This is the second time the WWAST will take the field here in West Sacramento after making their Raley Field debut in July of 2015. They'll take on the Sacramento All-Stars, a team composed of local personalities and celebrities. In 2015, Sacramento icons such as former NFL player Adrian Ross and KCRA Sports Anchor Lisa Gonzales were a part of the squad.

The WWAST is made up of brave men and women, both veterans and active duty soldiers, from four of the five service

branches, who have sustained injuries resulting in amputation. Through extensive rehabilitation. they have become competitive athletes again, playing against able-bodied teams in competitive, celebrity, and exhibition games across the country. In addition to functioning as an outlet for veterans and active duty soldiers to compete athletically, the WWAST uses these cross-country games to raise funds for the WWAST Kids Camp, medical research, and rehabilitation equipment.

Now in its fifth year, the WWAST Kids Camp seeks to empower young boys and girls with amputations. The camps are led by WWAST players who work as coaches and mentors, helping teach not just softball skills, but more importantly life skills as well.

The game is slated for Saturday, May 6. The WWAST will take on the Sacramento All-Stars at 3:30 p.m. in Game One of a Raley Field doubleheader. The River Cats will then host the division rival Reno Aces at 7:05 p.m. for Salute to Armed Forces.

Following the WWAST/ Sacramento All-Stars game, the River Cats will host the Reno Aces in game one of a four-game set. First pitch for part two of the doubleheader is set for 7:05 p.m. with gates to open at 3:00 p.m.

## **Sacramento Food Bank & Families Services Brings Fresh Produce to Urban Neighborhoods**

New Produce for All Truck Provides Farmers' Market Experience

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services (SFBFS), provider of food and support to 135,000 of the 242,000 members of the Sacramento community who are food insecure, just got more mobile.

Its new, Produce for All truck can motor to a destination, and because of its nifty design, roll up its side doors and distribute food akin to a famers' market. Anyone (no questions asked) can select fresh produce of their choosing from the open-air bins. The quality groceries come from regional farms and a variety of other sources.

The traveling produce truck, on the road due to the generosity

of a Sutter Health Community Benefit investment, is an important addition to SFBFS' 224 partner agencies that help to expand food distribution throughout the county.

"When one in four children in Sacramento County lives in poverty, and nearly half of our seniors don't have enough income to meet the most basic of expenses, our services are more important than ever before," says Blake Young, President/ CEO. "Our new Produce for All truck will increase our capacity to serve more residents where they live."

Transportation to one, centralized food bank in the county is often an overwhelming obstacle for food insecure families. Those who must rely on public transportation, seniors, families, the working poor, the unemployed and the disabled, can find navigating the system challenging. When fresh produce can come to them, a healthier lifestyle is more likely. SFBFS' Produce for All truck, transporting food from local growers and donors to as many as 300 families at any given stop, is also a neighborhood-by-neighborhood link to additional services such as CalFresh, employment, housing and healthcare.

"No one — regardless of income level, age, gender, race/ethnicity, marital status or community of residence — is invulnerable to the possibility of experiencing food insecurity sometime in their lives," says Young. And when that happens, by providing healthy food, we may be able to offer other assistance related to the root cause of poverty."

## Governor Brown Declares State of Emergency, Requests Presidential Major Disaster Declaration Due to Recent Storms

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On March 7th Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. requested a Presidential Major Disaster Declaration to bolster state and local recovery efforts following late January storms that caused major flooding, mudslides, power outages and damage

to critical infrastructure across California.

Governor Brown also issued two emergency proclamations due to storms in late January and February – for the counties of Alameda, Alpine, Amador, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, Del Norte, El Dorado, Fresno, Glenn, Humboldt, Kern, Kings, Lake, Lassen, Los Angeles, Marin, Mariposa, Mendocino, Merced, Modoc, Monterey, Napa, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, San Benito, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Barbara, Santa

Cruz, Shasta,

Santa

Sierra, Siskiyou, Sonoma, Stanislaus, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity, Tuolumne, Ventura, Yolo, Yuba, Contra Costa, Orange, Riverside, San Francisco and Solano – which direct Caltrans to formally request immediate assistance through the Federal Highway Administration's Emergency Relief Program. The proclamations also direct the Office of Emergency Services to provide assistance to specified counties as a result of the late January storms. Damage assessments for the February storms and for the damaged spillway at Oroville Dam are ongoing.

Today's request follows two other separate Presidential Major Disaster Declaration requests granted last month - to support the response and recovery efforts for the situation at Oroville Dam and the impacts of the early January storm system. In addition to today's action, Governor Brown has issued emergency declarations connected to storms in December and early January and Oroville Dam. Last month, Governor Brown announced a four-point plan to bolster dam safety and flood protection statewide.

## Kiyo Sato Named Woman of the Year at Annual Celebration

Assemblyman Ken Cooley and the California Legislature Recognize Sato

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) joined the California Legislative Women's Caucus to recognize women from across the state in celebration of Women's History Month. This year, Assemblyman Cooley honored Kiyo Sato of Sacramento.

"Like so many Japanese-Americans that were forced to leave their homes in a time of national panic and bigotry, Kiyo did not let it stop her from living an exceptionally full life. She joined the Air Force, became a nurse, raised her family and is now a highly-regarded author," said Assemblyman Cooley. "Kiyo has shown tremendous courage and perseverance through her entire life and I am truly honored to see her recognized at the State Capitol for all of her extraordinary achievements."

Kiyo Sato, the eldest child of a Japanese-American immigrant family, grew up before World War II with her eight brothers and sisters in Sacramento, California. Her parents established a thriving family farm on a few acres in the Mather Field area of Rancho Cordova. Home life in the Sato family was a pleasant mix of Japanese and American customs, as Kivo describes at length in her memoir Dandelion through the Crack and in her more recent book Kiyo's Story - A Japanese-American Family's Quest for the American Dream. Kiyo was 19 years old and had just started college in Sacramento when President Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066 in February, 1942,


which forcibly relocated Japanese-Americans from their homes. Kiyo and her family were forced to leave their farm with little more than the clothes on their backs and relocate to an internment camp at the Poston Indian Reservation in Arizona.

At the end of the war, Kiyo and her family were released from the prison camp and briefly worked in Colorado as seasonal laborers before they finally returned to their farm in Sacramento to rebuild their home and their lives. Kiyo's parents were able to keep their farm, but many Japanese-Americans were not so fortunate and had to start completely from scratch.

Kiyo later joined the United States Air Force, completed college with a Master's in Nursing and achieved the rank of Captain for the USAF Nurse Corps. She eventually returned home from her service, married, and started her own family in Sacramento. Her four children grew up helping with their grandparents' farm – a vital part of every Sato family member's experience.

Kiyo Sato is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Nisei Post 8985, in Sacramento. As a renowned published author, Kiyo was the winner of the 2008 William Saroyan Prize for nonfiction, and winner of the Northern California Publishers and Authors Gold Award for Best First Books, the Sacramento County Historical Society Publications Award, and the NCPA Mark Twain Award in 2012. Kiyo's favorite saying is "Kodomo no tame ni" meaning "for the sake of the children."



## Mourners Honor CHP Officer Killed in Line of Duty

#### SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

- More than a thousand mourners, dominated by members of law enforcement from police and fire divisions as far away as Utah and New Mexico, many wearing black bands across their badges in a show of solidarity, filled the sanctuary of Adventure Christian Church in Roseville March 4th to pay their respects to fallen California Highway Patrolman Lucas Chellew.

Among the mourners were the officer's sister, Hanna Chellew, who followed in her big brother's footsteps to become a member of the CHP's motorcycle division. Choking back tears, she recalled her broth-

er's wide, dimpled grin and propensity for pulling pranks, but mostly reflected upon his unwavering dedication to service and family.

"From a little sister's perspective, Lucas was the best big brother any one could ask for," she told mourners, among them, several state legislators, including Gov. Gerry Brown and Attorney General Xavier Becerra. Calling him her "role model," she said "Every year that passes, Lucas will be a year older. And I will have another year to be better. To be more like him."

Chellew, 31, graduated fourth in his class from the CHP

Academy in 2009 where he was pinned by his father, retired CHP Captain Charles Chellew. He served on the elite Mounted Patrol Unit for the Capital Protection Section before transferring to South Sacramento's West Valley motorcycle division. Some members of his squad were assigned the somber duty of carrying their fellow officer's casket into the sanctuary to the sound of bag pipes, while others offered emotional anecdotes about their

friendships with Chellew and his tenacious sense of duty.

"This is a message to you and my squad, the South Side Squad," said Chellew's commander, CHP Captain Evan Robinson. "He was a fighter pilot and bad guys beware." Speaking more directly to Chellew's family seated front row near his flag-draped casket, Robinson added "That's your son. That's your husband. That's your brother. He was all in."

"The energy, the faith, the devotion which we bring to this endeavor will light our country and all who serve it - and the glow from that fire can truly light the world," John F. Kennedy famously said. Now whether our city's endeavors can truly light the world or not, I am not sure, but the words of John F. Kennedy as he spoke of our country also seem to fit what the citizens of the City of Rancho Cordova have been trying to do since we began our own endeavor. We are doing quite a few things here that are not being done in other cities of other states. When I was first hired (elected) to the Rancho Cordova City Council, I didn't think for a moment that I was going to communicate any differently to the other people of Rancho Cordova than I had in the past. It would not only be hard to change so much, but also hard to change to the point where you would be a completely different person. We have been active members of our community for too long a time to transition into different people. We had a staff member who went to seminars and workshops for a week to learn how others help communities in their cities. And when talking to people from other cities and states, she was surprised how few other staff members can have an easy conversation with their City Councilmembers.

to be on a parallel plane because cityhood gives us a voice. Living in a bedroom community as part of the unincorporated part of Sacramento County, you are heard, but not heard well. "The energy, the faith, the devotion ... " that John F. Kennedy was speaking about for the country also applies to our city. We have been as successful as we have because so many people in Rancho Cordova put so much energy, faith, and devotion into the time they give to their community and their fellow citizens. You have to be a Rancho Cordovan to be on the City Council, and we put that same vigor, strength, and enthusiasm into our jobs that all of you put into all of your efforts.

I was looking through papers recently, and one name that kept showing up over the years, and still does today, is George Burnash. George is a wonderful example of what citizens in Rancho Cordova do once they get involved. I met George in 1975 when I first became a member of the Cordova Community Council organization. I learned a tremendous amount from George because he was already involved. And over the years of working for incorporation to become a city, George has been there working too. He is one of those Rancho Cordovans who does much and then gets done, sits back, and watches how his efforts blossom. Thanks, George. I really always appreciate your work and your friendship.

I was doing some spring cleaning on some of those papers I mentioned earlier, and while digging through a lot of stuff, I found a newspaper clipping from the San Francisco Chronicle that is dated July 1, 2003. As we get close to our 14th birthday as an incorporated city on July 1, 2017, some of what Louis Freedberg said in his article clearly applies to today. "In the old California, local government is usually viewed with suspicion and

*as disdain.* It's quaint, almost inspirational, to find just the opposite feeling here."

> "Rancho Cordova and its neighbors have, in essence, recaptured some of the spirit and energy that built California. It may be just a matter of time before the new California morphs into the old California, and also becomes a tight tangle of houses, traffic and malls. Rancho Cordova's new city fathers will have to work hard to avoid that fate. But for now, there is ample room to grow, and amazingly, room to dream," said Freedberg. Fortunately, we will continue to have ample room to grow for years, and we have many generations here who will never stop dreaming.

> With the population growth we are seeing in Rancho Cordova up to today, the connections that were established very early in our community have continued and are allowing us to keep in touch with each other. We still have that small town feeling. I am talking about connections like the Cordova Community Council, the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce, the Cordova Recreation and Park District, the many churches in Rancho Cordova, schools where kids are taught and the neighborhoods meet, all the youth sports leagues, and that only scratches the surface of the connections.





#### No magic number Dear Dave,

I'm 26, and I've been running my own business as sole proprietor for a year and a half. My gross revenues are about \$94,000, and my personal net worth is around \$68,000. Is there an asset level you recommend reaching before moving to LLC status? - Meghan

#### Dear Meghan,

There's not really a magic number for this kind of thing. In your case, I wouldn't go to the trouble for an LLC right now. You don't need the hassle of extra paperwork and the expense of processing and filing fees.

Just make sure you have normal, liability-type insurance in place. That shouldn't cost a lot of money.

The main reason you would consider shifting to an LLC is if you had reached a point in life as a business owner where you were afraid you might have a target on your back. By that, I mean you would want protection in the event of a lawsuit if your company had grown to sizable proportions and you had begun to accumulate substantial personal assets.

At this stage I don't think anyone's going to bother you.

## **Freedom of Speech Denied to** State Senator by Democrats

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Thursday, March 2nd, State Senator Janet Nguyen, a Vietnamese immigrant, strident advocate and supporter of American veterans and our American freedoms, stood up in the state legislative Senate chamber to exercise her freedom of speech and voice her opinion.

The chamber had recently heard a glowing review and tribute about Tom Hayden and the many wonderful contributions in his lifetime. After the Hayden family left the chambers, Senator Janet Nguyen stood to express her personal opinion, based upon her first-hand experience on the impact that Tom Hayden had on her country as she was growing up. She recounted that Tom Hayden, to the end, continued to defend the Hanoi communists, and disparaged and undermined not only his country but most unfairly and egregiously, the thousands of young and loyal American veterans, men and women who were willing to risk their lives to answer the call of their country to preserve basic human liberties for an American ally.

The chair of the legislative chamber, seeking to immediately cut-off her impassioned personal discourse, called for her to stop speaking. Senator Nguyen deeply offended by the many comments which directly contradicted facts and her own personal observations and experience continued her impassioned recounting of her remembrances that Tom Hayden's comments and actions had on her country and her countrymen.

The chair of the State Senate session, ultimately declared her 'out of order' and finally ordered several members of the senate sergeant-at-arms to

physically remove her from the chamber; denying her the very basic 'freedom of speech' which was her right not only as an American citizen, but also as a properly elected official in the State of California.

### **State Senate Democrats** Halt Free Speech

When I spoke on the floor of the California state Senate on Thursday, little did I know that my efforts to provide my colleagues with a different historical perspective regarding former Sen. Tom Hayden would become a national news story.

Two days earlier, the Senate honored Tom Hayden, who served in the Legislature but who also had a long history as an outspoken supporter of the communist North Vietnamese government during the Vietnam War.

Some might ask why, over four decades after the war ended, there remains so much emotion surrounding Hayden's actions. Let me explain. I was born in Vietnam and my father and uncle served in the South Vietnamese Army. My uncle was executed by the communists and my father was sought for a "re-education" camp.

As a result, we fled on a 10-meter wooden boat across the South Asia Sea to find freedom and were fortunate to find refuge in the United States, a nation founded on the principles of freedom and democracy.

It was in the interest of representing the residents of the 34th district, home to the largest community of Vietnamese

outside of Vietnam, that I felt compelled to tell my colleagues what Sen. Hayden's support of the communist regime meant to the Vietnamese-American community.

Prior to my speech, I notified the Senate Pro Tem's Office of my desire to speak on this subject matter and followed protocol. The majority party was well aware of my plans and out of respect to his family and to my colleagues I chose to step out of the chamber on Tuesday during a ceremony in his honor and waited for another time to make my comments. Nevertheless, when I spoke on Thursday I was forcibly removed from the chamber by the Sergeant-at-Arms.

I am deeply disappointed with the majority party leadership's actions because they didn't just silence my voice, they silenced the voices of the more than 930,000 residents I represent. Their actions were not the result of some arcane Senate rule or the fact I didn't follow protocol but because some senators did not like what I had to say.

In Vietnam to this day, free speech does not exist and on Thursday, I caught a glimpse of what that must be like. The freedoms we enjoy in this country are worth defending and I am proud to have been a part of that fight. As an American, I am committed to continue to fight to protect first amendment rights for the residents of my district and for the residents of the great state of California.

Janet Nguyen is a state senator representing the 34th district which includes the communities of Fountain Valley, Garden Grove, Los Alamitos, Santa Ana, Seal Beach, Westminster, unincorporated communities of Midway City and Rossmoor and portions of Anaheim, Huntington Beach, Long Beach and Orange.

### Shooter Sentenced for Murder at Home Depot Parking Lot, **Defendant Sentenced to Life for Series of Rapes**

**DATE:** February 27, 2017 **CASE:** Jeffrey Michael Caylor & Kari Ann Hamilton (Case #14F01906)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Donell Slivka, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Michael Kenny sentenced Jeffrey Michael Caylor to life in prison without the possibility of parole plus an additional 50 years and 8 months. On December 21, 2016, a jury convicted Caylor of the first-degree murder of Hassan Alawsi. The jury found true the special circumstance that Caylor shot the victim from a motor vehicle intentionally causing death and the allegation that Caylor personally and intentionally discharged a firearm causing death. Caylor was also convicted of attempted murder, assault with a firearm causing great bodily injury, robbery, burglary, vehicle theft and felon in possession of a firearm.

Kari Ann Hamilton was convicted of accessory to the murder. Hamilton was also convicted of attempted murder, robbery, burglary while armed with a firearm and vehicle theft. Hamilton's sentencing had previously been continued to March 24, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 31.

On March 16, 2014, Hassan Alawsi was sitting in his car at the Home Depot parking lot on Florin Road when Caylor drove up and shot and killed him. Hamilton was in the car with Caylor. A few hours later, Caylor and Hamilton returned to their neighborhood in Carmichael. The two accosted a neighbor, and Caylor pulled out a gun and demanded the victim give them her car keys. When the victim refused, Caylor physically assaulted the victim. The defendants then stole the victim's car. On the morning of March 17, 2014, Caylor and Hamilton drove to their prior business location in the stolen car. As they approached the business, Caylor observed the neighboring business owner. Caylor and Hamilton had a hostile business relationship with that individual. Caylor pointed a gun at the business owner and pulled the trigger three times, but the gun did not fire. That victim got the license plate of the vehicle and

called 911.

The defendants were stopped in the stolen vehicle by Chico police, which led to the discovery of the gun used to murder Mr. Alawsi and evidence linking the defendants to the assault of the second victim and car theft.

**DATE:** February 27, 2017 CASE: Jose Gomez-Garcia (Case #10F05320)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Matt Chisholm, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Shelleyanne Chang sentenced Jose Gomez-Garcia to 206 years to life in prison. On June 23, 2016, a jury convicted Gomez of six felony counts of forcible rape, two felony counts of forcible sodomy, and one felony count of forcible oral copulation. The jury also found true a multiple victim enhancement on eight counts.

From June 2002 to October 2002, Gomez-Garcia raped three women by force. Each victim was taken to a deserted warehouse parking lot and violently raped. Two of the victims were sodomized. Gomez-Garcia controlled each victim by grabbing them around the neck and making threats. All three victims immediately reported the sexual assaults to law enforcement. DNA recovered from each of the victims was analyzed by the District Attorney's Crime Lab. The three cases were linked to each other, but not to a suspect.

In 2004, Gomez-Garcia was arrested for illegal re-entry after deportation, which resulted in a federal felony conviction. While in custody, federal authorities collected Gomez-Garcia's DNA. In 2010, there was a DNA hit to Gomez-Garcia, who by that time had been deported to Mexico. Extradition proceedings were initiated and he was returned to Sacramento in 2014 to face these charges.

Gomez-Garcia has a prior 1998 strike conviction for shooting into an inhabited dwelling. ★



## **Enslaving Debt has Soured** to Almost \$20 Trillion

Within 40 days our national debt is likely to be \$20 trillion; four of which is from eight years of George W. Bush and ten from eight years of Barack Obama-the two biggest spending presidents in U.S. History. Obama alone accumulated more debt than all previous presidents put together.

So what is a trillion dollars? To begin with a trillion is the number one followed by twelve zeros. A trillion dollars is a thousand billion and a billion is a thousand million. This still means very little to my students who count their money in fives, tens and twenties.

One mathematician gave us a more practical way to evaluate our outstanding debt. One trillion, one-dollar bills stacked atop each other (not end to end but flat) would reach nearly 68,000 miles into space-a third of the way to the moon (See CNN News Cast, Feb. 4, 2009). If so, the debt incurred under President Obama alone, \$10 trillion, would reach the moon and back and to the moon again. Moreover, if you like traveling atop this stack of ones, our total \$20 trillion in debt would take you to the moon and back three times and almost to the moon again.

Senator Mitch McConnell gave another illustration just as awe striking. He calculated that if we spent a million dollars every day since Jesus was born we still would not have spent a trillion dollars—only three-fourths of a trillion dollars (ibid.).

Someone else equated our national debt to seconds and concluded that a million seconds

seconds is about 32 years. A trillion seconds is about 32,000 years thus 20 trillion seconds is 640,000 years (See CNN News Cast, Feb. 4, 2009). This only makes my head spin, as my Ph. D is not in math.

I ask my students, "Who gets to go without so that this debt can be paid?" "Go without!!!?" That is a concept foreign to this generation!! They do not know, and neither do their parents and grandparents who laid it on their backs. When they are told that their share of the debt is \$61,457 (see USDebtClock.org), due immediately, they are angry. Someone should have told them that government handouts are not free.

The 13th Amendment ending slavery has been rescinded, they are America's new slaves. Bondage was given them before their birth, or while they were in the womb, or before they were old enough to know what it meant to be sold into slavery. The past generation wanted nice costly programs for free and were willing to sell their children in order to have them. Communist China now owns an eighth of our debt and the bills are due. What is worse the older generation is still anxious to incur even more debt on our defenseless children and grandchildren. Are we not the most debt addicted, insensitive generation in U.S. History?

The latest new theory to avoid fiscal responsibility and continue unlimited spending used by Bush in late 2009 and Obama thereafter is referred to as Quantitative Easing. Crudely it means printing more money out of thin air to cover our debt, but it is far more sophisticated than that. For Bush the money supply was greatly expanded by having the Federal Reserve purchase \$600 billion in Mortgage-backed securities (Harding, Robin. 3 November 2010, Quantitative Easing Explained. Financial Times). Obama purchased \$600 billion of Treasury securities over a six month period of time beginning in November 2010 in what has been called Quantitative Easing or QE2 to distinguish it from QE1, the Bush expansion of the money supply (Cesky,

is about 11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> days and a billion Annalyn,3 Nov.2010, "QE2: Fed Pulls the Trigger" CNNmoney. com. Retrieved 10 Aug. 2011). Neither president really stimulated the economy long term or created jobs, but for a few months, like a drug high, things seemed to feel better. Other, less publicized, Quantitative Easements followed.

> The biggest problem with expanding the money supply is that it reduces the value of the money that you have in your pocket. Prices go up. My 1968 new Camaro cost me \$ 2,700. Had I instead put the money under a mattress and tried to purchase a Camaro today it would cost more than ten times that much. In this instance money has lost 90% of its value since then. Those on fixed incomes are robbed as surely as if a thief had lifted their wallet or purse. They cannot return to their employer for a raise to compensate for the loss caused by their own government.

> Still, with all the sophisticated "doublespeak," as for example quantitative easement, it means that we will print whatever money we need to purchase whatever we wish. Neither party is serious about stopping the debt and removing the bondage that we are imposing upon our children and grandchildren. In last Fall's presidential election the Democrats proposed "free" college. Donald Trump's proposed trillion-dollar infrastructure program, shared with us in his first address to Congress, does not appear to suggest a change. Who cares if our debt of dollar bills stacked upon one another can go to the moon and back three times and almost to the moon again, so long as the government fills our stomachs and, in the case of Obama, buys our cell phones?

#### **MOBILE FOOD FACILITY GREEN, YELLOW AND RED PLACARD PROGRAM**



Effective January 1, 2017, the Green-Yellow-Red (GYR) placarding program will include food trucks, also known as Mobile Food Facilities (MFFs). Similar to the existing GYR placard program for fixed food facilities, the program will provide a clear and easily recognizable means of determining the food safety status of the MFF.

The program is mandatory and will be implemented for all MFF's (food trucks) operating in Sacramento County. This notice is to inform you of the coming changes, as well as to help you understand the ways you can prepare your business for this program.

#### **Placard Criteria** PASS



. 0

A GREEN placard is issued when no more than one major violation is observed. The major violation must be corrected or mitigated during the inspection to avoid closure. **NOTE:** A reinspection may be conducted if one or more major violations have been documented on prior field inspection(s), even if a GREEN placard was issued.

#### **CONDITIONAL PASS**

A YELLOW placard is issued when two or more major violations are observed. These violations must be corrected or mitigated during the inspection to avoid closure. A reinspection will be conducted within 24-72 hours (dependent upon MFF operating schedule) to ensure all major violations remain corrected. If all major violations remain corrected during the reinspection, a GREEN placard will be issued at the reinspection. A reinspection fee of \$201 will be billed.


#### CLOSED



A RED placard is issued when an imminent threat to health and safety is observed. Examples of imminent health hazards include: no water, food temperature >41°F or <135°F, rodent/insect infestation, leaking waste water, or severe unsanitary conditions. The **RED** placard must remain posted and the MFF must remain closed until a reinspection is conducted to confirm that the imminent health hazard no longer exists. If all major violations remain corrected during the reinspection, a GREEN placard will be issued at the reinspection. A reinspection fee of \$201 will be billed.

#### Inspections

EMD inspectors will be inspecting the MFF while it is operating, at least one time per year. (NOTE: The operator is not required to stop serving customers during the inspection.) A Green, Yellow, or Red placard will only be issued during operational inspections and must be kept posted on the MFF, within 2 feet of the service window or service area.



Education Classes

EMD offers FREE "How to Get a Green Placard" training classes, designed for MFF operators. The specific criteria for the placard program, as well as basic food safety training will be reviewed in each class. The goal of these classes is to ensure each attendee has a complete understanding of how to receive and maintain a GREEN placard. Each class is 90 minutes. ## The End of Diabetes is Within Reach between 2004 and 2014.

The Food and Drug Administration just approved what could be one of the biggest breakthroughs in the treatment of type 1 diabetes in decades.

Dubbed an "artificial pancreas," the MiniMed 670G is an implantable pump that senses blood glucose levels and delivers precise insulin doses to diabetic patients. Devices like these could make syringes for injecting insulin and manual blood monitors obsolete.

Unfortunately, victories like this in the battle against diabetes remain rare. Even though the condition is one of the top causes of death in the United States, research into it is grossly underfunded. Just as troubling, public awareness of how to prevent diabetes -- and how to manage it effectively -- remains inadequate.

The medical community has the power to stop the diabetes epidemic in its tracks -- but only if it makes diabetes research and education a bigger priority.

About one in 10 Americans currently suffers from diabetes. Worse, incidence of the disease has been rising for years. The number of cases in the United States shot up 44 percent

Diabetes takes a toll not just on the health of millions of Americans but on the economy, too. The disease costs Florida over \$24 billion a year -- and the entire country about \$250 billion annually. That's bigger than the yearly economic output of most states.

Compared to these staggering treatment costs, research funding for diabetes is a pittance.

Consider that the disease kills 28 times more Americans each year than HIV/AIDS. Yet the National Institutes of Health spend nearly three times as much annually on HIV/AIDS research as on diabetes research.

Given the enormous promise of today's diabetes research, this lack of funding is a missed opportunity.

Researchers at Harvard and MIT, for instance, are exploring a technique for making large numbers of insulin-creating cells that, once delivered to type 1 diabetes patients, could keep the disease at bay for years at a time. Johnson & Johnson, together with biotech firm Viacyte, is currently developing the first-ever stem-cell treatment for diabetes. In short, we've never been closer to curing diabetes. But meeting that goal will take far longer if research funding

remains as sparse as it is today. Halting the epidemic will also require a more aggressive effort to prevent and diagnose the disease. More than one-third of American adults have pre-diabetes -- the kinds of elevated blood sugar levels that often lead to diabetes. Yet 90 percent of these individuals aren't aware of their condition.

This is where government agencies and academic institutions could have a significant impact.

The school I teach at, St. George's University in Grenada, has already taken up this cause. We're collaborating with Grenada's Ministry of Health on a school nutrition policy to advocate for healthy consumption habits. We've also worked with the ministry to launch programs that promote physical activity in schools and offer exercise classes to the community.

Ending the diabetes epidemic is within reach -- if we commit to funding the most promising medical research and effectively educating the public about the disease.



RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) In his first season as the Cordova High School baseball head coach last spring, Doug Hughes had no junior varsity team.

Now in his second season, there are 13 players for the varsity team. Plus, there are enough underclassmen to field a Lancer JV team. The last time that the Cordova baseball program fielded a JV squad was in 2014. "It's exactly what we needed to turn the baseball program around," Hughes said.

Hughes and the Cordova varsity baseball squad are looking to turn their fortunes around this season. In 2016, the Lancers posted a 5-10 record in the Sierra Valley Conference and 6-15-1 overall. This season, the Lancers have started the season with an 0-2 mark. Those defeats came at the hands of McClatchy, 10-0, on March 1st and an 8-0 setback to Winters on Feb. 25th.

Despite the losses, Hughes is beyond optimistic about this year's team. That is because the Lancers have experienced back on the field.

"We are fortunate enough to have the majority of our players back," Hughes said.

Returning this season for the Lancers are four seniors in catcher/pitcher/shortstop Logan Appino, pitcher/first baseman/ catcher Spencer Gudgel, second baseman/pitcher Jordan Meyers, pitcher/first baseman/outfielder Austin Smith and infielder Zack Guererro. Another senior this

year's team who didn't play last spring is outfielder Elias Acevedo.

The juniors on this year's squad are outfielder/utility Jeremy Buck, leftfielder and pitcher Colby McDonald, a transfer from Pleasant Grove High School of Elk Grove, outfielder/pitcher Trevor Ready and outfielder Benito Soto.

Two sophomores are on this year's team. Ryan Tipton, who started as a freshman last spring, returns as a sophomore at the third base spot. He's also projected to see some time on the mound for the Lancers. The other is shortstop/catcher/pitcher Nick Ravareau.

Another newcomer to the Lancers is Jesse Ortiz, a transfer from Grant High School. According to Hughes, McDonald is eligible to play immediately because he didn't play baseball at Pleasant Grove. But Ortiz played in the Lancers' program before transferring to Cordova. 





