Fresh Off the Farm to Your Fork *Soil Born Offers a Special Local Service*

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova's well known urban agriculture education project, Soil Born Farms, is gearing up for its Spring/Summer Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) season, and it still has spots available for community members who would

like to eat seasonal produce, support local agriculture and contribute to a number of education programs offered through the farm.

Working in the field to harvest this week's CSA, Elle Huftill-Balzer, a CSA manager, picks Deep Purple scallions while another group of Soil Born's staff focuses on D'Avignon radishes and Jericho lettuce. Also among them are a volunteer and a first-year apprentice.

"We're not just a production farm, we're an educational farm. We run Harvest Sacramento [and] A Garden in Every School Symposium, working with school gardens. We have youth groups come out here and work

in the Youth Garden; we do tours, field trips, nutritional outreach with adults and kids, as well as the adult apprenticeship program," said Huftill-Balzer, who has been with Soil Born since 2010 and has run the CSA for the past two years.

When purchasing the Soil Born CSA, buyers get much more than just a box of

vegetables: they are supporting a number of programs that cultivate community knowledge and futures in agriculture. This includes opportunities for CSA members themselves, who are invited to get to know the farm and the people who grow their food.

"People who come out to the

Rancho Cordova Participates in Building Safety Month

Building Codes: Driving Growth through Innovation, Resilience and Safety

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Each year, the City of Rancho Cordova participates in Building Safety Month (BSM) to help individuals, families and businesses understand what it takes to create safe and sustainable structures. BSM is a campaign developed by the International Code Council, and this year 57,000 members will educate people worldwide during the month of May.

The City's Building and Safety Division consists of certified building safety and fire prevention experts who inspect buildings and review construction plans to ensure the places where residents live, learn, work, and play are safe.

"We respond before the first responders," said City Building Official Joseph Cuffe. "Our job is really about public safety and ensuring that the structures we use every day do not pose risks to our health or safety."

Rancho Cordova is in a unique position given the significant building and economic development occurring now and in the future. To spread awareness about opportunities in the building safety industry as well as the City's Building and Safety Division's role in ensuring the safety of new and existing buildings, the City of Rancho Cordova has planned various local BSM activities throughout the month of May.

This year's BSM theme is focused on code officials' role in community safety and economic growth. The City will be sharing building safety tips and resources throughout Building Safety Month on its Facebook page and at events to help inform the public of safety codes, permitting processes, and opportunities in the building safety field. *Source: City of Rancho Cordova* ★

Record Setting Kids Day Rocks a Sports Theme

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - They came. They jumped. They giggled. And when it was all over, the 28th Annual Kids Day in the Park went into the record books as the largest ever.

With a record 140 exhibitors including 20 sports leagues and providers, children and their families, indeed, were able to "Get Your Game On" – this year's theme. Attendance was set at more than 6,000 – the largest turnout ever.

Presented by the City of Rancho Cordova, Sacramento County Department of Health and Human Services, and a host of other sponsors, Kids Day showcased a wide range of youth sports and more than 150 free things to do. The event was produced by the Cordova Community Council.

The event also marked the Sacramento County kick-off for National Children's Mental Health Awareness Day.

With pennants rippling in the breeze of a picture perfect day, children tried their hand at rugby, soccer, cheerleading, gymnastics, martial arts, softball, baseball, basketball, football, golf, tennis – even French Parcours – all aimed at keeping kids healthy and active. Event partner Sports Stars Sports Jam led the way.

Among the other fun, free attractions were off-road ATV simulators, A US Air Force thrill exhibit, climbing wall, giant obstacle course, arts and crafts and more.

Kids learned about bike safety at the popular Police Activities League (PAL) Bike Rodeo during where 80 bicycles donated by the Sheriff's Toy Project were given away to lucky children, along with hundreds of free bike safety helmets.

While Kids Day is all about fun, children's health is the primary objective. Organizers worked with health providers from Sacramento County and the Folsom Cordova Unified School District to present free hearing, vision, dental and school readiness screenings to help get kids off to a healthy start. Parents received tips on how to prepare their children for school, how to obtain mental health resources, and how to access a wide range of public and private services for their kids.

"What an amazing day for the children of our community," said Amy Hiramoto, the event chair person who has been active at Kids Day since its inception in 1989. "Rancho Cordova cares about its kids, and this is a special day to show it." ★

Construction to Start Next Year in Rio del Oro Development

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

The planned Rio del Oro development in Rancho Cordova consists of 3,828 acres of land located east of Sunrise, between Douglas and White Rock. "All of downtown Sacramento can fit in Rio del Oro," said Michael LaFortune, Senior Development Director for Easton Development Company. "Careful planning was done to make sure Rio was woven into the existing city fabric."

LaFortune spoke in tandem with Price Walker, Elliott Homes Vice President of Project Development, about Rio del Oro at the Rancho Cordova April Luncheon at City Hall on April 21.

"Trails, parks and open space are why people will come to a community and more importantly, why people will stay in a community," LaFortune said. "Our open space network is both complex and diverse."

The 800 acres of open space include more than 500 acres of wetland preserve, 16 miles of bike trails, and a large community park of over 100 acres as well as smaller park spaces. Six elementary schools, two middle schools and one high school will satisfy the K-12 requirements. The project also offers 157

acres of commercial space and 90 of office space, with 269 acres of industrial area. "That may not resonate or sound just how large that is, but that will then translate to development square footage," LaFortune said. "For example, we have over 1 million potential square footage in office, 1.5 million in regional retail, 2.5 million sq. ft of industrial. This is a significant opportunity as this city grows."

Linda Budge, vice mayor of Rancho Cordova, said, "We're at a point where all of a sudden, Rancho Cordova is growing again, growing residentially, growing commercially. When we grow the commercial and the industrial spaces - that of course means another growth in jobs to add to our job base that we have already. And that's an extremely positive situation for us to be in."

Cyrus Abhar, Rancho Cordova City Manager, said planning for this area was conceived before Rancho Cordova even became a City in 2003. "The city's job is to oversee the development process, so myself and my team were involved from the planning aspect to engineering to financing of the project," said Abhar.

Communities and people change over the long period of time required to go to completion of a project like this. "So we have a thing called a

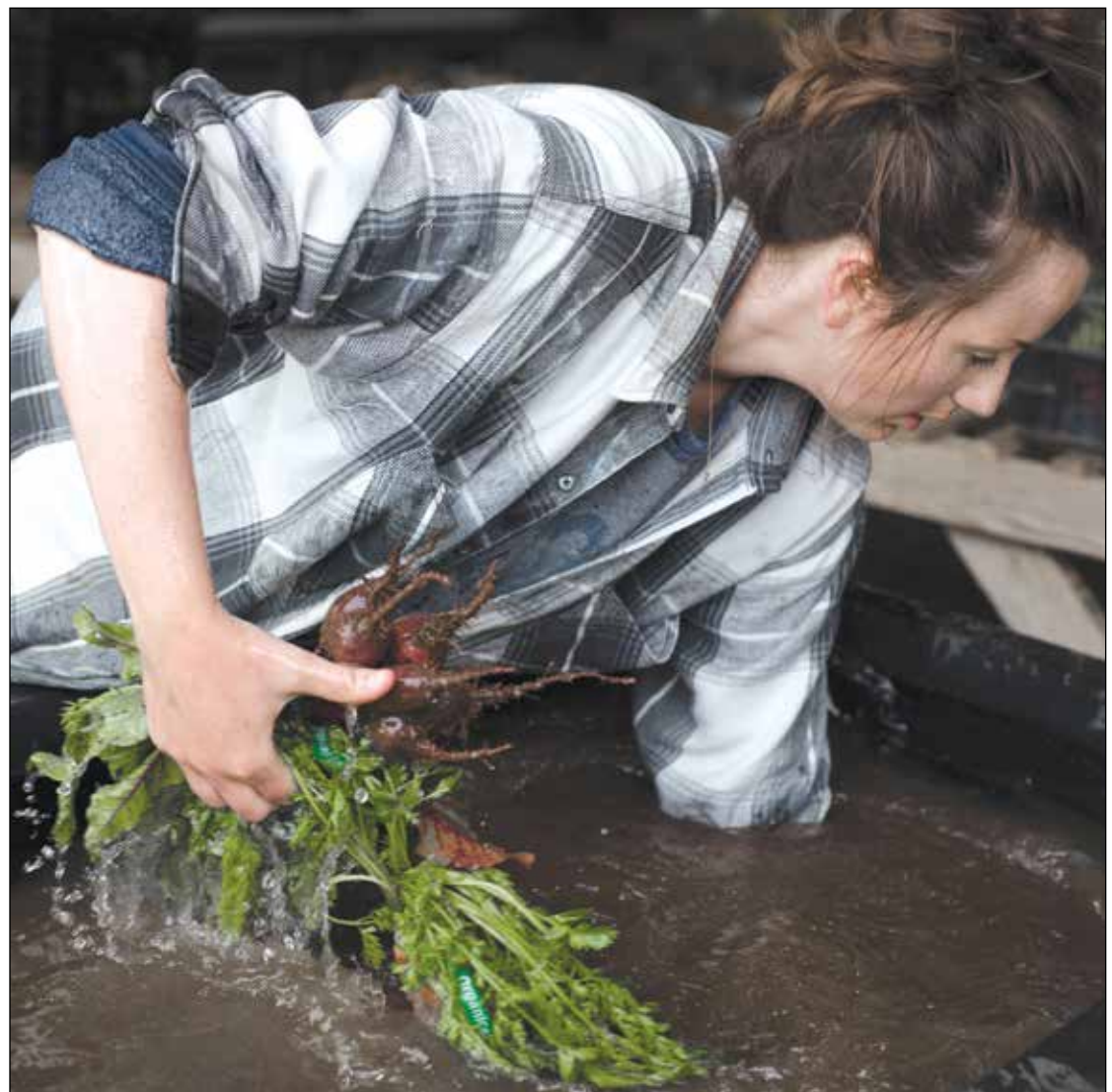
development agreement, and the development agreement can be revised from time to time," said Budge. "You want to ensure that in your formal approvals you've given everybody the ability to make a different decision if they need to in subsequent years."

Phase One will involve about 450 lots starting in the southwest corner of the project, near Costco. "The first houses are the most expensive to build, because you're bringing infrastructure to them," said Walker. "But it's our anticipation that hopefully we'll be under construction early next year; we'll see how that works out." Planned residential acreage is 1,500 plus for single family residential, 280 plus for medium density and 95 plus acres for high density residential.

Though Easton Development and Elliott Homes are two different organizations, they have functioned as one entity in getting this project approved. LaFortune has been with Easton for 12 years and has an MBA from UC Davis. Walker holds a degree in urban planning from San Francisco State and has been with Elliott Homes for the last 27 years. The men coach Little League together; in fact, Walker said that their team is undefeated right now.

"Neighborhoods, that's what we do," said Walker. "We create neighborhoods." ★

farm to pick up their box, they'll bring their kids and go for a walk around the farm. It brings them out of their normal life and see, "This is what agriculture looks like, this is where my food comes from," said Huftill-Balzer. CSA members are also invited to a number of the farm's calendar events that range from Introduction to Urban Backyard Beekeeping on May 6th to Homegrown Herbalism on June 6th.

A Soil Born CSA box includes 8-10 of that week's organic, seasonal fruits and vegetables. Purple cherry tomatoes, figs and peaches, white-striped eggplant, and other unique varieties can all be expected during

the program's 24-week run from May 24th through November 1st.

"We cover the broad categories, but then there are the fun varieties within that," said Huftill-Balzer.

Community members may sign up to receive a box every week or every other week, with pickup on Wednesdays at any of three locations in Sacramento. The farm is open to the public M-F 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Saturdays 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., closed Sundays. Office hours



are M-F, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Their American River Rancho location is at 2140 Chase Dr., Rancho Cordova, CA. For more information on Soil Born and their CSA program, visit them online at soilborn.org or call 916-363-9685. ★

Rancho Cordova Station 62 on Bradshaw when he got the notice of a collapsed Highway 50 overpass, which was under construction at the time, at Folsom and La Riviera. Three cars had been caught underneath and one construction worker was killed. "We just turned around and went back to 62 because we had the State heavy rescue rig, that had big jacks, and welders," Shannon said. "... we had gasoline spilling and everything else. We finally found the people that were trapped and got them out."

Thinking back over his more than 25 years with the fire department, Shannon bemoans the fact that he didn't keep a daily log; a lot of the events tend to run together after a long period of time. "It was a great job, it really was; very satisfying," Shannon said. He enjoyed the breakfast. "The pancakes were good, and I saw people I hadn't seen in a long time."

Kellenberger enjoyed hearing about some of the incidents that happened back in the 70s, 80s and 90s. "There are big differences between now and then, primarily because of the newer technology we have now, like turnouts, breathing apparatus, engines, trucks, medics,

etc.," Kellenberger said. "What remained the same, are the calls; helping people during difficult times."

This was Kellenberger's first year with this event. "I hope to be at this firehouse for the next few years," Kellenberger said. "I plan to invite them over for an annual breakfast each year."

Doug Leard has lived in Rancho Cordova for more than 50 years, and went to high school in Folsom, because Cordova High School had not yet been built. He worked with the fire department for 30 years, starting out as a firefighter and retiring as Captain.

Leard recalled a fire in a strip mall off of Coloma Road. "My firefighter is eager," Leard said. "He jumps off and is getting ready to go in. It had a cantilever porch where the porch extends out over the sidewalk, there's no posts. It's supported from the inside. Well, the inside had burned off. ... He wants to go. I said no, hold off, hold off. In just a few minutes that whole porch came down. He would have been in there and that whole thing would have come down behind him. Maybe cut off the flow in his hose."

Even though situations are dangerous they don't seem that

way, because the risks are calculated. "You do your training and you follow the rules, you're okay," Leard said. "There are a few times when you run into things, you're on a big forest fire or something and the fire's all around you, and you think 'Uh-oh!' But you manage to get through it."

The retired firefighters are members of the Mills One Club that meets at Mills Station at the Mather Field Road light rail station. "That was the hub of the community at one time, it was Mills Station," said Mike Spaich, currently president of the Club. Initially each of the Sacramento areas had their own volunteer fire department that gradually switched to professional firefighters. "Little by little, this would be in the late 70s and the 80s, the mergers all took place," Spaich said.

The last merger was in December 2000 when American River Fire Department and Sacramento County Fire Protection District merged to form the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District. "Metro Fire," serves a population of over 738,000 in a 358 square mile service area, according to the District's website, <http://metrofire.ca.gov>. ★

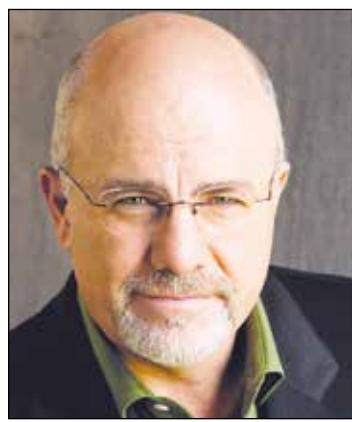

Dave Says

Giving beyond your means

Dear Dave,
My wife and I are debt-free except for our home, and we're on Baby Steps 4 and 5. Recently, we were asked to make a large donation to a charity we already support. We don't have the full cash amount they asked for on hand, and after hearing that, they said we could make monthly installment payments until the donation amount was paid in full. We're hesitant to do this because it seems a bit like debt to us. What do you think?

Dear Ben,
Well, it's not debt. There would be no repercussions, other than guilt, if you couldn't make the full donation. So, it's not debt. To be honest though, I don't engage in that kind of stuff when it comes to giving.
My wife and I do all our giving — except for our tithe to our local church — through our family foundation. Sometimes we'll do this giving in a couple of installments, but it's not because we don't have the money. It's generally a situation where we're walking with the charity or ministry throughout the year,

and we're observing and assessing the need.

I'd be hesitant to give a gift when I don't have the money. Most of the time, approaches like this fall under the heading of manipulation. You're being pushed beyond your means. Most giving of this type, biblically speaking, would be from surplus. And right now, you don't have the surplus.

I'm kind of uncomfortable with this, Ben. I don't engage in making gift promises beyond what I have. It's not debt, but it kind of starts to feel like it, and it's not so much living beyond your means as it is giving beyond your means. That's just another reason it doesn't strike the right chord with me.

Dear Dave,
I am 18 years old and home-schooled. I want to continue my education this fall, and my dad works at a college near our home. I would get free tuition, but there's another college farther from home that I like just as much — but it's more expensive. On the plus side, it is a Christian school, and my faith is important to me. What do you think I should do?

Dear Braden,
Free tuition is a major plus in my book. At the same time, I can

understand your desire to get out from under mom and dad's wings a little bit. Just don't make the mistake of thinking that a school, church or anything else is completely Christian. You'll meet some of the wildest characters ever at a Christian school, just like you would at a public university. However, you would have the advantage of a built-in spiritual support network.

All things considered, and since you mentioned your faith specifically, I'd probably choose the Christian school. But I wouldn't go into debt to make it happen. There's absolutely no reason why you can't work and go to school at the same time. Pay it as you go. I did it, and I finished with good grades in four years. It's a little bit harder way to go, but it's a lot better than ending up with a ton of student loan debt when you're through!

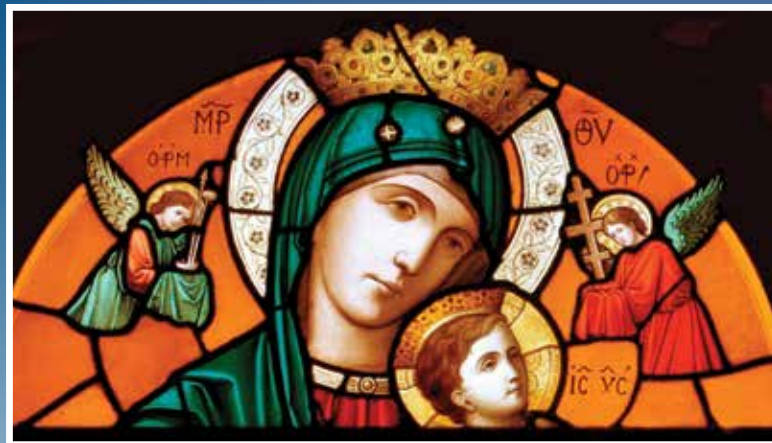

Defendant Convicted of Carjacking, Discharging Firearm, Evading
DATE: April 24, 2017
CASE: Jamar Stevens (Case #15F07245)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Scott Schweibish, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Jamar Stevens was convicted by a jury of carjacking with a use of a firearm allegation found true. Stevens was also convicted of shooting into an occupied dwelling, negligent discharge of a firearm, being a felon in possession of a firearm and evading police officers.

On November 28, 2015, officers attempted to stop Stevens, who was driving a stolen vehicle. Stevens attempted to elude the police, driving onto a dead-end street and then fleeing on foot into a backyard. Stevens tried to kick in the backdoor of a home before firing a single round into the sliding glass door to gain entry. Once inside, Stevens demanded the victim's car at gun point. Stevens fled in the victim's truck and was seen by officers, resulting in a second vehicle chase. When the truck became disabled, Stevens again fled on foot into the football stadium at Luther Burbank High School. Stevens tried to get inside the concession building by firing another round at the door, which did not work. Stevens finally gave himself up to officers.

Stevens' criminal history dates back to 2004, including multiple convictions for domestic violence, vehicle theft, evading police officers and resisting arrest.

Stevens faces a maximum sentence of 29 years and 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for June 2, 2017, at 9:00 am in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

Defendant Sentenced for Series of Sexual Assaults, Robberies

CASE: Jerry West Jr. (Case #15F05919)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Jones, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Shelleyanne Chang sentenced Jerry West Jr. to 446 years to life in prison. On February 7, 2017, a jury convicted West of two counts of forcible oral copulation, two counts of assault with intent to commit forcible oral copulation, attempted forcible copulation, two counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm, kidnapping for purposes of robbery and oral copulation, four counts of robbery and carjacking. The jury also found true multiple use of a firearm

Defendant Convicted of Child Sexual Assault

CASE: Maurice Higgs (Case #16FE017541)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Bruce Chang, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Maurice Higgs was convicted by a jury of three counts of child sexual assault on a child 10 years or younger, two counts of child sexual assault by force and one count of child sexual assault on a child under 14 years of age.

Beginning February 2012 until February 2014, Maurice Higgs sexually assaulted a female child on multiple occasions when she was 5 to 7 years old. Higgs threatened the victim on at least one occasion that he would physically harm her if she told anyone. He eventually admitted the assaults to law enforcement.

Higgs has two prior 2003 strike convictions for robbery and making criminal threats.

Higgs faces a maximum sentence of more than 135 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 9, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen Sumner. ★

allegations and a multiple victim allegation.

On August 31, 2015, Jerry West put a gun to a female victim's head, demanded her cellphone, groped her and demanded oral copulation. He then fled in the victim's vehicle. On September 22, 2015, two women were in a car that had just parked. West opened the car door, put a gun to the passenger's head and demanded property from her. He then put the gun to the driver's head, demanded her property and struck her in the head with the gun. West groped both victims while pointing the gun at them and forced the passenger to orally copulate him. When the driver began a struggle with West for the gun, West fired the gun at both victims and missed. West then grabbed the victims' purses before fleeing. On September 25, 2015, West grabbed another female victim and covered her mouth so tightly that she couldn't breathe. West dragged the victim into Southside Park, where he demanded her property, groped her and demanded that she orally copulate him. He continuously threatened her life if she screamed or ran. The victim was able to break free and ran to a nearby residence where she called 911. The victim's iPhone was tracked, leading officers to West. DNA evidence linked West to the two prior assaults.

West has two prior 2008 strike convictions for carjacking two separate victims.

Regional Transit Launches Survey to Engage Community

Additionally, in February 2017, Sac RT released its new Strategic Vision, a multi-year plan that prioritizes a customer-first agency culture as well as a route optimization study to analyze how to best serve different parts of the region.

Catfisher Uses Sacramento Businesses to Lure Victims

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

Better Business Bureau (BBB) is warning social media users of an Internet criminal who is using four Sacramento businesses as a front in order to scheme innocent people into sending him money.

The alleged businesses include: Brad Computers Co., Bran Computers Co., B & M Computers Co., and J&M Computers Co.

According to their websites, three of the four businesses sell computers and computer accessories. Each lists a different physical address as their location, all in Sacramento. However, BBB has been unable to confirm any of these locations, or the legitimacy of the businesses. All currently have an 'F' rating.

Victims were typically contacted by the alleged business owner on dating and travel websites. He uses different variations of the names Brad, Michael, James, and Brandon. Most victims say they talked to the owner over email, one victim by phone. In some instances he waited months before asking for money, but

others say that he asked for money just a few short days after initiating a conversation.

When he does ask for money, he claims he needs it to help pay for tariffs to receive international goods for his business. Once the money is sent, typically via wire transfer, he stops responding. Victims are both female and male.

Better Business Bureau urges consumers to remember not to send money or personal information to people you do not know, and to report scams at bbb.org/scamtracker.

How to avoid a romance scam:

- Ask them to video chat. Ask the person to chat over a live video connection such as Skype, Facetime, or Google Hangout. If they avoid you, or claim they're too busy, this is a red flag and you're probably dealing with a catfish.
- Do a reverse image search. An Internet criminal never uses their own picture, but what can be more surprising is that they often use a picture of a famous

model or singer. Do a reverse image search on your Internet browser by uploading the picture directly, or by providing a link if the image is online.

- Do a web search for the business. If the person you're talking to claims to own a business, verify the business at bbb.org. Look for any alerts, complaints, or reviews.

- Copy and paste their email into your web browser. Many scam artists do not take the time to write original emails to each of their victims, and often use the same sob story every time. Copy and paste some of the email into your web browser - you may be surprised by what you find.

- Don't be ashamed to report the scammer. If you are the victim of a romance scam, come forward and share your story with others. Report it to your local Better Business Bureau and learn more about romance scams at bbb.org/scamtracker.

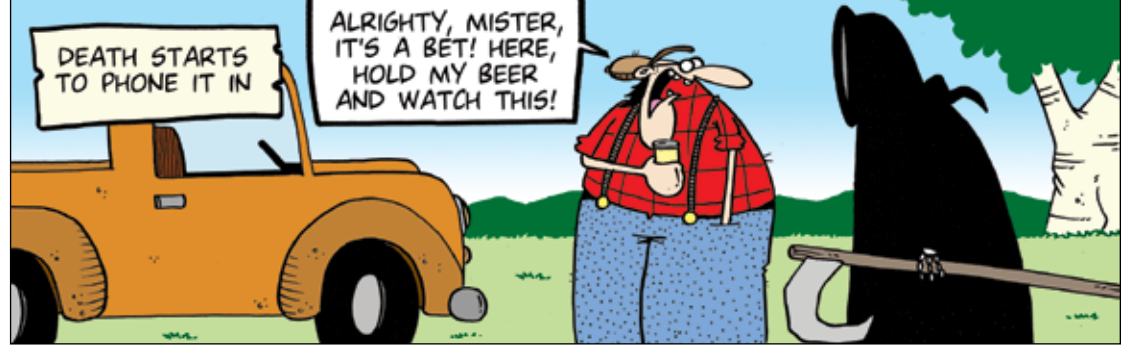

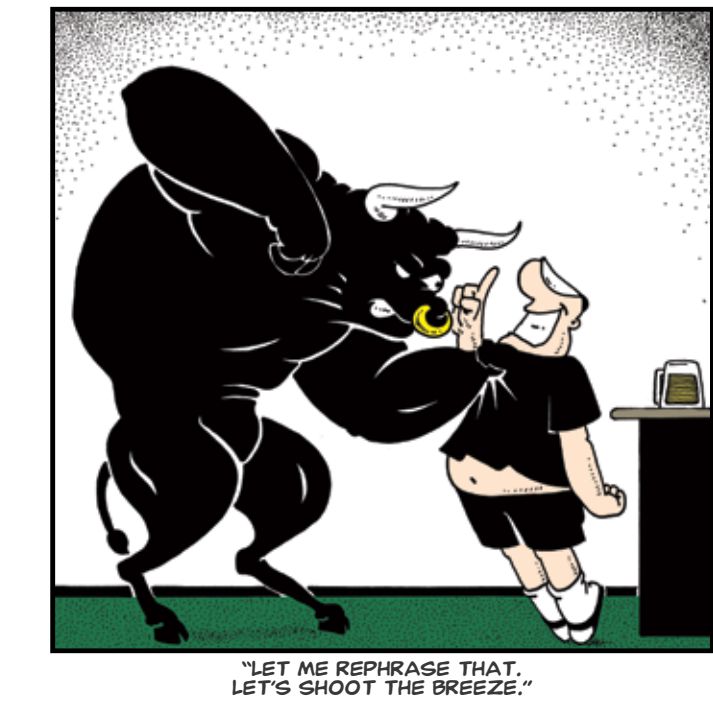

Game Plots

In America, Japan Remains Strong

Japan is nothing new to the videogame industry. Though the first video game originated in the United States, and although Atari, a US-company, was the first to found the megagiant industry we know today, it was the Japanese Nintendo Entertainment System that shocked videogames' hearts back to life after Atari's disastrous failure. More Japanese companies like Sega and Sony would soon join the fight, and it wasn't until 2001 when Microsoft's Xbox became the first major American product to retake a significant portion of the market.

And in 2017, Japan's influence remains strong. Though both Sony and Xbox are now so large that they can't be legitimately tied to a single country, Japanese developers continue to make headlines and break top sales charts seemingly every month.

But what makes this island nation, with a population a third that of the US, so consistently prolific and so disproportionately dominant on the world videogame stage?

Though no country's games can be painted with a universal broad brush, most Japanese games popular in the US share an inventiveness and an energy lacking in most Western titles. In

the undeniably *American Gears of War*, one can mow through enemy hordes with chainsaw-equipped machine guns. In the Japanese *Metal Gear Solid 4*, one can use similar machine guns to fight an army of tanks with giant frog legs...while watching a cyborg ninja fight a vampire on the other half of the screen.

Obviously not all Japanese games are so extreme, but most appeal to American audiences for exactly this type of fantastical situation. While the culture of American games demands "grounded" or "realistic" experiences, Japanese titles are far more concerned with the outer limits of style and imagination. For an incredible, cinematic set-piece experience, American consumers can choose between *Uncharted 4* with its guns, trucks, and motorcycles, or *Final Fantasy 15* with its behemoth monsters, teleportation, and magical swords. The consumer interested in pure escapism has an easy choice to make.

In addition to the inventive, imaginative nature of most Japanese games, Japanese popular culture as a whole has steadily grown a strong American following over the past two decades. Anime (Japanese animated television) is now a cultural mainstay among much of our country's youth, pulling consumers away from American

television for a similar reason to games. Anime is wild and creative. American TV keeps a foot firmly planted in the real world.

Of course, this isn't universal. Some Japanese developers have taken to beating Americans at their own game (*Resident Evil VII's* distinctly Louisiana flavor and US-style horror design is the strongest example), but as a whole, few Japanese titles can hope to outsell the next *Call of Duty* or *Battlefield*. Nevertheless, sales of recently-released Japanese games (like *Nier: Automata* and *Persona 5*) have been far stronger than expected, driven both by a passionate audience and positive responses from Western critics. Though Japan may no longer own the market, as it did in the heyday of Sega and Nintendo, its influence and popularity are here to stay.

CDPH Warns Consumers Not to Eat TP Food Processing's Lemongrass Satay and Shrimp Satay Due to Botulism Risk

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) today warned consumers not to eat TP Food Processing's Lemongrass Satay and Shrimp Satay jarred food products. The two items may have been improperly produced, and may be contaminated with botulism. Although no illnesses have been linked to these products at this time, ingestion of botulism may lead to serious illness and death.

TP Food Processing, Inc. of Westminster, California, has voluntarily recalled two varieties of jarred food products: TPF Lemongrass Satay in 9-ounce jars and half-gallon plastic tubs, and TPF Shrimp Satay in 6-ounce and 9-ounce jars. These items were sold under the TPF brand name in six-sided glass jars with reddish/orange screw-on metal lids.

The recalled food products

were sold at grocery stores in Arizona, California, Georgia, Oklahoma, and Oregon. Photographs and lot codes of the recalled items are on the CDPH website.

Consumers who have any of these products, or any foods made with these products, should discard them immediately. Double bag the jars and tightly seal them in plastic bags then place in the trash. Rubber or latex gloves should be worn, if possible, when discarding the products. If that is not possible, wash your hands with soap and running water for at least two minutes after handling any food or containers that may be contaminated.

Botulism is a rare but serious paralytic illness. Initially, symptoms may include double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids, and dry or sore throat. Paralysis starting in the upper

part of both sides of the body and making its way down may follow. Additional symptoms may include slurred speech, difficulty swallowing, and inability of the neck muscles to support the head. Paralysis of the extremities and respiratory muscles may occur. Infants with botulism appear lethargic, feed poorly, are constipated, have a weak cry, and poor muscle tone.

CDPH recommends that anyone experiencing symptoms after consuming these products consult a health care provider immediately. Consumers who observe the product being offered for sale are encouraged to report the activity to the CDPH toll-free complaint line at (800) 495-3232. For more information visit www.cdph.ca.gov. Boys Volleyball Spiking Opponents

seat for the conference's No. 3 playoff spot, as the section playoffs are scheduled to start next Tuesday.

Seven of the 10 players on the squad are seniors - Alex Kiosa, David Babin, Vitaliy Semenov, Jason Novik, who is one of the team captains. Mark Shcherbanyuk, Nik Trachuk and Daniel Yaikov. Juniors are Allan Volkov, Allen Rogalskiy and Eugene Khramtsov, who is the other team captain.

The process to start a boys volleyball program at Cordova started last year thanks to the persistency of Valeriy Babin, a senior who graduated last spring.

"Since I started (teaching) at Cordova High, many boys had been asking me to do something volleyball related, and my response was they needed to get it started up, and once they did, I would coach," said Reuter, who has coached college volleyball. "We had 10 players last year, and all the juniors and sophomores from last year returned."

Cordova, which went 1-8 in 2016, started 3-3 this season. The Lancers have won four of their last conference matches to earn one of the conference's three playoff berths.

"The second half has allowed me to focus our

practices to meet the demands of the other teams," Reuter said. "All around, these guys have shown marked improvement throughout the year. You would not know that most of these players started playing competitive volleyball for the first time last year. Because of their hard work and competitive attitude, they have made this a winning season."

When the season started in February, the Lancers had practices 5:30 to 7:30 a.m. Once the Cordova boys and girls basketball teams' seasons were over - all use the current gym but the school's new gym is scheduled to

open the start of the next school year - the boys volleyball team held practices after school. Part of the hard work Reuter has seen his squad put in practices and matches is being rewarded with post-season action.

"They never complained about morning practices," Reuter said. "They showed up and put in the work. We're looking forward to playoffs. As long as we are able to perform consistently at our high level, we'll be in the race. This group is very fun to coach." ★

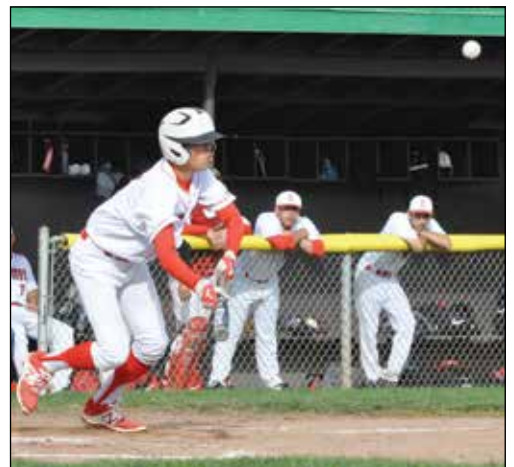
Lancers Baseball Splits with Warriors

The only FLC athletic team still competing is the men's golf team, which won the Big 8 championship last week and is preparing for next Monday's NorCal regional championship tournament at Spanos Reserve in Stockton, where they'll play 36 holes in one day. They'll tee off at 7:00 am and play 18 holes before lunch, then play another 18 in the afternoon. The top four teams there will qualify for the state championship tournament the following week in Arroyo Grande. ★

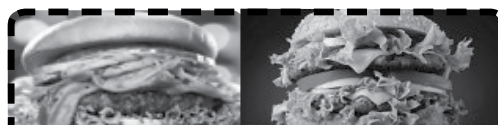

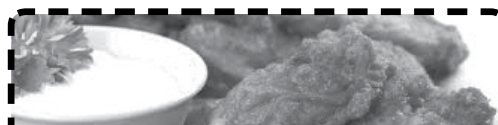

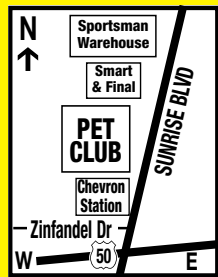
