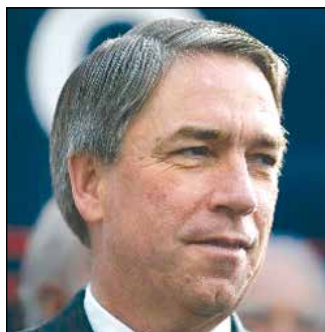

In 2011 Diann Rogers was hired to serve as president and CEO of the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce. She previously served as senior vice president for the Folsom chamber's government relations

committee. Since taking over, membership has grown by roughly 30 percent. Her strategy? Fine-tuning programs to meet members' needs, creating inter-chamber events, fostering member-to-member collaborations and ramping up legislative advocacy work at the state and federal levels.

Q: What is the chamber's current membership and how has that changed under your leadership?

A: We currently have approximately 450 active members. When I took over as chamber president, we had roughly 380 members. Now, it is really

important that people understand the numbers are always evolving.

Q: How many members sit on your board of directors?

A: Our bylaws allow between 12 and 25 and we currently have 20. Everyone contributes

City ADA Improvement Project is Underway

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Every year, the City of Rancho Cordova's Public Works Department completes a number of construction projects in our community. These projects beautify Rancho Cordova and ensure the City has walkable, connected neighborhoods and safe routes for residents, bikers, and drivers. You can visit the online Projects in Your Community tour or Public Works Achievement tour to see projects that are under construction, ongoing, completed, and planned by visiting www.cityofranhocordova.org/government/public-works/plans-and-projects

The City of Rancho Cordova is replacing sidewalk in front of 38 homes and one business as part of the 2018 ADA Sidewalk Improvement Project. The project will improve pedestrian safety and enhance accessibility for residents in Rancho Cordova neighborhoods.

The project began on February 20, 2018 and is estimated to last 30 working days, weather permitting. Construction is expected to last no longer than one week in front of each location and will take place Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Street parking and driveway access in some locations will be restricted during construction. The city cautions to expect noise and sidewalk closures during the project.

TAPIGAMI is a contemporary art form created by local Sacramento artist Danny Scheible. "First attracted to masking tape because of its versatile, accessible, and malleable nature, Scheible used the unlikely material to create large-scale installations and create an accessible and interactive art form," according to his

bio. Since then his art has become award winning and he has written several instructional style books, promoting not only his work, but the style of art itself.

The ribbon cutting ceremony was also in honor of the reopening of the Mills Station (MACC) itself. "We have worked to find a way to create an arts exhibit and performance space for the building, but it has been difficult to get it off the ground," said Rancho Cordova Mayor Linda Budge. "So we are very excited for re-introducing the building to the community and to begin using it as we have always intended."

From Star Wars to Rick and Morty, Scheible's unique form of art resides in a category of its own. If you missed the MACC grand opening or last weekend's receptions, be sure to catch them this weekend, March 10-11, from noon to 6 p.m. Mills Station is located at 10191 Mills Station Road. SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Established at the end of 2014, the Junior Tennis Fund Sacramento has donated over \$16,000 to the greater Sacramento Region over the years. Mainly donating to parks and recs, the goal of the organization is to bring tennis to kids who may not have ever had a chance to set foot on the court otherwise.

The JTFS is a collective giving organization that supports public youth tennis in the greater Sacramento area. They harness the power of collective giving to support community philanthropy and help create new tennis opportunities for all kids, especially the underserved, at public facilities, parks and schools.

Among the years of contributions, they have donated to the Carmichael Recreation and Park, South Gate Recreation and Park District, Rio Linda Recreation and Park District and the Mission Oaks Recreation and Parks District. Most recently they donated \$1,800 to Woodland Park.

“We are a youth development program that helps with social skills and gets kids out of the house,” said Carol Rose, Founder and Director of JTFS. “Kids like tennis and enjoy getting out there and chasing the ball.” Rose explained the beauty of tennis entering these children’s lives. “Tennis is a sport that instills core values, teaches life skills and helps to develop productive citizens. It’s a sport that can be played for a lifetime.”

Expanding on that point, some kids pick up the sport and truly run with it, which led to the newest idea of JTFS. Beginning last year, the program, with the help of various coaches around the community, identify the kids that are working hard, taking the sport seriously and have the ability to take their skills to the next level. They award these kids scholarships for private lessons and then they automatically get signed up for an upcoming tournament through the Sacramento Area Tennis Association. SATA runs a series of tournaments throughout the year for all different age groups.

Upcoming for JTFS is one of the biggest fundraising days of the year, as they will once again be participating in the Big Day of Giving, the Sacramento Region’s annual 24-hour fundraising event and year-long

capacity building program. The event takes place on Thursday, May 3 and this year JTFS will join powers with the Effie Yeaw Nature Center and The Wish List Project at The Patriot Restaurant located in the Milagro Centre in Carmichael.

These organizations are inviting friends and donors to stop by, say hello and enjoy some great food and drinks – all in the spirit of giving. Donors for any of the non-profits will be given a discount for dinner that evening at The Patriot. Last year the region raised nearly \$7.2 million from tens of thousands of donors, according to the Sacramento Region Community Foundation.

Jeff Sessions Addresses Illegal Immigration; Protests Take Place

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions addressed immigration and California sanctuary laws downtown Sacramento on Wednesday morning, speaking at the annual meeting of the California Peace Officers Association held at the Kimpton Sawyer Hotel. Sessions informed those in attendance that the Justice Department sued the state of California because state laws are preventing federal immigration agents from doing their jobs and putting their lives at risk, but the state's leaders believe otherwise and continue to deny any wrongdoing. Last month, Oakland Mayor

Libby Schaff warned residents of a federal immigration agent raid, allowing more than 800 criminals to avoid arrest. This drew harsh criticism from both Immigration and Customs Enforcement and the White House. "So here's my message for

Mayor Schaaf: How dare you. How dare you needlessly endanger the lives of our law enforcement officers to promote a radical open borders agenda," Sessions said on Wednesday. He also questioned Lieutenant Governor Gavin Newsom for "bragging about the obstruction of law enforcement," calling it an "embarrassment for the great state of California." Governor Jerry Brown thumbed out a tweet stating, "Jeff, these political stunts may be the norm in Washington, but they don't work here. SAD!!!" Dozens of protestors blocked traffic outside of the Kimpton Sawyer Hotel and the Golden 1 Center, holding signs and chanting in opposition of Sessions and the White House. ★



The Evolution is Here

Get Used to Hearing About Artificial Intelligence

Have you noticed how evident AI is now in our everyday life? It started with coordinating traffic signals along major streets in an effort to expedite the flow of traffic. Home Depot now has the personal checkout line where one employee oversees four pay stations. Bel Air has the same thing. At McDonald's you will see at least one electronic ordering station that is connected directly to the preparation line that issues you a receipt and directs you to

pay the cashier. Complex algorithms control the electricity grid to constantly adjust the flow of electrons for efficiency purposes. Automobiles can now drive themselves.

There are significant implications to this evolution. The arrival of such advancements is self-inflicted. Those who advocate for higher minimum wages are creating huge incentives for business to invest in physical capital rather than human capital. Think back to when we were kids: our first job was scooping ice cream at Baskin Robbins at \$1.65 per hour, or being a carry out person at the local grocery store for \$2.10 per hour, or whatever. Those were learning situations. We were learning work ethics and consumer relations, getting exposed to the real world of working for a living.

As near as I can tell, the horse is out of the barn on "first job" opportunities. While those first jobs won't all disappear, there will

be a significant reduction in the number of them. Employers are now able to purchase equipment with artificial intelligence that can process relatively simple job tasks. The end result is that "first jobs" are being eliminated. The economic driver for this is clearly the regulatory burden being placed on employers. A machine never calls in sick. A machine doesn't require workers compensation insurance. A machine doesn't fill out a time card with all the potential private attorneys general actions that come with an inaccurately completed time card. A machine doesn't enroll in Obamacare. You get the point.

In my opinion, artificial intelligence is a positive development for our economy, enhancing productivity up and down the economic chain. I wonder about how far AI will progress over the next few years. For a number of reasons, I worry about the demise of "first jobs" for our young people. So should you. ★

Anti-Alzheimers

6) PERFORMING STAND-UP COMEDY. Memorizing your set, reading the audience, creating material and physical appearance on the stage.

7) LEARNING TO DANCE. Physical coordination, fine motor movements, responding to music, memorizing choreography, and understanding different dance techniques.

8) CHESS CLUB OR GROUP CARD GAMES. Remembering your cards and the rules for each game, step-by-step strategy concentration on the game, and planning how you will win.

9) MENTORING OTHERS IN YOUR FIELD. Remembering and drawing from your experience, focusing on the mentoring activity, reading another person's emotions and motivations, coming up with options and solutions.

10) VOLUNTEERING TO TEACH. Remembering the subject matter, focusing on the teaching, responding to student needs, examining and explaining multistep solutions.

11) JEWELRY, CRAFTS, MODELS OR ART. Understanding complex designs, memorizing techniques and patterns, concentrating on the activity, and the physical act of assembly.

12) TAKING COMMUNITY COLLEGE COURSES. Memorizing new words and concepts, understanding multistep thinking, applying new theories to find solutions.

Pair Convicted of Murder, Multiple Charges in Apartment Shooting

DATE: February 26, 2018

CASE: Richard Gutierrez & Laurencio Quintero (#15F03952)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Laura West, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

Richard Gutierrez and Laurencio Quintero were convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Stacy Norman, shooting at an occupied house and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury found true allegations that Gutierrez and Quintero personally used and discharged a firearm causing death during the commission of the shooting into the occupied house. Quintero was also convicted of first-degree burglary and discharging a firearm in a grossly negligent manner.

On June 13, 2015, Gutierrez and Quintero shot at occupied apartments on Rio Linda Boulevard. Multiple rounds entered the apartments, narrowly missing sleeping children and adults inside. Two of the rounds pierced the victim's neighbor's window and traveled through a wall into the victim's bedroom, striking the victim while she was in bed. She suffered a through and through gunshot wound to her chest and died from a loss of blood. Later that day, Quintero and three other men broke into an apartment on Beaumont Street to confront the resident of that unit. They had at least one gun with them and fired five shots into the resident's bedroom door. The resident of the apartment was not home at the time.

Allegations that Gutierrez suffered a prior 2013 strike conviction for robbery and that Quintero suffered a prior 2007 strike conviction for felony assault with a deadly weapon will be determined at sentencing.

Gutierrez faces a maximum sentence of 50 years to life in prison. Quintero faces a maximum sentence of 62 years to life in prison. Sentencing for both defendants is scheduled for March 23, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 12 before the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard.

Defendant Convicted of Murdering Ex-Girlfriend

DATE: February 28, 2018

CASE: Dameshlo Green (Case #14F03237)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit

Dameshlo Green was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Tamisha Ridge and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true a use of firearm allegation.

Green and the victim had and on and off relationship for more than 10 years. After 5 years of no contact, they resumed their relationship until the victim broke up with Green a few months later. On May 14, 2014, Green entered the victim's residence, went into her bedroom and shot her in the head with a shotgun.

The allegation that Green suffered a prior 2011 assault with a deadly weapon strike conviction will be determined at sentencing.

Green faces a maximum sentence of 50 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for March 27, 2018 in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

Defendants Sentenced for Illegally Accessing State Computer Network

DATE: March 5, 2018

CASE: Jeffrey Rikala & Jonathan Turrentine (Case #17FE004204)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Bruce Chang, Cyber Crimes Unit

Jeffrey Rikala and Jonathan Turrentine pled no contest to illegally accessing a computer network to wrongfully obtain money, property or data. The Honorable Lawrence Brown sentenced both defendants to 30 days county jail and 3 years probation.

Between October 22, 2016, and November 1, 2016, Rikala and Turrentine were employees of the State of California Department of Technology. The defendants engaged in a scheme to mine Monero, a form of cryptocurrency, by using State of California computer servers.

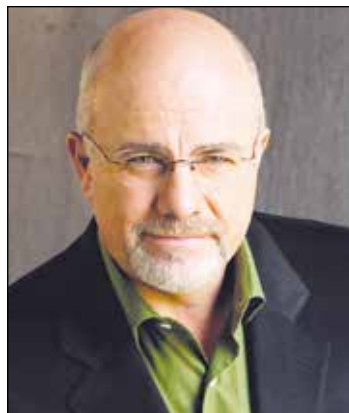

I have a credit card that I haven't made a payment on in almost two years. The debt has been sold a couple of times, and now a collector is saying I owe \$1,200. The original amount was \$500. I'd like to work something out, but I can't afford \$1,200. What should I do?

Dear Luanne,
They're asking for \$1,200 because they've added things like interest and late fees. They want to make as much money as possible on an old debt


they bought for pennies on the dollar.

If you can afford \$500 right now, ask if they'll accept a one-time payment to settle the account. Get it in writing if they accept the offer, and don't give them a penny until after you get a copy of the written agreement. Once you have the agreement in hand, send them a money order or cashier's check for \$500. Do not, under any circumstances, give them electronic access to your bank accounts.

You waited too long to take of your obligation, Luanne. That made things more difficult and more stressful than necessary. I'm glad you decided to do the right thing, and clean up your mess, though. Better late than never!

Cordova Baseball Ready for New Season

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - With a fresh season just getting under way, one of the pluses for Cordova Lancers’ baseball head coach Doug Hughes has been his roster’s capability of playing different spots on the field.

The 14 Lancers on the roster are a combination of returning players and newcomers looking to make some noise in upcoming weeks. Entering its Saturday morning preseason game at Sacramento High, Cordova is 1-3. Last spring, the Lancers went 7-8 in the Sierra Valley Conference and 10-13 overall.

Five senior players return this season for the Lancers; outfielders Jeremy Buck, Colby McDonald and Trevor Ready. Last season, Buck led the Lancers in batting average at .371, followed by Ready at .305.

Joining the trio are two juniors who started as sophomores last spring in third baseman and pitcher Ryan Tipton and infielder/pitcher Nick Ravareau. Tipton had a .271 batting average last year and Ravareau .270. On the mound last year, Tipton had a 4-2 record with a 2.08 ERA.

New additions are sophomores Gavin Sullivan, Anthony Baca, Kenny Brown and freshman Caleb Smiley.

“In all, we had 36 kids come out for baseball,” Hughes said. “We held a joint tryout and have not made a final decision for the varsity team as of yet.”

Since the season started on

February 24, when Cordova (1-3) started its season with a 9-1 loss to Winters, Hughes has been toying with the line-up. That includes moving some underclassmen to the varsity team from the frosh-soph squad.

“We will shuffle kids from the varsity and JV to see how they are in game situations until our first league game,” Hughes said. “We hope to have

our roster finalized (by the end of this week). We are fortunate that we have kids that can play multiple positions. The key for this year’s team is defense and pitching.”

That is because the middle of next week, Cordova begins action and its final run in playing in the SVC. This summer, Cordova will be part of the new Greater Sacramento

League, which is Division IV, with Florin, Johnson, Natomas, Valley and West Campus, all of Sacramento.

“Personally, I am going to miss competing in the SVC; same goes for our players,” said Hughes of the conference change. “I have the upmost respect for all of the coaches, players and schools. We have decided that we will play

non-league games against each other for the next few years.”

Liberty Ranch, which won the SVC title last spring and is one of the schools Cordova plans to play in preseason in 2019, will be one of the teams to beat in this year’s conference, Hughes noted.

“Until they are dethroned they are still the SVC champions,” Hughes said. “I expect the SVC to come down to the last

week. I don’t think anyone is going to run away and hide.”

Saturday, March 10 at 10 a.m., Cordova plays a non-league game at Sacramento High. Monday, March 12 Cordova will host Florin. Wednesday, March 14 Cordova begins SVC action at Rosemont. Friday, March 16 the Lancers host Union Mine. The three games are scheduled to start at 4 p.m. ★

Background: Anglers can cast a line into the 160-acre lake from the shoreline or one of six fishing piers. Small boats with electric motors are also allowed (no gas motors). In addition to trout, the freshwater lake is home to bass, bluegill, red-ear sunfish, crappie and catfish. In preparation for the derby, Rancho Seco Lake was recently stocked with thousands of pounds of catchable trout.

Registration takes place on both days of the derby between 6 a.m. and 10 a.m., rain or shine. Derby tickets are \$5 per person

plus a daily park fee available at the park gate. A valid California state fishing license is required for those 16 years of age or older. Anglers hoping to win a prize must weigh their fish at the official weigh station between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on the day of the catch. For complete rules, visit itsmud.org/RanchoSeco.

The 400-acre Rancho Seco Recreational Area offers more than just fishing. The full-service facility offers picnic areas, RV and tent camping sites, a beach and swimming spots. Kayaks, rowboats, paddleboards and fishing boats are available to rent.

equally, whether you are a small business owner or representing SMUD, it doesn't make any difference. It's the collective spirit of this chamber that makes it work. This is where two plus two equals five. I have the most active board I've had in years and a really talented staff. I love coming to work every day. It's a passion.

Q: What's been your chief strategy for growing and retaining your membership?

A: I think it has been through a consistent evaluation of the programs and services we provide, asking ourselves if we are truly providing value to our members. Nobody walks out of a chamber with a set of tires, so we have to show and demonstrate the value to them, and if we don't, then people have a right to take their money elsewhere.

Q: What has been your biggest area of growth with respect to member participation?

A: I'm very proud of the growth of our Business Expo. In 2011 we had approximately 32 vendors and roughly 100 guests. Now, it's about 100 vendors inside and outside city hall and we have about 700 visitors.

Q: Networking is so important. How does the chamber promote networking?

A: Face-to-face networking opportunities are still the number one reason for joining a chamber. However, approaches have adapted and changed to serve member interests and schedules. We now have two different versions of our Monthly Power Lunch, for example. We have the Highway 50 lunch with the Folsom and El Dorado Hills chambers. We also do a quarterly Sunrise Corridor luncheon with the Fair Oaks and Carmichael chambers. It didn't always work this way. Chambers have traditionally been very territorial, but

we have learned that if you want to remain relevant, you can't do that anymore. Business doesn't begin or end at a city or county line.

Q: What programs or services are your primary focus?

A: There are three focuses we try to maintain: networking opportunities, business services and advocacy. Tools we offer are aimed at helping to support members with information and access to things like how to go green, tax incentives and other issues. We also are here to make connections between our members. For example, SMUD has millions of dollars in contracts and we work to make connections between them and small-to-mid-sized members. It's about providing a safe place for people to come for help or find someone to talk to. And, primarily since the recession, our role as an advocate has also grown. We are the voice for and about business, and that's something I take very seriously.

Q: What is the Rancho Chamber focused on at the advocacy level?

A: So many bills in the Legislature impact our members; bills on ADA issues and minimum wage, as an example. So I take a great deal of pride in our work tracking those. Also, we have just launched into

a contract with UCAN - United Chamber Advocacy Network, which will serve as a complement to the California Chamber of Commerce. It's more boots on the ground at the legislative level.

Q: What changes have you implemented with your annual events?

A: We have dramatically shifted how we do events. For example, last year at this time we were doing our Aloha evening dinner and raffle. But after listening to our members and identifying what their needs are, there was a desire for a big, annual daytime event. The evening events just don't work as well anymore. So we're having a big, annual luncheon that ties our installation of new officers, recognition of outgoing board members and the Best In Business Awards together as one event.

Q: How have member-to-member relationships changed?

A: The single biggest thing I've seen is a spike in collaboration between members. The Barrel District (beer and distilleries) is a great example. They get together and they talk about things. Businesses are coming together, turning up for each other's ribbon cutting ceremonies. They understand that collaboration is key. ★

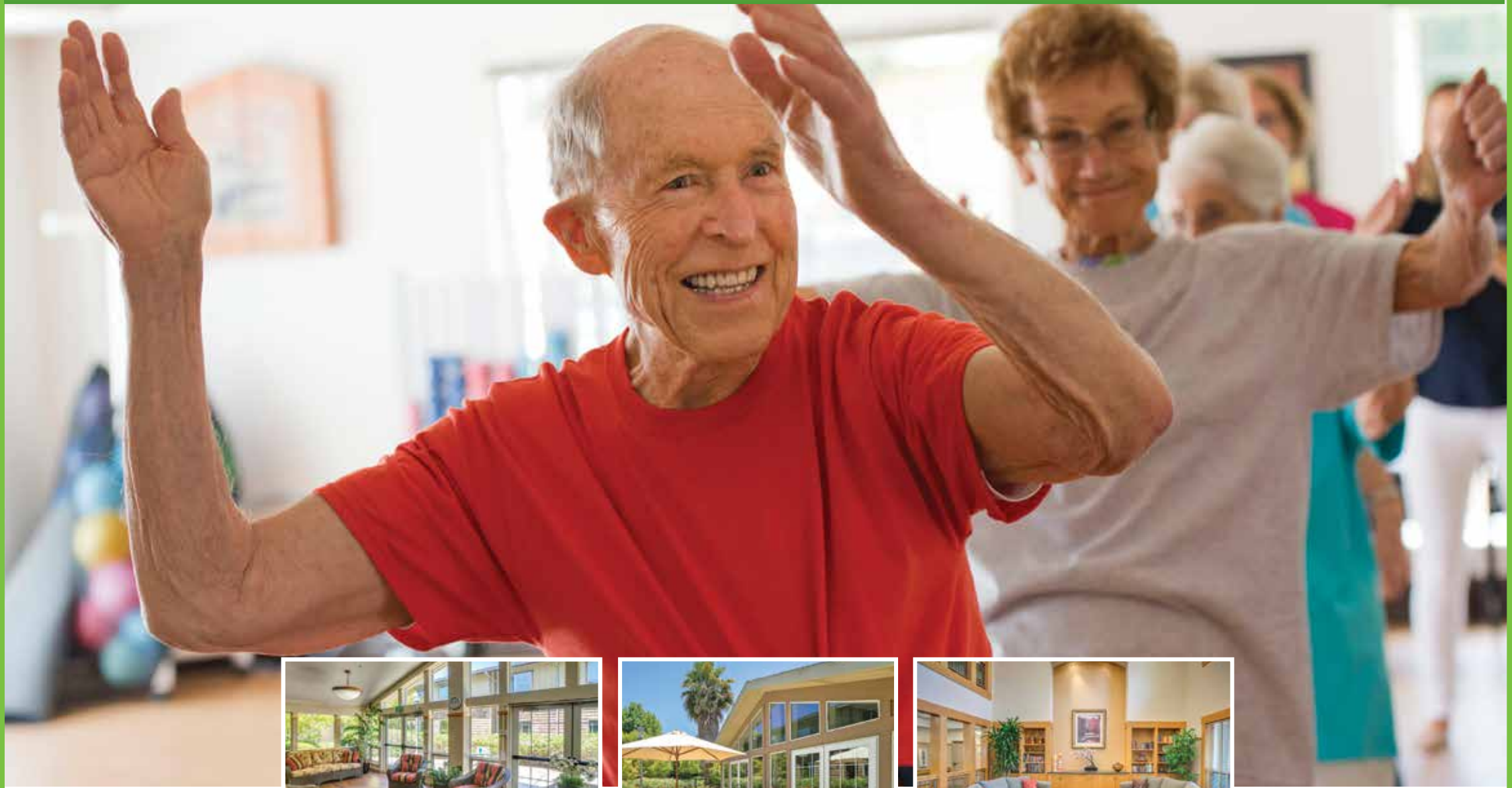
