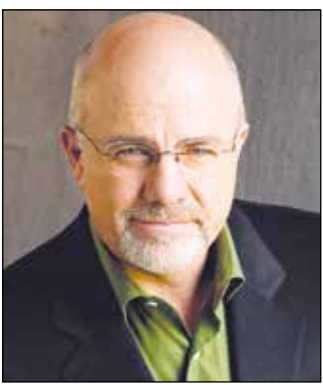

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Seven Rancho Cordova residents and three organizations were honored as Rancho Cordova's Volunteer Superheroes at the 19th Annual Community Volunteer Awards on Friday March 9 at City Hall.

Good Day Sacramento's Cambi Brown served as Master of Ceremonies, entertaining the audience with a fast paced description of each honoree's achievements, scripted by the Council's Shelly Blanchard.

The event was sponsored by the Cordova Community Council. Their website describes the council as "a non-profit organization that presents Rancho Cordova special events through working with member volunteer organizations. They are Rancho Cordova's organization of organizations."

While many of this year's recipients were recognized for recent

accomplishments, they have devoted decades to their passion to help others and to make Rancho Cordova a great place to live. They have shown strong leadership skills and the ability to win over and work with those needed to help accomplish their goals.

Those who have benefited from their hard work include students, schools, refugees, sports and music programs, veterans, the homeless and hungry, animals and an entire city.

Wayne Harmer took home the Rancho Cordova Citizen of the year award. He was the only honoree to have the words "a little crazy" attributed to his volunteer

style - and for good reason. Like the other honorees, Harmer has spent thousands of hours volunteering at all kinds of jobs but goes just enough beyond what is expected of him to earn that title.

City and Community Partners Plant Over 100 Trees for California Arbor Week

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - One hundred and nine trees. That's how many trees were planted along the Bear Hollow Retention Basin and in the Stone Creek neighborhood of Rancho Cordova in celebration of California Arbor Week. On March 10, 2018, the City of Rancho Cordova teamed up with the Sacramento Tree Foundation, SMUD, Cordova Recreation & Park District (CRPD), and 80 community volunteers for a tree planting event that will beautify the community with 90 native oak seedlings tucked along Bear Hollow Basin's bike path, and 19 street and park trees dotting the Stone Creek neighborhood.

and other residents who simply wanted to give back to their community.

This tree planting that commemorated California Arbor Week is part of the City and its partners' ongoing efforts to increase the City's urban tree

canopy to 35 percent by 2035. This initiative - which is also referred to as "NeighborWoods" - provides homeowners, businesses and community organizations with up to 10 free trees per property, plus assistance with planting and irrigation. NeighborWoods

**Trump: Gov. Brown
Doing "Very Poor
Job" Running State**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - President Donald Trump visited the great state of California to inspect border types near San Diego on Tuesday. He took time out of his visit to express his feelings regarding Governor Jerry Brown's lack of control over the state.

"Governor Brown does a very poor job running California," Trump said. "They have the highest taxes in the United States. The place is totally out of control. You have sanctuary cities where you have criminals living."

Trump's long-awaited, highly anticipated visit to California did not come without a firestorm of adolescent tweets from state leaders in attempt to retaliate against the president's claims.

Brown responded by tweeting, "Thanks for the shout-out, @realDonaldTrump. But bridges are still better than walls. And California remains the 6th largest economy in the world and the most prosperous state in America. #Facts"

#Facts or not, Trump still claims that political leaders in California are actually in favor of walls, saying, "The state of California is begging us to build walls in certain areas, they don't tell you that."

Lieutenant Governor Gavin Newsom responded with a tweet of his own: "California is not 'begging' you for this wall. Your wall is a waste of money and is literally impossible to complete. It will look more like a piece of swiss cheese than an insurmountable barrier. It's nothing more than a 6th century solution to a 21st century problem."

Despite all of the animosity, Trump's visit to California lasted just one day. After spending time inspecting wall prototypes built to his specs, he later spoke at the Marine Corps Air Station Miramar before traveling to a Beverly Hills fundraiser that was expected to raise \$5 million for the Republican National Committee. ★

Annual Roseville Gem Show Rocks On for 2018

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Roseville Rock Rollers 56th Annual Gem, Jewelry, Fossil, and Mineral Show will take place at the Placer County Fairgrounds in Roseville March 24-25. Hosted by the Roseville Rock Rollers, also known as the Roseville Gem and Mineral Society, this year's show features gemstones, jewelry, fossils and minerals and has something for the whole family.

The group was established in 1960 as a group of local “rockhounds,” according to show chair James Hutchings. That group, deeply interested in the science and art of the earths’ natural beauty in rocks and minerals, first met in homes and then as their numbers grew, expanded to the use of a local school room.

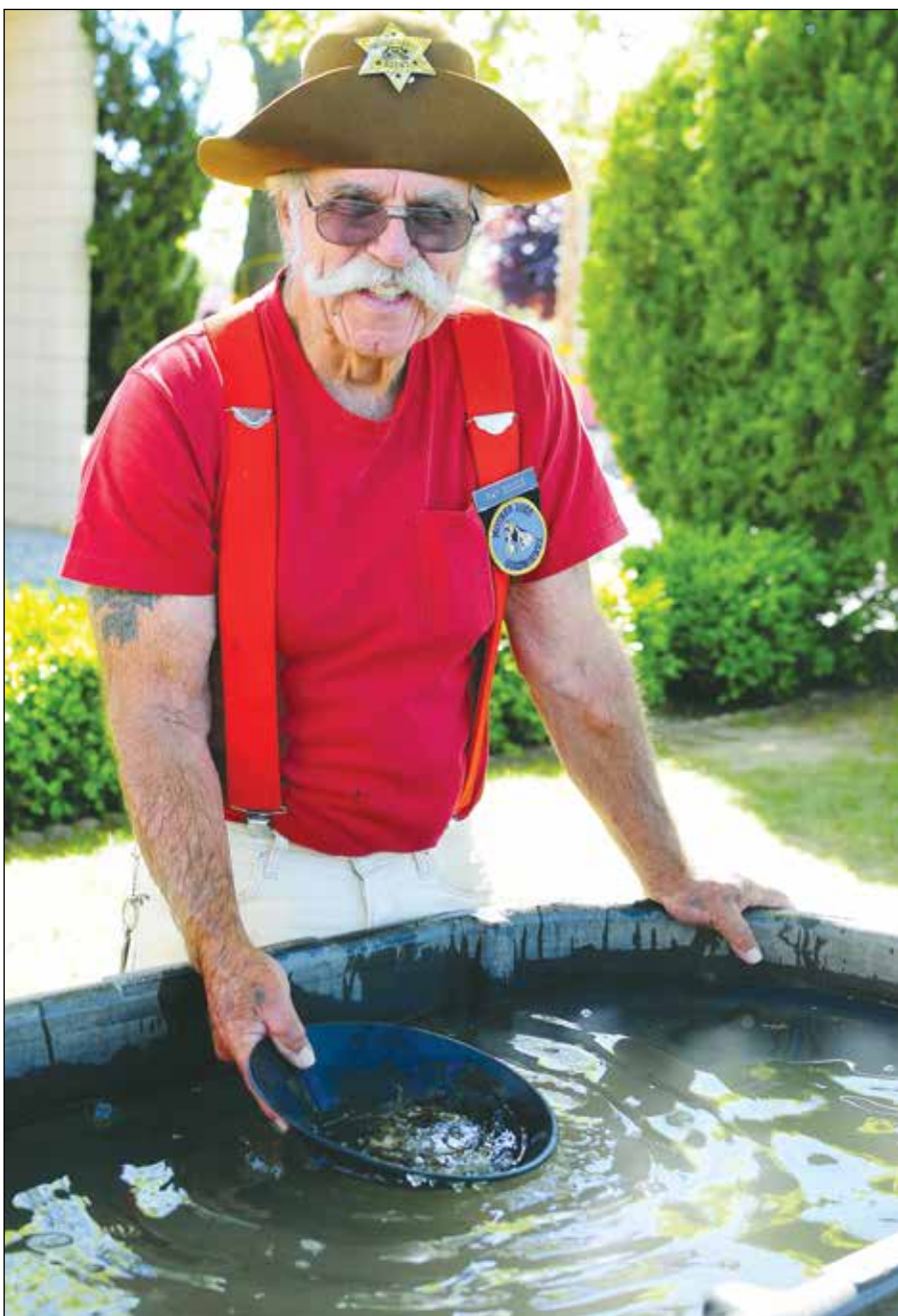

This year's show has dozens of exhibits for attendees, such as jewelry, metal, wire and glass beading arts, fossils, crystals and minerals, but that's not all. So that attendees aren't rushed, the show also provides a cafeteria. "A very fine hot lunch is available at our own kitchen in Johnson Hall," states Hutchings. The group has put together a menu of very reasonably priced food and beverages will also be available at the show's cafeteria.

In addition to exhibits, classes and demonstrations, show goers can pan for gold, purchase equipment, buy raffle tickets, have rocks, gems and mineral identified by experts or make purchases at a silent auction.

Wishing to share the art and science of the mineral world, in the tradition of gem and mineral shows around the world, the Roseville Rock Rollers established their own gem and mineral

show around 1962. The society grew, the show grew, and the show and the Society moved to the Placer County Fairgrounds where it continues today.

“As the Roseville Gem and Mineral Society has expanded, the show expanded to support the costs associated with its programs, such as the Rookie Rock Rollers, juniors program, the Annual Scholarship program to Geology Students at Sacramento State Geology Department, and our year round Lapidary shop on the fair-grounds,” said Hutchings. “The lapidary shop on the Fair Grounds is the heart

and soul of our Society, where we teach lapidary arts, jewelry fabrication, conduct mineral identification and mini tail gate rock sales.”

Hutchings developed his love for “rockhounding” at an early age. “Personally, I as most young people, was fascinated with rocks minerals and crystals. My parents encouraged me with my first Golden Book of Rocks and Minerals, a book still in current print, and my first rock pick.”

At the age of 38, he became seriously interested in rockhounding and gold mining, attending a mineral

identification course at Sierra College, next pursuing an in depth understanding the chemistry and physics that form “these miracles in the earth.” He has put that knowledge to good use today providing what he refers to as a “mini lab” during the show to test rocks, minerals, and gems to provide guest an idea of materials they have in their possession.

While the Rock Rollers must generate funds to keep their programs operating, the primary purpose of any Gem and Mineral Show is to promote the Art and Science of the mineral world, according to Hutchings.

Like many of the group members, an early exposure to rockhounding and lapidary arts often provides a genesis of interest that often blossoms later in life, Hutchings said. "We really work hard, to attract the parents who want to expose their children to the natural world and foster that spark."

There are presentations and activities for youngsters on identifying and handling specimens of all kinds. Students and Scouts can reinforce their California Rock Cycle curriculum and merit badge information. Scouts can have their mineral finds evaluated for rock type or mineral and validated for their required collection.

Hutchings suggests visitors come early and plan on spending the day at the show. "We take over the entire fairgrounds with exhibits, demonstrators, and vendors."

Not to be missed are real treasures the group will have on display. "Folks tend to walk by the display cases," he said. "These simple, well lighted boxes contain the best of the best of personal collections of minerals in variety or by theme. The displays are, 'literally' miniature museums showcasing specimens in the possession of individuals who have spent a lifetime collecting the best of the best of their favorite species of rock or mineral," said Hutchings.

“We are looking for the general public who are looking for gem stones, set and unset, handmade, and fine art jewelry, and mineral specimens from every corner of the world! We find the single most striking comment from folks who, by accident, end up at our show is, “I had no idea such things existed in the world!”

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - We will be knocking on the doors of Washington D.C. elected officials (hired public servants), the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) headquarters, the Department of Transportation, and the Fisher House Foundation headquarters. We'll be updating the VA department administration about our progress on Mather Veterans Village in the City of Rancho Cordova. We have made wonderful progress so far, and the beginning work on Phase Two and Phase Three is about to begin. Now for many, that isn't new information, but I am very grateful that many people have been working with me and we will be able to help many of our homeless veterans and get them off the streets and in a home.

I am working on this column today in Washington D.C. in between seminars, meetings, and hearing some great speakers. The Opening General Session at the National League of Cities (NLC) provided a very well-planned program of representatives from all 50

states. The keynote speaker was Emmy-winning journalist Bob Schieffer. There are many people today (a generation or two) who don't know who he is, but many people know him as one of the nation's most-revered reporters. Granted, there are some who may not have agreed with everything he said, but I think he took the time to make sure that everything he said was understood by everyone.

He was in the news business for 58 years, and spent 46 of those years at CBS News. He was declared "the last of the old school anchors from the heyday of network TV news," by NPR (and for your information, NPR stands for National Public Radio. Abbreviations bug me sometimes because there are so many of them and they mean different things, even though their letters are the same.). Mr. Schieffer interviewed every President since President Richard Nixon; he has covered the White House, the Pentagon, the State Department, and Capitol Hill; and he has written four books. He spoke about the news that isn't covered today. He said that unfortunately, more and more people are accepting what they read or hear in

social media as their source of "facts and information," and they respond and react to that information only. He still takes the time and makes the effort to gather facts from more than just one source. I appreciate NLC for bringing excellent speakers like Bob Schieffer to the convention.

We had a meeting with the Department of Transportation, and we will have meetings with representatives from the Department of Veterans Affairs. We will also meet with representatives of the Fisher House Foundation, who build Fisher Houses (similar to the Ronald McDonald homes), which house families who have members of their family being taken care of in a VA hospital. Two Fisher Houses have even been built next to the VA hospital at Travis Air Force Base. When a veteran is in the VA hospital, their family can stay at a Fisher House at no cost. That makes a difference of whether or not they can be close to that patient because of the cost. I'll keep you updated.

Bright Shining Stars

DOVIA Annual Awards Shines a Light on Outstanding Volunteers

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - How do you inspire a team of volunteers not to roll their eyes when asked to do perhaps the most humble of tasks - scooping up dog waste?

With a lot of patience and a willingness to meet them where they are at, says Janice Wagaman, who was selected by the Directors of Volunteers in Agencies (DOVIA) March 8 as the agency's 2018 Outstanding Volunteer Coordinator of the Year.

DOVIA Sacramento is a non-profit organization providing support, workshops and trainings for professional volunteer managers at agencies across the county.

For the last five and a half years, Wagaman has served as the director of volunteers at the Front Street Animal Shelter in Sacramento. Wagaman is tasked with the job of overseeing roughly 2,400 volunteers at the shelter, which range from high school students to elderly adults with retirement time on their hands - all of whom come in with various levels of passion and commitment for service and, of course, an unwavering dedication to helping animals.

"It's a tough job, lots of passion there, and often it is very emotional," said Wagaman. "But I absolutely would not have any other job in the world," said Wagaman. "In my case, one of the

biggest challenges is inspiring new volunteers who are starting out at the first level to understand the importance of some of the more menial tasks we have to get done, which is go and pick up poop. And the other challenge is that, with so many people and so many different levels of compassion and passion for being of service at the shelter, I don't always have the time I would like

to have to get to know all of my volunteers on a personal level."

Under her directorship, Wagaman has created a new volunteer program called "SMART (Sacramento Missing Animal Response Team) Pet Alert, which has played an instrumental role in helping to boost the number of the shelter's lost animals who are returned to their owners from 23 percent to nearly 30 percent.

"My volunteers are really pushing this at an amazing level," said Wagaman, one of three volunteers nominated for the award. "They are using social media apps and programs, like Next Door and Facebook to help reconnect lost animals with their owners and it is having a huge impact. I'm super proud of them and this program."

In addition, the shelter's overall "Leave Live Rate" under Wagaman's direction is at 87 percent - that means 87 percent of the animals brought in to the shelter due to separation from their owners, abandonment or other reasons, are being rehomed each year.

"That's a good number," said

Wagaman. "Of course, we'd love to see 100 percent, but we are proud and always working toward the goal."

The annual awards also include recognition for Outstanding Youth Volunteers. Taking that award for 2018 was Janae Bonnell, 18, a senior at Oak Ridge High School in El Dorado Hills. Bonnell has worked as a volunteer at Shriners Hospital for Children in Sacramento since 2016. One of 14 young volunteers nominated for the 2018 award, she plans on a career in pre-med. She has clocked hundreds of hours as a volunteer working in, among other places, the hospital's pre-operation unit, post-anesthesia care unit, operating rooms and admissions department.

"Really, this is amazing, but I am very impressed with all of the other nominees who are volunteering out there like me," said Bonnell, as she posed for photos alongside her parents and sister. "I love working with people and of course being at Shriners gives me valuable experience that goes along with what I

want to do, which is pre-med."

Bonnell took home a scholarship for \$500 as part of her award.

Included among the list of nominees for the Outstanding Youth Volunteers is Carmichael resident and El Camino High School senior, Konark Mangudkar, honored for his volunteer work at Eskaton Village Carmichael since 2016. He is interested in a career in neuroscience and technology and has an infinity for working with seniors and in the arena of memory care.

"I get a lot out of working with the elderly, especially those with memory loss issues," said Mangudkar. "I know they often don't know who I am, but sometimes they do. It's a very rewarding place to help out. I know I am getting more out of this than I expected at first."

The other nominees in the Outstanding Youth

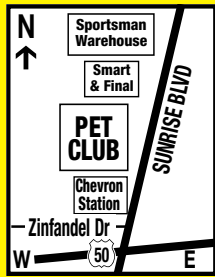

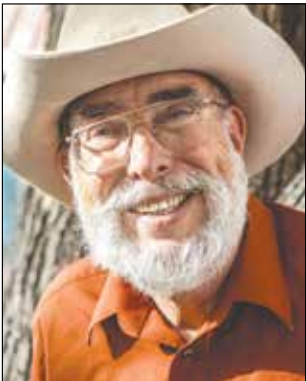
It wouldn't take long and we'd be tagged as nuts, but we sure could be a little perkier when we deal with people and with our family members. For all we know, it could be the last time we see them.

a statewide program that puts billions of cap-and-trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy and improving public health and the environment—particularly in disadvantaged communities. Typical systems meet 75-90 percent of customers' electricity needs.

SMUD energy experts also work with the selected customers to perform complete energy audits of their homes and determine the most effective ways to improve each home's energy efficiency. Contractors then install multiple efficiency measures, which can include upgrades to insulation, lighting, weather-stripping and more. All of these upgrades are done at no cost to the customer.

"Completing our one-hundredth project is an exciting milestone for this partnership," said SMUD Chief Customer Officer Nicole Howard. "It underscores the efforts we're making to improve the lives of families in underserved communities, and we're proud to continue working with GRID Alternatives to help many more families this year."

"Solar is a triple win in

our communities," said Bob Gragson, Executive Director of GRIDAlternatives North Valley. "It provides energy cost savings that families can invest back in their homes and neighborhoods; puts people to work; and furthers our transition to clean energy. We look forward to continuing this important work with SMUD."

SMUD is also working to provide energy efficiency upgrades to low-income customers beyond the scope of the GRID Alternatives partnership. SMUD currently has three additional programs—Deep Home Energy Saver, Energy Saver Home Bundle and Energy Saver Apartment Bundle—that are designed to provide SMUD's EAPR customers with energy efficiency upgrades. SMUD's Board of Directors has approved the allocation of more than \$10 million to these programs over the next several years above and beyond the current program's budget.

IRS Summarizes ‘Dirty Dozen’ List of Tax Scams for 2018

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Following continuing threats to taxpayers, the Internal Revenue Service today listed email “phishing” schemes as a top filing season concern and part of the annual listing of the “Dirty Dozen” tax scams for 2018.

The IRS warned taxpayers, businesses and tax professionals to be alert to fake emails or websites looking to steal personal information. These attempts can expand during tax season and remain a major identity theft threat.

Compiled annually by the IRS, the “Dirty Dozen” lists a variety of common scams that taxpayers may encounter any time of the year, but many of these schemes peak during filing season as people prepare their tax returns or seek help from tax professionals.

To help protect taxpayers, the IRS is highlighting each of these scams on 12 consecutive days to help raise awareness. The IRS also urges taxpayers to help protect themselves against identity theft by reviewing safety tips

prepared the Security Summit, a collaborative effort between the IRS, states and the private-sector tax community.

“We urge taxpayers to watch out for these tricky and dangerous schemes,” said Acting IRS Commissioner David Kautter. “Phishing and other scams on the ‘Dirty Dozen’ list can trap unsuspecting taxpayers. Being cautious and taking basic security steps can help protect people and their sensitive tax and financial data.”

2018 Sees New Phishing Schemes

The IRS continues to see a steady onslaught of new and evolving phishing schemes as scam artists work to victimize taxpayers during filing season.

In a recent twist to a phishing scam, the IRS has seen thousands of taxpayers victimized by an unusual scheme that involves their own bank accounts. After stealing client data from tax professionals and filing fraudulent tax returns, the criminals use taxpayers' real bank accounts to

direct deposit refunds. Thieves are then using various tactics to reclaim the refund from the taxpayers, including falsely claiming to be from a collection agency or representing the IRS. Phone calls, emails and web sites are used to make the scheme more elaborate. Versions of the scam may continue to evolve. The IRS encourages taxpayers to review some basic tips if they see an unexpected deposit in their bank account.

In addition, the IRS has seen email schemes in recent weeks targeting tax professionals, payroll professionals, human resources personnel, schools as well as individual taxpayers.

In these email schemes, criminals pose as a person or organization the taxpayer trusts or recognizes. They may hack an email account and send mass emails under another person’s name. Or they may pose as a bank, credit card company, tax software provider or government agency. Criminals go to great lengths to create websites that appear legitimate but contain

phony log-in pages. These criminals hope victims will “take the bait” and provide money, passwords, Social Security numbers and other information that can lead to identity theft.

Fake emails and websites also can infect a taxpayer’s computer with malware without the user knowing it. The malware gives the criminal access to the device, enabling them to access all sensitive files or even track keyboard strokes, exposing login information.

For those participating in these schemes, such activity can lead to significant penalties and possible criminal prosecution. IRS Criminal Investigation works closely with the Department of Justice to shut-down scams and prosecute the criminals behind them.

Tax Pro Alert

Numerous data breaches in the past year mean the entire tax preparation community must be on high alert during filing season to any unusual activity. Criminals increasingly target tax professionals, deploying various

types of phishing emails in an attempt to access client data. Thieves may use this data to impersonate taxpayers and file fraudulent tax returns for refunds.

As part of the Security Summit initiative, the IRS has joined with representatives of the software industry, tax preparation firms, payroll and tax financial product processors and state tax administrators to combat identity theft refund fraud to protect the nation's taxpayers.

The Security Summit partners encourage tax practitioners to be wary of communicating solely by email with potential or even existing clients, especially if unusual requests are made. Data breach thefts have given thieves millions of identity data points including names, addresses, Social Security numbers and email addresses. If in doubt, tax practitioners should call to confirm a client’s identity.

What to Do with Phishing Attempts

If a taxpayer receives an

unsolicited email that appears to be from either the IRS or an organization closely linked to the IRS, such as the Electronic Federal Tax Payment System (EFTPS), they should report it by sending it to phishing@irs.gov. Learn more by going to the Report Phishing and Online Scams page on IRS.gov.

Tax professionals who receive unsolicited and suspicious emails that appear to be from the IRS or related to the e-Services program also should report it by sending it to phishing@irs.gov.

It is important to keep in mind the IRS generally does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as text messages and social media channels.

Taxpayers have a set of fundamental rights they should be aware of when dealing with the IRS. Taxpayers can explore the Taxpayer Bill of Rights and the agency’s obligations to protect them on IRS.gov.

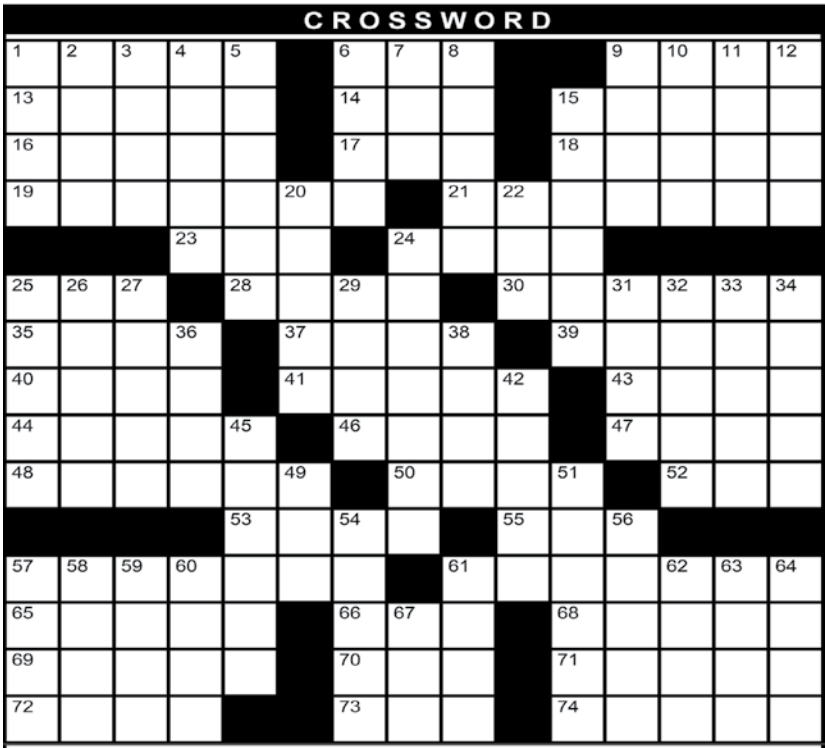

Immigration Is a Federal Issue



Commentary by Doug Ose

Immigration is a federal issue. The laws governing immigration are determined by Congress. Allowing each of the 50 states to create their own immigration system is a recipe for disaster. Only Congress can resolve the immigration issue. The last time Congress made any meaningful update to immigration law was in 1992, before email and Amazon and smart phones. It's time for a comprehensive update.

My suggestions include the following:

- (1) Start by repairing our relationship with Canada and Mexico. These relationships must be cordial and respectful. We have many mutual interests. We also have differences. Those differences cannot be resolved by trading insults.
- (2) Create a federal guest

worker program that allows qualified and properly vetted foreigners to work here for a specified period of time. Each worker must provide a significant financial bond in favor of USG to ensure compliance with the terms of the program, including departure at the end of the work term. Collect sufficient biometric data to ensure the worker can be identified. Withhold a significant percentage of their earnings during the work period. At the end of the work period, the worker must return to their own country to get their withheld money at the US embassy there. Use the biometrics to identify the worker. If the worker doesn't show up within 30 days of the end of the work term, then the earnings are forfeited.

- (3) Create and fund the necessary eVerify system so that employers can instantaneously determine the status of an applicant, including a picture of the applicant.
- (4) Create and fund a process for people who are here illegally, who's only crime is that they came here illegally, to apply for legal status to be earned after a given period of time, perhaps 15 years, as long as they remain productive and law-abiding members of our society. Applicants must post a bond in favor of USG that is forfeited in the

- event they break the law.
- (5) Fund an adjudicatory process including sufficient administrative law judges to review on a case by case base each DACA application. Get to an answer about each applicant's suitability. Clear the backlog.
- (6) Build "the wall."
- (7) Terminate the automatic extension of eligibility for immigration to "friends and family". Every applicant needs to be vetted for suitability.
- (8) Terminate the program whereby foreign investors can purchase eligibility by making an investment in America. Every applicant needs to be vetted for suitability.
- (9) Only grant student visas after posting of a significant bond in favor of the USG. Collect biometric data on student. Bond can only be released by having student appear at US embassy in their home country within 30 days of visa expiration date.
- (10) With the exception of emergency medical care, individuals without legal status shall not receive government financial assistance until such time as they have attained legal status.

These are my suggestions. What are yours? ★

Defendant Convicted of Shooting, Robbery

DATE: March 5, 2018
CASE: Demetrious Marcus (Case #17FE010993)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Scott Schweibish, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
Demetrious Marcus was convicted by a jury of two counts of robbery and assault with a deadly weapon. The jury found true a personal use of gun allegation on all three counts. Marcus was also convicted of being a felon in possession of a firearm.
On March 27, 2017, two suspects entered the victim's apartment, pistol whipped the victim's father and demanded money from the victim. The victim and his son were held at gunpoint while the two suspects ransacked their home, stealing their personal items. When the victim and his son chased the two suspects out of the apartment, one of the suspects shot the victim in the back before fleeing in a getaway car. The victim provided a description of the suspects, but they were not immediately caught. A few months later, the victim was able to identify Marcus as one of the robbers, but was not able to determine if he was the shooter. The other suspect has not yet been identified.
An allegation that Marcus suffered a prior 2009 strike conviction for residential burglary was found true. Marcus' criminal history dates back to 2007, including additional convictions for domestic violence and multiple vehicle thefts.
Marcus faces a maximum sentence of 38 years in prison. Sentencing is set for March 22, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen Sumner.

Defendant Convicted for Attempted Murder, Armed Robbery of Brinks Guard

DATE: March 5, 2018
CASE: Gilbert Smith (Case #16FE013303)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
Gilbert Smith was convicted by a jury of attempted murder, robbery and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true the allegation that Smith personally and intentionally discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury.
On July 8, 2016, Smith robbed a Brinks guard as he transported a large sum of money from the Golden One credit union to his armored vehicle. Smith was dressed as a construction worker with a mask, sunglasses and

bandana covering his face. Once the Brinks guard exited the bank, Smith approached the guard with a .40 caliber handgun and shot him. He then grabbed the money and engaged in a shootout with the injured guard, who shot Smith several times. Both men were transported to the hospital and received emergency treatment. The guard suffered serious injuries, including an infected lung and fractured rib that required multiple surgeries.
Smith has a prior 1994 drug sales conviction and has a pending armed robbery case (#16FE005509).
Smith faces a maximum sentence of 32 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 23, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Bowman.

Defendants Convicted of Child Abduction Charges

DATE: March 6, 2018
CASE: David Watson & Christina Bell (Case #16FE019708)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Heidi Brennan, Child Abduction Unit
David Watson was convicted by a jury of kidnapping while personally using a knife and child abduction.
Watson and Bell were in a relationship and had a child together. The Shasta Interagency Narcotic Task Force conducted a probation search at the home where Watson and Bell had been residing. Bell, who was home at the time with the couple's 5-month-old baby, was arrested for child endangerment and drug related charges. Shasta County Child and Family Services (CPS) took the baby into protective custody. Bell's mother, who resides in Sacramento County, obtained legal temporary guardianship of the baby. On October 12, 2016, Watson and Bell went to the mother's house for a supervised visit with their child. During the visit, Watson pulled out a knife and left the residence with the baby. Bell and Watson fled back to Shasta County, but were arrested days later.
Allegations that Watson suffered a 1987 strike conviction for first-degree burglary and a 1992 strike conviction for assault with a firearm will be determined at sentencing.
Watson faces a maximum sentence of 38 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 27, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.
On January 30, 2017, Christina Bell pled no contest to child abduction and was sentenced to 364 days in jail. ★

Layoff insurance?
Dear Dave,
Some of the people I work
with have been buying into
a new kind of supplemental
insurance that protects against
layoffs. It costs about \$30 a
month per person, and the
full payout if you're laid off
is \$9,000. It seems to me you
would have to be paying in for
a long time to see that kind of
return, so I wanted to see how
you feel about this kind of
thing.
-Steve

Dear Steve,
Anytime insurance is there
for something you could cover
yourself, it's a good idea to
stop and remember that every
insurance company is still a
business. They must cover all
the costs of operation, plus
make a profit. Believe me, that
takes a lot of money.
Statistically speaking, if lots

of people cashed in on a policy
like this an insurance com-
pany would go out of business.
We're talking about only \$30
a month to cover \$9,000. That
alone tells you not many people
cash in. It's gimmick insurance.
On average, you're losing
money when you buy insurance
of any kind. Again, on average,
over the scope of your lifetime
you'd be better off simply sav-
ing money and self-insuring
against things like this. The
only things I recommend buy-
ing insurance for are things
you can't afford to cover per-
sonally. But you can afford
to cover a layoff by saving an
emergency fund of three to six
months of expenses.
If I'm in your shoes, Steve,
I'm not buying that stuff.

- James
Dear James,
The only reason you're get-
ting a refund is because you had
too much taken out of your pay-
checks in 2017.
Let's say your refund is
\$3,500. Basically, you loaned
the government \$3,500 of your
own money, interest-free. A
refund isn't a gift or reward.
James. It's your own cash that
you get back because you paid
in too much during the previous
year. In your case, that adds up
to almost \$300 a month!
Instead of loaning the govern-
ment money that you worked
hard to earn, wouldn't it be a
better idea to keep it in your
own pocket?

Falcons Baseball, Softball Victorious Over the Weekend

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Baseball
For the second week in a row, the Folsom Lake College baseball team salvaged game three of their series, this time with a 7-4 win over Delta College at Falcon Field on Saturday afternoon. The Falcons avoided a sweep by the Mustangs with timely hitting and some quality pitching by the bullpen. First-inning RBI singles by Josh Winkler and Michael Farley and a bases loaded walk to Andrew Williams gave the Falcons an early 3-0 lead. Delta tied the score in the third, then added a run in the sixth for a 4-3 lead. But the Falcons answered in the bottom half of the sixth when John Mook singled home Andrew Williams and Aidan Malm doubled in two more runs. One out later, Nate George scored from third on a wild pitch to put the Falcons up 7-4. The real key, however, was the Falcon bullpen of Shane Gustafson, Austin Beard and Kennedy Zeinen, who shut down the Mustangs’ potent offense with just one earned run over six innings before turning it over to closer Josh Winkler, who then earned his fourth save of the season with a scoreless ninth. With the win, the Falcons improved to 2-4 in Big 8 Conference play (14-5 overall) and will face Cosumnes River, another 2-4 team, for three games this week. The teams are scheduled to play at CRC on Tuesday, at Folsom Lake on Thursday, then back at CRC on Friday. Weather, however, will likely affect at least one of those games.

Softball

Entering Saturday’s doubleheader against Diablo Valley, the Folsom Lake softball team had shown that they could beat up on lesser opponents, but had yet to demonstrate that same level of confidence against equal or better teams. That changed on Saturday, however, as the

Falcons split the two games against a quality Viking team at Falcon Diamond, losing 11-6 before winning 4-1.

In game one, the Falcons rapped out 16 hits but were held to just six runs, all in the final two innings. Left fielder Tatyana Rosen had four hits and drove in three runs, and pitcher McKenna Rickles had two RBI, but the Falcons had spotted the Vikings with too big a lead to come back.

In the second game, Falcon pitcher Lauren Orris baffled the Vikings with off-speed pitches, giving up just one run on two hits as she induced popups and weak grounders throughout the game. It also helped that a solid Falcon defense played error-free behind Orris. Falcon designated player Tatyana Rosen collected two more hits, including her team-leading ninth double, as she raised her batting average to .478. Rosen also leads the Falcons in hits (33), home runs (3), RBI (23), batting average and slugging (.739). The Falcons improved to 3-4 in Big 8 play (9-11 overall) and will hope to climb above .500 after this week’s games against American River (1-4, 9-12 overall) on Tuesday and Santa Rosa (0-6, 9-10 overall) on Saturday. ★
