National Agencies Offer Crisis Training in Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The St. John Vianney Catholic Church hosted a two-part presentation on Saturday, July 22 for what citizens can do in the event of a "worst case scenario." The morning seminar was given by the Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD), the National Security Administration and the Department of Homeland Security. Officers Randy Moya and C.T. Smith, each with over 20 years in law enforcement, and part of the Problem Oriented Policing (which deals with chronic community issues) unit of the RCPD discussed emergency practices during their "Active Shooter Presentation," including pointers, statistics and profiling information on reaction and survival. The second part dealt with giving emergency first aid. "Stop the Bleed" gave people the chance to receive instruction in

advance of a crisis on how to recognize and treat traumatic injuries and control bleeding to save lives until first responders arrive. A trauma surgeon was on hand to give his expert advice for this basic, but essential skill. A variety of artificial tissue wounds were provided for demonstration purposes. Dozens of people packed the hall at St. John Vianney to attend the free event, which was open to the public. The Sacramento Diocese recently provided the same training, which St. John Vianney Deacon Walter Little completed and then sought to bring to Rancho Cordova. Said Deacon Little. "I came back and thought it would be exciting to do for the whole community." His pastor at St. John Vianney, Fr. Chuck Kelly, agreed and representatives were invited from all the houses of worship in Rancho Cordova to attend, as well. "The Church is in the business of being aware of the issues of the day," commented Fr. Kelly at the event, also remarking that

approximately half of the audience were parishioners from the parish. The crowd consisted of adults of all ages and genders, bringing into sharp focus the fact that such unfortunate situations and preparedness for such an event is paramount in the minds of many in the Rancho Cordova Community. "At a certain point [regarding learning and pre-planning]," said Officer Moya during the Q and A, "you're going to have to make decisions." He addressed the difference between "hard" and "soft" targets and the likelihood of those locations to be able to defend themselves in the event of attack or to render first aid in an emergency to the injured. According to Moya, the Sacramento Sheriff's office is happy to come and do a liability assessment of homes, schools, churches, businesses and other buildings or locations in all communities within their jurisdiction, offering instruction, tips

State Fair Wraps Up with Great Numbers

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California State Fair created memories for the entire community this year. It reached record numbers as the one northern California event where everyone is welcome to come out and enjoy the best of what California has to offer. "The California State Fair is proud to be recognized as the largest showcase of the rich bounty and diversity of our Golden State," said Rick Pickering, CEO and General Manager of the California State Fair. We celebrated agriculture, livestock, horse racing, unique foods, events, rides, and exhibits... some of which people have never seen before. Food sales grossed an estimated \$8.5 million, and there was an estimated \$4.2 million in carnival ride sales grossing over \$12.7 million in sales revenue; not including hotel stays and other revenue sources for the Sacramento region. With it being the Fair's 50th year at Cal Expo, there was a lot to celebrate. New this year was the dedication of "Best of CA: Celebrating Farm Workers' Rich Contributions to Food and Agriculture." There was the return of soccer, with the Sacramento Republic FC playing two games. Sponsored by the Tractor Supply Company, the Junior Livestock Sale of Champions raised \$270,344 for youth, which was the highest amount in the past 10 years. Despite being one of the hottest July's in 10 years, with 8 days of triple-digit weather during the weekends, 636,628 attendees enjoyed the Fair. Out of the 17 concerts, 7 completely sold out for the Gold Circle Reserved Seats. More than 32,500 racing fans came to the Miller Lite Racetrack Grandstand for horse racing and special events. Other notable numbers were; 1,488 beers entered into the Commercial Beer Competition; 2,663 wines entered into the Commercial Wine Competition; 19,662 wine slushies were served in the Save Mart Wine Garden. Overall 19,931 competitive entries were at the State Fair and 6,412 total exhibits. 5,992 free rides from Butler Amusement in support of the CA State Fair's Read to Ride program for local children who turned in 2,996 book reports. There were 37 corn dogs were eaten by the winner of the Milo's Corn Dog Eating Contest - Molly Schuyler from Plumas Lake, CA. She defeated competitors that came from as far as Philadelphia to compete. 75,000 total corn dogs were consumed at the fair. 9,556 livestock animals were on display; 18,100 Turkey legs were sold; 35,100 Funnel cakes were sold; 11,325 pieces of the fruit were given out through the Save Mart Supermarkets Passport Program at the Kaiser Permanente CA State Fair Farm; 1,963 #50thFairHunt SMUD bags were given out; and 2,060 Dish fireworks were shot into the night sky. Central Valley Towing helped Fair guests with 7 jump starts, 10 unlock cars, 2 tire changes and assisted in shuttling 5,832 people to and from the parking lots to entrances. Unity Sacramento Celebrating 70 Years of Love

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Seven decades have passed since Unity Sacramento church incorporated, officially extending the word of Unity Founders Charles and Myrtle Fillmore's "New Thought" approach to Christianity, first from within the modest Crest Theatre in Sacramento's downtown corridor, followed by a move to a converted bowling alley on L Street 20 years later, then, in 1991, from its current home, the site of a former grocery store on Folsom Road in Sacramento's eastside.

In celebration of 70 years of service, Reverend Kevin Kitrell Ross commonly known as "Rev. Kev," and his leadership "Dream Team," comprised of nearly a dozen trained Unity teachers and support staff, which includes Ross's wife, Anita, are ramping up their efforts to achieve what is arguably any spiritual congregation's most pressing goal: expanding membership by primarily attracting and retaining younger congregants, bringing them into the fold on the promise of spiritual inclusivity, number one, but also one of hope and peace for all those suffering or seeking to understand whatever social ills may ail them.

"I want Unity to incorporate the practical tools of the fellowship that I was taught, that is no doubt a part of our primary purpose," says Ross. "But what has been missing here is how we can do a better job of applying those tools to heal the divides and

address those on the fringes of our communities."

Call it progressive. Call it new age. Call it whatever you like, which is precisely the point: Unity's New Thought-Ageless Wisdom ministerial approach offers a sacred space for non-denominational worship, where Biblical teachings are interwoven with the beliefs of spiritual leaders from Mahatma Gandhi and the Buddha, to Mohammad and Krishna. There is plenty of room for just about anyone in this house of worship, which operates as a spiritual and metaphysical melting pot of prayer, cultural nourishment, enlightenment, spiritual education, healing and community outreach.

"We are a lot of things to a lot of different people," says Ross, whose office feels more like a day spa than a minister's private space. A water feature trickles almost silently down the back wall behind his desk, the base of which is a massive tree stump, salvaged from a fire. Its top, a finely polished burl slab. No crosses in the traditional sense here, but there is a near-eight-foot long wooden staff propped up in the corner, as well as sculptures and paintings and other religious iconography from Asia and Africa, among other places, hanging on the walls. And the soft, purple recessed lighting is enough to send anyone into a quiet state without much prompting.

"I need a sanctuary from the sanctuary sometimes," Ross says. "It gets to be heavy out there as the day unfolds and

being in a quiet space at times to think and contemplate is very important."

Ross, 43, is sporting a pair of turquoise running shoes, button-down shirt and a contemporary navy jacket, looking more like a hip-hop artist than a minister overseeing a flock of some 600 congregants. A native of Chicago's south side, Ross was chosen from a pool of several candidates to lead Unity Sacramento in 2010. Prior to that, he served as senior minister at Unity Kansas City, the ministry's flagship church and teaching center. The Morehouse College graduate, highly influenced by the words and teachings of Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., said he saw a lot of things missing at Unity

Sacramento upon arrival and he set out to see some changes put into place right away, beginning first with food.

"One of the things I noticed here is that this area really is a food desert," says Ross. "People who want fresh vegetables or fruits and not fast food, which is on every corner it seems, have to drive miles just to get it. So we started a Farmers' Market and it has just exploded."

More directly aimed at attracting younger members, his team launched the "Dream Center," where youth perhaps at risk for otherwise getting into gangs or simply just needing a place to express themselves and be with their peers, can come and hang out, play pool, talk with a pastor, paint, draw, bang on musical instruments or simply just enjoy a safe space.

"It's very important for young people to have a safe place to express their creativity and enrich themselves," said Ross. "Being in the presence of mentors is also critical."

Unity now also houses a Visions and Education center, offering homeschooled students an extended learning support resource for tutoring and test preparation, as well as an onsite charter school created through a community partnership that can take in 50 students at any given time. Blessings in a Backpack also now occupies space within Unity Sacramento's confines, where it prepares meals for delivery to kids at local schools, clandestinely stuffed into backpacks every Friday to ensure kids in need have access to food for the weekend.

"Blessings in a Backpack puts food into the kids' backpacks so that, on the weekends, when they don't have access to the food from the free or reduced-cost programs they are enrolled in, they can be sure to have

something to eat," said Ross.

Sunday services in the traditional senses are offered at 9 a.m., and include a traditional approach with classic hymns and quiet, reflective sermons. Then, at 11 a.m., Ross kicks it up a notch with a high-energy service, featuring contemporary readings, speakers and infectious live music. Unity now offers guided meditation classes by trained Unity teachers, a rotating "Power Hour" sermon series during the week, featuring guest

ministers and speakers.

"We want to make all aspects of worship here as accessible as possible," Ross said. "It's about inclusiveness."

In short, Unity Sacramento has attempted to hold to its roots but get with the times, as many years and ways of delivering the message have come and gone since the Unity movement was founded by Charles and Myrtle Fillmore in Kansas City in 1889. Much has changed since Unity Sacramento was incubated as Christ Unity Church in 1920, where it served as a teaching center under the guidance of

Naomi Anderson before incorporating as Unity Sacramento on May 16, 1947.

John Hinkle held the ministerial reigns and ran Unity from inside Sacramento's Crest Theater. In 1966, Dorothy and Phillip Pierson assumed leadership, purchasing the first permanent home for Unity: an old bowling alley at 1415 L Street, and continued to serve as senior ministers for the next thirty-six years before retiring in 2002.

Nominated as one of the top five mental health friendly churches in the community, Ross has put sound resources and energy into ensuring services for those suffering from mental illness, ramped up significantly when a congregant suffering from depression, set herself on fire.

"That incident was heartbreaking for us," Ross says. "We are on the front lines, because most people who are suffering some form of a mental issue will come to see a minister first. So we now have prayer chaplains, congregants and members of our staff who have been trained to work with individuals suffering from mental health issues. We want to break the stigma of mental illness."

"We have become visible and very active in the interfaith community," Ross said. "We want to build those bridges and extend our ideologies of inclusivity and love. We want to reflect the community where we are and that means reaching out to those who live on the edges of society because of their faith, because of their color, and bring them in."

Ross helped institute Unity's Law Enforcement Accountability Directive or Project LEAD, to help bridge gaps and slowing begin to demolish the walls that have long-divided local law enforcement and minorities.

"Project LEAD has been very instrumental in helping to create more of a transparent process with local law enforcement," Ross said. "Unity is like cream in your coffee. We want everyone to know that we are not just a church. We are also the most loving place on earth." ★

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR DENTAL OFFICES

New EPA Rule Requires Dental Practices to Install Amalgam Separators and Implement Best Management Practices

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recently issued technology-based pretreatment standards under the Clean Water Act to **reduce discharges of mercury from dental offices into municipal sewage treatment plants.**

The Dental Office Effluent Guidelines became effective July 14, 2017. This final rule **requires dental offices install amalgam separators and two best management practices.** Dental offices that place or remove amalgam:

- ✓ Must install, operate, and maintain an amalgam separator
- ✓ Must not discharge scrap amalgam into the sewer
- ✓ Must not use certain kinds of line cleaners, such as bleach

Existing dental dischargers must comply and submit a form to Regional San (see links below) by October 12, 2020. New dental dischargers or ownership transfers must comply within 90 days of their first discharge. If any dental practices already had amalgam separators prior to June 14, 2017, they have until June 14, 2027, to replace them with compliant separators. Dentists who never place amalgam or remove amalgam in limited or unplanned circumstances are exempt.

Who is affected by this new rule?

This rule applies to offices, including large institutions such as dental schools and clinics, where dentistry is practiced that discharge to a municipal sewage treatment facility. It does not apply to mobile units or offices where the practice of dentistry consists only of oral pathology, oral and maxillofacial radiology, oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthodontics, periodontics, or prosthodontics.

Why are these standards necessary?

When dentists remove old amalgam fillings from cavities or place a new filling, mercury in the form of dental amalgam enters the wastewater of the dental office. Mercury from waste amalgam can make its way into the environment from the treatment plant through the land application of sludge or through surface water discharge to the Sacramento River. Mercury is a potent neurotoxin that can have a wide range of health effects. Once released into the aquatic environment, certain bacteria can change mercury into methylmercury, a highly toxic form of mercury that bioaccumulates in fish and shellfish. Eating fish and shellfish is the main source of people's exposure to methylmercury in the U.S.

and suggestions for both locations and the people in them, the intent of which is to help develop a safety protocol that can be put into place as soon as a possible threat is detected.
Officer Moya even used a recent example of his own personal experience while at a movie theater. Upon a disruption in the movie he noted, many of the viewers typically panicked and crowded towards exits. His training and experience taught him that was not generally the safest move.
During the presentation, he and Officer Smith pointed out that being aware of all entrances and egresses (exits) where people go and generally being aware of the surroundings, is an easy first step in case of emergency. They also pointed out that running away in a zigzag motion makes people much harder targets to hit, greatly increasing the chances of survival.
Moya and Smith pointed out that first responders had learned a lot over the years about proceeding in dire circumstances and changes had been made to

deployment tactics and more lives saved. “Time is of the essence,” they said in agreement.
The medical portion of the morning presentation had staff from the Cascade Training Center from the Sacramento area. Cascade Training is a national organization that conducts training for first responders, law enforcement, medical, athletics and civilians in many areas and levels of trauma treatment.
Dr. Robert Jacobi, the trauma surgeon in attendance began his medical career as a firefighter and paramedic. He specializes in trauma and emergency medicine and is well acquainted with quickly treating and stabilizing patients in all types of situations.
The estimated 100 people present at the event were able to learn how to recognize various traumatic wounds via the synthetic dummy teaching displays and learn how to appropriately stem bleeding. It is estimated that approximately 85% of fatalities could be averted by controlling or stopping bleeding, according to documentation provided by presenters to the group. ★

- When disaster strikes, preparation is key. Realizing that their senior mobile home park was *not* prepared to effectively respond to an emergency, a group of residents at the Mobil Country Club in Rancho Cordova decided to take action.
The almost 500 homes that make up Mobil Country Club sit just east of Sunrise Boulevard at the northeastern edge of Rancho Cordova. The park is reserved for seniors 55 years and older, about one-third of whom are handicapped or have some type of walking or driving limitation.
A group of residents came together and formed the Mobil Country Club Homeowners Association (HOA) a few years ago to discuss and address homeowner concerns. For example, until a few weeks




ago, the park only had one clear evacuation exit onto heavily traveled Sunrise Boulevard if a flood, fire or other disaster were to strike the community.
“We started first with an emergency evacuation plan because that’s what the residents wanted,” said Carol Schroeder, President of the HOA and resident of the park for 16 years. “They felt that in the event of an emergency, there weren’t any guidelines. They wouldn’t know what to do.”
Led by a handful of Mobil Country Club residents, the HOA applied for grant funding from the City of Rancho Cordova’s Community Enhancement Fund and was awarded \$38,754 to purchase two six-passenger electric golf carts, a storage structure, and other supplies, such as flashlights, to evacuate handicapped

or slow-moving residents to safety.
However, “the golf carts won’t be sitting, waiting for an emergency to happen,” said Schroeder. Resident volunteers will also use the golf carts to shuttle residents within the park to social activities and facilities, including the parks’ clubhouse and laundry building, helping to improve the quality of life of many residents.
After consulting risk and evacuation specialists at Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, the HOA designed a robust emergency evacuation guide for Mobil Country Club residents, which volunteers distributed to each home last week.
The guide includes a map assigning clear evacuation routes for specific sections of the park and gives step-by-step

procedures for five types of disasters: fire, earthquake, tornado, bomb threats, and floods.
The HOA says the guide is the first of its kind in the Sacramento region designed specifically to meet the needs of mobile home park residents. “Other parks want to know what we’re doing so they can follow suit,” said Antonio Martinez, one of the key members of the HOA. The HOA expects some of the 12 to 15 other mobile home parks in the Sacramento region to use their evacuation guide as a model.
Bob Schroeder, another key HOA member said, “The impact of this project is the mere fact that residents have a way to get around that they didn’t have before. The people really appreciate it.”

Peace means different things in different cultures and to different people. We have all looked up definitions in dictionaries to see what they mean. For example, peace: “any state of calm or tranquil; friendly international relations; freedom from or cessation of war.” President Ronald Reagan said, “All of us denounce war. All of us consider it man’s greatest stupidity. And yet, wars happen and they involve the most passionate lovers of peace because there are still barbarians in the world who set the price for peace at death or enslavement. And the price is too high!”

During my Memorial Day and Veterans Day committee meeting the other day, we talked about how one hundred years ago on April 6, 1917, we entered WWI. Some of the things that were discovered during that war like medicine helped save lives. And at the same time during “The Great War” or “The war to end all wars,” the invention of and use of such war machines like tanks and poison gas were

what we read about and what we may hear about during 2017.

Now the reason I said we may hear about WWI this year is because as the years have gone by, the news media seems to forget that their responsibility is to report the news, versus not telling their audience all of the story and just what they want their audience to hear. The story about WWI is both heroic and very ugly. It is heartbreaking and brave and noble. It is what will not be read in today’s history books in most schools because some history (WWI) is abbreviated “because our children shouldn’t have to read about that part of history which is fearsome, hideous or dangerous.” Perhaps I am more wrong than right, but what I have found so far is that children’s games today show more guts and gore than was ever shown in the past. I think that many of today’s kids see more death in some of their games and some movies, and think less of life in general. That is quite different than what their parents were taught.

A while back, I read a letter from a Sergeant who was a WWII Veteran. He was being interviewed by a teen reporter from the high school paper about what veterans experienced

in the war. The Sergeant told about one time in which he was down in a foxhole with another GI, and they were talking about things back home and how they were willing to die to protect their family, home, church, etc. Then the Sergeant stopped his story, looked at the teen reporter, and said he was worried about kids today because he didn’t think that today’s youth knew what they were even willing to live for. Much less what they were willing to die for. Interesting views, wouldn’t you say?

Over the next couple of years, we will be talking about the 100 years from our country’s involvement in WWI, and all next year the 100 year anniversary of the beginning of Mather Air Force Base. Our history of Rancho Cordova is intertwined with the history of Mather Air Force Base and today’s Mather Air Field. When I was stationed there as an Airman assigned to the “Strategic Air Command’s 320th Bomb Wing,” the sound of planes flying overhead was the sound of freedom. It is still the sound of freedom, but it is also the sound of peace as we know it today.

Defendant Convicted for Murder in Failed Marijuana Deal

DATE: July 26, 2017
CASE: Christopher Nelson (Case #16FE013712)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kari Reeve, Homicide Unit

Christopher Nelson was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of Roy Fearon. The jury also found true a gun use allegation.

On July 12, 2016, Christopher Nelson drove across the country from Virginia to meet with Roy Fearon in Sacramento. Nelson previously made a deal to buy \$6,000 worth of marijuana from the victim, but the deal fell through and Nelson did not receive the marijuana. Once in Sacramento, the victim attempted to make things right with Nelson by searching local grow houses for available marijuana. When his efforts failed, Nelson went to the victim's hotel room to rob him. Once inside the room, Nelson fired four shots. The victim was struck twice, killing him. Four other occupants of the room jumped out of the second-story window to escape Nelson, who then fled and was ultimately arrested in Utah.

Nelson faces a maximum sentence of 40 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for August 18, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Laurel White.

Defendant Convicted for Attempted Murder in Drug Deal

DATE: July 27, 2017
CASE: Damien Tardy (Case #16FE015244)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Damien Tardy was convicted by a jury of attempted murder. The jury also found true the allegations that Tardy intentionally discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury, and that the offense was committed willfully, deliberately and with premeditation.

Shortly after midnight on August 2, 2016, the victim met Damien Tardy and another man at a South Sacramento motel to purchase heroin. When the victim determined the heroin was poor quality, he went back to the motel to get his money back. The three men then drove to the north area of Sacramento

and purchased better quality heroin. After they sat in the car for a few minutes, Tardy said he had to get something out of the trunk and exited the car. When the victim then exited the car, Tardy drew a gun and fired two shots, striking the victim in his head and neck. The victim fell to the ground and tried to crawl away from Tardy, who then fired several additional shots, striking the victim in his torso and leg. Police were called to the scene and the victim was transported to a hospital, where he received several surgeries.

Tardy faces a maximum sentence of 32 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for August 23, 2017, at 11:00 a.m. in Department 29 before the Honorable Timothy Frawley.

Defendant Sentenced for Domestic Violence Shooting

DATE: July 28, 2017
CASE: Marcos Adams (Case #15F05630)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Jesse Saucedo, Domestic Violence Unit

The Honorable Timothy Frawley sentenced Marcos Adams to 30 years and 4 months in prison. On May 31, 2017, a jury convicted Adams of attempted voluntary manslaughter, corporal injury on spouse or cohabitant, assault with a deadly weapon, and felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true multiple allegations that Adams personally used a firearm and caused great bodily injury involving domestic violence.

On August 30, 2015, Marcos Adams, a validated gang member, and the victim got into an argument outside of an apartment complex on Stockton Boulevard. The victim punched Adams once in the face. Adams responded by pulling out his firearm and shooting at the victim's head, hitting her in the elbow as she covered her face. The bullet became lodged in the victim's elbow. Adams fled the scene and was not apprehended until late 2016 when he committed another act of domestic violence against a different victim.

Two prior strikes were also found true for a 2004 robbery conviction and a 2011 felon in possession of firearm conviction with a gang enhancement. ★

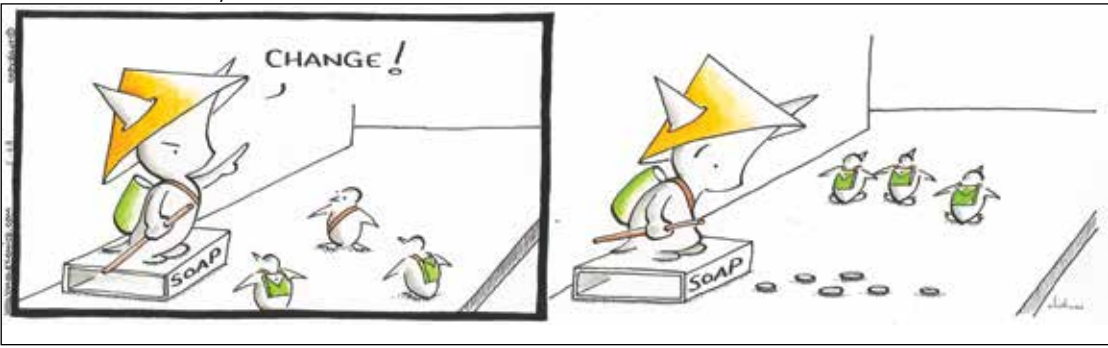

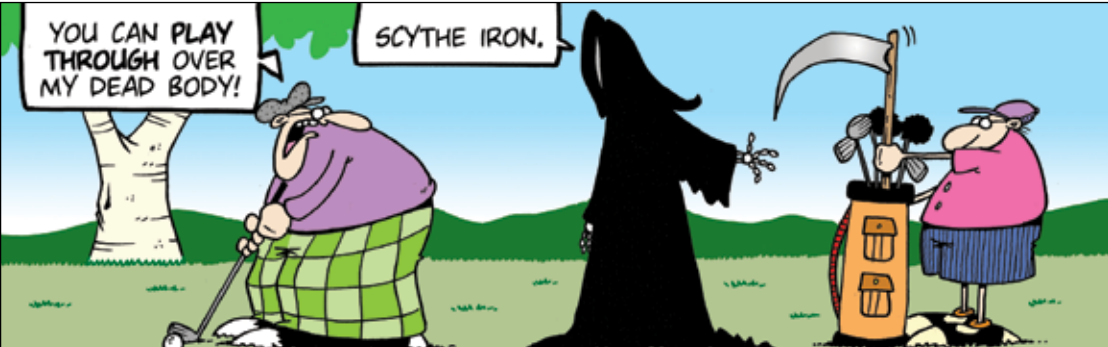

"Sometimes in June or July, we would have anywhere between six to seven kids (not) in practice," Nill said. "A lot of them were away because of vacation or summer jobs. We
