Brewing a Great Christmas

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - David Mathis, owner of American River Brewing Company in Rancho Cordova, has been a commercial brewer for over 20 years, and did home brewing before that. His interest in beer, however, predated his start as a brewer. "I have very strong Danish roots, and my parents took me back to Denmark when I was 7. That's when I had my first beer," Mathis said. "I've always known that I wanted to be involved with brewing at a very young age."

Though his father was born in the United States, the family has followed the Christmas tree lighting tradition of Mathis's Danish mother. "We had ten kids (in the family)," Mathis's mother Birgit Mathis said. "We'd line up outside and my dad would open the door and you would see this Christmas tree, with all these candles on it . . . When David went to Denmark one time for Christmas, he saw what it was all about, the magic."

This year American River Brewing Company held its Christmas tree lighting on December 2. By the time the tree was unveiled, a large crowd had already filled the tasting room and spilled out through the open warehouse door. Just outside, Chef Keith Breedlove's Cülinerdy Crüzer food truck sold burgers, sandwiches, and other food. Mathis revealed the lighted Christmas tree shortly after 6 p.m., with enthusiastic response from the guests.

"I enjoy my life, I enjoy what I do for a living, I enjoy people that are in my life," Mathis said. "I enjoy bringing happiness, whether it's through conversation and friendship or through making great beer."

Mathis's brewer Andy Armstrong was also present, and his choice of beer was a Capitol Copper, a hybrid style amber/pale ale. "It's kind of a newer style that we're doing," Armstrong said. The brewery has 12 beers

Children's Museum Brings Free Program to Schools

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- The Sacramento Children's Museum in Rancho Cordova has launched a new program to bring "STEAM" (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) activities to local elementary schools for free. This program is called Van Go! and has recently hit the streets. First and second graders at Sunrise Elementary School were lucky enough to experience the "Building & Engineering" lesson this week. Each class spent an hour experiencing hands-on learning activities that included building a house or a car with a Rigamajig large scale building set, building towers with marshmallows and spaghetti, and creating parachutes to be sent through a wind tunnel.

Teachers often have a need for outside resources that they can use to supplement and enhance their current lesson plans, but such resources can get costly. The Sacramento Children's Museum wanted to help by bringing resources directly to Rancho Cordova elementary schools at no cost. The Van Go! program activities range from literacy-based programs, to science and STEAM programs, to creative and artistic lessons. Each student who participates also receives a free pass to the Sacramento Children's Museum.

"The City of Rancho Cordova is a vibrant community that values education and the arts for our youth," said Council Member Linda Budge. "We are proud to be able to bring the Van Go! program to Rancho Cordova elementary schools, thanks to a \$40,000 grant from the voter-approved Community Enhancement Fund."

The Van Go! program is made possible through a partnership with the City, Sacramento Children's Museum, and school districts, as well as a grant from the City's Community Enhancement Fund.

Folsom Lake College President to Retire at End of Year

FOLSOM, CA (MPG) - Dr. Rachel Rosenthal, the President of Folsom Lake College, will retire December 31, 2016 after serving in the position for four-and-a-half years. Dr. Rosenthal is the second president in the school's twelve-year history.

During Rosenthal's tenure, she guided the institution through the creation of a ten-year College Master Plan, the fruitful piloting of an inmate education program at Mule Creek State Prison and the Folsom Women's Facility, the launch of the FLC/Rancho Cordova Promise Program in partnership with the City of Rancho Cordova, the transformation of the college's Innovation Center into a makerspace, and a successful application for reaffirmation of accreditation.

"This young college has grown and matured into a magnificent institution and I've been honored to serve as its president.

It's as if I've been at the right place at the right time," Rosenthal shared. "I must also acknowledge my wonderful mentors and the support of so many great people all along the way as for this, I am ever grateful."

Rosenthal has dedicated more than two decades to higher education serving in management and faculty positions at Sierra College in Rocklin and American River College in Sacramento. Prior to her time in education, she worked in the private sector as a project engineer and led the design of highway seismic retrofit projects in Southern California.

Rosenthal is also active in the community having served on the boards of the Folsom Economic Development Corporation, Folsom Tourism Bureau, Folsom Lake College Foundation, the Sacramento SPCA and canine companions, and is a Commissioner for the

Association for California Community College Administrators Association, the California Community College Athletics Association, and the American Association of Community Colleges.

"Rachel's dedication to the community she serves is among the chief reasons that Folsom Lake College has fostered such a stellar reputation in the Sacramento region and beyond," said Brian King, Chancellor of the Los Rios Community College District. "Her integrity, creativity and passion will sorely be missed by our entire organization."

Folsom Lake College's longtime Vice President of Administration Kathleen Kirklin will serve as Interim President while the Los Rios Community College District conducts the nationwide search for Rosenthal's successor.

Teacher Spotlight: Giving Credit Where Due

Cordova High School Teacher Amazed by Her Hard-Working IB Students

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - When Rachel Nguyen came to Cordova High School three years ago, it was because her new teaching job met both her criteria: a culturally diverse school and a newly-forming International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme.

At her interview, she told the assistant principal, “I’m hoping to build a program I can bring my own children to.”

And in fact, her kindergartner and first grader are on track for their mother’s high school: They attend a nearby elementary school. “I want my kids to grow up with students like I teach,” she says

It’s safe to say that Nguyen is crazy about her students.

“This is the most diverse school I’ve ever walked into,” says Nguyen, who is the school’s IB Diploma Programme

Coordinator. “There are these rich heritages and this super community of learners. Every one of my classes is so interesting.”

She also tells stories of the challenges her students face, which can easily bring her to tears, but in the end, leave her even more impressed. One young woman in her class travels 40 minutes on public transportation to get to school every day. A young man works in a restaurant to help support his family - but snagged extra hours this summer so he could buy himself a laptop.

“They are brilliant, hard-working individuals ... and this is a beautiful, amazing group of people,” Nguyen says. “There is strength and creativity and a sense of community here.”

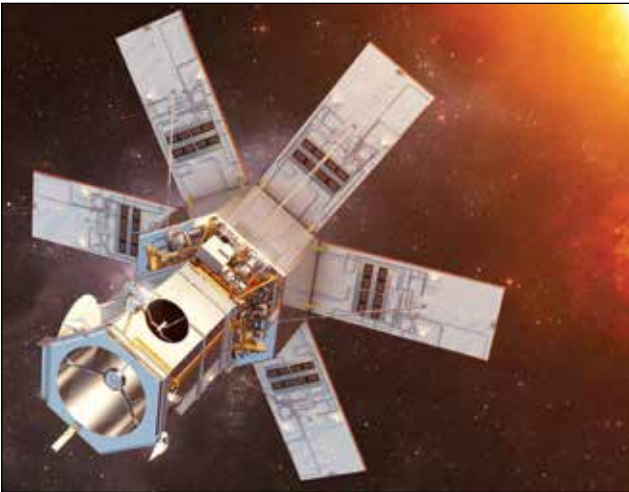

Aerojet Rocketdyne Supports Launch of WorldView-4 Commercial Earth Observation Satellite

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne, a subsidiary of Aerojet Rocketdyne Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: AJRD), successfully supported the launch of WorldView-4, DigitalGlobe’s newest high-accuracy, high-resolution imaging satellite. The mission was launched from Vandenberg Air Force Base in California aboard a United Launch Alliance Atlas V rocket today. Aerojet Rocketdyne propulsion on the Atlas V included the RL10C-1 upper-stage engine, six helium pressurization tanks and a dozen Centaur upper-stage Reaction Control System thrusters (RCS). For the WorldView-4 satellite, Aerojet Rocketdyne provides 12 MR-106L 5-lbf hydrazine rocket engines which provide all of the maneuvering and attitude control propulsion for the mission.

“High-resolution commercial satellite imagery plays a critical role in modern society, from helping to keep nations safe, to supporting disaster response efforts, to powering a wide range of location-enabled applications and services. We are proud to support the launch of WorldView-4 and

Aerojet Rocketdyne’s role in the launch began after separation of the first stage, when a single RL10C-1 upper-stage engine ignited to place the payload into orbit, helped by the Centaur thrusters and pressurization tanks. The RL10C-1 delivers 22,890 pounds of thrust to power the Atlas V upper stage, using cryogenic liquid hydrogen and liquid

oxygen propellants during its operation.

The RL10C-1 was developed from the RL10 family of upper-stage engines, which have accumulated one of the most impressive track records of accomplishments in the history of space propulsion. More than 470 RL10 engines have supported launches over the last 50 years, helping to place military, government and commercial satellites into orbit, and powering scientific space-probe missions to every planet in our solar system.

The 12 MR-106 series 6-9 lbf Centaur upper-stage

hydrazine thrusters provide roll, pitch and yaw control, as well as settling burns. Aerojet Rocketdyne has flown more than 3,000 MR-106 series 6-9 lbf thrusters with 100 percent mission success. ARDE, a subsidiary of Aerojet Rocketdyne based in New Jersey, provided the pressure vessels on the first and second stages of the launch vehicle.

WorldView-4 was built by Lockheed Martin and is owned and operated by DigitalGlobe. The satellite will orbit Earth every 90 minutes, traveling 17,000 miles per hour and capturing as much as 680,000 square kilometers of the Earth’s surface daily – the equivalent of the land area of Texas. The 12 MR-106L engines on the WorldView-4 satellite are located at the corners of the satellite to provide three-axis control, as well as maneuvering of the satellite. Each rocket engine is approximately the size of an average person’s hand and weighs less than 1.5 pounds.

We received word from the Sacramento County Registrar of Voters that the County had not certified our election as of Monday morning on December 5, 2016. This needed to be done before the swearing-in of our Councilmembers. Legally, they had until December 8, 2016 to certify the election. As you will know when you read this, our swearing-in ceremonies for David Sander, Donald Terry, and Robert J. McGarvey (me) will not be done until December 19, 2016. That evening, the swearing-in ceremonies will be first, followed by a City Council vote and swearing in for the Mayor and Vice Mayor. We will not be doing everything “the way we always have”, according to your City Clerk, Mindy Cuppy. The way it worked out, the Sacramento County Registrar of Voters certified the election on December 5, 2016 at 4:45 P.M. That was a little late to go back to the original plan, so we didn’t.

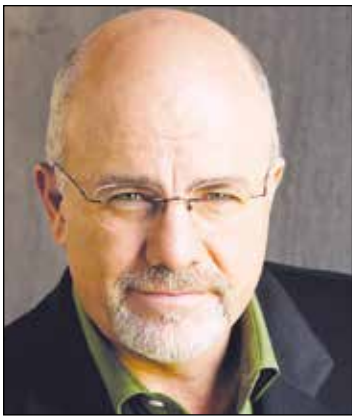

Dying car, or kill the student loan?

Dear Dave,
I'm 38 years old, and I've got \$12,000 in student loans still hanging over my head. It's the only debt I have. I make \$30,000 a year, and I've managed to save \$12,000, but I'm also driving a junky, old car that will have to be replaced soon. Should I split the money I've saved and buy a \$6,000 car while paying off \$6,000 of the student loan?
- Phil

Dear Phil,
If I'm in your shoes, I want that student loan out of my life as quickly as possible. At the same time, I don't want you living life without some money in the bank. If you've followed me for very long, you know I teach the Baby Steps when it comes to getting out of debt and saving money. Baby Step 1 is to save a beginner emergency fund of \$1,000. Baby Step 2 is to pay off all debt, except for your home, using the debt snowball method. The third Baby Step is to build a fully funded emergency fund of three to six months of expenses.

You don't have quite enough on hand for your idea and to have something left over. I recommend paying off \$11,000 of the school

loan now and then finishing it up as you go. It won't take much more time. Limp along in the beater for a little while longer and then, when you have no student loan debt, finish your emergency fund and start a car fund.

I talk to a lot of people your age who still have student loan debt. But you have the opportunity to punch its lights out in a hurry. If you pour on the coals, you should be able to save money and get a better car in just a few months!

The teacher was wrong

Dear Dave,
My daughter is in her first year of college. Recently, her math instructor walked students through the process of getting a credit card and building credit. We've always followed your plan and taught her to do the same. When she asked the instructor if no credit score was as good as a high credit score, the instructor said no. He told the class the only way to buy a home without a high credit rating is by having a huge amount of assets or savings. I think I know your answer, but how do I explain this to an 18-year-old?

Dear Allison,
Well, the first thing you explain is that college instructors — even tenured college professors — can be absolutely wrong sometimes. A few years ago my daughter took a personal finance class

in college, and on the first day the instructor went on a rant saying Dave Ramsey is stupid. He didn't know I was her dad, but she went through the entire class and never said a word. When she called home and asked what she should do, we told her to take the class and give him the answers he wants on the tests. We reminded her that she's just taking a class, and that doesn't mean she has to form her life opinions around what that guy thinks.

Sit down with your daughter and gently explain in this instance her instructor doesn't have a clue what he's talking about. Explain to her you can get a home loan even if you have no credit score. People do it all the time. There are places like Churchill Mortgage that would be happy to give her an example of this process. It's called manual underwriting. All you have to do is make a reasonable down payment, have two years at the same job, and provide two years of tax returns.

TV CORNER – “INCORPORATED” ON SYFY

Science-fiction would probably not be a genre if the future held promise for a world in which everything is beautiful, people are friendly, freedom reigns, and cats and dog live together in peaceful co-existence.

The Syfy cable channel’s “Incorporated” sticks to the formula of a dystopian future in the year 2074 where the land has been ravaged, coastal cities have vanished and multinational corporations have replaced the government.

What might attract an audience for this show is the highly publicized involvement of Matt Damon and Ben Affleck as the producers. And maybe you will fall for the thriller elements, even though we’ve seen many of them before.

Seemingly taking a page from “Blade Runner,” the future is bleak in an America where the remaining population is located in heart of the Midwest and is divided between haves and have-nots.

If you are not working for the big corporate power Spiga in the safe, secure Green Zone, you would be

relegated to a harsh and brutal life in the lawless Red Zone, where junior executives go slumming on a Friday night to score drugs and watch brutal cage fights.

All nations are under the control of large corporations, and there is a nicely humorous TV news bulletin about Canada building a wall to keep out more Americans from joining the 12 million already illegally residing in the Great White North.

The central character is Ben Larson (Sean Teale), an ambitious young man moving up the corporate ladder by devious means. He’s also married to Laura (Allison Miller), the daughter of the cagey, controlling Spiga CEO (Julia Ormond).

Competing with other junior executives all dressed in dark suits without ties, Ben’s true background is unknown not only to his superiors, but also to his wife. His primary mission, other than climbing the ladder at work, is to find a long-lost love left behind in the Red Zone.

To be sure, Ben won’t want to get on the wrong side of Spiga, because those who fail the company are sent to the “Quiet Room,” a chamber of horrors where Spiga enforcer Julian (Dennis Haysbert) proves to be sadistically

frightening.

Spiga’s control even extends to family planning. Ben’s wife Laura may harbor her own secrets, but she surprises her husband with the news that the couple has been granted a “permit” to have a child.

When one of the executives is caught trying to leave for home with contraband electronic files, he’s dealt with harshly. Operating like the Stasi or KGB, Spiga tolerates no deviation from the corporate culture.

In a chilling talk with employees, the CEO intones that “Spiga is a generous mother” and that it “only asks for hard work and loyalty.” The alternative is for a fate that should be evident.

“Incorporated” has some interesting elements about the fate of humanity. When the CEO says that promotions require a vetting process, it’s clear that Ben may have something to fear because he has plenty to hide.

The question now is whether the Orwellian science-fiction thriller of “Incorporated” will deliver the promise of providing satisfying answers.

TV CORNER – “HAIRSPRAY LIVE!” ON NBC NETWORK

The NBC network had such great success with a live theatrical performance for the Broadway musical “The Wiz” that the decision to do the same for the long-running musical “Hairspray” seemed like a wise programming move.

Since the film “Hairspray Live!” will be delivered as the title implies in a live telecast, there’s not much to go on for a review in advance other than a few clips made available and knowledge of the Broadway show.

To be more accurate, “Hairspray Live!” is also advertised as being based on the theatrical version, though I am not sure if it would be the 1988 film written and directed by John Waters or the 2007 edition that starred John Travolta as the iconic Edna Turnblad.

In all likelihood, “Hairspray Live!,” given the constraints of staging a live performance, should be much more similar to the Broadway production that starred Harvey Fierstein as Edna Turnblad, mother to a dance show hopeful.

NBC made the smart choice of bringing Fierstein into the program to reprise his Broadway role. He’s the perfect fit to encourage his chubby, sweet-natured daughter Tracy (Maddie Baillio) as the dancing-loving teen who auditions for and wins a spot on “The Corny Collins Show.”

The setting is 1962 Baltimore where racial integration has yet to penetrate all segments of society. On the all-white TV show, Tracy becomes an overnight sensation and her newfound status as a celebrity brings societal changes in the vanguard of the civil rights era.

In the midst of charming the public with her winning persona, Tracy’s dream to dance results in her meeting a colorful array of characters including the resident dreamboat Link Larkin (Garrett Clayton) and the requisite mean girl Amber Von Tussle (Dove Cameron).

Another key character is Motormouth Maybelle, a role portrayed by Jennifer Hudson, the Grammy Award-winning recording artist who may be best known for her part as a member of a trio of soul singers in “Dreamgirls.”

If by chance you miss the telecast of “Hairspray Live!,” there is an unconfirmed report that the TV film will be released on DVD in time for the holidays. ★

"This year's inductees represent the latest of an endless series of geniuses and creators," said Governor Brown. "Tonight, we celebrate achievement, vision and the artistic."

Inductees and family members of posthumous inductees received the Spirit of California medal from the Governor and First Lady in the official state ceremony this evening at the California Museum in downtown Sacramento. This year marks

The IRS, state tax agencies and the tax community came together in 2015 to combat tax-related identity theft as a coordinated partnership. But they realized one partner was missing: taxpayers.

The IRS and its partners need the help of all taxpayers to help protect important tax and financial data. The Security Summit also needs the help of tax professionals and businesses to share information and help educate clients and employees about security measures.

"With holiday shopping underway and the 2017 tax season about to begin in January, we are entering a period where

many people will be using sensitive financial and tax data on their computers," said IRS Commissioner John Koskinen. "In the months ahead, more than 100 million tax returns will be completed on laptops and desktops by taxpayers and tax professionals, making this the perfect time to take steps to protect your valuable information. As the holiday season approaches, we also encourage everyone to look out for friends and family who may not be tech savvy and may be leaving their computers vulnerable to

identity thieves." The IRS and its partners will be promoting a range of topics related to computer security and tax scams, reminding taxpayers to: Always use security software with firewall and anti-virus protections. Make sure the security software is always turned on and can automatically update. Encrypt sensitive files such as tax records you store on your computer. Use strong passwords; Learn to recognize and avoid phishing emails, threatening phone calls and texts from thieves posing as legitimate organizations such as your bank, credit card company and government organizations, including the IRS. Do not click on links or download attachments from unknown or suspicious emails; Protect your personal data. Don't routinely carry your Social Security card, and make sure your tax records are secure. Treat your personal information like you do your cash; don't leave it lying around. *Source: IRS Media* ★

CDPH Offers Food Safety Tips for the Holidays

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - With the holiday season approaching, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) reminds consumers to use safe food preparation and storage measures to prevent foodborne illness. Bacteria that can be found in foods such as meat and poultry may cause illness if they are insufficiently cooked, inadequately cooled or improperly handled.

"We can help ensure that foodborne illnesses don't ruin our holidays by properly preparing and handling meat, poultry and other foods," said CDPH Director and State Public Health Officer Dr. Karen Smith.

About 48 million illnesses,

128,000 hospitalizations and 3,000 deaths in the U.S. each year are related to foodborne diseases, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Foodborne diseases can be prevented by: washing hands with soap and warm water before and after food preparation, and especially after handling raw foods; cleaning all work surfaces, utensils and dishes with hot soapy water and rinsing them with hot water after each use; cooking food thoroughly and refrigerating adequately between meals.

Symptoms of foodborne disease can include diarrhea, which may be bloody, vomiting, abdominal cramps and

fever. Most infected people recover from foodborne illnesses within a week. Some, however, may develop complications that require hospitalization. Young children, the elderly, pregnant women and people with weakened immune systems are at highest risk for potentially life-threatening complications.

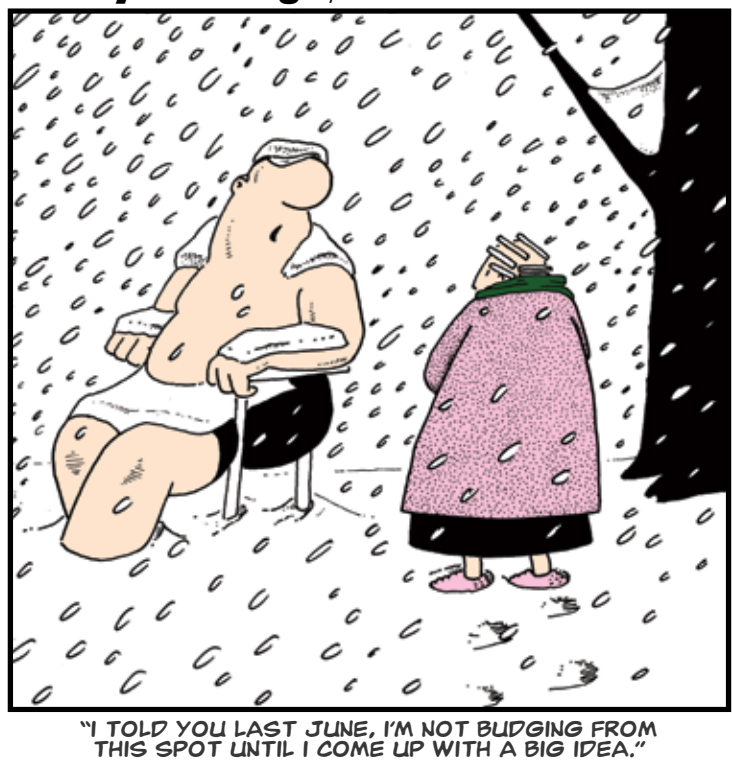

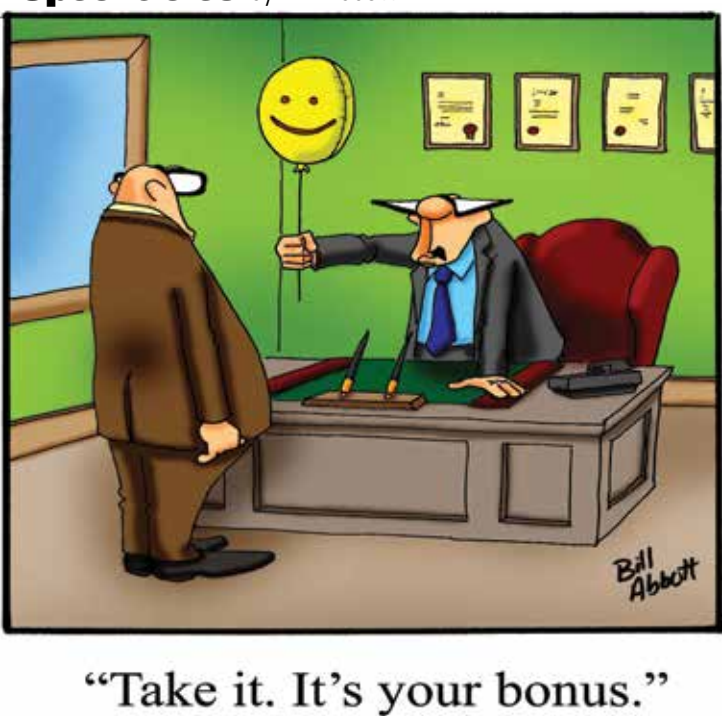

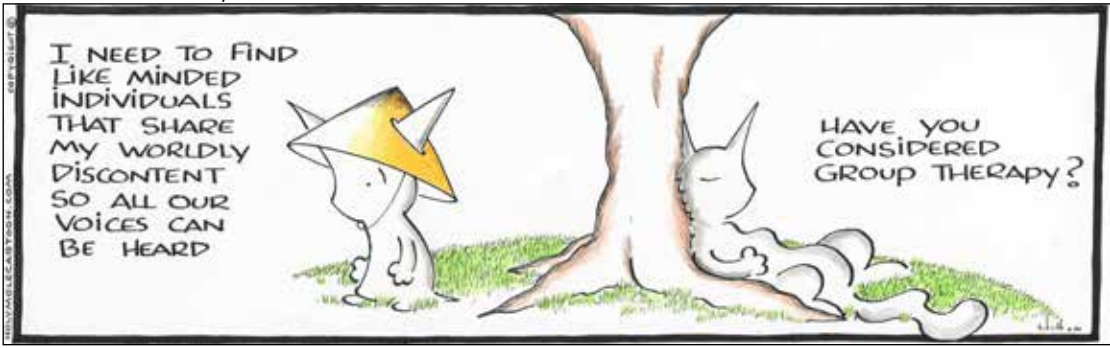

Defendant Convicted for Series of Rancho Cordova Sexual Assaults
Repeat DUI Offender Sentenced for Gross Vehicular Manslaughter
Woman Convicted for Murder of 84-Year-Old Man

DATE: November 15, 2016
CASE: Jordan Hudson (Case #14F01257)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit
Jordan Hudson was convicted by a jury of assault to commit forcible rape, two counts of assault to commit forcible oral copulation, and committing a lewd and lascivious act on a 15-year-old child with the defendant being at least 10 years older than the victim.
On February 3, 2014, a woman was walking in Rancho Cordova when Hudson attacked and tried to rape her and force her to perform oral copulation on him. The victim fought back and Hudson fled the scene. On February 20, 2014, Hudson attacked an 18-year-old girl as she walked home from her high school. Hudson again tried to force the victim to perform oral copulation on him. This victim also fought back and Hudson fled the scene. Later that day, Hudson grabbed a 15-year-old girl's buttock while she was walking home. The victim pushed him away, but Hudson continued to follow her into her apartment complex. Hudson left the scene when the victim's sister yelled at him to leave.
Hudson was previously convicted of battery for a similar incident that occurred in 2011. He faces a maximum sentence of 21 years in prison. Sentencing is set for December 13, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 26 before the Honorable Laurel White.

DATE: November 16, 2016
CASE: Joseph Short (Case #16FE008033)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kelly Clark, Vertical Vehicular Homicide Unit
The Honorable Geoffrey Goodman sentenced Joseph Short to 15 years to life in prison. On October 13, 2016, Short pled to gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated. Short also admitted to having a high blood alcohol content (BAC) and prior DUI's from 2010 and 2003.
On April 24, 2016, Short was driving on Highway 50 in an aggressive and dangerous manner. Short drove upwards of 100 mph and weaved in and out of traffic. Short tried to pass a vehicle in the slow lane by driving on

the highway shoulder. At that moment, David Condell and his wife were in their cars on the shoulder. Mr. Condell had just filled his wife's car with gas. While Mr. Condell waited for a break in the traffic before driving back on the highway, Short slammed into the rear of Mr. Condell's car, killing him. Mr. Condell's car then crashed into his wife's car, injuring her. After the collision, Short drove back on the highway and crashed into another car, causing the other car to rollover. There were no injuries from that crash. Short's BAC was .35 percent.
Short has a prior 2010 DUI with a BAC of .36 percent. He also has a prior 2003 DUI from San Diego County.
This case was prosecuted by the Alcohol and Drug Impaired Driver Vertical Prosecution Program. Funding for the program comes from a grant by the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS), through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

DATE: November 17, 2016
CASE: Tiana Smith-Anderson (Case #13F05990)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit
Tiana Smith-Anderson was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of Singh B. Singh. The jury also found true that Smith-Anderson used a deadly weapon in the course of the murder. At sentencing, the Court will determine the truth of an additional allegation that Smith-Anderson suffered a prior conviction and prison commitment.
Mr. Singh and Smith-Anderson were acquaintances. On September 8, 2013, Smith-Anderson was alone with 84-year-old Mr. Singh at his Oak Park home. Later that night, Mr. Singh's daughter returned home and went to bed. When she woke up the next morning, she went to check on her father and found him on the bedroom floor covered with a blanket and a large pool of blood. Responding officers found Mr. Singh dead on scene. Singh's autopsy revealed he had been stabbed 26 times.
Tiana Smith-Anderson faces a maximum sentence of 17 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for January 6, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 15 before the Honorable Kevin McCormick. ★

Cordova Boys Basketball Strike Down Thunder in Victory

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Five seconds led to a victory for the Cordova High School boys basketball team in Tuesday’s non-conference home game against Rocklin at Lancers Gym.

The Lancers used a 3-pointer to post a come-from-behind 65-63 win over the Thunder. Cordova (2-2), which trailed Rocklin 50-45 entering the final quarter, outscored the Thunder 20-13.

Cordova guard Markell Briggs came up with a steal that led to a 3-point shot that sailed through the net for the win. Briggs had a team-high 19 points.

“We had been down the whole game,” said Cordova head coach Fletcher Johnson. “Nothing but the bottom of the net.”

With two minutes left in the game, Cordova still trailed but by six points. But the Lancers’ defense forced Thunder turnovers on steals.

“We got back in it and then he (Briggs) hit that one that gave us the go-ahead (and win),” said Johnson of the Lancers’ defense and Briggs’ game-winning shot.

At halftime, Rocklin led 31-26. After the first quarter in which Rocklin led 20-19, but in the second quarter held the Lancers to only seven points.

“Shots weren’t going down,” said Johnson of the second quarter. “Missed a lot of outside shots. We turned the ball over a few times.”

Another perk for Rocklin for most of the game was its depth. The bulk of the Thunder’s

“Great to see the guys step up, and not hang their heads,” Johnson said.

Briggs was one of two Lancers who scored in double figures. The other was junior point guard Calvin Augusta, who had 15 points. One of the Lancers’ other point guards in Jason Novik and forward Jose Hernandez had seven points each. Forward LeAndre Ward and Joe Danielyan had five points each.

Grant 65, Cordova 50

In a road non-conference game on Dec. 3rd, the Lancers led 16-12 after the first quarter. But the host Pacers outscored Cordova 27-13, in the second

quarter for a 39-29 lead and never looked back.

Augusta had 13 points for the Lancers, and Novik 10.

Cordova 82, Mira Loma 76

In its first home game of the season on Nov. 30th, Cordova had four players score in double figures. Novik had a game-high 27 points, followed by Augusta with 22, Briggs 13 and forward Caleb Clark 12. Cordova jumped out to an 18-7 first quarter lead, and never looked back.

On Wednesday, Cordova started action in the four-day McDonald’s Classic at Edison High School of Stockton.

The tourney is the first of three for the Lancers. Toward the end of next week, Cordova plays at the Holiday Classic in Tracy. ★

on tap right now, with a couple of other beers that they bring out once in a while.

The Brewing Company opened on Friday, January 13, 2012, and will be celebrating its anniversary on Friday the 13th, 2017. “It’s a good luck day for us,” Mathis said. On that day, the Company will reintroduce the Sunrise IPA (India pale ale), the first style brewed – a classic English IPA.

Mathis considers American River Brewing Company to be a hidden gem of Rancho Cordova. “We’re very, very proud of being part of Rancho Cordova, and we’re very proud of putting out great beer,” Mathis said. “To be part of the beer scene in

Sacramento as it’s growing and maturing, becoming more recognized nationally, it’s a good time to be in the beer business. . . We like to think that we’re putting some good product out there.”

American River Brewing Company tasting room at 11151 Trade Center Dr., Rancho Cordova, is open from 4-8 p.m. on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and from 2-7 p.m. on Saturdays. Mathis agreed that they get a lot of people who come by the tasting room regularly to try their different brews. “But we don’t consider them regulars,” Mathis said. “We call them family.”

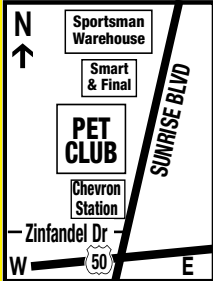
