Local Muralist Brings "Serenity" to Veterans

MATHER, CA (MPG) -The Sacramento Veterans Administration Medical Center at Mather recently unveiled a new addition to its Meditation Garden. The new feature, named "Serenity," is a mosaic mural by Rancho Cordova artist Robin Moyher.

The Meditation Garden was designed for veterans to have a peaceful place to reflect, but Moyher wondered if she could use her skills as an artist to add to the space, bringing some color and texture to enhance the experience for visitors to the garden.

Moyher was able to collaborate with other artists, community volunteers, the Veterans Administration and the City of Rancho Cordova to produce the seven foot tall wall mural, depicting a landscape lush with the tranquil presence of butterflies, flowers and a dove.

The project was open to volunteers, including veterans and their families with all materials supplied. In addition to the coordination efforts of Veterans Administration Voluntary Service Program Director Maria Almes, Moyher also received a grant from the City of Rancho Cordova.

"Rancho Cordova artist Robin Moyher, the VA Northern California Health Care System, and the City of Rancho Cordova have stepped in to make the experience even brighter for those who served our country," according to City spokesperson Ashley Downton. "Rancho Cordova values its veterans, as well as art in public places. Three partners came together to support these veterans through art."

The City provided a grant from its Community Enhancement Fund to cover the expenses of tools and supplies, said Downton. "Robin Moyher dreamed the idea to create a mosaic mural to encourage the arts, honor the sacrifices veterans and their families have made for our country, and create a lasting memento of beauty and community pride in Rancho Cordova," she said.

The dedication took place on March 28 at the VA Medical Center with Rancho Cordova Vice-Mayor Linda Budge and other dignitaries in attendance. In addition to Moyher's leading vision and hands-on talent, the work represents over 40 other mosaic artists from 16 states and three foreign countries. The piece took Moyher

approximately seven months of her own time and 500 hours to complete.

Moyher also took to social media in her campaign to enlist volunteers from across the globe. She held workshops to familiarize volunteers with the medium and materials. Moyher made special efforts to encourage and welcome the veterans themselves, along with their family members to participate in the tactile experience of

creating meaningful works of art. The benefits of art for therapy are well documented scientifically in helping patients process trauma and improve healing outcomes.

The Sacramento VA Medical Center at Mather serves more than 500,000 patients each year. The garden is open for veterans, their families and visitors to enjoy and is located on the Medical Center grounds at 10535 Hospital Way, Mather. ★

Sacramento Employment Trends

Hard to Find, Hard to Keep as Job Market Soars

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- High anxiety, finding qualified applicants and retaining current workers are on the minds of Sacramento regional employers as hiring soars. In the next three months over three-quarters of top regional employers polled are in the hiring market. Among the highest number recorded since the Trends Survey began in 1992, seventy-seven percent (77%) of companies polled directly by phone say they are motivated to hire in Q2.

However, growing strength of the economy brings issues that concern regional employers including hiring qualified workers. Seven percent (7%) of those polled between February 22 and March 23, report shortages of qualified skills while others are challenged to find anyone for entry level and general labor positions.

While Sacramento regional employers tell Pacific Staffing twenty-one percent (21%) of hiring is motivated by the need for replacements within existing workforce, twenty-six percent (26%) say hiring is necessary for growth of the business. Employers are also hiring more for seasonal demands in Q2 than in past years as twenty-three percent (23%) say hiring is seasonal. Not one employer reported any plans for reductions or layoffs.

While hiring issues like retention and applicants are market challenges, in anecdotal comment HR company contacts also report a high level of frustration and anxiety in developments over potential political changes to alter or eliminate the Affordable Care Act. Complaints include recent completion of changes to the new healthcare requirements, development of compliance within the framework and education of workforce in ACA. With countless hours over several years invested in meeting ACA demands employers are not happy at not knowing what the future may bring or interested in investing more time and money in making changes.

Drivers remain a challenge to bottling, product distribution, route delivery, manufacturers and construction firms. Other shortages for skilled trades, equipment operators and estimators remain an issue in Construction. Employers are also seeking IT, especially software development and digital networking while others seek accounting/bookkeeping, general office/clerical, customer service, sales and manufacturing, warehouse and shipping workers.

FCUSD Focusing on New Superintendent Search

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Following the current Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) Superintendent Deborah Bettencourt's public announcement of her intent to retire from her position as superintendent of schools at the close of the 2016-2017 academic year, the FCUSD is now reporting that it is nearing the candidate interview phase of the search for a new superintendent. The application process closed March 13.

"The 22 applicants who completed the application process include a diverse pool of candidates from various backgrounds, including people who currently serve as superintendents, deputy and assistant superintendents, and other positions of school administration," according to a FCUSD press release.

The search firm Leadership

Associates used input taken from stakeholder, public and community forums to author the job description used to screen applicants for the new superintendent position.

The FCUSD states that, "This

depth of experience and breadth of candidates is attributable to the confidential search process chosen by the Board. This encourages a broader array of applicants who might otherwise be hesitant to publicly announce their candidacy. The search firm is now in the process of vetting the applicants. The next step is for the Board of Education to review the vetted applicants and select those who will be interviewed."

The Board will hold a special closed session meeting on April 13 at the Education Services Center Board Room at 6 p.m. to determine which candidates will be interviewed. After that date closed session interviews will take place on April 22 and 23.

CLARIFICATION: In the March 31, 2017 edition of the Rancho Cordova Grapevine Independent, documents supplied to the Grapevine from Rancho Cordova resident Michael Zechlin cited numbers from the City Budgets from 2014-2015 totaling \$4,208,500 in fines and forfeitures. The

City has clarified those figures, specifically in regard to Code Enforcement and provided additional details for the public to be made aware of.

For the Rancho Cordova City Budget year 2014/2015, Code Enforcement reports \$269,144 and for budget year 2015/2106 the annual total is

\$260,051.

"These were fines related to general code violations, rental housing violations, as well as vacant unsecured buildings," according to Maria Kniestedt, Communications & Legislative Affairs Manager for the City of Rancho Cordova.

New California Law Puts Charge in Lead-Acid Battery Sales

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Beginning April 1, 2017, sales of lead-acid batteries will be subject to two \$1 fees. Manufacturers will pay a \$1 fee for every lead-acid battery sold to a retailer, wholesaler, distributor, or other person for retail sale in California. Consumers will pay a \$1 fee on each purchase of a replacement lead-acid battery.

As signed into law by Governor Jerry Brown, the Lead-Acid Battery Recycling Act of 2016 requires retailers to register, collect, and remit the fee to the Board of Equalization (BOE); and manufacturers to register and remit the fee to the BOE. Manufacturers who are considered retailers are required

to collect the \$1 California battery fee as well as pay the \$1 manufacturer battery fee. Retailers who purchase and import lead-acid batteries from a manufacturer who is not subject to the jurisdiction of California must pay the \$1 manufacturer battery fee.

A lead-acid battery – the type commonly found in vehicles – is any battery that weighs more than five kilograms (11 pounds), is composed primarily of both lead and sulfuric acid, and has a capacity of six or more volts. Retailers will charge a refundable deposit, subject to sales tax, when a consumer purchases a replacement lead-acid battery and does not simultaneously


provide a used lead-acid battery to the dealer.

The fee is expected to generate \$26 million annually. Revenues collected will be deposited into the Lead-Acid Battery Cleanup Fund, where they will be used to investigate, evaluate, clean up, remediate, remove, monitor, or otherwise respond to any area in the state that may have been contaminated by the operation of a lead-acid battery recycling facility.

Beginning April 1, 2022, manufacturers will no longer be required to collect and remit the \$1 fee. Instead, consumers will pay a \$2 fee upon purchase of a replacement lead-acid battery.

Ganned if You Do, Ganned if You Don't

From the same governor who brought you the illegal fire tax now comes a plan to blow the top off California's spending cap and leave taxpayers on the hook for tens of billions in extra taxes. It's a bad idea that fractures the faith between citizens and government and spells trouble for California's fiscal future.

With California's runaway spending, it's hard to believe the state even has an expenditure limit. But in 1979, a year after signing off on the revolutionary Prop. 13, voters passed Proposition 4, implementing the "Gann Limit," which would peg California's state spending to the 1978-79 level and only let it grow adjusted for inflation and population. State revenues above the voter-approved limit actually had to be refunded to taxpayers, an event that would cause panic attacks in today's money-hungry capitol.

In 1986-87, a boon year for tax revenues, the state issued more

than one billion dollars in rebates to relieved taxpayers who finally had some protection from an insatiable Sacramento.

Alas, it was too good to go on forever. Proposition 111 in 1990 defanged the Gann Limit, weakening its terms, and it now rarely factors into budgeting decisions.

But, weak as it is, it's still on the books, and there is no ceiling too high for the Democrats when it comes to government spending. Governor Brown's new budget proposal is straining against even the wilted Gann Limit, and he's going to do something about it.

Is he going to cut spending? Is he going to refund taxpayers? Or is he going to manipulate the budget to carve out more room to spend?

If you went with manipulate, I've got a job in the California Department of Finance for you.

Brown proposes taking \$22 billion off the Gann Limit books this year. The money would not be accounted for as state spending or as local spending, as required in the original Proposition. For Gann Limit purposes it would just disappear, like the hopes of fiscal conservatives all around the state, if his scheme is successful.

In essence, he would open up an avenue for another \$22 billion in spending by reclassifying the current \$22 billion. He would not spend less, he would not adhere to the even the watered-down mandates of the 1979 Gann Limit reform, he would just trick his way around the spending cap.

Try this sort of deception on your

tax return to see how the state normally views creative exemptions of the sort they are practicing now.

Spending is taxes. The two can't be separated, and Governor Brown's bad-faith end-run around the Gann Limit guarantees a heavier load for California taxpayers and a California perpetually stretched to its fiscal limit.

I have a novel idea: Live up to the law. If taxpayers deserve rebates, give them rebates! Don't twist and distort or outright ignore the law just because it lets taxpayers keep more of their money. They earned it in the first place; it's not a gift that a benevolent government doles out.

If the state is bringing in too much money and spending too much, get rid of the illegal fire tax or cut the Vehicle License Fee. Cut tax rates! That would put more money back in people's pockets without putting the government in the way as a rebate middleman.

The Gann Limit has been little more than a rumor for decades, but it is a rule passed by the people to protect them from just the kind of spending excess proposed by Governor Brown. It's a sad commentary on our state, but when it comes to raising your taxes, rules seem made to be broken.

Sacramento is a Synergistic Startup Epicenter

It's no secret Sacramento is a terrific environment for startups with university talent, investors, accelerator and startup programs, driving distance to the Bay Area, and an international airport, not to mention great quality of life. What is less known are the many features that distinguish us from other startup-friendly communities.

First, there's our senior population. Americans aged 65 and older are expected to grow from 46 million to more than 98 million by 2060. California is projected to be among the fastest growing states. Californians age 60+ are expected to grow more than twice as fast as the total state population. By 2040, nearly 500,000 people age 60 and over are expected to live in Sacramento County.

A growing field addressing the needs of seniors is gerontechnology, a combination of gerontology and technology. It blends technology and innovation to address the challenges of aging and caregiving. For the savvy entrepreneur, it's potentially the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow.

AARP reported in January 2016, "Companies from established multinationals to startups, mass-market firms to niche players, are recognizing a (senior) caregiving market opportunity that's expected to reach \$72 billion in 2020 alone. The cumulative total for 2016-2020 is expected to be \$279 billion."

A second unique feature is that in the west coast, Sacramento most reflects the overall makeup of the United States. An indication of how a product or service

may perform nationally can be obtained locally. For startups targeting the 60+ crowd, Sacramento seniors offer an invaluable wealth of feedback to entrepreneurs. Innovation and technology may come from the youth, but practicality, insights and reality checks come from seniors.

A third feature of Sacramento is the growing infrastructure of startup support. In addition to the Hacker Lab, Urban Hive, Sacramento Entrepreneurship Academy, SCORE, Sacramento Business Services Center and numerous Meetup groups, startup specialty groups are locating in Sacramento. Aging2.0 (www.aging2.com), based in San Francisco, focuses on helping entrepreneurs who are targeting the senior market.

Keri Vogtmann, (Sacramento@Aging2.com), founder of the Sacramento Aging2.0 chapter notes, "Given the Sacramento business landscape, we have a real opportunity to be the epicenter of gerontechnology." Ms. Vogtmann is currently organizing the Sacramento Aging 2.0 pitch competition on Tuesday, April 18, 5:30 – 8:00p.m. The public is welcome to attend and vote for the startups they feel best meet the needs of seniors. Registration is at aging2.com/events.

Health 2.0 (www.health2con.com) is another startup specialty group, focusing on healthcare innovation. Keisuke Nakagawa (keisuke@whitecoat.com) is the co-founder of Health 2.0 Sacramento and of whitecoat, a startup focused on developing technologies to advance medical education and health literacy. "Sacramento and its leadership

have done a tremendous job cultivating and promoting startups. It's becoming a powerful startup ecosystem," commented Mr. Nakagawa. "This is especially true in healthcare."

Being the state capital is a fourth unique feature of Sacramento. Governments are often viewed as slow and not innovative. This is not necessarily accurate. Through policy, governments can create opportunities for startups. The critical factor is entrepreneurs' involvement in local and state government. There are numerous ways to be involved. The Sacramento County Adult and Aging Commission (www.sacramentoadultandaging.org) is one of many bodies that welcomes the involvement of private citizens. Among other things, this commission is charged with advising the Board of Supervisors on matters relating to older and dependent adults. Entrepreneurs interested in gerontechnology are welcome on this commission.

"We fail to see that there is a cause and effect in our relationship with government," said Mr. Nakagawa. "Being close to policy makers can be a strategic advantage."

The startup "bones" of Sacramento – talent, investors, support organizations, user population and geography – create a solid foundation for entrepreneurs. What makes us especially appealing for startups are our additional qualities: our vital senior population, our national profile, startup specialty groups and being the state capital. When you put it all together, Sacramento is primed to be a synergistic startup epicenter. ★

America Shouldn't Say Good-Bye to Fossil Fuels

Quick: What do makeup, prosthetics, and heart valves have in common?

Unbeknownst to most Americans, all are made possible by fossil fuels. Fossil fuels are behind almost every aspect of our daily lives -- from T-shirts to life-saving medical devices.

Unfortunately, a growing movement to keep oil and gas in the ground could cut off production of our favorite fossil fuel products. Green activists behind the effort believe continued use of oil and gas will destroy the planet.

Rather than leave fossil fuels in the ground, we should bury such

green alarmist claims. Americans wouldn't be able to survive without oil and gas. Contrary to the activist hysterics, these resources could help save the planet.

When Americans fill up their cars at the pump or turn on the burner of their stoves, they can see the benefits of fossil fuels pretty directly. But the full impact of these resources on American lives is mostly hidden. Everyday products -- lipstick, sweatshirts, laptops, hangers, Band-Aids, and credit cards -- are all produced with fossil fuels.

Seven million Americans depend on prosthetic hips or knees made with natural gas and oil. Each year, five million Americans with heart disease are given

decades more to live with heart valves only possible through fossil fuels.

Most people have little acquaintance with the importance of fossil fuels. They're ill-prepared to demand of green activists what will replace oil and gas across the full spectrum of everyday life. Are the activists prepared to jettison advanced prosthetics and go back to wooden peg-legs? Would that work with a heart valve?

Environmental group Greenpeace believes 80 percent of the world's remaining fossil fuel reserves need to remain in the ground to counter global warming.

Green activist Bill McKibben lamented that extracting too many fossil fuels would "overwhelm the

planet's physical systems."

More than 375 nongovernmental organizations penned a letter to global leaders urging them to put a halt to fossil fuel development.

Their anti-industrial goal is unrealistic and dangerous. Without oil and natural gas, every facet of our lives would be disrupted. Fossil fuels are friends, not foes, of the environment.

Fossil fuels are cleaner than ever. Thanks to cleaner-burning natural gas, carbon emissions produced by electricity are at their lowest level in 25 years. Emissions from six common pollutants plummeted 71 percent between 1970 and 2015. Modern-day cars, SUVs, and pickup trucks now run 99 percent cleaner than in

the 1970s.

The energy industry is committed to supporting the environment. Since 1990, it has invested \$322 billion -- nearly \$1,000 per American -- in making its operations more environmentally-friendly.

Increasing use of oil and gas has potential to improve the environment worldwide.

Over two billion people in developing countries rely on biomass -- wood fuel, charcoal, agricultural waste, and animal dung -- for cooking.

Burning biomass has dire health and environmental consequences. More people die each year from biomass-produced smoke than from malaria. Additionally,

biomass can result in tremendous land degradation and air pollution.

Replacing biomass with fossil fuels would be a huge boon to the environment and human well-being. The World Health Organization concluded that switching just 50 percent of households now using biomass as their primary cooking fuel over to fossil fuels would save nearly \$91 billion per year and result in "unambiguous emissions reductions from all fuels."

Oil and natural gas are essential to daily life. They don't belong in the ground. They belong in everything around us.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Democrats passed two legislative proposals (Senate Bill 6 (Hueso) and Senate Bill 54 (de León) that would make California a sanctuary state for convicted felons who are in the country illegally and provide free legal service for them. These costly and dangerous legislative proposals that create a safe haven for undocumented felons passed the Senate Monday, and are one step closer to becoming law. Former chairman of California's state parole board, Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama) issued the following statement: "College scholarships for

middle class families are slated to be chopped making way for free legal service for arrested undocumented immigrants.

"I cannot say this enough -- this is not about immigration. This is about enabling criminal behavior and activity that endangers our citizens.

"Creating a sanctuary state is dangerous for Californians; it compromises our public safety and diminishes justices."

In 2011 under President Obama, the U.S. Government Accountability Office reported that 54 percent of all undocumented criminals were arrested in California. More than 100,000

were incarcerated costing California taxpayers billions. "[A]bout 50 percent" of these undocumented offenders "were arrested at least once for either assault, homicide, robbery, a sex offense or kidnapping."

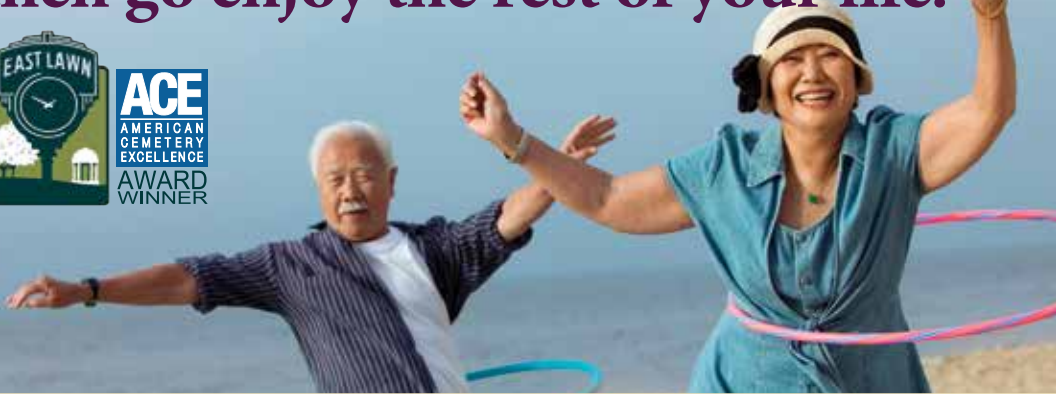

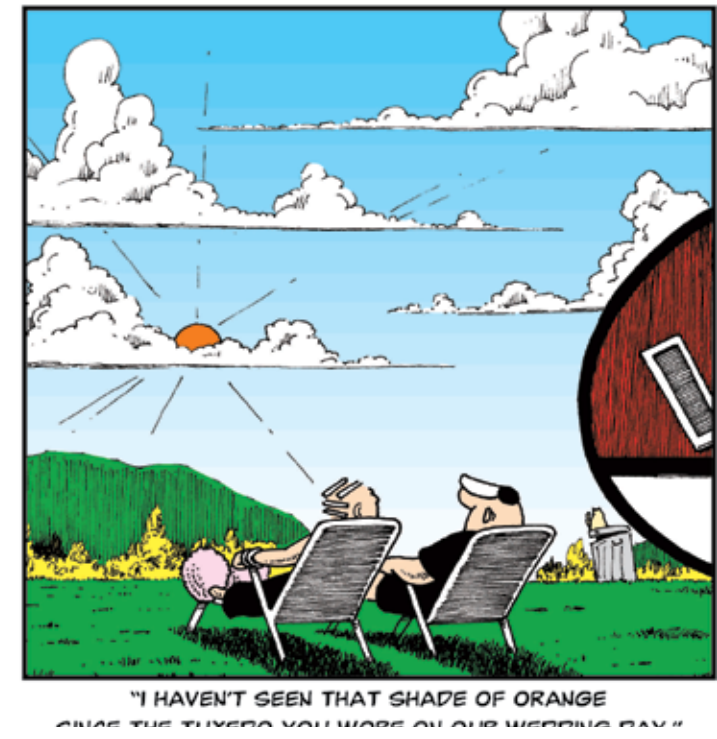

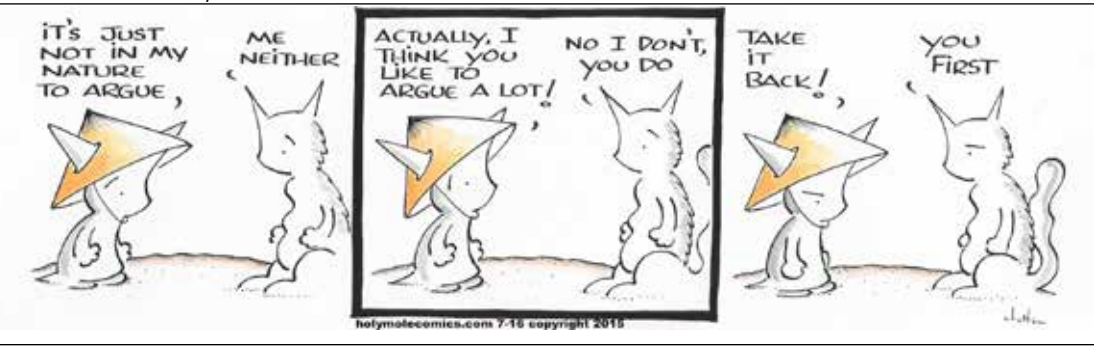

It Takes a Family for a Successful Comeback

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A little more than six years after closing down, Carmichael-based ACR Solar International is open for business and on fire, experiencing triple-digit revenue increases and finding itself basking once again in the sunlight of self-ownership.

“We started all over in 2012 with negative cash flow,” explains company founder Al C. Rich, who, along with the help of family and a few loyal team members, have brought the company back to life after it was shut down abruptly just one year after it was acquired by Folsom-based fuel cell maker, Jadoo Power Systems, Inc.

Rich initially launched the company in 1977 as AC Rich and Sun on the East Coast. It was a time when the mere mention of solar heating could set eye-balls rolling within energy expert circles loyal to interdependence on overseas oil and coal.

“When we were just getting started in Virginia, nothing much was happening with solar,” said Rich. “It was a field that many people just weren’t quite sure about yet.”

But when President Jimmy Carter vowed to reduce the country’s dependence on oil by the 1990s, new solar programs and government contracts to run them began to surface. By 1992, already widely recognized for its advances in solar, including its patented, award-winning solar

SKYLITE™ water heater, and procurement of several government consulting contracts, Rich was invited to participate in a new Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Solar Program created under S. David Freeman. It proved a real game changer.

“Thank God for David Freeman and SMUD,” said Rich. “They had a new solar program going and they got us out here in California from Virginia, and that’s how we got to Carmichael.”

The company reformed as ACR Solar, International in 1997 and established its subsidiary, solarroofs.com. In 2008, ACR Solar was named one of the fastest growing companies in Sacramento by the Sacramento Business Journal and acquired by Jadoo in 2010. Despite widespread success and a robust demand for commercial and residential solar systems, Jadoo shuttered the company the following year due to what Rich describes as “bad stock swaps.” Everyone, Rich included, got their pink slips just before Christmas.

“That was a very scary time for all of us,” said Rich, adding that he was a bit older and not sure about next steps, given the rapidly changing marketplace.

But he, along with his daughter Ashley, who has worked for AC Solar since 2006, and a few loyal employees refused to give up on the company. In 2012, Rich set out to rebuild using little more

than sweat equity to get there.

“I realized that I was going to have to hire myself if I wanted to continue,” said Rich. “But it wasn’t easy. We had to actually pay bills for the company that Jadoo never paid. We worked very hard to rebuild and it took a lot of sweat equity and loyalty.”

Today, ACR Solar has 11 full-time employees, including daughter Ashley, who serves as vice president, and Rich’s son, Clark, who oversees IT and

media. Three employees on the roster share ownership in the company, Rich said.

The first year back in business, ACR did roughly \$250,000 in sales. Last year, sales topped out

1.75 million and ACR found itself at number 14 on the Sacramento Business Journal’s list of the region’s fastest-growing companies. This year sales are expected to hit \$2 million.

So, what’s the secret sauce for keeping the company on track? “Service,” said Rich. “It’s really simple. We are doing what I’ve always done, which is provide good value, dedicated customer service and good pricing. That’s what works.” ★

FACT: A person who fills up their car’s tank once a week will pay an extra \$125 a year due to the gas tax increase. If you drive a pickup, it would be an extra \$260.

FACT: Capitol Democrats claim that we haven’t raised the gas tax in decades, but the Legislative Analyst’s Office estimates that cap and trade has created a hidden gas tax of 15 cents and recently estimated that could increase to 74 cents per gallon.

FACT: Naming a Transportation Inspector General is an artificial reform: it simply renames an existing Caltrans department and provides no independent oversight. The Assembly Republican plan would create an independent Inspector General’s Office to oversee Caltrans.

Providing roadways is a core function of our government. It’s time for Capitol Democrats to stop raiding transportation funds for pet projects and build the roads that will get Californians out of traffic.

Assembly Republicans have a plan that fully funds road repairs AND traffic relief without raising taxes on hard working Californians. ★

Lady Lancers Receive ‘Blessings’ in SVC Team Win

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Led by large contingency of under and upperclassmen, the Cordova High School girls track and field team dominated Liberty Ranch in a Sierra Valley Conference dual meet.

Hosting the Lady Hawks at Lancers Stadium on March 29th, the Lady Lancers raced to a 70-57 win over Liberty Ranch. The win gives Cordova a 1-1 record in the SVC.

In the varsity boys’ meet, Cordova also had winners in running events. But the Hawks came away with a 90-46 win over the Lancers. The Cordova frosh-soph boys squad came away with a 67-40 grounding of the Hawks.

In the varsity girls’ races, Cordova’s Blessings Norwood was a double winner. In the 400 meter race, the freshman had a time of 1 minute, 8.75 seconds. Norwood leaped her way to first place in the triple jump at 28 feet, 4 ¾ inches. She is also a member of the 4x100 and 4x400 relay teams that also took first place.

“Blessings is a hardworking and dedicated athlete,” said Cordova head coach Shane Jackson of Norwood. “She puts her full effort in everything she does. She is getting

stronger in all of her events, including the triple jump and 400 meters.”

In the 100 hurdles, Trinity Foster shined with a first place finish at 18.20 seconds. The third of the trio of Cordova girls who won their race was Ambiance Jackson, first in the 300 hurdles at 54.87 seconds.

In relay races, the Lady Lancers’ 4x100 meter relay team of Norwood, plus other

freshmen in Cara Donis, Gabriella Maduri and senior Bri Anna Samuel edged Liberty Ranch, 54.13. In the 4x400 relay race, Cordova’s Foster, Norwood, Maduri and Samuel raced to a first place finish at 4:35, with Liberty Ranch clocked at 4:50.

The field events had Cordova’s Faauga Toelee win the shot put with a toss of 34 feet, 10 inches. Faauga’s

sister, Pele Toelee captured first in the discus at 90-01.

“These young ladies are continuing the tradition of accomplished lady throwers for Cordova,” said Jackson of Pele, a sophomore and Faauga, a freshman.

Second place finishes for the Lady Lancers were Carla Donis in the 100 meters at 13.71, Gabriella Maduri at 200 meters at 29.47, Bri Anna Samuel in the 400 meters with a time of 1:10.11, Jackson in the 110 hurdles at 19.75 and Pele Toelee with a 30-11 mark in the shot put.

For the Cordova varsity boys, the 4x100 relay team of junior Tyreke Tate, Bryan Estrada, Elijah Morgera and Dante Pannell took first place with a time of 45.12. Members of the 4x400 of boys Andrew Roberts, Estrada, Morgera and Philip Cadena crossed the finish line at 3:51.62.

Tate won the triple jump at 39 feet, 1 ¼ inches. Roberts followed in top finishes for the Lancers, taking the 400 meters at 54.56.

“It has been a good year for these three hard working young men,” said Jackson of the group of Lancer boys. “So far early in the season they are on track with their training and times.”

Second place finishes for the Lancers were Morgera,

a senior, in the 100 meters at 11:53, plus the 200 meters at 23.52. Adam Holman took second in the 110 hurdles at 16.85 and the 300 hurdles with a time of 44.25.

On Wednesday, Cordova continued SVC action with another meet at El Dorado.

That will be the Lancers’ final meet until Wednesday, April 19th, when they welcome Union Mine for an SVC meet at Lancers Stadium. ★

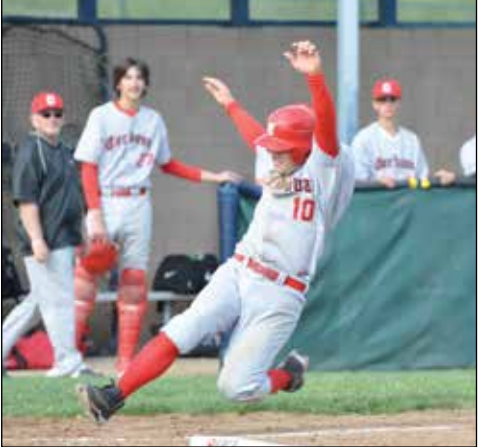
No-Hitter Gives Cordova Baseball Winning Record in SVC

Then next week, the Lancers will continue action in their own tournament.

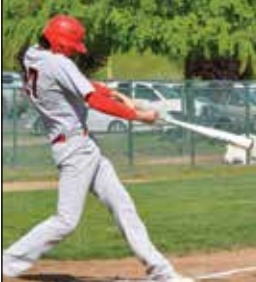
After taking last year off, the Cordova Baseball Easter Tournament returns starting on Monday. All games will be played on the Lancers’ diamond.

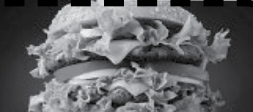
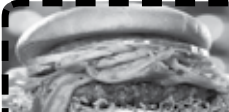

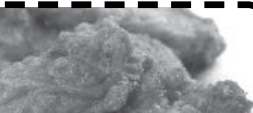
