Youth Rugby Tourney Coming to Town

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - This weekend marks the beginning of the 2017 rugby season, with Rancho Cordova again hosting the 33rd Annual Kick Off Tournament (KOT). The Cordova High School fields will be filled with over 100 youth teams from California and beyond who will travel all the way to Rancho Cordova to participate in the two-day event.

"This is the largest youth rugby tournament in the northern hemisphere," said Jerry Ahlin, of the Sacramento Valley Rugby Foundation (SVRF) and the KOT Director. In addition to multiple games, the KOT Vendor Village will have food vendors, and multiple booths selling souvenir clothing and equipment.

Boys and girls teams consist of youth and high school-age players from under 8 to 18, according to Nick Freitas, Sacramento

Valley Regional Development Officer for Rugby NorCal. There are 100 teams, 60 referees and 1500 people daily, with games going from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Rugby is touted as a game suitable for all ages. Freitas explains, "I can go one and on about this one but I'll give the simple answer. Everyone gets to touch the ball during a game, multiple times. It also helps develop a well-rounded person or athlete. In rugby you can pass the ball, kick the ball or simply run [the ball]. It is also an amazing aerobic experience as the game never stops. You truly have to work as a



team in rugby, the sport develops individual who can communicate and operate as a cohesive unit better than any other sport I've been a part of."

Rancho Cordova City Council Capsule

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - This week's meeting of the Rancho Cordova City Council was called to order with an invitation for new Rancho Cordova Chief of Police Christopher Pittman to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. Vice Mayor Linda Budge ran the meeting in place of Mayor Donald Terry who was absent and attending a political conference.

Public Hearing Items included consideration of an Administrative Use Permit and Conditional Use Permit and a letter of Public Convenience and Necessity for the Mi Rancho Grocery Store located at 10669 Coloma Road, to sell beer and wine off-site. Store owners had worked with

the Rancho Cordova Police Department in examining the possible increase of crime in the area and to make sure appropriate safety and security measures were made. Several Councilmembers had been to the market and found it both attractive and nicely stocked with fresh fruits, vegetables and meats. According to Vice Mayor Budge, "I thought it was adorable." The market is located in the Rossmoor Shopping Center. The resolution passed and the applicant can now apply to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, the next step in the permitting process.

Regular Calendar Items considered by the Council were the Approval of Final Design and Location of Folsom Boulevard

Murals and the selection of Lincoln Village Art Installation and related details. Many of the artists who had submitted selected works were in attendance. The works are intended to improve and enhance the cityscape for residents and visitors and feature a distinct flavor of expression by each art group. Some additional adaptations to plans were requested of the artists and a subcommittee formed by the City Council will continue to work out details of the beautification project.

The Council also discussed and considered the intended Horizons at New Rancho Affordable Senior Housing Project and adapting to Affordable Housing for Families. The Vice Mayor referred to a comparable example in another

city, citing it as a possible model for the New Rancho site. Funding gained for the housing is rapidly aging and must be spent soon, but the distribution of the monies was based on the development being solely for seniors. The multi-generational housing model referred to by Budge is in step with current design theory, but there remained some question as to the current design specifications of New Rancho being large enough to accommodate families.

Finally, City Staff asked the Council to adopt a resolution for the purchase of property at 3303 Luyung Drive to develop a corporation yard for the city. Per asking price and current valuation, the investment in the land would be over \$1 million. ★

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - An officer involved shooting and the arrest of a known drug dealer were two of the Rancho Cordova Police Department's (RCPD) major incidents this week. According to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Spokesman Sergeant Tony Turnbull, a wanted suspect pulled a gun on officers at a storage facility in Rancho Cordova in the 2600 block of Sunrise Avenue. The 29 year old male suspect had outstanding felony warrants and law enforcement had been searching for him for several days and acted on a tip about the suspect's whereabouts.

When officers from the Sheriff's Department Major Crimes Bureau and Special Enforcement Detail located the man, he was inside a vehicle, with a gun in his hand. According to the Sacramento

County Sheriff's Department, "As detectives went to make contact with the suspect, he exited the passenger side of the car with a handgun in his hand. The suspect began to raise the handgun. Fearing for his safety, one of the detectives discharged his firearm at the suspect. The suspect was struck by gunfire and fled on foot into a portal door leading into the storage building. The suspect was subsequently taken into custody and the handgun was secured. Deputies immediately began life saving measures."

The Sacramento Metro Fire Department arrived on scene and the suspect was transported to a local hospital where he remained until Tuesday evening. According to new Rancho Cordova Police Department Chief Christopher Pittman, the suspect was released and transported to the Sacramento

County Jail late Tuesday. The injured suspect had outstanding felony warrants for his arrest. One warrant was for burglary, grand theft, receiving stolen property and possession of a firearm by a felon and the second was for a violation of mandatory supervision. No one else was injured. An investigation is underway. The officer involved is a fourteen-year veteran and per policy and procedure, is on paid administrative leave pending the investigation. Also on January 13, the RCPD Crime Suppression Unit (CSU) made use of another tip on the location of a suspect known to be a drug dealer on probation. A probation search found the man in possession of a large quantity of methamphetamine. The suspect was subsequently arrested and booked on new charges. ★

New Construction Projects Begin in Rancho Cordova


RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is starting two construction projects to improve transportation throughout the community. The Rancho Cordova Traffic Management Center Project will connect traffic signals on major City roadway corridors to ensure traffic flows more smoothly. This will also allow the City to respond more efficiently to traffic incidents. The first part of the project will take place in January on Folsom Boulevard from Bradshaw Road to Rod Beaudry Drive. The project is anticipated to be completed by Summer 2017.

The Rancho Cordova Justinian Drive at Sunrise Boulevard Signalization Project will install a new traffic signal at the intersection of Sunrise Boulevard and Justinian Drive near the Anatolia neighborhood. The project will create safe routes for residents to walk, bike and drive throughout the area, and it will increase accessibility by allowing drivers to turn left from Justinian Drive to travel southbound on Sunrise Boulevard. The project will also create safe routes to Heron Landing Park, a new community park under construction near the

intersection. The project is anticipated to be completed by Summer 2017. Construction will take place Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Expect intermittent lane and sidewalk closures and minor delays during the project. names haven't been submitted there, and there are even more veterans that are members of the American Legion, The Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, and many other organizations. Those names would all be placed on the plaque or monument or.... And I'm not just talking about veterans who have died – you don't have to have died to have your name on the monument.

That form is only a guide to provide basic information like name, branch of the service, time spent in the military, and where they served. There is a place on the form that asks if the veteran died in the service. And when one veteran who filled out the form answered that question, he said "Not yet!" That definitely sounds like a crack you would expect to receive from someone who served in the military.

The location for a Fisher House, or a comfort home where families can stay for free when a loved one is receiving treatment, will be close to the Mather VA Hospital and has been narrowed down to three locations. All of them are within a block or so of the hospital, but nothing is decided yet. If things go as usual, when we finally get an actual location for the Fisher House, the location will be none of the three I am thinking about. One location is where the old bungalows were across from the Veterans Village; another location is directly south of the Veterans

Village; and the other location is one to two acres of the property that the VA Hospital is buying from Sacramento County.

When I was stationed at Mather Air Force Base, it was as secure as any base could be. The Alert Pad was where the B52's were located, and they could get their crew up in the plane and take off from the base in as many minutes as there are fingers on your hands. And usually the time was less than that when they were flying. It is hard to believe that those B52's are still part of our country's air defense, but they are work horses that will be flying into the future.

The coming Presidential Inauguration on Friday, January 20, 2017 will be an inauguration that will be remembered by the people who are paying attention today. Whether it will be an inauguration that will show respect for the Office of the President, whether you like the elected person or not, I think it should be similar to what you do when you are in the military. You salute the passing general because you show respect to the general's position or rank, not necessarily because you respect that person. Oh well. After all is said and done on this coming Friday, maybe our Senators and Congress Members will get to work.

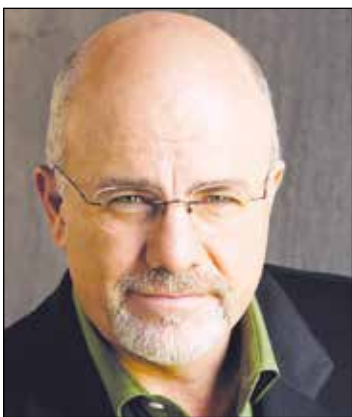

Unsung Heroines Soar in Uplifting ‘Hidden Figures’

The movie’s opening scene is a white cop harassing three black women on the side of a road with a broken-down car. Later, white colleagues of these ladies will refuse their using the same coffee pots, water fountains and toilets at work. Career advancement for these blacks and others working at NASA? Not with the policies set by their white superiors. The movie also throws in a couple of civil rights protests to stress the segregated and prejudiced South of the 1960s. And, yet, in the entire 2-hour-plus movie, not a single “N word” is heard or a drop of blood seen.

What is this, “Cool Runnings?”

While both movies address how unfairly and disgustingly bigotry oppresses black people’s dreams for greatness, a PG rating, mainstream marketing and sanitized storytelling do repress their potential to deliver indelible messages for civil rights, and in the case of “Hidden Figures,” equal rights as well. Picture “Schindler’s List” without Jews being killed or dialogue free of anti-Semitic slurs.

But like the aforementioned 1993 comedy about the Jamaican bobsled team hoping to make the Olympics, “Hidden Figures” still inspires. Big time.

Set at NASA during America’s space race with the Soviets, the Hollywoodized, yet effecting biopic follows three brilliant black female employees who, despite obstacles placed by mostly male and lily-white superiors at Langley Research Center, make significant contributions while shooting for the stars. Thanks to the movie and the book on which it’s based, by Margot Lee Shetterly, these amazing women are unsung heroines no more.

Each lady gets her day in the sun, but at center is NASA mathematician Katherine Johnson (Taraji P. Henson). Without her, John Glenn wouldn’t have been the first American in space, and man might not have landed on the moon as early as we did. Computer scientist Dorothy Vaughan (Octavia Spencer) does the work of a supervisor at Langley, but the glass ceiling is lowered for blacks, especially those who are also women. Engineer hopeful Mary Jackson

(Janelle Monae) also is hampered by a system that will require miracles and, like NASA’s space program desperately trying to catch up with the Soviets, a series of firsts. The main actresses make the most of their roles, but only one, Henson, gets the stand-taking moment that both audiences and Oscar voters love.

The mostly white supporting cast includes Kevin Costner as a driven, compassionate NASA chief and Kirsten Dunst as Dorothy’s snippy quasi-racist boss. Both are fine, which can’t be said of a lackluster Jim Parsons as NASA’s chief engineer. Haven’t seen a key role performed so flatly since Wile E. Coyote got road-killed.

Flaws notwithstanding, and they really are just nits, “Hidden Figures” blends emotion, heart, drive and even humor to engaging effect. Its Disney-like approach, where hardly a discouraging word is heard or physical struggle shown, does allow for younger audiences. With STEM and equality so key to our country’s future, maybe a movie like this being PG isn’t so bad. 4 of 5 Stars ★

What If Sick People Lose Their ObamaCare?

As Republicans contemplate repealing the Affordable Care Act (ACA or “ObamaCare”)—seriously, not just as a political gesture—alarms are sounding about millions of individuals losing coverage. So soon we have forgotten about the millions who lost coverage they had had for years because ObamaCare outlawed it. ObamaCare resulted in perhaps five times as many losers as winners—even counting just those who ended up with more expensive or less desirable coverage. If you count the taxpayers, the tally of losers is much higher. But with government largesse, the losers—the ones who have their earnings taken away—are “forgotten men.” Anyone who has government-funded benefits taken away, on the other hand, becomes a victim. The best poster children are cancer victims. They face a premature, particularly nasty death. Who would deny someone’s mother or 4-year-old daughter the chance of a cure, even if the chemotherapy costs more than \$100,000? ObamaCare would. Exchange plans have excluded the best cancer hospitals from their narrow networks. Medicaid would. It might call the treatment “experimental” or “not cost-effective.” Medicare would, possibly just because the patient is “too old” or “too young.” Unless the particular victim can be featured in a PR campaign to “save ObamaCare,” she might be “better off with the pain pill,” as President Obama put it.

And let’s not forget how the FDA has driven the costs of drug approval sky-high, suppresses therapies that have no prospect of turning billion-dollar profits, and protects manufacturers against competition when the drug is about to go off patent. The anti-leukemia drug Gleevec, for example, cost \$26,000 per year in 2001, a price called “high but fair,” considering the cost of research and the need for profits. It is \$146,000 a year today, but the introduction of cheaper generics in the U.S. is being delayed. Why can such prices be sustained? Because third parties sometimes pay them. One ObamaCare plan reportedly pays \$10,488 per month for Gleevec, from a pharmacy with which it apparently has an arrangement, although it might be available from Walgreen’s for \$4,400, and from other pharmacies for still less. What would the hapless patient do if her Exchange plan went out of business (maybe because Republicans took away its subsidies or maybe because it just failed)? One option would be to go to India and buy a year’s supply of a generic version of Gleevec for \$400. (The cost of manufacture is \$159.) In fact, the manufacturer might well give her the drug to buff up its image. But drug companies really love the third-party payment schemes, just like big hospitals do. Do the designers of ACA—which would be more aptly named the Unaffordable Care Act—really care about cancer patients? Such patients may be useful props for lobbying, but they don’t help achieve the reformers’ stated goal of maximizing “population health.” Prolonging the lives of sick people reduces the average health score. Money spent on Gleevec is diverted from reducing disparities, achieving “quality” quotas, and paying for the information technology and administrators to “document” all that (and sell the data). The current “healthcare delivery” system, including entitlement programs (e.g. Medicare and Medicaid), is about the redistribution of wealth and the

control of medical care, which enables control of the population. The idea of comprehensive third-party payment for all medical care (all that is allowed) destroys medicine—the care of the sick—while placing unsustainable burdens on the economy. The people who are terrified about losing their ObamaCare “coverage” are the very ones at greatest risk of losing their lives if ObamaCare is perpetuated. Real reform would put patients back at the center and demote insurance companies to their proper function of reimbursing subscribers for the costs of unexpected catastrophes. Costs would plummet, and innovation would soar. While the free market is building much better facilities, some patients will be caught in the transition. But we should be concerned about their actual care, not their coverage. They can be helped in many ways, without destroying arrangements that work for the 99 percent. Perhaps a dollar-for-dollar tax credit for those helping to pay for their treatment? What if we said that those who like their government medicine can keep it? Just let the rest of us go. *Jane M. Defendants Sentenced for Natomas Apartment Shooting Death Defendant Sentenced to Prison for Felony Auto Insurance Fraud National Slavery & Human Trafficking Prevention Month

DATE: January 6, 2017
CASE: Dezmon McClary & Charles Johnson (Case #15F06105)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit
The Honorable Marjorie Koller sentenced Dezmon McClary to 50 years to life in prison and Charles Johnson to 5 years, 8 months in prison. On December 8, 2016, a jury convicted McClary for the first-degree murder of Marcus Gonzalez. The jury also found true the allegation that McClary intentionally and personally discharged a firearm causing death. Charles Johnson was convicted of involuntary manslaughter while armed with a firearm, and felon in possession of a firearm. McClary had been dating a resident of the Natomas Park Apartments. On October 8, 2015, McClary became aware that his ex-girlfriend was seeing a new boyfriend. The next day, McClary and Johnson went to the ex-girlfriend’s apartment. McClary, who was armed with a shotgun, and Johnson, who was armed with a handgun, entered the apartment through an unlocked door. McClary located Marcus Gonzalez and believing him to be the new boyfriend, shot him with the shotgun.

CASE: Jada Qadir (Case #16FE019925)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kelly Mulcahy, Insurance Fraud Unit
Jada Qadir pled no contest to felony automobile insurance fraud. The Honorable Michael Bowman sentenced Qadir to 2 years state prison and ordered him to pay \$6,335 in restitution to Foremost Insurance (subsidiary of Farmers Insurance). In 2011, Qadir purchased a Harley Davidson motorcycle and completely remodeled it, including having customized murals painted on it and constructing the seat out of alligator skins. In July 2015, Qadir obtained a suspicious appraisal of \$47,000 for his Harley. He then obtained full coverage insurance at Foremost, which obtained a reputable appraisal valuing the Harley at no more than \$32,000. In October 2015, Qadir reported the Harley stolen to the Galt Police Department. Qadir claimed he was riding the Harley and ran out of gas. Qadir stated he called a cousin who took him to get a can of gas, and when they returned the Harley was gone. The next day, Qadir called Foremost and started a claim for the “theft” of the Harley. Foremost became

suspicious and investigated the claim. Foremost denied the claim because Qadir lied during the Examination under Oath and failed to provide requested documents. In 2016, authorities received information that parts from the allegedly stolen Harley were at Qadir’s home. A search warrant was served at Qadir’s residence, where officers located all of the customized painted parts as well as the alligator seat from the allegedly stolen Harley. **DATE:** January 11, 2017

In June 2015, DA Schubert announced an unprecedented partnership of roughly 30 agencies and organizations in the anti-human trafficking and exploitation coalition called “Sacramento Together.” Partners include the Sacramento County District Attorney’s Office, local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies, the Public Defender’s Office, the Probation Department, local and state public agencies, and community based organizations. One of the goals of Sacramento Together is to increase public awareness about human trafficking. Cases like the Elk Grove Uber driver, who reported the sex trafficking of a minor by her exploiters, is an example of how public awareness aids in the intervention and prevention of human trafficking. The District Attorney’s Office asks for the public’s help to combat these crimes. A call to 911 or to the national hotline (1-888-373-7888) can make the difference. Community awareness, education, and intervention efforts through the Sacramento Together coalition, specialized collaborative courts, and the Human Trafficking Task Force will remain a high priority for the District Attorney’s Office. ★

Warm climate. Cultures dating back thousands of years. Exotic destinations known for their food and wine. Luxurious floating resorts that take you there.

What's not to like about Mediterranean cruising?

Romantic Rome, alluring Athens and navigable Naples were featured in part one (<http://bit.ly/2iX6DVn>) of our Top 10 list of favorite Mediterranean ports. Now let's go on a journalistic jaunt to the fourth- through sixth-ranked exceptional destinations that delighted during back-to-back 10-day Mediterranean cruises aboard the resplendent Celebrity Reflection and bar-raising Carnival Vista.

#4: Barcelona

Spain's second-largest metropolis is the whole package, offering everything you want from a cruise port without need of a shore excursion or private guide. The city of Gaudi, Picasso and Miro doesn't take an expert to find spectacular sights, superb shopping, a breathtaking beach and fabulous food and drink. People watching also is bar none; Barcelona is blessed with model citizens – meaning so many of its people look like models!

easiest of three options to reach the plateau is a 5-Euro cable car ride with likely long lines (especially coming down). Masochists might prefer a bumpy donkey 5-Euro ride (plus tip) that several people told me is a minor hell or a zig-zagging 488-step footpath that's free, but also complementary are the aromatic and messy souvenirs left by the aforementioned beasts. Every cruiser who hoofed it by their own power or a donkey's told me later that they were too tired and sweaty to enjoy the first glimpse of the destination's famous whitewashed houses and blue domes sparkling under the sunlight. Take the cable car.

Your payoff is a place where a bad selfie background doesn't exist. Good luck not being

photobombed, though; so much beauty attracts so many people. The chalk-white buildings, crawling bougainvillea and dramatic coastline, coupled with interesting museums, churches and boutiques, lure nearly 800,000 cruisers a year, and the locals aren't too happy about that. A newly imposed cap on ship-arriving visitors has put a small dent on the number of itineraries that include Santorini, particularly during the high season of July through mid-September. But that's a small inconvenience compared to the benefits to visitors and residents alike.

The spectacular ports of Marseilles, Kusadasi, Rhodes and Mykonos and will help us round out the Top 10 next time.

For cruisers, exploring is really as simple as going into town by cab, telling the driver to plop you pretty much anywhere, then walking in any direction. Chances are you'll fall in love with this luxurious and electrifying port – and its beautiful people – whether you stroll La Rambla, the three-lined pedestrian thoroughfare popular with tourists and locals alike, or the cobblestone-paved old town known as Barri Gotic (Gothic Quarter), where Pablo Picasso and Joan Miro once dwelled. No visit is complete without paying homage to Antoni Gaudi's distinctive style of Catalan Modernism. His work graces the city's architecturally rich landscape, including at his magnum opus, the Sagrada Familia. Giant cranes have been a mainstay of

2026, the centenary of Gaudi's death. There will be plenty of toasts with glasses of cava then, but why wait as just a few steps from wherever you are likely a fantastic tapas bar or café pouring the local sparkling wine that pairs perfectly with the array of small plates ready to be devoured.

#5: Florence

The port of Livorno on the Etruscan Coast of Tuscany serves as the gateway to Florence and Pisa for more than 15 major cruise lines. Shore excursion desks keep busy fulfilling passengers' wishes to discover the area's famous religious sites.

Most large ships offer a "Florence & Pisa on Your Own" tour, and at \$90 for an adult ticket, \$80 for children, Carnival's excursion might actually be

saying "ciao for now" in Santa Croce Square. The roughly three hours of independent exploring are well spent checking out the Duomo with its cathedral, bell tower and Baptistry, the cherished Ponte Vecchio bridge over the Arno River, the countless leather shops, and the best pasta and gelato within walking distance according to Yelp or Trip Advisor. You're really on your own if you want to see Michelangelo's "David" statue at Accademia Gallery, but replicas of the marble masterpiece can be found elsewhere in the old city. From Florence it's a 1 1/2-hour drive to Pisa for a visit to Miracle Square and its famously leaning 645-year-old tower. Don't be shy about taking a photo of you trying to right the foundation-challenged bell tower. You're a tourist!

#6: Santorini

Whoever said "getting there is half the fun" never went to the Taj Mahal or Greece's most picturesque, dramatic and tourism-dependent island. India isn't on the Mediterranean, so we'll leave the ghastly drive from New Delhi to Agra for another story. As for Santorini, there's no getting around a tender ride and a 400-meter climb up the cliffs of a caldera to reach Fira, a pretty town in itself, but not as picturesque as Oia a half-hour cab or bus ride northwest. Almost every shore excursion begins in Fira. Your

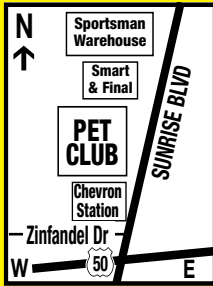
