SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On October 16 at the Hyatt Regency, Olympic Gold Medalist Jeff Float will be inducted into the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Hall of Fame. This event is honoring a total of 17 individuals who have all enjoyed stellar careers in their respective athletic endeavors.

Among those also selected are Gold Medalist Wilbur Thompson, Coach Dan Carmazzi, Administrator Pete Saco, Official Joe Harper and Sports Editor Marty James. A few of the other notable athletes who were chosen in the past include Summer Sanders, Debbie Meyer, Tedy Bruschi, Bill Cartwright, Dusty Baker and Steve Sax.

The CIF Sac-Joaquin Section [CIF-SJS] organization, while functioning at the grass-roots level, often launches long-term vocations beyond grade school. When asked about his high school background, Jeff was quoted as saying, "Jesuit served as my starting block from which I dove into a rewarding collegiate experience and successful swimming career. With the great fortune of Arden Hills and its legendary Coach Sherm Chavoor being located across the street from Jesuit, my sports training, superb education and religious beliefs thrived. Now as a coach and mentor for over two decades, I feel privileged to share my passion for swimming with today's youth. For these reasons and many others, I will always remain grateful to Jesuit for instilling in me its credo ... becoming 'A Man for Others.' And I attempt to uphold that standard every day."

Along the path, Jeff's accomplishments include the following: 1980 Olympic Team member in Moscow [boycotted]; 1984 peer-elected Captain and Gold Medalist in Los Angeles; 1977 ten-time Gold Medalist in the World Games for the Deaf in Romania [unrivaled for 39 years]; 2008 recipient of the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor [bestowed to all 1980

State Now to Dictate Religious Practices?

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) issued the following statement regarding Governor Brown's signing of Senate Bill 1146 (Lara), a bill that discriminates against all religious-based universities and infringes their ability to ensure faith-based practices are upheld on campus, undermining the concrete right of religious freedom guaranteed in the First Amendment.

"We are heading towards a one belief system, and anyone who strays from that state-sponsored orthodoxy gets punished. This bill is a step towards putting a scarlet letter on the chest of all religious institutions.

"The First Amendment is clear: Christian and other religious institutions should be free to practice their faith without state interference. This is phase one of a radical strategy to tear down religious institutions. First it's to identify the target, isolate it, then demonize it. This bill could have been worse, but as part of a larger strategy to eliminate religion, it's alarming.

"California prides itself on multiculturalism, but it seems like Christians are one culture the ruling elites fear and target more than any other. We are blessed to live in a free nation and we should be able to respect beliefs that differ from our own."

Senator Ted Gaines represents the 1st Senate District, which includes all or parts of Alpine, El Dorado, Lassen, Modoc, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, Shasta, Sierra and Siskiyou counties.



California Capital Airshow Welcomed Huge Crowds

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The 2016 California Capital Airshow, presented by Sacramento County, in partnership with the City of Rancho Cordova, opened the gates at Mather Airport this past weekend with an increase of more than 20 percent in attendance over last year. The Airshow welcomed the world-famous U.S. Navy Blue Angels, US Army Golden Knights for the very first time, the Royal Canadian Air Force CF-18 Hornet Demo, US Air Force F-16 Viper, 'FIFI', the iconic B-29 Superfortress and so much more.

After a full day of awe-inspiring performances, sadly, due to unforeseen circumstances, the Blues Angels were unable to perform on Saturday. The commanding officer and flight leader, Cmdr. Ryan Bernacchi, contracted a food-borne ailment offsite and was under the medical supervision of the team's Flight Surgeon and could not fly. The Blue Angels decide whether or not they perform per regulations, as safety is their number one priority. Once the Airshow was notified that the team would be grounded due to the Commander's illness the public was informed immediately.

"Fans were thrilled that 'Boss' was feeling better and that the Show welcomed back thousands of Saturday ticket holders. All were excited to return for a

second day of Airshow fun."

While Sunday weather reports initially called for stormy conditions, weather was not a factor and fans enjoyed the full line up of performers including the heart-stopping Blue Angels demonstration.

"Without events like these, our children and grandchildren would never be able to see up-close examples of the ingenuity that makes our country great or spend a weekend in the presence of heroes and legends. Cooley's Bill to Expand Foster Youth Access Signed by the Governor

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Ken Cooley's (D-Rancho Cordova) AB 2417 was signed in to law by Governor Brown this afternoon. AB 2417 expands foster youth access to court appointed special advocates, known as CASAs. These are volunteers who are appointed by a judge to provide one-on-one mentorship and advocacy to abused and neglected children who are under the jurisdiction of the juvenile court. Children with court appointed special advocates have demonstrably better long-term outcomes: they are more likely to find a safe permanent home, half as likely to reenter the foster care system, and have far greater success in school. However, there are currently not enough CASA volunteers to advocate on behalf of the foster children in need of their services.

CASA programs are required by law to fingerprint each volunteer

to screen for a criminal background before allowing them to mentor and advocate for youth. Non-profit organizations that serve children do not have to pay the California Department of Justice fees for background checks, but CASA programs are currently excluded from this benefit. This places an undue financial burden on this critical child advocacy program.

AB 2417 enhances foster youth access to CASA volunteers by including CASA programs in the existing fee exemption that other child-focused non-profit organizations enjoy.

"Foster kids face obstacles that affect their long-term education, job prospects and even housing stability," said Assemblyman Cooley. "AB 2417 expands access to

CASAs that provide foster youth vital support and services they need to transition into independent adulthood."

"We applaud Assemblymember Cooley for his leadership and Governor Brown for his approval of this simple legislative change which will result in more children in foster care having the caring advocacy of a Court Appointed Special Advocate," said John Lipp, CEO of the California CASA Association. "This represents a great savings to our local CASA programs that they will leverage to recruit, train, and supervise CASA volunteers, whose advocacy improves and transforms the lives of abused and neglected children."

AB 2417 will take effect January 1, 2017. ★

When we are able to turn those mental pictures into reality, we never forget that second of time because we were able to make a picture come true. "A moment's insight is sometimes worth a life's experience." Oliver Wendell Holmes, Sr. said.

Our California Capital Airshow at Mather Airport was a great success according to the people I have talked to. It was a shame that one of the pilots got sick and the Blue Angles program had to be cancelled on Saturday. But when that happened, the people on the California Capital Airshow board did the right thing, and told the people who only had a Saturday ticket and parking pass that their tickets were going to be honored on Sunday too. The pilot was well on Sunday, and everyone at Mather, as well as the people who were waiting to see the Blue Angles fly over their homes and neighborhoods, were not disappointed. The little bit of rain (a first) didn't stop any of the pilots from doing what they love to do. And that is, like John Gillespie Magee Jr. said, to fly.

"Oh, I have slipped the surly bonds of earth, and danced the skies on laughter-silvered wings; sunward I've climbed and joined the tumbling mirth

of sun-split clouds - and done a hundred things you have not dreamed of - wheeled and soared and swung high in the sunlit silence. Hovering there, I've chased the shouting wind along and flung my eager craft through footless halls of air. Up, up the long delirious burning blue I've topped the wind-swept heights with easy grace, where never lark, or even eagle, flew; and, while with silent, lifting mind I've trod the high untrespassed sanctity of space, put out my hand and touched the face of God."

The author of that poem, John Gillespie Magee Jr., was a pilot and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force, which he joined before the United States entered WWII. He was a Spitfire pilot and was only 19-years-old when he was involved in a mid-air collision in 1941. That poem has possibly given people who don't fly what some pilots may experience as they do fly. My guess is that many, if not all of the pilots who flew in this year's California Capital Airshow, are able to wheel and soar and swing like he did. It was another great show for the City of Rancho Cordova, for Sacramento County, and for everyone else, no matter where they may come from. And thank you to the 1,000 volunteers who made the show possible.

If You Can Ride a Bike, You Can Get Organized

Who taught you to ride a bike? Do you remember how different riding a bike was than riding your trike? With a tricycle, you really had to pedal hard to get over bumpy terrain, but with a bicycle you could almost glide over it. As soon as you mastered the skills of riding, you were given the joy of riding fast and easy. Remember feeling like you were flying? To go faster than you could run was addictive and you had the same joy a dog has with his head out the window of a Subaru, fur smashed back by the wind.

Once you nail that, it's just a matter of putting more focus on using it and just like riding a bike; you'll be back on top of things.

Commitment and Desire

But there's more. When you were young, you looked at riding your bike as something fun to do, because the rewards for pleasure were great. You also had the commitment to learn, because you saw all the other kids having fun and there you were on your little, red trike, with a stupid bell that rusted into silence.

For Democrats, First Amendment Rights Stop at Climate Change

Democrats' grand plan for this election year doesn't seem to include free speech. The group that drafted the Democratic Party platform recently called for the Justice Department to prosecute energy companies that don't agree with Democrats on climate change.

But is that wise? If the government is allowed to punish those who merely question climate change, it should also be allowed to punish climate alarmists for false doomsday predictions.

That reasoning doesn't make sense. Democrats should end their crusade before they start feeling the brunt of their own logic.

Unfortunately, silencing climate dissenters with laws didn't start with the DNC platform. It's part of a growing trend.

Twenty state attorney generals nationwide have started investigating oil companies. The AGs allege that to maintain high profits, Big Oil purposely misled investors and the public about climate change consequences.

Right- and libertarian-leaning policy centers -- such as the Heartland Institute and Competitive Enterprise Institute -- are also facing scrutiny. My employer, the National Center for Public Policy Research was even targeted on the Senate floor. The green crusaders claim we were all accomplices in helping oil companies obscure

environmental threats.

Meanwhile, Attorney General Loretta Lynch recently acknowledged that the Justice Department may use a federal law originally created to fight organized crime to prosecute climate skeptics. In the Obama administration's distorted reality, the analogy isn't much of a stretch.

Ironically, the state AGs unveiled their crusade at a press conference in March with former vice president and climate Svengali Al Gore. Gore, who predicted that the North Pole would be ice-free by 2013, has repeatedly cried wolf about the coming environmental apocalypse -- while snatching millions by promoting dubious green investments.

But what's to stop a newly formed league of climate-agnostic attorneys general, emboldened by the strategies of their green colleagues, from prosecuting those like Gore who have become rich off doomsday predictions?

Gore isn't alone. In 2008, ABC News predicted that because of climate change, New York City would be submerged by 2015. Concurrently, the United Nations warned that there were only eight years left to prevent a "dangerous" rise in global temperatures.

In 2007, the head of the organization's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change cautioned that it would be "too late" by 2012 without immediate global action. Previously, the UN warned that

global warming was about to usher in a huge period of population disruption, creating 50 million climate refugees by 2010.

These are just a smattering of inaccurate predictions from environmentalists. Some utilized flawed models. Some were propaganda to influence public opinion and legislation. Others just wanted to get rich off government-subsidies for green technology.

Those motives are no better than the ones said to be driving oil companies. Were the tables turned and green zealots held accountable for misleading the public, many of the prosecutors would be the prosecuted.

Realistically, investigations like the one the state AGs are now pursuing are about harassing political opponents -- not protecting the public.

The investigation into these oil companies and think tanks is a flagrant attempt to bypass the Constitution and stifle political speech. It should be opposed regardless of their stance on climate change. It's shameful that a major political party has so little regard for free speech.

Legislation Expanding Veterans' Property Tax Exemption Signed Into Law

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Governor Brown has signed legislation (SB 1458) sponsored by Board of Equalization Member George Runner and authored by Senator Patricia Bates (R-Laguna Niguel) that expands eligibility for the state's property tax exemption to disabled military veterans who were discharged under "other than honorable conditions."

"We should do everything we can to honor veterans injured as a result of their service," said Runner. "By making this small

change, more California veterans will be given access to a benefit offered to them by a state grateful for their sacrifices."

Before this bill was signed, only veterans who received an honorable discharge were eligible for California's disabled veterans' property tax exemption. This includes veterans who have a service-related 100% disability rating from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and are receiving all federal benefits related to their service.

SB 1458 expands the disabled veterans' exemption eligibility by changing the state requirement that a veteran's character of discharge from military service be under "honorable" conditions to the standard of "other than dishonorable" conditions. This bill does not provide any benefit to those discharged under dishonorable conditions. As a tax levy, SB 1458 becomes law immediately, but for practical reasons will not take effect until January 1, 2017.

Defendant Convicted of Multiple Charges from Sexual Assault of Woman Defendant Convicted of Sexually Assaulting 17 Year Old Defendant Convicted for Murder, Series of Attacks

DATE: September 22, 2016
CASE: Anthony Ray Jones (Case #15F05868)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit
Anthony Ray Jones was convicted by a jury of two counts of forcible rape, three counts of forcible oral copulation, and one count of forcible digital penetration. The jury found true the allegations that Jones was armed with a deadly weapon and that the crimes were committed during the commission of first-degree burglary on all six counts. Jones was also convicted of three counts of assault with a deadly weapon, two counts of felony sexual assault, assault with intent to commit rape, two counts of false imprisonment, first-degree burglary, criminal threats, and child endangerment.

On September 21, 2015, the victim returned home with her 3-year-old son. As the victim entered her apartment, Jones forced his way inside. When the victim screamed, Jones pointed a gun at her son and threatened to shoot him if she didn't stop screaming. Jones continued to threaten the victim to follow his orders or he would shoot her and her son. Jones then ordered the victim to take her clothes off and proceeded to sexually assault her multiple times, including raping and forcing her to perform sexual acts on him. Jones videotaped the victim during the assault with his phone. When the victim's husband returned home, Jones ordered him into the bathroom at gunpoint and threatened to shoot him. Jones then left the apartment and told the victim that if she called the police, he would come back and shoot the whole family.

Jones faces a sentence of approximately 160 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for October 28, 2016, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 28 before the Honorable James McFetridge.

DATE: September 22, 2016
CASE: Randy Klippenstein (Case #15F06223)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Jones, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

Randy Klippenstein was convicted by a jury of two counts of rape by force, two counts of digital penetration by force, four counts of oral copulation by force, and three counts of sexual misconduct.

In August 2013, Klippenstein began

making sexual comments about the appearance of a 17-year-old female. Soon after, Klippenstein sexually assaulted the victim and continued the sexual assaults for the next year and a half. The victim told Klippenstein "no" and tried pushing him away in an attempt to prevent the assaults, but she was unsuccessful. Throughout this time, Klippenstein threatened to kill the victim or lock her away in a basement if she ever told anyone about the abuse.

Klippenstein faces a maximum potential sentence of 66 years in prison. Sentencing is set for October 21, 2016, at 8:30 a.m. in Department 39 before the Honorable James Arguelles.

DATE: September 28, 2016
CASE: Christopher Franklin (Case #15F06717)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney William Satchell, Homicide Unit

Christopher Franklin was convicted by a jury of first-degree murder, attempted murder, assault with force likely to cause great bodily injury, and illegal possession of a concealed firearm. The jury also found that Franklin discharged a firearm causing death and great bodily injury.

On July 10, 2015, Dennis Clark was homeless and sleeping under a bridge. When Mr. Clark awoke, he found Franklin standing over him. Without warning or provocation, Franklin began shooting at Mr. Clark, striking him four times. Multiple .40 caliber casing were recovered at the scene.

On October 11, 2015, Anna Bernaix was sleeping near a homeless encampment when she was found shot to death. Several .40 caliber casings were also found at the scene.

On October 13, 2015, Douglas Bean was working as a surveyor near remote railroad tracks. Franklin approached Mr. Bean from behind and placed him in a strangle-hold. Other workers witnessed what was happening and stopped Franklin just as Mr. Bean was losing consciousness. The Sacramento County Sheriff's Department responded and apprehended Franklin. Deputies searched Franklin and found a concealed .40 caliber handgun. Testing by the District Attorney's Crime Lab determined the handgun Franklin was carrying was used to shoot both Mr. Clark and Ms. Bernaix.

Franklin faces a maximum potential sentence of 75 years to life plus 21 years in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for October 25, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 24 before the Honorable Shelleyanne Chang. ★

Lancers Ready for Homecoming, SVC Opener

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Five non-league games are in the books for the Cordova High School football team.

The Lancers opened the season with a 55-20 home win over Rio Americano. Then after leading 34-6 entering the fourth quarter of its second game of the season, Cordova (3-2) held off a late rally to beat Chavez of Stockton, 34-32.

Now with a 2-1 record at that point of the season, the Lancers hosted Rio Linda and Vista del Lago at Lancers Stadium. But those games ended with Rio Linda posting a 31-29 win and Vista at 52-35.

Two weeks ago on the road, Cordova got back on the winning track at Foothill of Sacramento. After punting on their first offensive drive against the Mustangs, the Lancers scored on every possession in the first half. That led to a 56-14 win over Foothill to conclude the pre-season with a winning record.

The Lancers had their bye last week, which Cordova head coach Darren Nill is glad it's come and gone.

"For some reason, bye weeks are just funky weeks for Cordova," Nill said. "My kids don't take bye weeks very seriously. (Plus) we were playing with a lot of injuries (from the Lancers' contest against

Foothill.) But we did heal up."

On Tuesday night, the Lancers had what Nill described as a "real good practice" and are back to being focused. Tonight, Friday, the focus now shifts toward welcoming CHS alumnus and Lancer fans for the school's fall homecoming game - and Sierra Valley Conference opener against Galt (3-2), which has won its last three non-league games.

"Homecoming is a big deal for us," Nill said. "The stands will be packed. The mood is very festive. I think we will be up for the game." The Warriors' defense will take

on a Lancer offense that is averaging 221.4 yards in the air and 220.8 on the ground per game.

Leading the charge is Cordova quarterback Xavier Johnson, who has completed 72-of-128 passes for 1,107 yards and 12 touchdowns. Wide receiver Calvin Augusta has 22 receptions for 421 yards and six touchdowns, and teammate Alvin Banks is 21-364 for four touchdowns.

On the ground, running back Deante McCullough leads the Lancers' rush attack with 57 carries for 511 yards and seven touchdowns.

Galt's offense is led by running back Zach Orman, who has rushed 102 times for 942 yards and 13 touchdowns, and quarterback Gabe Abarca, a senior who started as a junior last year. The Warriors are averaging 259 yards per game on the ground.

Game time is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. The Galt-Cordova frosh/soph game is scheduled to kick-off at 5:15 p.m. ★

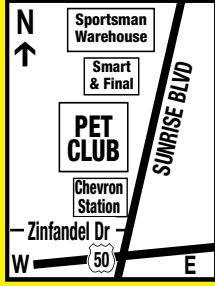
