RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A new exhibit of fine art is open for viewing now through July 30 at Rancho Cordova City Hall, with the theme "Black and White". The Artists Reception was held in the opening week of the show, on April 13.

Measure J Offers Local Tax Cut for Seniors, Relief for Some Elderly

Special Release by Cordova Recreation and Park District

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Cordova Recreation and Park District is granting a partial tax exemption for qualified property owners on the Measure J parcel tax. The CRPD Board of Directors approved a 20 percent reduction for residential property that is owned and the principal residence of adults aged 65 years or older in the qualifying tax year.

Measure J is a special tax on property passed by voters in November 2016 to help support CRPD's goal of providing safe, clean and accessible parks and facilities to the community. Measure J will support specific areas in the District, including Rosemont, Larchmont, Riviera East, Gold River and most of the City of Rancho Cordova.

Applications for the senior discount are due by May 31, 2017. Applications are available online at www.crpd.com, at the CRPD District Office located at 2729 Prospect Park Drive, Suite 230 or at the Neil Orchard Senior Activities Center located at 3480 Routier Road. Applications may be brought in person or mailed to the District office or Senior Center.

CRPD will also be hosting an informational workshop at the Senior Center on May 15 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Reservations for the workshop will be taken at the Senior Center front desk.

Patrouille de France Soars High at Mather

MATHER, CA (MPG) - Mather Airport played host last Saturday, April 15 to France's top military pilots when the "Patrouille de France" came to town. A crowd of at least 5,000 spectators and French and American dignitaries turned out to see the French pilots and aircraft perform during the historically significant show.

The Mather event was the only west coast appearance of the French Air Force's elite military jet demonstration team, during its 8 U.S. city run. The day was sponsored by the City of Rancho Cordova and the California Capital Airshow (CCA). The Patrouille de France, in conjunction with the City and CCA, orchestrated the single performance in honor of the 100th anniversary of the US entering World War I, and as a lead in to the centennial celebrations of

Young Man Who Has Given Finally Gets

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Cordova Community Council recently awarded Rancho Cordova student Anthony Lacayo at the group's 18th Annual Volunteer Awards in March. Lacayo attends Mitchell Middle School and has served as a volunteer for the last three years during the Folsom Cordova Unified School District's Family Engagement Summery Academy.

Lacayo first attended the Academy himself as an elementary school student, and decided to give back to the community once he was old enough. "He decided to volunteer to make a difference for elementary students in the program," according to Kathy Escobar, Multimedia Communications Specialist for the Folsom Cordova Unified School District.

Since then he has spent most of his last few summers as part of the Counselor in Training (CIT) program, a feature of the district's program design.

"Anthony is the reason why we created the CIT component of the summer program," said Linda Burkholder, the district's Director of Family Engagement and Support Services. "We now have more than 20 middle and high school students serving as

courtesy Folsom Cordova Unified School District CITs every summer. The younger students in the Summer Academy often tell me they want to be CITs like 'Mr. Anthony' when they get to middle school. He inspires his younger siblings and peers to get involved in science."

In addition to his many hours of volunteer work as a CIT for the school district, Lacayo has managed to find time to help with another integral organization in Rancho Cordova, the Police Activities League (PAL). Escobar elaborated on the law enforcement group's appreciation of Lacayo's service. "PAL is sending him to a leadership conference in southern California in the summer, in recognition of

his passion for service and his work on the Youth Leadership Council."

The Family Engagement Summery Academy offered by the Folsom Cordova Unified School District is geared to help families grow together by using "reading, science, games and fun adventures," says the district's website. The summer day camp is funded in part by grants and donations from the community. It provides recreational opportunities, hands-on art and science projects, reading, technology, field trips and includes a Parent Academy with activities for adults, too.

Rancho Cordova, CA (MPG) - Walnutwood school instructor Jessica Cisneros-Elliott teaches students a little differently than most of her peers do and she was recently recognized for her abilities and talents by local media outlet ABC10 as their Teacher of the Month.

Folsom Zoo Sanctuary Gets a Hand FCUSD Student Project Benefits Animals

Rancho Cordova (MPG) - Last fall, Folsom High teacher Pam Goldman led 30 of her students to the Folsom Zoo Sanctuary in pursuit of learning. The students are part of the Principles of Engineering (POE) class that she teaches. The visit to the Folsom Zoo was part of the course curriculum, allowing students to begin designing habitats and providing enrichment items for animals living at the facility. Once the design review phase is complete, students will move on to the building and installation of their individual design projects at the Zoo.

"Students created a detailed design proposal including CAD drawings and supply lists and they recently met with engineers for the review of their designs," stated Goldman. The yearlong Zoo Project, which is funded by grants, is designed to teach students about identifying the animals' needs while utilizing their engineering skills,

according to Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) spokesperson Kathy Escobar.

"Thanks to community partnerships and initiatives that support programs like this, these students are applying the knowledge they gain in the classroom with realworld experience, while also making a tangible impact in the community."

shadows, or we'd start seeing other aspects of things," McCray said. "Her penchant for getting you to open your eyes, and how to see the world, and how to translate that into art, was just phenomenal."

Robin Moyher's black and white mosaic in this show also featured Zentangle - in fact, that was its title. Moyher's commissioned work, Serenity, was unveiled recently at the VA Medical Center at Mather. Other artists in this show have incorporated Zentangle into their work, including Rick Sloan of the Cordova Recreation and Park District Board with his pen and ink art titled, Whimsical Journey.

Ann Greitzer's three realistic pen and ink portraits brought her into this show for the first time. In fact, she had not been in a show since her art college days. 



The Patrouille de France flies Dassault/Dornier Alphas, used as light attack jets in combat and also training missions. The planes have been co-developed and manufactured in France by Dassault Aviation and Dornier Flugzeugwerke in Germany. Other craft were also on display for visitors to see up close,

as well as a variety of exhibits. Food trucks and merchandise to commemorate the event were available for purchase.

California Capital Airshow Executive Director Darcy Brewer called the event, "a tribute from our French allies to the American heroes of World War I and a rare opportunity to experience this world class air force up close and personal."

The Patrouille de France performance serves as a herald for this year's 2017 California Capital Airshow, taking place September 9 and 10 at Mather. The CCA was established in 2004 and is dedicated to community enrichment and educational youth programs and scholarships, encouraging aeronautical science and engineering.



Tax Freedom Day Late Again for California

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Californians who have filed their income tax returns by the April 18 deadline will unfortunately have to wait eight days longer than the rest of the nation until they've collectively earned enough money to pay off their total tax bill for the year.

Tax Freedom Day, calculated annually by the Tax Foundation, is the day when Americans have earned enough money to pay their taxes at the federal, state and local levels.

Nationally, Tax Freedom Day lands on April 23, but for California

it lands on May 1.

"For some lawmakers, this terrible distinction seems to be a badge of honor," said Board of Equalization Vice Chair George Runner. "With liberal politicians recently voting to increase gas and car taxes, I fear this day will come even later next year for hardworking taxpayers."

According to the Tax Foundation, Americans will pay \$3.5 trillion in federal taxes and \$1.6 trillion in state and local taxes, for a total tax bill of \$5.1 trillion,

or 31 percent of national income. That's more than Americans will collectively spend on food, clothing and housing combined.

Compared to other states, California's Tax Freedom Day is one of the latest in the nation. Only Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey and Connecticut have later dates.



On April 3, 2017, Golden State Water Company (GSWC) filed Application No. 17-04-002 with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting an increase in rates to establish its authorized cost of capital and rate of return for utility operations for 2018, 2019 and 2020. GSWC's application requests an increase in the rate of return of 0.77% from the current percentage of 8.34% to 9.11% for 2018, 2019 and 2020.

Overall, the proposed changes to the cost of capital will increase GSWC's currently authorized revenues by \$12.1 million (4.0%). If approved, GSWC's request will increase rates beginning on January 1, 2018.

GSWC is required to file a cost of capital application every three years. The authorized cost of capital determines the amount of money GSWC is allowed to recuperate in rates as a return on the money it has invested. This request is subject to adjustment per the Water Cost of Capital Mechanism, which allows for automatic annual adjustments to the return on equity and embedded cost of debt in the cost of capital. GSWC's proposed cost of capital request is summarized in the following table:

No candidate for president gets to office without CFR approval,

Over the decades they have been called the shadow government, the secret combination, the moneyed establishment, the eastern establishment and now just the establishment. They have hated only two presidential party nominees Barry Goldwater in 1964 and Donald Trump in 2016. The first they destroyed, the second they seek to remove or destroy.

President Woodrow Wilson was the first president to reference a secret influence over politics at the highest level. In his The New Freedom (1913) he wrote of his experience with a hidden force: "Since I entered politics, I have chiefly had men's views confided to me privately. Some of the biggest men in the United States in the field of commerce and manufacture, are afraid of somebody, are afraid of something. They know that there is a power somewhere so organized, so subtle, so watchful, so interlocked, so complete, so pervasive that they had better not speak above their breath when they speak in condemnation of

A hundred years later, Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton, identified the CFR as her source of direction when she addressed them in their new D. C. "sub-center down the street." She told them: "I am delighted to be at these new headquarters. I have been often to the mother ship in New York City but it is good to have an outpost of the Council right here down the street from the State Department. We get a lot of advice from the Council so this will mean that I won't have as far to go to be told what we

should be doing and how we should think about the future." In the presidential campaign the establishment media portrayed Donald Trump as a joke—certainly not a serious candidate, not a real conservative, a flip-flopper on the issues, anti-women, anti-immigration, insulting to everyone, a braggart, only into himself, least likely to beat Hillary Clinton, only attractive to white males, and not in touch with reality with respect to the Middle East, and more. They were wrong. A third of these charges would have easily destroyed previous candidates. As president they work to obstruct everything he does. He is vilified in virtually every national press outlet. record, although the best ever, is

Unfortunately Trump's CFR no longer pure. CFR Lieutenant General H. R. McMaster replaced General Michael Flynn as National Security Adviser and Neil M. Gorsuch as U.S. Supreme Court justice, is imminent. Gorsuch was first listed as a CFR member in the 2007 Annual Report and thereafter for five years. He is not currently listed. Gorsuch must be questioned regarding this affiliation. Another concern surfaces; Ruth Bader Ginsburg also has CFR membership and thus two of the nine justices of the highest court in the land could have a higher loyalty. She has made no secret that she views international law (UN law) as constitutional. In fact her loyalty to the Constitution came into question in 2012 when the Egyptian government sought her advice in the writing of a new constitution. She recommended the South African or Canadian models and could not recommend the U.S Constitution. Two of nine justices who may have a higher loyalty than the Constitution is two too many.

Trump would be better off to avoid all globalist organizations and members in his administration. There are plenty of experts available without globalist sympathy. Still, he has done well in reducing globalist influence in those he chooses to advise him.

Credit Unions in Sacramento County Generate \$850 Million Impact

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

- Credit unions serving members in Sacramento County recently generated an \$850 million annual impact to the region's economy, which supported 5,730 local jobs and also produced \$55.1 million in savings to those members according to a special report released April 18th by the California Credit Union League.

The economic impact of both locally-headquartered and non-local credit unions serving members across the county in 2016 also contributed to the industry's total statewide impact across California, which was \$17 billion. This is equal to the same positive effect as some of the nation's largest corporations in America, including Kraft Heinz, General Mills, Xerox, and Facebook—each having approximately \$17 – 18 billion in annual revenue.

As they pump financial benefits back to members through offering better interest rates on loans and deposit accounts, as well as lower or no fees, these 17 credit unions were serving more than 575,000 members across Sacramento County through a mixture of online and mobile banking channels, as well as a network of 84 branches that members can visit in person.

The reports were commissioned by the League and independently completed and published by ECONorthwest, an economic research and consulting firm in Portland, OR. The study looked at balance sheet, regulatory "call report," and operational data to come to its conclusions. ECONorthwest completed an independent analysis of credit unions surveyed and

used a "multiplier-effect" model to extrapolate its economic conclusions.

In a separate local quarterly-trends report, 10 credit unions headquartered in Sacramento County collectively hit records in membership (1.26 million members), money lentout (\$11 billion), and deposits (\$14.2 billion). These statewide trends in first-mortgages, secondmortgages, HELOCs, business loans, new and used auto loans, credit cards, and other consumer loans give a snapshot of how local consumers are currently spending their money.

"Credit unions' combined ripple effect in the broader economy cannot be ignored as their financially cooperative, not-for-profit model reinvests local dollars back into local economies," said Diana Dykstra, president and CEO of the League, which is based in Ontario, CA. "These reports reaffirm credit unions' efforts to empower their members by helping them make wise financial decisions and thrive."

Household wealth and socio-economic mobility are increasingly seen as being tied to opportunities in financial education, an area many credit unions consider their strength.

"Research shows that up to half of wealth inequality may be caused by differences in financial literacy," states a January 2017 Education, Income and Wealth article published by the Federal Reserve. USCIS Will Issue Redesigned Green Cards and Employment Authorization Documents

USCIS Special Release

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services today announced a redesign to the Permanent Resident Card (also known as a Green Card) and the Employment Authorization Document (EAD) as part of the Next Generation Secure Identification Document Project. USCIS will begin issuing the new cards on May 1, 2017.

These redesigns use enhanced graphics and fraud-resistant security features to create cards that are highly secure and more tamper-resistant than the ones currently in use.

The new card designs demonstrate USCIS' commitment to continue taking a proactive approach against the threat of document tampering and fraud. They are also part of an ongoing effort between USCIS, U.S. Customs and Border Protection. and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to enhance document security and deter counterfeiting and fraud.

The new Green Cards and

EADs will: Display the individual's photos on both sides;Show a unique graphic image and color palette: (Green Cards will have an image of the Statue of Liberty and a predominately green palette; EAD cards will have an image of a bald eagle and a predominately red palette); Have embedded holographic images; and no longer display the individual's signature. Also, Green Cards will no longer have an optical stripe on the back.

Some Green Cards and EADs issued after May 1, 2017, may still display the existing design format as USCIS will continue using existing card stock until current supplies are depleted. Both the existing and the new Green Cards and EADs will remain valid until the expiration date shown on the card.

Certain EADs held by individuals with Temporary Protected Status (TPS) and other designated categories have been automatically extended beyond the validity date on the card. For additional information on which EADs are covered, please

visit the Temporary Protected Status and American Competitiveness in the 21st Century Act web pages on uscis.

Both versions are acceptable for Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification, E-Verify, and Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE). Some older Green Cards do not have an expiration date. These older Green Cards without an expiration date remain valid. Individuals who have Green Cards without an expiration date may want to consider applying for a replacement card bearing an expiration date. Obtaining the replacement card will reduce the likelihood of fraud or tampering if the card is ever lost or stolen.

Legislation to Fix Security Flaw in State's Voter File Passes First Hurdle

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In a information needed to complete communication between the rare moment of bipartisanship, the Senate Committee on Elections and Constitutional Amendments unanimously voted to pass Senator Jim Nielsen's measure to fix a security flaw the state's voter file.

"Our democracy is an honor system based on trust," said Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama). "We must do everything we can to protect its integrity and keep the trust of the people. This measure will help ensure that trust."

"I thank my colleagues on the committee for their support," added Senator Nielsen.

Senate Bill 682, if passed, would prohibit the Department Motor Vehicles (DMV) from giving the Secretary of State electronic the voter registration affidavit for ineligible voters who hold special drivers' licenses for noncitizens.

California's current online voter registration system automatically allows the voter registration of anyone with a drivers' license who self-certifies that they are eligible to vote - including individuals DMV knows to be ineligible because they were issued special noncitizen drivers' licenses. These noncitizen drivers' licenses do not establish voter eligibility, yet the online voter registration system only requires a drivers' license number. As a result, undocumented residents may be unlawfully registered to vote.

There is no protocol for

Secretary of State and the Department of Motor Vehicles to prevent these registrants from being approved under current law.

"Keeping the voter roll clean and up-to-date is a challenging task. This bill helps fill a gap in the security of the voter roll," said Candace Grubbs, Butte County Elections Clerk-Recorder.

RT Financials Showing Positive Trend

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The Sacramento Regional Transit District (Sac RT) has been relentlessly optimizing business practices over the past eight months to bring its financial house in order, and the positive results are very encouraging. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2017, Sac RT is trending below budget. This has allowed Sac RT to develop a budget for FY 2018 that is expected to be \$1.6 million less than the prior

Additionally, by working diligently over the past year with rating agencies, last week Sac RT received great news from Moody's, a bond credit rating service, that upgraded Sac RT's bond rating from "negative" watch to "stable" outlook, which will help Sac RT to issue future bonds at a much better interest rate for regional capital projects. The significant transformation that Sac RT has made in the last year, as well as strong political support and strong board governance, is building up RT's long-term financial stability, which will continue to move Sac RT in a new direction.

Under the direction of Henry Li, General Manager/CEO, Sac RT committed to strengthening its finances while making the system more clean, safe and convenient for riders. Sac RT has identified innovative revenue sources, strengthened its finances and reduced expenses to fund maintenance and capital investments. By aggressively containing costs and pursuing revenue enhancement opportunities, Sac RT has secured more than \$3 million in operating funding, which

helped enhance customer services. "At a time when many public agencies are increasing budgets, we have been able to reduce ours. We are figuring out innovative ways to do more with less." said Henry Li, General Manager/CEO. "Our number one priority is the customer, and the ability to reduce the annual budget without cutting service or increasing fares is

a huge victory from where Sac RT was a year ago."

Based on these positive trends, Sac RT projects to add to its fund balance for the first time in three years, and build up an emergency cash reserve of \$6 million (with a 2017 year-end goal of \$9 to \$10 million). Captain Shawn Condit Named Firefighter Employee of the Year


Sac Metro Fire Special Release By Deputy Chief Eric Bridge

California's Economic Output **Outpaces Nation for Fourth Straight Year**

Domestic Product (GDP) has grown consistently faster than the nation's as a whole for four straight years. In 2015, the California GDP rose 5.6 percent, while the U.S. GDP increased 3.7 percent (unadjusted for inflation). Also called "economic output," GDP measures the market value of goods, services, and structures that are produced within a particular period, and tends to be related to population, income, spending, employment, housing permits, and other measures of economic activity.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, the New York-Newark-Jersey City metropolitan area led the nation with an economic output of about \$1.603 trillion in 2015. California was represented by two of the top 10 areas: Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim (\$930.8 billion), and San Francisco-Oakland-Hayward (\$431.7 billion). The Los Angeles metropolitan area accounts for 37.9 percent of California's GDP, while the San Francisco Bay Area comprises 17.6 percent. The Sacramento-Roseville region accounts for 4.8 percent (\$118.8 billion).

San Jose has been the fastest growing metropolitan

area within California – and the second fastest in the U.S. – with stronger economic growth than 380 of the SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California's Gross nation's 382 metropolitan areas in 2015. With growth rates that ranged from 5.0 percent to 10.4 percent over the past five years, the San Jose area had the largest increase in that time frame – 37.6 percent – more than 60 percent higher than the California average gain of 23.1 percent, for a total GDP of more than \$235 billion. The state's second-largest increase was in the Visalia-Porterville area - 32.4 percent - followed by Merced (30.2 percent), Napa (29.6 percent) and Madera (28.1 percent). The Hanford-Corcoran area also finished above the state average (24.2 percent). Both the Chico and Sacramento-Roseville areas had strong showings in 2015, ranking fourth and fifth in the state respectively in GDP growth.

One way to compare economic wellbeing among regions is to calculate inflation-adjusted GDP per capita. Real economic output per capita in the San Jose area was close to twice that of the California average in 2015. Other areas with higher than average per capita real GDP include San Diego, and Napa.

Cordova Baseball Preparing for the Home Stretch


