Hawks, Honkers and Hoots!

Bird Ambassadors Coming to Rancho Cordova Library

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -Hawks, Honkers & Hoots will present their program at the Rancho Cordova Library at 4 p.m., Thursday, August 24. They have been an official group for five years. "All of our birds have an injury that make them non-releasable to the wild," said Kelli Moulden, one of the volunteers for the group. The birds that are being cared for and given a home by the organization would have had to be euthanized if this

option was not available to them. The mission of HH&H is to inspire respect for local and migratory birds through customized and entertaining educational programs. The first took place in an elementary school in 2011, and the group also puts on programs for libraries, retirement homes, festivals, and last month presented at the Pacific Flyway Decoy Association. "We're known to have a lot of fun with our educational programs," Moulden said. "We feel like if you are laughing, you are learning, and

you're probably going to remember it." None of the staff are paid, all are volunteers. "Everybody does it because we love the birds," Moulden said. Of the five staff, four previously volunteered for a rescue organization and two actually rescued raptors for them. Their birds currently include Ms. Murphy, a red tailed hawk; Mr. Bolt, a peregrine falcon; Ms. Digger, a burrowing owl; Mr. Trek, a Swainson's hawk; Mr. Whoo-Dini, northern pygmy owl; and Ms. Whisper, barn owl. As well,

they have Mr. Chuckie, Mr. Frankie, and Mr. Duncan, domestic ducks. Depending on how the birds are doing on a particular day, Moulden and her associates will typically bring four of the birds to a presentation. "The public has just been very, very supportive of our organization," Moulden said. "We're really so blessed for that." the buildings your kids will learn in are environmentally safe and structurally sound. These thoughts will land you at the core of what Condor Earth's business services include, which are simultaneously varied and technically detailed, to the

CHP to Hold Start Smart Driver Class

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The leading cause of death for Americans 15-20 years old is motor vehicle collisions. In an effort inform and to reduce motor vehicle collisions in California, California Highway Patrol (CHP) North Sacramento area will offer a free Start Smart class. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), mile for mile, teenagers are involved in three times as many fatal crashes as all other drivers.

The classes are used to promote traffic safety to both parents and teens. We encourage both parent/caregivers and teens to attend the class. The CHP's Start Smart program is a driver safety education class which targets new and future licensed teenage drivers between the age of 15 -19 and their parents/guardians. The Start Smart class will cover collision avoidance techniques, driver responsibility, collision trends, distracted driving laws, alcohol related driving laws and the provisional license process. The program also offers an opportunity for new drivers and parents/guardians to ask CHP Officers clarifying questions. North Sacramento CHP will be offering this free class on Tuesday, August 22nd, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. The class will be held at the Sacramento Water and Sewer Treatment Plant at 5026 Don Julio Blvd, in the conference room. This building is located on the northeast corner of Elkhorn Blvd. and Don Julio Blvd. Persons interested in signing up for the class will need to register for the class by emailing Officer Chad Hertzell at chertzell@chp.ca.gov. At least one parent/guardian attend the class with their teen driver. *Source: CHP* ★

Leading the Leaders: DOVIA Sacramento Supports Non-Profit Volunteer Managers

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

With few exceptions, among the most important individuals behind any successful nonprofit organization, including its return on investment, are its volunteers. But how do you find them, keep them motivated and give them the tools to they need to effectively make an impact?

Enter DOVIA, or Directors of Volunteers in Agencies, which has chapters across the country, including Sacramento. The Sacramento Chapter is currently celebrating 40 years of service, providing some 100 volunteer managers from a vast range of non-profit agencies, most of whom are members, with the support they need to successfully build and serve their core of volunteers.

DOVIA workshops and trainings offer ideas for learning how to motivate volunteers, as well as avenues for members to connect with other volunteer leadership professionals and collaborate and exchange ideas.

Rachele Doty, is the volunteer coordinator for First Call Hospice in Citrus Heights. She also serves on the board of directors as vice chair for DOVIA, Sacramento. She views the organization as an indispensable resource, where, through workshops, trainings, networking and annual conferences, she can access an evolving and valuable exchange of information on relevant issues facing professional volunteer managers, no matter the size or scope of their agency's mission.

"I have just on-boarded 20 new volunteers at First Call Hospice, so I have been utilizing every tool and workshop or training I have under my

belt through my membership with and my role on the board of DOVIA," said Doty. "The agency is absolutely critical for anyone who is working with volunteers. You get the support you need to promote your own growth but also the growth and development of your volunteers, whether you're part of an executive team or some other administrative department."

Dues for membership to DOVIA are \$55 for one year for those who are signing up as an employee of a non-profit agency, and that fee allows for the bundling of two employees from the same agency. For individual memberships, the annual fee is \$30.00, all nominal fees for access to support for trainings that often non-profits themselves

simply don't have the resources to provide, despite their dependence on volunteers.

Lynne Moore is a member support specialist with the Girl Scouts Heart of Central California Council, one of 112 councils in the nation. She and several colleagues from her agency recently attended a DOVIA workshop at Bayside Church in midtown, Sacramento focused on delivering effective presentations to volunteers. For her, the workshops and DOVIA membership provide unsurpassed support and education needed to oversee the some 300 volunteers that support her council.

"I get so much from my membership," said Moore. "I have a lot of moving parts in my job and a lot of changing faces, so

it's critical that I keep up with new trends in recruitment and retention of volunteers. We depend so much on our volunteers and they deserve the best leadership available to them."

The biggest challenge many non-profit organizations face with respect to volunteers, says Doty, is finding them.

"That's an ongoing battle for everyone in the capacity of recruitment," Doty said. "One of the things we focus on with our workshops and trainings is how to utilize all of the available tools out there to reach potential, new volunteers. That includes social media apps, creating events to attract volunteers and how to effectively get the message out to volunteers in the community about your organization and its mission."

Meredith Holkeboer is the Volunteer Services Assistant/Pet Therapy Coordinator at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Sacramento. To say she's landed her dream job would be an understatement. She also finds her membership with DOVIA as invaluable. It has provided her with the tools to network with other volunteer coordinators and share ideas for how to keep volunteers engaged and impassioned about their work.

"The unpaid volunteers that support us are critical to our mission, so I am always on the search for new tips and ideas for how to work more effectively with our volunteers at Shriners," Holkeboer said. "I get a lot out of my membership. I learn new things every time I attend a workshop or a conference and I am reminded that I'm a part of a unique group of leaders out there who are overseeing people who make a choice whether to keep showing up and helping out."

DOVIA will cap its 40th year with participation at the upcoming annual conference

on Tuesday, Oct. 24 at Shriners Hospital. The ALIVE Hybrid Conference: Take the Leap | Embrace Change, will feature presentations for DOVIA members by four internationally renowned volunteer leaders with workshops centered on navigating organizational and

Library Serving Over 100 Veterans Each Month

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Veterans Resource Station is one of the first things people see as they enter the Rancho Cordova Library. Books, DVDs, and pamphlets about veteran resources surround the station, and a computer is reserved for veterans to use for job applications, research, and checking emails. What is most impactful about the Veterans Resource Station, however, is the people who sit at the table five days a week.

About 20 volunteers, the majority of whom are veterans themselves or have had family members in the military, each dedicate several hours a week to help connect local veterans to their benefits and resources available to them, and their impact is growing.

"Now we've served over 100 people each month for the past three months. That's a new high for us," said Evelyn Figeroid, Library Assistant and Coordinator for Veterans Connect at the Rancho Cordova Library.

Figeroid credited the intentional front and center placement of the station near the entrance of the library, as well as their proactive outreach and recent pop-up stations for the increase in the station's reach.

The volunteers are trained by the California Department of Veterans Affairs and simply want to help those who have served. They do not always know who or how they will be helping on any given day, and on some days, no one stops by the station. But on other days, the staff and volunteers who run the Veterans Resource Station, have a big impact on peoples' lives.

Making resources more accessible, connecting veterans to support groups or personal contacts, or simply being a good listener can make all the difference for some veterans who visit the Veterans Resource Station. They've dealt with everything from elder abuse cases, homelessness, medical needs, financial challenges, and more.

It isn't unusual for it to take some time and perhaps a few visits to the station before some veterans are ready and willing to accept benefits available to them. Nor is it unusual for some veterans to open up and share stories from decades ago for the first time to volunteers at the Rancho Cordova Library. But, what some veterans experience at the Veterans Resource Station becomes a story in itself.

"Stuff happens here in the middle of the library. It's kinda cool," said Figeroid.

Volunteers staff the Veterans Resource Station at the Rancho Cordova Library at various times from Tuesday-Saturday year-round. On Saturday, August 19th at 2 p.m., movie creator George Retelas will present a free film screening of his movie Eleven, a moving and fascinating film celebrating the honor and bravery of World War II veterans. the company's first foray into the Sacramento region. Its new 3,344-square foot facility is now home to five full-time employees and will serve primarily as the company's site for most of its industrial and environmental compliance operations.

Condor's headquarters remains in Sonora. Job and other employees work out of both the Sonora office and the new location in Rancho Cordova, which, explains Job, was chosen to both put the company in closer proximity to the offices of state regulatory agencies, with which it must work and meet with regularly, and closer to a wide pool of talented potential workers. The company also has an office in Stockton.

"Our move was strategic," says Job. "We were formally operating this division out of Roseville, but since we must meet with and interact with clients closer to the Sacramento area, it made sense. In addition, there is a huge talent pool in the area that is extremely solid."

Condor Earth is 70 percent owned by its employees through an ESOP (Employee Stock Ownership Plan), with the remaining 30 percent of the stock owned by senior staff. The ESOP, established in 2004, serves to give employees roles valued roles as company and project stakeholders, not just service providers.

"We are very proud to be an employee-owned company, empowering our employees to think like owners, advocating for the clients' best interest and benefiting from a job well done," said Job.

The company has a long and distinguished client roster that includes Adventist Health Sonora, Mercy Medical Center, Merced, the Manteca and Stockton unified school districts, the California State and Regional Water Quality Control Boards, the Department of Toxic Substances Control, the state departments of Health Services and Fish and Game, as well as

the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security.

Currently, Condor is working with the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) on construction of a 6,000-foot water system tunnel. The \$16 million project is roughly half way done, scheduled for completion in early 2018, according to Job.

"We are working to significantly improve the reliability of the main canal system for the OID," Job said.

Condor's roots trace back some three decades. Its original founders came west as employees of Gulf and Western Corp. to develop and manage structural engineering plans for the Jamestown gold mining operation. Gulf and Western morphed into Paramount Pictures, then Viacom. The founders eventually formed their own company, which would become Condor Earth, incorporated in 1983 as Condor Minerals Management, focused on providing geologic and permitting services to the mining industry across California and Nevada.

With a mining support services playing such a key role in the company's history, it isn't too difficult to see how Condor has emerged as a leader in the geotechnical/geological evaluation and engineering design of small-to-mid-sized tunnel projects, including water system tunnels.

In fact, says Job, the company's long-term focus is on storm water systems, whether designing new water tunnel systems or providing engineering expertise

for shoring up older systems, for which there is a growing market. "I would say our long-range, strategic focus is in water resources management and infrastructure feasibility investigations," said Job. "So, our move into the region (Rancho Cordova, specifically) was to be closer to clients, closer to the agencies we must work very closely with, with respect to our work in water systems analysis and design."

Condor's history of tunnel design expertise includes another, slightly more whimsical component. The company has provided engineering design services for more than 200 wine cave projects for several California wineries. Storing wine below ground makes sense from both an economic and marketing standpoint, says Job.

"Your ROI (return on investment) with a wine cave (barrel storage system) versus a surface warehouse alone is a good reason to store below ground," says Job. He says high humidity in wine caves is estimated at between 70 and 90 percent, which is good for the wine. In addition, gross volume losses through evaporation each year are significantly lower for underground wine barrel storage vs. above ground, and, since the temperature inside a wine cave hovers between the ideal range of between 58 and 62 degrees, the wine is very happy down in a nice, cool cave.

"We don't build wine caves, but we design them," says Job. "And we have a long list of reasons for why you would want to build one."

Whether its water or wine, Condor is on a trajectory for growth, which will likely lead to an expansion of the employee roster in the Rancho Cordova location over the coming year.

"I'm getting ready to work on our five-year strategic plan," said Job. "The emphasis is on water, waste water storage and run-off projects, and the growing demand for our services in this area is supporting about a 10 percent growth margin." ★

New CDPH Reporting Tools will Benefit Cancer Patients and Research

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Current and future cancer patients, and researchers working to prevent cancer, are expected to benefit from new reporting requirements to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). In order to assist health systems, laboratories and pathologists meet new electronic-reporting requirements, CDPH has released the California Cancer Registry (CCR) Electronic Pathology Reporting Standards

Implementation Guide. "CDPH is pleased to partner with providers and clinicians to advance the fight against cancer," said CDPH Director and State Public Health Officer Dr. Karen Smith. "Electronic reporting will help speed up data collection and, most importantly, match cancer patients to cutting-edge, potentially life-saving new treatments."

The implementation guide defines the reporting requirements and provides standardized

formats for electronic pathology reporting of cancer diagnosis.

Electronic cancer reporting is required as of January 1, 2019, under Assembly Bill (AB) 2325, which was signed into law in September 2016 by Governor Jerry Brown.

The CCR website has more information about AB 2325, the cancer-reporting requirements and the Electronic Pathology Reporting Standards Implementation Guide. ★

Working to Keep Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Funding for Mather Community Campus

The Mather Community Campus will continue operating the transitional program that has been very successful since 1994. The program has assisted both homeless individuals and homeless families get back on their feet and back into society. Many homeless citizens learn that they, like many others, can become productive citizens again. When the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) said they were going to cut over \$2 million from the transitional program, I was very frustrated because it was HUD that began the program, and it was HUD that gave national recognition to the Mather Community Campus program twice.

I am working with Supervisor Don Nottoli and his staff, as well as other council members and our staff, to keep the program going. The program that HUD is pushing now simply gets someone in a home or an apartment and off of the street. I don't think that the people who need help will get it just by getting off the street without receiving the medical and sometimes mental help that they need.

I will continue to work with Supervisor Nottoli to make sure that the over 300 people who are receiving help at the Mather Community Campus can continue to believe in the program and know that our City can also be depended upon. I will keep you informed as I gather more information.

The Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito & Vector Control District is continuing to fight the mosquito and other insects, while at the same time providing some very interesting information about how to fight mosquitoes and protect yourself. At the board meeting on August 15, they talked about how yellowjackets take over abandoned squirrel holes in the ground and other empty animal holes. The yellowjackets take advantage of such things and move in very quickly, we were told. There has been an increase in large nests in areas like the Borden Road area of Herald. That increase was very well covered by the different media outlets on July 24th, but we were given more information at the meeting to pass on.

On occasion I have seen yellowjacket nests around my house, but I didn't realize that they also use holes in the ground

to make nests. In one area of Herald, there were 90 big nests on five acres. I am glad that there are treatments being done by the Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito & Vector Control District to help take care of yellowjacket problems in the district. If you visit their website, you can find very helpful information from the district.

For those who were able to go to the Mather Memorial Day Celebration this year, we hope you enjoyed our "new" location. I just wanted to let you know that on Veterans Day, November 11, 2017, we will be honoring veterans in the new location like we did on Memorial Day. With the expansion of Mather Hospital going on for a couple of years, we will not be able to use that area right on the Veterans Memorial Plaza with the 16 foot statue itself. We will be in the parking lot next to the plaza to celebrate and honor our Veterans, and we will have the tents necessary to protect you, the band, and the speakers. We hope to see you there on Veterans Day.

One reason that inactivity leads to fatigue has to do with the way we store adrenalin. If it isn't used, adrenaline saps energy and decreases the efficiency of the heart. Strength training builds muscle tissue which sculpts, shapes, and defines your physique. Muscles also use up calories at a faster rate than body fat, so you're always burning more calories.

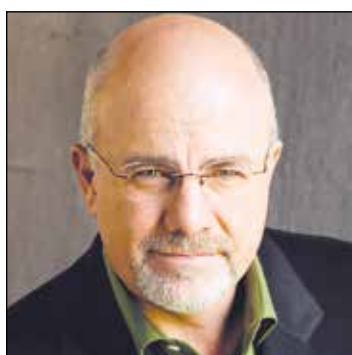
while I've held it hostage.

A bad move

Dear Dave,

I have a whole life insurance policy with zero cash value due to loans I took out per the advice of my agent. I finally realized this wasn't a smart move, as I now owe premiums plus interest every year. Am I still on the hook for the policy loans if I forfeit the policy to buy term insurance?

—Tanner

Dear Tanner,

No, you are not. Get your term insurance in place first, then when you cancel the policy your

cash value will offset your loans.

They won't loan you more than your cash value. It's seldom that they will loan you 100 percent of cash value, so you might actually have a cash value that is above your loan amount. If they have loaned you the full amount of your cash value, it'll be an exact break even, and just canceling the policy means you cancel the interest and cancel the premiums.

It was bad advice to buy the policy, and even dumber advice to clean the whole thing out and sit there paying interest to borrow your own money and pay a premium to keep the loan open.

I recommend 10 to 12 times your income on a 15- or 20-year level term policy. During that 15 or 20 years, of course, you should be getting out of debt and building wealth so that you have a big pile of money and no need for life insurance.

Defendant Sentenced for Bank Robbery, Carjacking

DATE: August 1, 2017
CASE: Carlos Aguirre (Case #10F04114)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Dinah Mielke, Felony Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Raoul Thorbourne sentenced Carlos Aguirre to 30 years and 4 months in state prison. On February 27, 2017, a jury convicted Aguirre of carjacking and six counts of robbery. The jury also found true the allegation that Aguirre personally used a firearm on all seven counts.

On January 22, 2010, Carlos Aguirre was armed with a gun and wearing a ski mask when he followed an assistant bank manager into her work at the Bank of America on Folsom Boulevard. Aguirre grabbed her from behind with his arm around her neck, and put the gun to her head. He ordered her and other individuals in the bank to the ground. He then ordered two tellers to give him money, which amounted to between \$30,000 and \$50,000. Customers in the bank testified that they were afraid they were going to die that day. Aguirre demanded car keys from the assistant bank manager while displaying his gun. She complied and Aguirre took his backpack with the money and ran out to her car, where he lost his ski mask. The District Attorney's Crime Lab obtained a DNA sample from the mask and uploaded it to the DNA database, resulting in a match to Aguirre. Cell phone records put Aguirre's phone in the area of the bank 11 minutes before the robbery took place, and at approximately the same time the day before.

Aguirre's prior 1997 strike conviction for assault with a firearm and the allegation that he used the firearm during the commission of a felony or attempted felony was also found true.

Defendant Convicted for Apartment Complex Shooting

DATE: August 2, 2017
CASE: Bryant Fields (Case #16FE007858)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kristen Andersen, Targeting Armed Recidivist Gang Enforcement Team (TARGET)

Bryant Fields was convicted by a jury of attempted murder, two counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm, two counts of shooting into an occupied vehicle and felon in possession of a gun. The jury also found true multiple allegations that Fields personally used a gun and that he intentionally discharged a firearm.

On April 18, 2016, officers responded to a shot spotter notification at an apartment complex, where they found 10 spent casings. Video of the shooting and witness interviews revealed that Bryant Fields got into a short verbal altercation with the victim. When the victim got into his car to leave, Fields followed him out of the complex on foot and shot at the victim's car 10 times. One round hit another vehicle as it passed by the scene. On April 23, 2016, officers located Fields at a residence along with items that connected him to the crime, including the gun used in the shooting.

An allegation that Fields suffered a 2009 prior strike conviction for assault with a firearm will be decided at sentencing.

Fields faces a maximum sentence of 48 years and 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for September 8, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Bowman. ★

Busting the Myth That Proposition 13 Eviscerated Sacramento's Tax Revenue

The year 1978 might seem almost like ancient history – a distant memory for most voters, and unimaginable for a growing class of policymakers who were not yet born then. With the passage of time, folklore prevails and myths sometimes come to overshadow facts. It is in this light that opponents of Proposition 13 have made many false claims about the landmark property tax reform initiative.

One of the often-cited claims by opponents of the 1978 ballot measure is that "Proposition 13 eviscerated local revenue." Nothing could be further from the facts. Data shows that since 1978, local property tax assessments in California have increased by 856.48 percent.

This year alone, local property tax assessments are expected to increase an average of 5.5 percent statewide, amounting to billions of dollars in additional funding for local schools, libraries, fire and police departments, parks and recreation programs,

public health programs, streets and transit.

Sacramento County alone has seen 6.4 percent growth in the total assessed value of properties subject to local property tax. Neighboring counties also have grown substantially – El Dorado County's assessment roll grew 4.68 percent, and Placer County's grew 5.7 percent.

While Proposition 13 limits property taxes to 1 percent of a property's assessed value, and caps how fast taxes can increase each year, the aggregate revenue growth has been substantial.

Proposition 13 protects property owners by capping the growth of a property's assessed value to 2 percent per year, absent a change in ownership or new construction. The point that many critics of Proposition 13 fail to account for is that aggregate figures are much higher than 2 percent. Only in the depths of the state's worst recessions (1994-1996 and 2009-2012) have Proposition 13 property taxes failed to grow more than 2 percent per year.

In fact, the growth of property tax assessments has far outpaced inflation and changes in California's population. Since passage of Proposition 13, assessments have grown at an average rate of about 7.07 percent per year. In contrast, inflation has grown at an average annual rate of 3.57 percent, and population has grown at an average rate of 1.43 percent.

The post-Proposition 13 growth is similar to the growth

prior to the initiative's passage. From 1945-46 to 1977-78, property assessments grew at an average rate of 7.93 percent.

What most people remember from the pre-Proposition 13 period is the public outrage, as property tax assessments were skyrocketing as much as 15 percent from one year to the next, based on such things as the sale price of your neighbor's house.

Instead of setting your property tax based on factors out of your control, Proposition 13 bases the property tax on acquisition value – usually the purchase price, an objective standard that generally is not disputed – plus 2 percent per year. The cap ensures that even as the aggregate property tax assessments grow, individual taxpayers are protected.

Discussions about Proposition 13 should not be framed by myths and misleading statements. To evaluate Proposition 13, tangible data from state and local sources must be used to inform the debate.

Love Proposition 13 or hate it, the data shows that it has provided a stable and growing source of revenue for local government that has far exceeded inflation.

"We are returning five all-league varsity football players," Nill said.

Last year's team, in the SVC, averaged 36.8 points per game on offense and gave up only 9.4 per game. Nill said he and his coaching staff are expecting

similar numbers, if not greater on offense and lower on defense, this season. Nill backed it up by pointing out the returning players on both sides of the ball, plus an improved kicking game.

"We're going to be exciting to watch," Nill said. "Our defensive line is coming back with another year of experience. Our defensive backfield is a no-fly zone."

Today, Friday, Cordova scrimmages at Capital Christian. The varsity contest is scheduled to start at 7 p.m., and frosh-soph at 5 p.m.

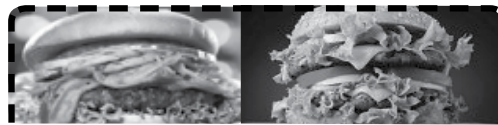

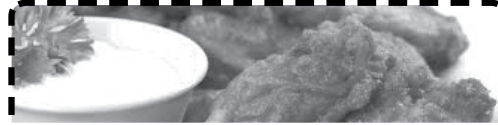

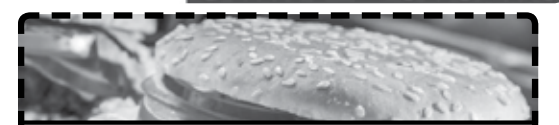
