Survivor Recalls the Day “When Boys Became Men”

ROSEMONT, CA (MPG) - Bomb smoke over Pearl harbor cleared three quarters of a century ago. But for WW II veteran Samuel E. Clower, memories are clear as yesterday. “When I read names of the dead, I see their faces,” says the Rosemont resident. “I remember them as kids who never had a chance to grow old.”

The nonagenarian is among dwindling witnesses to the surprise attack that precipitated America’s entry into WW II. He was 21. Now 97, he considers December 7, 1941 the day “when boys became men.” As war in the Pacific continued, he took part in the New Guinea invasion and earned a Purple Heart medal for injuries. He later endured hungry months as a Japanese prisoner. He would serve in Korean and Vietnam conflicts before retiring as an Air Force Colonel in 1974.

Raised on a Texas cattle ranch, Clower had a creamery job when he decided to enlist. “I’d read what was happening in Europe,” he explains. “I wanted to be prepared for what might come. I figured after a few years in the Army, I could return to my creamery job and get promoted...”

After training at Fort Bliss TX,

the 19-year-old spent months patrolling the US/Mexican border on horseback. “In our barracks, I saw an Army poster promoting Hawaii as a place to serve,” he says. “I thought: that’s for me. Six weeks later, I was at Schofield Barracks (Oahu) learning weapons and administration with the infantry. The weather was great; duties were easy; people were friendly. On \$21 a month, Hawaii was paradise.”

By December, 1941 he was due for Mainland leave. Intelligence indicated a Japanese attack – somewhere in the Pacific -- was imminent. Sergeant Clower volunteered to lead a December 6 detail guarding a dam near Wheeler Air Field. At sunrise on December 7, he surveyed the sky. “I saw aircraft coming from the north,” he recalls. “They were miles away; I thought they were our guys coming in

to play golf.” Soon Japanese emblems were visible. One wing of the massive attack headed toward Honolulu. The other wing bombed Wheeler Field,

600 yards from where Clower watched.

The sergeant witnessed the air strip’s destruction as 233 US aircraft went up in flames. “How helpless can you feel?” he asks. “We couldn’t know the magnitude of the attack or what to expect next.” In distant Pearl Harbor, dozens of US Navy vessels were sunk or damaged. At Hickam Field, 188 planes were wiped out. US casualties included 2,400 dead and 1,000 wounded.

At Wheeler, Clower helped bring local families to safety. “We waited for news from Schofield Barracks,” he recalls. “All radio communication was gone. I’d have given a million bucks and 10 years for a cell phone. After two hours, our relief arrived in taxi cabs; all other transportation was knocked out. We learned what happened at Pearl Harbor and tried to figure what to do. For seven days, we lived on our nerves, guarding the coast in fear of another attack. Our ships, our airfields and heavy guns were gone -- the Japanese could have landed in rowboats and taken over. We were desperate for the US Navy to get aircraft carriers over to protect us. Of course, all leave was cancelled. No question, we were at war.”

Within months, Clower was dispatched to Perth, Australia, to train for allied invasion of Japanese-occupied New Guinea. After that action, duty took him to the Solomon Islands. “Three hundred of us made camp on a supposedly uninhabited atoll,” says Clower. “We woke up surrounded by Japanese. They’d been stranded by our blockades and were starving. Their commanding officer was

Harvard-educated and I guess we were as well-treated as any POWs could be. But I went from 150 to 128 pounds. We ate rodents; seaweed; bark off trees. We had faith – it helped that our captors were almost worse off than us.” After five months, the ailing Americans were rescued and shipped to San Francisco. “We sailed under the Golden Gate,” says the survivor. “We were all in tears.”

Health problems dogged the remainder of his war years. But Mainland duties enabled the Sergeant to meet and marry Pauline Wiopious from Capay, CA. His bride is now 96 and has supported him through 73 years of Army – then Air Force – service. Based all over the world, the Clowers raised three children. After retirement from Yokota Air Base in Japan, Colonel Clower began a civilian career in the hotel industry. Leisure was much spent with the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association until, in 2014, only a few hoary survivors actually survived. As a rare Greatest

Generation pillar, Clower is now much celebrated and feted, especially on sponsored trips to Oahu.

“I enjoy telling others how things used to be at Schofield,” says the former barracks resident. “Hawaii really was paradise for a young man. Until December 7, 1941. Then, overnight, we all quit being youngsters.” ★

Vandals Strike Youth Rugby

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova youth sports recently took a heavy blow when the future site for a regional rugby and soccer complex fell prey to ransacking vandals. Situated on land in Mather Park, the damage is extensive.

Longtime Rancho resident and local sports figure Jerry Ahlin, perhaps the primary player in finding and securing the site for youth sports, is the one trying to clean up the mess. He found the damage on a regular trip to check the facilities.

“This is the fourth time,” said Ahlin, indicating the site has been attacked before. “What do we have to do? Put up a sign that says, ‘Future Home of Sacramento Valley Rugby Foundation?’”

While the site remains largely undeveloped, The Sacramento Valley Rugby Foundation (SVRF) managed to acquire a set of portable buildings from Sierra College to use as classrooms, meeting rooms, a cafeteria and more. The idea was to use the buildings until funds could be secured for more permanent structures. The extensive damage will now set all that back.

Amid the completely broken windows, smashed restroom fixtures, ripped walls, ceilings, kicked in doors, graffiti and stripped wiring, Ahlin is re-securing the site and trying to figure out where to go from here. Worldwide, rugby is a rapidly expanding sport and big foundations are helping finance development to nascent programs across the globe. China, he says, recently was gifted \$10 million dollars to develop their national program. Funds like that could go a long way here, once there was a little more to build on.

Ahlin and his non-profit

SVRF have contributed heavily to perpetuate and grow sports in Rancho Cordova. The SVRF brought the annual January Rugby Kick Off Tournament (KOC) to Cordova High and donated \$20,000 to repair and upgrade acres of playing fields at the school. The event is hugely popular and brings thousands of global players, coaches and families to Rancho Cordova—and that brings in revenue and business for the city, as well as helping establish Rancho as a sports destination.

The SVRF plan is to develop the roughly 90-acre site, which is leased from Sacramento County, with up to six rugby fields and six soccer fields, a European-style clubhouse, classrooms for training referees, students and players, meeting rooms and a cafeteria, all set in a central courtyard. “This would bring a whole new industry to the area,” says Ahlin, including professional level athletes. There is nothing like it anywhere in northern California and the phenomenal growth of the sport indicates the timing is right.

Ahlin wants to expand rugby

for more age groups and activity levels. Youngsters (or adults) of nearly any age can play flag rugby and learn the sport without contact. Coach and referee training ensures not only fair game play, but that safety precautions are taught at all levels, reducing injuries. Unlike some sports, rugby players are taught to utilize their bodies and protect their

head and neck at all times.

“Rugby really is a family sport,” says Ahlin, who happens to be a Cordova Community Council honoree for Distinguished Service to Youth. Sportsmanship is strongly stressed. Opposing teams often lend players to the other during games and gathering together afterwards to thank the referees, other teams and families for coming out to participate. Hosting teams often provide food for the opposition as a courtesy for traveling and playing. It’s just part of the rugby culture.

Charles Vesper Utterback

Charles Vesper Utterback of Sacramento, age 96, passed away after a short illness on Saturday, November 12, 2016 in Sacramento surrounded by his family.

Charles was born July 16, 1920 in Lodi, California to Vesper Coulter and Clara (Hammond) Utterback. Charles was the loving father of James (Amy) and David (Dia) Utterback and his grandchildren, Rebekah (Tim) Trimble, Patricia Utterback, CJ Utterback, Christopher Utterback and Michelle Utterback. He is also survived by his sister Marge (Utterback) Heringer and many nieces and nephews. Charles was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Leona Elizabeth (Wolff), his brother James "Bud", his daughter-in-law Doreen Utterback and his grandson Andrew Vesper Utterback.

He married Leona Elizabeth Wolff in July 1955 at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Sacramento. Charles and Leona were life-long members of Westminster. They celebrated their 50th anniversary there in 2005. Charles was an elder and was involved in the youth programs with his sons.

Charles attended UC Davis where he studied agriculture and was a member of the university's ROTC where he was commissioned as Jr. Officer. He worked as a university firefighter. He entered WWII as a Jr. Officer and was stationed in the Philippines. Upon returning from the war, Charles continued his education at Davis and earned multiple degrees in agriculture. He also continued his military service in the California National Guard where he rose to



the rank of Lt. Colonel. While training at Camp Roberts Charles saved a soldier's life and received the California National Guard Military Cross Award for extreme heroism.

Upon graduation Charles joined his father to manage the family's farming operations throughout southern Sacramento County. Charles and his father raised cattle and grew sugar beets, tomatoes, alfalfa, prunes and walnuts. All these agriculture experience laid the foundation for Charles to begin growing sod/turf. Charles was the second sod farmer in Sacramento County. The sod growing operations began near Bradshaw Road and Jackson Road and then moved north to the Bradshaw Road & Folsom Blvd. area. Utterback Sod Farm, Inc. has remained in that same area since 1969. Charles and Leona and their two young sons worked tirelessly to grow the company into the successful company it is today. The third generation of the Utterback family now works within the company to

carry on Charles' legacy of high quality sod and excellent customer service. Charles delivered sod to thousands of customers throughout the Sacramento region and spent the last decade operating the forklift at the sod farm yard. The day before he entered the hospital, he was on his forklift loading customers' trucks and enjoying the fresh air and sunshine.

In 1969 Charles and his brother-in-law Lester Heringer spent 6 months working in Iran for the Minister of Agriculture. They worked to help modernize and bring Western agriculture practices to farmers of Iran.

Charles was a very hard working man. He awoke early each morning ready to do business. He was a role model to his two sons and hundreds of younger gardener and landscaper customers. 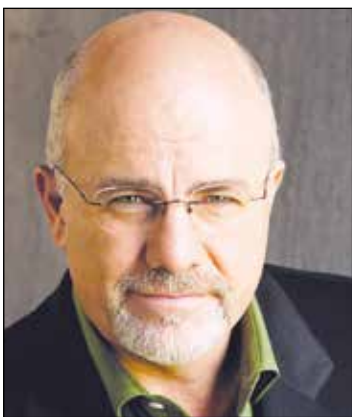

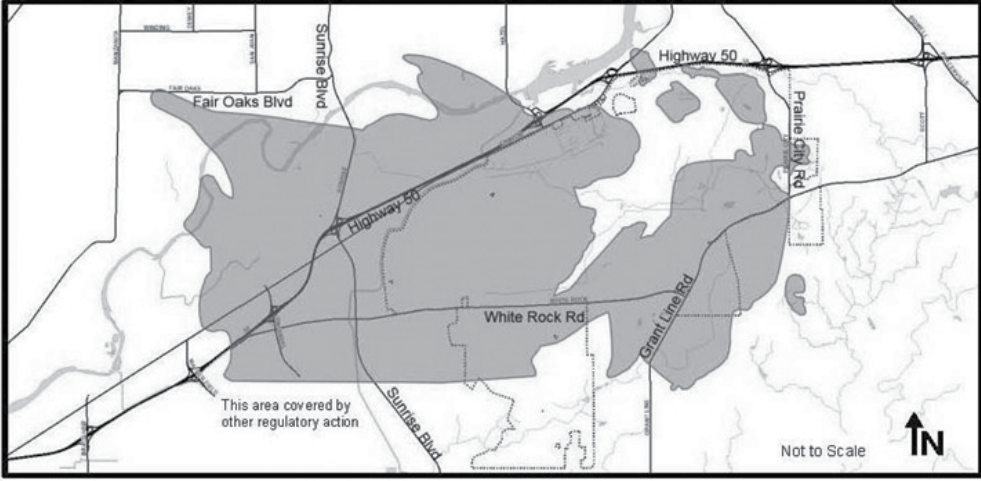

Extent of Groundwater Contamination in Eastern Sacramento County

Groundwater in a portion of eastern Sacramento County is contaminated. Contaminants include industrial solvents and chemicals resulting from the manufacture and testing of rocket and missile systems and production of chemicals.

The map shows the approximate extent of contamination in the vicinity of the Aerojet Superfund Site where contaminant concentrations exceed regulatory standards established to ensure safe long-term consumption. There are currently two regulatory actions (Western Groundwater Operable Unit and Perimeter Groundwater Operable Unit) that require Aerojet Rocketdyne to halt the spread of contamination, remediate the contamination, and restore the groundwater to beneficial use. Aerojet Rocketdyne has installed and is currently operating the majority of the treatment systems necessary to remediate and restore the off-site groundwater. Additional system modifications are anticipated to be completed in the next several years. Groundwater in portions of areas south of the Aerojet Superfund Site is also contaminated. Other regulatory actions are addressing these areas.

Drinking water in this area is primarily provided by public water supply systems, which monitor water quality and shut down impacted wells under the oversight of the State Water Resources Control Board-Division of Drinking Water.

Construction of new private and public water supply wells in Sacramento County requires a County permit. The Sacramento County Environmental Management Department has developed a special review procedure for permit application associated with wells proposed to be constructed near sites with known groundwater contamination. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Live Nativity, admission free, returns this year after an enthusiastic response from the public in 2015. Like last year, visitors pass shepherds in the fields, see the Three Kings arriving from afar, and enter Bethlehem, where the marketplace bustles around them complete with census takers and Roman guards. Mary, Joseph, and the Baby enter, all accompanied by music and narration. Six babies will make their acting debut as the newborn Christ during the four-day run from Thursday, December 8, through Sunday, December 11. The show has four presentations per night: 6:30, 7:00, 7:30, and 8:00, at 2100 California Circle in Rancho Cordova.

“The baby is real!” is a common reaction we’ve had,” said Heather McCauley, who is in charge of casting and direction, as well as numerous other logistical matters. “(Visitors) felt like they were going back

in time and being a part of the first Christmas.” McCauley, who lives in El Dorado Hills, is a music and drama teacher.

Manned by an all-volunteer cast and crew, one set of 100 actors perform on Thursday and Saturday, and another, different set of 100 on Friday and Sunday. There are also numerous behind-the-scenes workers taking care of costumes, lighting, sound, and such things as parking, check-in, and ushering, for a total of around 300 volunteers per night.

McCauley said that it is amazing to see so many people come forward and give so much of their time to make this event happen. “It is such a special gift that we’re giving to the community, that people love, all different religions, and it’s something that people are looking for at this time of the year.”

Last year the count of visitors attending the presentations reached 7,400, several thousand more than expected. Because of that, this year’s organizers have added a reservation process,

more seating, and have made other arrangements for the convenience of the patrons.

The Live Nativity is presented by the Folsom Stake of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The Stake president, Daniel Harrison, presides over congregations of the Church in the Folsom/El Dorado Hills area. “The goal is to try to help people feel that they are actually in Bethlehem and that they have a meaningful Christmas experience remembering the birth of Christ, which is the reason why we celebrate,” Harrison said.

This year reservations are recommended, but no one will be turned away. For reservations, directions, photos, and more information about the performance, see www.LiveNativity.org. The presentations are located at 2100 California Circle, off of Folsom Boulevard near Folsom Auto Mall, turning south onto Birkmont Drive, then left on California Circle. ★

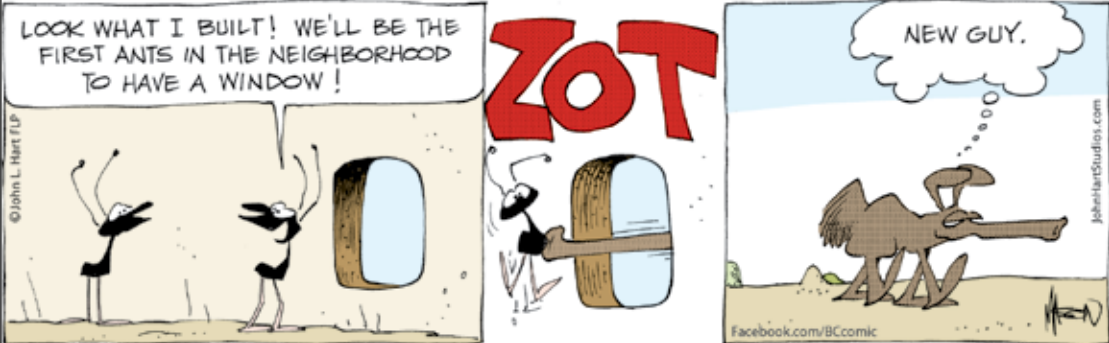

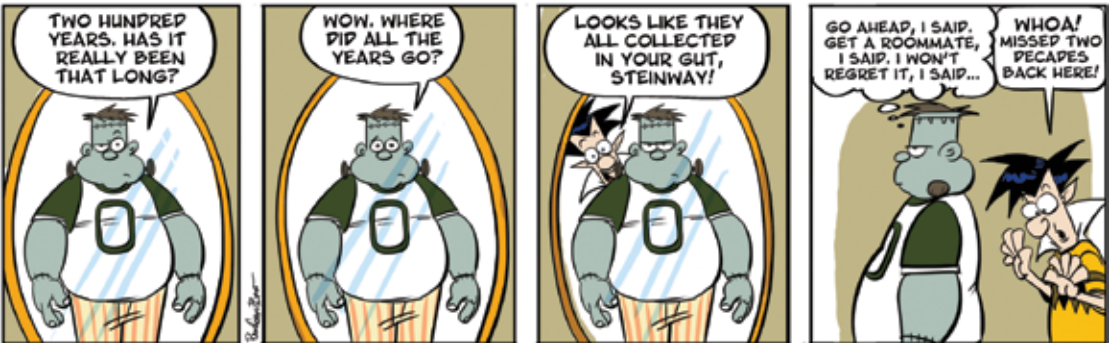

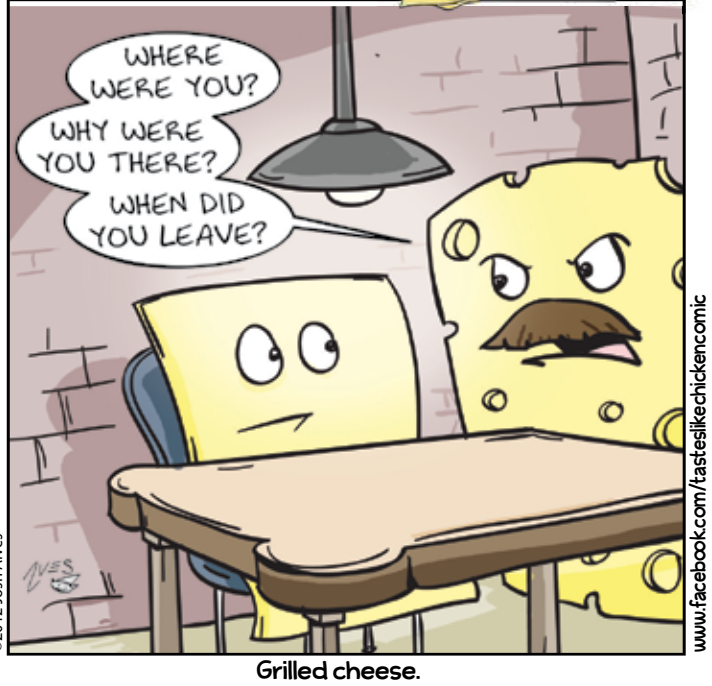

The Secret to Being Organized
Pam Young's Corner
Staying on Track During the Holidays

The holidays definitely impact SHEs (Sidetracked Home Executives). Because we're creative, we can go into OPM (Over Production Mode). Our perfectionism kicks in and we want to recreate the magic we see on glossy magazine covers without thinking about how fake it all is.

We SHEs love the holidays, and since we're easily distracted throughout the year, this time of year can pitch us over the festive edge.

The holidays don't let us off the hook when it comes to the work involved in running a household. Imagine that you have a half hour specifically slotted for housework. You've got four 3x5 cards with specific chores on each to direct your work (if you're on the SHE system). There's an estimated time telling you how long each task will take written on each card. You're dressed for housework, so you won't wreck your good clothes and you've got sensible shoes on.

According to your math, you can do the tasks on the cards in half an hour, but what has happened to your good intentions when you find yourself at the mall buying Christmas presents?

You can find that out by thinking backward until you come to the point in your housecleaning that prompted the diversion. Maybe you were innocently dusting the dining room table with a couple weeks' worth of mail stacked on it and when you went to move the mail to dust you saw the coupon for 25% off Christmas pajamas at Nordstrom, and the sale ends today! So much for housecleaning, but at least you

have some gifts to wrap.

If you are a champion at getting sidetracked read on, because there is a wonderful anti-sidetracking tool you can use and it's located in your head (well actually in your throat). You can read all about it at the end of this essay.

If you're tired of being a victim of distractions here are ten you need to be aware of before you start any housework whether it's during the holidays or any time.

1. Cell phone

If you've been sidetracked in the past by any of these distractions, here's what you can do. When you set your timer for 15 minutes and plan to clean the refrigerator for example, promise yourself you are going to **stay on task short of an emergency like a broken arm, a fire in the next room or a drone takes the top of your roof off.** Once the vow is made, work fast and play with your time constraint. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A group of seniors and guards highlight this year's Cordova High School boys basketball team.

Cordova head coach Fletcher Johnson welcomes back four seniors, all of whom saw significant playing time last season as juniors. The Lancers posted an 8-2 record in the Sierra Valley Conference for second place and 17-12 overall last season.

Moving up to the varsity squad from last year's Cordova junior varsity hoops squad is guard Markell Briggs, who hovers at 6'1. Briggs and Novik could be part of a three-guard starting line-up, Fletcher noted.

"There will be times we'll have four guards and whatever post-player we can

find," Johnson said. "It's all about the guard play."

Calvin Augusta, a wide receiver on the Cordova football team that won a share of the SVC title last month, is another guard, also a junior. Another football player who is now sporting basketball shoes is Tyreke Tate, also a wing player.

In the early stages of the pre-season, the Lancers are looking to establish a rotation of players coming off the bench to join the starters.

"All of the things you have to do to build that team camaraderie," Johnson said.

As for the team to beat in the SVC, Johnson is picking Union Mine, which returns most of its starters from last season. He feels his squad and Liberty Ranch will battle the Diamondbacks.

"They are the team to beat," said Johnson of Union Mine.

On Monday, Cordova opened its season at Vista del Lago of Folsom in the Sac-Joaquin Section's Foundation Game. Admission from the game and others played in the section goes toward A. Dale Lacky Scholarship and Women in Sports Conference. The Lancers

fell to the Eagles by an 85-70 score.

Cordova Football Earns All-SVC Honors

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - One of the benefits of the Cordova High School football team winning a share of the Sierra Valley Conference title is being honored after completion of the season.

A combined 13 Lancer gridders, plus head coach Darrin Nill, earned all-SVC first team, second team and honorable mention picks. Nine of those players were named to the conference's first team.

Leading the way for the first team was Cordova running back Deante McCullough, who rushed 166 times for 1,493 yards and 17 touchdowns. Another offensive weapon for the Lancers selected was sophomore quarterback Xavier Johnson, who completed 138-of-248 passes for 2,043 yards and 20 touchdowns. He averaged 185.7 yards passing per game.

Rounding out the offensive players making all-SVC was wide receiver Calvin Augusta, a junior who had 51 receptions for 914 yards and eight touchdowns.

Cordova players who made the all-SVC on defense were linebackers Kenny Haney, who led the squad in tackles at 91, and Yusef Pugh, third on the

team in tackles at 67.

Earning the all-SVC honor, times two, is junior linebacker Kelechi Njoku, second on the team in tackles at 74. He was also named the SVC's Defensive Lineman of the Year.

Rounding out the list of all-SVC honors for the Lancers were safety Tyreke Tate, and defensive backs Bryan Estrada and Raymond Fite.

Taking all-SVC second team honors were center Austin McCoy, a sophomore, and linebacker Jason Johnson, a senior.

Making the conference's honorable mention list were Cordova linebacker Michael Gonzalez and wide receiver Alvin Banks.

"Everybody played an important role throughout the entire season," Nill said.

Nill was named the conference's Coach of the Year. In his second season, Nill and his assistant coaches led the Lancers to a 7-4 overall record, which included a 4-1 mark in the SVC to win a share of the title with Liberty Ranch and El Dorado.

"It's a great honor put forth by my peers," Nill said.

After 120 minutes of battling both Big 8 rival Santa Rosa and relentless wind & rain on Saturday night at Falcon Stadium, the Falcons accomplished their goal when sophomore Hannah O'Donnell calmly knocked the ball past Santa Rosa goalkeeper Ally Milone to give the home team a decisive 3-2 margin in penalty kicks. The Bear Cubs had given the Falcons all they could handle, as the visitors seemed to control the time of possession throughout the first half. Meanwhile, the Falcons' back line of Megan Trent, Mia Evans, and Natalie Fischer made sure that very few balls made it to goalkeeper Aubrey Hall, and the teams

were scoreless after 45 minutes. After some halftime adjustments (and with the wind & rain now at their backs), the Falcons stepped up the pressure. Still, neither team managed to find the net in regulation time as they remained deadlocked at 0-0. Playoff rules call for two 15-minute overtime periods (no Golden Goal rule), so the teams trudged back onto the drenched field for another 30 minutes of fun in the rain. Again, both teams had their chances but neither could score, leaving the outcome to the dreaded penalty kick shootout (alternating 5 shots for each team) as the rain intensified. With the Bear Cubs missing their first two shots off the posts, sophomore Tori Pearson gave the Falcons a 1-0 lead after two rounds. Two



rounds later, sophomore Amber Hicks put the Falcons ahead 2-1 with just one round to go. 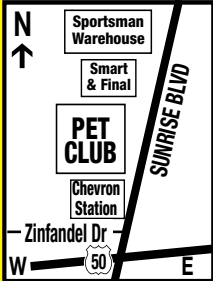
