Call to Students "Criminal Justice Shadow Day"

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

Sacramento County high school students are encouraged to register for the 3rd Annual "Criminal Justice Shadow Day." This unique program gives high school students an opportunity to job shadow professionals from various criminal justice agencies.

Based on the area of interest, students will be paired with prosecuting attorneys, defense attorneys, probation officers, law enforcement officers, investigators and judges to get a first-hand look at the criminal justice process and the different roles within the system. There will also be a presentation on crime scene investigations (CSI), evidence collection, and forensic science used to solve crimes.

This year's Criminal Justice Shadow Day will be held from 8 a.m. - 2 p.m., Friday, June 16, at the Board of Supervisors' Chambers in the Sacramento County Administration Building located at 700 H Street, Sacramento.

The program is open to current Sacramento County high school students (incoming 9th graders through 12th graders). Students will need to submit completed registration forms and a signed permission slip, which can be downloaded at www.sacda.org. The deadline to register is June 9, 2017.

Space is limited and on a first come, first served basis.

DA Anne Marie Schubert states, "Since its launch in 2015, close to 200 students from 56 schools across Sacramento County have participated in the Criminal Justice Shadow Day. The success of the program is a result of the partnerships we have with our criminal justice colleagues, and our shared commitment to engage with our youth and inspire them to pursue careers in the justice system."

The Criminal Justice Shadow Day is one of several DA youth programs designed to increase understanding and build positive relationships between youth and members of the criminal justice system.

Society For The Blind to Compete in National Fitness Challenge

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Sacramento nonprofit Society for the Blind is one of 13 groups across the nation – and one of only three in California – that are competing in the United States Association of Blind Athletes' and Anthem Blue Cross Foundation's fifth annual National Fitness Challenge. Society for the Blind and its competitors will provide more than 300 blind and visually impaired youth and adults with an opportunity to increase their physical fitness levels and live healthier, more active lives. Other California participants are Junior Blind in Los Angeles and Lighthouse for the Blind and Visually Impaired in the Bay Area.

"We are pleased to again partner with USABA to help break down barriers, and leverage technology to help those with vision impairments enjoy the physical and emotional benefits of exercise," said Brian Ternan, president of Anthem Blue Cross. "Together, we want to ensure that those with visual impairments are not denied the opportunity to lead an active life and have the opportunity to avoid the health risks that come from a sedentary lifestyle."

Research has consistently shown that individuals who participate in regular physical activity to improve their health have higher energy levels, a lower risk of health-related diseases, improved psychological health, and lower rates of depression and anxiety. Because of the many barriers and misconceptions about their abilities, approximately 70 percent of the nearly 56,000 children and youth who are blind and visually impaired in the United States do not participate in even a limited physical education curriculum.

When the National Fitness Challenge kicked off in Sacramento this spring, participants who signed up with Society for the Blind had a number of physically challenging activities to look forward to. In efforts to increase participants' levels and step counts, staff at Society for the Blind will be working with

dance instructors, personal trainers, judo instructors and more. In addition to raising their overall physical activity, participants will also become more aware of opportunities in their community. "Society for the Blind is honored and excited to again be a part of the National Fitness Challenge," said Shari Roeseler, executive director. "This partnership with USABA and Anthem raises awareness and, more importantly, participation of people with vision loss in health and fitness activities. We look forward to friendly challenges among our fellow participating agencies as we increase the physical fitness and overall health and wellness of our participants."

For more than 60 years, Society for the Blind has created innovative ways to empower individuals living with low vision or blindness to discover, develop and achieve their full potential. Society for the Blind has grown from a dedicated group of volunteers that included the Lions Clubs of America to a nationally recognized agency and the only comprehensive rehabilitative teaching center that provides services for a 27-county region of northern California. The nonprofit provides low-vision eye care, life and job skills training, mentorship, and access to tools to maintain independence for 6,000 youth, adults and seniors experiencing vision loss each year. Since its founding in 1976, USABA, a community-based organization of the United States Olympic Committee, has reached more than 100,000 blind individuals. Madam Ambassador Talks Diplomacy at Rancho Cordova Luncheon

- On May 19th, the Cordova Community Council hosted Eleni Tskapoulous Kounalakis as the guest speaker at their monthly Rancho Cordova Luncheon at City Hall.

Kounalakis is the daughter of a prominent Sacramento developer, and she helped create the Anatolia neighborhood of Rancho Cordova. In 2010, she was nominated by President Barack Obama to serve as the U.S. Ambassador to Hungary under Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. In April 2017, Kounalakis officially announced her bid for Lieutenant Governor of California.

At the luncheon, Kounalakis focused her discussion on her years

as the U.S. Ambassador to Hungary and her democratic theories, derived from her father’s teachings on Hellenistic history and early Greek values. She shared that her most meaningful experiences were meeting everyday people on the streets, as well as her interactions with American service people headed to or from Afghanistan, versus meeting other ambassadors and foreign ministers.

Connecting everything back to her experiences in Rancho Cordova, Kounalaki drew back the curtain on her experience and role as an American diplomat, and gave 100 guests signed copies of her book Madam Ambassador.



The City of Rancho Cordova is seeking applicants to fill a vacant City Council seat. Council Member Dan Skoglund, who had served on the City Council since 2004, passed away in April leaving a vacancy on the five-member City Council.

At the May 15th City Council meeting, Council Members voted to fill the seat through an application process which was launched as an online form on the City's website on May 16th. The City is accepting applications from Tuesday, May 16, 2017 through Tuesday, May 30, 2017 at 5 PM.

At the June 5th City Council meeting, applicants will be interviewed by the current City Council Members. The City Council will select and appoint one candidate at either the June 5th or June 19th City Council meeting. The City expects to swear in the new City Council Member on June 19th.


All applicants must be residents and registered voters within the city limits of Rancho Cordova. All applicants are required to disclose financial information and to file a Fair Political Practices Commission Statement of Economic Interest. 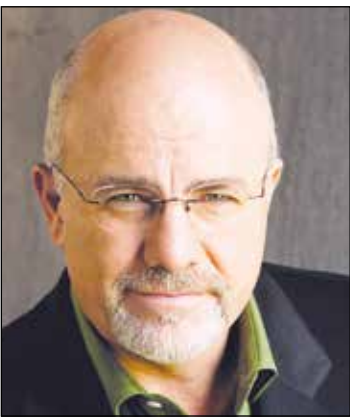

Just stay on course and stick with the plan, Dawn. Fifty isn't old. You two have plenty of time to get your finances in order, find a great home, and look forward to many great years ahead!

Will Next President be “Elected” by End Run Around the Constitution?

Opponents of the Electoral College seek to alter a process that has worked for well over two hundred years. Fueled by Hillary’s winning the popular vote yet denied the White House and unable to get two-thirds of the states as required to consider altering this part of the Constitution, some seek an end run around it instead. They say that the Electoral College is not democratic enough. They call their plan the National Popular Vote Plan. In it participating states would allocate their electoral votes to the winner of the national popular vote rather than the winner of the popular vote in their state.

There exists no language in the Constitution authorizing a popular vote for the executive branch of government. Such came about in 1824 after the Electoral College denied the presidency to Andrew Jackson, the most popular man in America due to his success in the Battle of New

Orleans in the War of 1812. His supporters, believing the denial to be an injustice, created a straw vote so that the people could participate in the election although this vote had no power.

Over time the media empowered it by treating it as the “legitimate” vote for the president belittling the College process as unfair and undemocratic. Seldom do they remind us that it works because we are not a democracy, but a republic, and that none of the branches of government are democratic; most especially the Senate and Supreme Court. Andrew Jackson had to wait until he could convince the seasoned citizen voters of the Electoral College that he was not too emotional for the office. He did so four years later in 1828. Moreover, today the media seldom cover the real election for the president in December such is their disdain for it.

Those unable to get a two-thirds vote to destroy the Electoral College have conceived a brilliant plan to do just

that without the constitutional amendment required. The plan is to have each state legislature commit their state to support the national popular winner instead of the candidate winning their state. When enough states do so that the Electoral College numbers exceed 270, remaining states will be required to support as well. Wham!! Almost without any public debate outside state legislatures, and seemingly overnight, the popular vote will replace the Electoral College as the means by which a president is elected. We would be back to a few highly populated states deciding for the rest of the country—so opposed by our Founders.

Ironically proponents ignorantly use a small portion of the Constitution to destroy a larger portion. They cite Article II, Section 1 which reads, “Each State shall appoint, in such manner as the legislature thereof may direct, a number of electors, equal to the whole number of Senators and Representatives to which the State may be

entitled in the Congress.” This, they say, gives state legislatures the right to award their electors as they see fit. Actually, the phrase allows the state legislatures appointing powers only. To suggest that they should have influence over their voting once selected, nullifies the reason for their existence. The Electoral College was to be a non-governmental body completely separate and unaccountable to the State Legislature once appointed, as per the rest of the section. Certainly the phrase did not authorize states to simply alter or dump Article II, Section 1 and Amendment 12 of the Constitution.

Moreover, the National Popular Vote Plan also violates Article I, Section 10. This prohibits states from entering into “alliances” with other states unless Congress gives its consent. Certainly agreeing states have entered into an alliance with one another to nullify the Electoral College, which mandates the right of individual states, through their people, to

chose the president.

At present ten states and the District of Columbia, a combined electoral vote total of 165, have come on board delivering about half the 270 electoral votes needed to impose this upon the rest of the country and nullify a long standing pillar of the Constitution. States voting to change the Constitution without amending it, as required by the document, are: California 55, Hawaii 4, Illinois 20, Maryland 10, Massachusetts 11, New Jersey 14, New York 29, Rhode Island 4, Vermont 3, and Washington 12. New York is the most recent addition joining the unconstitutional alliance March 25, 2014.

Unfortunately for those who revere the Constitution and the wisdom of the Founding Fathers to balance the vote so that rural American would not be disenfranchised by urban American, are emboldened by Hillary Clinton’s receiving the popular vote in the 2016 presidential election yet denied the presidency. Still, it is well to

remember that only California gave Clinton its popular vote. In the other forty-nine Donald Trump won the popular vote. Without the Electoral College Clinton would be president by the vote of but a single state, disfavored by all others. How is that just, balanced or even democratic?

Granted the Electoral College is the most difficult part of the Constitution to understand and is easy to oppose because it is undemocratic. Spend some time to understand it. A patriot and constitutionalist will see through the scheme to destroy it without the debate and transparency required in Article V. No end run around this document should ever be permitted.

Our Wounded Warriors can still take a big swing at life.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - I have been playing America's game ever since I was 3 years old. I love the smell of a stadium hot dog, fresh cut grass, and the sound of a ball when it hits the bat. Baseball is my sport. I enjoy it on and off the field, and I can truly say it is the most beautiful sport around. I've been blessed with the speed to run from home to first base in under 4.5 seconds; that's 90 feet! While I feel lucky to have such talent, I must admit I rarely consider what it would be like not to have these abilities.

I recently had the opportunity to spend a day with the Wounded Warriors Amputee Softball Team who is made up of some incredibly brave people...true heroes! Not just because they served in the

United States military, but because they are amazing, inspiring, and all around brave souls. These men and women were wounded in combat; some lost their arms, some lost their legs... but they never lost their will to succeed!

My dad has been active duty for over ten years now, and I have watched him deploy twice and come back home safely. I never once thought about my dad losing an arm or a leg. I admit feeling like he is indestructible, sort of assuming he would be okay. But the truth is, when a soldier goes to war they are risking their life: there is no guarantee they will be safe.

These warriors went to war just like my dad but they were injured, injured bad. I honestly didn't know what I was getting into meeting this team. I had never met anyone who lost an arm or leg, and I was a little

nervous at first. I kept thinking to myself "What if I offend them with my questions?" I sure didn't want to do that.

But as I watched these men and women play ball, I realized we share a love of the game. Their bases may not be

90 feet apart, but who cares?! These athletes are doing exactly what I do when I lace up my cleats and hit the field: they are playing the best game around: baseball!

I sat down with two of the players, Cody and Josh, to ask

them some questions about their past, and I as in awe by their stories. These athletes were just doing their job, the job they were trained to do, and then the unthinkable happened. They could have given up, but instead they found the courage and the drive to keep on going. They found a new cause to fight for, and refused to let anything get in their way.

Whether they believe it or not they are still heroes, every time they take the field or saddle up to the plate. These athletes get out on that ball field and run, dive for balls, scale the wall for that winning catch, and play their hearts out over and over again. I am sure they must be in pain from time to time, must occasionally stumble on their new legs, but they never give up.

By refusing to drop their glove to the ground and quit a game, they send a powerful message about never giving up in life.

I will leave you with something one of the players, Nick, told me, something that will stick with me for the rest of my life. Nick is amazing, his story is so inspiring—this hero has been through more than most of us will ever go through in our lifetime, and he still carries a smile on his face and lives life to the fullest. I asked all the players to sign my jersey, and along with his signature Nick added something special: his personal motto.

I hope it will inspire you as it does me, "Crush Life!"

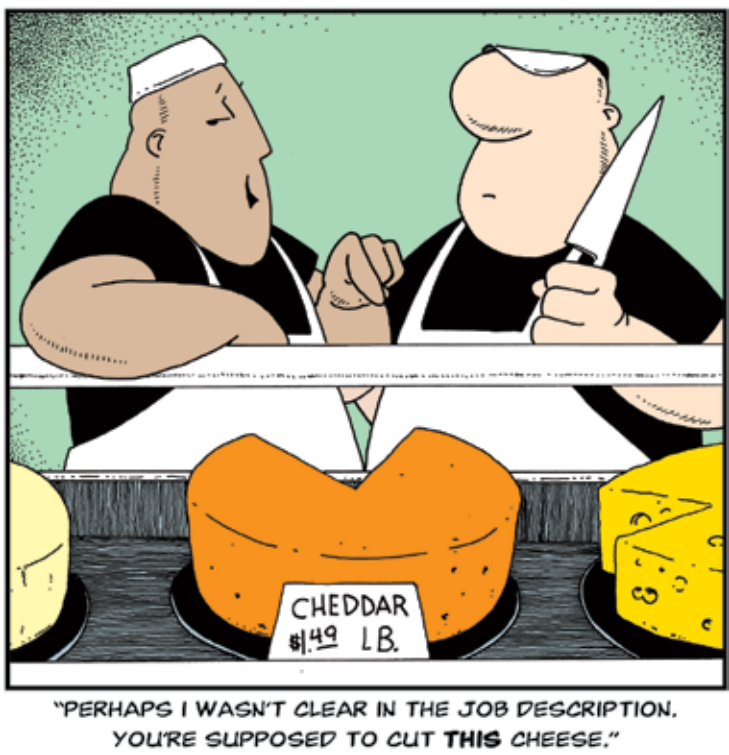

Top Border Cop: The Sanders Drug-Importation Bill Keeps Me Awake At Night

A 24-year-old woman recently crossed the Mexican border in Nogales, Arizona on foot, pushing an inconspicuous stroller. In addition to her two young children, it carried five pounds of fentanyl, a deadly opioid 50 times more powerful than heroin. Law enforcement intercepted the drug shipment this time. But many other packages get through, with fatal consequences.

As a recently retired 25 year public servant and former police chief of Nogales, I have seen firsthand the fentanyl crisis and the human carnage it wreaks. So it's with deep concern that I read about Sen. Bernie Sanders' bill to open the U.S. pharmaceutical market to foreign prescription medications.

The legislation, which would allow Americans to buy medicines directly from overseas suppliers, is intended to cut drug costs, since drugs from abroad are often cheaper than those in the United States. While well-intentioned, the legislation would increase the flow of illegal narcotics and counterfeit drugs laced with fentanyl into the United States. Local law enforcement, already strained by narco traffickers, would find their time and their resources spread perilously thin.

Police nationwide are struggling to address an opioid crisis so severe that it's dramatically increased mortality rates for middle-aged, white Americans. Addicts face a double peril as Mexican cartels often lace prescription opioids with fentanyl.

"They think they're taking oxy, but they're actually taking fentanyl, and it's lights out," one Drug Enforcement Administration special agent recently said. In metro Phoenix alone, 32 people in the past two years died after taking counterfeit OxyContin pills laced with fentanyl that came from Mexico. And in 2014, the number of fentanyl-related deaths nationwide more than doubled in a single year to 4,200.

In the past few years, we've lost firefighters and college grads, senior citizens and avid outdoorsmen, to fentanyl that was brought across the border. I've seen the corpses and stood in front of the grieving families. Their preventable and untimely deaths have haunted me on the clock and off.

If the Sanders drug importation bill is passed, the dead may soon include patients who thought they were taking legitimate drugs for legal purposes. Right now, the United States has the safest prescription-drug supply chain on the planet because of the Food and Drug Administration's restrictions on

foreign-drug importation.

Most medicines are produced domestically. The ones that aren't made in America are imported via closely monitored supply chains, to ensure that foreigners can't purposely or unwittingly ship fake drugs to Americans.

If we get rid of those protections and allow foreigners to ship medicines directly to Americans, bad actors will seize the chance to profit, even if it kills people.

Under the proposed bill, packages of medicines would come into the country largely unmonitored – and it is likely that many illicit drugs would slip in through the cracks. With the FDA unable to weed out fake and contaminated medicines from legitimate pills, responsibility will fall to local law enforcement.

But, the proposed legislation would put law enforcement in a no-win situation. We don't have the resources or the manpower to take on more responsibility. Innocent patients will die from counterfeit medications after taking what they think are legitimate prescription pills.

The Sanders bill is intended to save lives and help patients afford medications. But every way I look at it, this legislation will cost lives.

Defendant Convicted of Two Robberies
DATE: May 5, 2017
CASE: Pierre Cleveland (Case #15F05965)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kristen Andersen, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Pierre Cleveland was convicted by jury of two counts of robbery for two separate robberies which took place in September 2015. The jury also found that he used a gun during the course of the first robbery and was a felon in possession of a firearm.

On September 7, 2015 Cleveland went into a Chevron station on 4700 Florin Road with a firearm and robbed the sole employee. He stole money from the register and after the victim refused to get on the ground, he shot the firearm off two times before fleeing the scene. On September 29, 2015, Cleveland went to the Florin Shopping Center located at 6005 Florin Road. He robbed the victim of \$5,600.00 in cash. The victim had just withdrawn the money from the US Bank and was about to get in his car when Cleveland struck him over the head and stole his money. Cleveland then fled the scene in a car that was waiting for him in the Sears parking lot. Officers were able to locate Cleveland in a nearby parking lot after the license plate of the fleeing vehicle was obtained. Cleveland was detained by law enforcement and was found to have half of the victim's money and the gun from the first robbery on his person. Cleveland faces a maximum sentence of 27 years and 8 months in state prison. Sentencing is set for June 2, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. in Department 40 before the Honorable Raoul Thorbourne.

Defendant Convicted of Kidnapping & Assault with Intent to Commit Rape
DATE: May 9, 2017
CASE: Thomas Chavez (Case #15F04824)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Unit

Thomas Chavez was convicted by a Sacramento Superior Court judge of kidnapping and assault with the intent to commit rape.

On August 6, 2015, at approximately midnight, a woman was walking down Stockton Boulevard when Chavez pulled up behind her in his car. He jumped out of his car, grabbed her from behind, held an ice pick to her neck and forced her into his car. Chavez drove behind a nearby store to an isolated area. Fortunately, CHP officers who were nearby observed Chavez drive behind the store and went to investigate. The officers shined their light into the vehicle and heard the woman screaming for help. Chavez was arrested soon after.

The Honorable Laurel White found Chavez guilty of kidnapping and assault to commit rape. In addition, the court found Chavez had suffered prior convictions for sexual assault in 1988. Chavez faces a sentence of 30 years to life in state prison. Sentencing is set for June 2, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. in Dept 10.

Defendant Convicted for North Highlands Party Shooting
DATE: May 12, 2017
CASE: Ira Johnson (Case #15F04234)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Jeff Hightower, Homicide Unit

Ira Johnson was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of Rogelio Gastelum, and two counts of attempted murder. The jury also found true allegations that Johnson personally discharged a firearm causing death or great bodily injury.

On July 12, 2015, Ira Johnson and his friends attended a party in North Highlands. When asked to leave, the group started a fight. Johnson and another unidentified man pulled out guns and fired multiple shots into the crowd of partygoers, killing Rogelio Gastelum. Two other victims were shot, but survived their injuries.

Johnson faces a maximum sentence of 59 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 21, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

Defendant Convicted for Murder by Lying in Wait
DATE: May 12, 2017
CASE: Timothy Varmall (Case #15F01019)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Omar Singh, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Michael Bowman found Timothy Varmall guilty of the first-degree murder of Smurti Patel. Judge Bowman also found true the allegations that Varmall was personally armed and committed the murder by means of lying in wait.

Between September 2014 and February 2015, Timothy Varmall followed Smurti Patel and planned "coincidental" run-ins with her to make her think favorably of him. His purpose during those months was to find the best opportunity to kill Ms. Patel. On February 9, 2015, Varmall stalked Ms. Patel and followed her onto a light rail train. As they exited, Ms. Patel spotted Varmall and agreed to walk with him. As they walked across a dark lot, Varmall stabbed Ms. Patel seven times. Varmall fled the area while Ms. Patel staggered across the street to a restaurant, where medics were called to the scene. Ms. Patel died from her wounds on February 13, 2015. Varmall confided in one of Ms. Patel's friends that he murdered her because he was romantically interested in Ms. Patel and she rejected him.

The Court also found true that Varmall suffered two prior strike convictions for purposes of the Three Strikes Law. In 1994, Varmall was convicted of sexual penetration with a foreign object and forced oral copulation.

Varmall faces a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for June 9, 2017, at 10:30 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Bowman. ★

Cordova Preparing for New League

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - One more year is left for the Cordova High School athletic program in the Sierra Valley Conference.

After the 2017-18 school year ends at this time next year, Cordova will say good-bye to the SVC. At the start of the 2018-19 school year, Cordova and five other schools will be part of a new Division IV league that, at this time, doesn't have an official name.

Last month, the Sac-Joaquin Section's Board of Managers passed unanimously the 2018-22 league realignment cycle. The section's league realignment committee passed the measure in March, and most of the schools in the section also approved the changes for the next cycle. Currently, Cordova and the SVC are D-IV. But in the next league realignment cycle, Cordova leaves the SVC, which is being dropped to D-V, and joins a new league consisting of Florin, Valley, Johnson and West Campus, all of Sacramento, and Natomas.

According to Tom Pena, Cordova's athletic director, the athletic directors of the new D-IV league met recently. Two of the topics discussed were the name of the new league and hiring the league's first-ever commissioner. Pena said that the league hopes to have a name and new commissioner in place by June.

The passing of the 2018-22 league realignment cycle means changes for nearly half of the 192 high schools in the section. This includes school that range from Yuba City to Merced, and Tracy to El Dorado and Placer counties.
