

The Birds are Back for Another Hoot

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Nearly 100 people attended the August performance of Hawks, Honkers & Hoots at the Rancho Cordova Library. For those who missed the first program or just want to see it again, the bird ambassadors will return to the library at 4 p.m., Thursday, October 19.

"We're known to have a lot of fun with our educational programs, and we're known to involve the audience quite a bit," said Kelli Moulden, president of the non-profit group.

The organization's purpose is to provide a home for birds with injuries that make them non-releasable to the wild, and to disseminate information on local and migratory birds. It is based in El Dorado County and staffed entirely by volunteers.

"People of all ages come, and I find that adults enjoy it just as well (as the children)," Moulden said. "We not only present our birds, but we have a discovery table. On that discovery table are actual wings, feathers and talons from birds that have unfortunately passed away . . . You can feel what a great horned owl wing feels like and feel how sharp their talons are."

The performance offers fun, interactive natural history, and interesting facts about the birds of prey living in and around the Pacific Flyway.

Pedestrian Killed While Crossing Street

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At 6:02 p.m. on October 6, 2017, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Communication Center began receiving 911 calls regarding a male being struck by a vehicle near the intersection of Mather Field Road and International Drive in the City of Rancho Cordova. Additional callers indicated the victim was crossing the street in his wheelchair, travelling across Mather Field Road.

Officers from the Rancho Cordova Police Department immediately responded to the scene. Upon arrival, officers located the victim and found he had sustained major injuries. Officers immediately began life saving measures in an attempt to aid the victim.

Personnel from the Sacramento Metro Fire Department arrived on-scene and pronounced the victim deceased. At this time, the victim has been identified as a male in his 60's from Rancho Cordova.

The driver of the vehicle that struck the victim remained at the scene and is cooperating with investigators. Investigators are in the process of conducting the accident investigation and interviewing witnesses in an attempt to determine what caused the collision. At this time it appears the victim was travelling within the crosswalk.

The identity of the victim in this case will be made available by the Sacramento County Coroner's office, after notification has been made to his next of kin.

Metro Fire Rolls Out in Pink for Breast Cancer Awareness

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (Metro Fire) kicked off Breast Cancer Awareness month with the debut of one of its Pierce manufactured fire trucks decked out in a pink wrap, ribbon and a touch of blue Oct 5, part of its two-month campaign to raise funds and awareness for breast and other forms of cancer.

The big pink truck made its debut at Metro Fire headquarters in Mather as part of the centerpiece of the campaign "All Cancers All People." Metro Fire has partnered with the Albie Aware Breast Cancer Foundation to promote Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October, and the Movember Foundation to put the focus on men's health and cancer awareness in November.

"The centerpiece of its multi-month campaign was the transformation of one of our Pierce Manufactured fire trucks from fire engine red to "October Pink" and just a touch of blue ombre," says Christopher

Vestal, Metro Fire captain/paramedic and public information officer.”

Albie Aware Breast Cancer Foundation Executive Director Cindy Love, alongside cancer survivors from Metro Fire and others who have been impacted by cancer attended the roll out for the campaign. Albie Aware, founded in 2007, offers assistance for life-saving diagnostic testing, patient advocacy, prevention education and compassionate support to individuals battling breast cancer.

The Movember Foundation was founded in 2003 in Melbourne, Australia to essentially fund research and programs dealing with education and treatment for prostate cancer. In 2007, Movember launched in the United States with a partnership with the Prostate Cancer Foundation. Today, the foundation works to conduct outreach and fund research for men’s cancer and various other health-related causes, including suicide prevention, with a global reach and roughly 5 million participants.

Metro Fire’s pink truck, which has been named “All Cancers All People,” got its makeover courtesy of Sacramento-based Vehicle Wraps Inc., with a little help from Sacramento Area Firefighters Local 522 and the Sacramento Metro Firefighters Association, Vestal said. In addition to the debut of the pink and pale blue truck, Vestal said Metro Fire was teaming up with the Sacramento Kings to conduct “surprise visits” to patients across the region and deliver free tickets to the Kings’ Oct. 9 game against the Portland Trailblazers, during which Albie Aware breast cancer survivors will be participating in the half-time ceremony.

This is the fourth year Metro Fire has been involved in promoting cancer awareness in the county. The way Metro Fire sees it, the outreach goes hand-in-hand with its normal duties.

“We view this as something that extends our mission to providing services to our community throughout the region, not just emergency situations, but also preventative outreach,” Vestal said. “We have a duty to

let people know about how early detection helps save lives and about the services available to those who are diagnoses with cancer.”

For the last two years, Metro Fire has won the contest for most money raised for Movember’s “First Responder Challenge,” which involves fire departments and others across the region. Metro Fire collected \$32,000 in donations for 2016 and \$28,000 in 2015.

“Metro Fire will be working hard again to win Movember’s “First Responder Challenge” for the third year in a row after setting a record in 2017 record of \$32,000,” Vestal said.

The Way Ministries Spreads Gifts for Body and Spirit to Those in Need

- “The Way Ministries is a ministry of Jesus, and loves on the needy by providing for and feeding the homeless, poor and needy.” These words on their website barely hint at the impact of The Way’s quiet presence in many locations throughout Sacramento County. Their motto, “Helping Hands, Healing Hearts, Casting Vision” describes the three types of ministries their volunteers are involved in every day of the week: Street Ministry (Homeless Outreach), Food Distribution, and Other Ministries. These programs reach out to serve not only the physical needs but also the spiritual needs of the homeless and others.

Since their congregation is on the street, founders Lonnie and Sarah Nix along with Carlo and Rhonda Sandoval and the Patrick and Char Miller work with their teams of volunteers in many capacities.

The street and homeless outreach ministry meets and serves people where they are throughout the county. If they have to “sit in the gutter and talk” with them to comfort them and meet their needs, they will.

The Rusch Park homeless outreach in Citrus Heights serves 30 to 50 hot meals at the park every Tuesday (rain or shine) at 4:00 p.m. at 7801 Auburn Blvd. Food, prayer and referrals to other resources as needed are offered. Community volunteers are always welcome to join the

riding the rails, takes place on Wednesdays at a rail yards in Sacramento.

Food for Families, a growing family food distribution program is held at Serna Village at McLellan Park every Tuesday morning. The event provides boxes of food for over 250 families. The program began in 2012 with five to seven boxes of food a week being handed out from the back of Pastor Lonnie Nix’s pickup. Today more than 250 families receive a giant box of food to prepare 8-10 meals weekly for their family.

Deliverance Corner homeless outreach: The same ministry of food, prayer and resources serves 40 to 50 meals every Tuesday and Friday at 5:30 p.m. at Madison Avenue Baptist Church, 4148 Madison Avenue, North Highlands, at the corner of Madison Ave. and Hillsdale Blvd.

All these programs minister to participants with the goal to earn their trust and eventually have them move off street into a clean and sober living home.

A special hot dinner for the 50 children living at the Section 8 Logan Park Apartments in North Highlands takes place each Tuesday and Thursday evening.

Another unique food ministry for young people with little hope, caught in the lifestyle of

To make this happen in a timely manner, a well-rehearsed team of more than a dozen volunteers descends upon the gym at Serna Village early Tuesday morning to unload dozens of pallets holding boxes of fresh fruit, vegetables, bread, juice and canned goods delivered by a Placer Food Closet box truck. Three assembly lines then sort and prepare the boxes with food, a dessert and other staples. Families arrive at the gym during this process, mingle with their neighbors and are greeted by Pastor Nix who delivers a short message of hope and healing prior to the food distribution.

Donations, plus prayers and volunteer help are always welcome. Five dollars feeds a family of four for a week and

twenty dollars feed them for a month. Prayers, time and money are always needed.

The work week ends on Friday evening with a high energy church service starting at 6:45 at Crossroads Church, 5501 Dewey Drive in Fair Oaks. The close-knit Way family that keep these programs going, residents of the three clean and sober resident houses and others touched by other ministries gather for fellowship, song and to hear the Word.

Way Ministries is only able to fill the needs of those they serve because of their many faithful ministry partners! The number is growing, along with new programs either operated or supported by The Way!

Way Riderz, an active Christian motorcycle club, has a large presence within the ministry, helping at events and riding with other Christian and secular clubs on the weekends. They use their Harleys and other motorcycles as a tool to take advantage of opportunities to minister to those they meet on their rides.

Grace House, Oak House, Stewart House, Restoration House and Second Chance Ministry are safe, Clean and Sober places to recover from addictions and prepare to re-enter into society. Many government and private organizations work with The Way to place potential residents in these residence, including district attorneys and probation officers. Way members work with other community food and clothing programs, work with children and seniors, in schools and at mobile home parks, and with veterans and housing programs throughout the county.

The men and women of The Way Ministries are committed to making an impact on the world around them for the glory of God, serving out of their love for people and for Jesus. ★

Animal Services Safety Tips

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - During summer and early fall months, the Sacramento region experiences extremely hot weather, which can be uncomfortable and dangerous for pets. As we experience higher than normal temperatures, the City of Rancho Cordova reminds residents to take special care to avoid the health impacts that extreme heat has on pets.

Never leave your pets in a parked car. On a warm day, temperatures inside a vehicle can rise rapidly to dangerous levels. For example: On an 85-degree day, the temperature inside a car with the windows opened slightly can reach 102 degrees within 10 minutes. After 30 minutes, the temperature may reach 120 degrees. Pets may suffer irreversible organ damage or die. If you see a pet left inside a hot car, please call Rancho Cordova Animal Services at (916) 851-8852 or the Police Department at (916) 362-5115. In situations in which the animal requires immediate response, citizens may take action to rescue the animal in accordance with California Penal Code Section 597.7 after making contact with the proper authorities.

Walking your dog on a hot day can have painful consequences. Asphalt and cement get very hot during summer months and can burn your dog's paws. Avoid

this problem by walking your dog in the early morning or evening hours, or, if possible, walk your dog on grass. Always carry water with you to keep your dog from dehydrating.

At home, keep your pet from overheating indoors or out with a cooling body wrap, vest, mat, or with a quick cool bath.

The City of Rancho Cordova has highly trained Animal

Services Officers who provide field services, such as response to stray or lost animals, barking dogs, loose aggressive and dangerous dogs, injured animals, deceased animal removal, investigation of animal cruelty, and public education.

If you need Animal Services, call (916) 851-8852. For emergencies involving immediate threats to public safety, call 911. ★



At least 13 were dead, 100 were injured, and more than 1,500 homes and businesses were destroyed as of Tuesday morning. The number of fires in Northern California was 14 at last count, which is changing too fast. Seeing the pictures of the fires in Southern California, like the one in Anaheim so close to Disneyland, it is hard to believe how fast those fires are moving.

covering all things when talking about loss. I am sorry for what has happened to so many.

Now going on to a positive thing that has been done for veterans. On Monday, September 25, the governor signed into law SB 330 from Senator Tom Berryhill that will help disabled veterans in California ease construction costs. Local governments can waive or reduce building permit fees for home improvements. The bill was unanimously approved by both houses of congress and then sent to the governor. It was supported by the California Building Industry Association, American G.I. Forum of California, The American Legion-Department of California, AMVETS-Department of California, and many more organizations in the state. I am very glad to see California's veterans organizations, different businesses, and all of our hired public servants supporting our veterans.

In last week's *The Grapevine Independent*, there was a letter to the editor from Mr. Bob Cashatt in which he asked if the City Council talked about changing its mind about allowing marijuana "pot shops" in the City of Rancho Cordova. To begin with, I will continue to vote against any ordinance allowing marijuana to be sold in shops in our city. The City Council made it clear, once again, that it is not interested in allowing any retail sales of marijuana in our city. The question that was being asked, and

is still in the air, is about allowing non-retail commercial marijuana businesses in the City. One example would be an office that only has phones in it to accept marijuana orders from customers in Rancho Cordova. I am still trying to get that clarified to my satisfaction because having an answering service in an office would still deny having the marijuana being sold there.

If the order is placed in Rancho Cordova, then the merchandise would be taxed by Rancho Cordova, even though it wasn't a product of Rancho Cordova. Too many questions need to be answered. But my vote is still no on any ordinance that would allow the opening of a drug shop with marijuana in the City of Rancho Cordova.

One of my goals when I write these columns is to keep the citizens of the City of Rancho Cordova aware of what is going on in their city/community/neighborhood. Thomas Jefferson said, "If we are to guard against ignorance and remain free, it is the responsibility of every American to be informed." We must remain cautious, however, about the different sources of information that flood our newspapers, and magazines, and news media, and social media, and television, and radio, and...!

Jerry Brown Signs Transsexual Takeover Bill

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Veteran California pro-family leader Randy Thomasson, president of SaveCalifornia.com, has issued the following statement responding to Governor Jerry Brown signing, without comment, SB 219, which will force all California long-term care facilities to submit to the tyrannical transsexual agenda, without limit:

"Existing law prohibits care homes from discriminating on the basis of actual or perceived sexual orientation, or actual or perceived gender identity (HSC 1569.269(b)). Yet this dangerous new law will unnecessarily and excessively penalize certain types of private speech at care facilities, and will impose criminal liability for saying 'wrong' words, including injurious fines and up to a year in jail.

"By imposing severe penalties within a confusing new 'sex change' policy, SB 219 will insensitively condemn care home employees who are non-English speakers and who may misunderstand requests of a resident in gender change transition. Creating harsh criminal penalties is not a sensible solution to delicate communication problems that may arise at care facilities. It's sad that the ruling Democrats ignored the common-sense objections of the California Association of Health Facilities.

"Who could have imagined a law sending Californians to jail for saying 'he' or 'she' in a way the State doesn't like? But it's here. Under SB 219, if a California long-term care home employee refers to a transitioning transgender woman as 'he,' or a transitioning transgender man as 'she,' they can incur a criminal fine and be incarcerated for up to a year, while the care home itself can suffer heavy fines and license revocation by the Department of Public Health, and also incur a fine of up to \$150,000 under the state Fair Employment and Housing Act. This merciless squashing of free speech cries out to be ruled unconstitutional."

long-term care facilities -- senior homes, convalescent homes, skilled nursing facilities, developmentally disabled, pediatric day health, respite care, etc. -- to fully support transsexuality and cross-dressing, including all types of "sex" unless sexual relations are forbidden for all residents. The bill lacks a religious exemption for residents, employees, managers, or owners.

When SB 219 becomes law on January 1, 2018, it will be unlawful and criminal for any private care facility to:

1. **Not call a transsexual's desire pronoun "he" or "she" or the transsexual's new "male" or "female" name.**
2. **Move or evict a transsexual resident for acting out their transsexual behavior, even if other residents are disturbed by it.**
3. **Respect the wishes of a person in a shared room not to have a transsexual roommate.**
4. **Maintain order by keeping biological males and biological females from sharing rooms and beds.**
5. **Refuse to help dress men in women's clothes or women in men's clothes, since the new law mandates a "right to wear or be dressed in clothing, accessories, or cosmetics that are permitted for any other resident."**
6. **Protect privacy in men's and women's restrooms**

and bathing areas, despite the bill's mandate for unisex bathrooms, "regardless of whether the resident is making a gender transition or appears to be gender-nonconforming."

7. **Restrict homosexual or transsexual "sex" with other residents or visitors on the premises, unless there is a uniform ban on sexual relations for all residents.**

8. **Fail to introduce all employees to a new government-endorsed curriculum called, "Building Respect for LGBT Older Adults."**

9. **Despite all the above, private care centers could not "deny or restrict medical or nonmedical care that is appropriate to a resident's organs and bodily needs." (So, with a cross-dressing biological male, the private care facility would be forced to treat him as a "woman," but then as the man he is in regard to his "organs and bodily needs"?)**

SB 219 will force California care facility employees, often Hispana or Filipina women, to abandon all morals, reason, and logic by being legally forced to dress up a biological man, if he demands it, in bra, panties, and women's clothes; being forced to put on him women's earrings and necklaces and panty hose and women's shoes; and being forced to apply make-up, eyeliner, and lipstick.

As LifeSiteNews explains, "if an elderly woman living at a nursing home in California is upset that she has been assigned a severely gender-confused man (say, a man with penis intact and artificially-induced breasts who dresses like a woman) as a roommate, her request to be reassigned another roommate could be termed 'discriminatory.'"

“BLADE RUNNER” STYLISH BLEAK FUTURE; “SEAL TEAM” ON TV

A Film and TV Review by Tim Riley

A sequel to a cult favorite and ground-breaking science-fiction film that comes thirty-five years later suggests that insightful considerations are absolutely necessary to understanding the trajectory of the “Blade Runner” cultural significance.

First, we need to look back to the original “Blade Runner” and its pioneering of an entirely new cultural genre that might be described as “neo-noir cyberpunk,” an existential state that captures a bleak dystopian future.

The sequel arrives with “Blade Runner 2049,” and its director Denis Villeneuve, observing that the source material was a blending of the two genres of science fiction and film noir, aims for the surreal atmospheric existence of a defiled universe.

While it is not absolutely essential to have seen the original, it helps to know that Harrison Ford starred as a former blade runner named Rick Deckard who came out of retirement to track down and terminate four fugitive replicants that escaped from an off-world colony.

Deckard was reluctant to take on the job of hunting the life-like robots, but over the course of completing his mission he met and fell in love with Rachael, a beautiful, young woman who turned out to be a replicant.

Fast forward to thirty years later in “Blade Runner 2049,” and Ryan Gosling plays the role of an LAPD blade runner named K who oddly enough has difficulty with memories of his childhood to the extent that he starts to question his humanity.

But “Blade Runner 2049” has much to do with the conflict between humanity and technology, and the intersection of the two manifest themselves in Officer K’s home life where his only companion is Joi (Ana de Armas), who materializes as a life-like hologram.

As a result of tracking down an old-model replicant (Dave Bautista) living off-the-grid as a protein farmer, Officer K unearths a long-buried secret that has the potential to plunge an already dysfunctional society into a permanent state of chaos and ruin.

Consequently, Officer K’s discovery leads him on a quest to find Deckard, the former LAPD blade runner who has been missing for 30 years and wants to very much remain hidden at his lonely outpost in a decimated Las Vegas where only a flickering image of Elvis provides a human presence.

The future world of “Blade Runner 2049” is so bleak that you may be fascinated to learn that the climate of sunny Los Angeles has been so drastically changed that the average days are often more like the harsh, snowy conditions of Chicago in January.

Atmosphere and visual style are the two things that create a most compelling landscape in the environmentally degraded surroundings of a toxic wasteland. The bleak aesthetics are fascinating and make this film interesting to watch.

“Blade Runner 2049” is full of intriguing characters, including industrialist Niander Wallace (Jared Leto) who’s pulling the strings with his genetic engineering and Robin Wright’s tormenting police captain.

To his credit, director

Villeneuve has preserved and enhanced the strong image of what Ridley Scott, director of the original film, presented as a disturbing future that could be at the same time so seductive and frightening.

“SEAL TEAM” ON CBS NETWORK

Military-themed series are popping up on several network schedules this fall, but “SEAL Team” running on CBS television seems like the best fit for this type of drama and the core audience that taps into the top-rated network’s penchant for safe, dependable programming.

This new drama series centers on David Boreanaz’s commanding role of Captain Jason Hayes in a tight-knit team that is seen in the first episode in a gunboat firefight with ISIL forces. But this show is about a lot more than just military operations.

The stress of war has taken a great toll on Jason. He’s estranged from his wife and children. Losing a colleague in combat is just as devastating as the death of any family member.

During the summer TV press tour, Boreanaz observed that “SEAL Team” is a “workplace show” and that his character has to “deal with his own inner turmoil” and the complexity of his personal life. Combat missions are important to the series, but not the end-all.

“SEAL Team” consists of a solid ensemble of actors, from Jessica Pare as a CIA liaison involved in mission planning to Neil Brown, Jr. as Jason’s trusted teammate. Boreanaz’s Captain Hayes may inspire many to follow him into battle during the run of this series. ★

Back from Italy! Glad to be Home!

Do you dream about traveling to exotic places? Do you ache to see famous points of interest like the Eiffel Tower, the Tahj Mahal or to meet Michael Angelo's David even though he's naked? When you hear about a friend or neighbor getting to go on a cruise or spending time in Paris, London, Amsterdam, Hawaii or just about anywhere short of North Korea, do you find yourself craving to go and feeling bad because you can't? Do your travel dreams get squashed because of your workload, lack of money, too many kids to take along or a bunch of other reasons?

Mom always wanted to travel when my sister Peggy and I were growing up, but we never got to go very far because we didn't have the money and Dad couldn't take time off from work. But that didn't stop Mom from planning! Bless her little, organized heart; she subscribed to "Holiday Magazine," a glitzy periodical for the rich (and we weren't)! It even looked and

felt expensive because it was in full color and heavy because every page was almost as thick as the slick cover. Also, it was filled with lots of ads for diamond jewelry and fancy cars in addition to the places it urged us to go. Mom plotted out trips complete with itineraries, destinations for dining, recreation, accommodations and such, and collected them all in her cherished box of travel dreams; her version of a bucket list, where they all waited for the day they'd take us away. We never went.

Remember George Bailey in "It's a Wonderful Life" saying, "You know what the three most exciting sounds in the world are? Anchor chains, plane motors & train whistles."? Those were Mom's words too and like George Bailey her energy went into creating a wonderful home-life for our family and not into traveling the world.

A Lesson on Travel

The lesson I learned is

something the travel industry doesn't want you to consider. Actually I learned it on the way home in the jumbo jet filled with travelers from all over the world. The trip home took 24 hours counting all the connecting legs and waits in airports (the transatlantic part was an 11-hour flight) and the lesson came while watching one of the three in-flight movies which happened to be "Under the Tuscan Sun" starring Diane Lane.

I'll share the lesson at the end of this article. For now, it's important you know *when* I got the lesson, because until that point in our trip, I couldn't put my finger on what I was supposed to learn, even though it kept nagging at me throughout the whole trip. For now let's go to the villa we stayed in in Tuscany.

Casanova dei Boschi

The Villa was called Casanova dei Boschi and is 400 years old; older than the United States of America! It was hard

to wrap my mind around that fact and I don't think I really ever did. It's located outside the town called Montepulciano which just happens to be one of the towns shown "Under the Tuscan Sun." The villa was situated two hours on a freeway from the airport at Florence (Italians call it Floor-en-zee.). Unfortunately it took us five hours to drive there because our GPS (which spoke Italian, we don't) had us going in circles and we couldn't find the expressway though we managed to go the wrong way on a one-way street and couldn't get the van in reverse so we could turn around. (After ten minutes fiddling with the gear shift and learning the Italian gesture for **IDIOT**, Terry discovered he had to pull up on a ring around the gearshift for the transmission to honor us with its reverse.)

My bonus daughter Kristi planned the entire trip (totally my mother's daughter even though she wasn't) and while she and her family traveled through southern Italy for five days, her plan was for us to rent the van to seat seven, meet them at the train station when they came in from Rome and spend the next five days together at Casanova dei Boschi. We ended up getting the caretaker of the villa to navigate the journey from the villa to the train station to pick them

up, even though he was hard of hearing and didn't speak English. Pointing works in all countries!

Okay, here's the lesson. The only reason you want to travel to places you've never been is because either someone who has been there told you about it and made you want to go there too or you've seen those places in magazines, movies or on television. After spending five days under the Tuscan sun, somehow it didn't match the movie experience, because movies aren't real life, they're suspensions of reality. For one thing, it was 95 degrees every day and one of those days we were enticed to go on a day-long bicycle tour "meandering through ancient villages ending up at a vineyard for wine-tasting." (We were told the route was gentle and for beginners, which at the end of the day left us wondering what an intermediate tour would have been! Some of the hills were reminiscent of San Francisco.)

While watching "Under the Tuscan Sun" it hit me that we'd been to many of the places Touchstone Pictures took us in that film but it left out the not so glorious and romantic stuff of travel life which includes crowds, waiting in lines, noise, heat and the expense of it all. In the movie there was no learning to back up in a rented van, trying to read Italian road signs,

ordering food for a gluten and lactose intolerant husband, no pillows the size of Kotex Mini Pads, no Italian yellow jackets (meaner than American ones) no picking between running the air conditioning or the dishwasher. When you travel, be prepared for reality, because it follows you everywhere you go.

As I write this, I know I'm under the spell of jet lag and I'm sure by tomorrow all the joy that I experienced in beautiful Italy will come bubbling up. Right now, I feel like the next time I get the urge to go to Italy, I'm going to watch "Under the Tuscan Sun" and order the meat lover's pizza from Anthony's Pizzeria right here in Woodland, Washington!

So the lesson is really that you take yourself with you wherever you go, so if you can't go someplace else right now have fun right where you are!

The Honorable Michael Bowman sentenced Bryant Fields to 51 years in prison. On August 2, 2017, a jury convicted Fields of attempted murder, two counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm, two counts of shooting into an occupied vehicle and felon in possession of a gun. The jury also found true multiple allegations that Fields personally used a gun and that he intentionally discharged a firearm.

On April 18, 2016, Sacramento police officers responded to a shot spotter notification at an apartment complex, where they found 10 spent shell casings. Video of the shooting and witness interviews revealed that Bryant Fields got into a short verbal altercation with the victim. When the victim got into his car to leave, Fields followed him out of the complex on foot and shot at the victim's car 10 times. One round hit another vehicle as it passed by the scene. On April 23, 2016, officers located Fields at a residence along with items that connected him to the crime, including the gun used in the shooting. The Court found that Fields had suffered a prior strike conviction for felony assault with a firearm on November 19, 2009.

Three Gang Members Convicted of Attempted Murder

DATE: September 29, 2017
CASE: Joseph Castaneda, Manuel Labrasca & Ray Ramirez
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Gang & Hate Crimes Unit

Joseph Castaneda, Manuel Labrasca, and Ray Ramirez were convicted of two counts of attempted murder and enhancements for causing great bodily injury and participating in a criminal street gang.

On March 17, 2016, Castaneda, Labrasca and Ramirez were in the parking lot of an apartment complex in the Lemon Hill area. All three are validated Norteno gang members. The two victims were in a car that entered the parking lot. When the passenger got out of that car he was immediately attacked. The driver attempted to intervene in the assault and was also attacked. Both victims suffered extensive stab wounds but they were able to get into their car and driver was able to drive to a local hospital.

Castaneda and Labrasca face a potential prison sentence of up to 30 years. Ramirez has a prior strike conviction for robbery and participating in

a criminal street gang and faces a minimum sentence of 50 years to life. Sentencing is set for November 3, 2017 10:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Russell Hom.

Defendant Convicted of Child Sexual Assault

DATE: October 3, 2017
CASE: Jose Contreras (Case #16FE011439)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney TeriAnn Grimes, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Jose Contreras was convicted by a jury of two counts of committing a sex act with a child under 10 years of age and two count of committing a lewd act upon a child.

On June 8, 2016, the victim's parents left their 6-year-old daughter in the care of Contreras, who is a family member. When the victim's parents returned home, they found Contreras naked from the waist down in their daughter's room. The victim was crying and had thrown up and urinated on herself. The victim's father immediately called 911 to report the crime. The victim later told the police how Contreras sexually assaulted her.

Contreras faces a maximum sentence of 50 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 17, 2017 at 1:30 p.m. in Department 29 before the Honorable Timothy Frawley.

Defendant Convicted for Murder of 13-Month-Old Girl

DATE: October 6, 2017
CASE: Guyland Washington (Case #14F04826)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Dawn Bladet, Homicide Unit

Guyland Washington was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of 13-month-old Leila Shehadeh, and child assault causing death.

On the morning of July 11, 2014, Guyland Washington's then girlfriend left her 13-month-old daughter, Leila Shehadeh, in Washington's care. When the girlfriend returned that afternoon, she discovered her daughter was not breathing and unresponsive. Paramedics brought Leila to the UC Davis Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead shortly after her arrival. When doctors observed bruising and multiple injuries to Leila's head, body and anal areas, they reported suspected child abuse to law enforcement. An autopsy showed Leila suffered a skull fracture with associated brain swelling, rib fractures and significant bruising on various parts of her body. Her cause of death was determined to be intentionally inflicted blunt force injuries.

Washington faces a maximum sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 8, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 12 before the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard. ★







Finding a Job As a Felon

As we all know, finding a job is tough these days. Imagine having to try and find a job while having a felony on your record. The way I see it, we have ALL made bad choices and the only difference between us, and a felon, is that they got caught. Are there some crimes that are too much for an employer to handle? I'm sure there is, but many crimes are ones that can be left in the past. Many "criminals" want to get out of prison and move on with their lives, they want to go to work and help take care of their families. Yes, they have families too.

Put it in a different perspective... Imagine that you once made a bad choice. Due to that bad choice you are taken away from your family that depends on you, and loves you. You spend a various amount of time behind walls where the conditions are less than extremely disturbing. Once you finally get out you are overwhelmed by the changes that happened in the world, while your world stood still for so long. With a sense of "what the hell happened" you try to pull up your boot straps and find work, only to find that employers are looking down on you for a story that they can't even begin to imagine. All they see is what is written on paper, never once taking the time to hear what really happened. Now, a man that has been housed in an unbearable environment can't find work to help support the family that he loves, and feels like he owes, for standing with him through the trenches.

This leads me to the personal journey my husband and I have encountered. My husband was given an eleven year sentence for punching a man one time, while defending a

minor child from being jumped by two grown men. Granted, he shouldn't have hit that man, but he felt justified in the sense that he was protecting a child. A judge told the jury that my husband would get a maximum of five years, if convicted. Before sentencing the jury was dismissed and the judge gave my husband and eleven year sentence. He was required to serve eighty percent of his sentence, due to it being a "violent" offense. There was so much to what had happened and not even the judge wanted to hear it. My husband and I had a one year old son when he went to prison in May 2009, my husband didn't come home until June 2017, and our son is now 9 years old. My husband's first five years of incarceration were spent in out of state prison's, making it very hard for anyone to go to visits. In the eight year's this man was behind those walls he strived to earn his G.E.D., he passed multiple parenting classes, he spent two years in an auto mechanics class and earned his certificate, he went through seven months of a substance abuse/violence management course, and multiple computer courses so he could try to provide a better future for his wife and children when he got home. This man did all of this in an environment many of us could never possibly imagine, yet he did it and kept his head up for most of his journey. He came out of prison ten times better of a man than he went in, yet finding a job is nearly impossible because of what shows up on a piece of paper.

Imagine trying to better yourself in a constant war zone, would you be able to do it? Many of us can't even fathom the idea, yet my husband did it. Riots, fights, abuse, hunger, and some more for eight years. Through the hell he called life

he became a better friend, a better father, and an amazing husband. In a world where people are beat down to believe they are nothing is the world that my husband learned to love himself and his family. All he wants to do is work and provide for his family, to feel like a man again, but our society makes that impossible. My husband would be the strongest, most reliable, employee a company could have but they won't even give him a shot because of what they see on a piece of paper.


This HAS to change. How do we expect our men to be providers if we don't allow them to provide? A LARGE percentage of our youth has been, or is, incarcerated at some point in their life. Whether it be situational, unpreventable, or intentional it is something we have to deal with. I can tell you though, that when somebody that feels broken down is given a shot to feel stable again, they will give you all that they have, and isn't that what an employer should be motivated by? I speak on our journey, because it is the journey I know, but there are SO many people with a similar story and they ALL deserve a chance. Society talks about how men aren't what they used to be, but did anyone think about the fact that they aren't giving our men the opportunity they deserve in order to provide for their families? Have they thought about the fact that they are so focused on the choices that people made in their past that they aren't seeing the amazing changes they have made and who they are NOW?

When is it time to let people live, and be productive members of society, after a bad choice? This is something that only employers can change! My husband has sent out, literally, nearly 1,000 resume's. He has been on maybe 5 interviews and

had maybe 5 phone interviews and the minute the question arises about whether he has a felony the conversation stops. Is that fair? The same day that he left the gates of the prison he went to the DMV, took the test, and was a licensed driver after years behind those walls. He went to the social security office to get a new social security card. This all happened in the same town he had been incarcerated in for the past three years, instead of running as fast as he could to get out of there. He felt it to be very important to obtain these things so that he could find work and provide for his family. Due to circumstances, while he was incarcerated, his G.E.D. was not received before leaving prison, but since being home he has completed three of the four pieces to his G.E.D. Is this the case for all felons? No, not by a long shot, but that is why it is necessary to get to know the person behind the paper. A convicted felon needs many things to truly be rehabilitated, but a major piece is feeling self-worth again, that is partially given back to them by means of employment.

I'm asking employers to make a change in what they look at. Give these men a chance. If you give someone a chance you might be surprised how much they give back to you, and your business. Hiring a felon within their first year allows companies to receive a tax break. It prevents further crime by giving a man a job to support his family instead of feeling desperate and taking desperate measures to provide what his family might need. Give each individual the chance to prove themselves, just as you were given a chance at some point in your life to prove yourself to an employer. It's time we strengthen our communities by seeing change instead of judging the past. ★

Cordova ‘Peaking’ at Right Time in SVC Win over Galt

GALT, CA (MPG) - A series of early mistakes haunted the Cordova High School football team for most of one quarter.

But the Lancers refocused the rest of the way that led to a 52-13 Sierra Valley Conference opener victory over Galt on the Erv Hatzenbuehler Field at Warrior Stadium on Oct. 6th.

Cordova (1-0 in the SVC, 4-2 overall) was marred by early mistakes, thanks to Galt (0-1 in the SVC, 3-3), which picked off a Lancer pass and recovered a fumble in the early part of the first quarter. On one of its offensive possessions, Cordova drove to the Warriors’ 10-yard line, only to watch the drive come up short in which a holding call was called against the Lancers.

“We made a lot of mistakes,” said Cordova head coach Darrin Nill of the opening quarter. “It was one of those things where we had to get the mistakes out of the way first before we could start playing football.”

Toward the end of the quarter, Cordova scored its first touchdown when quarterback Johnlee Sanders threw a scoring pass to wide receiver Jordan Colvin. The Lancers opted and made the 2-point conversion. Galt scored its first of two touchdowns in the quarter to make it an 8-7 score entering the second quarter.

The Warriors turned the ball over after a missed 37-yard field goal in the second quarter. Then the Lancers’ offense went on a scoring spree that led to a 32-7 halftime advantage.

Leading the way for the Lancers were Sanders, who completed a touchdown pass to wide receiver Alvin Banks. Sanders, who completed 10-of-14 passes for 192 yards and threw three touchdowns, scored on rushing touchdown, and rushed 10 times for 133 yards and two more scores for a combined five in the game.

Yusef Pugh had a punt returned 70 yards for Cordova, which was successful on all of its 2-point conversions in the quarter.

The Warriors was focused on

the Lancers’ passing attack led by Sanders, who has completed 84 of 120 passes for 1,425 yards and 17 touchdowns for the season. That’s when Cordova opted for its running game that finished with 271

combined yards.

“They knew we had a really tough passing attack,” Nill said. “(Cordova running backs) were giving us six, seven yards a carry. When they (Galt) tighten up the

box a bit, we threw the ball.”

Cordova scored two more touchdowns in the third quarter, along with Galt adding another one to make it 45-13 going into the fourth quarter. After the

Lancers scored their final touchdown, game officials called for a running clock when the game became more than a 35-point difference.

After giving up 39.3 points per game on defense in the pre-season, Nill and his assistant coaches were pleased to hold a Galt squad that has many offensive weapons to only two touchdowns.

“I think we’re peaking at the right time,” Nill said. “We’re getting it together with the right people at the right places.”

Leading the Lancers’ defense were linebackers in Elijah Jenkins, who had 13 tackles, Pugh 10 and Chase Allen seven.

On Friday, Oct. 13th, Cordova will have its homecoming game against SVC foe Union Mine (0-1 in the SVC, 2-4), which rallied from a 26-8 deficit but fell short to Liberty Ranch, which posted a 40-35 win in the conference opener in El Dorado last Friday. Game time for Union Mine-Cordova is scheduled to start at 7:30 p.m. ★

The Falcon men completed the doubleheader sweep with a shutout of crosstown rival American River on Friday night at Falcon Stadium as they regained first place in

the Big 8 Conference. First-half goals by Chase Gray and Pablo Herrera, and second-half goals by Santiago Peniche and Luis Aguilar fueled the victory. The win, coupled with a Delta College loss to Santa Rosa, allowed the Falcons to reclaim their hold on first place at the halfway point in the Big 8 schedule. The next four matches are crossover matches with Central Valley Conference teams before the Falcons return to Big 8 play on October 27. ★






