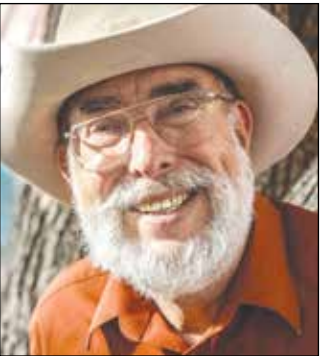

Making a Difference in Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In 2016, many local businesses and residents have partnered with the City of Rancho Cordova through the City's Volunteer Program to make a difference in the community. In the past year, volunteers donated over 6,000 hours, which amounts to an estimated \$141,000 in additional resources for the community.

The City's Volunteer Program began in 2012 with a focus on beautifying the community, helping neighbors, and partnering on community events. This year, City volunteers participated in more than 25 local events such as neighborhood clean-ups, Mayor's Walks, tree planting events, the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Celebration, and much more.

In the past quarter alone, City staff connected numerous volunteer groups with Sierra Service Project, which is a local nonprofit organization committed to strengthening communities through service to others. Local businesses that volunteered included VSP, Wells Fargo, Lutheran Social Services, and Developmental Disabilities Service Organization. One example of the good work City volunteers do is when Sierra Service Project connected the VSP team with a resident who needed some maintenance for her home. The group removed damaged and weathered fencing and worked for over 7 hours replacing fencing at the property.

State Seeks To Make Water Conservation A Way of Life

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Working to make water conservation a way of life, State agencies recently released a draft plan for achieving long-term efficient water use and meeting drought preparedness goals that reflect California’s diverse climate, landscape, and demographic conditions.

“Californians rose to the challenge during this historic drought and recognized that conservation is critical in the face of an uncertain future. This plan is about harnessing the creativity and innovation that Californians have shown during the driest years in state history and making water conservation a way of life in the years ahead,” said California Department of Water Resources Director Mark W. Cowin. “This plan will help make permanent changes to water use so California is better prepared for whatever the future brings.”

The new plan’s fundamental premise is that efficient water use helps all of California better prepare for longer and more severe droughts caused by climate change.

California recently suffered the driest four years in state history, with only average rainfall last year, and 75 percent of the state remains in severe drought conditions. Meanwhile, a new report from UCLA projects that the Sierra Nevada snowpack — one of California’s largest sources of water supply — is likely to drop 50 percent by the end of the century due to climate change. Recognizing these risks and many others, today’s plan seeks permanent changes to water use that boost efficiency and prepare for more limited water supplies. These practices will help achieve a top priority in the Governor’s Water Action Plan - to “Make Conservation a California Way of Life.”

Today’s plan builds on the success of mandatory water restrictions during California’s severe drought and develops long-term water conservation measures that will ensure all communities have sufficient water supplies. This will involve activities such as ensuring farmers plan and prepare for severe drought and permanently

banning wasteful practices like hosing off sidewalks and driveways.

“The last few years provided the wake-up call of all wake-up calls that water is precious and not to be taken for granted,” said Felicia Marcus, Chair of the State Water Resources Control Board. “Californians rose to the occasion collectively during the drought. We can build on that success and now prepare for a more unpredictable and disruptive future marked by a changing climate – and do it equitably and cost effectively.”

Today’s plan represents a shift from statewide mandates to a set of conservation standards applied based on local circumstances, including population, temperature, leaks, and types of commercial and industrial use. For example, communities in hotter and drier climate zones will receive irrigation allowances that reflect evaporation levels.

Key water conservation efforts included in today’s plan include:

- Permanent bans on wasteful practices, such as hosing driveways and excessively watering lawns.
- Technical assistance and financial incentives for water suppliers to implement leak prevention, detection, and repair programs.
- Collecting information about innovative water conservation and water loss detection and control technologies.
- Requiring agricultural water

suppliers to quantify water use in their service areas and describe measures to increase water use efficiency.

- Full compliance with water use targets for urban water suppliers by 2025.
- Planning and preparing for continued and future drought and water shortages.

Some of the actions described in the draft plan will require working with the Legislature on new and expanded State authority, while others can be implemented under existing authorities. All recommendations aim to achieve the main objectives of the Governor’s Executive Order B-37-16: use water more wisely, eliminate water waste, strengthen local drought resilience, and improve agricultural water use efficiency and drought planning.

In addition to taking action to implement this long-term water conservation plan, State agencies recognize the reality that most of California potentially faces a sixth year of historic drought. Therefore, in January the State Water Board will also consider whether it must extend its existing emergency water conservation regulations, as required by Governor Brown’s recent executive order. The State Water Board has already taken action to maintain mandatory reductions in communities that could not verify they have enough water supplies to withstand three more years of severe drought.

Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life, Implementing Executive Order B-37-16,” is the result of extensive community and stakeholder engagement across California. The plan was prepared by the Department of Water Resources, the State Water Resources Control Board, the Public Utilities Commission, Department of Food and Agriculture and the Energy Commission. 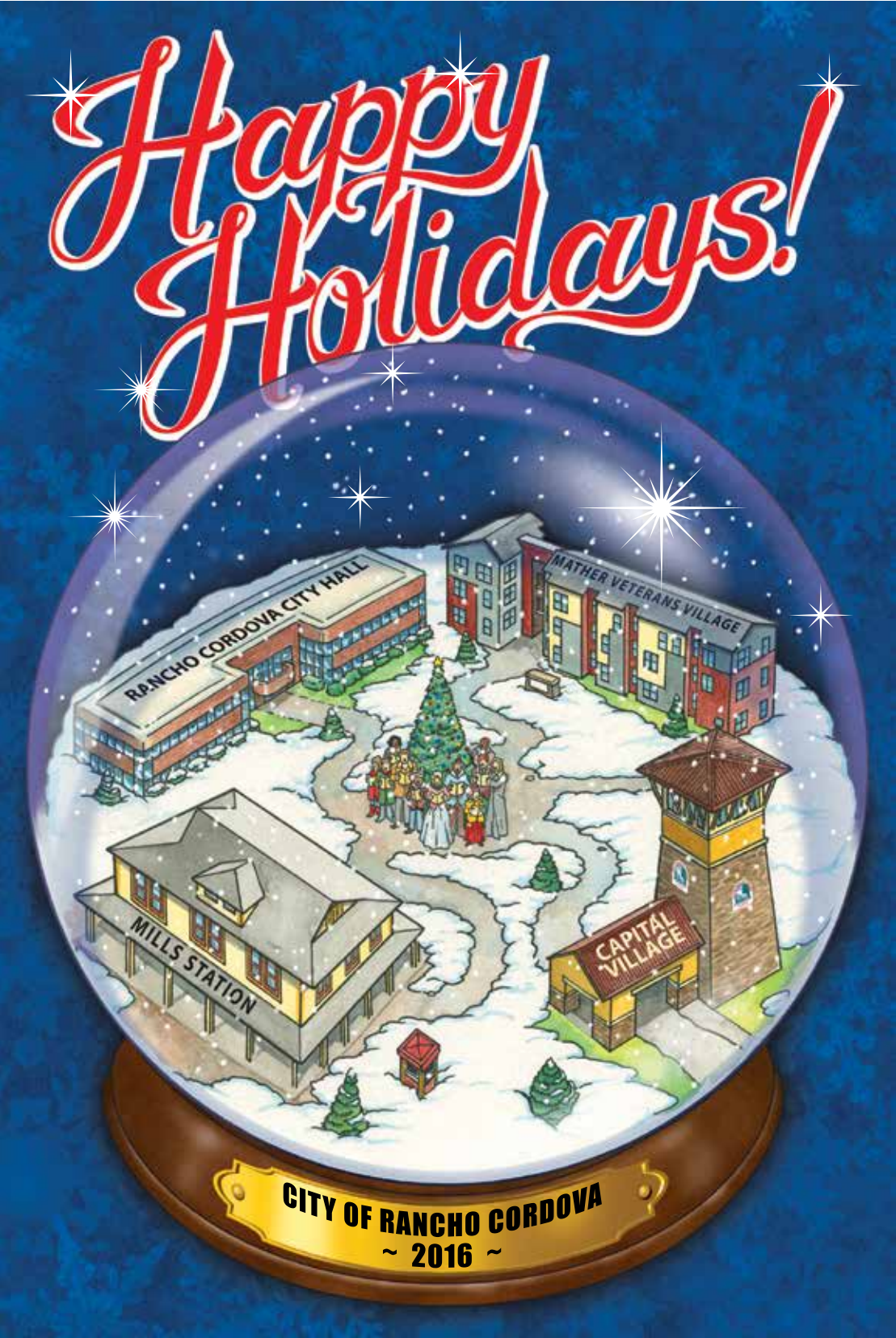

Heroism Recognized and Sparks Fly at City Council Meeting

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova City Council’s recent December 5th meeting began by recognizing the Valerio family whose quick thinking, military training and medical skills helped rescue survivors of a helicopter crash during the family’s wait to visit the Pearl Harbor Memorial. With the help of city council member Linda Budge, the heroic family was finally able to visit Pearl Harbor and pay their respects to the fallen veterans and victims. The council next addressed public hearing items regarding the Anatolia Center Project and a tentative subdivision of the shopping plaza at the intersection of

Sunrise and Zinfandel. Public commentary included input regarding the appearance of the Anatolia Project and it was recommended that the council consider adding an ecological water feature. Various examples were discussed by the council and the developer’s team, including the architect. Other discussion focused on sign height, overhead shading and tree placement to offer shoppers protection from the sun and inclement weather. The council voted to allow the next phase of development to move forward. A proposed parcel split requested by the owner of the shopping plaza that houses the new Chik-Fil-A and Sportsman’s Warehouse became heated

during the discussion. O’Reilly Auto Parts and the parcel owner petitioned the council to subdivide a single existing parcel, resulting in a freestanding auto parts store directly adjacent to Zinfandel Boulevard. The subdivision would leave an open space to be developed later by the owner. The discussion between council members and the auto parts retailer’s representative became heated, requiring Mayor David Sander to utilize his gavel and repeatedly remind the representative that he was out of order. A compromise was reached with the city requesting the petitioning parties to come back with more detailed information. ★

The New Year Will Mean We Can Begin Working on Some Things That Are Partially Completed

We know our grandkids will have some wonderful memories of getting ready for Christmas, and picking a Christmas tree among all those beautiful trees you have to choose from will be one of those enjoyable and pleasant memories.

Our grandson Ryan asked today how many days until school was out for the holiday, and we told him that he only had four days until the Christmas vacation began. I am working on this column on Monday, so when you read this one, it will be Friday, December 16, 2016. Time is flying by very quickly as the year comes to an end. It reminds me of a quote about life I read a while back that said, "Life is like a roll of toilet paper. The closer it gets to the end, the faster it goes." I'm not sure of life going quite as fast as the roll of toilet paper, but this year has been a long one considering everything that has happened. Oh yes, and another thing, I just read about the Dow Jones Industrial Average, and the article said that the Dow Jones will probably hit 20,000 points for the first time pretty soon. The Dow Jones hit 15,000 points on May 7, 2013; it hit 10,000 points on March 29, 1999; it hit 5,000 points on November 21, 1995; and it hit 3,000 points for the first time on April 17, 1991. Everything is relative of course, like the price of gasoline was \$1.07/gallon in 1991; \$1.06/gallon in 1995; \$0.98/gallon in 1999; \$3.67/gallon in 2013; and \$2.11/gallon today. I know that in July 2008 the price of gasoline was \$4.55/gallon, so I am glad that the price today is \$2.11/gallon. 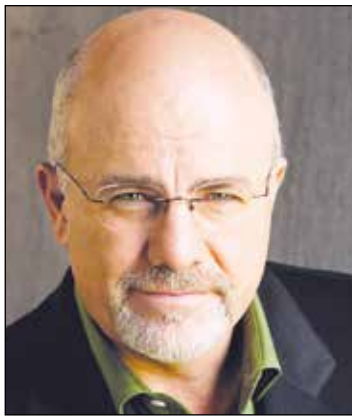



OFFICE CHRISTMAS PARTY (Rated R)

Once upon a time, Christmas movies would serve up traditional holiday fare such as “It’s a Wonderful Life,” which continues to thrive on cable, and the Irving Berlin musical “Holiday Inn,” among others.

So far, during this holiday season we have had Billy Bob Thornton as a loutish Santa in “Bad Santa 2” and now the extreme version of a corporate holiday celebration in “Office Christmas Party.” Neither film is suitable for family viewing.

To its credit, “Office Christmas Party” has a great cast of comic characters, starting with Jennifer Aniston as the corporate boss-from-hell, T.J. Miller as the slacker boss of the Chicago branch office, and Jason Bateman as the borderline nerdy tech executive.

Miller’s Clay Vanstone runs the Chicago branch of the family-owned tech firm Zenotek, but his older sister Carol (Aniston) does not share Clay’s fun-loving spirit of having a corporate culture that values its employees.

With Christmas approaching, Clay wants to have a fun office party, though Mary

RAUCOUS “CHRISTMAS PARTY” LAUGH-FILLED; “STAR” ON TV

(Kate McKinnon), head of Human Resources wearing a non-denominational holiday sweater, is a killjoy who frets about the right cheese platter.

Getting wind of these plans, Carol cancels the Christmas festivities and threatens to close down the Chicago office, firing all of the employees and leaving her brother to live off his trust fund.

Assisted by Bateman’s tech executive Josh Parker and Olivia Munn’s tech savvy engineer Tracey, Clay and his crew go behind her back to set up a raucous party to attract a big account from potential client Walter Davis (Courtney B. Vance) who could save the branch office from closure.

The solution to keeping the Chicago office functioning beyond the holidays is the kind of stupid, futile gesture that originated with frat parties in “Animal House.” Throw the most debauched party one could imagine because it’s all going to hell anyway.

Starting off as a dance party with live reindeer, an imitation Jesus and Clay in a Santa suit, the evening gets gradually rowdier and out-of-control because it’s always a bad idea when employees get drunk with their co-workers.

A snow machine is inadvertently loaded with a bag of cocaine that loosens the inhibitions of Walter Davis. The

party eventually turns into the semblance of the decaying Roman Empire’s drunken and depraved sex orgies.

Bad behavior becomes the norm for “Office Christmas Party,” but the fast pace of sight gags, one-liners and crude yet often hilarious scenes turns this holiday comedy into an amusing diversion, if you are willing to let go of any reservations about the absence of a sensible plot.

TV CORNER – “STAR” ON FOX NETWORK

Banking on the success of the TV series “Empire,” the FOX Network turns to the same creator and executive producer, Lee Daniels, to pull back the curtain on music’s gritty and dark reality in the new series “Star.”

“Empire” has a strong pull for many watching this music industry soap opera of power plays and betrayals, but I’ve not been a follower of its melodramatic machinations, even though Taraji P. Henson’s Cookie is a powerful force of nature well worth watching.

From a personal point of view, I am even less likely to get past the first episode of “Star,” in which the main characters are a trio of young girls running from their pasts in order to chart a path to stardom in the treacherous music business.

“Star” is not just the name of the show. It happens that the most talented singer in the aspiring girl group is named Star (Jude Demorest), a tough-as-nails beauty who looks like she could just as easily twirl on

a pole at a low-rent strip club. Star is a young woman of unbridled ambition who escapes from a hellish foster family in Pittsburgh and heads off to rescue her younger sister Simone (Brittany O’Grady) from a similar terrible fate. Together, the long-separated siblings head to Atlanta to team up with spoiled rich girl Alexandra (Ryan Destiny), who for reasons that don’t seem readily apparent or even logical leaves her upper-crust lifestyle in Manhattan for a dubious trek into the underbelly of the capital of Georgia.

The only connection the girls have to this Southern metropolis is beauty shop owner Carlotta Brown (Queen Latifah), the godmother to Star and Simone who takes them in but soon finds the girls are a handful.

The role of Carlotta, who sings beautifully in the church choir, allows Queen Latifah to shine with her natural talents, but given that she spends too much time coping with bickering employees, that’s about as far as it goes.

The character that might be the most believable is down-on-his-luck Jahil Rivera (Benjamin Bratt), a seedy-looking type who hangs out in dive bars and strip clubs, but still has a knack for spotting musical talent.

Having once managed singers, Jahil sees the girls as a ticket back to the industry. The ambitious manager might be interesting to watch, but there is much about “Star” that seems too contrived, and even unsettling, to stick with for the long haul. ★

Grandchildren of the Sixties



Commentary by Dr. Earl Tilford

College students in the streets protesting a Trump presidency are not so very different from the demonstrators who took over Columbia University in April 1968. Nevertheless, what took place in less than three weeks back then did a lot to mold the present.

On April 9, 1968, at a memorial service for Martin Luther King, Jr., 20-year-old Mark Rudd, president of Columbia’s Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), grabbed the microphone to denounce Grayson L. Kirk, the university’s conservative president. Columbia bordered Harlem, where it had recently acquired land to build a new gymnasium. Rudd accused Kirk of racism for building a

gym to serve Columbia’s wealthy and predominantly white student body at Harlem’s expense. He also lambasted Columbia for supporting the war in Vietnam by acquiring grants from the Institute for Defense Analyses (IDA) to study military strategy.

For 20 days, Rudd channeled passion into idealism to fuse issues of race with frustrations over Vietnam. On Tuesday, April 23, several hundred students seized the library. After venturing out and failing to bring down a fence around the gym construction site, some protestors returned to the library while others occupied the administration building. Two days later, over a thousand students and off-campus supporters were ensconced in five university buildings. Protestors came together and then clustered around causes. Banners marked off various “liberated zones.” The hardcore revolutionaries—advocating violence—wore red armbands. Those urging nonviolence wore green. Black Panthers hung Huey Newton posters. SDS favored images of Karl Marx, Che Guevara, and Vladimir Lenin.

On Thursday, April 25, black students and allies from Harlem demanded white occupiers leave the administration building. Mark Rudd and SDS moved to Kirk’s office in the occupied library. On Monday night, April 29, over 1,000 New York City police swarmed the campus. By

dawn, 720 students were in custody and 148 people were hospitalized.

Columbia marked the height of the “Sixties” movement. The Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) expelled whites in 1965. The Black Panthers, founded in Alabama by SNCC the same year, morphed into a sexist and racist separatist movement. After Columbia, Mark Rudd and student colleague Ted Gold split from SDS to found the radical and violent Weather Underground. On March 6, 1970, Gold and two other Weathermen perished when a bomb they were making exploded prematurely. Weather Underground leaders Mark Rudd, Bernadine Dohrn, and Bill Ayers went underground. Dohrn and Ayers eventually married. Later they supported the political aspirations of Chicago activist Barack Obama.

Rudd became one of the charter members of the 2008 group, Progressives for Obama, the mission statement of which was written by SDS founder Tom Hayden.

Images of protesting students, police brutality, and Tom Hayden’s appeal for creating “two, three, many Columbias” mobilized young people on other campuses in the ‘60s. SDS went on to Chicago, where with Yippies and hippies, they sparked mayhem that contributed to putting Richard Nixon in the White House. Radicals then captured the

Democratic Party to support Senator George McGovern’s presidential candidacy leading to near political seppuku in 1972.

The May 1970 campus eruptions—protesting four deaths at Kent State—more closely resembles what’s happening now with the grandchildren of the Sixties generation. Then, as now, there indeed were “many Columbias.” What difference did it—or does it—make?

Back then, not much. Columbia caved. It didn’t build the gym and cut off relations with IDA. In 1968, like most of American academe, Columbia was still conservative. But pressure on administrators was growing so that by June 1969, 80 major colleges and universities were seeking new presidents. Unable to stand up to demands issued by students and, increasingly by faculties, college and university administrators tried accommodation. This allowed a generation of Sixties-inspired radicals to move into academia where they thrived while instilling their leftist ideological perspectives. Only a handful of institutions, mostly in the South, held the line, at least for a while. Today only a few academically rigorous conservative colleges and universities remain: Grove City College, Hillsdale College, and Pepperdine University are among them.

America’s war in Vietnam ground along until January 1973. Richard

Nixon’s troop withdrawals, made possible by massive bombing coupled to Henry Kissinger’s deft diplomacy, contributed far more to ending U.S. involvement than protestors ever did. In the 1980s, the “68’ers” twice elected Ronald Reagan. Our kids are the helicopter parents who coddled the 20-somethings rioting today.

Columbia was the first real media-driven student protest event. Sporadic, short-lived campus disturbances usually took place in college towns with limited media coverage. The Columbia unrest lasted three weeks. The press honed in because it involved pampered white children from upper middle class to wealthy New York/New England families. The New York Times covered it. Major newspapers from Philadelphia to San Francisco dispatched reporters from their New York City offices. Camera crews from the three TV networks rode the subway to Columbia to provide coverage.

The current children’s crusade will rock on through Inauguration Day 2017. Then the kids will return to school, maybe learn something, and hopefully grow up.

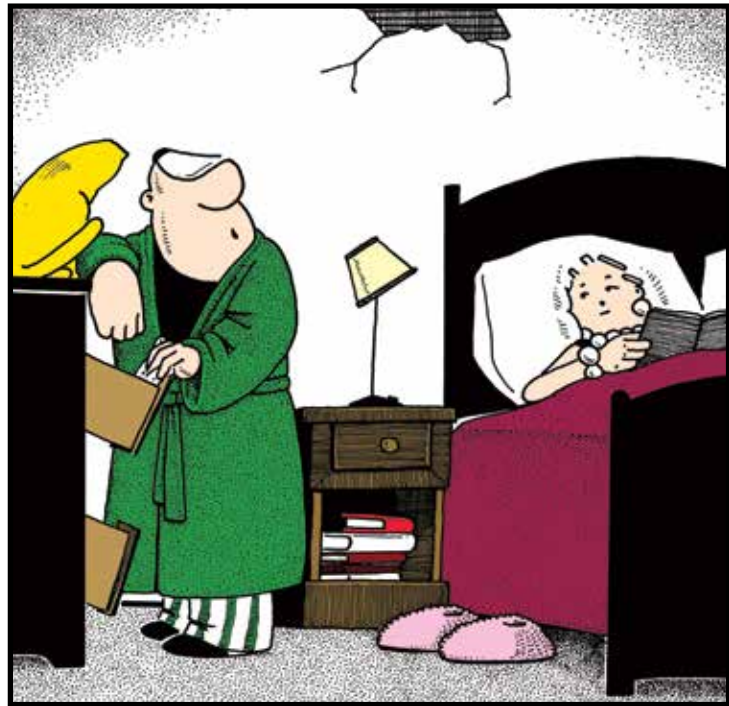

Defendants Convicted in Crime Spree Involving Multiple Robberies and Rape
Defendants Convicted for Liquor Store Robberies, Shooting
Defendant Convicted for Murder of Infant

DATE: November 23, 2016
CASE: Anthony Cotton, Latrale Way, Lamar Edwards & Donny Smith (Case #14F05913)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Anthony Cotton was convicted by a jury of kidnapping for purposes of robbery, first-degree residential robbery, second-degree robbery, attempted robbery, residential burglary, and assault with intent to commit rape during a residential burglary. Latrale Way was convicted of two counts of kidnapping for purposes of robbery, kidnapping for purposes of rape, first-degree residential robbery, assault with intent to commit rape during a residential burglary, forcible digital penetration, forcible rape, attempted robbery, second-degree robbery, and felony sexual battery. The jury also found true several firearm allegations connected to the crimes.

Co-defendants Lamar Edwards and Donny Smith previously pled guilty to first-degree residential robbery with personal use of a firearm allegations.

Between June and October 2014, the defendants committed a number of crimes in the Antelope and North Highlands areas. While committing a home invasion robbery, all four defendants held a man and his children in their house at gunpoint and ransacked the house. Two of the defendants then attempted to rape the man's 27-year-old daughter, but the father was able to run outside for help and the defendants fled. In a second robbery, Latrale Way and other unidentified suspects approached a man and a woman at a park. After the group robbed the man, Latrale Way kidnapped the woman and forced her to drive to an ATM machine to get money. Way then directed the woman to a nearby neighborhood and raped her in her car. Two weeks later, Cotton and Way committed three additional armed robberies in the same park. Forensic DNA testing conducted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Crime Lab conclusively linked Latrale Way to the rape.

Cotton and Way both face multiple life sentences in prison. Edwards faces a maximum of 16 years in prison and Smith faces a maximum of 15 years in prison.

Sentencing for all defendants is set for January 6, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

CASE: Demetrius Johnson & David Bell (Case #15F03124)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Samuel Alexander, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Demetrius Johnson and David Bell were convicted by a jury of three counts of robbery. The

jury also found true allegations that both defendants personally used a firearm and that Johnson discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury.

On May 22, 2015, Demetrius Johnson and David Bell went to a liquor store on Franklin Blvd. When Johnson and Bell tried to leave the store without paying for their items, the clerks tried to stop them. Bell then lifted up his shirt and threatened the clerks with a revolver. Ten minutes later, Johnson and Bell entered a mini mart two blocks away from the liquor store. Bell attempted to go behind the counter to take bottles of alcohol. When the clerk confronted Bell, Johnson pointed the revolver at the clerk and fired two shots as the defendants left the store with the bottles. The clerk was struck in the arm, causing a fractured bone and tissue damage. The defendants were later apprehended with the revolver and property from both robberies in their possession.

Johnson has multiple prior strike convictions for robbery, carjacking, and criminal threats as well as prior convictions for elder abuse and assault with a deadly weapon.

Johnson faces a maximum sentence of 40 years and 8 months to life in prison. Bell faces a maximum sentence of 20 years and 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for January 20, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Eugene Balonon.

Damian Porter was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of Graeson Byrd and assault on a child resulting in death. A separate jury acquitted co-defendant Davonna Rae Byrd, the victim's mother, of murder and assault on a child causing death charges.

On April 8, 2013, Porter was home alone with 11-week-old Graeson from early in the morning until 911 was called later that afternoon. When medical personnel arrived, Graeson was not breathing and did not have a heartbeat. The child was pronounced dead when he arrived at the hospital a short time later. Medical evidence showed Graeson had sustained a serious head injury that caused his death, and that Graeson had sustained numerous other injuries inflicted over several weeks. Among those injuries were rib, arm, and leg fractures.

Porter faces a maximum sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 30, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 21 in front of the Honorable Steve White. ★

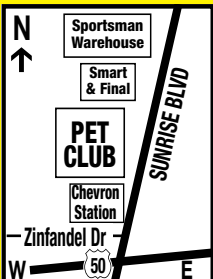
