RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A surprise Mitchell Middle and Williamson Elementary School assembly at Dave Roberts Community Park on Thursday morning, August 24th, kicked off an exhilarating morning organized by the City of Rancho Cordova in partnership with the California Capital Airshow. After listening to inspiring speeches by their school principals, Airshow Operations Manager Angela Terry, City of Rancho Cordova Vice Mayor Linda Budge, Congressman Ami Bera, and Superintendent Dr. Sarah Koligian, students were still unaware of what was in store for them.

That's when California Army National Guard pilots landed a Blackhawk helicopter in the middle of the park and military teams from the California Army National Guard and California Air National Guard carried in "Top Secret" boxes, which contained backpacks filled with free exclusive "Operation #InspireTheFuture" tickets. Valued at nearly \$175,000, these tickets to the September 9-10 California Capital Airshow were distributed to 3,600 Rancho Cordova students and their parents.

The City held its first Operation #InspireTheFuture events last year to give Rancho Cordova students' the opportunity to experience the thrill of flight at the Airshow cost-free, learn about Rancho Cordova's military history, as well as the exciting STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) opportunities in the military and beyond.

After the surprise assembly at Dave Roberts Community Park, 13 more Rancho Cordova elementary, middle, and high schools received special visits from Rancho Cordova City Council members, military squadrons from the California Air National Guard and California Army National Guard Air Force, and Airshow representatives. The military teams encouraged students to dream big and work hard in school, while sharing insights about their own jobs and passions.

Five additional Operation #InspireTheFuture deliveries are planned, giving students at each of the 20 elementary, middle and high schools in Rancho Cordova the opportunity to experience the Airshow. Each school will determine how best to distribute tickets to their students, such as awarding them to students for living school values and academic performance.

"The City of Rancho Cordova is committed to giving our young people opportunities to engage in fun and educational activities that inspire them to accomplish great things and make a difference in our community and beyond," said Rancho Cordova Vice *Continued on page 3* "It is a privilege to work alongside Adam, and we are very happy to see him recognized for his continued excellence serving as Rancho Cordova's City Attorney," said Mayor Donald Terry.

Regional Parks Safety Tips for Labor Day Weekend

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - As Sacramentans get ready for the final holiday weekend of summer, Sacramento County's Department of Regional Parks is reminding visitors to have fun and be safe. People of all ages should be aware of the rules and regulations at County parks. These rules promote safety and help preserve the parks.

Be Safe in the Water:

- Life Looks Good On You and so does a life vest! Before you dive in, put on a life vest. There are borrowing stations along Sacramento's waterways and at local fire stations. Remember, even the strongest swimmer can be pulled under by the strong river currents.
- Kids Don't Float-but life vests do. Make sure your child wears a life vest. Sacramento County ordinance requires any child under 13 to wear a life vest before accessing any public waters (Sacramento County Ordinance 13.08.301). Bring a life vest for each of your children to the river.
- Rivers are running especially

fast and cold this weekend. Sacramento County recommends that people of all ages and abilities use caution when swimming or boating. Visit the Sacramento County's Department of Regional Parks website about water safety tips.

Alcohol Prohibited for the Holiday Weekend:

- Beginning Saturday, Sept. 2 through Monday, Sept. 4, possession of alcohol is prohibited on the shore and river of the American River within Sacramento County Regional Parks' jurisdiction. The prohibition includes open or closed alcoholic beverages.
- County Rangers will also continue to enforce the year-round alcohol restrictions from Paradise Beach to Discovery Park.

Prevent Wildfires:

- All fireworks are prohibited in Regional Parks.
- Smoking is only allowed in developed picnic areas, asphalt surfaces, golf courses and on levee tops in the American River Parkway.

• Open flame fires are not allowed, and barbequing is only permitted in designated picnic areas.

Parking Fee Increase:

The number of visits to Regional Parks increases dramatically during holiday weekends, which increases the cost to staff and maintain the parks. In order to offset these costs and provide maximum staffing and enforcement, the vehicle entrance fee will increase to \$8 for single vehicles and \$13 for oversized vehicles and vehicles towing watercraft.

These increases will not affect annual pass holders. Visitors who regularly enjoy County Parks are encouraged to purchase an Annual Parks Pass, not only to save money but to help keep our parks safe and clean.

Martin Barre Band Headlines Harlow's

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, (MPG) - You'd have to be living under a rock not to notice the resurging interest in classic rock and roll, live performances specifically, and riding that wave is former Jethro Tull guitarist Martin Barre, who's new band is currently enjoying its first West Coast tour with a September 8 gig set for Harlow's Nightclub downtown.

"I get the best of both worlds," says Barre, 71, explaining how he and former Tull lead man, Ian Anderson who founded the band in 1967, have an understanding that the music of Tull, which officially disbanded in 2011, belongs to them equally. As such, fans new and old of Tull's original music can fully expect the Martin Barre band to come through, pulling heavily from Tull's more than two dozen albums and compilations, delivering familiar and new versions of the songs that shaped the British rock band's 45-year run, including, Crossed *Eyed Mary, Thick as a Brick, Skating Away* and the 1971 release that essentially put the band on the map in the United States, Aqualung.

"Ian and I have an understanding that, although Jethro Tull are finished, we both have full access to our music," said Barre. "My new band is going to be pulling from an amazing repertoire of the Tull classics, adding in my own band's bluesy rifts and interpretations, but positively we are going to be making our fans happy. I talk to our fans and I know what they want and it's important to me."

Harlow's gig marks the third stop on the band's 2017-18 tour, which culminates in Germany next second album in 1961, Stand Up.

The Martin Barre Band's approach will please fans who remember the earthy, bluesy sounds of early Tull, as well as their popular folky and progressive rock sounds. But don't be surprised if the performance takes you right out of the Tull bubble for a minute and into alternative territory with Barre's own version of a couple of tunes from fellow British rock favs.

"We'll be doing a very cool version of two Beatle's songs Eleanor Rigby and I Want You (She's So Heavy)," said Barre. "Why, because they are fun."

When you spend more than four decades with a band, explains Barre, it becomes like a marriage: evolving with time and changing points of view. But what has remained constant is the founding members' original purpose: to produce great music and entertain the fans. The fact that Barre and Anderson are not fighting over performing and recording rights to the original music, ensures it will continue to be available.

"My entire purpose is to produce great music," says Barre. "This is what I live for every day and to say that we are lucky to have been able to do that for 45 years, is amazing. Now, here I am at 71 enjoying both the ability to keep playing all of the fantastic music we (Jethro Tull) produced, while enjoying a new chapter, where I get to make new music of my own and bring new ideas and sounds and creative attention into the present. It just doesn't get any better than that, and neither I or Ian want to see that stop." Barre said he spent several years working on his new sound before audiences across his home country of Great Britain and abroad, including a string of shows on the East Coast over the last couple of years. This tour, he says, marks the Martin Barre Band's first opportunity to continue the build out of the new band's sound and Barre says he thinks West coasters are "really going to be impressed." "I spent 45 years building up the Tull brand and it is a solid brand," said Barre. "Then, with my new band, I spent a good deal of time working on building out my own brand. Now, I'm ready to start doing the same thing out on the West Coast. We are all just so excited to be here and to be doing what we love."

At this point in my story, Jack, my sweet eight-year-old love, said, "Was she a republican?"



Single-Payer: Coming Soon to a Theater Near You?

Hollywood loves a sequel. This summer, studios are releasing a fifth Pirates of the Caribbean, a third edition of the Despicable Me franchise, and another Spiderman.

But warmed-over ideas are not the sole province of the film industry. Progressive lawmakers are launching a reboot of their own -- Single-Payer Health Care: A Future We Can Believe In.

The trailer promises a futuristic, universal healthcare system without premiums, deductibles, or copays. But this feature is sure to flop. Single-payer's previous runs have been horror shows, with billions of dollars in cost over-runs and patients waiting helplessly for necessary care.

Lawmakers across the country are vying to be the first to establish a single-payer system.

The California state Senate passed a bill that would abolish private health coverage and enroll all residents in a single-payer system. The state Assembly shelved the measure for now -- but may consider it next year. Washington state senator Maralyn Chase is drafting a similar proposal.

In May, New York's state Assembly approved a bill that would establish a single-payer system in the Empire State. And in June, Nevada Gov. Brian Sandoval vetoed legislation that would have allowed any state resident to sign up for the state's Medicaid program.

At the national level, a singlepayer plan introduced by U.S. Rep. John Conyers, D-Mich., has over 100 co-sponsors.

These bills would destroy the healthcare system and the economy.

Consider the California bill. The state Senate's Appropriations Committee found that the measure would cost \$400 billion annually. That's more than three times the state's annual budget.

The state would fund its plan by raiding taxpayers' wallets. The Appropriations Committee calculated that it would take a new 15 percent payroll tax to come up with half that tab.

In New York, single-payer could cost \$226 billion in 2019 and destroy 175,000 local jobs, as companies flee to other states.

Those crippling taxes are among the reasons that even liberal voters have panned previous attempts to impose single-payer. Colorado voters rejected a single-payer proposal last November by an 80-20 margin. The plan would have subjected residents to an additional 10 percent payroll tax. Even Democratic Governor John Hickenlooper didn't back it.

Vermont's dalliance with single-payer was also short-lived. In 2011, the state legislature approved a single-payer plan. It would have cost \$4.3 billion annually -- requiring an 11.5 percent payroll tax and an additional 9 percent individual income tax. Former Governor Peter Shumlin scrapped the plan, deeming it too expensive.

Single-payer systems also deliver atrocious care. In Canada's single-payer system, the median patient waited 20 weeks in 2016 between referral from a general practitioner and receipt of treatment from a specialist. A 2014 study of 11 industrialized countries ranked Canada dead last in timeliness of care.





CORDOVA SPORTS Raiders Rally to Beat Lancers in Opener

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A two-point lead was something that the Cordova High School football team was looking to expand in the fourth quarter against Rio Americano in the season opener.

But the Raiders were the ones who came away with a 42-35 win over the Lancers at Del Campo High on Aug. 25th. The loss was tough for Cordova, which had a combined 488 total offensive yards against the Raiders' defense.

Entering the final quarter, Cordova (0-1) led 27-25. But two interceptions by the Raiders' defense led the way toward touchdowns. On top of that, two kickoffs were returned for touchdowns.

"What caused us the game was our lack of effort on the kickoffs," said Cordova head coach Darren Nill. "Those are just back-breakers."

That helped the Raiders score 17 points in the final eight minutes of the game to secure the victory. An 8-yard pass, plus the extra-point kick, gave Rio Americano a 32-27 lead. A rushing touchdown and two field goals cushioned the Raiders' lead to 45-27.

The Lancers cut the lead toward the end of the quarter when quarterback Johnele Sanders threw a 75-yard pass.

Cordova opted and converted on the 2-point conversion, but that was all of the Lancers' scoring in the game.

In the first quarter, both teams

scored a touchdown each, but failed on the extra-points, for a 6-6 score. Then in the second quarter, Sanders completed a 25-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Calvin

Augusta. Add the extra-point, and the Lancers had their first lead of the season at 13-6.

After the Raiders scored re to cut the lead to 13-12, the to

Lancers added a 5-yard touchdown run to increase their lead to 20-12. But Rio Americano returned the kickoff 100-yards to trim into the Lancers' lead to 20-19, all in the second quarter.

"We're making some personnel changes on our kickoff," said Nill of the kickoff team that allowed the touchdown. "Trying to get some more hungry kids out there, some more physical kids, to stop that type of thing."

Sanders hit Augusta again, this time on a 73-yard pass, midway through the third quarter to increase Cordova's lead to 27-19.

The Lancers had four fumbles in the game, all in the first half. But lost the ball only once to the Raiders.

"I thought that Rio Americano came out and outplayed our guys in the first half," Nill said.

Sanders completed 7-of-9 passes for 185 yards and a touchdown in the game. He also rushed 11 times for 102 yards and another touchdown. Raymond Fite had three receptions for 99 yards.

On defense, Augusta, from his defensive back spot, had 12 tackles and outside linebacker Yusef Pugh had nine.

Tonight, Friday, Cordova will play its first home game of the season at Lancers Stadium against Chavez. The Stockton school fell to Mountain House, 33-12, in the season opener on the Mustangs' field last Friday. Game time for today's game is 7:30 p.m. ★

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)-A group of returning players gives the Cordova High School football team momentum this season.

Tonight, Friday, the Lancers will host Chavez of Stockton at Lancers Stadium at 7:30 p.m.

Prior to the season opener against Rio Americano last Friday – see elsewhere in this section on the game – Cordova football head coach Darrin Nill talked about the squad after his Lancers On Aug. 18th, Cordova scrimmaged at Capital Christian.

"You had some positive surprises, and some negative surprises," Nill said.

One of the positives was the Lancers' consistency on moving the ball on offense. "We moved the ball well on them," Nill said. On the other side of the ball, the Cougars were more physical than the Lancers.

"I think that surprised our guys," said Nill of the Cougars. Spearheading returning players are senior quarterback Tyreke Tate (6-foot, 187 pounds), who led the Lancers' defense at free safety that led to a share of the SVC title with Liberty Ranch and El Dorado last fall.

Joining Tate, who will continue to play the free safety spot, is wide receiver Calvin Augusta, second in the SVC in receiving last year and like Tate was all-SVC player. Augusta also play defensive back. Junior Alvin Banks is back at wide receiver and defensive back, another all-SVC player.

"That kid can just flat out play football," said Nill of Banks. "He's a fantastic athlete; he can throw the ball, he can catch the ball. I think if he could throw the ball and catch it himself, he probably would."

Looking to carry the ball on the ground is senior running back Clifford Bright, who will be one of the Lancers' defensive ends and a three-year starter. Joining Bright in the backfield will be junior Raymond Fite, who started as a sophomore last season. Fite is also listed as a defensive back, a spot he made all-SVC.

On the offensive and defensive line for the Lancers are seniors, starting with center/defensive tackle Austin McCoy (6-foot, 260) and offensive/defensive tackle Michael Castillo (6'1, 245), left guard/defensive tackle Joseph Salcedo (5'9, 270), another three-year starter and right guard/defensive end Josh Colvin (6'3, 200). ★ Falcons started strong against the Gladiators with five shots on goal in the first 20 minutes of play. Though none of the shots found the net, the team's confidence was building. The match remained a scoreless tie well into the second half as both teams battled for chances to score.




Falcon sophomore Austyn Ciampa scored the game's only goal with a successful PK in the 65th minute.
