Art Zooming In on the World

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - "Zoom In" is the theme of the 18th art show put on by the Cordova Community Council and local artists. It is now on display at the Rancho Cordova City Hall, from elephants to abstracts. The exhibit can be seen Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. through April 7, 2017.

Marsha Mason, local artist and juror for this show, said that the immediate criteria for entry into the show were, first, they had to meet requirements for size and hanging hardware, and second, be consistent with the theme. Beyond that, there were other important elements. "I looked for an emotional connection and good skills," Mason said. "... Did the piece have good composition? Good use of values (lights and darks)? Was color used skillfully? Was it finished?"

The volunteer team doing intake

assisted artists by helping them to affix the correct hardware on pieces that did not meet the hanging criteria, so that they could be accepted into the show. In addition, there was another new feature to the intake this time. "For the pieces that were not accepted into the show, we stapled the criteria on the back and told them why the piece was not accepted," Mason said. "Many of them were not zoomed in, they didn't meet the theme ... I think that helps the artists grow because everybody, when they don't get a piece accepted, wants to know why."

Probably the youngest artist in the show, Shakti Kondakindi had two works accepted. One was a collage of an elephant from the rear, and another, a close-up of a bird of paradise flower. Shakti is 6 years old and attends

Rocket Engines Made by Aerojet Featured at Future Flight During Super Bowl

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne, a subsidiary of Aerojet Rocketdyne Holdings, Inc. (NYSE:AJRD), is displaying the RS-25 and RL10 rocket engines at the Future Flight area of the Super Bowl LIVE fan festival. Aerojet Rocketdyne is one of six Houston Super Bowl Host Committee sponsors for Future Flight, which is where the “wow” factor for the 2017 Super Bowl LIVE fan festival resides.

Future Flight’s main attraction is a virtual reality ride that takes guests on an excursion through deep space to Mars and has them land back on the 50-yard-line of NRG Stadium, home to the Big Game. Guests wear virtual reality goggles for the two-minute, 10-second ride that concludes with a 90-foot drop.

Under NASA’s current plan, astronauts will voyage to the Red Planet in the 2030s using the Space Launch System (SLS) rocket – the most powerful rocket ever built. With the initial SLS rocket standing 322 feet tall or 107 yards, and later versions evolving to 364 feet tall or 121 yards, all versions of the SLS will be longer than a football playing field. The SLS is ultimately being designed to provide an unprecedented lift capability of 130 metric tons, comparable to lifting 895 NFL linemen into space.

Four RS-25 engines sit at the bottom of the rocket and will fire non-stop providing more than two million pounds of thrust for 8.5 minutes to make the journey into space. The RS-25 engines previously helped boost NASA’s space shuttle to orbit, flying in a configuration of three engines per mission with 135 total shuttle flights over the 30-year shuttle history. Currently, upgraded engines are undergoing tests at NASA’s Stennis Space Center in Mississippi to demonstrate the additional capability and higher performance requirements for

the SLS missions.

The RS-25 engine, designed and manufactured by Aerojet Rocketdyne, highlights the nation’s progress in developing transportation systems for human exploration of deep space.

“Amazing things are happening in America’s space program, which is why we wanted to share some of the latest developments with the American public,” said Eileen Drake, CEO and President of Aerojet Rocketdyne. “When the Space Launch System launches in 2018, we want the American people to say, ‘I have seen one of the engines powering that rocket.’”

A full-scale RL10 rocket engine, built by Aerojet Rocketdyne, is also on display at Future Flight. The RL10 engine is located in the upper stage of the SLS rocket and provides

the main propulsion once the rocket has reached outer space. One RL10 engine will be used on SLS when it makes its inaugural flight in 2018, and four RL10 engines will be used on the first rocket carrying astronauts, which is slated to launch in 2021. Over the last 50 years, more than 475 RL10 engines have played a vital role in launching hundreds of satellites to orbit and sending spacecraft to explore every planet in our solar system.

In addition to the RS-25 and RL10 engines on display, Aerojet Rocketdyne has virtual reality goggles showcasing an RS-25 engine test at Stennis Space Center, as well as space-themed interactive learning activities and educational videos inside the Future Flight pre-ride pavilion.

“Super Bowl LIVE guests

will be thrilled with the Future Flight area. The ride, models and interactive exhibits are all space related and tell the story of how our astronauts will make the journey to Mars in the near future,” added Drake.

One student is awarded the scholarship from the Rancho Cordova community and one student is awarded the scholarship from the Folsom community. The award amount per student is \$1,000.

In addition to offsetting some of the financial costs of college, the scholarship aims to give students a greater appreciation for a family member or other person that has made a sacrifice to provide them with greater opportunity in life.

Daniel Campbell Ford was a coal miner in Tennessee with only a second grade education when he started his family a century ago. Daniel wanted more opportunity for his children and desired that each would receive a quality education. He sold everything

Despite his lack of formal education, Daniel always encouraged his children to take advantage of their educational opportunities. Ford was proud that all 11 of his children graduated from high school – this rate would have been high at the time and nearly unfathomable had he stayed in Tennessee. A few of his children graduated from college and nearly all of his grandchildren graduated from college, many with advanced degrees.



A Buzz is in the Air

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's most recent Crop and Livestock report indicated that Apiary (bee keeping) production has increased. With Sacramento County's embrace of its agricultural heritage, this increase should not come as a surprise as bees pollinate our crops.

Now is the time for beekeepers to order bees. Approximately two three-pound packages of bees and a queen— which costs \$150 to \$175 each—will pollinate an acre of almonds. They can be purchased locally at businesses such as Sacramento Beekeeping Supplies. The bees will be ready for pick-up or delivery in April and May.

If you are interested in raising bees, and haven't already, contact the Zoning Department to find out if your property is properly zoned for bee keeping.

Your hive should also be registered. The Agricultural Commissioner will register your hive for \$10.00 per year. A benefit of registration is that you can request neighboring farmers inform you when they spray pesticides, which are detrimental to bees.

The Sacramento Area Beekeepers Association (SABA) offers valuable classes for first-time beekeepers.

Bees are fascinating creatures. Not only are they hard workers, they are sophisticated communicators. According to Agricultural Commissioner Juli Jensen, "A bee will search for a food source, such as a blooming tree. When she finds one, she returns to the hive, and performs a "waggle tail dance," with the surrounding bees watching her. The dance communicates the location of the source and the directions to find it. The level of enthusiasm of her "waggle-tail dance" illustrates how "good it is."

kindergarten at Riverview STEM Academy. She said her art teacher helps out with ideas. "I get some ideas, too, and then we find something we like in our ideas and we paint it, and we stick with it and we do it." Shakti's work is in mixed media. She said she chose an elephant because "Elephants are cute."

Judy Gustafson is experienced in clay sculpture and ceramic art. She has lived in Rancho Cordova since 1961, and as a child was in the earliest first grade class at Peter J. Shields School. She started using clay when she attended Cordova High School, under art teacher Daphne Stammer. Two of Gustafson's clay sculptures were featured in a glass case with other three-dimensional works. She said her work sometimes just comes to her in

her sleep. "I have the ability to dream something and I wake up and I'll make it," Gustafson said. "There are a lot of artists in my family, and we all do that."

As the juror, Mason had one of her works displayed at the show. Titled Redolence 2, it was done in a watercolor process that required that it not dry out during its creation. For that reason, the time required to create it was somewhat less than usual for her. Her usual time to create a piece, she said, is around a month to six weeks.

(homes) that we were all expecting, the stores all stopped being built too. Well, our city has weathered the physical, emotional, and financial storms, and we are on the move again. Our staff has been able to accomplish all that has been asked of them and much, much more. We have been able to do more than anyone in the county expected, and my thanks to them all cannot be measured. So thank you to our/your wonderful staff here at City Hall.

Some of the people who have lived in Rancho Cordova for quite a long time can remember how some of the community looked when it was just being built as we know it today. The Anatolia neighborhood and all the others around it were just some empty fields east of Sunrise Boulevard and Folsom South Canal, and whose residents were a few cattle, jackrabbits, and rattlesnakes. The grand opening in Rancho Cordova at its beginning was also quite different than the grand openings we are used to today in neighborhoods, new parks, and new businesses.

The initial grand opening of the first sub-division of Rancho Cordova was in November of 1953 with the first model home being built on what is now Zinfandel Drive and Chassella Way. There were thousands of people who came to see the new model homes, but they also came to see the star of the show who was entertainment personality Mr. Art Linkletter. He was here in Rancho Cordova for the grand opening, of course, but he was also the president of an electric company and he was selling light bulbs. The homes sold very fast because of the growing Aerojet General company, whose employees were growing in the numbers of thousands.

For those who now live in The City of Rancho Cordova, some know and some may not know that at its peak, Aerojet General employed 22,000 (yes, that's twenty two thousand) people. The old Folsom Road was "Old Highway 50", and the Southern Pacific railroad tracks were originally the tracks of the Sacramento Valley Railroad, which was the first rail

line constructed in California. (Those original 26 miles historical tracks were completed in 1856, and they run straight through Rancho Cordova.)

Mather Air Force Base (A.F.B.) was also growing in the 1950s. The government expanded the runways at Mather A.F.B. from 8,500 feet long to 11,300 feet long and reinforced the concrete on the runway so it could handle the B52 bombers that were moving in later in the 50s. The 320th Bomb Wing from the Strategic Air Command brought in a few thousand more people to Rancho Cordova, and their military and civilians needed homes too. Rancho Cordova had unbelievable growth, and with everything new, Rancho Cordova was "the" place to go. Unfortunately, the Cold War was growing at the same time, and with Aerojet General and Mather A.F.B. as part of Rancho Cordova, our community was extremely important in our country's Cold War effort.

Moving through the past and the present is much easier than it used to be because of the computer; so looking at the good and bad of those years, we can see how much more fortunate we have been than other communities. Look at us now. Mather wasn't one of those bases that was closed and just let go. The KB Homes at Mather replaced the military homes that housed the officers and the non-commissioned officers at Mather, and that planned community was named "Independence". It is a beautiful community, and the residents at Mather are looking forward to Raley's opening as much as the people living on the other side of Sunrise.

And another thing, for those who don't already know, our first streets in Rancho Cordova were named after wines: Zinfandel Drive, Cabernet Way, Chassella Way, and others, because "Cordova Vineyards" is where Rancho Cordova received the name. I could go on connecting the past and the present, but look at a map, and you will see those connections on your own.

Business Outlook is Looking Good

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce held its annual Business Outlook Economic Forecast event on January 27 at the Marriott Hotel. This year's event saw a solid increase of local business people attend, reaching nearly 200.

Barry Broome, President and CEO of the Greater Sacramento Area Economic Council gave an energetic, enlightening and uplifting presentation of what this region has to offer larger companies seeking to relocate or expand their operations in Northern California. "The Sacramento Region is becoming the California option for business" Broome said. When speaking of business leaders, he said "We need to become a selling machine for our region".

When outlining the obstacles to regional business success Broome shared "All of our behavior should be about full employment. If we got our act together we could double the estimated job growth for the region of 58,000 in ten years." He also commented on the difficulties of working with the State of California by saying "The State is completely irresponsible about their economic plan. Jerry Brown does not take responsibility for California's economy."

Broome's presentation was summed up in one of his final comments, "We have a great opportunity if we operate in a very determined way. I think we have a great future."

The first speaker, Mark Vitner, managing director and senior economist at Wells Fargo Securities, presented on the national perspective. "NAFTA

hasn't worked and needs to be changed. All three countries agree on that" he said. He laid out many national statistics and trends, especially sticking to the premise that the unemployment rate is only 4.5%. Oddly, he spent a fair amount of time with anti-Trump administration comments, which were noticed and drew comments by attendees.

Curt Haven and Amanda Norton presented for the City of Rancho Cordova Economic Development Team. They shared many of the promising statistics that show the recent growth within the city and the region that are leading to its expanding potential.





Defendant Convicted for Burglary, Sexual Assault of Sacramento Couple Sacramento Police Officers Acted Lawfully in Shooting of Joseph Mann

DATE: January 25, 2017
CASE: Anthony Galloway (Case #15F02903)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

Anthony Galloway was convicted by a jury of first-degree burglary, assault with intent to rape during the course of the burglary, and two counts of forcible oral copulation with the allegations that Galloway committed the crime during the commission of the burglary and personally used a deadly weapon found true on both counts.

In the early morning hours of May 12, 2015, a couple was asleep when Galloway entered their bedroom through a window. With a hammer in his hand, Galloway forced the male victim to perform sexual acts on his girlfriend. Galloway then took off his shirt, pulled the female victim's hair and stated he was going to rape her. The male victim tried to save his girlfriend and charged at Galloway, but Galloway quickly placed the male victim in a choke hold. During the scuffle, the female victim screamed for help from a bedroom window. Galloway fled the residence, but was apprehended by police in a neighboring backyard.

Galloway faces a maximum sentence of 57 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for March 10, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 16 before the Honorable Marjorie Koller.

cause them bodily harm, including yelling that he was going to "gut" them. He ran aggressively at one officer in a vehicle while waving his knife and holding it up in the air in a threatening manner. He rushed directly at a civilian while crossing the road, coming within approximately one foot of her and close enough to stab her or take her hostage. Mann repeatedly refused commands to stop and disarm himself. While attempting to escape from pursuing officers, he ran directly in front of multiple businesses into which he could have easily entered and harmed others.

Instead of continuing to run in a direction where there were no officers, Mann held his knife in a menacing manner and turned directly towards two officers who were in close proximity trying to disarm and arrest him. These officers were forced to make a rapid decision. Fearing for their own safety, the safety of each other, and the safety of the community, the two officers discharged their weapons at Mann as he continued to point his knife at them in a threatening manner. Mann died as a result of his gunshot wounds.

The District Attorney's Office reviews all officer-involved shootings that result in death or bodily injury. By law, officers are allowed to use deadly force when they reasonably believe they are faced with imminent danger or when making an arrest if there is a substantial risk that the suspect will cause death or serious bodily harm if his apprehension is delayed.

Based on a thorough review of the evidence, including multiple in-car camera recordings and surveillance videos, Mann posed an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to the responding officers and the public. The officers were justified in shooting Mann to defend themselves and each other, to protect the public from imminent harm, and to prevent the escape of a suspected felon who posed a significant threat of death or serious bodily injury to others.

Our review only addresses whether the officers involved committed any violation of criminal law. We do not address issues of civil liability, police tactics, or department policies or procedures. ★

Widespread Flu Activity that is More Severe than Last Year

CDPH Special Report

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - California Department of Public Health (CDPH) State Public Health Officer Dr. Karen Smith reported today that the state is experiencing widespread influenza activity that is more severe than last year. CDPH has also received the first report of a death associated with influenza in a child younger than 18 years of age. The death occurred in Riverside County. "This is a tragic reminder that the flu is a serious illness for people of all ages and kills thousands of Americans each year," said Dr. Smith. "If you haven't been immunized yet this season, getting flu shots for you and your family now can still help protect you this winter." CDPH disease monitoring indicates widespread flu activity

across the state that is more severe than last year. Since the beginning of the influenza season, CDPH has received reports of 14 influenza-associated deaths, including the child in Riverside. This count represents a fraction of the total flu deaths statewide because only deaths in people younger than 65 are reported to the state and not all influenza-related deaths are easily attributable to influenza. Hospitals statewide have been impacted by a surge in influenza patients, and hospitalizations for pneumonia and influenza at Kaiser Permanente hospitals in Northern California during the week ending January 7 reached 10.2 percent, the highest level recorded in 10 years. "We are closely monitoring the impact of influenza on health care facilities," said Dr. Smith. "Some acute care hospitals in California

are full and have diverted patients to other facilities." For anyone who has not yet received a flu shot this season, it is not too late. Influenza activity usually continues for several months, and it is still early in the season. CDPH recommends all Californians aged six months and older, including pregnant women, should get the annual flu vaccine. The flu virus circulating this season closely matches the vaccine, suggesting that the vaccine will provide protection against influenza and reduce the risk of severe disease. The flu vaccine prevents disease due to the most serious wintertime virus, but other viruses are also circulating now. For more information about influenza visit the CDPH influenza web page. ★

Senator Gaines Introduces Bill to Help Businesses Save Money

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) has announced Senate Bill 13, which will provide much-needed tax relief to the manufacturing, research and development, software and agricultural industries by expanding an existing sales and use tax exemption. "Small businesses are the backbone of California's economy and we need to do everything we can to make sure they capitalize on any available tax break," said Senator Gaines. "I will continue to push for lower taxes and simpler, less burdensome regulations to let employers know that California is open for business in order to get our economy back on track." Existing law allows manufacturers and research and development companies a sales and use tax exemption for their qualifying tangible personal

property purchases up to \$200 million a year. This includes property such as machinery and equipment used for manufacturing activities. Property that is considered to have a useful life of less than one year is excluded. Senate Bill 13 seeks to expand the definition of businesses eligible to receive this exemption by including software publishers and others who conduct agricultural business activities. It will also increase the annual property purchase limit from \$200 to \$500 million a year. Finally, it will define property as having a useful life of one or more years if the property includes a warranty for one or more years. Senator Gaines introduced this bill on the heels of recent reports indicating that the existing tax exemption has been severely underutilized. Since its inception on July 1, 2014

through September 30, 2016, businesses utilizing the exemption were only 21 percent of the original estimates made by the Department of Finance and Board of Equalization. "My hope is that by clarifying and expanding the exemption, that more businesses will be able to take advantage of it," said Senator Gaines. "Businesses should be rewarded for their contributions to our state, not continually penalized at every turn. I'm going to let them keep more of the money they earn instead of shipping it to an unaccountable Sacramento." Senator Ted Gaines represents the 1st Senate District, which includes all or parts of Alpine, El Dorado, Lassen, Modoc, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, Shasta, Sierra and Siskiyou counties. ★

Endless Conversation About Washington is Hindering Problem Solving in Sacramento

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Tom Berryhill (R-Twain Harte) cautions Senate Leadership to focus on problems facing California, rather than events in Washington, D.C. "Problems facing California won't go away simply because we stop talking about them. Obsessing on every move President Trump makes is diverting the time and energy needed

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Better Business Bureau (BBB) is warning job seekers of a work-at-home offer from an Internet-based logistics company that identifies themselves as Board of Minutes and Resolutions, or Transuniq. According to their website, transuniq.com, they offer mail forwarding services and are located in Sacramento, California. Consumers report that they are being solicited by representatives of Transuniq on CareerBuilder for a position with the alleged business as a logistics coordinator. Duties include accepting and reshipping packages, and checking for damaged or defective shipments. Respondents who accept the offer are told they will receive payment by check, or via direct deposit to their financial institution after a 30-day probationary period. However, consumers say after the 30-day period ends no payment is received. Transuniq.com claims the business is "operated in an entirely ethical and transparent manner." However, when BBB requested additional details from the

business about their offer, they did not respond. Additionally, the business lists a Sacramento address on their website, 915 L Street, Suite C433, but applicants should be aware that the website is registered through a domain registration service incorporated in Pakistan. Better Business Bureau has been unable to locate a valid business registration for Board of Minutes and Resolutions, or Transuniq with any local county or state agency. BBB urges extreme caution and consideration of the potential risks when participating in re-shipping offers. If the offer is a scam, you may be participating in fraud involving stolen merchandise and/or identity theft. Tips to Avoid a Reshipping Scam: • Read the job description thoroughly. Avoid any job offer that involves receiving and reshipping packages. If the offer is a scam, you may be participating in fraud involving stolen merchandise. • Is the company willing to hire

you on the spot? In general, legitimate companies will not hire you without at least one interview and a background check. • Does the website seem sloppy, or unfinished? Check whois.com to verify the website's creation date, and be wary of companies with websites that were created very recently. Also be wary of a website with several spelling errors, and distorted or pixelated images. Click here to learn more about identifying a scam website. • Where is the company located? Do a general web search for the physical address listed on the website. Addresses often lead to empty parking lots, or other legitimate businesses. Be especially wary if the company does not list an address. Source: BBB ★

Exporting Oil and Gas Will Import Economic Growth

What could turn out to be President Obama's most effective economic policies only just happened: ending the 40-year ban on U.S. crude oil exports and approving terminal construction to export U.S. liquefied natural gas. And a Donald Trump presidency likely means expansion and acceleration of those efforts. In December 2015, Congress passed a \$1.1 trillion spending bill that lifted the crude oil export ban. The president opposed the repeal, but the bill extended wind and solar energy tax credits, so he took the compromise. By contrast, liquefied natural gas export terminals only require Department of Energy approval. And while permits have been authorized slowly, several have finally been approved. That action jumpstarted the U.S. oil and gas export business, with Texas LNG terminal projects underway in Freeport, Corpus Christi and Brownsville. From January to May 2016, the U.S. exported half a million barrels of crude oil daily to 16 countries -- in Europe, South and Central America, including Israel and even China. Meanwhile, the first U.S. tanker with LNG departed from Louisiana in February 2015. In the first six months of 2016, 50

billion cubic feet (Bcf) of natural gas were exported. One energy analyst estimates the United States will export 7 Bcf/day by 2020 and 17 Bcf/day by 2040. Current production is about 80 Bcf/day. First, while the nation consumes more oil than it produces, the United States is projected to become a net gas exporter by halfway through this year. The country needs markets for that abundance of natural gas. Second, exports enhance economic efficiency. For those who wonder why U.S. companies would export crude oil when the country still imports 24 percent of its oil, the answer has to do with efficiency and refining. Most U.S. refineries are made to process very heavy oil. But most oil coming from shale formations, comprising half of total production, is light sweet crude oil -- requiring a less-intensive refining process. While some refineries are starting to adapt, that refining transition isn't quickly or cheaply made. The closest refineries may be operating at or near capacity. Instead of having to discount or store a regional oversupply of crude oil, oil producers should export to refineries abroad that have the capacity to handle it. Third, U.S. exports could help meet our allies' energy needs -- especially those dependent on oil from countries like Russia,

which use energy supplies as a geopolitical hammer. The European Union depends on Russia for about a third of its energy needs -- it'd love to have an affordable alternative. Finally, exporting crude oil and natural gas will jumpstart economic growth and reduce the U.S. trade deficit. Energy experts Daniel Yergin and Kurt Barrow estimated ending the oil export ban would; Increase daily oil production by 2.3 million barrels and new investment by \$1 trillion; create 860,000 jobs, including many high-paying blue-collar jobs; and add \$3 trillion in federal revenues -- important for a country about to pass the \$20 trillion mark in total federal debt. The energy boom over the past eight years provided real benefits during a time of sluggish economic growth. Without it, the country might've fallen into recession. Oil and natural gas exports will allow us to extend and expand that boom and become the world's energy-producing powerhouse. But doing so requires faster approvals of LNG terminals and easing federal opposition to drilling offshore and on federal lands, both of which President-elect Donald Trump pledged to do. You can become stronger in your ability to successfully handle life's challenges through regular practice. As you improve, issues will shrink in their significance. Circumstances you used to think were a big deal will be reduced to a mere annoyance, if that. It will even seem as if fewer significant problems are in your path.

Cordova Locked into Tie for SVC lead

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday night, the Cordova High School boys basketball team needed extra time to keep its top spot in the Sierra Valley Conference.

Opening the second round of conference play at rival Rosemont, the Lancers overcame a 62-62 tie after four quarters to post a 76-71 win over the Wolverines.

Scoring 14 and 16 points in the first and second quarters respectively gave Cordova a 30-24 halftime lead.

Cordova 66, Union Mine 50

In an SVC game at Lancers Gym on Jan. 28th, the Lancers jumped out to a 22-17 first quarter lead that set the tone for the game.

Cordova's defense kept the visiting Diamondbacks' defense in check in the


