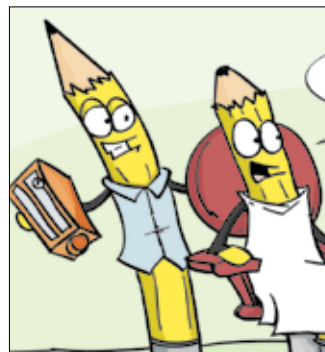

Los Rios Board Appoints Three to Top Leadership Posts

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Los Rios Board of Trustees has unanimously approved the appointment of three key leadership positions for the Los Rios Community College District. Whitney Yamamura, 53, was appointed President of Folsom Lake College. Michael Gutierrez, 48, has been named President of Sacramento City College. Dr. Jamey Nye, 43, will serve as the District's Vice Chancellor of Education and Technology.

"It's not often that a Board gets to bring three leaders as talented and dynamic as Whitney, Michael and Jamey into our organization at the same time," said Ruth Scribner, President of the Los Rios Board of Trustees. "While each brings a unique background and diverse set of skills, they all share a passion for higher education and a commitment to doing the hard work

necessary to improve the lives of the students we serve."

Whitney Yamamura has served in the Los Rios District for almost 30 years and, with his appointment, becomes the second Asian American College President in the history of the Los Rios District. Having most recently served as Interim President of Sacramento City College, Whitney has also worked as Vice President of Instruction at Cosumnes River College, the founding Dean of American River College's Natomas Center as well as American River College's Dean of Behavioral and Social Sciences. Whitney began his tenure as a member of the American River College faculty, as an adjunct and full-time Professor of Economics.

"It is an honor to have been selected

to serve as the President of Folsom Lake College," said Yamamura. "I am excited to join the talented and hard-working team of faculty and staff as we continue to grow our college and look for new and creative ways to serve students."

Michael Gutierrez will be the first Latino president in the 100-year history of Sacramento City College. He comes to Sacramento City College from Texas, where he has most recently served as Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Student Success at Eastfield College in the Dallas Community College District. In his 21 years in higher education, the Princeton University graduate has served in a wide array of different areas, including faculty, college administration, research, workforce/economic competitiveness

and resource development.

"It is humbling to have the opportunity to serve an academic institution with the storied history and reputation of Sacramento City College," said Gutierrez. "For a hundred years, Sacramento City College has been a cornerstone of the Sacramento community. As we look ahead, we'll continue to celebrate the rich fabric of our college and work tirelessly to help our students reach their goals."

Dr. Jamey Nye will take over as the Vice Chancellor of Education and Technology having spent the past 17 years in Los Rios, most recently serving as Associate Vice Chancellor of Instruction. In this role, Jamey has led Los Rios' Workforce and Economic Development Center and has helped Los Rios build

Widowed Persons Offers Greif, Recovery Support

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - When Deeann Lynch lost her husband, Rick, of 30 years in 2012, she carried on as best as she knew how with life. But after roughly two years of widowhood, she says, something finally occurred to her that completely rocked her foundation.

"I woke up about two and a half years after my husband passed away, and it hit me that I was really alone," said Lynch, 66, a retired school teacher with the San Juan Unified District. "I hadn't really given it a lot of thought before that day. I was just kind of operating on auto pilot. But I realized all of our friends that we had as a couple were nowhere to be found. I took a look at my life and I didn't really like what I was seeing."

What Lynch experienced, the delayed impact of losing a spouse but not quite living through the grief and moving forward afterward, is common. Just ask any one of the roughly 345 members of the Widowed Persons Association of California, Sacramento Chapter, where, week after week newcomers, just like Lynch, are greeted and welcomed in by long-standing members with experience to offer on how to feel, grieve, process and get on with reshaping their lives after the death of spouse.

"Common understanding, the trust in others who have been through what you are going through, these are the things that we offer our members," says Claudia Ezzell, the chapter's sitting president, who lost her husband in 2006 and, in 2007 started attending the association's Sunday Support class, which she said "changed everything."

Trail a finger down the list of commonly identified top causes of stress, isolation and deep depression and you'll find loss of a spouse right up there at the very top. Widowed Persons provides a safe and convivial space for those experiencing the death of a spouse

to recover from grief, release the stress, share their experiences with others, make new friends, stay connected and find redirection. Sometimes, as in Lynch's case, this begins years after someone loses a spouse. In other cases, it can be a matter of days.

While chapters have come and gone, the Widowed Person's Association of California, Sacramento, was the first, founded in 1986 by Helen Krough, newly widowed and seeking a network of support.

"She was sitting around staring at the TV for days after she lost her husband," said Ezzell. "The funny thing is, the TV wasn't even on and her son pointed it out to her that she was staring at a blank TV. So she decided to put an ad online

looking for others who just wanted to get together and share experiences. She was hoping for 10 to 15 people, but 75 people showed up for its first meeting, which was held in the Carmichael Library."

The Sacramento Chapter has since had as many as 500 members at a time and the list of programs and activities has grown from lunches and coffees to include travel trips, music festivals, dances, theater nights, monthly luncheons, dinners, Sock Hops at the Carmichael Elks Club, Luaus, walking groups, picnics, bridge, pinochle and Mexican train domino game days, bowling and more.

The chapter has a budget of roughly \$60,000 and is run completely by a core of roughly 24 volunteers, all of whom have

come through the program. There is an annual membership fee of \$120.00, which may be split into two payments. The fee for joining after July 1 is \$40.00. Fees cover expenses for recruiting speakers, holiday parties, the printing of the monthly newsletter and other administrative costs.

Perhaps the most critical aspect of the chapter's programming is its Sunday Support group, run by Ginny Baldauf, who joined the chapter when she lost her husband in 2003. Sunday Support, says Baldauf, is the "core of everything the group has to offer. It's our weekly support group where all of us begin to get back on our feet. I started in Sunday Support. I came on the advice of a friend and I think I cried every Sunday for

weeks, but eventually something turned over for me and I realized I had found a new support system and new friends."

For Lynch, finding the group was also like being tossed a life preserver.

"I was going to a support group in other areas for a while, but I wasn't getting anything I needed there," Lynch said. "Then a friend brought me here and it was like for the first time I started to hear other people talking about the kinds of things I was feeling and thinking. I thought I was going crazy, but I realized I wasn't. I was just needing to make new friends and feel that connection with people who understood me."

In addition, the chapter offers four, six-week Grief and Recovery workshops each year, which are free to all and set to begin again July 13. Topics, according to workshop coordinator, Chuck Beaver, cover overcoming grief, coping with stress and anxiety, and changing relationships and moving on with your life. The workshops culminate with a potluck event.

Men and women alike come seeking that initial support in dealing with the death of a spouse. For most, the death has come suddenly and there is deep, profound and seemingly unshakable grief. For others, such as caregivers of a spouse suffering from dementia, Alzheimer's disease or other long-term illnesses who have had time to plan for change, the grief comes sneaking up from behind as they experience not just the loss of a loved one, but the loss of their identity as a caretaker.

"Many caregivers experience deep grief because their role as caretaker is now over and they find themselves without a sense of director or purpose, once that role has ended," Baldauf said.

Because women tend to outlive men, membership is largely comprised of women," said Ezzell. The average age of the group's membership is 79 and that's a concern. With a goal to grow the membership base and increase

funding, the group is amidst an effort to attract younger members. The challenge, said Ezzell, is that younger widows and widowers tend to still have careers and the ability to do more socializing to make new friends. Older members come in with fewer connections as they have typically been retired for some years and or their friends are primarily also passed away.

"It's tough to get younger members in but we need them to grow," Ezzell said. "Many younger people who lose a spouse still have a place to go every day. They work or they are in school, or raising small children, so they have roles and networks."

Since joining the chapter, Lynch has begun volunteering in the office and supports Baldauf with Sunday Support. She also said she's done a few things she'd stopped doing when her husband died, namely, traveling. But perhaps more importantly, she's made new connections with people and from those connections have come new friendships, a key to recovery.

"I've started traveling again, which is something my husband and I did do together," Lynch said. "But the big thing is that I've made new friends here. The people you meet in the Sunday Support group become your friends and you find you are doing things again and are part of this new community. They become like a new family." ★

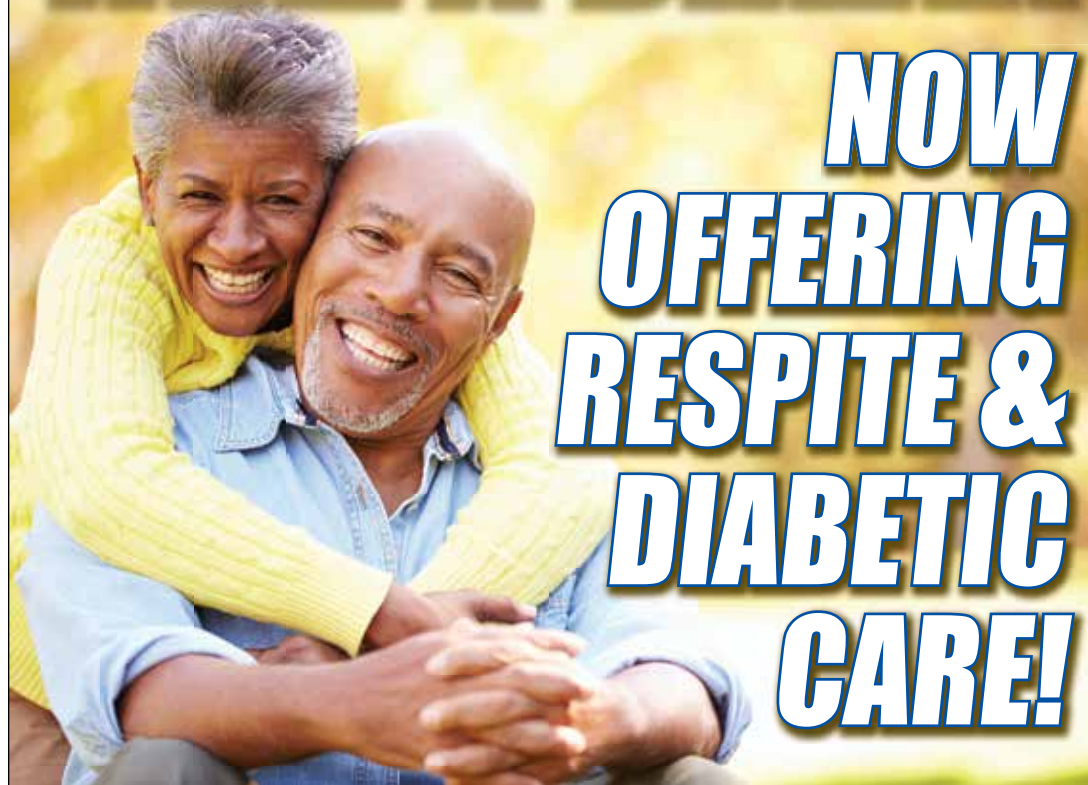
He is a 2013 graduate of Florin High School, Sacramento, Calif. ★

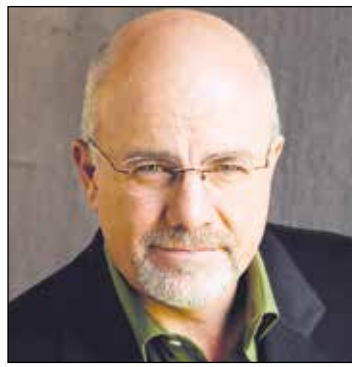
our focus will remain the same, we will now be part of a global group of women, all working on their local community's most pressing issues, most of which are related to children."

Dave Says

Let him be mad

Dear Dave,
My dad wants me to buy a house on a 30-year loan for him and my mom in my name, and let them make the payments. I'm 24 years old and have a good credit score and a nice apartment, but my job depends largely on how the oil industry is doing. My dad filed bankruptcy nine years ago, and he's already \$150,000 in debt again, so he's never been very responsible with money. I think this would spell big trouble for me, but I'm sure he will be mad if I say no. What are your thoughts?
- Emmanuel

Dear Emmanuel,
Yeah, I think doing something like this would spell big trouble for you. If your dad is irresponsible with money — especially to the point of having to file bankruptcy — what makes you think he'll make these house payments on time?

I know this would be an uncomfortable conversation to have with your dad, but you need to brace yourself and just do it. Be respectful and explain

exactly why you won't do this. Think about it, Emmanuel. When he doesn't pay the bill on time, it's going to screw up your credit score. And when you get ready to buy a house, guess what? You're going to have trouble qualifying because you already own a house. Most people don't make enough money to qualify to buy two homes.

Basically, your dad is asking you to not buy a house so they can have one. I can't tell you how to make your dad okay with saying no to this, but I can tell you that your answer should be no. Let him and your mom know that you love them both, but this is something you just can't do.

Dip in, pay it off!

Dear Dave,
My wife just had our first child. Now, we now have about \$3,000 in medical bills not covered by insurance. We've got \$8,000 in our emergency fund, and I make between \$25,000 and \$30,000 a year. Should we try setting up a payment plan with the hospital, or is dipping into our savings a better idea?
- Matt

Dear Matt,
I'd write a check today and knock out that hospital bill. This falls under the heading of

"emergency" in my mind, so pay the bill and jump back into rebuilding your emergency fund.


You've done a really good job of saving on your income, but let's see what we can do about making better money in the future. Extra practical training in your field, or more education in the classroom, could increase your income quickly. Your emergency fund needs to be a little bigger as well, and it'll be a lot easier to make this happen if you're making more money.

I'm sure you're a hard-working guy, but it's going to be tough for even a small family to make it on what you're bringing home now. The unexpected can become a common occurrence when there's a little one in the picture.

Change the World, Change Yourself

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Unemployment. Isolation. Hunger. Abuse. Can one person make a difference?

Changing one's own life for the better can be daunting, much less changing the world. Surprisingly, with minimal effort both can be accomplished.

The secret: find a purpose. According to Viktor Frankl, the Austrian neurologist and psychiatrist, our focus should not be on gaining pleasure or avoiding pain but rather on finding meaning. This is accomplished by getting involved in a cause for which you have passion.

A cause can be a societal issue such as adult literacy, homelessness or animal abuse. A cause may also be at an individual level: ensuring your child gets through high school without using drugs or

helping your elderly neighbor get to and from church.

Instead of dwelling on self, look outward. With minimal effort, you will find someone whose life you can positively impact. Being externally focused has a surprising effect: it nurtures you internally. It is hard to be nice and not feel good about yourself.

As a volunteer on the Sacramento County Adult and Aging Commission, I have learned about many issues confronting dependent adults and seniors. There is inadequate transportation, which leads to isolation, depression, malnutrition and self neglect. There are also problems with affordable housing, financial and physical abuse, and discrimination.

Can one person solve these problems? No. Can the Commission solve these problems? No. Can we make a dent, bring issues to the attention of our elected officials, and help implement solutions? A resounding yes!

Recently the Commission researched the issue of unregulated room and board homes for seniors. Prompted by this report, County agencies are collaborating to investigate the matter.

The Commission also researched disaster preparedness options for dependent adults and seniors. We learned that

there are many programs available – but knowing where to find them is an issue. We recommended ways to resolve this problem. Last year the Commission successfully lobbied to prevent defunding of the Senior Companionship program, which pays a minimal amount to low-income senior volunteers who assist frail adults.

As commissioners with a mission to better the lives of dependent adults and seniors, our lives have also been enriched. We have gained insight into community concerns from speakers who share with us their expertise. We have learned from fellow commissioners causes that touch their lives such as the problems faced by seniors in the LGBT community, the underutilization of technology, the need for more adult day programs, and finding safe and affordable housing.

And along the way, something else occurred. We've formed friendships. We've shared personal stories. We've expanded our social circles by meeting people we would most likely never have met otherwise. We found meaning both externally and internally.

These experiences occur in most volunteer organizations. They happen when you volunteer at a hospice and sit at the bedside of a dying person.

They happen when you keep score at a Special Olympics competition. They happen when you're part of a team that picks up litter along the American river or rescues abused animals.

It's amazing how many organizations are in constant need of volunteers, including board members. If you're not sure where you'd like to help, turn to the Internet for ideas. Search on "volunteer opportunities Sacramento" or go to www.volunteer-match.org. Your talents are needed! Of course, make sure the program is legitimate and consistent with your values.

The pursuit of purpose, not the pursuit of happiness, changes your world. Having meaning in one's life is what creates personal happiness; it is not personal happiness that creates meaning.

There are many bad things in society and many people suffer because of them. All people – even those who are suffering – have the ability to be a positive influence. Every situation presents the opportunity to find meaning. As Viktor Frankl noted, "For the world is in a bad state, but everything will become still worse unless each of us does his best."

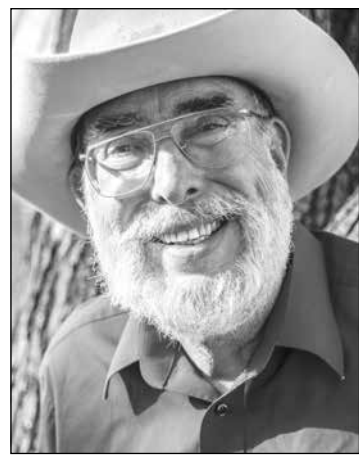

SacRT Shocked by Senseless Violence

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Officials from Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) are shocked over news that a SacRT assigned sheriff's deputy was injured in the line of duty recently. Sacramento Sheriff's Deputy Alex Ladwig was shot by a 27-year old Sacramento man who was loitering at the Watt/I-80 light rail station. The four-year veteran of the force is in stable condition with major facial injuries.

"Our hearts are heavy and our prayers go out to Deputy Ladwig and his family," said SacRT Director and Sacramento County Supervisor Phil Serna. "Deputy Ladwig was injured trying to make a difference in our community by helping to improve the Watt/I-80 Station. We owe him a debt of gratitude."

The Watt/I-80 Station has been the focus of a major improvement effort over the past several months. Sacramento Police Lieutenant Lisa Hinz, Chief of Police for SacRT, recently instituted a three-pronged approach to reduce the station's criminal element, which included increased law enforcement, a station improvement

plan and in coordination with business owners and community groups in the area.

"This was a senseless act of violence and it simply will not be tolerated," said Hinz. "Deputy Ladwig is a well-respected member of our team and we will honor his efforts by ensuring that Watt/I-80 be turned into a model station in the months ahead."

Deputy Ladwig was on overtime when the shooting occurred in order to support increased patrols at the station that have been in effect for several weeks. Two transit agents have also been assigned to the Watt/I-80 Station on a permanent basis to maintain a uniformed presence. Additionally, Hinz is in the process of developing a station improvement plan by way of a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) study that was recently initiated.

Community involvement has been another key component of this major initiative. SacRT representatives and law enforcement officials met last week with leaders from the Watt Avenue Partnership and from Walk Sacramento to coordinate activities focused on improving

pedestrian safety and security at the station.

"SacRT's new team has been working diligently to make a difference at the Watt/I-80 light rail station," said General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "This is the dark before the dawn, but we are confident our team will make a difference in the coming months as we work to implement a multi-pronged approach that is comprehensive. Deputy Ladwig's commitment to our community is honorable and we will honor his efforts by ensuring our residents are safe at this station."

SacRT recently began an adopt-a-station program in which each member of the district's new executive team has committed to monitoring three stations for safety and cleanliness.

RT operates approximately 69 bus routes and 43 miles of light rail throughout Sacramento County, including the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, Rancho Cordova and Elk Grove. Sacramento buses and light rail trains operate 365 days a year.

Defendant Sentenced for Kidnapping, Assault to Commit Rape

DATE: June 16, 2017

CASE: Thomas Chavez (#15F04824)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Unit

The Honorable Laurel White sentenced Thomas Chavez to 30 years to life in prison. On May 8, 2017, Judge White found Chavez guilty of kidnapping and assault with the intent to commit rape. In addition, the Court found Chavez had suffered prior convictions for sexual assault in 1988.

On August 6, 2015, a woman was walking down Stockton Boulevard when Chavez pulled up behind her in his car. He jumped out of his car, grabbed her from behind, held an ice pick to her neck and forced her into his car. Chavez drove behind a nearby store to an isolated area. CHP officers who were nearby observed Chavez drive behind the store and went to investigate. The officers shined their light into the vehicle and heard the woman screaming for help. Chavez was arrested soon after.

Defendant Convicted for 1995 Double Murder, Attempted Murders

DATE: June 22, 2017

CASE: Hung Phi Nguyen (Case #95F05136)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Jeff Hightower, Homicide Unit

Hung Phi Nguyen was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murders of Ri Nguyen and Say Ngo. He was also convicted of four counts of attempted murder.

In 1995, Hung Phi Nguyen and two others were attempting to take over an extortion racket of Chinese gambling businesses in south Sacramento. On May 17, 1995, Hung Phi Nguyen shot at Thang Bui and Duong Phan in a case of mistaken identity. On June 27, 1995, Hung Phi Nguyen and his cohorts then shot and killed Ri Nguyen, their extortion competition. They also killed Say Ngo, the owner of a gambling business. Mark Huang and San Vong were shot in the crossfire, but both survived their injuries. The other two defendants were tried and convicted of the double murder in 1995. Hung Phi Nguyen eluded law enforcement until he was captured while crossing the Arizona-California border in 2011.

Hung Phi Nguyen faces a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for July 21,

2017, 10:00 a.m. in Department 30 before the Honorable David De Alba.

Defendant Sentenced for Child Sexual Assault

DATE: June 27, 2017

CASE: Maurice Higgs (Case #16FE017541)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Bruce Chang, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

The Honorable Allen Summer sentenced Maurice Higgs to 150 years to life in prison. On April 27, 2017, a jury convicted Higgs of three counts of child sexual assault on a child 10 years or younger, two counts of child sexual assault by force and one count of child sexual assault on a child under 14 years of age.

Beginning February 2012 until February 2014, Maurice Higgs sexually assaulted a female child on multiple occasions when she was 5 to 7 years old. Higgs threatened the victim on at least one occasion that he would physically harm her if she told anyone. He eventually admitted the assaults to law enforcement.

Higgs has two prior 2003 strike convictions for robbery and making criminal threats.

Defendant Convicted for Sexual Assault of Homeless Woman

DATE: June 27, 2017

CASE: Lonnie Calimee (Case #16FE006026)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

Lonnie Calimee was convicted by a jury of first-degree residential burglary and sexual penetration of an unconscious victim.

In the early morning hours of March 22, 2016, the homeless female victim was sleeping in her tent under an overhang of a building on Bicentennial Circle in Sacramento. She awoke to find Lonnie Calimee halfway inside her tent and sexually assaulting her. When the victim screamed, Calimee fled the scene. The victim was able to call 911, and she was taken to the Bear Center for a sexual assault examination. The examination revealed injuries consistent with penetrating trauma. DNA samples were collected from Calimee, and the victim's DNA was recovered from under his fingernails.

A trial as to allegations that Calimee has suffered seven prior strike convictions will occur at the sentencing hearing. Sentencing is set for August 11, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Bowan. ★

Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame Inductees Announced

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A champion boxer, the founder of Rancho Cordova Soccer, an amazing sports family and a storied youth baseball team will be among those inducted into the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame this October.

The inductees will be honored during the 2017 Induction Ceremony slated for Oct. 14 at Rancho Cordova City Hall.

"Rancho Cordova has a uniquely powerful history of youth sports achievement," said David Sander, a Rancho Cordova City Councilman and president of the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association. "Our Hall of Fame memorializes that incredible history and should inspire our current youth athletes as well."

To be elected to the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame, inductees were judged to have attained significant achievements in or contributions to athletics, as well as exhibiting high standards of character and sportsmanship.

"The history of Rancho Cordova is closely linked with some of the most talented athletes in the country," said Conrade Mayer, chairman of the Hall of Fame selection committee. "We need to look at this amazing sports legacy and allow it to inspire our entire community, especially our youth."

Rancho Cordova Sports luminaries to be inducted with the Inaugural Class include:

- **1974 American Legion Post 281 Baseball Team:** Comprised entirely of Rancho Cordova youth baseball standouts, the team is honored not only for qualifying

to play in the California State Championship, but for an outstanding record of accomplishment which followed. The team eventually finished third in the state, but four team members went on to play professional baseball, four competed for junior colleges and seven for colleges, making it one of the most successful youth baseball teams in Rancho Cordova history. The team was coached by Rich Rose and included players Gary Stonebrook, Scott Jenner, George Harper, Walt Hill, Jim Noonan, Warren Brown, Doug Land, Mike Anicich, Jim Deane, Steve Finch, John Ingram, Mike Hoffditz, Morgan Jones, Bob Beale and the late Mark Abbondola.

- **Farynairz Family:** Dominating Rancho Cordova high school sports in the early 1980s, brothers Brett and Tony and sister Deborah are honored for a remarkable legacy left by a single family. After outstanding Cordova High School accomplishments, Tony went on to be a baseball All American at San Diego State, Brett played outside linebacker for seven years in the NFL, and Deborah was an all American Cross Country runner at UC Davis, eventually going to earn a medical degree from Harvard and become a leading orthopedic surgeon.
- **Robert Arellanes:** A retired Sacramento State professor and dean, Arellanes will be honored for his efforts to bring the then little known sport of soccer to Rancho Cordova, eventually founding the



Rancho Cordova Soccer Club and Cordova High School Soccer program, which have engaged thousands of local youth in the sport for decades.

- **Ken Bowles:** A longtime coach of football, basketball, softball and track, Bowles is being honored not only for his coaching, but for contributions to and leadership of youth sports across the board for decades.
- **Otis Griffin:** A Cordova High School football standout who played for Texas A&M and Arena Football's Los Angeles Avengers, Griffin went on to a professional boxing career, including winning "The Next Great Champ" on a Fox reality show of the same name in 2005.
- **Jeff Hazard:** A 1980s Cordova High School wrestling standout, Hazard went to Stanford on a wrestling scholarship, earning top wrestling honors and a degree in geology, sharing his knowledge in both with youth to this day.
- **Stacy Hom Loftus:** A 1985 Cordova High graduate, Hom

was a champion in women's discus at both the high school and college level. Her 1990 throw of 170-30 still stands as a Women's Outdoor record at Sacramento State.

- **Joe Horgan:** An outstanding Cordova High School baseball player, Horgan played at Sacramento City College before heading to Major League Baseball, where he played 47 games for the Expos in 2004 and the Washington Nationals in 2005.
- **Joe Horyza:** A legendary and beloved basketball coach at Mills Jr. High, Horyza went on to statewide leadership in the field of Physical Education and Coaching.
- **Chris Johnson:** A high school baseball and basketball player for the Lancers, Johnson evolved as a golfer at UC Davis where he earned Division II All American honors. Still a Rancho Cordova resident, Johnson continues to be acknowledged as one of the region's best golfers over a career that has lasted decades.
- **Jerry Karnow:** An admired

Mills Jr. High coach of football and wrestling, Karnow has been inducted into both the Sacramento and National Men's Senior Baseball League Halls of Fame with a long career which included being an All CIF pitcher in 1959 and a Gold Medal winner in the Nike World Games among other honors.

- **Kevin Nixon:** A Cordova Lancers basketball star, Nixon was Utah State's MVP in 1988 and its highest scoring guard; a starter for three years and team captain in his junior and senior seasons. He has continued his basketball stardom into coaching, including an Arizona State Championship team and assisting Bishop Gorman (NV) women's team to four state championships.
- **Walt Phillips:** Beloved football and baseball coach in the early days of Mills Jr. High, Phillips was part of the early training and coaching combine which gave birth to Cordova High School's legendary football teams.
- **Jack Ramsey:** A longtime and admired Mills Jr. High coach whose guidance helped shape the Cordova High School football dynasty of the 1970s.
- **Bob Reece:** Cordova High quarterback, basketball player and catcher in the early 70s, Reece who went on to Stanford, then nine seasons in the minors system of the Expos, with nine games in the Majors. He is recognized as Cordova High's first MLB player.
- **Ray Savorn:** A longtime Rancho Cordova resident, Savorn was an outstanding college athlete and 39-year

Cordova High School teacher and coach, and accomplished senior tennis athlete. His basketball officiating accomplishments landed him in the LaSalle Club's Officials Hall of Fame in 2016.

- **Mike Valentine:** A first-team selection on the Sacramento Bee's 1977 All-Metro defensive team, Valentine was an elite defensive end who was a key member of the Lancers' section champion football teams in 1976 and 1977. A top hurdler, Valentine established a then-school record 14.4 in the 120 High Hurdles and helped Cordova track teams to back-to-back Metro League titles in 1976-77. Today, Valentine teaches history and is freshman football, and track and field coach at Granite Bay High School.

The inductees will be honored during the 2017 Induction Ceremony slated for 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 14 at Rancho Cordova City Hall. Tickets for the event are \$25 and will include an appetizer and cocktail reception and awards program. Tickets will be limited to 350, and the event promises to be a sell-out.

Online tickets will go on sale Sept. 1 at www.cordovacouncil.org. The event is organized by the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association in partnership with the Cordova Community Council.

The Rancho Cordova Athletic Association was formed in 2013 to foster lifelong values of good sportsmanship, teamwork and healthy active lifestyles through development of excellent youth sports facilities and organizations, positive coaching and access to play for all. ★

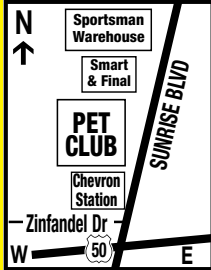
