RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Eighteen high school students are experiencing "Summer at City Hall," a 4-week program funded by the City's Community Enhancement Fund. This professional development program gives students hands-on experience and education regarding how local government works. Non-profit organization PRO Youth and Families organized the program for incoming high school juniors and seniors who live within the City of Rancho Cordova.

Hearing in CHP Officer's Death Set for Sept. 11

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A July 13 preliminary hearing for the man accused of causing the death of CHP Officer Lucas Chellew February 22 in South Sacramento, has been rescheduled in order to give CHP investigators more time to complete their investigation of the accident.

Defense attorney Alice Michele requested an extension for the hearing for her client, Alberto Quiroz, 26 at the time of arrest, who faces one misdemeanor and three felony counts of vehicle theft, possession of a stolen vehicle and resisting arrest.

Motorcycle patrolman Chellew was pursuing Quiroz, also on a motorcycle, on Fruitridge Road, when he was suddenly cut off by a passing car, lost control of his motorcycle and hit a pole. He was taken to UC Davis Medical Center where he later died from his injuries. Quiroz was arrested shortly after the pursuit.

Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller confirmed that the hearing, which was stalled for several months for settlement conferences before being calendared, was delayed so that CHP officials conducting a detailed investigation into the crash that killed Chellew could have more time to prepare.

"They need more time to put together their report before we can move forward," Miller said, adding that the original charges have not changed in the case against Quiroz, but declining to say that they could.

The CHP report is expected to play a critical role in the case against Quiroz. Should it reveal willful recklessness on the defendant's part, charges against him could change to include at least one count of vehicular manslaughter.

Chellew's widow was present in the courtroom for the hearing. She sat flanked by CHP patrolmen, presumably colleagues of her late husband, as Judge Kevin J. McCormick asked Quiroz, clad in an orange jumpsuit inside a detaining cell, if he agreed to waive his right to have his case heard sooner. He did. ★

Another Gas Tax Imposed on Californians

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Following the presentations of Assembly Bill 398 (Eduardo Garcia) and Assembly Bill 617 (Cristina Garcia), two measures that push for the expansion of the cap-and-trade program and raise more taxes on all Californians, Democrat members of the Senate Appropriations Committee passed both measures along party lines. These two onerous measures are estimated to increase gas taxes by a minimum of \$0.63* per gallon, on top of the recently passed \$0.19 per gallon gas and car tax increase. Vice Chair of the Senate Budget Committee, Senator Jim

Nielsen (R-Tehama), issued the following statement:

"Californians were hit with a \$52 billion gas and car tax increase in April.

"Today, we are hit again with another gas tax. We will soon have to pay another \$0.63* per gallon to fuel our cars - a total increase of \$0.82 per gallon based on estimates from the independent Legislative Analyst.

"This 'cap-and-trade deal' is for the elites, not everyday Californians, to pay for their pet projects. This is a crushing blow to California residents. When will it ever be enough for Sacramento politicians?" ★

Runner, BOE, Responds to Fire Fee Suspension

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - *George Runner issued the following statement in response to the Legislature's approval of AB 398, which suspends the so-called "Fire Prevention Fee" until 2031.*

"For six years, ruling Democrats have extorted money in the form of a fire tax from hundreds of thousands of rural Californians, including many seniors on fixed incomes.

"After blocking repeal efforts for years, state leaders finally acted today

to suspend this unjust tax, but only because they needed to win votes for a costly climate change measure.

"In other words, they did the right thing for the wrong reasons.

"This seeming victory for California taxpayers is bitter-sweet. A suspension falls short of a full repeal, and it fails to provide refunds to homeowners who were forced to pay this illegal tax.

"It's never too late to do the right thing: Give us our money back!" ★

Berryhill Votes to Protect Rural California, Small Businesses and Farmers

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - *Senator Tom Berryhill, R-Twain Harte, issued the following statement Monday in support for AB-398, a bill to extend the state's cap-and-trade program for a decade while reducing taxes, fees and regulations by more than \$16 billion dollars.*

"This legislation is the unfortunate result of years of aggressive climate-change policies forced on us by the coastal elites who run Sacramento. But instead of sitting on the sideline and watching everything go off a cliff, I was able to ensure farmers, small-business owners and rural Californians were well-represented and protected in the negotiation.

"Cap and trade fills a void created

by onerous policies, a void that would otherwise be filled by regulations written by out-of-touch, unaccountable bureaucrats - the exact people I came to Sacramento to rein in.

"As an added bonus, this bill suspends the illegal fire tax and keeps Sacramento Democrats from increasing taxes on gas by substantially more than one dollar per gallon. Again, this bill is not perfect, but it is more reasonable after a bipartisan negotiation. Two Mather Soil Vapor Extraction Units Achieve Cleanup Goals

Air Force Cleanup Program Takes Another Step Toward Completion

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Air Force's remediation program at the former Mather Air Force Base took another major step forward this summer when two Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE) units were found to have achieved their cleanup goals.

Late June, the Air Force Civil Engineer Center announced that two of the three remaining Soil Vapor Extraction systems accomplished their mission, a major step towards completion of the soil cleanup process at Mather.

Although the base closed in 1993 and all related military operations departed, the Air Force remained responsible for Mather's environmental cleanup. Since then, Air Force soil and groundwater cleanup activities have proceeded alongside community redevelopment efforts and the restoration work has provided a successful platform for Mather's redevelopment.

Today, all 5,718 acres of the former base have been transferred to local control for reuse. Mather has become a hub of general aviation and industry; approximately 6,600 people work on-base, employed by more than 60 individual businesses.

Historically, the military used chemicals, including fuels, solvents and oils at Mather in support of national defense from 1918 to 1993, although there were several breaks in service. In 1979, contamination was detected in water supply wells. Environmental cleanup began in the 1980s, years before Mather closed.

The cleanup primarily includes removing contaminants from the soil and groundwater beneath the

land surface. Currently, the Air Force uses Soil Vapor Extraction to remove contaminants from the soil before they can reach the groundwater.

The treatment systems have removed over 1 million pounds of volatile organic compounds and petroleum products from the ground and treated over 12 billion gallons of groundwater.

Douglas Self, AFCEC Base Environmental Coordinator at Mather, stated the closing of these two units marks a major milestone in the Air Force's effort to complete the cleanup and make way for successful reuse.

"The Air Force is committed to completing the last remaining activities necessary for the environment restoration at Mather," Self said. "Being able to shut these systems down means we are getting closer to achieving that goal."

The two Soil Vapor Extraction units operated since 1998. One was installed near an old wash rack, where airplane parts

were cleaned and degreased. Contaminants at this site included jet fuels and trichloroethylene (TCE), an industrial solvent used as a degreaser at many Air Force installations. The second unit was located near an oil-water separator. Both units have been switched off since 2015 while the Air Force confirmed that cleanup was complete in those areas.

A third unit, also offline since 2015, is located near a former dry-cleaning facility where tetrachloroethene (PCE) was used. Removing vaporized contaminants from the deep soil in this area has been completed and the Air Force is working with regulatory agencies to achieve site closure.

Demolition of the unit near the oil-water separator is tentatively scheduled for this summer. The unit near the wash rack may be put back into service to treat a newly discovered site requiring additional remediation. TCE was recently found in the soil near an airplane

hangar currently used by Mather Aviation.

Ongoing testing of the soil at this site will assist the Air Force and regulators with determining whether to use the already-standing unit for this cleanup process or construct a newer, more cost-effective unit.

Institutional controls (ICs) will be used at each site to ensure inadvertent exposure to contamination does not take place. The ICs require future developers to take steps to prevent human exposure to any remaining contaminants in the shallow soil and gives regulatory agencies the ability to ensure these steps are taken.

"The Mather cleanup program is progressing very well," Self said. "Our state-of-the-art soil and groundwater remedial systems are in place and running smoothly. The Air Force has completed the cleanup process at nearly 90 percent of contaminated sites and we will be here until the cleanup job is finished." ★

Pledging to Pool Safety

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - As more residents head to their local or household swimming pool to escape the summer heat, safety experts are reminding individuals to adopt simple safety steps to prevent drownings.

Drownings are the number one cause of unintentional death for children ages 1-4, and City of Rancho Cordova Chief Building Official, Joe Cuffe, says they're usually preventable.

The City of Rancho Cordova is an official Pool Campaign Safety Partner with the U.S. Consumer

Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and is promoting safe water habits as part of the nationwide "Pool Safely" campaign.

"Pool Safely is a year-round campaign, but during the summer months, we take additional steps to remind our residents how to reduce risk of drownings," said Cuffe.

From July 17th to July 21st, the City of Rancho Cordova has been encouraging residents to sign the Pool Safely Pledge, which asks individuals to commit to actions such as learning CPR and ensure

pools have fencing or gates and safe drain covers.

"The pledge serves as a reminder that, without proper structures or care, pools can be fatal, and simple steps can reduce chances of a tragic event," said Joe Cuffe, Chief Building Official for the City of Rancho Cordova.

Bera Introduces Bipartisan Health Care Improvements

Working to Protect Consumer Access to Vision Care

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - Congressman Ami Bera, M.D., along with Congressman Jim Renacci (R-OH), introduced the Protecting Consumer Access to Vision Care Act of 2017 today. This bill would provide relief from the health insurance tax (HIT) for stand-alone vision plans under the Affordable Care Act.

"As a doctor, I know how important eye health is to whole health. This simple, bipartisan idea puts the patient first and helps keep care affordable for seniors and families. These fixes are exactly the kind of reform both Democrats and Republicans can get behind," said Rep. Bera. "Access to vision care is

critical, especially for those 88 million Americans who are served by SAVPs, with over 4 million covered in Ohio alone. Since vision plans provide

limited-scope health coverage, they are not subject to ACA market reforms and therefore should be exempt from other ACA taxes and fees," said Rep. Renacci. "In fact, unlike other traditional health insurance subject to the fee, SAVPs are excluded from being offered directly on the Exchanges per the ACA."

Stand-alone vision plans cover routine eye exams and are critical in revealing other conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, tumors, and undiagnosed strokes. The health insurance tax can place an undue burden on vision plans, leading to higher prices and limited eye care.

Happy Days

But Anson had a special message he wanted to share with me on POPPOFF. Have you ever thought about Drowsy

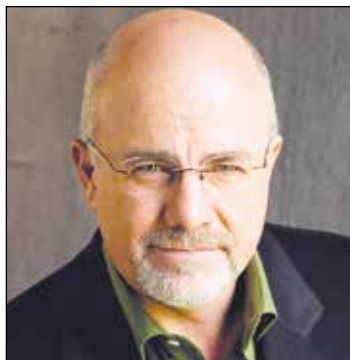
Driving? You have to admit that you and everyone you know has had one of those moments in their driving life. And Anson was no exception.

Here are some stats that will really get you thinking. It is a silent epidemic with some 100,000 police-reported crashes each year according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration as a result of driver fatigue. Here are the gruesome facts. These crashes result in at least 1,550 deaths, 71,000 injuries, and \$12.5 billion in monetary losses. Threaten to garnish

Dear Dave,
I got a call from a debt collector regarding \$2,000 I owe in medical bills. I'm trying to get my finances in order and pay this off, but I'm afraid they'll follow through on their threat to garnish my wages. Can you give me some advice?
- Mike

Dear Mike,

First, I want you to take a deep breath and calm down. Debt collectors like to play on your emotions because they think you'll give in and do something you can't really afford to do. Most of them don't care about you or your situation as long as they get some money.

They won't garnish your wages because they can't. They would have to go through the formal, legal procedure of first suing you and then winning the case. They broke federal law by saying they would garnish your wages but hadn't sued you. If I'm in your shoes, I'd be filing a complaint against these bozos with the Federal Trade Commission.

Don't react with fear and panic in the face of debt

collector threats. Talk to them and explain your situation. See if you can work out a compromise. If they get nasty or break federal law again, let them know you'll be filing another complaint with the FTC. You'd be surprised how reasonable these people can be when faced with the possibility of government intervention.

In the meantime, do everything you can to scrape up as much cash as possible. Have a big garage sale and sell everything in your attic or basement you don't need. Then, when you get this mess cleaned up, pay off the rest of your debts — if you have any — and start living on a written monthly budget!

Rental house being foreclosed

Dear Dave,
I've been living in a rental house for some time now. I was just told by the owners that the house is being foreclosed on next week. I've tried to call and email them, but haven't heard anything back. Should I go ahead and pay rent for this month?
- John

Dear John,

I wouldn't. The bottom line in a situation like this is: You're giving them money and they're not paying the bills. I wouldn't give the owners another dime until they return your phone calls or talk to you in person and let you know the details as to what's going on with the house you're living in.

In the meantime, I'd advise speaking with an attorney and a real estate professional in your area to find out exactly what your rights are at this point. Many places require a 30-day notice before renters are required to vacate a property.

TENSE, CLIMACTIC "PLANET OF THE APES" SHOWDOWN THRILLS

A Film & TV Review

WAR FOR THE PLANET OF THE APES (Rated PG-13)

The "Planet of the Apes" franchise, which started in 1968 with Charlton Heston as an astronaut landing on a strange planet where apes ranked higher than humans on the evolutionary scale, has spawned numerous sequels over the years.

One has to wonder how Heston's space explorer George Taylor would react to the current iteration of the "Planet of the Apes" trilogy that started with "Rise of the Planet of the Apes" in 2011 and has now culminated with "War for the Planet of the Apes."

In the current trilogy, with the final chapter directed by Matt Reeves, who performed the same duties for "Dawn of the Planet of the Apes," the most sympathetic character is Caesar (Andy Serkis), the chimpanzee who acquired human intelligence and speech abilities from experimental drugs in the first film.

Indeed, Heston's astronaut, who expressed his disgust for being manhandled by simians, would be aghast at the turn of events weighing heavily against the remaining humans. Yet, it all makes sense in the grand scheme put forth by director Reeves.

The first word in the title of the final installment informs the nature of the story to unfold. The opening scene involves human soldiers tracking apes in a densely-wooded forest where the helmets are stenciled with "Bedtime for Bonzo" and "Monkey Killer," among other things.

"War for the Planet of the Apes" has several themes that run throughout, from Western revenge to a prison break thriller, but the most prominent might be an allegory to the Vietnam War, with a strong nod to "Apocalypse Now."

The reference to Francis Ford Coppola's masterpiece wartime movie is unmistakable when Caesar and his trusted allies go up against the completely unhinged Colonel (Woody Harrelson) who fashions himself as a latter-day Kurtz, complete with the shaved bald head.

Unlike his brutal simian rival Koba (Toby Kebbell), who wanted to practice genocide on the remaining humans, Caesar took the more peaceful view that he could happily hide in the jungle to avoid any military confrontations.

Regrettably, as one of the few apes with the ability to speak proficient English, Caesar is Public Enemy Number One in the eyes of the deranged Colonel who sees the ape leader as an existential threat to the well-being of mankind.

As a result, the Colonel's forces hunt down Caesar to his lair, eventually killing all but one of his family members. This cruel act engenders not just a war footing for the apes, but triggers the type of vengeance that so often guides the theme of a Western adventure.

Joined by a small band of trusted cohorts, including the wise orangutan Maurice (Karin Konoval) and right hand man Rocket (Terry Notary), Caesar's expedition to locate the Colonel's fortified hideaway leads to some unusual discoveries.

As already established

previously, a potent virus, commonly referred to as the simian flu, has decimated the human population, or at least rendered a few surviving members of the species to a reversionary primitive state.

Some humans have been robbed of the ability to speak, and it is these surviving people who are also targeted for extinction by the Colonel. Caesar finds and befriends a young mute girl they name Nova (Amiah Miller), a victim of the virus who has been orphaned.

Exhibiting the type of compassion that eludes the Colonel, Caesar is unable to abandon the young girl to a deadly fate, and so she comes along in Caesar's trek as a reminder that humanity might extend beyond just the grasp of the evolved homo sapiens.

Arriving at the Colonel's base camp is a painful reminder that brutality has become a staple for the few humans left standing. The Colonel in essence runs a concentration camp populated by simian prisoners required to do hard manual labor.

With Caesar masterminding a prison break, the film takes a page right out of "The Great Escape" playbook. And the Colonel has to face the consequence that his simian foe is a charismatic, resourceful enemy who motivates his species to fight back.

From the excellent storytelling to the stunning visuals of desolate, forbidding landscapes, "War for the Planet of the Apes" works on several levels. Most importantly, the climactic battle scene is anything but ordinary in its delivery of the action goods. ★

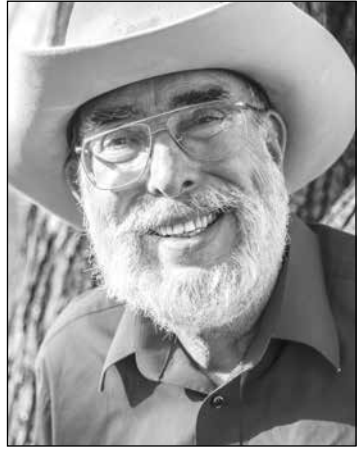

Defendant Convicted for Shooting at Vehicle Near Arden Fair Mall

DATE: July 11, 2017
CASE: Robert Faler (Case #14F05242)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Laura West, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit
Robert Faler was convicted by a jury of attempted murder, shooting at an occupied vehicle, and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury found true allegations that the crimes were committed for the benefit of and/or in association with the Sureño criminal street gang, and that Faler personally used and discharged a firearm during the commission of the offenses. It was also found that Faler had been previously convicted of robbery and served a prison term for that offense.

On July 18, 2014, the victims crossed paths with Robert Faler and his former co-defendant, Alexis Lopez, while at a gas station on Arden Way. Lopez drove to the station with Faler in the front passenger seat. Faler and Lopez were both Sureño gang members, and Lopez believed he recognized the victims as rival Norteño gang members. After the victims drove away, Lopez followed them and caught up to them as they drove on Arden Way near the Arden Fair mall. Faler fired multiple shots at the victims' car and flashed gang signs before Lopez drove away. The victims' car was hit by three bullets, one of which entered the front passenger compartment.

Faler faces a maximum sentence of 55 years to life in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for August 4, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 23 before the Honorable Geoffrey Goodman.

Defendant Sentenced for Multiple Sexual Assaults

DATE: July 14, 2017
CASE: Steven Anthony McCarter (Case #16FE002313)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Bunmi Awoniyi sentenced Steven McCarter to 151 years to life in prison. On June 5, 2017, a jury convicted McCarter of two counts of rape by force with personal use of a deadly weapon, two counts

of assault with a deadly weapon, two counts of assault by means likely to produce great bodily injury and assault with the intent to commit rape against two separate women.

On November 21, 2015, a homeless victim was sitting on a street curb near Sacramento State. McCarter offered to drive her to get food, which she accepted. McCarter then provided her with alcohol and asked her to stay in his motel room. The victim agreed to stay in his room with the understanding there would be no sex. The victim later awoke to find McCarter naked with his arms around her neck. McCarter punched and elbowed the victim in the face several times, choked her until she couldn't breathe, and wrapped his belt around her throat in an attempt to suffocate her. When the belt broke, the victim begged McCarter to stop beating her. McCarter proceeded to rape the victim twice. The victim escaped the next morning and was taken to a hospital for her injuries and a sexual assault exam. The District Attorney's Crime Lab analyzed DNA collected from the exam, which was later matched to McCarter's DNA.

On January 23, 2016, a second victim was walking and carrying grocery bags in south Sacramento. McCarter offered to give her a ride, which she accepted. The two talked about meeting again later that night. When the victim became stranded at a light rail station, she called McCarter and asked for a ride home. McCarter picked her up and drove to a liquor store. He then stated he was too drunk to drive and asked if they could stay in a motel for the night. The victim agreed with the understanding there would be no sex. When the victim was in bed, McCarter demanded she remove her clothing. When she refused, McCarter punched her in the face and hit her in the eye with a liquor bottle. The victim was able to fight McCarter off and escape. The next day, the victim went to a hospital and reported the attempted rape. She later identified McCarter in a photo lineup.

McCarter was released early from prison as a 'non-violent' second striker on September 23, 2015. Two months later, he raped and assaulted the first victim. Two months after that attack, he assaulted the second victim. ★

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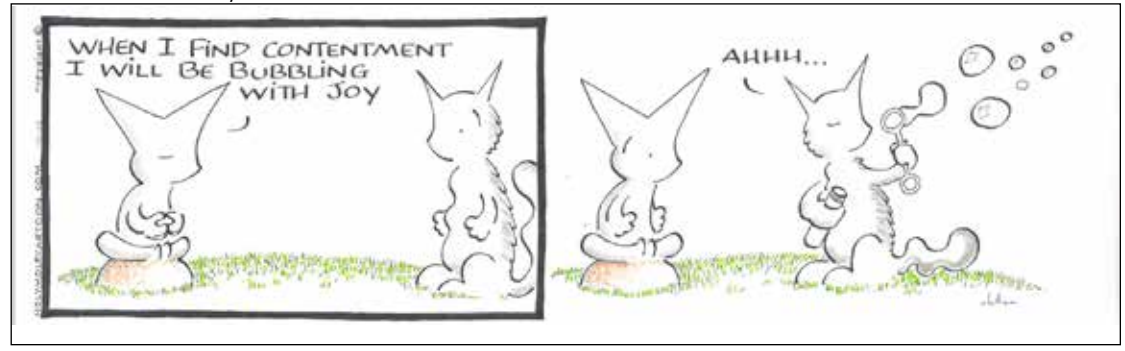
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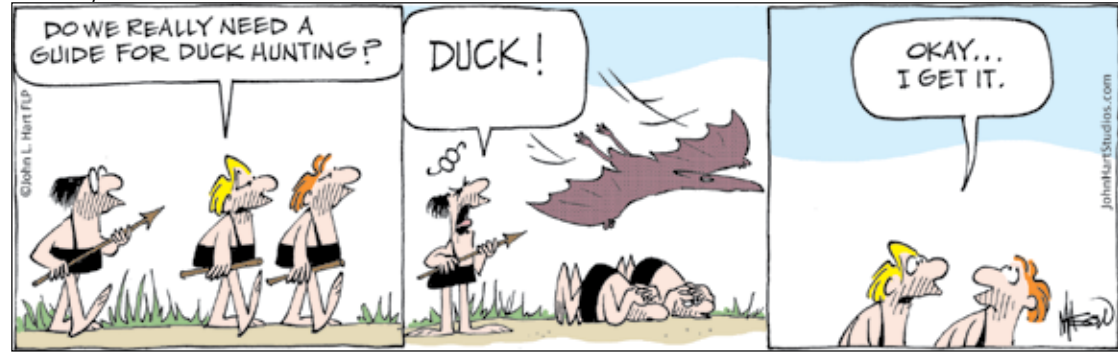

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Homelessness on the Rise

New Report Confirms Increase in Number of People Experiencing Homelessness

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Despite housing 2,232 individuals and families who were experiencing homelessness in 2016, a new report commissioned by Sacramento Steps Forward and authored by Sacramento State's Institute for Social Research confirms that homelessness has increased across Sacramento county in the past two years.

According to the report, titled "Homelessness in Sacramento County: Results from the 2017 Point-in-Time Count," the total number of people experiencing homelessness has increased by 30 percent to 3,665 since 2015. Among people who are unsheltered, a subset of the total population who are living outdoors on the street, in tents, cars, or RVs, the number has increased by 85 percent to 2,052. Approximately 31% of people who are unsheltered are chronically homeless, meaning they have experienced prolonged bouts of homelessness and are disabled.

"This report provides a sobering confirmation of what we see in our neighborhoods every day," said Ryan Loofbourrow, CEO of Sacramento Steps Forward. "It's frustrating that we could not stop the rising tide of homelessness, but we hope this information will provide regional leaders with the empirical data they need to collaborate on innovative solutions."

In addition to overall increases in homelessness, the report found a 50 percent increase in the number of homeless veterans since 2015, up to 469 people. The majority of these veterans are unsheltered. Veterans continue to make up approximately 13 percent of the total homeless population.

Individuals who reported continuous homelessness tended to be substantially older and were often encountered in encampments near the American River Parkway, in contrast to younger people who were downtown. Older chronically homeless individuals – between 55 and 64 – were also more likely to report being a veteran or suffer from a disabling medical condition.

"This news affirms what is already evident to the people of Sacramento, the question is what are we going to do about it," said Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg. "We are going

to implement the city's \$64 million Whole Person Care grant together with our public housing resources to get 2,000 people off the streets as soon as possible. No excuses, no boundaries, action and results are all that matter."

There were drops in the numbers of families and transitional age youth who were found to be homeless, which is a testament to the work of homeless service providers, but these groups are traditionally hard to survey for this type of report so the findings may not accurately capture a true census of these communities.

The report cites the housing drought as a potential factor in the rise of homelessness and explains that the trend in Sacramento is consistent with other communities who have tight housing market conditions. The report also explains the potential impact of flooding on the American and Sacramento rivers and improved statistical methodologies.

The rise in homelessness between 2015 and 2017 in Sacramento County is consistent with similar increases recently reported across the state. At the time the report was written,

Alameda County reported a 39 percent increase in homelessness, a 76 percent increase in Butte County, and a 23 percent increase in Los Angeles County.

"This report confirms what we all see with our own eyes: a shocking and unacceptable rise in the number of persons experiencing homelessness. We need to redouble our efforts to increase our stock of affordable housing so that everyone in Sacramento has a simple home of their own," said Joan Burke, who is Chair of Sacramento's Homeless Continuum of Care Advisory Board and Director of

Advocacy Loaves & Fishes.

Sacramento Steps Forward commissioned this report as a part of its biennial point-in-time count, which is a county-wide census of people experiencing homelessness. It provides a snapshot of who is homeless on a single night. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requires local communities to conduct this census every two years as a condition of receiving federal funding for their Homeless Continuum of Care, for which Sacramento Steps Forward is the lead agency.

The point-in-time count was conducted on January 25, 2017 by nearly 400 trained volunteers who fanned out across the county to count and survey people living on the street, in tents, cars, and RV's, while a data team documented the number of people sleeping in emergency and transitional shelters.

The point-in-time count and this report were made possible thanks to funding from the County of Sacramento, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency.

Sacramento Steps Forward is a 501(c)(3) non-profit homeless service agency who, through collaboration, innovation, and service, is working to end homelessness in our region.

Founded in 1989, Sacramento State's Institute for Social Research (ISR) is an interdisciplinary unit that harnesses the power of scientific research tools to address social problems. Their research and analysis expertise, learned through the hundreds of projects completed for government agencies, nonprofit organizations and the academic community, provides the region with actionable information that can inform key policies and decisions. ★

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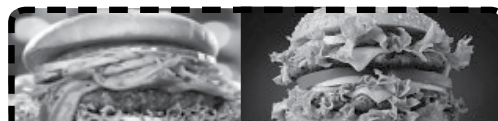


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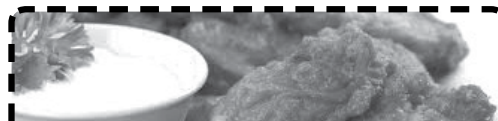


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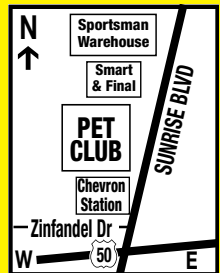
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
