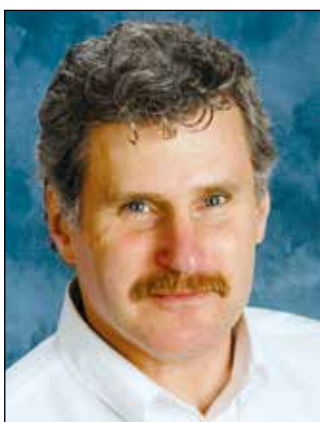

# Library Unveils New Korean Collection

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Rancho Cordova Library is the new home for a collection of Korean-language books and materials. The Grand Opening of this collection was held in November with the Korean Consul General Shin Chae-Hyun and staff, Vice Mayor Linda Budge, and Library Authority staff who gathered at the Rancho Cordova Library for a ribbon-cutting ceremony and viewing of the collection.

After the ribbon-cutting, a cultural event to further celebrate the opening of the new section continued at Rancho Cordova City Hall. KP International Market catered the event, and leaders from the Sacramento Valley Korean America Community, which is located in Rancho Cordova, were in

attendance.

Many members and families from the Korean American Community enjoyed performances by the Korean School of Sacramento, along with both traditional and modern dances by "urisaew" and SoNE1, the UC Davis K-Pop Group. Traditional dancers use their bodies, traditional instruments, and beautiful, flowing costumes to create a narrative motion that represents centuries of Korean history, while the K-Pop Group brought the very popular acrobatic style that has been spread by young Koreans today.

"It was my pleasure to welcome this new Korean book collection to our community," said Councilmember Linda Budge. "With the Korean Community Association, as well

as 65% of the Korean American business community located in the Rancho Cordova community, it was only logical that the Rancho Cordova Library should house this special collection."

KP International Market's owner, Byong Joo Yu, requested that the library host this collection to expand the cultural materials that library visitors can access. The collection is funded by the Office of the Consulate General of the Republic of Korea, located in San Francisco.

## Whisker Warriors Partners with Meals on Wheels

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Whisker Warriors, a local non-profit organization dedicated to reducing animal overpopulation and ensuring the well-being of animals in our community, has teamed up with Meals on Wheels. Meals on Wheels is a program that delivers pre-made food to seniors at home who are unable to purchase or prepare their own meals. Last year, Rancho Cordova Meals on Wheels volunteers discovered that some of the senior citizens who received free food were giving their meals to their pets because of their limited resources.

To help, in August of 2015 Whisker Warriors began supplying donated cat and dog food to Meals on Wheels to be distributed to the seniors in the program with pets. Along with their regular food delivery, these residents are now receiving food for their cat or dog to ensure that their companion animals are also well-fed and getting the nutrition they need.

"We are grateful that we have partnerships that allow us to provide services for people and animals in need in our community," said Tera Kolvenbach, Executive Director of Rancho Cordova Whisker Warriors.

Today, 230 homebound seniors in the Meals on Wheels program and their 375 cats and dogs are benefiting from this partnership.

# Final Environmental Documents for WaterFix Released

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)**

- Following hundreds of public meetings and thousands of public comments, California has released the final, refined environmental documents for WaterFix, an essential effort to modernize the State's water infrastructure.

"WaterFix will secure water supplies for 25 million Californians and prepare for a future marked by rising seas, seismic threats and more extreme weather," said Mark Cowin, Director of the California Department of Water Resources. "After years of scientific study and analysis, we have found the best solution for protecting both the Delta's ecosystem and a vital water supply for California."

The Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and Environmental Impact Statement

(EIS) describe environmental impacts that could arise from modernizing California's infrastructure and includes measures to avoid or minimize those impacts. The document analyzed 18 project alternatives, including the status quo, and ultimately concluded that WaterFix, known as Alternative 4A, was the best option for both increasing water supply reliability and addressing current Delta ecosystem concerns while minimizing environmental impact. WaterFix was chosen because of its ability to provide a reliable source of clean water while minimizing unnatural flows in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta that harm native fish and habitat. More than 100 alternatives were also considered in the development of the WaterFix EIR/EIS and screened out for lack of feasibility or public benefit.

WaterFix is the State's plan to upgrade infrastructure in the estuary where two major rivers – the Sacramento and San Joaquin – meet before flowing to San Francisco Bay. The Delta provides critical habitat for wildlife, including several endangered or threatened species of native fish. The State's two biggest water projects, the State Water Project and the federal Central Valley Project, deliver water that passes through the Delta. Together, the two projects deliver water to 25 million people across California. Water project operations in the south Delta are increasingly curtailed to protect listed fish species. WaterFix aims to reduce that conflict so that water supplies are stabilized and harmful reverse flows are reduced. The project consists of three new intakes in the

northern Delta and two 35-mile-long tunnels to transport water to the existing pumping plants in the south Delta. New intakes and tunnels would also help guard water supplies against saltwater intrusion as sea levels rise and in the event of an earthquake or storm powerful enough to destroy levees in the low-lying Delta.

The product of 10 years of study, analysis, and public input, California WaterFix is a key element of the Brown Administration's five-year plan to build more reliable, resilient watersystems and to restore important ecosystems. The basic elements of WaterFix were chosen in order to satisfy the 2009 Delta Reform Act, which established the co-equal goals of providing a more reliable water supply for California and protecting, restoring, and

enhancing the Delta ecosystem. The 2009 law directed State agencies to analyze a reasonable range of Delta conveyance alternatives, including various routes and carrying capacities.

Now that the EIR/EIS is completed, Biological Opinions are expected to be finalized in early 2017, clearing the way for final environmental clearances, completion of other necessary agreements, and construction beginning as soon as 2018.

The final EIR/EIS was refined after more than 300 days of public review and 600 public meetings throughout the State about the draft versions. It includes responses to and revisions based on more than 30,000 public comments. The final environmental documents are available at <http://baydeltaconservationplan.com/FinalEIREIS.aspx>

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - What would you do if you saw a young child at risk of drowning? On May 31, 2015 that was the scenario in the Anatolia community.

It was Sarah Debnokoff's first day as a lifeguard at the Anatolia Clubhouse. She had received her lifeguard certification five days prior. While watching swimmers, Debnokoff spotted a young boy at the bottom of the community spa. She quickly jumped into the spa, pulled the boy out, saw that he was not breathing, and immediately started CPR. Julianna Stowell, a guest at the pool and a nurse, saw what was

happening and assisted Sarah with administering CPR. Due to the quick actions of Debnokoff and Stowell, when Metro Fire crews arrived at the pool, the young boy was once again breathing on his own, though barely conscious. He was further treated by the Metro Fire crew, transported to the hospital, and has since recovered.

"That moment was like an out-of-body experience," said Debnokoff. "I had just finished my lifeguard training, so everything was fresh in my mind. I didn't think; I just did what I had been trained to do."

On December 22, 2016, these

community heroes were commended for their quick thinking and life-saving actions by Sac Metro Fire Assistant Chiefs Greg Casentini and Randy Hein, Mayor Donald Terry, and former Anatolia Homeowners Association President Craig Osborn.

"Your actions on May 31, 2015 saved the life of a young boy," said Mayor Donald Terry. "The City of Rancho Cordova commends you for acting so quickly, and for being prepared and well-trained for that situation."

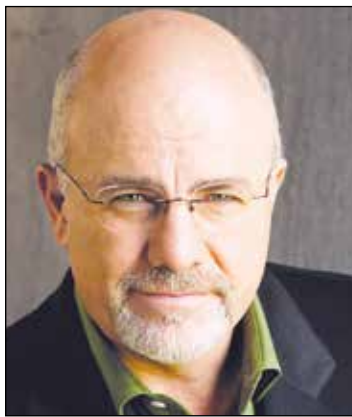

# Governor Brown Grants Pardons

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. has announced that he has granted 112 pardons and one commutation.

Individuals who have been convicted of a crime in California may apply to the Governor for a pardon. Those granted pardons all completed their sentences and the majority were originally convicted of non-violent, drug-related crimes. All applicants for a pardon who were eligible obtained a

Certificate of Rehabilitation, which is an order from a superior court declaring that a person convicted of a crime is now rehabilitated.

A gubernatorial pardon may be granted to people who have demonstrated exemplary behavior and have lived productive and law-abiding lives following their conviction. Pardons are not granted unless they are earned.

When a pardon is granted, the California Department

of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation are notified so that they may update their records on the applicant. The pardon is filed with the Secretary of State and the Legislature, and it is a public record.

The Governor also granted one commutation to a current inmate, which will reduce the prison sentence but not eliminate it. The individual will not be released from prison today and he will remain incarcerated until he

is eligible to appear before the Board of Parole Hearings. The inmate receiving the commutation has shown exemplary behavior during incarceration, including vocational accomplishments, self-help, volunteer activities and earning multiple community college degrees.

# Dare to Live Without Limits

## Peer Pressure



Peer pressure is a real or imagined force compelling you to behave in a way contrary to your desires, morals, or ethics. Peer pressure can come from anywhere: family, friends, acquaintances, or even strangers. Regardless of the source, the impact is the same; capitulation to peer pressure jeopardizes your journey by diverting you from your path. Saying no to peer pressure seems difficult because of the fear of rejection or alienation.

Of course it’s a good feeling to be part of a group, accepted, and included in various activities. But how much are you willing to sacrifice in quest of acceptance? This is something you should come to terms with before being in the midst of peer pressure. You need to set standards that govern your actions regardless of any pressure.

Those who are highly susceptible to peer pressure are prone to yielding to the demands of others regardless of the negative consequences which may

result. Our sensitivity to peer pressure starts at a young age when we see how concerned grown-ups are about the opinions of others. “What will other people think?” is the comment heard all too often.

Consequently, we develop our own sensitivity to how others react to our thoughts, feelings, and actions. Avoiding ridicule, rejection, or criticism becomes engrained as a powerful motivator. As a result, our lives are structured around conformity. Rather than pursuing our individual paths, our decisions are filtered through the lens of real or perceived peer pressure.

The results are particularly insidious when you align yourself with people who are on destructive paths. Young children and adolescents are particularly susceptible to involvement with the “wrong” group. These kids think it’s cool or rebellious to hang out with deviant types of people. Unfortunately, the results of this type of association

are negative. They include drug use, excessive drinking, crime, or other harmful behavior.

Although peer pressure experienced when you get older may not be as destructive, it still drives you from your individual path. Your happiness suffers whenever your behavior is adjusted to conform to the perceived desires of others.

You are solely responsible for the direction of your life. It doesn’t matter what other people say, think or do. True happiness is based on following your own genuine path, not on the acceptance of anyone else.

You can inoculate yourself from peer pressure with a thorough understanding of yourself, your likes, your dislikes, values, and goals. The more you know about yourself, the easier it is to remain on track.

The next time you feel any type of peer pressure, assess how it relates to your self understanding.

Is there any conflict with what you want to do, like to do, feel is wrong, or believe unethical? If the answer is yes, giving in to peer pressure will have a deleterious impact on you.

Initially, saying no to peer pressure feels awkward. As you make it a habit, you will experience greater freedom. Anyone whose friendship is dependent on your acquiescing to their demands is not a true friend nor is associating with them of any benefit to you. Ironically, in spite of all your efforts to win their acceptance, they actually don’t have much respect for you.

When you free yourself from the grip of peer pressure, you’ll attract others who have the same outlook. The new friends you make will be based on a common, mutual bond. Your fear of rejection will diminish and eventually disappear. A refreshing new perspective will unfold as you pursue your own path.

# Hardwired: The Brain's Circuitry for Political Belief

*When people's political beliefs are challenged, their brains become active in areas that govern personal identity and emotional responses to threats, USC researchers found.*

A USC-led study confirms what seems increasingly true in American politics: People are hard-headed about their political beliefs, even when provided with contradictory evidence.

Neuroscientists at the Brain and Creativity Institute at USC said the findings from the functional MRI study seem especially relevant to how people responded to political news stories, fake or credible, throughout the election.

"Political beliefs are like religious beliefs in the respect that both are part of who you are and important for the social circle to which you belong," said lead author **Jonas Kaplan**, an assistant research professor of psychology at the Brain and Creativity Institute at USC Dornsife College of Letters, Arts and Sciences. "To consider an alternative view, you would have to consider an alternative version of yourself."

To determine which brain networks respond when someone holds firmly to a belief, the neuroscientists with the Brain and Creativity Institute at USC compared whether and how much people change their minds on

nonpolitical and political issues when provided counter-evidence.

They discovered that people were more flexible when asked to consider the strength of their belief in nonpolitical statements – for example, "Albert Einstein was the greatest physicist of the 20th century."

But when it came to reconsidering their political beliefs, such as whether the United States should reduce funding for the military, they would not budge.

"I was surprised that people would doubt that Einstein was a great physicist, but this study showed that there are certain realms where we retain flexibility in our beliefs," Kaplan said.

The study was published on Dec. 23 in the Nature journal Scientific Reports. Study co-authors were Sarah Gimbel of the Brain and Creativity Institute and Sam Harris, a neuroscientist for the Los Angeles-based nonprofit Project Reason.

**Inside the mind**

For the study, the neuroscientists recruited 40 people who were self-declared liberals. The scientists then examined through functional MRI how their brains responded when their beliefs were challenged.

During their brain imaging sessions, participants were presented with eight political statements that they had said they believe just as strongly as a set of eight nonpolitical statements. They were then shown five counter-claims that challenged each statement.

Participants rated the strength of their belief in the original statement on a scale of 1-7 after reading each counter-claim. The scientists then studied their brain scans to determine which areas became most engaged during these challenges.

Participants did not change their beliefs much, if at all, when provided with evidence that countered political statements such as, "The laws regulating gun ownership in the United States should be made more restrictive."

But the scientists noticed the strength of their beliefs weakened by one or two points when challenged on nonpolitical topics, such as whether "Thomas Edison had invented the light bulb." The participants were shown counter statements

that prompted some feelings of doubt, such as "Nearly 70 years before Edison, Humphrey Davy demonstrated an electric lamp to the Royal Society."

**Thoughts that count**

The study found that people who were most resistant to changing their beliefs had more activity in the amygdalae (a pair of almond-shaped areas near the center of the brain depicted in the illustration) and the insular cortex, compared with people who were more willing to change their minds.

"The activity in these areas, which are important for emotion and decision-making, may relate to how we feel when we encounter evidence against our beliefs," said Kaplan, a co-director of the Dornsife Cognitive Neuroimaging Center at USC.

"The amygdala in particular is known to be especially involved in perceiving threat and anxiety," Kaplan added. "The insular cortex processes feelings from the body, and it is important for detecting the emotional salience of stimuli. That is consistent with the idea that when we feel threatened, anxious or emotional, then we are less likely to change our minds." He also noted that a system in the brain, the Default Mode Network, surged in activity when participants'

political beliefs were challenged.

"These areas of the brain have been linked to thinking about who we are, and with the kind of rumination or deep thinking that takes us away from the here and now," Kaplan said.

The researchers said that this latest study, along with one conducted earlier this year, indicate the Default Mode Network is important for high-level thinking about important personal beliefs or values.

"Understanding when and why people are likely to change their minds is an urgent objective," said Gimbel, a research scientist at the Brain and Creativity Institute. "Knowing how and which statements may persuade people to change their political beliefs could be key for society's progress," she said.

The findings can apply to circumstances outside of politics, including how people respond to fake news stories.

"We should acknowledge that emotion plays a role in cognition and in how we decide what is true and what is not true," Kaplan said. "We should not expect to be dispassionate computers. We are biological organisms."

## Defendant Sentenced for Multiple Charges, Stemming from Bar Shooting Defendant Sentenced for Series of Rancho Cordova Sexual Assaults Wife & Husband Convicted of Insurance Fraud

**DATE:** December 9, 2016

The Honorable Trena Burger-Plavan sentenced Abelino Nunez to 31 years and 8 months to life in prison. On August 30, 2016, a jury convicted Nunez of attempted first-degree murder with personal use and discharge of a weapon allegations found true. Nunez was also convicted of assault with a semiautomatic pistol, felony evading an officer with wanton disregard for public safety, hit and run, driving under the influence, bribery of a public official, and being a felon in possession of a handgun.

On December 16, 2013, Abelino Nunez was escorted out of the La Cabana Bar by security because he was intoxicated and tried to start a fight. Nunez got into his car and pulled up to the front of the bar, where he motioned to the bouncer to come closer to his car. Nunez then fired several shots. The bouncer dove behind a rock wall to avoid being hit. One bullet entered the bar and another became embedded in a rock wall where the victim dove. When police officers responded to the scene, a witness pointed out Nunez's car. Officers pursued Nunez and a high speed chase ensued. Nunez reached speeds in excess of 90 mph, running multiple red lights and stop signs, and driving in the opposite lane of traffic before crashing into a parked truck. Nunez took off on foot, but was quickly detained. A test of his blood alcohol revealed that he was two and a half times above the legal limit. Nunez then offered one of the officers up to \$25,000 if she would let him go.

**CASE:** Jordan Hudson (Case #14F01257)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Laurel White sentenced Jordan Hudson to 21 years in prison. On November 14, 2016, a jury convicted Hudson of assault to commit forcible rape, two counts of assault to commit forcible oral copulation, and committing a lewd and lascivious act on a 15-year-old child with the defendant being at least 10 years older than the victim.

On February 3, 2014, a woman was walking in Rancho Cordova when Hudson attacked and tried to rape her and force her to perform oral

copulation on him. The victim fought back and Hudson fled the scene. On February 20, 2014, Hudson attacked an 18-year-old girl as she walked home from her high school. Hudson again tried to force the victim to perform oral copulation on him. This victim also fought back and Hudson fled the scene. Later that day, Hudson grabbed a 15-year-old girl's buttock while she was walking home. The victim pushed him away, but Hudson continued to follow her into her apartment complex. Hudson left the scene when the victim's sister yelled at him to leave.

Hudson was previously convicted of battery for a similar incident that occurred in 2011.

**CASE:** Deborah Ann Carter & Louis Hudson (Case #15F02774)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Alan Hengel, Insurance Fraud Unit

Deborah Ann Carter was convicted by a jury of three felony insurance fraud charges. In a separate proceeding, another jury convicted Carter of felony failure to appear and found true the allegation that she committed a felony within 5 years of a prior prison term.

On July 7, 2014, a volunteer worker for an alcohol and drug recovery facility for the homeless accidentally backed the facility's minivan into a parked car at a slow rate of speed, causing minor damage to both vehicles. The car was occupied solely by Carter's husband, Louis Hudson. Later that day, Carter directed her niece to call the facility's auto insurance and report that both Carter and Hudson were in the sedan when the accident occurred. Both Carter and Hudson claimed they had been injured in the accident.

The California Department of Insurance Urban Auto Fraud Unit investigated Carter's insurance claim and interviewed two witnesses. Both witnesses said only Hudson was in the sedan at the time of the accident, and that they saw Carter come out of a nearby building screaming after the collision.

Louis Hudson previously pled no contest to a misdemeanor auto insurance fraud charge. He was sentenced to 90 days in jail and placed on three years probation.

Carter faces a maximum sentence of 8 years in prison. Sentencing is set for January 13, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 39 before the Honorable James Arguelles. ★

# Israel Ambushed by the UN, Obama

The UN Security Council attacked Israel by voting to condemn Israeli settlement activity. And in a stunning reversal of U.S. policy, the Obama administration refused to veto the anti-Israel measure. Now Israel's enemies will use this UN action to intensify pressure on the Jewish state. This dangerous resolution shows why you and I must make our voice heard on Israel's behalf.

With Americans tuning out in the run-up to Christmas, President Barack Obama carried out a sneak attack on the Jewish state today.

Despite furious lobbying by Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and pressure from President-elect Donald J. Trump, the UN Security Council approved an anti-Israel resolution condemning all Israeli settlement activity.

Egypt pulled the measure, after Trump intervened, but four UN Security Council members – New Zealand, Malaysia, Senegal and Venezuela – brought it to a vote. And the Obama administration, in a deeply troubling departure from past American policy, withheld America's veto, letting the measure pass.

An incensed Israeli official

accused President Obama and Secretary of State John Kerry of abandoning Israel. In a Times of Israel report, the unnamed official blasted Obama for having "secretly cooked up with the Palestinians an extreme anti-Israeli resolution behind Israel's back which would be a tailwind for terror and boycotts. . . ."

This newly-passed resolution demands Israel "immediately and completely cease all settlement activities in the occupied Palestinian territory, including East Jerusalem." The enemies of Israel will immediately use it to ratchet up world pressure on Israel.

The U.S. has a long-standing policy of vetoing anti-Israel resolutions at the UN, but the Obama administration today abandoned Israel and sided with Palestinians who want to eliminate the Jewish state.

President-elect Trump was exactly right when he called the resolution "extremely unfair to all Israelis."

"As the United States has long maintained," Trump declared, "peace between the Israelis and the Palestinians will only come through direct negotiations between the parties, and not through the imposition of terms by the United Nations."

But by condemning Israeli settlement activity, the Obama administration, with just one

month left in office, has made Middle East peace all the more unlikely. That's bad for Israel, bad for Palestinians, and bad for the world.

God gave the Jewish people the land of Israel thousands of years ago. He also promised to return His people to their land, and to settle them on it, announcing through the prophet Ezekiel: "I will settle people on you as in the past and will make you prosper more than before. Then you will know that I am the Lord" (Ezekiel 36:11).

But Palestinian leaders refuse to recognize Israel's right to exist as a Jewish state. You can find out why when you request my new book, Why Israel Matters.

It is God's calling on our lives, and our own nation cannot prosper if we are unfaithful to Israel. You see, it is not just Israel that matters. Our own response to God's command to comfort and bless Israel matters. It matters for you and me, and for our children and grandchildren as well.

That is why I am asking you now to stand with Christians in Defense of Israel. With your help, we will defend Israel and its historic, legal, and God-given right to live and settle the land God gave to it.

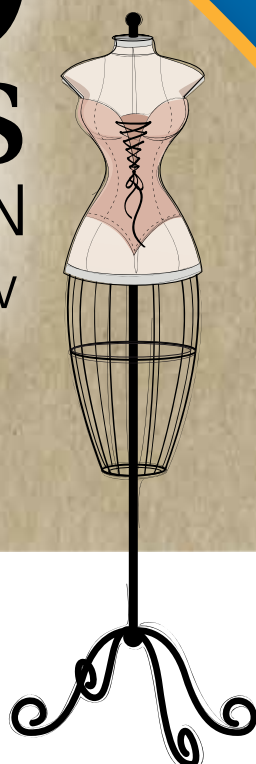
