RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - There will be no shortage of giggles on Saturday April 29, when Kids Day in the Park celebrates its 28th Anniversary at Hagan Park in Rancho Cordova.

Presented by the City of Rancho Cordova, Sacramento County Department of Health and Human Services, and a host of other sponsors, Kids Day will challenge kids to "Get Your Game On," showcasing a wide range of youth sports and more than 100 free things to do.

The event also marks the Sacramento County kick-off for National Children's Mental Health Awareness Day.

Admission, parking and all activities are free of charge. Food will be available for purchase.

This year's event takes kids and their parents into the wide world of sports, with plenty of hoops to shoot, balls to throw and more. Teaming up with Sports Stars Sports Jam, this year's event will showcase dozens of sports and opportunities to play them at Kids Day and beyond.

Among the fun, free attractions will be

off-road ATV simulators, a host of hands on sports games, Kids Zumba, rock climbing wall, obstacle course and more.

In addition to fun and educational sports attractions, kids can learn about bike safety at the popular Police Activities League (PAL) Bike Rodeo during which dozens of bicycles donated by the Sheriff's Toy Project will be given away to lucky children, along with hundreds of free bike safety helmets.

While Kids Day is all about fun, children's health is the primary objective. Organizers work with health providers from Sacramento County and the Folsom Cordova Unified School District to present free hearing, vision and school readiness screenings to help get kids off to a healthy start. Parents can get tips on how to prepare their children for school, how to obtain mental health resources, and how to access a wide range of public and private services for their kids.

More than 100 exhibitors whose focus is children and health will be providing free

activities for children, keeping little hands busy while parents access information. Kids Day runs from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday April 29 with no admission charge. Free parking is available nearby.

Gibson Ranch Management Decision Extended by Board of Supervisors

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County Board of Supervisors has extended until May 31 its private level contract with former congressman Doug Ose to manage Gibson Ranch, giving the board more time to consider Ose's renewal proposal, redirect management of the park back to Sacramento Department of Regional Parks, or go another direction and solicit bids from other private contractors.

While the extension of his contract may not necessarily mean Ose will be granted a renewal to manage Gibson Ranch, it doesn't rule out the option either. In fact, Ose said it was because discussions with the board of supervisors were going so well that he agreed to the extension. While enjoying a \$22,000 profit in 2015, Ose has said he is currently losing \$20,000 a month due to labor cost increases and, unless he can obtain a new contract that includes some of his ideas for revenue-generating programs, he's ready to walk away.

"I agreed to extend my deadline of my contract and I never would have done that had I not seen our discussions as being positive, or had I not thought that we were going to come to an amicable or acceptable agreement," Ose said.

Ose assumed management of the 325-acre nature reserve after steep financial losses by the county put the park on the brink of closure in 2011. Ose's current, five-year contract was set to run out April 30, putting the future of Gibson Ranch, which he has said served 100,000 visitors in 2016, at risk of closure again.

While Ose has declined to discuss the details of any proposed new financial arrangement, his plan includes a contract for 20 years instead of five, as well as increasing the park's entry fee from \$5 to \$8. In addition, he's interested in installing as many as 50 full hook-up RV sites that could generate as much as \$12,000 a month in revenue for the park, and wants to expand facility rentals to include big-ticket events, such as high school graduations.

Ose's original agreement allowed him to rent the park for \$1 a year plus half of his profits. In turn, the county agreed to pay Ose \$500,000 over the current life of the contract for deferred maintenance. Ose has said that arrangement is no longer viable and that monthly expenses are

The Small Business Symposium: Roadmap to Success will run from April 30 through May 6, 2017, throughout Capital Region Small Business Week. The Symposium is Tuesday, May 2, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at McClellan Conference Center, 5411 Luce Avenue, McClellan, CA.

City Council Member Dan Skoglund Passes

September 16, 1950 – April 20, 2017

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Dan Skoglund, husband, father, grandfather and son, passed away on April 20, 2017 due to complications following a recent surgery. He was 66.

Dan is survived by his wife, Pam; his mother, Gerry; sons John Skoglund (Lindsey) and Jeff Skoglund; grandson Benjamin; brother David Skoglund (Linda); brother-in-law Richard Ferguson (Pattie); and many nieces and nephews.

Dan is perhaps best known for having served on the Rancho Cordova City Council since 2004. During that time he served as Vice Mayor in 2008 and 2013, and as Mayor in 2009 and 2014. He helped bring about the successful incorporation of Rancho Cordova and was appointed to serve on the first Rancho Cordova Planning Commission.

Dan represented the City on the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District, Sacramento Area Sewer District, Sacramento Metropolitan Cable Television Commission, and South Sacramento Habitat Conservation Plan Elected Advisory Board.

Dan Skoglund was a longtime community volunteer and leader of such organizations as the Active 20/30 Club and Rancho Cordova Rotary Club. He had served as a trustee of the Rancho Cordova Rotary Foundation, was a Paul Harris Fellow, and a recipient of the Quiet Rotarian Award. He had



also served as the vice-chair of CORPAC. Dan was also a longtime member and former president of the Cordova Community Council. He had a soft spot for youth and helped coach Little League and soccer. In recent years, he led fundraising efforts to purchase new band uniforms for the Cordova High School Marching Band.

More recently, with his family, Dan formed the Skoglund Family Fund to purchase Christmas gifts for needy Rancho Cordova children during the holidays, working with the Folsom Cordova Partnership to make sure all kids found something under the tree.

Dan was a Relocation Consultant for California Moving Systems for 35 years. He served as past-president of the Sacramento Chapter of the California Moving and Storage Association. He was a graduate of Sacramento High School and attended Sacramento City College.

Dan Skoglund will be remembered as a dedicated volunteer, a caring leader, a loving family man and proud Rancho Cordovan.

The City of Rancho Cordova issued the following statement on April 20:

"It is with a heavy heart that the City of Rancho Cordova announces

the passing of Council Member Dan Skoglund.

Dan passed away the morning of April 20, 2017 due to complications from a recent surgery.

Dan was appointed to fill a vacancy on the City Council in 2004 to finish out the term of the late Mayor Dave Roberts who passed away during his term in office. Dan was elected to a full term in 2006, 2010 and 2014 and served as Vice Mayor in 2008 and 2013 and Mayor in 2009 and 2014.

"We are deeply saddened by the passing of our friend and colleague Dan Skoglund," said Rancho Cordova Mayor Donald Terry. "Dan had a heart for the Rancho Cordova community and as a colleague, he was always a strong advocate for what was best for our residents and the City."

Dan represented the City on the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District, Sacramento Area Sewer District, Sacramento Metropolitan Cable Television Commission, and South Sacramento Habitat Conservation Plan Elected Advisory Board.

Dan lived in Rancho Cordova since 1975. He was a member and Vice Chair of the City's first Planning Commission. He served as a president for many organizations, including the Rancho Cordova Rotary Club, the Cordova Community Council, the Active 20/30 Club, and the Sacramento Chapter of the Professional Moving Association.

Dan was a Relocation Consultant for California Moving Systems for 35 years. He was a graduate

of Sacramento High School and attended Sacramento City College.

"Dan was a gentle and kind-hearted individual," said Rancho Cordova City Manager Cyrus Abbar. "He was instrumental in planning the future of Rancho Cordova and was known as a passionate supporter of youth programs and activities."

Dan was a family man and is survived by his mother, Gerry; wife, Pamela; son John Skoglund, daughter-in-law Lindsey Feeley Skoglund, and grandson Benjamin; and son Jeffrey Skoglund."

Visitation will take place on Wednesday, April 26, 2017 from 5-7 PM at East Lawn Memorial Park, 4300 Folsom Blvd., Sacramento. Memorial services will be held on Thursday, April 27, 2017 at 10 AM at Sun River Church, 11223 Trinity River Drive, Rancho Cordova. A reception will be held immediately following the memorial services at Rancho Cordova City Hall, 2729 Prospect Park Drive, Rancho Cordova. A private burial service will be held at Kilgore Cemetery.

Members of the Tuskegee Airmen will come to the Rancho Cordova Library to give an "insightful presentation," on the original airmen who served in World War II, said Evelyn Figeroid, Coordinator for Veterans Connect at the Rancho Cordova Library. Perry Woods, Vice President of the George "Spanky" Roberts Chapter of the Tuskegee Airmen and Vice Commander of American Legion Post 709 proposed the program, which Woods referred to as a "profound event."

The program will include a video documentary and panel discussion on the Tuskegee Airmen from 1 to 3 p.m., Saturday, April 29. The panel will discuss the history of the integration of African-American airmen into service as United States Air Force pilots, and their heroic efforts on behalf of the citizens of the United States.

The program will be held in the Community Room at the Rancho Cordova Library, 9845 Folsom Blvd., Sacramento. Light refreshments will be served.

The original Tuskegee Airmen were a group of around 1,000 black pilots and more than 15,000 black ground personnel who overcame segregation and discrimination to serve their country in the Air Force in World War II. The airmen trained at the Tuskegee Army Airfield, and received education at Tuskegee University in Alabama. Until that time, no official black aviators had been allowed in the United States Air Force. The Tuskegee program officially began June 1941 with the 99th Pursuit Squadron at Tuskegee University.

of the original Tuskegee Airmen, is scheduled to be in attendance at the library with his wife, Gloria. Among those participating on the panel are Perry Woods, Vice President of the George "Spanky" Roberts Chapter and Vice Commander of American Legion Post 709, and James Coleman, WWII veteran who fought in Iwo Jima. Woods coordinated the program with Figeroid in order to bring the story to the public.

"I am so very excited to be offering this program to our community," said Figeroid. "This is a story of heroics on many fronts." ★

now coming directly out of his pocket and he needs to "stop the bleeding."

Matt Hedges, chief of staff for County Supervisor Sue Frost who recently toured Gibson in preparation for her discussions with the board on Ose's contract, said she and Ose want the park to remain open, however the board needs to weigh all options on the table. Frost and fellow board members will spend the next few weeks, he said, reviewing a pending report from Regional Parks detailing a scenario for it to assume management of the park, as well as Ose's proposal.

"In addition to the option of renewing a contract for Mr. Ose, county parks also will be offering its own plan to operate the park under a traditional model without a lot of extra amenities," Hedges said.

Should management be turned back over to the parks department, it would require the hiring of additional staff, according to Hedges, who added that the department would also be faced with the challenge of how to

manage the park's equestrian boarding program launched under Ose's tenure.

"That plan would include using county staff to manage the park, as well as the creation of three new and two seasonal positions," said Hedges. "In addition, because the department has never run an equestrian boarding program, it needs to weigh that element as well."

Parks Director Jeff Leatherman has declined repeated requests for comment.

Hedges said the third option

to be deliberated by the board is to open up the process to other, private bids, which could be considered alongside Ose's proposal. Although a few inquiries have come in, no serious proposals from other private contenders have been put forward, Hedges said, adding that fact alone puts Ose in a very positive position. Ose agreed.

"I'm feeling very positive," said Ose. "And I want to say that I appreciate the county's consideration of my concerns and plans, and the mutual goal is to keep Gibson open." ★

Berryhill's Fishing License Bill Unanimously Approved by CA Senate Committee

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A bill authored by California Senator Tom Berryhill, R-Twain Harte, to promote fishing for all Californians unanimously passed the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee on Tuesday, April 25th.

Currently, fishing licenses are based on a calendar-year cycle, with no extra time or prorated rates given for purchases made later in the season. SB-187, which is supported by groups representing nearly every type of Californian, would make fishing licenses valid for 12 months from the time of the purchase.

"Fishing is important for so many Californians," Berryhill said. "From anglers who love the sport to people just trying to feed their families, this bill would

improve the quality of life for our constituents."

Recreational fishing contributes more than \$4.6 billion annually to California's economy. It is a major source of outdoor tourism, jobs and tax revenue for state and local governments. But sales have plummeted as rates have increased.

In 1980, when licenses were a reasonable \$5, California sold more than 2.2 million licenses. Today, the base price for an annual fishing license has skyrocketed to \$47.01, while the number of annual licenses sold has decreased a staggering 55 percent.

California has over 2.7 million anglers, yet there is a growing concern that the unprecedented

decline in California's fishing sales will threaten funding for fishery and conservation programs, as well as millions of federal dollars tied to the number of licenses sold.

SB187 enjoys a broad coalition of support that includes sport, labor, business, tourism and citizen groups.

"This bill just makes sense," Berryhill said. "Any bill that unites labor unions, state and local chambers of commerce, anglers, tourism groups and everyday Californians is ready to become law."

Senator Berryhill represents Rancho Cordova and the counties of Amador, Calaveras, Inyo, Mariposa, Mono, Stanislaus, Tuolumne and parts of Fresno, Madera, Sacramento and Tulare. ★

The Folsom Cordova Unified School District Board of Education has selected a finalist in its search for the district's next superintendent: Dr. Sarah Koligian, superintendent of the Tulare Joint Union High School District and a veteran educator with 30 years of experience supporting student achievement.

Final contract negotiations are underway, and it is anticipated that the Board will ratify Dr. Koligian's appointment May 4, its next regular meeting. Current superintendent Deborah Bettencourt, who announced her retirement earlier this year, will remain at the helm full-time until June 30, 2017.

"I am deeply honored and excited to be joining the Folsom Cordova Unified School District family as their next superintendent. I am committed to building upon the rich traditions and culture that support student excellence," Dr. Koligian said. "I look forward to working collaboratively with the Board of Education, employees, students, parents, and community to lead the District to continued student success and achievement. I thank the Board of Education for this opportunity."

The Board of Education made its decision with input gathered from parents, employees, community members, and other key stakeholder groups who indicated they are seeking a superintendent who is collaborative, who has a record of success as an educational leader, and who will be committed to the District's mission, vision, core values, and community. The Board considered 22 internal and external candidates and, after a rigorous screening and series of interviews April 22-23, chose Dr. Koligian as the best fit for our schools.

"The board is excited to welcome Dr. Koligian as our District's next superintendent," said Board of Education President Zak Ford. "She understands the diverse needs of our District, and her extensive K-12 experience as both a teacher and administrator will serve us well at all levels. As both a District Board member and as a District parent, I am thrilled that Dr. Koligian will be joining us."

Koligian, 55, began her teaching

career as a resource teacher at Madison Elementary School in Fresno's Central Unified School District, where she supported English learners whose primary languages were Spanish, Hmong, and Punjabi. During her 20 years at Central Unified, she held several leadership positions including Associate Superintendent of Educational Services and Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction. In 2007, she was named superintendent of the Golden Valley Unified School District in nearby Madera County.

Dr. Koligian has been the superintendent of Tulare Joint Union High School District since 2011. The Tulare County district serves more than 5,400 students and has eight schools, including three comprehensive high schools. During her tenure, she started the Education Foundation for Tulare High School District supporting the district's Four A's: Academics, Agriculture, Arts, and Athletics. Under her leadership, the district has earned three Golden Bell awards from the California School Boards Association (CSBA) for their health careers in education, agriculture education, and "Harvesting Hope" community campaign. Additionally, the district has implemented three Linked Learning academies in the areas of engineering, art, and pre-med. A new district charter high school opened in 2014 to offer blended, online learning opportunities, and a second charter high school for credit acceleration opened in August 2016.

Dr. Koligian was born and raised in the San Joaquin Valley.

She earned her undergraduate and postgraduate degrees at California State University, Fresno, including a Bachelor's in Business Administration, her teaching and administrative credentials, and a Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership.

She also is a graduate of the Association of California School Administrators' (ACSA) Superintendent's Academy, and has completed the CSBA's Master's in Governance Program. Organizations including CSBA, ACSA, the Madera County School Boards Association and others have invited her to speak at their professional development conferences, and she has been an adjunct professor at Fresno Pacific University teaching a Master's level course in Curricular Leadership.

Her career includes multiple recognitions: ACSA Tulare Charter Superintendent of the Year; Honorary Portuguese-American of the Year; FFA Regional and California Star Administrator of the Year; ACSA Region 11 Marcus Foster Memorial award; ACSA Region 9 Superintendent of the Year nominee; and Administrator of the Year recipient for Curriculum and Instruction.

Dr. Koligian is a board member for the ACSA Tulare Charter and is currently the ACSA Region 11 state representative to the Superintendent Council, after previously serving on the Equity, Achievement, and Diversity Committee. She serves as President of the Tulare County Hispanic Leadership Network, Central Valley Education Coalition Board, and is co-chair of the Sequoia's Adult Education Consortium Board.

Dr. Koligian and her husband Wayne, a retired teacher and coach, have been married more than 35 years and have been blessed with four grown children, a daughter-in-law and granddaughter. She is a member of the Greater Tulare Area Kiwanis Club and is a former elder of her church. In her spare time she enjoys spending time with family, recreational running, and the great outdoors.

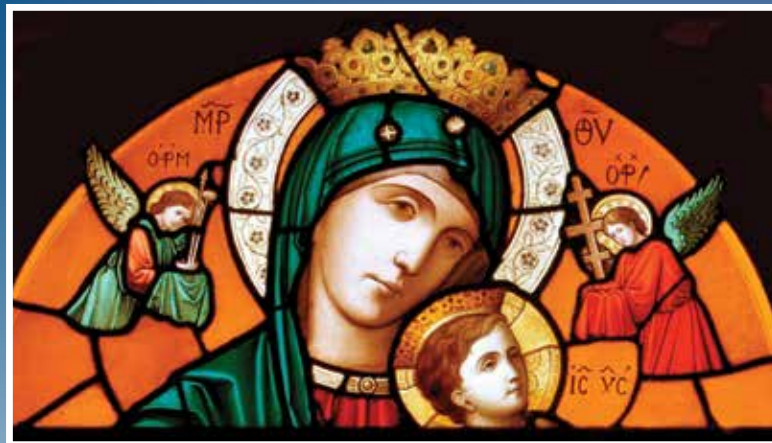

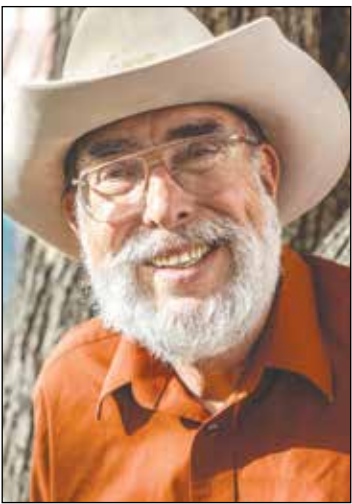

Taxpayers Gouged at the Pump

Commentary by Senator Ted Gaines

Here are a few facts that should give pause to anyone supporting California's new gas tax: CalTrans is overstaffed by 3,500 people, wasting \$500 million every year that could be going to roads; California diverts a billion dollars in "weight fees" into the general fund annually, which should also be paying for roads; Californians already pay some of the highest gas taxes in the country but have some of the worst roads, which points to an efficiency problem.

It's plain to see that the fake funding crisis used to push the new taxes through the legislature was really a crisis of political priorities. The money is there – without the new taxes – to pay for modern, smooth roadways up and down the state.

Still, the legislature has a default position, and that's to pickpocket taxpayers and businesses at every turn. Hence the new tax to backfill the waste and diversions that should be paying for roads right now.

Governor Brown, oblivious to the actual effect the bill will

have on businesses and families, tried to deflect criticisms of the new tax's cost by noting that it will set back the average family about \$10 a month.

Are my rural constituents, who drive 45 minutes to get to the grocery store, supposed to be happy because of that average? Are my suburban commuters putting 80 miles a day on their cars supposed to be happy with that average? It will be meaningless to them, as they will pay hundreds of dollars more a year in gas taxes and registration fees to pay for roads that their tax dollars already could have and should have paid for.

Because of this government decision to raise gas taxes \$.12 a gallon, diesel \$.20, and add an additional registration fee of \$25-\$175 on each vehicle (and that is just a partial list of the new charges), everyone in the state can expect to pay more for everything they buy, from school clothes to groceries to laptops. Not because the items are better, but because California legislators are attaching a premium to everything with their relentless search for tax dollars.

These new taxes and fees

aren't one-time charges. They go on forever under the current bill, and will start increasing, indefinitely, starting in 2020.

I want a first-class infrastructure for our state and am willing to pay for it, but not twice. That's what this cynical bill does to our citizens. It forces them to pay a second time for roads that their tax dollars already could have built. It's backfilling an imaginary shortfall to cover up government failure.

A state that can afford to waste tens of billions of dollars on the colossally expensive and worthless High Speed Rail is not a state starving for money. To California's majority party, though, every problem looks like a deficit and every solution looks like a tax. It's killing the middle- and lower-classes in the state.

Our state has the 48th-worst tax climate already, but this gas tax proves, yet again, that legislators can't leave unwell enough alone.

California 'Bail Reform' Legislation Aces Out Crime Victims

Liberal legislators in Sacramento are continuing their efforts to change California's criminal justice system with a new proposal for "bail reform" that leaves victims of crime out in the cold.

From the politicians' perspective, their reforms are aimed at making the system more equitable for those accused and convicted of criminal activity.

In two identical proposals by two Capitol Democrats - State Senator Robert Hertzberg (D-Encino), primary author of Senate Bill 10, and Assemblyman Rob Bonta (D-Alameda), primary author of Assembly Bill 42 - the state would fundamentally overhaul the pre-trial release process, largely doing away with the surety bail system. That system would be replaced with one that has a heavy bias towards releasing those charged with non-violent, non-serious felonies (including residential burglary) and misdemeanors on their word that they will return to court for their required appearances.

The mirror proposals going through the legislative process would also reduce the current bail schedule based on seriousness of charges to a new method where a judge must set bail at the lowest amount possible that a judge feels would be necessary to ensure the accused individual would not be a flight risk.

However, a review of the legislation reveals that it is structured in a way to significantly reduce the role of crime victims in this process, despite the passage in 2008 by voters of a Crime Victims' Bill of Rights, Marsy's Law, to ensure that victims would have, among other rights, the ability to have a voice in the criminal justice

process.

Under the current system, the potential pre-trial release of someone charged with a crime takes place at an arraignment hearing. California's Constitution requires that victims be notified of public hearings, and that they have a right to be present, and to be able to make a statement to the judge. These rights not only ensure that victims are treated with dignity and respect, but also allow a victim to weigh in on potential release conditions.

The proposals by Hertzberg and Bonta would, in the case of all misdemeanors and many felonies, shift the decision process on pre-trial release of those charged with crimes from a hearing (where victims have rights) to an administrative process where an agency completes a pre-trial assessment report and arrestees are released without a public hearing at all, based on findings in the report.

Nowhere in the legislation is consideration given to provide victims with notification that this assessment is taking place. Nowhere is a victim given an opportunity to provide input to the assessment. If a victim has a concern for his or her safety, and perhaps would like a protective order against the individual being released, there is no way for the victim to be heard, or for his or her concerns to be taken into account.

This effort made headlines this week when famed bounty hunter Duane Chapman, the star of the reality TV show "Dog The Bounty Hunter" for eight seasons, appeared in an Assembly Public Safety Committee hearing to testify against the legislation. The Committee narrowly passed the legislation, with three Democrats voting yes, one Democrat abstaining, and the two Republicans voting no.

The Senate version of the bill passed through that chamber's Public Safety Committee earlier this month, with all five Democrats voting yes, and the lone Republican vote against it. Both bills must pass an additional committee before heading to the Assembly and Senate floors, respectively, for a full vote. Ultimately one of the bills will need to cross over and be passed by the other chamber before heading to the Governor's desk.

Primary supporters of this legislation include the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), public defenders, and criminal defense lawyers, as well as various social justice groups - primarily arguing that the current system disadvantages those who cannot afford to pay bail.

Opponents are largely public safety organizations and, of course, bail bonds companies - who feel that this change would lead to an increased number of those accused of crimes fleeing, or committing other crimes while released.

This legislation follows on the heels of other controversial changes to the criminal justice system in California, including prison realignment, a ballot measure approved that reduced sentencing guidelines for many significant crimes; and a proposal approved by voters last November that ends determinative sentencing, and which will allow a great many convicted felons to come up for parole significantly earlier.

These ballot measures were passed largely on the strength of misleading ballot titles and summaries issued by then-Attorney General, now U.S. Senator, Kamala Harris.

recognized was Sacramento Teen/Animal Membership program (S.T.A.M.P.). S.T.A.M.P. consists of 12-18 year old participants and meets every other Saturday and Sunday at the Bradshaw Animal Shelter. They happily complete basic shelter cleaning tasks and creative projects, alike, and play with the shelter animals. Their very successful pet reading program was recognized nationally with inclusion in the PBS documentary series, "Shelter Me" which spotlights unique and innovative programs that have a direct and positive impact on the animals within municipal shelters.

Like myriad counties across the country, Sacramento is experiencing an increase in opioid addiction and accidental overdoses. Megan Key was honored

for donating 300 hours over a six-month period to Sacramento County Public Health in its work toward reducing opioid abuse, overdoses and deaths in Sacramento County. Megan Key is the primary author of the "Sacramento Prescription Drug Surveillance Report, 2015." She helped the Epidemiology Unit to provide insightful interpretation of trends in opioid prescribing, develop recommended actions, and establish concrete goals for the County and Sacramento Area Opioid Taskforce.

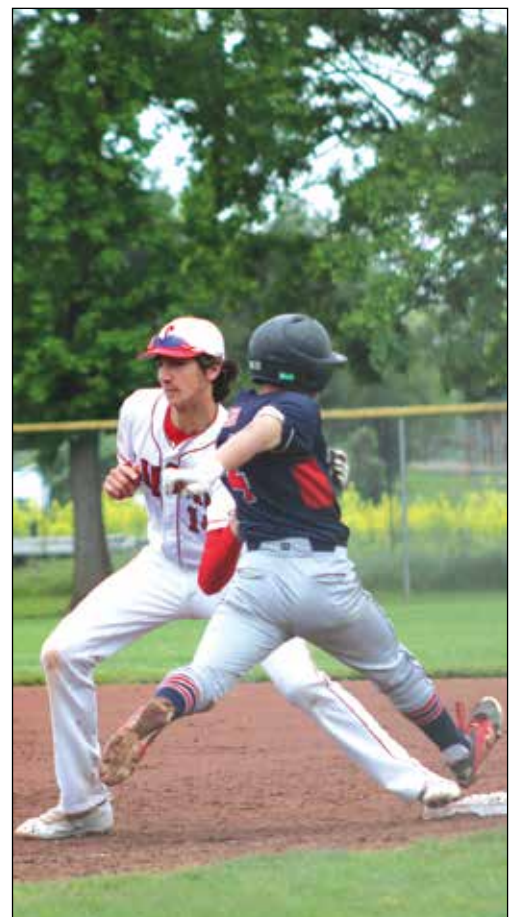
