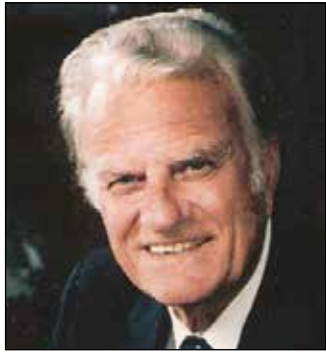

# Telling Our Stories

*African American Family History Seminar Enlightens All*

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The 2018 annual African American Family History Seminar is a good place to discover your ancestry, whether you are a beginner or a seasoned researcher. "Many people come to our seminar who may not be African American, but their child, or their grandchild, or their husband or wife may be," said Sharon Styles, co-chair for the seminar. "Sacramento is so diverse in people that anyone can come and learn. The genealogists who want to be more informed when they're researching for other people, they come to learn."

The seminar will be held from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Saturday, March 10 at the FamilySearch Library, 2745 Eastern Ave., Sacramento. The fee is \$28 and registration by March 2 will guarantee receiving the

syllabus and lunch. For high school and college students registration and lunch is only \$10. Attendees can register online at [www.AAFHS.com](http://www.AAFHS.com).

Styles became a member of the seminar committee in 2013. "I've met so many wonderful people who are also interested in family history and in genealogy, so it's been a win-win," Styles said.

The keynote speaker this year will be genealogist and author Angela Walton-Raji, who has focused her research on blended African and Native American families. California Assemblyman Jim Cooper will speak about his own family research after the opening ceremonies. Each hour of class time will include five different courses to choose from. New this year, volunteers will be available for one-on-one assistance if someone has a particular question, or to help navigate Ancestry and FamilySearch.

When it comes to genealogy, Styles said, not everyone has a passion for it. Nevertheless, she encourages everyone to document stories about their families now because birth and death dates are wonderful, but you still need something about them to make them fully formed people. In two or three, or 20 generations from now, what you record about your story will be valuable. "And when you tell your own family history," Styles continued, "you don't have to worry about someone else telling your story. In order for our stories to be our own, we have to tell them."

Denise Griggs, exhibit chair for this year's seminar, said that her father was orphaned by the time he was eight and all he knew about his parents was that their names were Bud and Sadie. Those turned out to be nicknames and he never found any more information

## CHP Investigation Locates Stolen Vehicles and Narcotics in Bust

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - On February 21, 2018, the California Highway Patrol (CHP), Valley Division Investigative Services Unit (ISU), assisted by the Sacramento County Auto Theft Suppression Task Force (SACCATS), served a search warrant at a residence in Carmichael, California. In recent weeks, the CHP recovered numerous stolen vehicles in a Carmichael neighborhood. Upon further investigation, investigators identified a nearby residence where numerous stolen vehicles were being hidden. CHP investi-



gators served a search warrant at the residence which led to additional search warrants being served at a residence and storage facility in the City of Sacramento.

Twelve stolen vehicles (including cars, trailers, off highway vehicles, and a boat) were discovered on the properties. The total recovery value of the vehicles is estimated at \$35,000. Additionally, narcotics to include heroin, marijuana, and methamphetamine, a street value of approximately \$158,000.00, were discovered. Four arrests were made as a result of this operation. The investigation is ongoing.

The safe securement of the residence and property required coordination of 20 officers and investigators, as well as the assistance from the CHP's Air Operations Unit and K-9 Units. SACCATS is comprised of personnel from the California Highway Patrol, Sacramento County Probation, Citrus Heights Police Department, California Department of Motor Vehicles, and the California Department of Insurance. ★

# U.S. Navy Concert Band Delivers Unforgettable Performance at Cordova High

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - More than 1,300 spectators were treated to a once in a lifetime experience as the 60-member U.S. Navy Concert Band performed a fast moving 90-minute concert at Cordova High School in Rancho Cordova on February 22.

Cordova High, which itself boasts six bands that perform throughout the community, hosted the event. The city was the fifth stop of an 11-state Goodwill tour throughout the West Coast and Midwest.

As musical ambassadors for the U.S. Navy representing 320,000 active-duty Sailors serving around the world, these musicians go where ships can't. Ten bands travel to connect people all across America to its Navy and to promote good will in other countries. Other touring bands include jazz, country bluegrass, chorus and rock. The average age is 27.

To set the tone for the evening, the Cordova High Air Force Junior ROTC Color Guard presented the Colors. The audience was completely engaged with the wide variety of family-oriented pieces

from traditional marching band tunes, classical pieces, popular movie songs and others.

Concert moderator Senior Chief Musician Courtney Williams not only served as narrator for the program but thrilled the audience when he broke into song in his rich bass voice. They were further delighted as he was accompanied by Musician 1st Class alto Kristine Hsia for two duets.

Four outstanding student musicians from Cordova High had the honor of performing John Philip Sousa's

# Grant Applications Now Open for City’s Community Enhancement Fund

### RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- In November 2014, voters in Rancho Cordova approved Measure H, a ½ cent local sales tax measure to provide funding for the City’s Community Enhancement Fund. Since then, new after-school programs were created, students attended Folsom Lake College fee free, more than 365 trees were planted in local neighborhoods, and other projects and programs were put in place to help beautify and enhance the community. Without the support of the Community Enhancement Fund, many of these efforts would have never seen the light of day. As 2018 continues to move forward, the annual call for grant applications for the Community Enhancement Fund is here.

The City of Rancho Cordova is now accepting grant applications for the 2018/2019 fiscal year, and applicants will have until March 15, 2018 to submit their proposals. The City will accept applications from individual residents, organizations, businesses, and community partners who are interested in enhancing the Rancho Cordova community. The grants awarded in this call for applications are

part of the estimated \$7.9 million budget in 2018/2019 for the City’s Community Enhancement Fund.

The City anticipates awarding approximately \$1.7 million in community grants, including: \$952 thousand for arts, culture, history, entertainment, and sports; \$476 thousand for education; and \$300 thousand for other projects. The remaining funds are allocated to other community priorities such as community development, economic development, public safety, public works, and more. The actual budget may vary based on final approved funding allocations.

The criteria considered by the City during the project selection process includes:

- Community Pride
- Civic Engagement
- Quality of Life
- Public Safety
- Arts, Culture, History, and Entertainment
- Sports
- Children and Youth
- Education
- Business/Economic Development

Grant applications that

include a project or program operating on a K-12 school site must request the endorsement of the applicable school’s superintendent(s), and must be submitted to the school district representative with the draft grant proposal no later than March 8, 2018.

After applications are received by the City, staff will review each application and supplemental materials, and will share the initial review of applications with City Council in April. Applicants may be contacted to present their project during the May City Council meetings. Funding decisions could be made as early as May and formally adopted in early June 2018. Staff intends to notify all applicants of the funding decisions by late June 2018.

Those interested in submitting a grant proposal can apply through an online application or submit a written funding request. “Washington Post” with the band.

One piece performed at every concert is “Turning Point,” arranged by retired Senior Chief Musician Bryan Kidd, and narrated over music by Williams. Williams took listeners on a powerful eight-minute journey into the four-day naval battle against Japan off Midway Island in June of 1942. The naval victory proved to be the turning point of the war in the Pacific during World War II. The performance brought the house down as the entire audience rose to its feet with thunderous applause.

The U.S. Navy’s reputation for having some of the finest and most dedicated musicians in the country does not come by accident. Upon joining the Navy band every member is already an accomplished musician in their own right, having at least





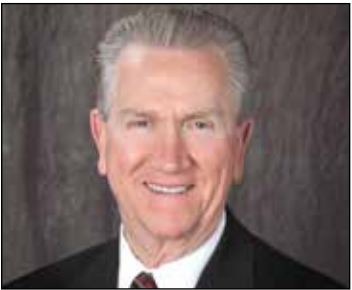

## RS-25 Engine Throttles Up for Deep Space Exploration

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - With an eye toward future deep space missions, Aerojet Rocketdyne and NASA today powered up the RS-25 main engine for the agency's powerful heavy-lift Space Launch System (SLS) to its highest thrust levels yet.

During the recent 260-second hot fire test, the RS-25 engine throttled up to 113 percent of its original design thrust level. The first four flights of SLS will use engines that max out at 109 percent of rated thrust (these same engines operated at 104.5 percent rated thrust when flown on the Space Shuttle). New RS-25 engines developed under Aerojet Rocketdyne's restart program will baseline their thrust at 111 percent.

"Increased thrust requirements for the RS-25 are just one of the many changes in the SLS rocket's performance that will facilitate our nation's deep space exploration goals and objectives," said Dan Adamski, RS-25 program director at Aerojet Rocketdyne. "While we can analytically calculate engine performance and structural capabilities at these higher power levels, actually demonstrating that performance with an engine hot fire provides the added confidence that these engines will meet all specification requirements demanded of SLS."

The RS-25 is an updated version of the Space Shuttle Main Engine that helped power the Space Shuttle into space. There are 16 flight engines that will power the first four SLS flights in inventory at Aerojet Rocketdyne's Stennis facility. Fourteen of the engines previously flew aboard the Space Shuttle. The SLS rocket was designed for missions beyond low-Earth orbit carrying crew or cargo to the Moon or beyond. The initial configuration for what SLS can carry past low-Earth orbit and on to the Moon is

more than 26 metric tons, with a final configuration of at least 45 metric tons. All SLS configurations are powered by four RS-25 engines attached to the 212-foot-tall core stage, the backbone of the rocket being built at NASA's Michoud Assembly Facility in New Orleans.

"One of the key features of SLS is its versatility to support human and robotic missions, launching spacecraft, habitats and astronauts to a variety of deep space destinations," said Eileen Drake, CEO and president of Aerojet Rocketdyne. "The lifting power of the SLS will permit NASA to get bigger payloads to distant planets more quickly than any other launcher operating today."

The latest RS-25 hot fire test also was the fourth involving an additively manufactured Pogo Accumulator Assembly. The assembly is the largest 3-D printed RS-25 component tested to date. Newly manufactured RS-25 engines, to be used starting with the fifth SLS mission, will incorporate the additively manufactured Pogo Accumulator Assembly and other 3-D printed parts currently in development. This effort is one of many

focused on making the engine more affordable for future missions.

The first SLS mission is scheduled for fiscal year 2020, when the rocket will blast off carrying an uncrewed version of NASA's Orion spacecraft on a mission beyond the Moon farther than any human-rated space vehicle has ever traveled. The SLS-Orion combo is scheduled to fly a similar mission profile in the early 2020s, only this time with an astronaut crew on board.

Griggs was eight when her father told her that, and she said to him, “If you promise me you won’t die when I’m a kid, I’ll find your family when I grow up.” When Griggs was at Oral Roberts University, she finally did and faxed the information to her father the day before Father’s Day. She had found a census and by his older siblings’ names in that

document, Griggs found her father’s parents. That is when she got into genealogy, 30 years ago.

# A Final Tribute Honoring a Special Lady During Women’s History Month

Women’s History Month celebrates the vital role of women in American history. The vibrancy and legacy of women past and present unifies and nourishes our collective whole as we march onward towards fundamental human equality.

Lieutenant Lynn Balmer, born September 12, 1907, on the family homestead in Plumas, California, saw history unfold before her eyes and created a bit of history herself. On her 108th birthday, she was recognized by American Legion Post 709, Rancho Cordova, California, as the oldest living female member of the American Legion.

However, now this special lady has been called to Post Everlasting. Lynn Balmer died peacefully at her home at Country Village in Chico, California, on December 9, 2017, at the vintage age of 110.

She was a lifetime member of American Legion Post 709, Rancho Cordova, California, where her nephew, Sgt. Ken Hicks, U.S. Air force veteran, was Historian. He is currently an active member of Post 709.

She was also a lifetime member of the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 637, Citrus Heights, California.

After WWII started, Lynn Balmer joined the military, “to free a man for active duty.” She served in the U.S. Coast Guard and achieved the rank of Lieutenant (junior grade) LTJG. Lt. Balmer secured a top secret clearance and worked in Military Intelligence. Using her keen mathematical abilities, she read and interpreted weather maps and charts and used morse code to help ships navigate through dangerous waters and adverse weather conditions between the United States and England.

Prior to her military service, Lt. Balmer was an elementary school teacher, teaching her first class in 1927. She later taught mathematics to high school students. In 1943, her passion for teaching and love for her students, (having no children, she treated each and every child as her own) gave way to her patriotism and love of country when she enlisted in the U. S. Coast Guard.

Yes, Lt. Balmer entered two noble professions and gave of her immense talents whole heartedly.

Between the years of 1946 and 1967 she attended the University of Washington part time, taught mathematics to junior high school students, volunteered at a children’s orthopedic hospital, and was a professional skater to boot. She retired and moved to Chico, California in the late 1990s with her husband, Charles.

Lynn Balmer’s passion for life lives on. She told stories about living through World War 1, living through the nationwide flu epidemic in 1918 by wearing bags of asafetida around her neck to school, living

through the Great Depression, and when there were shortages of grain and sugar, feeling very lucky that her father had bees so their family of nine children had honey.

Her nephew, Sgt. Hicks, and her extended family and friends continue to carry on Lt. Balmer’s storytelling to the delight of young and old alike.

The Women’s Suffrage movement was going strong in her childhood and when Lynn was 18 years old, she recalled that her mother got to vote for the first time in her life during the 1920 election. When Lynn became of legal age, she, too, proudly exercised her right to vote and encouraged all women, young and old, to exercise their hard-earned right to vote.

Lt. Balmer died at 110 years old leaving a personal legacy of a life well lived. She did not let life pass her by. Her deep love of country and patriotism ignited her commitment to help protect our democracy and way of life. That love still flourishes in the lives she touched personally and by the sheer power of her being.

She had richness of character, strength, gentleness, and a pioneer spirit exemplifying qualities of our American Legion veterans.

During Women’s History Month, it is only fitting we pay special tribute to Lt. Balmer and reflect upon and celebrate the lives of famous women pioneers and leaders in our history, as well as celebrate the unsung women heroes of our daily lives. ★

# Sacramento County DA Reports



## Defendant Convicted of 10 Counts of Child Sexual Assault

**DATE:** February 16, 2018  
**CASE:** Victor Miroshnichenko (Case #16FE020660)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney TeriAnn Grimes, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Victor Miroshnichenko was convicted by a jury of two counts of sex act with a child under 10 years old and eight counts of lewd and lascivious acts on a child under 14.

When the victim was 9 years old, her grandmother suffered three strokes and came to live with the victim’s family. Another member of the victim’s family, Miroshnichenko, also came to visit several days each week. Miroshnichenko began grooming the victim by showing her pornographic books and videos. When the victim was 10 years old, he began sexually assaulting her for the next two years. The victim disclosed the abuse in October 2016, when her mom found her hiding in the bathroom after Miroshnichenko had just come out of the bathroom.

Miroshnichenko faces a maximum sentence of 52 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for March 16, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 15 before the Honorable Laurel White.

## Defendant Sentenced to 12 Yrs. Prison for Felony Real Estate Fraud

**CASE:** Dennis Joseph Giacometti (Case #16FE011744)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Ruth Young, Real Estate Fraud Unit

The Honorable Patrick Marlette sentenced Dennis Joseph Giacometti (aka Dennis Jacopetti) to 12 years in prison. On January 12, 2018, Giacometti pled no contest to forgery, grand theft and filing false documents. Giacometti also admitted the aggravated white collar enhancement and the enhancement for commission of a felony while released from custody on another case.

Giacopetti advertised the businesses Legal Aid Services of California and Legal Aid of California online and through Craigslist. Although he was not an attorney, Giacometti represented himself as an attorney in order to obtain clients. Through these false representations, he unlawfully obtained legal fees from

multiple victims. Giacometti also filed false legal documents and illegally acted as a foreclosure consultant.

This case was investigated and prosecuted by the Sacramento County District Attorney’s Real Estate Fraud Unit.

## High-Risk DV Offender Convicted for Multiple DV Related Charges

**DATE:** February 23, 2018  
**CASE:** Patrick Lee (Case #16FE021010)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham, High Risk Domestic Violence Unit

Patrick Lee was convicted by a jury of domestic violence, criminal threats, child endangerment, kidnapping and false imprisonment. The jury also found true that Lee used a knife and caused great bodily injury involving domestic violence.

Lee and the victim lived together with their one-year-old child. On June 21, 2016, Lee assaulted the victim, causing visible injury. The victim’s cousin reported it to the police. Lee was arrested and charged with domestic violence. He bailed out of custody and reconciled with the victim. On October 15, 2016, Lee demanded the victim cut off her hair. He told her if she didn’t cut it off, he would kill her and displayed a knife. When their son began to cry, he threatened to kill her and the child if she did not stop him from crying. Lee then hit her, causing an injury. The victim did not report the incident, nor did she seek medical treatment for her injury. Approximately two weeks later, the victim decided to leave Lee. On October 29, 2016, Lee showed up at her work unannounced and demanded she talk to him. He threatened to hurt her and the customers in the store if she did not comply. The victim went out to the parking lot to talk with Lee in his car. Lee then drove out of the parking lot with the victim in his car and told her he was going to kill her. Believing he would kill her, the victim jumped from the moving car. She suffered a fractured skull and extreme facial trauma, which required a metal plate in her face and skin grafts.

The victim later reported that Lee was emotionally, economically and physically abusive to her throughout their relationship.

Lee faces a maximum sentence of 18 years in prison. Sentencing is set for March 22, 2018, in Department 40 before the Honorable Raoul Thorbourne. ★

## Lancers Surrender Lead, Season Comes to an End

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Del Campo Cougars hosted the Cordova Lancers in the opening round of the Sac-Joaquin Section Division III Boys Basketball Playoffs on Wednesday night. The 4th seeded Cougars entered the playoffs with a 19-8 record while the 13th seeded Lancers entered at 14-12. There was a good sized crowd on hand to support the teams that are separated by just eight miles – and they were not disappointed.

The Cougars jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead before Cordova finally got on the board two minutes in after a steal and finish by senior point guard Calvin Augusta. Del Campo senior small forward Michael Holmes answered with his first bucket of the night but the Lancers responded with back to back threes, cutting the lead to 9-8. The Lancers’ gritty defensive intensity picked up, but their offense remained inconsistent despite grabbing the slim lead. Cordova led 13-12 after the opening quarter.

After being frustrated by the Lancers physical defense in first quarter, Del Campo’s Holmes opened the second up with a three-point play to get the home crowd going. But the Lancers’ Sam Danielyan nailed a big three in retaliation to retake the lead at 22-20. Neither team could gain much separation as the half ended at 30-27 in favor of Cordova.

The teams exchanged two baskets each out half time and both offenses appeared to be fired up. Holmes started being more aggressive for the Cougars after a

quieter first half in which he only scored nine points. But Augusta’s fiery point guard play combined with some key three point shooting wouldn’t allow Del Campo to recapture the lead. Cordova was feeling confident as Danielyan nailed another deep three as the third quarter expired to take a 50-45 lead into the final quarter.

It was a lift off of the bench by Del Campo senior Marshaun Hunter that got the home crowd back into the game early in the fourth. Hunter was all over the offensive glass, giving the Cougars much needed second chance opportunities. But it was Holmes who took over down the stretch. He would turn it on and score 19 in the second half, including 14 in the fourth quarter to lead Del Campo back from what was looking to be a big upset in the opening round of the Sac-Joaquin playoffs.

Defensively, the Cougars swarmed Augusta and finally found a way to keep him out of the paint. The Lancers offense

couldn’t put anything else together as their three pointers dried up. Between the late offensive outburst from Holmes and big threes from guards Rory McGinnis and Jordan Bryant, the Cougars took the lead with just under three minutes to go and held on for the 71-65 win.

“I just kept playing,” Holmes said in regards to his tough start. Del Campo moves on to face the Patterson Tigers on Friday night but Holmes and the Cougars don’t care about the matchup because they know that regardless of their opponent they have to play much sharper basketball if they want to reach the ultimate goal of winning a championship.

As for the Lancers, their season comes to an end sooner than they had hoped. But at 14-13 overall, a winning season and a playoff appearance is still a bright spot for a young team that suited up five underclassmen and dealt with the absence of senior point guard Calvin Augusta due to a knee injury for the better part of the season. ★
