Report Shows Poor State Leadership By Paul Scholl SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Center for Jobs and the

New Employment

Economy recently released its full analysis of the May employment data.

In the State Employment Growth Rankings, California dropped to 3rd place behind Florida and Texas Between May 2016 and May 2017, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) data shows the total number of employed in California increased by 250,000 (seasonally adjusted), or 13.4% of the total net employment gains in this period for the United States. California dropped to 3rd place behind Florida (which has a civilian working age population only 55% as large as California's) at 409,600 and Texas (68% as large) at

Measured by percentage change in employment over the year, California dropped to 33rd highest. Adjusted for population, California dropped to 35th.

The report shows California's Labor Force Participation Rate at its lowest level since 1976. California's participation rate (seasonally adjusted) in May declined to 62.0%, while the US rate dropped only 0.2 point to 62.7%. Improvement in the unemployment rate at both the California and national levels came from these contractions in the labor force numbers.

The seasonally adjusted California participation rate in May was at its lowest level since 1976. The unadjusted rate was at its second lowest level since 1976. In the recent May Budget Revision, the Governor again pointed to the increasing share of lower wage jobs as one of the prime causes of slowing state revenues growth.

"The level of wages has been revised downward, and cash receipts have been significantly below forecast." - Gov. Jerry Brown.

Brown continues to not take responsibility for the many lost high paying jobs leaving California for better business climates in other states. California ranks last in the United States for being probusiness. Over one-third of jobs growth over the past 12 months has been in the low wage industries.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Barry Broome, President and Chief Executive Officer of Greater Sacramento Economic Council, was the guest speaker at this month's Cordova Community Council Luncheon. Broome's presentation to the group painted his vision of what he thinks Sacramento area economics can be: a data and evidence-driven "megaregional" hub extending far beyond Sacramento. Broome is developing an inclusive strategy playing to the strengths of northern California. It's a methodology he has developed throughout his professional life.

An Ohio native, Broome was working in the inner city of Cleveland when the mayor of Toledo called, looking for a new economic development director. "He had been through seventeen," said Broome of infamous Carty Finkbeiner. Toledo was in

Divine Love: the Answer to Universal Health

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Jose de Dios Mata, of Elsa Illinois, will give a free lecture to the public in Carmichael on Thursday, June 29 at 7:30 p.m. The talk is titled "Divine Love: The Answer to Universal Health" and is sponsored by First Church of Christ, Scientist, Carmichael, as a gift to the community and will be given in the church edifice at 4949 Kenneth Ave., Carmichael, During the talk free parking and child care are included.

This lecture is about the power of God as divine Love and the direct influence for good it can have on lives individually and collectively when spiritually understood. It explores the Biblical basis of God as divine Love whose law Christ Jesus taught and practiced in his healing and teaching ministry. It brings out the relevance of his command "to love your neighbor as yourself" and the worldwide healing impact this can have.

The ideas in this lecture

make clear the importance of loving from the standpoint of God, Love, as our source and each of us as God's tenderly cared for children. Later, he worked for the government for a decade, the last five years of which were spent as a special agent in the Intelligence

Services. In his personal life, he faced an enormous challenge in early 1979. A relative's sudden illness, for which the doctors could find no cure, as well as his own almost complete loss of hearing due to a congenital lesion, which he was told would require immediate surgery or result in total deafness — and he could not continue in his position at work until he had surgery — forced him to seek a solution to these difficulties. He chose not to have surgery. After trying a series of different alternatives, in December of that year José de Dios was introduced to Christian

Science by a doctor, his guitar student, who knew of his reluctance towards conventional medicine and encouraged him to explore this system of spiritual healing. Both situations were quickly and completely healed solely through reading the textbook of this religion, Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mary Baker Eddy.

He soon realized that the spiritual understanding he had just achieved enabled him to heal others. After several years of proving the practical effect of these teachings in the healing of illness and other inharmonious situations of day-to-day life, he gave up his career in 1986 and decided to move to the United States to enter the public practice of Christian Science as his only profession. - Unwanted feral/stray cats are everywhere and the proverbial "kitten-season" is in full-swing. In an effort to help these newborn kittens, people often put them in a box and rush them to the local shelter. Too often the outcome for these kittens isn't what the well-intentioned person expected. So how can you change this outcome? Spay/ Neuter of stray, feral, and

abandoned cats will prevent hundreds of litters of kittens, literally thousands of cats yearly, from being born in areas where they are not wanted and struggle to survive on their own.

Sacramento Feral Resources (SacFerals) recently introduced the Feral Cats Project.

The focus of the Project is to recruit volunteers and involve residents county-wide to help humanely curb the feral cat population in Sacramento County through a Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program. We are looking for the best ways to reach

residents in communities throughout the County.

Feral cats are a neighborhood issue that can have good resolution when working together to TNR. In fact, Sacramento County supports TNR - not euthanasia, starvation, or relocation (which is illegal) of feral cats. The good news is that there are low-cost and free spay/neuter clinics available.

Residents who want to help improve the feral cat situation can learn more about the Project, feral cats, TNR, feral colony assistance, and other volunteer opportunities at monthly Free Feral Cats Workshops. Workshops open to the general public. Meetings are held at 5605 Marconi Ave in Carmichael. The Workshop Schedule, class descriptions, and sign-up information is available online: http://www.sacferals.

Why establish a Feral Cats Project? In 2013 SacFerals introduced a public website to offer resources and assistance to anyone with feral cat issues. Over time, traffic to the website as well as requests for help have

substantially increased. During the past two years, SacFerals has received reports of more than 9,000 feral/stray cats. The need for assistance has out-paced the current volunteer staff.

With an estimated 98,000 -220,000 feral cats in Sacramento County, as the saying goes, "It takes a village" to make a huge dent in reducing the number of litters born in the County every year and to ultimately control and reduce the community feral cat population in Sacramento

The city was teetering on bankruptcy, but it was worse, said Broome. "The river caught fire and the lake was dead," he said. Once a burgeoning industrial city, Toledo had fallen on tough times. The Cuyahoga River was so polluted by dumped industrial waste that in 1969 it famously caught fire. The Cuyahoga is a tributary for Lake Erie, which around 1960, began garnering headlines for massive fish die-offs, algal blooms and yet more pollution. By the late 1980s, Toledo was situated in what would become known as "The Rust Belt," as recession and automotive industry struggles deeply impacted the local economy.

After the first six applicants turned down the job with Finkbeiner, Broome accepted and was instrumental in brokering a deal to keep Jeep manufacturing in Toledo, where it had been located since World War I. The new facility required hundreds of homes and business properties to be acquired and a river to be rerouted (undoing an old WPA project that had moved it from its original path), but was successful.

Broome then headed to Michigan. A 2003 Chicago Tribune article had this to say about Broome: "He hits the ground and the place starts to shake," says Don Parfet, a fourth-generation Upjohn heir. A sign taped to Broome's door in the cramped offices of Southwest Michigan First, Kalamazoo's non-profit economic development agency, reads, "Bull, China Shop."'

Since then, Broome served as CEO and president of the Greater Phoenix Economic Council, bringing in approximately 260 companies before being hired in late 2014 to come to Sacramento. He doesn't seem to have lost any

a "no guts, no glory" attitude. His experience, including Toledo, which he called "a do or die situation for that community," has enabled him to collectively lure and retain hundreds of companies, thousands of jobs, and raise over a billion dollars of investment in

economic development. California is sorely lacking in a statewide economic plan, according to Broome, comparing California to states like New York and Texas, which have such plans and are consequently financially healthier than California. He is carefully cultivating a regional brand for northern California, working with Sacramento and other counties to identify and consolidate an identity. "It's so impossible to work together without understanding how assets work and connect together," said Broome.

Broome's approach to economic development digs deep into community nuts and bolts, identifying each piece and showing it to its best advantage. Highlighting infrastructure, workforce development and learning to move beyond what Broome called "provincial thinking" are integral parts of Sacramento's economic future.

Community services (infrastructure) such as transportation, schools, shopping, arts and entertainment, cost and quality of life and employment opportunities are all vital to recruiting and retaining a talented, educated workforce, which is then attractive to companies looking to hire or

relocate, according to Broome. While Sacramento has long been prone competing with, say San Francisco, Broome is an advocate for pooling area resources. Greater Sacramento has partnered with the Bay Area Council to promote the megaregion brand. The move is intended to make the

of his momentum and brings area a key player in a global economy. California consistently ranks lowest among the 50 states for being "business friendly." Broome wants to change that and be what he calls, "The California Option, where people invest when looking at California."

Broome says Greater Sacramento receives dozens of inquiries every week from businesses and individuals looking at locating in or relocating to the Sacramento area, and the numbers are expected to grow. Concerns regarding things such as cost of living, taxes or litigation in the state are frequent and not without merit, but Broome has a track record and a plan to prove how desirable and obtainable life and business in Sacramento, and surrounding communities like Rancho Cordova, can be.

Easy access to public transportation, the highway system, farm fresh dining, world class universities, arts and culture, affordable commercial and residential real estate are all hallmarks of Sacramento area living, says Broome. Further enhancements such as making Sacramento part of a high-tech corridor, creating a university research park, expanding river front possibilities and developing a thriving corporate center are investments in the future.

"We need to have a different conversation," Broome maintains. Creating a megaregion with its own brand, sharing analytics with the communities, removing politics from the equation and emphasizing northern California's assets, will lead to tangible results and effective decision making. Replacing business as usual will allow California to compete on larger stages, regionally and internationally, and stop other states like Texas from poaching businesses and talent. According to Broome, "Texas is taking our jobs while we're not looking."



Street Rehabilitation Begins in Cordova Meadows

The City of Rancho Cordova recently began work on its 2017 Street Rehabilitation Project, a \$4.1 million publics works project to improve driver and pedestrian safety and comfort, as well as stormwater drainage, in the Cordova Meadows neighborhood.

The project is supported by the City's Community Enhancement Fund and includes new asphalt overlay, sidewalk and ramp replacements, and minor stormwater upgrades.

The stormwater upgrades have been completed throughout the


and protecting, restoring, and water supply. My only question is: what about the needs of Northern California citizens?






umn next week too. Keep cool!



What to do with the leftover?

Dear Dave,

When you use the envelope system, what should you do with any leftover money?

Dear Mandy,

My suggestion would be to carry it over to the next month. Lots of folks don't use all the money in their clothing envelope during a month. There's nothing wrong with letting a little extra build up in one of your categories if you don't spend it all in a given month or two.

You should be hitting the budget pretty close each month on categories like food. Getting out of debt and managing your money wisely doesn't mean going hungry. If you do end up with a little left over in the food

that's food-oriented. But it's okay to carry a few categories over from month to month. Just make sure you don't get crazy and blow that money on something outside the intended category, or on stuff you really don't need.

Too much risk

Dear Dave,

I have some company stock my grandparents bought for me years ago. Would be a good idea to cash out the stock and roll it into an IRA?

- Dylan

Dear Dylan,

Technically, you wouldn't be rolling it into an IRA. You would cash it out and use the money to establish a Roth IRA. And yes, I would do that.

It was very kind of your grandparents to buy you a gift like this, but I think you can do better. You didn't mention an amount, but let's say you've got \$10,000 in that company's stock. Now,

had \$10,000 sitting on the table? Most people, myself included, would say no because there's too much risk. I wouldn't advise having the majority of your wealth — the highest percentage of your net worth — tied up in one single company. That's bad news.

So yes, I would sell that stock and use the money to fund a Roth IRA or multiple Roth IRAs. I invest my Roth IRA money in mutual funds that have a solid track record of outperforming the S&P 500 for 10 years or longer.





Getting Back to the Constitution in Education

In an executive order (EO) issued April 26, President Donald Trump ordered a rollback of what he termed "a federal power grab" in education. Constitutionally this order is profound and long

The order begins, "By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, and in order to restore the proper division of power under the Constitution between the Federal Government and the States... it is hereby ordered as follows." It instructs Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos to review and report on regulations and directives as far back as the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Highlighted for her review were the General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) April 30, 1970—Dec. 10, 2015, the Department of Education Organization Act (DEOA) Dec. 10, 2015, and the Every Student Succeeds Act also of Dec. 2015, which replaced George w. Bush's No Child Left Behind with Obama's

The word education is not found in the Constitution, nor

Common Core.

ment to the Constitution has been added moving it from a state to a federal prerogative. Instead, from its inception, the Constitution protected the philosophy of federalism, (shared government), the federal government to manage foreign, the states domestic policy. Some ill-informed might argue that certainly the words "general welfare" in the document included education but this phrase was restricted to seven areas (Article I, Sec. 8, Clauses 2-9) specifically identifying what was to be general welfare, with education excluded.

Otherwise, the federal government might conclude that they should manage everything in the name of general welfare. This interpretation could destroy the Constitution as a restrictive document on governmental power. And this is what was meant by the words in the Trump executive order "to restore the proper division of power under the Constitution between the Federal Government and the

Until 64 years ago the federal government honored this division of power leaving education to the states as constitutionally designed. Their first major inroad into this area was the creation of The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare (HEW) on April 11, 1953. Heretofore both health and education were understood to be state prerogatives only. President Jimmy Carter signed the bill creating the Department of Education on October 17, 1979; without constitutional authority. This action resulted from the immense pressure applied by the "all powerful" teacher union—the

inferred, and no new amend- National Education Agency (NEA)—which sought to nationalize education removing it from local control. Carter rewarded their support in his election with the new cabinet post.

> But an executive order is not enough and can be rescinded by the next president, as Trump is doing to his predecessor. The EO restricts itself to "under the law" and Congress (both parties) clearly passed these major education laws identified in the order. Trump must more fully hinge his argument on the Constitution and on the doctrine of federalism, which preceded the Constitution as a carry-over from the Articles of Confederation, our first national constitution. He should do so by arguing that he has no authority to enforce law that violates the separation of powers as created by the Constitution, which he has sworn to uphold. He must also encourage Congress to rescind those laws or, through the states, create a new amendment to the Constitution using Article 5 of the Constitution. Otherwise this immediate victory, his EO, will be short lived.

One of the first questions I ask students in an into to government class, since every textbook has a chapter on federalism is, "Who cares most whether Johnny can read, his mother or federal bureaucrats located hundreds often thousands of miles away." It is generally agreed his mother does and is in a position to do most to remedy the problem by direct access to his teacher and school and can run for the school board if not satisfied.

A second question, "Who suffers most if the school fails Johnny?" Again, his mother as responsible bureaucrats left long term with the consequences of their failure with Johnny. As a life-long student or instructor I have never seen evidence that the federal government can administrate the needs of Johnny better than most parents.

My best and most caring teacher did her "magic" in a remote country school of two rooms; one a library the other a classroom. She taught all grades 1-8 at once with two or more students from each grade. No electronic aid or devices—only a chalkboard and books. Government policies and money raining down

have moved on and she is from afar generally discourage individuality in teaching and creativity. Instead they often spawn collective thought, (the enemy of real education), by their distribution of money favoring some ideas and groups.

> Federalism and the wisdom of the Founding Fathers to retain it and to specifically list the powers of the federal government in Article I Section 8 leaving all other powers, in this case education, at state and local levels, was brilliant. Hopefully the Trump E O will strike a new public debate eventually removing all federal influence and funding in

education. Trump is not yet a constitutionalist but this move alone shows him closer than the vast majority of presidents in my lifetime.

Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

- Does your organization or school have a project you feel could improve our waterways and keep them clean? The Sacramento County Department of Water Resources (DWR) could help you make that project come to life. The window has opened for submission to the 2017-2018 Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant program.

Schools and community groups are encouraged to review program requirements and submit applications to the Stormwater Quality Program for review. This is the thirteenth year DWR has funded environmental efforts to protect our waterways.

The grant is open to the following: schools and student groups; service clubs, youth organizations; homeowner's associations; community and neighborhood groups; not-forprofit groups; and informal groups with innovative ideas. Individuals and for-profit groups are not eligible.

DWR will offer up to \$2,500 for each project chosen for the grant. The amount will depend on the needs of the organization. Last year's grant winners included Will Rogers Elementary, Mira Loma High and Sierra Oaks School. This will also be the first year the grant will be available to

non-profit community groups.

The final date to apply is July 1, 2017. Eligible projects must be located within the Sacramento County Stormwater Utility Boundaries or directly affect the residents of these areas. 

Defendant Convicted of Murder, Robbery in Marijuana Transaction

DATE: June 1, 2017 CASE: Kane Thompson (Case #16FE009089)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kari Reeve, Homicide Unit

Kane Thompson was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder and robbery of Nicholas Jaffray. The jury also found true the special circumstance that the murder was committed in the commission of a robbery.

On May 7, 2016, Kane Thompson met Nicholas Jaffray at a marijuana dispensary. Mr. Jaffray was a marijuana grower who was at the dispensary to sell his products. Thompson represented himself to be a marijuana delivery man and legitimate marijuana vendor. Thompson then told Mr. Jaffray that he would like to do business with him. Later that day, Thompson and Mr. Jaffray met in an apartment complex parking lot and began to negotiate a marijuana transaction while sitting in Mr. Jaffray's car. As a third man with a shotgun walked out from the apartment complex towards the car, Thompson pulled out a handgun and told Mr. Jaffray "not to get killed over a pound of weed." Mr. Jaffray attempted to flee in his vehicle, but Thompson shot and killed him as he was exiting the parking lot. Thompson and the unknown accomplice stole Mr. Jaffray's backpack containing the marijuana before fleeing the scene.

Thompson faces a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for July 14, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 12 before the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard.

Defendant Sentenced for Robberies

The Honorable Raoul Thorbourne sentenced Pierre Cleveland to 25 years in prison. On May 4, 2017, a jury convicted Cleveland of two counts of robbery for two separate robberies. The jury also found that Cleveland used a gun during the course of the first robbery and

was a felon in possession of a firearm.

On September 7, 2015, Cleveland went into a Chevron station on Florin Road with a firearm and robbed the sole employee. He stole money from the register and after the victim refused to get on the ground, he shot the firearm off two times before fleeing the scene. On September 29, 2015, Cleveland went to the Florin Shopping Center and robbed another victim of \$5,600 in cash. The victim had just withdrawn the money from his bank and was about to get in his car when Cleveland struck him over the head and stole his money. Cleveland then fled the scene in a car that was waiting for him in the Sears parking lot. Officers were able to locate Cleveland in a nearby parking lot after the license plate of the fleeing vehicle was obtained. Cleveland was detained by law enforcement and was found to have half of the victim's money and the gun from the first robbery on his person.



Todd Williams was convicted by a jury of two counts of felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true a gang allegation on both counts.

Todd Williams is a validated member of the G-Mobb/Guttah criminal street gang. On August 17, 2016, Williams was in a car that law enforcement attempted to stop. Williams fled from the car, and officers gave chase. When Williams was apprehended, he was found to be in possession of two loaded firearms.

Williams has a prior 2010 strike conviction for accessory after the fact to attempted murder with a gang enhancement. He previously served 7 years in prison for this offense.

Williams faces a maximum sentence of 17 years and 8 months in prison. Sentencing is set for July 21, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Russell Hom. ★





Trio Looking to Make Impact in Cordova Football

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -

On a warm afternoon earlier this month, the Cordova High School varsity and frosh/soph football teams descended onto the turf at Lancers Stadium.

After spending more than an hour pumping iron inside the school's weight room, the players on both teams worked on drills in T-shirts and shorts participated in offensive drills that ranged from 7-on-7 to running plays. Among the players were three girls on both teams.

I asked around campus, and have been told she's one of the best female athletes on campus. I felt pretty sure she knew what she was doing. She can handle herself."

Pooni added, "I've always had an interest in it. I wanted to show people that just because

Pooni admitted that she had limited confidence when practices first started. But as each days and time in the weight room and football field passes, she's continued to build her selfesteem to a higher level.
