## You Need to Know These New Motor Laws for 2017

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - With the New Year upon us, the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) wants to inform the public of several new laws or changes to existing law that, unless otherwise noted, take effect on January 1, 2017. The following are summaries of some transportation-related laws taking effect.

• **Use of Electronic Wireless Devices (AB 1785, Quirk):** Driving a motor vehicle while holding and operating a handheld wireless telephone or a wireless electronic communications device will be prohibited, unless the device is mounted on a vehicle's windshield or is mounted/affixed to a vehicle's dashboard or center console

in a manner that does not hinder the driver's view of the road. The driver's hand may only be used to activate or deactivate a feature or function on the device with the motion of a single swipe or tap of the driver's finger, but not while holding it. The law does not apply to manufacturer-installed systems that are embedded in a vehicle.

• **Child Safety Seats (AB 53, Garcia):** This law requires a parent, legal guardian, or the driver of a motor vehicle to properly secure a child who is younger than 2 years of age in an appropriate rear-facing child passenger restraint system, unless the child weighs 40 or more pounds or is 40 or more

inches in height (3 feet, 3 inches).

• **Motorcycle Lane Splitting (AB 51, Quirk):** This law defines "lane splitting" as driving a two-wheeled motorcycle between rows of stopped or moving vehicles in the same lane. The law authorizes the California Highway Patrol (CHP) to develop educational guidelines relating to lane splitting in a manner that would ensure the safety of motorcyclists, drivers, and passengers. In developing these guidelines, the law requires the CHP to consult with specified agencies and organizations that have an interest in road safety and motorcyclist behavior.

## Cordova Readers Benefit from Partnership

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The unlikelyst of friendships are blossoming in Room 13 at Cordova Gardens. Students are playing the role of teacher and engaging students a decade younger than them. Every Friday Cordova High School teacher Suzanne Borth walks across the street with her second period English intervention class to Cordova Gardens Elementary School. For about half an hour, her students get the opportunity to read to elementary students.

The benefit for both parties is mutual. Ninth and tenth grade students enrolled in Borth's intervention classes are struggling readers, so the opportunity to practice their reading skills in a fun and relaxed environment is valuable.

"The biggest thing I've seen is their increase in confidence," says Borth, "I also have noticed that they are teaching reading when they read now. . . I see them pointing out sight words and having kids sound them out and having kids use visual literacy to predict what's happening in the story."

Ninth grader Keith Ferrell agrees that he has noticed positive differences in his reading because of the program. "I just like reading to people. . . It gets your boost of confidence up," said Ferrell.

The elementary students, who vary from grade to grade each week, are all at different levels of their reading development. Some enjoy reading chapter books, such as third grader Donavan Branch, while others are working on their sight word skills. Third grader Danica Chambers likes learning new vocabulary from her high school friends.

"If I don't know what a big word is they can help me spell it out and tell me what it is," Chambers said.

Kristi Zampieri, Intervention Specialist at Cordova Gardens, was the link between the high school and the elementary school. After Zampieri and Borth met at a coaching meeting and Borth proposed the idea of bringing her kids to read at the elementary school, Zampieri jumped on board and quickly had a schedule in place.

Zampieri recognized the benefit of the elementary students getting a personal reading session. She said, "By having those teenagers come over and reading with them one on one versus with the whole class it just creates a bond between the kids that they look forward to." ★

## Cordova Recreation and Park District Appoints New District Administrator

Larkin graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Communications and a minor in Sociology from Central Connecticut State University.

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Longtime public educator and current Folsom Cordova Unified School District Superintendent Deborah Bettencourt announced Wednesday that she would retire at the end of the current school year.

Bettencourt has been Superintendent since her appointment to the post in 2010, but has spent 42 years in education. As Superintendent for FCUSD, Bettencourt has overseen 32 schools, 2,000 employees and over 20,000 students during her tenure.

"The success of our district is directly attributable to talented and caring employees, school board members committed to excellence, and supportive

# City Welcomes New Police Chief Pittman

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Rancho Cordova's City Manager, Cyrus Abhar, announced that he has appointed Chris Pittman as the new Rancho Cordova Police Chief. Pittman, a Sheriff's Captain with twenty-two years of experience with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, will fill the role vacated by the recent retirement of former Police Chief Michael Goold in December of 2016.

"We are pleased to welcome Chris Pittman as our City's new Chief of Police," said Mr. Abhar. "Chief Pittman is well-known in our community, having served previously as Assistant Chief of Police in Rancho Cordova in 2014 and as the current President of the Rancho Cordova Police Activities League. His long history, wealth of experience, and commitment to Rancho Cordova all make him an excellent choice to lead our police department."

Pittman began his career in law enforcement with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department in 1994 and has served in a variety of roles, including Deputy Sheriff, Sergeant, Detective

Sergeant, Lieutenant and Captain. He has been assigned to the Rio Cosumnes Correctional Center, the U.S. Attorney's Anti-Violent Crime Initiative Task Force, and the California Multi-Jurisdictional Methamphetamine Enforcement Team. He has served in leadership roles as the Narcotic Investigations Bureau Commander, North Patrol Watch Commander, Folsom Dam Security Bureau Commander, Assistant Division Commander for the Security Services Division, Assistant Division Commander for the East Patrol Division, Assistant Chief of Police for the Rancho Cordova Police Department, and Commander of the Field Support Division where he oversaw a majority of the Sheriff's Department's support systems, including the 911 Communications Center.

"I am very excited to be coming back home to Rancho Cordova," said Chief Pittman. "Serving in Rancho Cordova as the Assistant Chief was the best assignment in my career as a law enforcement officer, and I look forward to working with the City

# Peter J. Shields Shows Students the Science Behind the Fun

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Three primary classrooms at Peter J. Shields participated in the Hour of Code (designed by [hourofcode.com](http://hourofcode.com)) event in December.

During Hour of Code, students were encouraged to explore computer science in the form of coding activities. They learned that there is a whole career field related to this topic and there are actual professionals behind all the apps and games the students love to play.

The student-participants worked as partners to navigate and problem solve their way through coding challenges.

Special guest speaker Yuri Sekretar, CEO and Co-founder of messaging app company Quiks Inc. brought his laptop, wireless router and a small, basic computer called Raspberry. He coded a simple reaction time game for two players. He explained and showed the children how he coded the LED light to light up at random intervals of time, input player names, and then allowed the children to play



the game. During the game, they first had to press their button when the light initially flashed on. When the kids asked if the light could just flash on and off, he changed his code to accomplish that function, enabling students to see that a person is behind every function done on technology devices.

In January, school will be starting the STEM-inspired (Science Technology Engineering and Math) Crusader Coding Club

open to 3-5 graders. They will be using the computer science curriculum for beginning coding skills from Hour of Code.org. Students will begin coding using a block format which progresses from basic commands and advances towards more complex commands such as loops and events. # New Motor 2017 Laws You Need to Know

- **Vehicle Registration Fee (SB 838, Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review):** This law increases the vehicle registration fee on every vehicle or trailer coach from \$43 to \$53 beginning April 1, 2017.
- **Environmental License Plate (SB 839, Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review):** This law increases the fee for the issuance of Environmental License Plates from \$43 to \$53, starting July 1, 2017. This law also increases the fee for the renewal, retention, transfer, or duplication of Environmental License Plates (personalized) from \$38 to \$43, starting January 1, 2017.
- **Accident Reporting (SB 491, Committee on Transportation and Housing):** This law increases the minimum financial threshold for property damage that is required to be reported to the DMV from \$750 to \$1,000 when a driver is involved in a motor vehicle collision.
- **Vehicle Safety Recalls (AB 287, Gordon):** This law enacts the Consumer Automotive Recall Safety (CARS) Act, and requires the DMV to include a general advisory regarding vehicle recalls and needed repairs on each vehicle registration renewal notice. This law prohibits a dealer or a rental car company from renting or loaning a vehicle with a manufacturer's recall no later than 48 hours after receiving the notice—until the vehicle has been repaired. This law gives a limited exception for

a licensed dealer or a rental car company with a fleet of 34 or fewer loaner or rental vehicles. The law authorizes the DMV to suspend or revoke a vehicle dealer's license if they violate the CARS Act.

- **Year of Manufacture License Plates (SB 1429, Nielsen):** This law expands the Year of Manufacture (YOM) license plate program to include vehicles and license plates manufactured through 1980. This law benefits owners of vintage motor vehicles who obtain license plates from the year corresponding to the vehicle's model-year, and wish to use those vintage plates in lieu of regular license plates. Such plates are commonly found from different sources, including relatives, garage sales, estate sales, etc. The program will include the blue and yellow license plates issued for use on California motor vehicles from 1970 until 1980.
- **Background Checks of Drivers of Transportation Network Companies (AB 1289, Cooper):** A transportation network company (TNC) will be required to perform a comprehensive background check of all their drivers. This law also specifies penalties for a TNC that violates or fails to comply with this requirement. A TNC will be prohibited from contracting with, employing, or retaining a driver if they are registered on the U.S. Department of Justice National Sex Offender public website, has been convicted of specified felonies, or within the previous seven years, has been

convicted of a misdemeanor assault or battery, domestic violence, or driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Any TNC in violation of the specified requirements is subject to a penalty of not less than \$1,000 or more than \$5,000 for each offense.

- **Installing Counterfeit or Nonfunctional Air Bags (AB 2387, Mullin):** This law prohibits knowingly and intentionally manufacturing, importing, installing, reinstalling, distributing, or selling any device intended to replace an air bag system in any motor vehicle if the device is a counterfeit or nonfunctional air bag system, or does not meet federal safety requirements. The law also prohibits selling, installing, or reinstalling any device that would cause a vehicle's diagnostic system to fail to warn when the vehicle is equipped with a counterfeit, nonfunctional, or a case in which no air bag was installed. This violation is a misdemeanor punishable by a \$5,000 fine and/or up to a one year in county jail.

# And Another Thing ...

*Does Our Governor's "Water Fix" Fix Anything? Tremendous Amounts of Water Will Be Transferred Through Those Huge Tunnels to Southern California*

state. I hope the rain continues as it has so far this rainy season. Today we are about 150% of normal according to the meteorologists on most of the TV stations. I hope they are correct that the reservoirs and aquifers are filled, and that the underground water levels are improving. I have to admit that I am watching the Governor's plans for the twin tunnels that will take a considerable amount of water from Northern California and send it south like the Peripheral Canal would have done if it had been completed.

The "scientists" from Southern California have "proven", with those 19,000 plus pages, that taking more water out of the delta and the rivers from Northern California is important. Others have said the Governor's "Water Fix" fixes nothing, except that tremendous amounts of water will be transferred through those huge tunnels. I am not sure what will happen when all the arguments are said and done (they will probably never be done), but Mark Twain once said, "Whiskey is for drinking; water is for fighting over." I think the final result of the twin tunnels has quite a long way to go. We'll have to pay attention to what is decided in the courts because that is

where it will end up.

The votes that kept the tunnels moving forward came from Southern California. That is similar to the vote from Southern California that decided the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District had to spend \$2 billion on changing our sanitation district. I remember that there were 12 hours of opposition presented in a public meeting from our Rancho Cordova City Council, many other elected officials, as well as many organizations. After those 12 hours of opposition, it took 15 minutes for the vote from Southern California representatives to decide that we had to do what they told us to do. We'll have to see what happens in the next two years about the water from the rivers and the delta going south.

We will all see what this new year has in store for us and what surprises we have waiting for us. Everyone will be taught something new as we move into 2017. Daniel J. 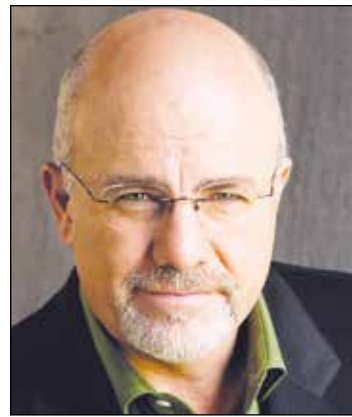

# Less Than Stellar Year for CalPERS

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The California Public Employees' Retirement System has not had a good 2016. Its investment returns were microscopic, it faced sharp criticism from a prominent financial website for alleged unethical behavior and Gov. Jerry Brown had to intervene to prevent the nation's largest pension fund from continuing to enable late-career pension spiking by public employees.

But year's end brought good news of a morbid nature to CalPERS, the California State Teachers' Retirement System and all agencies with actuarial responsibilities: It appears that U.S. life expectancy has plateaued after the nation previously seemed on track to eventually join Iceland and Japan as nations where it was common for people to reach their 90s.

This upward trend was blamed in San Francisco for the failure of pension reforms enacted in 2011 to provide much relief, as CalPERS reported last year, and has been one more factor in making long-term pension reform such a daunting test.

But after more than two decades of incremental but cumulatively significant increases in life expectancy, life expectancy went down slightly in 2015, according to the National

Center for Health Statistics. There were increases in eight of the 10 leading causes of death, including heart disease, diabetics, drug overdoses, Alzheimer's, diabetes and suicide. Cancer was the only notable bright spot, with deaths down 1.7 percent.

U.S. life expectancy rose from 75.4 in 1993 to 78.9 in 2014 before dropping to 78.8 in 2015, according to the latest report.

The findings were in line with a report last year from Princeton economists that showed an increase in death rates among middle-aged whites, a development that was linked to the opioid epidemic and other self-destructive behavior.

### CalPERS knocked for slowness in adjusting actuarial formulas

While social scientists and elected leaders ponder the implication of this development for the nation, it could provide a sense of relief at CalPERS. The pension fund has faced sharp criticism of "cooking the books" not just by having unrealistic expectations of earnings but by being slow to acknowledge its pensioners were living longer.

In early 2014, the Bay Area News Group's Dan Borenstein wrote a column about CalPERS' actuaries' struggle to get the CalPERS board to

adjust life expectancy forecasts. The actuaries got their way after grouching from some board members that this would increase costs for member agencies.

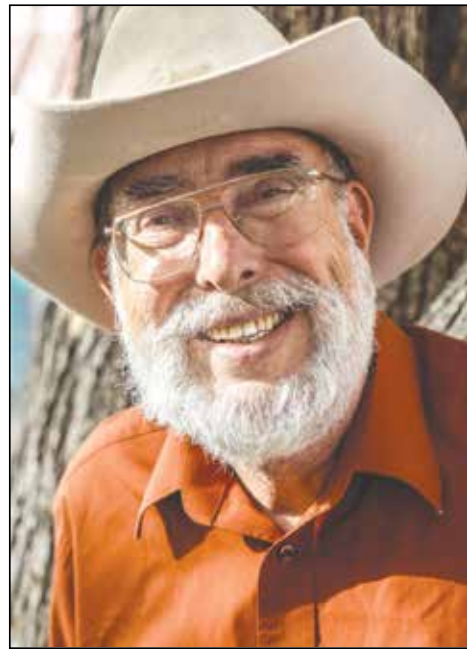
But Chief Actuary Alan Milligan remained worried that not enough was being done. In January 2015, CalPERS posted a mortality report that noted mortality had improved "a bit faster" than pension fund actuaries expected. It noted that CalPERS was now "predicting faster improvements than we had in the past."

The prediction might still prove right. While most public-health experts agreed that the National Center for Health Statistics report was bad news, there were some who warned against an overreaction to the findings.

Slate published an analysis by Ben Hanowell, a data scientist who works for a company that connects the aging with assisted living. He warned against positing broad trends from one year of data and noted that some groups — such as middle-aged Hispanics and African Americans — continued to see their life expectancy increase.

As of June 30, CalPERS had 68 percent of funds for its anticipated obligations to public employee retirees — \$139 billion less than needed. ★

# Game Plots

## Artificial Intelligence: Hiding the Puppet Strings

In 2016, we finally passed the videogame Turing test. Amidst a year of surprises and widespread innovation, the most consistent trend has been the inclusion of self-reliable, fully-characterized AI (Artificial Intelligence) pulling the puppet-strings of non-player characters. Previously (and still), creating a believable companion to populate a game world was a daunting task, due not to the lack of graphics capabilities (games like this year's *Uncharted 4* pulled off visuals as near-photorealistic as anyone could reasonably expect), but to the simple difficulty of making a cold, calculating computer behave like a living being: unpredictably.

The strongest example from the past year arises from the recently-released *The Last Guardian*, a game about the bond between a young, unnamed boy and a massive feathered dog-beast (adorably named "Trico") as they make their way through crumbling ruins. The player has direct control over only the boy, and while they can order the monster around the environment, Trico is prone to stubbornness and absent-mindedness. Nearly every review for the game recounts the critics' frustration when they knew what Trico needed to do to solve a puzzle, but simply couldn't get him to do it. He'd be persistently sniffing a tower, or running around exploring nearby, completely ignoring the player's orders. But though uncooperative AI is often bothersome, Trico's

non-compliance mimics the behaviour of a real animal. Even a well-trained housepet does not respond to commands immediately, and, when faced with the thrill of a squirrel or a bird, may not respond at all. As a result, these minor annoyances seem to be a calculated decision; they waste the player's time, but they also successfully create the illusion of life within Trico to hide the lackluster pre-programmed gears under the surface.

But unpredictability becomes somewhat more difficult when combat is thrown into the mix. Incompetent AI for friendly characters can stop the player from feeling like an action hero and make them feel like a babysitter, needing to constantly defend non-player characters. The player's allies in both *Final Fantasy XV* and *Uncharted 4* tackle this problem in an interesting way; they retain competence and predictability in combat situations (in both games I went down far more often than my AI compatriots), but incorporate unpredictability in their dialogue and interactions with the player character. In both games, AI characters draw from a pool of player-character or character-character dialogue, some interactions scripted to a specific time and place, some that can arise at any point during normal gameplay. This type of back and forth between friends (or, as is often in *Uncharted 4*, between husband and wife or between brothers), captures the improvisational nature of real human

relationships, and pulls the veil over the mechanics driving these digital-robotic characters.

Though some indie games from this past year (such as *Event 0* and *Oxenfree*) experimented with dynamic dialogue systems that allowed players to speak almost freely and naturally to AI, their complex systems are, for the moment, still infeasible to implement in a wider variety of game genres. Nevertheless, while their innovations are representative of what player-AI interactions could look like in the future, the current, somewhat passive, model of interaction was finally locked down and (arguably) perfected in 2016. They've followed the path of Pinocchio, cutting their puppet strings, transforming wood into flesh, and, to some degree, starting to feel alive.

# Americans are Freaking Out About Insurance Quality

Of all their concerns about health-care, Americans are most worried about whether they can afford their insurance. That's the key finding from a new Morning Consult survey of over 20,000 people.

It's easy to see why Americans are so anxious. Premiums are set to rise sharply next year. And insurers are shifting more of the cost of procedures and medicines onto patients. In short, people are paying more but getting less coverage. In many cases, patients appear to be skipping needed treatments because they can't afford their copays or co-insurance.

Unaffordable insurance is a problem for the nation, not just for individual households. If people don't have quality coverage, they'll be stuck with ineffective treatments. Their conditions can worsen -- causing their healthcare costs to balloon.

Rising premiums are crushing family budgets across the nation. More than four out of ten Americans said that their monthly health insurance premiums increased in the past year. Come 2017, insurers will increase premiums for employer-sponsored plans about 5 percent. For Americans who buy coverage on the Affordable Care Act exchanges, premiums will skyrocket 25 percent, on average. Consumers in many states could see their premiums increase 60 percent or more.

Insurers are making patients shoulder a larger share of treatment costs. Four out of ten Americans say that their out of pocket costs have spiked in the past few years, according to the survey. As of 2014, Americans were spending more than triple on their deductibles than they had a decade prior, according to the Kaiser Family Foundation.

In exchange for the added costs, Americans are receiving less coverage.

Insurers increasingly exclude some providers from networks to squeeze big discounts out of the remaining in-network doctors and hospitals. As a result, four in ten consumers had trouble, or knew somebody who had trouble, finding an in-network doctor or clinic.

Recently I had a medical issue that required surgery. The cost of the out-of-network surgeon was \$18,000. The insurance company refused to

pay the doctor's charge for the surgery. After three long and tedious rounds of appeals, an outside arbitrator deemed that the surgery should be covered since it was an emergency situation. The insurance company paid the surgeon its previously negotiated in-network fee of \$179.47. The number of in-network doctors, and thus patient's choices, is shrinking.

Firms are also dragging their feet or flat out refusing to pay for certain therapies. Nearly 30 percent of Americans report that their doctor prescribed them a treatment that wasn't covered by insurers. A similar percentage experienced difficulty getting an insurer to cover a needed treatment.

The thinning coverage and bulked up costs mean that healthcare is, in practice, inaccessible for many people, even though they technically have insurance coverage. A majority of Americans either couldn't fill a prescription, or know someone who couldn't, because the cost-sharing requirement was too high.

Consider the story one doctor recently shared about his patient suffering from ulcerative colitis, a chronic disease that causes inflammation in the large intestine. The doctor had prescribed the 28-year-old woman two medications that got her colitis under control.

But a year later, the woman returned to his office, crying. She was sicker than before. The doctor asked if the medicines had stopped working. She

then revealed that she had quit taking them because her insurance company stopped covering the drugs, and she couldn't afford the out of pocket costs.

Going without treatment is bad for patients -- and for the nation's healthcare budget. Nearly 60 percent of the population suffers from at least one chronic disease. Preventing and managing these diseases is vastly cheaper than letting them spiral out of control.

Chronic diseases are already projected to cost us \$42 trillion from now until 2030. If insurance quality continues to decline and more patients can't adhere to their treatments, the bill could grow even larger.

Reforms to lower insurance costs and ensure quality coverage would enable patients to better manage their chronic diseases. That would spare them from needless suffering -- and the nation from needless healthcare expenditures.

In the current political climate, it is difficult to see quick resolution to this not insurmountable problem. However, amending Obamacare -- as was always anticipated by the administration -- could resolve the issues.

For millions of Americans, good insurance is a prerequisite for good health. No wonder people are so concerned about their worsening coverage.

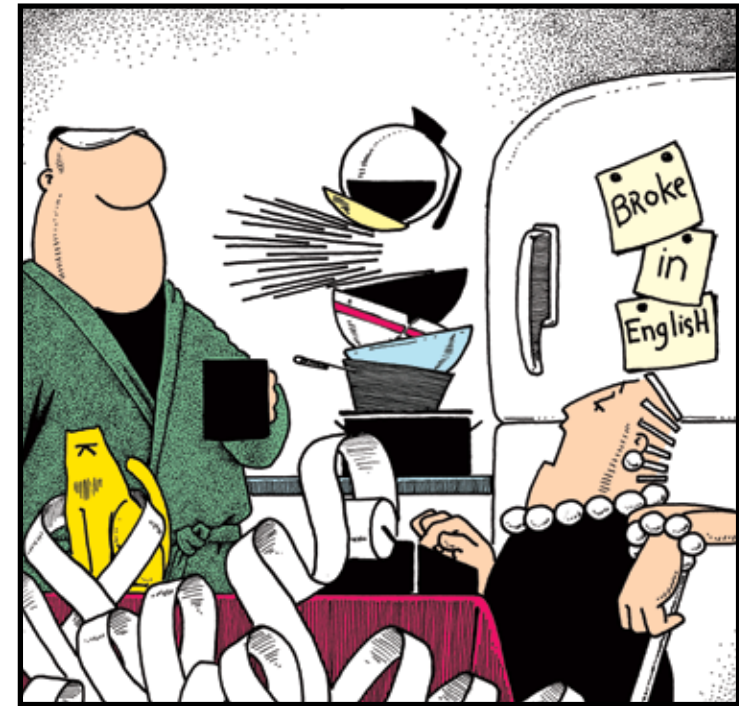

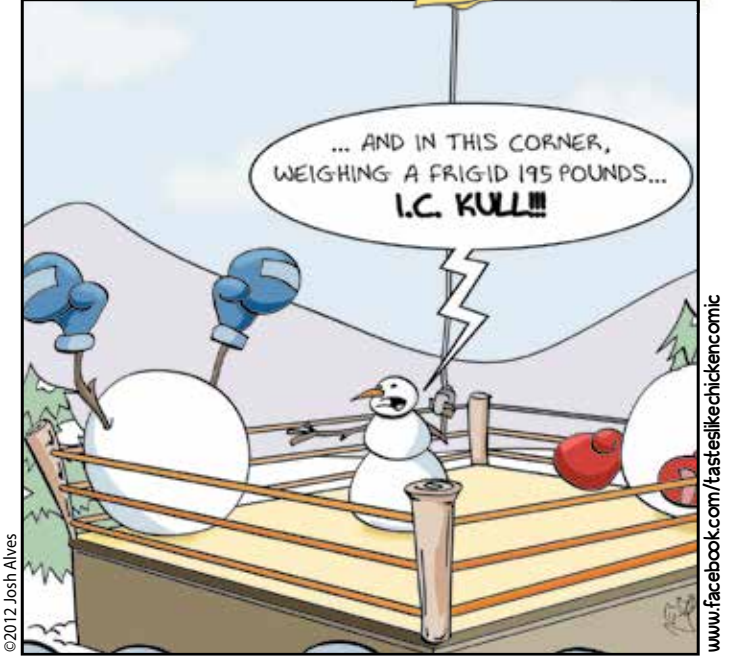

## Man Sentenced for Kidnapping Teens & Sexual Assault Defendant Convicted for Murder of Rancho Cordova Woman Pair Convicted for Murder at Home Depot Parking Lot, Series of Crimes

**DATE:** December 20, 2016  
**CASE:** Kevin Hickman (Case #15F03015)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Matt Chisholm, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Donald Currier sentenced Kevin Hickman to 11 years, 8 months plus 100 years to life in prison. On October 6, 2016, a jury convicted Hickman of three counts of forcible rape with kidnapping allegations, one count of forcible oral copulation with kidnapping allegations, kidnapping for purposes of rape, kidnapping of a child under the age of 14, and criminal threats.

Hickman met the victims' mother through a dating website. A few days later on May 16, 2015, Hickman offered to take her 16-year-old daughter and 13-year-old daughter to a party at a roller skating rink. The mother agreed, but Hickman didn't take the girls to a party. Instead, Hickman took the young girls to a house off of Marconi Avenue. By this time, the girls' cell phones had died and they had no way to call for help. Hickman took the 16-year-old victim to a shed in the backyard and raped her at knife point three times throughout the night. Meanwhile, the girls' mother called 911. The Sacramento Police Department was able to trace Hickman's cell phone to the house. The 13-year-old daughter was not physically or sexually harmed.

**DATE:** December 20, 2016  
**CASE:** Harold Fulkerson (Case #15F00520)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Thien Ho, Homicide Unit

Harold Fulkerson was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of Teresa Anderson. The jury also found true that Fulkerson used a deadly weapon and committed the crime while out on bail for carrying a concealed dirk or dagger.

On January 27, 2015, Fulkerson was visiting a friend at the Ashgrove Place Apartments in Rancho Cordova. Fulkerson followed the victim, Teresa Anderson, into her bedroom and stabbed her 17 times. The other occupants of the apartment called authorities, who apprehended Fulkerson at the scene and retrieved the murder weapon. Fulkerson claimed that his use of marijuana and methamphetamine caused him to suffer hallucinations. The victim and Fulkerson were acquaintances with no prior history of conflict. Fulkerson faces a maximum sentence of 18

years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for February 2, 2017, at 9:30 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

**DATE:** December 22, 2016  
**CASE:** Jeffrey Michael Caylor & Kari Ann Hamilton (Case #14F01906)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Donell Slivka, Homicide Unit  
Jeffrey Michael Caylor was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Hassan Alawsi. The jury found true the special circumstance that Caylor shot the victim from a motor vehicle intentionally causing death and the allegation that Caylor personally and intentionally discharged a firearm causing death. Caylor was also convicted of attempted murder, assault with a firearm causing great bodily injury, robbery, burglary, vehicle theft, and felon in possession of a firearm. Kari Ann Hamilton was convicted of accessory to the murder. Hamilton was also convicted of attempted murder, robbery, and burglary while armed with a firearm as well as vehicle theft.

On March 16, 2014, Hassan Alawsi was standing by his vehicle in the Home Depot parking lot on Florin Road when Caylor drove up and shot and killed him. Hamilton was in the car with Caylor. A few hours later, Caylor and Hamilton returned to their neighborhood in Carmichael. The two accosted a neighbor, and Caylor pulled out a gun and demanded the victim give them her car keys. When the victim refused, Caylor physically assaulted the victim. The defendants then stole the victim's car. On the morning of March 17, 2014, Caylor and Hamilton drove to their prior business location in the stolen car. As they approached the business, Caylor observed the neighboring business owner. Caylor and Hamilton had a hostile business relationship with that individual. Caylor pointed a gun at the business owner and pulled the trigger three times, but the gun did not fire. That victim got the license plate of the vehicle and called 911.

The defendants were stopped in the stolen vehicle by Chico police, which led to the discovery of the gun used to murder Mr. Alawsi and evidence linking the defendants to the assault of the second victim and car theft.

Caylor faces life in prison without the possibility of parole plus 82 years to life in prison. Hamilton faces 16 years in prison. Sentencing is set for February 10, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 31 before the Honorable Michael Kenny. ★

## Commercial Food Waste Recycling = WasteRight!



**Background:**  
**Assembly Bill 1826** requires businesses that generate a certain amount of food waste per week to recycle it! The bill also includes "green" wastes that are generated by landscaping services such as lawn clippings, tree trimming and non-hazardous wood waste. Businesses such as restaurants, bakeries, grocery stores, hotels, schools, hospitals, food processors, and landscapers are in some cases now regulated by this new law. Together these waste streams are called "organic wastes."

**What is the Technical Definition of Organic Waste?**  
Organic waste as defined in the bill includes the following material: food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste. These materials represent the largest subset of organic wastes that are currently disposed of in California landfills.

**Key Dates & Thresholds:**  
**January 1, 2017:** Businesses that generate 4 cubic yards of organic waste per week must arrange for organic waste recycling services.

**January 1, 2019:** Businesses that generate 4 cubic yards or more of ANY solid waste per week must arrange for organic waste recycling services.

**January 1, 2020:** If the State (CalRecycle) determines that organic wastes have not been reduced by 50 percent of the 2014 amounts, they will expand the requirements to cover businesses that generate 2 cubic yards or more of commercial solid waste per week.

**What are the Options?**  
Businesses that are required to recycle their organic waste must implement at least one, or a combination, of the following actions:

- a. Separate organic waste from other waste and subscribe to organic waste recycling service that includes collection and recycling of organic waste.
- b. Recycle your own organic waste onsite or take it yourself for recycling.
- c. Subscribe to an organic waste recycling service that may include mixed waste processing that specifically recycles organic waste.
- d. Businesses sell or donate their recyclable organic waste.

### Business Incentives - Early Adopters

Businesses that get on board early with this new recycling requirement may also be eligible for saving on garbage service fees from their commercial waste hauler. Businesses are urged to contact their service provider for more information.

In addition, the Business Environmental Resource Center (BERC) has a recognition program through their Sustainable Business Program for businesses.

## Cordova Girls Basketball Looks to Contend

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Next week is the start of Sierra Valley Conference play for the Cordova High School girls basketball team.

games only six to eight players suit up because of soccer. Part of the roster does not count players who have been cleared by the Sac-Joaquin Section because of transferring and foster care.

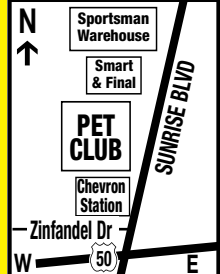

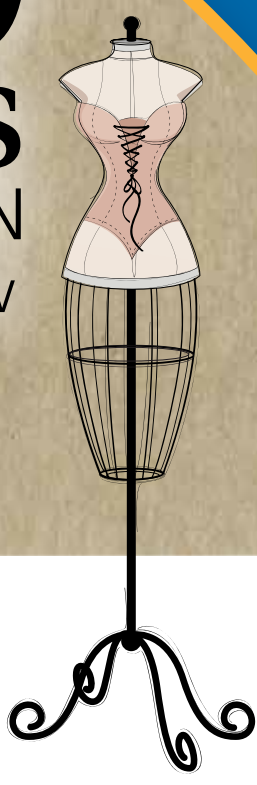
