**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Cordova Recreation and Park District (CRPD) held a grand opening ceremony on a windy and brisk Saturday, December 16, 2017 from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. to celebrate the opening of CRPD's 38th park, Heron Landing Community Park.

Heron Landing Community Park, located in Anatolia at Sunrise Boulevard and Justinian Way, is the 8th community park in the district. The 20-plus acre park has 20 picnic areas, 2 miles of walking trails, a spray pad area, 2 playground areas, 2 ballfields, a soccer field, 2 bocce ball courts, 2 tennis courts and 2 half

## SMUD Board of Directors Approves 2018 Budget

SMUD special release

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The SMUD Board of Directors approved a \$1.74 billion budget. The 2018 budget provides funding for all capital and operations and maintenance (O & M) programs needed to meet the Board's Strategic Directions in the year ahead.

The 2018 budget also positions SMUD for changes coming to the utility industry so SMUD can continue to meet our community's energy needs. The budget sets the stage for operational efficiencies and improvements, as well as expansions of customer offerings in the near future, and opens up SMUD to seek new revenue opportunities.

SMUD is in a strong financial position. SMUD has a robust cash balance and operating cash flow and will fund the majority of capital investment with cash on hand, only planning to borrow \$200 million next year. Recently Fitch and S&P upgraded SMUD's credit ratings to AA-, from an already impressive AA-, while Moody's continues to rate SMUD Aa3. This is the strongest SMUD's credit ratings have been in 33 years.

The 2018 budget is \$161 million more than the 2017 budget, due mostly to higher planned capital expenditures. SMUD continues to upgrade electrical infrastructure to maintain safe and reliable service, as well as invest in the technological foundations to meet future challenges. Offsetting these increases is a lower commodity budget due to declining natural gas costs, which SMUD locked in through hedging programs.

As the utility business evolves, SMUD is increasingly reliant on technological solutions in all business areas. As a customer-owned utility, SMUD continues to focus on improving the digital channels

# Farm Bureau Lends Support to Ambitious Irrigation Plan

*Proposed South County Ag Program Would Reduce Groundwater Pumping*

ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Farm Bureau (SCFB) testified in support of an ambitious recycled water project before the California Water Commission this week in downtown Sacramento. The Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District's (Regional SAN) plan would provide a safe and reliable supply of tertiary treated water for agricultural irrigation uses, which would reduce groundwater pumping and cause ground water tables to rise in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta region. Regional SAN is attempting to obtain funding for the project through the Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP) contained in Proposition 1, the water bond that California voters approved in 2014. The WSIP set aside \$2.7 billion in funding for water storage projects that improve the operation of the state water system, are cost effective and provide a net improvement in ecosystem and water quality conditions. "Sacramento County farmers

and ranchers smashed crop production records last year by producing a record high \$507 million worth of wine grapes, milk, pears, nursery crops and other agricultural commodities," said SCFB Executive Director Bill Bird during testimony before the CWC. "Our members broke that record because they had access to clean and reliable irrigation water supplies. Any project that would increase the reliability and quality of irrigation water supplies for Sacramento County growers has the Farm Bureau's support." Modeling presented to the CWC showed that the groundwater recharge facilitated by the project would lead to a 20-30-foot increase in the groundwater elevation in the South American Sub-basin, plus increase flows in the Cosumnes River, a tributary to the Delta. According to testimony provided by Regional SAN during the CWC hearing, the project is consistent with the objectives and intent of Proposition 1, and provides substantial agricultural, ecological, and regional water supply benefits at a low cost,

particularly when compared to surface storage projects. "This project is an example of the type of innovative multi-benefit groundwater projects California needs to implement to ensure our state has a more sustainable and reliable water supply," said Bird. "If Sacramento County growers are not forced to pump ground water for irrigation purposes because they can receive a reliable supply of water from another source at roughly the same price, they won't use those pumps." The CWC is expected to start allocating grant funding for water storage projects early next year. *Sacramento County farmers put food on your fork. SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Have you signed up for Sacramento-Alert, yet? Just go to [www.Sacramento-Alert.org](http://www.Sacramento-Alert.org) and sign up your home and work phone numbers and emails, as well as your cell phone numbers. This way, when an emergency happens in your area, you will be notified about critical and time-sensitive issues – including fires, floods, evacuations and disasters. When you sign up, it lets local officials, public safety and emergency personnel provide you with real-time information so you and your family will know

what to do or where to go in the event of a flood, neighborhood evacuation, major road closure, severe weather or other dangerous conditions. Choose how you want to be contacted – by phone call, text or email. As well, sign up for multiple locations that mean the most to you by registering your home address, work address, your parent's address or your children's school location in the counties of Sacramento, Yolo and Placer. Officials will only notify during an emergency or public safety event, or if public help is needed, for example,

to find a missing child or adult. Signing up is easy and your information is protected. # Senator Ted Gaines Named "Champion of Manufacturing"

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) today announced that he has been named a "Champion of Manufacturing" by the California Manufacturing & Technology Association (CMTA) on their 2017 Manufacturing Vote Record. CMTA represents 400 businesses from the entire manufacturing community – an economic sector that generates more than \$230 billion every year and employs more than 1.2 million Californians. "I have been a long-time champion of California's manufacturing industry and am proud to have earned this important

designation," said Senator Gaines. "For many manufacturers, it's become increasingly difficult to do business in California. I've carried and supported numerous bills that would let businesses keep more of their money so they can reinvest it back into their businesses, create more jobs and boost the economy, instead of handing it over to the government. They should be rewarded for their contributions to our state, not continually penalized at every turn. I remain committed to fighting on their behalf." The Vote Record looked at legislators' floor votes in the Assembly

and Senate on 10 key bills impacting California manufacturers and technology companies. # Governor Brown Grants Executive Clemency

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. today announced that he has granted 132 pardons and 19 commutations. Individuals who have been convicted of a crime in California may apply to the Governor for a pardon. Those granted pardons all completed their sentences and the majority were convicted of drug-related or other nonviolent crimes. Pardons are not granted unless they are earned. A gubernatorial pardon may be granted to individuals who have demonstrated exemplary behavior and have lived productive and law-abiding lives

following their conviction. The process includes eligible individuals obtaining a Certificate of Rehabilitation, which is an order from a superior court declaring that a person convicted of a crime is now rehabilitated. This requirement was waived for a refugee who is currently detained as part of a federal immigration proceeding. When a pardon is granted, the California Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation are notified so that they may update their records on the applicant. The pardon is filed with the Secretary of State and the

Legislature, and it is a public record. The Governor also granted 19 commutations to current inmates. Inmates currently serving a sentence for a conviction by the California Courts can petition to have their sentence reduced by applying for a commutation. In the majority of these commutations, these individuals have been granted the opportunity to make their case before the Board of Parole Hearings, which will determine whether they are ready to be released from prison. *Source: From the Office of Gov. # California's Top Public Safety Groups Laud Senator Nielsen's Legislative Work

Understanding the critical role of prosecutors, Senator Nielsen

worked closely with district attorneys to ensure that laws passed allow criminals to be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law and that victims and their loved ones are participants in the criminal justice process. As a result of his efforts, Senator Nielsen received their top ranking. Elected to the State Senate in January 2013, Senator Nielsen represents the Fourth Senate District, which includes the counties of Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Tehama and Yuba. # Animal Services Safety Tips

*What to Do When You See a Dog on the Loose*

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The City of Rancho Cordova has highly trained Animal Services Officers who provide field services, such as response to stray or lost animals, barking dogs, loose aggressive and dangerous dogs, injured animals, deceased animal removal, investigation of animal cruelty, and public education. If you need Animal Services, call (916) 851-8852. For emergencies involving immediate threats to public safety, call 911.

Here are a few tips from your city staff:

Dogs are to be kept leashed at all times during walks. Homes should have proper fencing so dogs are unable to escape. Only at dog parks where dogs are allowed off leash, may you let your dog off leash.

Dogs do sometimes manage to escape from the control of their owners. Aggressive dogs running loose can be serious threats to public safety. Dog bites can cause injury and infection, especially if the dog bite breaks the skin and is not vaccinated for diseases such as rabies. Children are much more likely to be severely injured by dog bites due to their small size and not being aware of how they should act around dogs. Also, dogs running loose can cause traffic accidents if crossing busy roads and highways.

The following tips help reduce the dangers and possible accidents caused by loose dogs:

1. If you see a dog running loose and cannot identify its owner, call Rancho Cordova Animal Services at (916) 851-8852 and be prepared to give a

description of the animal.

2. Be careful but observant of the dog’s behavior. Learn more about behavior in dogs at: <https://www.aspc.org/pet-care/dog-care/common-dog-behavior-issues/aggression>

3. If the dog is aggressive, ensure that you and others near the dog go inside or to a location inaccessible by the dog. Call 911 if you are in need of immediate care or unable to wait for Rancho Cordova’s Animal Services to arrive.

4. If the dog is rushing towards you or your dog, try startling the dog with an air horn or other loud noises. Use Citronella spray to irritate the dog and force it away from you. Long instruments, such as a broom or long stick, can be used to push away the dog. Popping open an umbrella can help to keep distance and startle the dog away.

5. If you are bitten by the dog, seek medical attention. The doctor will need the following

information: your name, address, telephone number, place where you were bitten, date and time of the bite, and the circumstances of the bite incident. They will also need any information about the animal (i.e., animal type, breed, description, location of the animal and any owner information you may have). After seeking medical aid, call Animal Services (916) 851-8852 to report the bite.

It is always best to be careful around a stray dog that does not know you. Some dogs who appear friendly might try to bite if they are afraid and protecting themselves. If the dog is friendly and you are able to safely contain the dog you may check the neighborhood for the owner, report found animal on social media, file a found report with Animal Services and local shelters, request Animal Services to pick up the dog during regular business hours, or transport the animal to the Sacramento SPCA.

its customers use to do business with SMUD. The 2018 budget includes initiatives to deliver a new SMUDapp with bill pay and outage communications functionality, as well as increasingly personalized customer experiences on SMUD's digital channels.

In 2018, SMUD embarks on exploring new business opportunities that open new markets and revenue streams. These include expanding opportunities for new revenue in traditional wholesale energy markets, such as successfully selling excess transmission capacity, plus new net revenue from non-traditional sources such as the new e-commerce solution, the SMUD Energy Store.

SMUD signed a contract in 2017 with Valley Clean Energy Alliance (VCEA) to provide Community Choice Aggregator (CCA) services. SMUD's work with VCEA, which launches next spring, will create a new revenue stream for SMUD and creates possibilities for expansion into other CCA markets.

The capital budget includes funding for improvements and investments to support

development of SMUD's load serving capacity—the amount of power needed to meet high demand during peak summer hours—as well as continued modernization of the grid; regulatory compliance; and customers' experience dealing with SMUD. Some major capital projects include:

- **Rebuilding Station E and Station G substations downtown**
- **Construction of the new Franklin substation in Elk Grove**
- **Rehabilitation of the SMUD Headquarters building**
- **Re-purchase of Solano Wind 3**

The O&M budget includes funding for the work associated with SMUD joining the Energy Imbalance Market (EIM) in 2019. The EIM is a real-time, wholesale power market managed by the California Independent System Operator that enables participating utilities to buy low-cost energy available across eight western states—the resulting efficiencies of pooling power resources across a wide geographic area provides cost savings and environmental benefits. Other

O&M expenditures include:

- **Power plant maintenance and overhauls**
- **Repair costs due to storm and wildfire events**
- **Technological enhancements to existing electrical equipment**

SMUD customers continue to pay significantly less for electricity than most Californians, and as of November 1, 2017, about 32 percent less than residential customers who are supplied by neighboring PG&E.

As the nation's sixth-largest, community-owned electric service provider, SMUD has been providing low-cost, reliable electricity for 70 years to Sacramento County (and small adjoining portions of Placer and Yolo Counties). # New Device Can Warn People About Impending Earthquakes

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Zizmos, a tech-based startup that is building a cost-effective cloud-connected seismic network providing earthquake early-warning and block-by-block risk predict, this week excitedly launched a Kickstarter campaign for their revolutionary earthquake detection system: the Earthquake Early Warning System.

Utilizing smart earthquake-sensing technology that could save millions of lives, the system is about to provide an early warning of on average 15-20

seconds for all users.

“Regarding earthquakes, every second matters,” said Battalgaazi Yildirim, Founder and CEO of Zizmos. “Having a 20-second head-start could be the difference between a severe injury or taking cover to protect oneself and one’s family.”

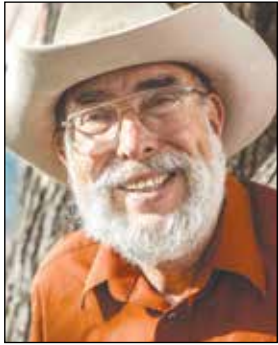

# NAFTA Renegotiations Must Advance Innovation and Creativity

Diplomats from the United States, Canada, and Mexico recently met to re-negotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). Many Americans feel NAFTA has disadvantaged U.S. workers. Others have complained about U.S. companies relocating factories to Mexico to take advantage of lax labor regulations. The Commerce Department has called out Canadian softwood lumber subsidies.

These are legitimate concerns and negotiators certainly need to address them. But they also need to address what's missing in NAFTA: strong protections that foster innovation and ensure competitive conditions for creative and innovation based industries. These protections are crucial to millions of workers and to our economy.

The economic value of creative and innovative based industries is captured in a person or company's ideas and inventions. These assets are often protected through intellectual property rights such as patents, trademarks, and copyrights, which prevent others from stealing or replicating original ideas without permission.

These robust sectors wouldn't exist without laws and policies that respect the substantial value they

add to their products and services and enable them to reap the benefits of their work.

That's because these businesses and inventors all face massive upfront costs.

Film studios must spend hundreds of millions of dollars to create a major motion picture. Biopharmaceutical companies frequently spend billions to research and develop a single medicine with no guarantee that medicine will ever make it to market. Record companies spend more than a quarter of their revenue on discovering and promoting new artists.

If rivals could swoop in and produce cheap, knock-off copies, after all the hard creative work has been done, there'd simply be no way for the creators and innovators to earn back their investments.

Needless to say, that would cripple significant segments of the American economy. All told, IP-intensive sectors added more than \$6 trillion to U.S. GDP in 2014. Together, IP-based start-ups, small businesses, and larger companies support more than 45 million jobs in the United States with workers earning nearly 40 percent more than their counterparts in non-IP intensive sectors.

On top of the many benefits to the United States, the products developed by creative and innovative based industries are shared around the world. The United States exports

roughly \$130 billion of IP-intensive products each year.

Unfortunately, illegal actions that deprive inventors of the economic rights to their IP, such as counterfeiting, piracy, and other intellectual property theft, threaten the ability of creators and inventors to continue investing and creating jobs. For instance, U.S. companies lose a cumulative \$250 billion annually to digital theft.

Innovation and creativity drive the American economy. This is our comparative advantage. To safeguard this, U.S. negotiators ought to insist on trade policies that respect innovation and creativity, and ensure strong protections for IP and creative content in the new NAFTA. If they succeed, the new agreement could become the gold standard for all future trade deals.

It's holiday time and craziness! Did you know that High blood pressure, also known as hypertension, kills over nine million people worldwide each year? One in every three people in the United States presently has hypertension with as many as 75% of us being destined to develop the condition as we age. But **Dr. David Rose** shared information with me on my POPPOFF Radio Show that has ten easy steps that anyone can do today to lower your blood pressure and no drug-side effects. He gives us the insider information in his book **“30 Days to Natural Blood Pressure Control.”** It's the No Pressure Solution. **Dr. Rose** is a board-certified specialist in internal and preventative medicine. Thirty days doesn't seem like a long time when it can save your life, so I asked him for the abbreviated version for this column.

So here goes. We start with **1)** Nutrition and eating your way to lower blood pressure. There are three principles to follow... I'm not surprised since I've had many docs on who tell me stress can cause all sorts of health problems. **8)** Use of natural adjuncts like herbs and supplements as aids. But, he added that we must be careful because some natural things could be harmful with serious side-effects. **9)** Refraining from pressors and excesses and avoid “false friends.” Greek philosopher Xenophon used the word temperance to connote “moderation in all things healthful; total abstinence from all things harmful.” **10)** Exercising faith in God and spiritual connections to high blood pressure. The topic of spirituality, and its impact on blood pressure, is complex and powerful, but the link is undeniably there, and therefore must be addressed.

There is so much more to share, but you'll have to get the rest of the story in **“30 Days to Natural Blood Pressure Control: The no Pressure solution.”** It's a start to taking control of your health! ★

# Brundage Returning to Manage River Cats in 2018

*New Pitching Coach Steve Kline and fundamentals Coach Nestor Rojas to Join Returning hitting Coach Damon Minor*

**WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento River Cats, in conjunction with the San Francisco Giants, are thrilled to welcome back Dave Brundage for his second season as manager of the River Cats for the 2018 season.

Brundage will be joined by a few new faces for the 2018 season at Raley Field. While Damon Minor will return for his third season as the River Cats hitting coach, he will be joined by new pitching coach Steve Kline and fundamentals coach Nestor Rojas. The new training staff will be made up of athletic trainer David Getsoff and strength and conditioning coach Andy King. Travis Higgs will round out the club's 2018 field staff, and will serve as bullpen catcher and team administrator.

An Oregon native, Brundage joined the River Cats in 2017 and compiled a 64-77 record in his 20th season as a minor league manager. Before coming to Sacramento, the veteran manager spent the previous four seasons with the International League's Lehigh Valley IronPigs. In 2016, Brundage led the IronPigs to an 85-58 record, the second best mark in all of Triple-A baseball.

Brundage, 53, made his managerial debut in 1995 with the Riverside Pilots (Seattle Mariners Class A-Advanced). He made his Triple-A debut in 2006 with the Pacific Coast League's Tacoma Rainiers. Brundage has a career record of 1,435-1,392 (.508) in 20 seasons as a manager including a 857-858 (.499) mark at the Triple-A level.

Drafted in the 4th round of the 1986 Amateur Draft out of Oregon State University, Brundage spent 10 seasons as



a player in the Minor Leagues with the Phillies and Mariners organizations.

Minor, 43, returns to the River Cats for his third season as hitting coach. In his second year with the team, Minor worked closely with Triple-A newcomers and top Giants' prospects Christian Arroyo, Chris Shaw, and Ryder Jones as they prepared for their Major League debuts.

A former Giant, Minor was drafted by San Francisco in 1996 and made his Major League debut in 2000. In 136 games over parts of four seasons, Minor hit .232 with 13 home runs. He set a career-high in 2002 when he played in 83 games and slugged 10 home runs, helping the Giants claim the National League pennant.

Kline, 45, joins the River Cats as pitching coach after serving in the same role for three seasons with the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels and nine seasons overall with the organization. While in Richmond, Kline helped in the development of several River Cats standouts, including Tyler Beede, Andrew Suarez, and Tyler Rogers. Kline led the Giants Double-A affiliate to a top-five pitching staff (in team ERA) in each of his three Eastern League seasons, including a league-leading 3.12 team ERA in 2015.

Kline completed his 11-year Major League career as a lefty reliever with the Giants in 2007. The Pennsylvania native was an 8th round selection by the Cleveland Indians in the 2003

draft out of the University of West Virginia. He set the single-season record for appearances (89) in 2001 while with St. Louis, and led the National League in games played as a pitcher for three consecutive seasons (1999-2001).

Rojas, 34, will join the River Cats as fundamentals coach after managing the Class-A Advanced San Jose Giants in 2017. Since retiring at the end of the 2010 season, Rojas immediately began his coaching career and has been a bright up-and-coming coaching talent in the Giants organization. Rojas landed his first managerial job in 2013 at age 29 with the Arizona Rookie League Giants, and led them to a 41-14 record.

A native of Venezuela, Rojas played for six seasons in the Giants organization, including two stints with Triple-A Fresno in 2009 and 2010.

Rounding out the field staff will be a new athletic training and strength and conditioning duo. David Getsoff will join the River Cats as the athletic trainer in his 10th season with the Giants Organization, while Andy King will be the River Cats strength and conditioning coach in what will be his fifth season with the Giants. Travis Higgs will return as the team's bullpen catcher in 2018.

## Sacramento County DA Reports

### **Defendant Sentenced to 25-Life for Murder of 13-Month-Old Girl**

DATE: December 8, 2017

CASE: Guyland Washington (Case #14F04826)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Dawn Bladet, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Maryanne Gilliard sentenced Guyland Washington to the maximum sentence of 25 years to life in prison. On October 5, 2017, a jury convicted Washington for the second-degree murder of 13-month-old Leila Shehadeh, and child assault causing death.

On the morning of July 11, 2014, Guyland Washington's then girlfriend left her 13-month-old daughter, Leila Shehadeh, in Washington's care. When the girlfriend returned that afternoon, she discovered her daughter was not breathing and unresponsive. Paramedics brought Leila to the UC Davis Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead shortly after her arrival. When doctors observed bruising and multiple injuries to Leila's head, body and anal areas, they reported suspected child abuse to law enforcement. An autopsy showed Leila suffered a skull fracture with associated brain swelling, rib fractures and significant bruising on various parts of her body. Her cause of death was determined to be intentionally inflicted blunt force injuries.

During the sentencing hearing, Judge Gilliard stated, "In my nineteen years of being a judge this has to be without a doubt one of the worst actions I have seen another human being do to such a vulnerable sweet innocent little child."

### **Defendant Pleads to Forcible Rape During Commission of Burglary**

DATE: December 14, 2017

CASE: David Hamilton (Case #17FE00245)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

David Hamilton pled no contest to forcible rape and admitted an allegation that the rape occurred during the commission of a first-degree burglary. Hamilton also admitted a prior 2014 robbery strike conviction.

At approximately 3:00 a.m. on February 7, 2017, Hamilton entered the victim's home through her kitchen window. Hamilton, who was a stranger to the victim, grabbed a knife and entered the victim's bedroom. Hamilton told the victim to get on the floor and threatened to kill her if she did not cooperate. He then bound the victim's hands, choked her and raped her. After the assault, Hamilton began walking around the house. The victim, who was scared he would hurt her sleeping children, was able to distract Hamilton by offering him food and drinks. During this time she was able to call 911 and send a text for help. When officers arrived, they found Hamilton hiding under the victim's couch with the knife.

Hamilton will be sentenced to 30 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for January 9, 2018, at 8:30

a.m. in Department 60 before the Honorable Stephen Acquisto.



### **Former Correctional Officer Pleads to Arson, Domestic Violence**

DATE: December 15, 2017

CASE: William Joseph Babbitt (Case #17FE005738)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Neil Ferrara, Special Investigations Unit

William Babbitt suspected the victim had dated his estranged wife. On August 20, 2016, Babbitt went to the victim's apartment and set fire to the front door while the victim was asleep. A neighbor saw the fire, alerted the victim and extinguished the fire. Later that morning, Babbitt's wife confronted him regarding the incident. During this confrontation, Babbitt threw her to the ground causing a scrape to her left arm. Investigators determined that Babbitt used an accelerant to set the fire. At the time of these crimes, Babbitt was employed as a correctional officer with the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

Babbitt will be sentenced to 3 years in state prison. Sentencing is set for January 23, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 37 before the Honorable Stephen Acquisto.

### **Former High School Teacher Sentenced for Sexual Relationships with Students**

DATE: December 15, 2017

CASE: Byron Wallace (Case #15F06533)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Laurel White sentenced Byron Wallace to 8 years, 4 months in prison. On October 31, 2017, a jury convicted Wallace of four counts of committing sex acts with a person under the age of 18, communicating with a minor with the intent to commit a sex act, molesting a child under the age of 18, three counts of unlawful sex with a minor, and dissuading a witness.

Wallace was a math teacher at Inderkum High School. He also ran the Christians in Action club as well as the HOPE program. A high school freshman met Wallace when she was a student in his geometry class. She got to know Wallace throughout her high school years from math classes and as an active member of the Christians in Action club. During her senior year, Wallace and the victim began exchanging flirtatious text messages. Eventually, they began meeting before and after school and became physically intimate. Over the course of their relationship, the victim spent more than \$3,500 on Wallace – buying him expensive shoes, belts and watches. Another student met Wallace her senior year when she asked him for help in math. She also became active in the Christians in Action club. Wallace and the victim began exchanging flirtatious text messages. Soon after, their relationship became physically intimate. Wallace also sent nude photos of himself to both victims.

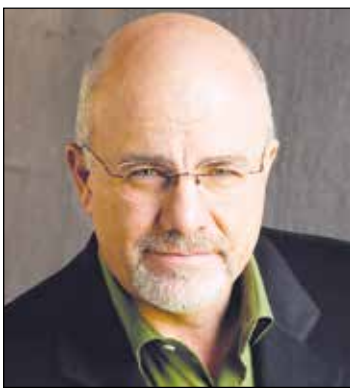

## Interview follow-up

Dear Dave,  
What is the proper etiquette after the job interview process? I recently had an interview for a sales management position. I've sent a couple of follow-up emails in the last few weeks, and I know I'm still under consideration, but I'm not sure what to do now.

Next time, since you obviously have a sales background, how about treating it like a sales call? If you're on a sales call, and the customer needs to perform some due diligence before deciding, a smart salesperson will ask to schedule a follow-up.

Ask if checking back on a certain day in the next week or two will work. You don't want to be obnoxious, but you want an appointment of sorts — a time frame — so you'll know when to follow up without being pushy.

In this situation, I would recommend sending another email. You want to walk right up to that fine line that separates bold from obnoxious, because that's one of things a good sales manager should be able to do. Respectfully tell them you understand the decision-making process takes time, but you need to know when you can expect an answer.

Use the idea that you're a great sales person, and you're treating this as a professional sales call. And don't be afraid to have a little fun with it. If you're still under consideration, that means they like you. You could even hint at the fact they don't want to hire a sales manager who doesn't know how to follow up!

## Cordova Cagers Are Hosting Tournament

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Four of the remaining five non-conference games left for the Cordova High School boys basketball team will be played at Lancer Gym.

Three of those four are being played in the form of the 42nd annual Cordova Christmas Classic, which started on Wednesday. Cordova (5-5) opened against Chavez of Stockton.

This is the second meeting between the Lancers and Chavez. Cordova posted a 52-41 win over the Titans at the McDonald's Classic in Stockton on Dec. 7th.

"The biggest thing is not to be overconfident," said Cordova head coach Fletcher Johnson of his Lancers facing the Titans again. "Make sure we come prepared to play."

If Cordova beat Chavez, it was scheduled to play the Center-Inderkum winner on Thursday. The other four schools in the tournament are Wood of Vacaville, American Canyon, Grant and Sierra Valley Conference foe Rosemont.

In recent years, Cordova had played in the St. Hope Elite Hoop Classic, which has featured some of the best Northern California high school boys basketball teams. But that tournament was moved up to this week, leaving the Lancers having to opt out of it.

"St. Hope had to change the dates of its tournament," said Johnson of that tournament, which has been played almost a week after Christmas. "At Cordova, you cannot stop (42 years) of tradition."

After Thursday's games, today, Friday's games will start with the seventh place game at 3 p.m., followed by the consolation contest at 4:30 p.m. The third place game follows at 6 p.m., with the title game scheduled to tip-off at 7:30 p.m.

Johnson is hoping to expand the tournament to 16 schools next winter, now that Cordova is scheduled to play in its new gym at some point this season.

"Make it a bigger event for the Sacramento area," Johnson said. "Reach out to (local) schools don't have to travel far for the Christmas break, stay closer to home."

The Lancers' last non-conference game was Dec. 9th, also at the McDonald's Classic, with a 78-44 loss to Clovis. In the first quarter, Clovis jumped out to a 21-7 lead, and increased it to 39-23 at halftime.

At that tournament, the Lancers went 2-2 with wins over Chavez and Lodi. Cordova fell to Modesto in the tournament opener.

After Cordova ends its tournament today, it will play two more non-conference games before starting Sierra Valley Conference action on Friday, Jan. 12th against rival Rosemont. Next Wednesday, Cordova plays at Bella Vista and wraps up the preseason with a Tuesday, Jan. 9th home game against Rio Americano. Both games are scheduled to tip-off at 7 p.m. ★

# Yep, Pot Goes Legit, Sort of

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - In many cities across California. Sacramento included, the cultivation and sale of recreational cannabis becomes legal Jan. 1, opening the flood gates for an industry widely expected to generate a gold mine for municipalities who have said "yes" to the legitimization of the pot business.

Anticipating an uptick in violent crime, robberies, homelessness and headaches, coupled with a complicated process for management of the commercial side of the cannabis industry, these areas have echoed a resounding “NOT” to the cultivation of cannabis in their towns. There are also too many questions, they say, about how to affectively assess pot farmers on their profits from what is currently a cash-and-carry industry, not to mention the offense of the smell from burning weed wafting over their neighborhoods.

If you're cloudy on the issues, there's good reason for it. The medicinal marijuana laws passed several years ago that ushered in the growth of the pot dispensary market made it legal for those with a "prescription" from their physicians to purchase limited amounts of pot.

Proposition 64, passed in November 2016, effectively made it possible for weed growers who are lucky enough to obtain licenses from the state

But, since it's a cash flow operation, there are many unanswered questions as to how growers will deposit and move

Sacramento currently has roughly three dozen pot dispensaries, again built out primarily after the medicinal pot laws went into effect, but there is a moratorium on approval of new applications for licenses.

Opponents of the law, however, including city officials, law enforcement agencies and county prosecutors have repeatedly pointed to what they see as
