change. The reasons for creating the RFS -- declining U.S. crude oil production and the belief that ethanol was more environmentally friendly -- no longer apply.

Innovative drilling techniques, which really began to take off about the time Congress created the RFS, have made the U.S. the largest producer of crude oil and natural gas in the world. Production is rising, not falling as it was in the 1970s.

In addition, many environmentalists now question whether ethanol is that much cleaner than gasoline, given all of the fuel and water it takes to grow, harvest, transport and process corn into ethanol -- not to mention its impact on the price of corn.

In short, even if the reasons for subsidizing and mandating the use of ethanol were once true, not anymore. Scott Pruitt is right that it's time to reconsider the Renewable Fuel Standard, regardless of who that angers.

Defendant Convicted for Attacking, Robbing Elderly Veteran

CASE: Benjamin Tremper (Case #16FE021740) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Frederick Gotha, Domestic Violence Unit

DATE: March 5, 2018

Benjamin Tremper was convicted by a jury of first-degree robbery with an elderly victim enhancement, and first-degree burglary with the allegation the victim was home at the time. Tremper's five prior strikes and a 5-year prison prior were also found true.

The 88-year-old victim, who is a Marine veteran, lived in a 24-hour staffed elder housing complex in Citrus Heights. On November 15, 2016, he got up to use the bathroom. When he returned to his room, he noticed his blinds had been tampered with and the sliding glass door was open. When the victim went down the hallway to investigate, he was attacked by the stronger, larger Benjamin Tremper. The victim and Tremper struggled, but Tremper was able to force the victim to the ground. Tremper told the victim to stay on the ground as he went looking around the victim's room, stealing his personal items. The victim was able to sneak into a bathroom and pull an "emergency lanyard" to summon staff for help. When staff responded, Tremper fled but was later apprehended.

Tremper has five 2005 strike convictions for four robberies and a carjacking. His criminal history also includes convictions for solicitation of murder, assault with a deadly weapon, burglary and vehicle thefts.

He faces a maximum sentence of 50 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 27, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Russell Hom.

Gang Member Convicted of Possessing Firearm, Enhancements

DATE: March 6, 2018

CASE: Deandre Rogers (Case #16FE023618) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Kristen Andersen, Targeting Armed Recidivist Gang Enforcement Team (TARGET)

Deandre Rogers was convicted by a jury of being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true a personal arming allegation and gang enhancement.

On December 14, 2016, a video was released Honorable Helena Gweon.

on YouTube showing Deandre Rogers rapping, disrespecting rival gang members, promoting his own gang and holding apparent real firearms. On December 15, 2016, officers conducted surveillance on Rogers, a known G-Mobb and Starz gang member. Officers followed Rogers to a restaurant and watched him get into the back of a vehicle. When they pulled the vehicle over, they located a Glock 21 with 17 rounds loaded in it. They also located a Glock 27 loaded with 12 rounds in another vehicle Rogers was seen accessing.

In 2016, Rogers was convicted of assault with a firearm and carrying a concealed firearm in a vehicle with a gang enhancement. The prosecution will present evidence of the truth of those convictions to the court at Judgment and

Rogers faces a maximum sentence of 34 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 6, 2018, at 11:00 a.m. in Department 12 before the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard.

Defendant Convicted for Sexually Assaulting 79-Year-Old Woman



Dustin Todd Smith was convicted by a jury of forcible rape and forcible oral copulation. The jury found true allegations the victim was 65 years of age or older and the offense was committed during the commission of a burglary on both charges. Smith was also convicted of assault with intent to commit mayhem, rape, sodomy, oral copulation.

The victim is a widow who was living alone. Smith was 31 years old and lived around the corner from the victim. The morning of the victim's 79th birthday, Smith broke into her house and entered her bedroom while she was asleep. When he pulled the sheets off of the victim, she woke up and screamed. She struggled with Smith, but he overpowered her and proceeded to sexually assault her. The victim suffered injuries from the attack. Video surveillance and DNA evidence linked Smith to the assault. He later stated he had been watching the victim for at least 10 years.

Smith faces a maximum sentence of 59 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 6, 2018, at 11:00 am in Department 41 before the


This is an even numbered where they want to play him in the field. I'm hoping the Giants can get him in a trade.)

Since I realized this was happening, I've been reading your books and learning how to manage my own money. I don't know how to deal with this situation with her, though. She admits she did wrong, but says she can't pay it back. Can you help?

Dear Alan, I hate hearing this. There's Dave Says

no easy way to deal with these kinds of situations.

The first thing you need to do is take over complete and total control of all your finances. Shut down any accounts that have her name on them, and anything else financially-related that she can access. I know this sounds harsh, but she has proven she's just not trustworthy. It's a hard thing to hear about a parent, but at this point you've got to take steps to protect yourself. What she has been doing is theft, and financial child abuse.


One extreme is to press criminal charges. The other extreme is to just forget it, and pay it. In between is a promise from her to repay everything she has taken, but she's already out of control. That's a promise that wouldn't be kept. The problem with prosecuting someone criminally for this type of action — other than the emotional toll, because she's your mom — is the money's already gone. It's doesn't make them magically have the money to repay you. On top of all this, you'd have a really hard time legally getting the student loans removed from your name due to theft.

Honestly, under the circumstances I think you're probably going to end up eating this. But sit down, and try to have a calm, clear discussion about what has happened, and why it happened. Let her know first, without a doubt, that you will criminally prosecute her if she ever uses your name to put money into her own pocket again. Second, tell her you're prepared to forgive her and forget about it - and she pays you back at some point, if she can — if she agrees to get some financial and emotional counseling.

Try to get her some help, and get her under control, Alan. If you don't, I'm afraid things are only going downhill from here.





Grounded In Tradition

Hi Coffee Brewing Up Old-School Café Culture

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Coffee, or rather the art of enjoying it, says Anna Hovakimyan, has been watered down to a gulp-and-go experience. So she and her husband, Ara, are trying to do something about that.

Last April the couple, she, a former medical assistant, he, a construction worker and carpenter recovering from a motorcycle accident and needing a plan B, opened Hi Coffee in the retail complex at Olson and Zinfandel drives in Rancho Cordova. You won't hear many loud "no-foam, double shot, extra vanilla" descriptors being bellowed out with orders here. This is coffee culture Armenian style.

In fact "Hi" is a play on *Hayastantsi*, which translates as *Armenian*. In addition to traditional brews, lattes, iced coffee drinks, artisan teas, chai and matcha smoothies, you'll want to try, must try the Hi Coffee. This is the house specialty. It consists of Arabica beans ground finer than espresso and hot water. These two ingredients are put inside a *jazzve*, a small copper pouring cup with a long wooden handle and the *jazzye* is then buried just to the brim in a bed of hot sand until the contents come to a roiling boil—an old-school brewing technique dating back centuries in Arabic, Turkish and Armenian cultures, among others.

"This isn't Starbucks. We do it slowly here," said Hovakimyan. "As a society, we've kind of gotten into gulping. Coffee is meant to be enjoyed, sipped slowly and, even better, done so with a group of friends or family, not pounding down on the run or in the car."

Hi Coffee, by the way, is the recipient of the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce's Best in Business Rising Star Award for 2017. Not bad for a small, non-traditional mom-andpop shop that's taken big risks by bucking local cultural trends in favor of old-world traditions.

A Hi-Coffee takes three to four minutes to brew in the hot sand and it's worth every minute of the wait. The finished brew is dark, but not bitter. You'll get about half of it poured into a tiny cup resting on a white saucer with a packet of sugar, a dark chocolate Ghirardelli square, a spoon and your *jazzve* with the remaining coffee for you to pour in at your leisure.

"You sip it, you enjoy it, and you add more of the coffee to your cup as you are ready," says Hovakimyan. "You can add the sugar or not, but then you have to follow it with the great taste of dark chocolate. That is how it is meant to be enjoyed."

Hi Coffee also serves up small plates including salads, beef and potato piroshkies, blintzes and more than a dozen artisan pastries, including traditional Armenian sweets, such as baklava and honey cake.

It takes a lot of, well, let's call it "confidence" to open up a stand-alone coffee shop in a shopping complex, with a Starbucks and or Peets likely within less than a quarter mile away. But you get more here than just coffee and a place to plug in a laptop. Cozy, high-backed booths provide space for intimate gatherings with friends or family, or they can be put end-to-end for large groups. The burlap covered walls and pendant lighting, coupled with local artwork on display, which rotates monthly, give off a warm ambiance.

There are a handful of standard wood tables and chairs up front, and a table with a working puzzle that changes weekly.

"I have regular customers who come in and don't even order," said Hovakimyan. "They just come in, sit down and work on the puzzle."

Anna and Ara invested roughly \$60,000 in start-up costs and have a staff of four part time workers.

"We budgeted for about half of that, but at every step there is one more thing you have to do," said Hovakimyan.

With time, word has spread about Hi Coffee's unique menu and there are many

regulars, several from the local Armenian diaspora, among others, who come for a taste and feel of familiar customs and traditions.

"This is place for everyone, but we make coffee the way many of our European and Slavic customers are used to having it made," Hovakimyan said.

Hovakimyan has also opened up the space to local groups, such as health and beauty experts, crafters and card making clubs, and she's hoping to expand opportunities to service clubs and organizations for meetings and small events. Also, once business is on more solid footing, she'd like to add a fully-operational kitchen and begin offering fine dining options.

"I imagine doing a multi-cultural menu that changes every day," said Hovakimyan. "We could use something like that here."

In time, as business builds, the couple would like to duplicate their efforts and expand beyond Rancho Cordova.

"I would like to start a Hi Coffee chain of stores eventually," said Hovakimyan. "We'll see. First a kitchen here, then more coffee out there"

Food For Seniors

Gov. Brown is a champion of his over budget crazy train to nowhere while senior citizens suffer from lack of food. His train is more important than people in California.

Brown's pet project started out as a \$9.5 billion bond project sold to voters in 2008. A project that has increased to over \$77 billion according to news reports I have recently read and which say may actually cost \$98 or more if it's ever completed in 2033.

While the crazy train is clanking along, over the last ten years the percentage of senior citizen's population age of 60 and older that faces food insecurity has increased by 45 percent according to a report by the National Foundation to End Senior Hunger. The report was written by James P. Zilak, director of the Center for Poverty at the University of Kentucky, and Craig Gunderson, professor of agricultural strategy at the University of Illinois.

Studies show that the percent of older adults in California facing the threat of hunger is 16.33%. California has the eleventh highest rate of senior food insecurity in the nation.

According to the World Health Organization "mal-nutrition can lead to loss of weight and strength, greater susceptibility to disease, confusion, diabetes, osteo-porosis, stroke, and cancer. And malnutrition also leads to increased visits to emergency rooms, increased lengths of hospital stays, and discharges from hospitals to convalescent hospitals and the associated much higher costs.

Did you know an additional \$17 million a year in increased funding for senior citizen's nutrition programs in California would provide for an extra 2 million meals per year, and serve over 12,500 more older Californians in their homes or at congregate meals sites?

Seniors get one meal per day and each meal supplies about 1/3 of the daily nutritional needs of seniors, but one-third is still just one-third. Seniors don't get all the fruits and vegetables they need, nor the protein and the dietary fiber that are critical to good health.

But Gov. Brown's crazy train is more important than the senior's citizens living healthy lives in California and that's why it gets so much more money.

While Fresno County is the number one agricultural county in the nation and California is the number one agricultural state in the nation, no one, and I mean no one in California, should go hungry regardless of age!

Food is much more important than Brown's crazy train to our citizens. Food is more cost-effective than hospitalizations or placement in a skilled nursing facility. Food can improve the quality of life for our senior citizens.

A budget augmentation of \$17 million to Senior Nutrition Programs by the State Legislature will send a clear message that California does care about promoting good health and well-being for everyone, rather than putting seniors in convalescent hospitals or cemeteries. ★
