

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Giving to those who are in real need of relief comes from many places. In Rancho Cordova, it came from KP International Markets last week. Shoppers, employees and management alike worked to raise funds for those who were impacted by the recent fires in the region.

Byong Joo Yu, President of the company said in a meeting with Red Cross representatives "We have been donating for many years. It is what we do as a company. We like to help others."

When the California fires hit the north state KP International began collecting funds for the Red Cross relief fund at their registers. Shoppers donated to the cause and the store raised \$3,000. The check was given to the Red Cross on November 16th.

The Red Cross offers many local programs where they work in the community to create more awareness and preparedness. One such program is the fire alarm installation program which is available to both home owners and renters who may not be able to afford in-home smoke detectors. Red Cross volunteers will even make an appointment with the resident to come out and perform the installation. There are also many other programs available, and getting the word out to smaller neighborhoods where there are some language barriers has been a recent Red Cross challenge. They simply do not have the local staff of volunteers who can help with all the translation skills needed to best prepare everyone.

The Red Cross faces disaster relief challenges every day. Locally they are working hard to build upon their growing volunteer base to offer more within smaller neighborhoods to head off smaller disasters.

"There is a disaster cycle, and we do what we can to stay out in front of it with our many programs" said Gary Strong, Chief Executive Officer for the Gold Country Region of the Red Cross.

Most donations go to help with crisis funding. "With all the disasters lately the Red Cross has been in the news a lot. People donated such much for the hurricanes, and then we had to ask for more because of the California fires. Everything helps" Strong said.

"We are looking to do more with our outreach to let the community know what we have to offer" said Kris Kirkpatrick, Chief Development Officer for the Red Cross. During the meeting she outlined many ways that they would like to reach the different cultures of Rancho Cordova, especially with fire drill training.

The award-winning organization has graduated 1,457 homeless women and their 3,500 children. Last year, 92 percent of graduates found homes and 81 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - California State Assembly Member Ken Cooley and two water companies serving his district – Golden State Water Company and California American Water – provided 450 turkeys with a combined weight of more than two tons to local non-profits as part of the 27th annual "Operation Gobble" program. The turkeys were distributed at his district office on Tuesday, Nov. 21, to approximately 21 organizations including the St. John's Homeless Shelter, the North Highlands Community Church and the Rancho Cordova Food Closet.

"Operation Gobble" is a charitable joint-venture between California water companies and elected officials and is set to deliver thousands of turkeys to families and individuals with limited resources throughout the *Continued on page 8*

Police Use Bait Packages to Deter Holiday Crime

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -In a press conference held at the Rancho Cordova Police Department, Chief of Police Chris Pittman announced that between 2011 and 2016, Rancho Cordova realized a 31.5% reduction in crime after adjustment for population growth. The figures are derived from the Uniform Crime Report, compiled by the FBI from data submitted by law enforcement agencies across the United States. "When we look at Rancho specifically, we were the largest drop since 2011 in the region," Pittman said. "So for us that was a very good sign that we're doing things right."

In 2015 Rancho Cordova police enacted several major programs that contributed to the reduction in crime. "One was intelligence led policing, a way of community oriented policing but smart, using crime analysts' data to determine crime trends," Pittman said. "We also enacted the Crime Suppression Unit here in Rancho Cordova." The CSU, a four member team led by Sergeant Michael Robertson, focuses on high crime areas. Those areas are determined by calls for service and by

intelligence, with the goal of taking a proactive approach to law enforcement rather than reactive.

This is the third year the CSU team is using the bait package program. That involves placing what appear to be normally delivered packages on selected porches in the community. If the package is stolen, police can track it with a GPS system similar to your phone and catch the person who stole the package. Rancho Cordova averages about five reported thefts of this type a

year, and police had one or two arrests per year over the last couple of years. "Nationwide, statistics show that during this time of the year package thefts go up so we're trying to be ahead of that and be very proactive to try and prevent what we can," Robertson said.

The neighborhood policing program is another of the Department's proactive approaches. The program divides the city into 19 neighborhood areas, and assigns patrol officers

to specific neighborhoods. This allows officers to interface with the community to better identify the problems, get to know the citizens and develop solutions together.

"What we believe is because, specifically here in Rancho Cordova with all the programs we have enacted, we're seeing a steeper decrease here," Pittman said. "... This is really good information to get out to the public so they know going into the holidays that it is a safer environment to be in."

Fatal Collision on US-50 at Mather Field Road

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On November 19, 2017, at approximately 0220 hours, the driver of a 2007 Honda Accord was driving westbound on US-50 approaching Mather Field Road in an unknown lane, reportedly racing another vehicle at high speed. The driver of the

Honda lost control, and the Honda entered the #4 lane, facing a northerly direction. An Elk Grove resident was driving her 2015 Hyundai Santa Fe in the #4 lane when the front of the Hyundai struck the right side of the Honda. The right front passenger in the Honda was killed upon impact. At an unknown point during the incident, the

driver of the Honda was ejected into the #2 lane, where he was struck by a BMW 328 from Manteca.

The occupants of the Honda have not been positively identified. It is unknown if the Honda's occupants were wearing their seat belts prior to the initial collision. Evidence at the scene indicated alcohol and/or drug

use may have contributed to this collision.

Rancho Cordova Awards \$215k in Grants to **Student Success**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A huge thank you to the City of Rancho Cordova for its continued support of educational enrichment, resources, and programs for our students. At its Nov. 6 meeting, the Rancho Cordova City Council awarded nearly \$215,000 in grants to benefit District students.

The grants were for Field Trips: Thanks to a \$155,648 grant, two Ford Transit Cargo Wagons for Mills and Mitchell middle schools will remove a transportation barrier for many students, allowing them to visit colleges and universities, academic competitions, music and art performances, and more; Arts Education: The City Council has allocated a total of \$49.350 toward two programs that enhance students' arts education opportunities: "Meet the

Masters," which provides visual arts experiences for elementary students through hands-on teacher guided lessons; and the Crocker Art Museum's "Artist to Go," which gives students the chance to learn about the museum's permanent collection through interactive projects; Student Athletics: Cordova High School's Cheer Team received \$10,000 to will not only send the squad to the Universal Cheerleading Association camp, but also fund new cheerleading mats needed for training and safety.

These projects and many more are funded from the city's Community Enhancement Fund, also known as Measure H, a 1/2 cent local sales tax measure that was approved by Rancho Cordova citizens in 2014.



documentation to the DMV office. The DMV will then place "Veteran" on your driver's license. While you are at the Sacramento County Veterans Service office, you can also get an identification card showing that you are a veteran. That identification can help when you go to some stores where they will take 10% off of anything you buy at the store. At Lowe's, for example, you can buy anything large or small, and you get 10% taken off of the price. The list of stores can be picked up at the county office. I think you can get that list online too, but I'm not sure, so you'd better check it out. It can make a big difference if you buy something like a refrigerator.

A few of us went to the National League of Cities annual conference in Charlotte, NC. It was well attended by representatives from cities across the country, and we learned that problems, like the illegitimate growth of marijuana, aren't a problem in California only. The increasing number of homeless is also a national problem and spiked last year and this year everywhere. The search for answers for the homeless is being found across all aspects of society, from the nonprofit groups to the chambers of commerce, from the religious to those who only believe in the almighty dollar. Finding some answers would benefit all.

There will not be "one

answer fits all" like one size fits all in shoes. 

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -A new solar farm, anticipated to provide more than a third of the electrical needs of Sacramento International Airport, is expected to be operational by the end of the year.

final permits, inspections, and other finishing touches. Once online, the facility will be capable of producing nearly eight megawatts of electricity, enough to power 1,600 homes.

The solar farm consists of a photovoltaic system located on two sites on otherwise unused airport property. The facility will use more than 23,000 solar panels mounted on equipment that tracks the sun's path from east to west over the course of the day, maximizing efficiency

and energy production.



Riley Reviews SUPERHERO "JUSTICE LEAGUE"

EXCITES FANS; "S.W.A.T." ON TV

A Film and TV Review by Tim Riley

JUSTICE LEAGUE (Rated PG-13)

The best news about the new DC Comics superhero film "Justice League" is that it's a contrast to the disappointing "Superman v Batman: Dawn of Justice," which failed in large measure to excite the fan base.

Will this assembly of superheroes answer the question of whether Superman is resurrected, maybe in the manner of Patrick Duffy's Bobby Ewing in the "Dallas" television series? To avoid spoilers, the answer is not found here.

On the other hand, Bruce Wayne/ Batman (Ben Affleck) remains perpetually gloomy, and that's likely the result of having to work with a squad of superhero metahumans, like Aquaman, The Flash, Cyborg and, of course, last but not least the enchanting Wonder Woman.

Gal Galdot's Diana Prince/Wonder Woman is a welcome presence, as she's the character who has fared best lately in her own stand-alone "Wonder Woman" film that arrived to great acclaim last year.

Planet Earth is now faced with a most malevolent force that looks to be indestructible. The eight-foot tall alien warrior Steppenwolf (heavily disguised Ciaran Hands), wearing an oversized anvil-shaped helmet, has an army of parademons, which are winged creatures flying around like a biology experiment gone wrong.

Steppenwolf's evil plan involves a chase for three magical boxes that

look like discarded air conditioners found in a landfill, which when assembled in one piece drive some power source to annihilate the planet.

Knowing they are up against difficult odds, Batman and Wonder Woman enlist help from Aquaman (Jason Momoa), an imposing figure more willing to remain in his Icelandic fishing village but turns out to be welcome addition, at least for some sarcasm and overall cockiness.

Also holding up well is Ezra Miller's Barry Allen/The Flash, the youngest member who admits that his experience with fighting is limited to pushing people and running away. He, too, offers some nice banter with the others.

Cyborg (Ray Fisher) was once college quarterback Victor Stone until a horrific accident turned him into a half-man, half-machine science experiment seems unsure of his role and is not that consequential.

The cast is full of supporting players, from J.K. Simmons' Commissioner Gordon to Connie Nielsen's Queen Hippolyta, but only Diane Lane's Martha Kent and Amy Adams' Lois Lane register with notable scenes.

"Justice League" is certain to excite the DC Comics fan base, as this confederation of superheroes works well together, albeit with some hiccups, for plenty of violent action against the alien invaders.

"S.W.A.T." ON CBS NETWORK

The CBS network must love police procedurals because they've done so many of them to satisfy an audience base craving action. To cite "Hawaii Five-O" as a current example, they are okay with revamping an old formula.

The memory bank reaches back to the 1975 version of "S.W.A.T.," starring Steve Forrest as S.W.A.T. leader Hondo Harrelson."

The Hondo of today's "S.W.A.T." is a different sort, perhaps the result of CBS tapping into the diversity theme, at least as a partial reason to cast the charismatic Shemar Moore as the former Marine soon elevated to leading a Los Angeles S.W.A.T. team in his role of Hondo Harrelson.

If anything, Moore's Hondo would be a nice face as the representative of an elite squad that is called into action for the most egregious crimes. But as an African-American, the new Hondo is afforded the opportunity to grapple with issues that roil the minority community.

In the first episode, the shooting of an unarmed black kid sets up that racial divide dynamic. Yet, even with tensions riding high, by the second episode, "S.W.A.T." has moved on to the focus of dangerous escapees from a prison break terrorizing Latino families.

There is enough tension in the police department, what with Hondo up against rigid brass that would prefer someone else to run his unit. And then, there's the competitive drama of Hondo's unit trying not to be outdone by the squad under the command of Mumford (Peter Onorati).

To complicate matters, Hondo is also in an affair with his superior officer, Jessica Cortez (Stephanie Sigman), who frets that her status as young, female and immigrant puts her in the three strikes zone with the brass.

"S.W.A.T." is not the kind of show destined for critical acclaim, but my guess is that CBS may have wisely gambled that it fits with the network's love of action shows appealing to its core audience.





it off for him as a gift for successfully completing law school — and you're in a financial position to do so without hurting yourselves or your future — that's fine, too. It would be another incredibly generous act. And in my mind, generosity of that magnitude should be met with gratitude and appreciation of equal measure.

If you choose this route, let him know how and why you were able to give him this gift. Don't hold it over his head or beat him up with it, but stress the importance of being wise with money, saving and investing, and staying out of debt in the future. Let him know if he'll follow your example, he might be able to do the same kind of thing for his kids someday. That would be a wonderful thing to see, wouldn't it? —Dave

Used car mileage? Dear Dave.

I know you advise most people to buy used cars. Do you have a rule of thumb for a mileage limit when it comes to buying a used vehicle?

Dear Paul, No, not really. Sometimes

mileage alone can be a good indicator of the quality of a used vehicle, but that's not always the case. I would also advise doing a little research, and maybe letting a trusted mechanic have a look to determine if there are any issues that might give you trouble soon.

The more inexpensive, and cheaply made a car is, the more likely it becomes that it would be worn down by higher mileage. Some vehicles start to get a little ragged at 100,000 miles, while others — some of the better makes — are just getting a feel for the road at that point. Of course, a lot depends on your budget, too.

Overall, I would advise you to look for something that has a good reputation, a solid history, and as little mileage as possible. There are good, used cars out there that will last for years! —Dave

Folsom Lake College Sports Update

Women's Soccer SACRAMENTO COUNTY, (MPG)

- Seeded #2 in northern California, the FLC women's soccer team opened the CCCAA state playoffs with a commanding 5-1 victory over #15 seed Hartnell College on Saturday night at Falcon Stadium. The Falcons looked sharp from the start, executing their set plays and controlling the ball while limiting the Panthers' opportunities to advance past midfield. It didn't take long before Natalie Fischer found Tiara Webb in front of the goal for the game's first score in the 8th minute. Five minutes later, it was Webb

who got the assist on Breanna Brumet's goal for a 2-0 Falcon lead. The Falcons would add one more goal just before halftime, this one off the foot of Britney Johnson, assisted by Andrea Martinez. In the second half, FLC coach Donny Ribaudo was able to give his entire roster some playing time in a playoff situation, something that could prove valuable in the coming week. The Falcons added two more goals - one each by Martinez and Johnson - for a 5-0 advantage early in the second half. The Panthers eventually found the net late in the match for their only bright

spot of the night. With the win, the Falcons advance to playoff round 2, where they'll meet Big 8 Conference runner-up American River on Tuesday afternoon at Falcon Stadium. The two teams played twice already this season, with the Falcons winning 2-1 at ARC, then taking the rematch at FLC, 3-0. Regardless of previous outcomes, Tuesday's playoff match should be intense.

Men's Basketball

With their first-game jitters behind them, the FLC men's basketball team played more like the team their coach

envisioned they would be in three weekend games at the Chabot College Tournament. In Friday night's opener, the Falcons took on Feather River, with a preseason ranking of #13 in NorCal. The Falcons battled a very good team, and with 25 points from Noah Hernandez including six 3-pointers – they nearly upset the Golden Eagles before falling 79-72. Zethan Dumpson tallied 18 points for the Falcons while Isiah Maun added 17.

On Saturday, the Falcons didn't do themselves any favors as they dug a deep hole, falling behind Chabot College by 16 points at halftime. But the Falcons didn't quit and eventually came all the way back to defeat the Gladiators, 81-79, for the first-ever victory for FLC men's basketball. Zethan Dumpson led the team with 31

points while Isiah Maun had 20. On Sunday, the Falcons played a close first half against College of Alameda and led by four points at halftime. That lead grew to 10 with seven minutes to play, but the Cougars fought back and edged the Falcons, 72-69. Noah Hernandez led all Falcon scorers with 26 points, while Zethan Dumpson finished with 17.

FLC head coach Bill Benford was happy to get that first win, but he also realizes there's work still to do. "We learned a lot about our team this weekend and will have to hit the practice court hard in preparation for our next set of games," noted coach Benford. The Falcons don't play again until December 1-2, when they travel to Sonora for the Columbia College Tournament.

Men's Soccer

Playing in their first CCCAA state playoff game in program history on Saturday afternoon, the Falcons' season came to an unexpected early end as they lost an excruciatingly close match to Big 8 Conference rival Santa Rosa, 1-0, at Falcon Stadium. The two teams had split their regular-season series - with both teams winning at home - before Saturday's playoff battle. The Falcons opened the match with crisp passing and maintained possession throughout a majority of the playing time, but could never find the back of the net. After a scoreless first half, the Bear Cubs shocked the home team with a goal off a corner kick in the 56th minute. With more than 30 minutes still to play, the Falcons had plenty of time to get an equalizer, but the Bear Cubs were playing their toughest defense of the match. The final five minutes were played at a frenetic pace as the Falcons sent a barrage of long shots, corner kicks, and headers at the goal, but the Bear Cub goalkeeper fought them all off. It was a disappointing end to an outstanding season for the Falcons; with a final record of 13-4-5, two of the Falcons' four losses were to Santa Rosa. \star
