City Council Meets Amid Packed House

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -There was standing room only as the Rancho Cordova City Council meeting this week took place amid a throng of citizens there for the evening's agenda. A color guard from Webelos Den the Mighty T-Rex's, Cub Scout Pack #380 presented the colors to the assembled crowd and council members, and led the Pledge of Allegiance. City Clerk Mindy Cuppy certified the election results from November and council members, vice-mayor and mayor were duly sworn in and reseated.

The city's new mayor is Donald Terry and vice-mayor is Linda Budge, both sitting Council members and City Council members David Sander, Donald Terry and Robert McGarvey were reelected to new four-year terms. David Sander, as outgoing mayor, was honored by the city for his service in office, took the opportunity to praise Rancho Cordovans. "The thanks belong to our resident families," he said.

The City Council awarded its next recipients of the Community Enhancement Fund checks to improve and develop resources for area residents. Elk Grove Unified School District was granted \$11,000 to fund schoolwide arts, focusing on music and choral activities for students. Cordova High Principal Dan Anklam was colorfully dressed for the occasion and was given \$20,000 for sports scholarships and improvements. The Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) was also awarded \$23,000 to promote the Meet the Masters art program for FCUSD students. The Cordova Community Council was given \$25,000 to purchase a new Christmas tree for display. The biggest chunk of funding went to the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame in the amount of \$80,000 to improve playing fields in the Rancho Cordova area. Parents, student-athletes and coaches have long been aware that Rancho Cordova's fields needed attention. *Continued on page 3*

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Community Groups Give from the Heart

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova volunteers and organizations came together Saturday to assist local families with children in need of a little help this holiday season. The 6th Annual Christmas In Cordova event provided parents who have children from 0-17 a unique and supportive experience.

Staffed stations set up throughout the campus guided parents from check in to childcare to gift selection and wrapping on site. New, unwrapped gifts donated by the community were provided for parents to come and select items for their own children and to wrap the gifts themselves. This year's event was estimated to benefit approximately 1,000 children, more than double the original number.

Dozens of volunteers from around

the area pooled time, resources and talent to host the event at Mills Middle School in Rancho Cordova. The Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD), the city of Rancho Cordova, Rancho Cordova Police Activities League (PAL), the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership (FCCP), the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, California Highway Patrol (CHP), and Sun River Church spearheaded the event, but even more individuals and groups were on hand to help. Guest's first interaction was with the crisply uniformed U.S. Naval Sea Cadets out in force to provide parking logistics and management, led by Rancho Cordova resident and Commanding Officer Curtis Gant.

Once inside, food and beverages were provided for participants needing a little fortification for the

HART Holds Hopes for Homeless CRPD Tree Planting Project a Success

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The

Rancho Cordova branch of the Homeless Assistance Resource Team, or Rancho Cordova HART, this winter will hold their third winter shelter for the local homeless. The plan is for nine churches to take responsibility for one week each from Monday, December 26, through Saturday, February 25.

Six sites are ready to go, but three are still needed. "We need our Christmas miracle," said Karen Edwards, leader of Rancho Cordova HART. Churches considering taking on a week's sheltering should send some volunteers to the first or second host sites to see how it's done, she said. The host sites can answer any questions, and the other churches can see how possible it is to do it themselves.

"I have great faith that we'll fill those," Edwards said. "But I know we have to do our due diligence, too, we have to actively pursue and recruit and do the big ask."

The intake site is the same location as last year, Way of Life Church at 10415 Folsom Blvd., between Coloma Road and Mills Park Drive. Guests can be there at 4:30 p.m. and must be in line by 5 p.m. even if they were guests the previous evening. "The doors open at 5 p.m. and the first 30, that's the max that we can take," said intake coordinator Inez Reyes. After registration the guests will be taken to the host site, where they will receive a hot dinner and be given a safe, warm place to sleep. In the morning they will be bussed back to the intake site with a breakfast bag and some food for later in the dav.

Reyes said that Pastor Mike Tempke of Way of Life Church and his volunteers deserve a lot of credit for all they do in providing the intake site and associated services. The

Church of Christ provides transportation to each host site, and back each morning. All the services are provided by volunteers.

In each of the previous years, HART has learned more about how to maximize the benefit for the guests. "We have a lot more knowledge, we're more equipped," said Reyes.

The Folsom Cordova Unified School District supplies a liaison, and that helps to ensure that any known homeless students at least have shelter for this period, and to see what else can be done for them. "Every week, once a week, during our whole season, (Sacramento) Self Help Housing will be there, doing housing counseling, DHA will come with resources, and Elica Health will come offering medical," Edwards said.

Rancho Cordova HART has been helping in other ways, in addition to the winter shelter. HART has partnered with the veterans stand-downs and helped at their events, and plans its own mini veterans standdown for the spring. HART also has started a mentoring program, coinciding with the shelter season. "We pair up someone who will come alongside (the homeless) – not do the work for them, but help them connect the dots, to get to their resources," Edwards said. "Sometimes the (homeless) are

so overwhelmed with day-today existence that they don't even know where to start."

Edwards said that there are some chronically homeless who may always be on the street. Nevertheless, she said, "I do believe that there is a percentage of our guests that we will not see this year because they've gotten into housing." Edwards estimates that 10 to 15% of last year's guests were able to obtain housing because they were veterans. Since last vear. Rancho Cordova HART has been mentoring Citrus Heights and Carmichael HART in setting up their own winter shelters, which are to be in place this season. That adds resources for people in those communities.

"It's definitely helping people," said Tom Beigle, coordinator for St. John Vianney Catholic Church's host site. "It seems inadequate for what the real need is, but we have to start somewhere."

Rancho Cordova HART recently attained its official nonprofit status, which gives it its own authority and convenience in carrying out its functions.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements Start in Cordova Vineyards

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova Elementary School Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvement Project has started in the Cordova Vineyards neighborhood. The project includes more than 1.5 miles of new sidewalk, ADA accessible crosswalks, and Class III bike routes.

The project will create safe routes for residents and students in the neighborhood to walk or bike to and from Rancho Cordova Elementary School and throughout the area.

Construction has started

on Chassella Way in front of Rancho Cordova Elementary School during the school's winter break. The project is anticipated to be completed by summer 2017.

Project construction will take place between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., with anticipated breaks during peak school traffic hours. Expect intermittent traffic control and parking restrictions during the project. Please drive with caution and reduce speeds in construction areas.

The project is funded by the


City's Community Enhancement Fund and a grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation's Congestion Management and Air Quality Program.

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


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Dave's take on layaway Dear Dave,

How do you feel about using layaway programs? - Jav

Dear Jay,

I'm not a huge fan of layaway plans, because they're not really the solution to a problem. What's wrong with just saving up and buying stuff when you have the cash? I mean, Christmas comes at the same time every year, you know? It's not like it snuck up on you.

I know there are rare instances when particular items are on sale, and you can take advantage of it through layaway if you don't have the cash at the moment. I don't really have a problem with that kind of thing in rare instances. But I would not, under any circumstances, use a layaway plan that has fees attached. You might as well borrow the money if you're going that route.

Here's a good rule of thumb: if you don't have the money, you can't afford it. And make sure you don't get into the habit of lusting after things you don't

own, because that lack of contentment is always tied to people being broke. Just don't make plans like this a way of life, Jay. If you do, you're liable to stay chained to layaway programs just like you'd be chained to debt!

Credit cards are not an emergency fund Dear Dave,

My husband and I are trying to follow your plan. We've paid off all of our credit cards, but he still doesn't want to close the accounts and cut up the cards. Instead, he wants to keep them in a drawer and use them as an emergency fund. He grew up really poor, and I think he's afraid of being poor again. We both know that's not what you recommend, so what can I do to convince him to follow your advice?

Dear Lynn,

I think rather than trying to convince him, it might be a better idea to gently ask questions and talk things through. You said he grew up in poverty. What I'm hearing is that the cards represent a kind of security blanket for him. I can understand that. But if you had \$10,000 set aside for emergencies, you'd have the security of knowing that a

transmission repair on the car or a new water heater for the house would only be a minor inconvenience — and you wouldn't have to go back into debt to make things right again.

Explain to him that what you'd like to do is replace the credit cards with your own money. You'd also be replacing what they do with a debit card. Ask him if there's a reasonable amount you two could have in the bank that would take away his worry and stress. Talk it out, agree on the amount, and then agree that when you've saved up and hit that number, the cards get cut up and the accounts are closed.

Just be patient and understanding. Above all, make sure you work together. If he's recognized the wisdom of getting out of debt and taking control of your finances, he's moving in the right direction! -Dave

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

River Cats Name Dave Brundage Manager for 2017

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento River Cats, in conjunction with the San Francisco Giants, are excited to welcome Dave Brundage as manager of the River Cats for the 2017 season.

Brundage is the only new face to the field staff as the rest of 2016's coaching and training outfit will return to Raley Field for this coming season. Alongside Brundage will be hitting coach Damon Minor (second season) and pitching coach Dwight Bernard (third season). LJ Petra is back for this third season as Athletic Trainer while Strength and Conditioning Coach Adam Vish (second season) rounds out the club's 2017 field staff.

An Oregon native, Brundage joins the River Cats with nearly two decades of managerial experience. The veteran manager spent the last four seasons with the International League's Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Philadelphia Phillies Triple-A), compiling a 286-289 record (.489). Last year, Brundage led the IronPigs to an 85-58 record, the second best mark in all of Triple-A baseball.

Brundage, 52, made his managerial debut in 1995 with the Riverside Pilots (Seattle Mariners Class A-Advanced) but has spent most of his managerial career at either the Double- or Triple-A levels. Prior to his four seasons with Lehigh Valley, Brundage helmed the Richmond/Gwinnett Braves for six seasons from 2007 through 2012. He made his Triple-A debut in 2006 with the Pacific Coast League's Tacoma Rainiers. Brundage has a career record of 1,371-1,315 (.510) in 19 seasons as a manager and a 793-781 (.504) mark at the Triple-A level.

Drafted in the 4th round of the 1986 Amateur Draft out of Oregon State University, Brundage spent 10 seasons as a player in the Minor Leagues with the Phillies and Mariners organizations.

Minor, 42, returns to the River Cats for his second season as hitting coach. In his first year with the team, the River Cats saw their team batting average climb four points to .272, good for sixth best in the Pacific Coast League in 2016. Minor worked closely with Giants prospect Austin Slater as he adjusted to Triple-A pitching. Slater went on to claim the PCL's August Player of the Month award with a .381 average, nine home runs, and 26 RBI in 30 games.

A former Giant, Minor was drafted by San Francisco in 1996 and made his Major League debut in 2000. In 136 games over parts of four seasons, Minor hit .232 with 13 home runs. He set a careerhigh in 2002 when he played in 83 games and slugged 10 home runs, helping the Giants claim the National League pennant. While in the Giants farm system, he compiled a .277 batting average with 179 home runs and 648 RBI across nine seasons. Minor spent the 2016 offseason serving as the hitting coach for the Scottsdale Scorpions (Arizona Fall League), where he worked with potential future River Cats hitters Aramis Garcia, Ryder Jones, and Hunter Cole.

Bernard returns for his third season as pitching coach for the River Cats. In his first two seasons with Sacramento, Bernard coached the River Cats staff to a 3.85 and 4.03 ERA, the first and third-best marks in franchise history respectively. Under his guidance, Clayton Blackburn claimed the PCL ERA title in 2015 (2.85 ERA) and finished second in Pitcher of the Year voting. In 2016, Ty Blach was named left-handed Pitcher of the Year while under Bernard's tutelage. Blach went 14-7 with a 3.43 ERA for the River Cats last season before going 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in four games for the Giants in September.

Like Brundage, Bernard brings exceptional experience to his role as pitching coach, having spent 31 seasons as a pitching coach or coordinator dating back to 1986.

Petra enters his ninth consecutive season in the Giants organization and third as Athletic Trainer in Sacramento. The University of Connecticut graduate joined the River Cats field staff in 2015 after spending the 2014 season in Fresno. Prior, Petra was with Double-A Richmond for two seasons (2012-13), and both Augusta (2009) and San Jose (2011) for one season each. Before joining the Giants organization, Petra spent 2007-08 as the assistant athletic trainer and head strength and conditioning coach for the Bowie Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles.

Vish starts his fifth season in the Giants organization as a Strength and Conditioning Coach and second in Sacramento. Entering his sixth season in professional baseball, Vish previously worked in the Kansas City Royals minor league system during the 2011 and 2012 seasons. He was named the Strength and Conditioning Coach of the Year for the Carolina League (Advanced A) in 2012 and is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh's Master of Science (MS), Exercise and Human Physiology program.

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






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

Defendant Convicted for Murder of Infant Defendant Sentenced for Inflicting 2nd-Degree Burns on Child Defendant Sentenced for Murder, Attempted Murder of Homeless Men Husband & Wife Plead Guilty to Felony Insurance Fraud

DATE: November 30, 2016 **CASE:** Damian Porter (Case #14F03935)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Damian Porter was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of Graeson Byrd and assault on a child resulting in death. A separate jury acquitted co-defendant Davonna Rae Byrd, the victim's mother, of murder and assault on a child causing death charges.

On April 8, 2013, Porter was home alone with 11-week-old Graeson from early in the morning until 911 was called later that afternoon. When medical personnel arrived, Graeson was not breathing and did not have a heartbeat. The child was pronounced dead when he arrived at the hospital a short time later. Medical evidence showed Graeson had sustained a serious head injury that caused his death, and that Graeson had sustained numerous other injuries inflicted over several weeks. Among those injuries were rib, arm, and leg fractures.

Porter faces a maximum sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 30, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 21 in front of the Honorable Steve White.

CASE: Joseph Zeno (Case #15F02799)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Monica Robinson, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

The Honorable Kevin McCormick sentenced Joseph Zeno to 9 years in prison. On October 26, 2016, a jury convicted Zeno of child abuse. The jury also found true the allegation that Zeno personally inflicted great bodily injury on a child under the age of 5.

On the morning of October 17, 2014, Zeno was alone with the 2-year-old victim. The victim's mother later noticed a large blister on the bottom of the victim's foot. The victim was treated at Shriners Hospital for second-degree burns covering the bottom of her foot. It was found that the only item that could have caused the burn was a hot frying pan. Zeno denied injuring the child, but admitted he had a form of discipline called "Hot Feet," where he would smack the bottom of a child's foot with his hand or hanger.

DATE: December 2, 2016 CASE: Kenneth Hill (Case #15F06592) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Caroline Park, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Richard Sueyoshi sentenced Kenneth Hill to 39 years to life in prison. On October 27, 2016, a jury convicted Hill for the firstdegree murder of Luis Cortez and the attempted murder of Hwan Chong causing great bodily injury. The jury found true allegations that Hill used a deadly weapon on both charges. In a separate proceeding, the jury found that Hill was sane at the time he committed both crimes.

On August 16, 2015, Hill was homeless when he sliced the neck of Hwan Chong, who was also homeless and mentally ill. Mr. Chong received stitches for his injury. Hill claimed that Mr. Chong attempted to rape him, and he was defending himself. On October 19, 2015, Hill stabbed another homeless man, Luis Cortez, killing him. Hill again claimed that Mr. Cortez attempted to rape him.

Hill had initially pled not guilty and not guilty by reason of insanity.

CASE: Grandon David DeMasters & Sandra Jean DeMasters (Case #16FE010741)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kelly Mulcahy, Insurance Fraud Unit

Grandon David DeMasters and his wife, Sandra Jean DeMasters, pled guilty to felony insurance fraud. On July 16, 2015, the defendants' 21-year-old son, Grandon Dylan DeMasters, left a bar near Isleton on a Harley Davidson motorcycle owned by the defendants. He rode at a high rate of speed, passing motorist Wing Joe. Moments later, Grandon Dylan DeMasters crashed the motorcycle on the side of the road and left it on the roadway. As Mr. Joe came around a bend, he hit the motorcycle. The Harley then burst into flames, totaling both vehicles.

On July 17, 2015, Grandon David DeMasters started an insurance policy on the wrecked Harley Davidson and did not disclose the accident. Sandra Jean DeMasters made a claim and stated her husband crashed the motorcycle. Both defendants gave additional statements to Pacific Specialty Insurance (PSI) in support of their fraudulent claim. On November 2, 2015, PSI paid off the \$12,889 loan on the Harley Davidson and paid \$2,000 to the defendants for other associated losses. On November 3, 2015, Mr. Joe's insurance company sought subrogation against PSI and the fraud was discovered.

The Honorable James McFetridge sentenced both defendants to 60 days in jail, 5 years formal probation, and ordered them to pay \$16,119 to PSI and \$1,000 to Wing Joe in restitution. \star

First League Realignment **Proposal has** . Cordova in **New League**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

· In a year-and-a-half, Cordova High School athletic programs could find it in playing in the same division it currently is in Division IV. But the Lancers could be in a different league.

The Sac-Joaquin Section had its first of five public meetings for league realignment for the 2018-22 cycle at The Reserve at Spanos Park in Stockton on Dec. 14th. Half of the section's 192 schools athletic directors and administrators, plus the section's league realignment committee, consisting of various athletic directors and administrators in the section, were present.

The first draft, presented by the section, calls for Cordova leaving the Sierra Valley Conference, which currently includes Rosemont, Galt, Liberty Ranch, El Dorado and Union Mine. The SVC is currently D-IV. The draft calls for the SVC to add Bradshaw Christian, in place of Cordova, and drop to D-V.

The proposal has Cordova part of a new six school D-IV league. The league, which has no name at this time, includes Cordova, Florin of Sacramento, Johnson of Sacramento, Laguna Creek of Elk Grove, Valley and West Campus, both of Sacramento.

Cordova High School Athletic Director Tom Pena was present at the meeting. He offered these thoughts at this time.

"This process will take several months," Pena said. 'Cordova High administration will consider feedback from all stakeholders, as it studies the proposal and develops a plan to provide input to the (league realignment) committee at the next session in January." Pena further stated that the goal, for the school's athletic program, is to be placed in a league that reflects "the scope and depth of our athletic program, and that serves the best interest of our students, staff, community and supporters." The second meeting will be Thursday, Jan. 12th, also at The Reserve. Another meeting will be conducted toward the end of January, and then a fourth meeting is scheduled for February. The final meeting is scheduled to take place in March.
