## Time to Lend a Hand *Sierra Service Project Seeks Applicants*

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Sierra Service Project, in coordination with the City of Rancho Cordova, is seeking applicants for free exterior home repair and improvement services as part of the Rancho Cordova Neighborhood Beautification Program. Sierra Service Project is a local non-profit organization that has organized and managed volunteer community service activities for the past 40 years.

Sierra Service Project will provide light exterior home repairs free-of-charge. Ideal projects for this project include fence and gate replacement, exterior painting, chain link fence removal, and general yard cleanup.

Applicants must own the home and fall within certain income levels. Additionally, the property must be located within Rancho Cordova city limits. Low-income residents, seniors, and veterans are encouraged to apply.

Volunteering is FREE and includes instruction, supervision, lunch, and a t-shirt. Sierra Service Project encourages all types of volunteer groups to register including youth groups, and service clubs.

The project is supported by a grant from the City's Community Enhancement Fund, and this is the third year Sierra Service Project has provided a neighborhood beautification program in Rancho Cordova.

## Contracts Awarded for Gaps in Homeless Services

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The Board of Supervisors on February 6th, authorized the County Department of Human Assistance (DHA) to enter into an agreement with Wind Youth Services (WYS) for \$380,000 for rehousing and supportive services for youth who are homeless or at risk of homelessness; and \$160,000 to Sacramento Self Help Housing (SSHH) for navigation and rehousing services for unsheltered homeless populations in unincorporated areas of Sacramento County. Services will run February through October 2018 and may be extended further.

In July 2017, the Board approved funding for the implementation of four County homeless initiatives to improve the County's response to homelessness in Sacramento County. The initiatives provide for a range of services, including shelter, transitional housing, and permanent housing services specialized for a variety of households: families, individuals, and those experiencing long-term homelessness. Currently those initiatives are all in various stages of implementation.

In September, the Board approved an additional \$540,000 in funding to address service gaps in the homeless initiatives and to serve vulnerable sub-populations. DHA released a Request for Proposals seeking services for families, individuals, transitional aged youth, ages 18 to 24, and unsheltered homeless in unincorporated areas of the County. The County received five responses to the RFP.

## Ol' Republic Brewery Taps Second Home in Barrel District

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Simon Olney and Jim Harte are pinching themselves. The two are co-founders of the award-winning Ol' Republic Brewery and forthcoming Roadhouse restaurant in Nevada City. They are preparing for a March opening of their second location in Rancho's fast-growing Barrel District, which the two brew masters had no idea existed prior to meeting with the city.

Ol' Republic is taking over the former location for American River Brewery, which closed last year on Trade Center Drive. They'll assume roughly 30,000 square feet of space that will serve as both home to the company's Sacramento

self-distribution center and tap room serving 12 different brews, as well as parlor games, including foosball, shuffle board, pool and darts.

It took years to find the location, which, to their benefit, happened to be in what is arguably the most-beer friendly commercial center in the region at the moment.

"We can't believe our luck in finding this location because we didn't know the Barrel District was here," said Harte, a Citrus Heights native and former wine distributor. "We have been looking for a second location in Sacramento for almost six years to address the logistical nightmare of doing our deliveries from Nevada City. We got very lucky when we heard about this space opening up because not only is it a centralized hub point, it's also a turn-key space for our second home."

# Controlling the Chaos When Disaster Strikes

*Verizon's Emergency Response Center Has Connectivity Covered*

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Likely, as you watched recent television or streaming images of emergency rescue operations following the devastating fires and subsequent mudslides in Southern California, for example, you gave little thought to how first-responders on the ground, in the air and elsewhere were keeping the lines of communication flowing as they scrambled into gear to save lives and prepare for recovery operations.

Behind the scenes, mobile carriers such as Verizon Wireless were doing some of the most critical work necessary in these types of situations: addressing cellular network failures, which are common in natural disasters. Depending on the situation, this can include anything from establishing mobile satellite systems to sending drones into those places humans can't go, including collapsed buildings, tunnels and unstable structures.

Recently, officials overseeing Verizon's Rocklin-based emergency services switch facility held a "Public Safety Day" event, offering some of its clients a tour of their Rocklin switch facility, once of several nationwide keeping an eye on their perspective, regional networking systems, as well as TV news coverage of any and all disasters or emergencies where first-responders are unable to get on the network.

Built in 2003, the facility's sister location is based in Sunnyvale. Roughly 30 people work at the Rocklin facility; however, there are more than 100 others centers set up across the country employing more than 46 teams comprised of roughly 160,000 people.

"We like to think of ourselves as 'pre-responders,'" said Paul Lynch, who manages Verizon's two Northern California facilities. "We monitor situations going on all over the country and we have crews on the ground from the get-go to provide onsite support for first responders to make sure they are connected and talking to one another."

The invite-only tours are offered monthly as a way to show emergency response teams from Cal Fire, police and sheriff's departments, the

Department of Fish Wildlife and others exactly how well-prepared and equipped the company is at providing them with on-demand connectivity during a natural or man-made disaster.

The team will mobilize portable networking call centers, mobile satellite stations and deployment of any one of the company's veritable barnyard of "cool tools," such as cells on wheels (COWs),

cells on light trucks (COLTS), HVACs on roadside equipment (HORSEs), and generators on a trailer (GOATs).

The Rocklin switch facility tour included a walk through the engineer's command center or NOC (Network Operations Center), where 24-hour "surveillance" of its networking operations run across wall-to-wall monitors, scrutinized around the clock by a team

of six engineers, three on the day shift, three on at night.

"We don't highlight any of this," said Lynch. "We don't grandstand what's behind our network. But it is important for our customers working in the emergency fields to have confidence in who they partner with and to see up close exactly what we can do and how quickly we can do it."

Verizon's Crisis Response Teams, in Rocklin and nationwide, conduct regularly scheduled drills and emergency tests to ensure that they are ready to roll when they are needed, including shutting down the battery rooms and switching over to generators.

"We don't want to be the last to know that we've got failure," said Lynch.

Tim Kuka, who oversees the Rocklin facility's Network Equipment Center (NET) located right next door to the switch facility, gave a tour of the state of the art building. The tour offered visitors a sneak-peak at Verizon's local 4-G networking nerve center, a mind-blowingly pristine space known as the Data Hall or "cloud room." The building was constructed in 2014 and contains an impressively intricate layout of data backup units and an equally mind-numbing amount of cable.

"If you would take all the conduit in this building alone and stretch it out, it would go all the way to San Francisco," said Kuka.

First-responders to man-made emergencies also often require backup power and or connectivity support. Case in

point: Verizon's switch teams worked closely with FBI officials during the mass shootings that occurred at a San Bernardino-based regional center in December of 2015, quickly mobilizing command centers, establishing private networking and satellite communications lines and serving to provide backup power and other services to all agencies aiding victims and overseeing the recovery efforts.

The switch facility and NEC tours culminated with a close-up demonstration of some of those cool tools, including Rocklin's own RAD (Robotic Assistance Device), a four-wheel robot that looks like a scooter with a camera tower perched on its front end.

"She can go into dull, dark, dirty and dangerous places," said Jim Larson a vendor with Robotic Assistance Devices, which partners with Verizon to provide the RAD. "She can be manually operated or put on automatic to handle perimeter security during a disaster or emergency, taking pictures the whole time while emergency personnel are doing their jobs."

Verizon's 46 emergency networking teams across the country also are prepared and ready to help set up networking stations with water, food and other supplies, as well as connectivity support relief efforts, specifically by the Red Cross. Its response teams also will provide first responders and others with handsets, dedicated mobile hotspot devices and private networks.

"Everything we provide is free, except in cases where we have to set up satellites," said Lynch. ★

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Rancho Cordova Police Department is pleased to introduce you to our new Problem Oriented Policing (POP) Supervisor – Sergeant Vanessa Johnson.

Sergeant Johnson began her path towards a career in law enforcement while studying criminal justice at California State University, Sacramento. She had completed an internship with the California Department of Insurance Fraud Division and was considering going into law enforcement at the state level.

However, one of her professors was a lieutenant with the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Department and inspired her to apply for the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Department Academy. She enrolled in and attended the Academy after she graduated from college.

Sergeant Johnson has been with the Sheriff’s Department for 15 years and worked in a variety of positions, including airport, marine enforcement, civil division, internal affairs, and the communications center.

In January 2017, she had an opportunity to come to the Rancho Cordova Police

Department (RCPD) on patrol. She had worked throughout the Sacramento region but never in Rancho Cordova. Rancho Cordova had an outstanding reputation of having good officer morale, a positive work environment, and a supportive city, and she had an interest in experiencing the City firsthand.

“The City of Rancho Cordova has held true to its reputation,” said Sergeant Johnson. “Coming to Rancho Cordova was one of the best decisions I’ve ever made in my career. It’s a pleasure to be part of the dedicated and motivated team at the Rancho Cordova Police Department.”

In December, Sergeant Johnson was selected to be the Supervisor of RCPD’s Problem Oriented Policing (POP) Unit. The POP Unit focuses on improving quality of life and strengthening neighborhoods in Rancho Cordova by concentrating on long-term public safety issues.

In her new role, Sergeant Johnson is helping to launch the City’s new Homeless Outreach Team, which consists of two full-time officers on the POP Unit, the City’s code enforcement department, and the City’s Homeless Navigator. The team’s primary responsibility is to

connect the homeless to housing and supportive services provided through regional partners, and work with local businesses to address homelessness.

Sergeant Johnson hopes to continue to work closely with the Rancho Cordova Police Activities League (PAL) program. The 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization builds relationships between RCPD and youth through a variety of programs, at no cost to the kids. Her hope is to continue finding programs that RCPD can offer to the more than 1,200 kids the program serves each year.

Sergeant Johnson wants to further build relationships and communication between the POP Unit and residents and businesses.

“My goal is for our POP Unit to continue to strengthen relationships with our community by creating partnerships and strategies for reducing crime in our neighborhoods,” said Sergeant Johnson. “I also want to connect with and empower residents so they can work alongside us to address quality of life issues within our community.”

That will be the building of the other 50 apartments in Mather Veterans Village. It will be 44 one-bedroom apartments and 6 two-bedroom apartments for veterans. Those apartments, like the first 50 apartments in Phase One, are going to be permanent housing apartments; not transitional.

It took almost two years to get the vouchers, tax credits, grants and additional help from the county to get where we are now. Something that has surfaced just recently is getting enough labor to do the work and getting material to build the structure for Phases Two and Three. There is so much work being done throughout the state because of the forest fires last year and the flooding last year that it may slow us down. Hopefully we can get started very soon, finally get the housing for the homeless veterans completed, and they can get the help from the Mather VA Hospital that they deserve.

## Contracts Awarded for Gaps in Homeless Services

*Continued from page 1*

The evaluators determined that the Wind Youth Services program integrated a spectrum of services through a strong partnership among three youth service agencies working to not only support youth experiencing homelessness stabilize in housing and employment, but to help this population avoid homelessness altogether.

Evaluators also determined Sacramento Self-Help Housing's (SSHH) proposal addressed a

gap in homeless services by expanding engagement and rehousing services for persons experiencing unsheltered homelessness in unincorporated areas of the County. This program will involve a strong partnership with SSHH, neighborhood leaders, such as the Carmichael Homeless Assistance Resource Team, law enforcement and DHA staff.

All of the selected programs will provide services that further the County's objectives to fund

services that promote permanent housing placement, residential stability, and increased skill level or income in order to prepare participants to live more independently.

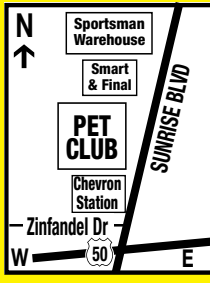

# One Year Later: The Great Uncertainty of the Oroville Dam and Spillway

One year ago, heavy rain-fall caused Oroville Dam to near its 3.5 million acre feet of water capacity. As is common practice, the main spillway was

opened to relieve some pressure, and on February 7th, a crater appeared in the middle of the spillway.

Everyone knows exactly what happened next. Dam operators had no choice but to continue using the damaged spillway, albeit at a lower output, and the hole grew. Operators hoped to avoid using the emergency spillway, which hadn’t ever been tested or used since the dam’s completion in 1968. But on February 11, 2017 – one year ago today – water began to pour over the emergency spillway. In less than 24 hours, nearly 200,000 people were ordered to evacuate as fear grew that the emergency spillway would fail due to unexpected erosion.

The spillway never gave out and no one was injured. But for a while, no one was certain what would happen – or what led to this near-disaster in the first place.

A year later, there is still a great deal of uncertainty, as well as hundreds of millions of dollars in damages. Repairs to the spillway have been ongoing while the Independent Forensic Team investigated what happened. The results were not good. They discovered that the original design of the spillways, coupled with years of inadequate maintenance, led to the main spillway failure and the unknown factor of actual usage of the emergency spillway.

The State of California has

requested FEMA to reimburse 75% of the estimated \$870 million price tag, but in previous correspondence with Congress, FEMA has been unclear whether it has the authority to fund these types of repairs. In the context of other disasters, FEMA has stated that it does not have the legal authority to fund projects where FEMA determines there was a “lack of maintenance,” and, as well, can only provide reimbursements for work to bring facilities back to their “pre-disaster design.”

FEMA’s reimbursement guidelines are definitely cause for concern. The Independent Forensic Team determined that Oroville Dam spillways’ original design and inadequate

maintenance contributed to the spillway failure. Knowing that, it’d make little sense for FEMA to reimburse the state only to return the main spillway to the same condition that played a role in causing the disaster in the first place.

I am working to get answers on this issue – and to gain some degree of certainty for nearby residents that a similar disaster can’t happen again. Last week, I sent a letter to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) seeking clarification on the agency’s authority to provide public funding for repairs of the Oroville Dam spillway.

We must proceed in a manner that ensures the safety of those impacted by the spillway

incident and, importantly, actually improves the spillway and all related infrastructure. These guidelines leave a lot of questions unanswered, and I am asking for some clarity.

The year following the Oroville Dam spillway collapse has been busy, but I’ll continue working with the necessary agencies and local officials to ensure that all of our questions are answered – and that Oroville, Butte County and Northern California aren’t subject to a disaster like this again, but instead have the positive assets the lake is for, such as flood control, recreation, stored water for people and the economy and clean hydroelectric power to meet our 21st century needs. ★

# Key IRS Identity Theft Indicators Continue Dramatic Decline in 2017; Security Summit Marks 2017 Progress Against Identity Theft

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The Internal Revenue Service has announced steep declines in tax-related identity theft in 2017, attributing the success to the Security Summit initiatives that help safeguard the nation's taxpayers.

Key indicators of identity theft dropped for the second year in a row in 2017. This includes a 40 percent decline in taxpayers reporting they are victims of identity theft in 2016. Since 2015, the number of tax-related identity theft victims has fallen by almost two-thirds and billions of dollars of taxpayer refunds have been protected.

"These dramatic declines reflect the continuing success of the Security Summit effort," said Acting IRS Commissioner David Kautter. "This partnership between the IRS, states and the tax community is helping protect taxpayers against identity theft. More work remains in this effort, and we look forward to continuing this collaborative effort to fight identity theft and refund fraud."

The Internal Revenue Service, state tax agencies and the tax industry have started their third filing season working as the Security Summit, a private-public sector partnership formed in 2015 to combat identity theft.

Because the IRS and Summit partners have stepped up efforts to stop suspected fraudulent returns from entering tax processing systems, there continues to be a substantial decline in the number of taxpayers reporting that they are victims of identity theft.

Here are key calendar-year 2017 indicators:

- The number of taxpayers reporting to the IRS that they are victims of identity theft continued its major decline. In 2017, the IRS received 242,000 reports from taxpayers compared to 401,000 in 2016 – a 40 percent decline. This was the second year in a row this number fell, dropping from the 677,000 victim reports in 2015. Overall, the number of identity theft victims has fallen nearly 65 percent

between 2015 and 2017.

- The number of tax returns with confirmed identity theft declined to 597,000 in 2017, compared to 883,000 in 2016 – a 32 percent decline. The amount of refunds protected from those fraudulent returns was \$6 billion in 2017, compared to \$6.4 billion in 2016. In 2015, there were 1.4 million confirmed identity theft returns totaling \$8.7 billion in refunds protected. Overall during the 2015-2017 period, the number of confirmed identity theft tax returns fell by 57 percent with more than \$20 billion in taxpayer refunds being protected.

- The financial industry is a key partner in fighting identity theft, helping the IRS recover fraudulent refunds that may have been issued. In 2017, banks recovered 144,000 refunds compared to 124,000 in 2016 – a 16 percent increase. The amount of refunds recovered was \$204 million in 2017, compared to \$281 million in 2016. In 2015, the financial industry recovered 249,000 refunds totaling \$852 million.

- In addition to these steep declines, the IRS also is continues reducing the year-over-year inventory backlog of taxpayers who file identity theft reports. For fiscal year 2017, the beginning inventory of identity theft reports submitted by taxpayers was approximately 34,000, under 10 percent of the fiscal year 2013 beginning inventory of 372,000 taxpayer identity theft cases.

These declines follow extensive Summit education efforts in 2017. The Summit partnership conducted awareness campaigns for tax professionals and taxpayers because everyone has a role in fighting against identity theft.

## Cybercriminals Looking for New Lines of Attack

Last year, multiple data breaches from outside the tax system means cybercriminals have basic information on

millions of Americans, such as names, Social Security numbers and addresses. The steps taken by the Summit partners since 2015 help protect against fraudulent tax filings that use this basic data. As the IRS and Summit partners have strengthened their defenses, identity thieves are looking to steal more detailed financial information to help provide a more detailed, realistic tax return to better impersonate legitimate taxpayers. Because they need more personal data, cyberthieves increasingly are targeting tax professionals, human resource departments, businesses and other places that have large amounts of sensitive financial information. The IRS continues to see a number of these schemes in attempts to get taxpayer W-2 information from tax professionals and employers.

Everyone must be vigilant and alert. Both taxpayers and tax professionals are encouraged to:

- Use Security Software. Always use security software with firewall and anti-virus protections. Make sure the security software is always turned on and can automatically update. Encrypt sensitive files, such as tax records, stored on computers. Use strong, unique passwords for each account.
- Watch out for scams. Learn to recognize and avoid phishing emails, threatening calls and texts from thieves posing as legitimate organizations such as banks, credit card companies and even the IRS or a tax software firm. Do not click on links or download attachments from unknown or suspicious emails.
- Protect personal data. Don't routinely carry Social Security cards and make sure tax records are secure. Shop at reputable online retailers. Treat personal information like cash; don't leave it lying around.

## Defendant Sentenced for Sexual Assault & Abuse of Elderly Victim

DATE: February 2, 2018

CASE: James Harold Garner (Case #15F02008)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Michael Savage sentenced James Harold Garner to 45 years in prison. On November 30, 2017, a jury convicted Garner of three counts of rape by force and two counts of forced oral copulation with allegations the crimes were committed against an elderly victim on all counts. Garner was also convicted of one count of elder abuse.

Garner was the live-in caregiver of the 65-year-old victim, who had survived a stroke and suffered from COPD. The victim had significant issues with mobility, strength, communication, and memory. On March 29, 2015, Garner went into the victim's room where he repeatedly raped and committed other acts of sexual assault against the victim.

## Defendant Convicted for Multiple Child Sexual Assaults

DATE: February 2, 2018

CASE: Anthony Johnson (Case #16FE015230)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Patrick Foster, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Anthony Johnson was convicted by a jury of 16 counts of committing a lewd act upon a child, three counts of forcible lewd act upon a child and one count of adult using a minor.

On April 8, 2016, law enforcement was notified that the victim had been sexually assaulted by Johnson. When the victim was later interviewed, he reported a long history of sexual abuse by Johnson.

When law enforcement arrested Johnson for these reported assaults, they learned of another victim who had made a prior 2011 report that she had been sexually assaulted by Johnson in the City of San Pablo.

Johnson faces a maximum sentence of 46 years in prison. Sentencing is set for March 9, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

## Defendant Sentenced for Felony Hit and Run, Insurance Fraud

DATE: February 5, 2018

CASE: Shane Sienes (Case #17FE009293 and #17FE012702)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney

Suzanne Salazar, Insurance Fraud Unit

On December 12, 2017, Shane Sienes pled no contest to felony hit and run with death or injury, felony insurance fraud and misdemeanor charges for "wet" reckless driving and insurance fraud. On January 29, 2018, the Honorable Lawrence Brown sentenced Sienes to 250 days in county jail, 5 years formal probation and ordered him to pay \$40,361.65 in victim restitution.

Sienes rear-ended two cars that were stopped at a red light. He then fled the scene after briefly talking with a witness, who reported Sienes appeared under the influence. Two victims suffered injuries from the impact. Sienes later falsely reported to his insurance company that the vehicle he was driving had been stolen. Further investigation revealed that approximately two months before, he made another false claim to his insurance company for damages to his vehicle in an attempt to receive payment for which he was not entitled.

This case was prosecuted by the District Attorney's Insurance Fraud Unit.

## Former School Employee Sentenced for Felony Insurance Fraud

DATE: February 8, 2018

CASE: Anthony Johnson (Case #16FE015230)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney John MacKenzie, Insurance Fraud Unit

Marcus Kelly pled no contest to felony insurance fraud. The Honorable Lawrence Brown sentenced Kelly to 30 days in county jail, 5 years formal probation and ordered him to pay restitution in the amount of \$40,097.40.

Kelly was employed by the Sacramento City Unified School District as a janitor. On September 9, 2014, he reported he had an unwitnessed slip-and-fall at work, resulting in reported back and leg pain. Kelly was placed on modified duty, including limitations on how much he could lift and limitations on bending or twisting at the waist. At the end of September 2014, Kelly reported his condition had worsened. When the restrictions could not be accommodated, he was placed off work. Kelly later told a doctor that his pain was so intense it interfered with his ability to travel and engage in social activities.

However, investigation found that during this time period, Kelly had been working as a dancer at a nightclub. Surveillance video showed Kelly dancing on stage for several hours over several days, and engaging in activities he reported to doctors he was unable to perform. This case was prosecuted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office Insurance Fraud Unit. ★

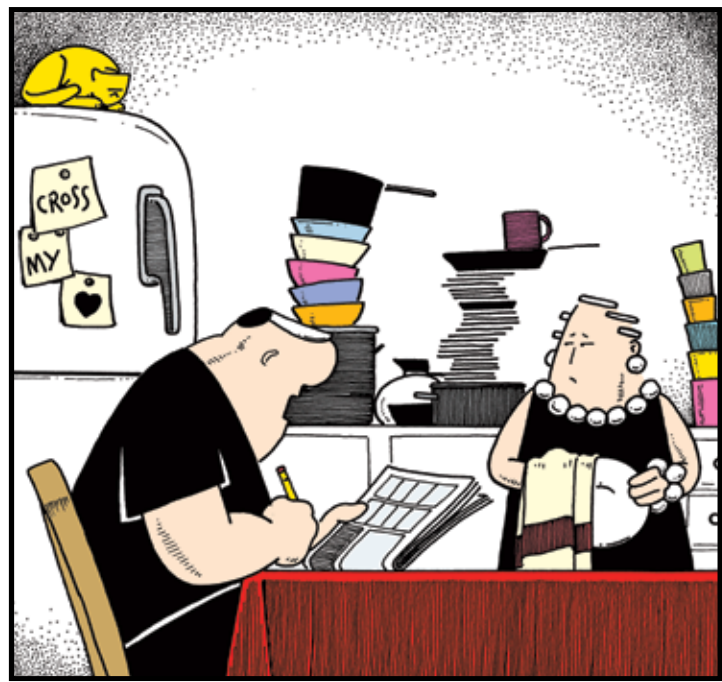

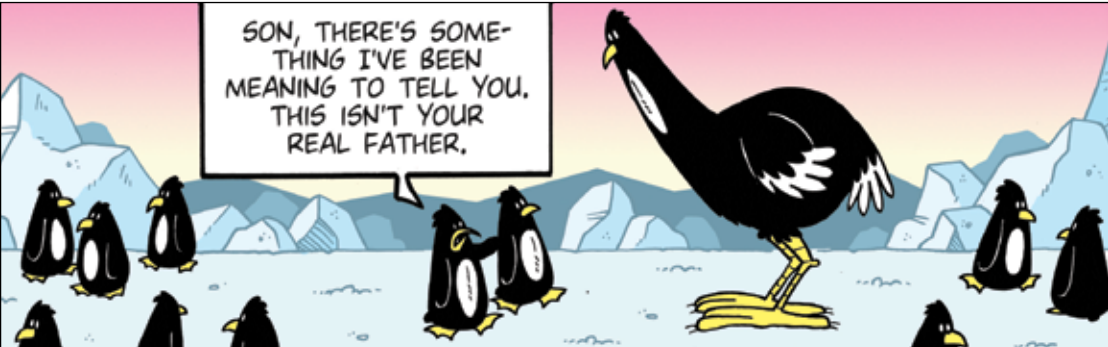

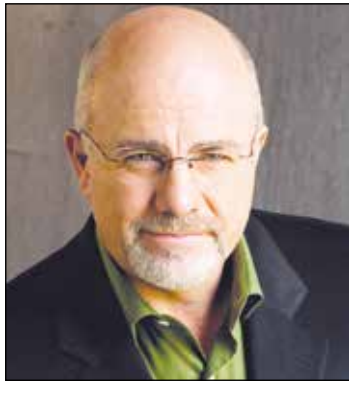

## Quit job for school?

Dear Dave,  
My wife and I have \$72,000 in debt from student loans and a car loan. We're trying to pay off our debt using the debt snowball system, and we each make about \$45,000 a year. She's a teacher, and she's planning on going back to school for her master's degree, but she's thinking about quitting her job to do this. She'll be able to make more money with the additional education, and she would only be unemployed for two years. The degree program will cost us \$2,000 out of pocket per semester for two years. Does this sound like a good idea?  
-Chris

Dear Chris,  
There's no reason for your wife to quit her job to make this happen. Lots of people — especially teachers — hold down their jobs and go back to school to further their education. I'm not sure trying to make it on one income when you're that deep in debt is a good idea.  
Whatever you do, don't borrow more money to make this happen. Cash flow it, or don't do it. We're talking about \$8,000 total,

and you've got \$72,000 in debt hanging over your heads already. My advice would be to wait until you've got the other debt knocked out, then save up and pay cash for school. You could slow down your debt snowball, and use some of that to pay for school, but I'd hate to see you lose the momentum you have when it comes to getting out of debt.

The choice is yours, but don't tack on anymore student loan debt. I know her income will go up with a master's degree, so from that standpoint it's a good thing to do. But if you do a good thing a dumb way, it ends up being dumb!

## Pre-planning explained

Dear Dave,  
My grandmother passed away a week ago. She was 98, and I know both she and my grandfather had pre-paid for their funerals in 2004. However, there were outstanding costs of \$1,500 with the funeral services we had to pay out of pocket, because she had outlived the insurance policy attached to the pre-payment plan. I know you say it's always better to pre-plan, not pre-pay, for a funeral. Can you refresh my understanding of this?  
-Rebecca

Dear Rebecca,  
Let's use a round figure, and say the cost of a funeral is \$10,000. What would \$10,000 grow to 25 years from now if it were invested in a good mutual fund? Now, juxtapose that number with the increase in the cost of a funeral over that

time. The average inflation rate of consumer-purchased items is around four percent. So, the cost of funerals, on average, has risen about four percent a year. By comparison, you could've invested that money, and it would've grown at 10 or 12 percent in a good mutual fund.

Now understand, I'm not knocking folks who are in the funeral business. But lots of businesses that provide these services realize more margin in selling pre-paid policies than they do in caskets. In other words, they don't make as much money selling the casket as they do selling a pre-paid policy on the casket.

Do you understand my reasoning? If we knew the exact date she pre-paid, and how much she pre-paid, that figure invested in a good mutual fund would be a whole lot more than the cost of a reasonable funeral. It's the same principle behind the reason I advise folks to not pre-pay college, or just about anything else, that's likely far into the future. The money you could've made on the investment is a lot more than the value of pre-paying. Pre-planning, on the other hand, is a great idea for many things — including funerals.

I'm truly sorry for your loss, Rebecca. God bless you all.

Falcons #4 singles Dan Lee and #5 Jet Renslo both lost in their opening matches but made their way back through the consolation rounds to win their respective Consolation Finals. #6 Josh Pechal won his quarter-final match before losing in the semi's to Foothill College. The men will play at Chabot on Thursday before opening Big 8 Conference play at Santa Rosa on Friday.

### Baseball

The Falcons opened their three-game weekend series against Gavilan College with a Friday night 2-0 shutout win over the Rams at falcon Field. Falcon starter Derek Stuber (six innings, no runs, one hit) and reliever Shane Gustafson (three innings, no runs, one hit) combined

to blank the Rams with 13 strikeouts. Converted shortstop (formerly third baseman) Josh Winkler provided all the offense the Falcons would need with his solo home run to left-center in the sixth inning. The Falcons added one unearned run in the seventh on a walk, two hit batters and a wild pickoff throw that scored John Mook from third with an insurance run. In the opening game of the afternoon doubleheader against Gavilan on Saturday, the Falcons lit up the scoreboard early with an eight-run first before winning 12-3. Seven Falcons recorded multi-hit games, including sophomore right fielder Aidan Malm (3-5, double, three RBI), freshman leftfielder Michael Farley (2-3, homer, double, two RBI), and sophomore centerfielder John Mook (2-3, two RBI). The Falcon pitchers allowed just two earned runs on five Rams' hits as Ricky Espinoza earned his first collegiate win. In the series finale on Saturday

afternoon, five Falcon pitchers combined to shut down the Rams yet again as the home team won a shortened seven inning game 3-1. Friday night's offensive hero, Josh Winkler, earned the save - his second of the season - with a perfect seventh inning on the mound. Hot hitting leftfielder Michael Farley had an RBI double in the third inning, then scored the Falcons' second run on Aidan Malm's single. Through eight games, Farley is hitting .400 with 4 home runs, 6 doubles, and 13 RBI and has a crazy 1.592 OPS (on-base plus slugging %). With the win, the Falcons improved to 7-1. They will host Feather River on Tuesday afternoon at Falcon Field at 2:30, and then travel to Mission College in Santa Clara for two games this weekend.

### Softball

In the opening game of their Saturday afternoon doubleheader at Falcon Diamond, the Falcons fell behind Butte

in the third inning and eventually lost to the Roadrunners 11-2 in five innings. The Falcons managed just three hits off Roadrunner starter Jamie Engel, including RBI singles by sophomore McKenna Rickles and freshman Raven Lewis. Rickles had her toughest start of 2018, giving up eight earned runs on 10 hits in just over three innings. In game two, Butte took an early lead with three runs in the first, but the Falcons answered back with one in the second, three in the third, and another one in the fourth for a 5-3 lead. The Roadrunners responded with two in the fifth to tie it at 5-5, then blew the game open with a grand slam home run in the sixth. The Falcons would not recover from that blow, as they wound up losing 12-6. The 10 hits were the best offensive output for the Falcons thus far in 2018, but their eight errors cost them the game and were a season-high as well. McKenna Rickles (3), Kelsey Liddell (3), and Sara Thibaut (2) all had multi-hit games, but also accounted for seven of the team's errors. The Falcons will hope to turn things around this week when they host Lassen College for a single game on Tuesday at 1:00 pm, then travel to Marysville on Thursday for a doubleheader at Yuba College. ★
