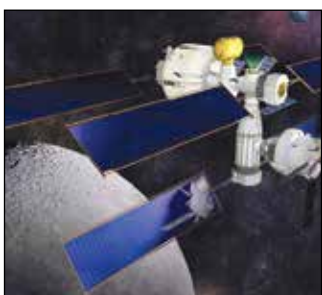

Measure H Provides 'Flex' Helmets for Cordova Football

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In November 2014, Measure H was passed by Rancho Cordova residents, allowing a half-cent tax local sales tax measure.

The generated money from the taxes is approximately \$7.2 million annually in revenues that goes into the city's general fund. Parts of the money are being used toward 48 approved projects submitted by a range of individuals, organizations, businesses and community partners.

One of those partners is the Cordova High School football program, which now has state-of-the-art helmets and shoulder pads.

The program was given \$385,000 to be spread out over the next three years. One-third of the money, approximately \$106,000 was used to purchase Riddell Speed Flex, high-tech helmets that have a head impact monitoring system for all of the Cordova varsity and junior varsity football players.

The technology from Riddell measures the head impact severity. When an impact exceeds a predetermined threshold, an alert is transmitted to the sideline staff, who can then examine the player for symptoms of a concussion. The helmet records threshold hits that are in the upper 1 percent of all hits from that position.

The trainer and his/her staff receive the alert, and notify the coaching staff. That player is pulled off the field to be examined. The helmets don't diagnose concussions.

"It's just one more tool that training staffs and coaching staffs can use to keep their players safe," said Cordova varsity football coach Darrin Nill. "They are much better than what we just got rid of. Up until

last year, we were using shoulder pads and helmets, although good quality, nothing like this. It's just really fantastic ... it's the latest and greatest."

Inside each helmet has a special plastic casing and the skull padding that is part of the head impact severity.

The National Football League (NFL) uses the Riddell Speed Flex helmets. Colleges across the United States are also using the helmets, along with the Cordova football program.

Nill said there are no complaints from his players on the varsity and JV levels.

"My kids love wearing those

helmets," Nill said. "They said it feels great. They think they look great. If it translates to them playing great, I'm all for it."

In a press release from Maria Kniestedt, who works for the City of Rancho Cordova, "Head injury and concussions are a great concern among parents, leagues, and schools - especially at the youth and high school levels ... both the JV and Varsity football teams at Cordova High School will be wearing helmet technology that keeps them safer."

Rancho Cordova Mayor David Sander added, "We

believe the City of Rancho Cordova is the first city in the nation to fund this helmet technology to keep its students safer."

The Davis High School varsity football team has similar helmets, but only for its varsity football team, according to Nill.

Sander added, "The Community Enhancement Fund grants will ensure Rancho Cordova's priorities happen that much faster. This year's applicants showed creative and innovative ideas that will continue making us a vibrant community that values opportunity, partnerships, and fun." ★

Deep-Space Habitation System Envisioned

Aerojet Rocketdyne Teams with Sierra Nevada Corporation to Conduct an Architectural Design Study

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne, a subsidiary of Aerojet Rocketdyne Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: AJRD), is working with Sierra Nevada Corporation (SNC), a leader in aerospace and defense systems, to conduct an architectural design study for a habitation system that would enable NASA astronauts to live for long durations beyond low-Earth orbit. SNC is serving as the prime contractor under NASA's Next Space Technologies for Exploration Partnerships-2 (NextSTEP-2), which seeks commercial development of deep-space exploration capabilities to support more extensive human spaceflight missions.

"We look forward to working with our industry partners on an architectural study for a habitat system that will allow humans to live in space farther from Earth and for longer durations than ever before," said Aerojet Rocketdyne CEO and President Eileen Drake. "It's an especially unique opportunity to help stimulate the commercial space industry while leveraging existing and emerging technologies, furthering our nation's ability to explore the frontiers and expand our knowledge of space."

As part of that study, Aerojet Rocketdyne has proposed to build a fully-functional prototype PowerTrain™ Solar Electric Propulsion (SEP) system designed to deliver power from the solar arrays to the thrusters on the spacecraft. The PowerTrain™ SEP system uses a peak-power tracking capability and is compatible with current and future advanced Hall-effect thruster propulsion systems. Last year, the company successfully built and tested a prototype system in a simulated mission

environment to show that it could achieve improved system efficiency over current Power Management and Distribution approaches used on satellites. The prototype was tested at Aerojet Rocketdyne's Los Angeles facility, where most of the International Space Station power-system hardware was developed.

Under the 18-month architectural design study, Aerojet Rocketdyne and SNC will devise concepts that include standards, common interfaces and testing approaches for the habitation system. It will also include the development and integrated testing of the full-size ground prototypes by 2018. The project details will depend on final contract negotiations.

According to NASA, the prototypes will demonstrate critical aspects of the engineering processes involved in the development of the operational

unit. The engineering test units will closely resemble final hardware and software products, and will be built and tested in order to establish confidence that the designs will function as expected in the harsh environments of space.

Bera Meets with Business Leaders on Impact of Health Insurance Tax

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Friday, August 5, Congressman Ami Bera met with key business leaders at Mailing Systems Inc. in Rancho Cordova to discuss the costly new financial burden imposed on businesses by the health insurance tax, or HIT, included in the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

This new tax amounts to at least \$130 billion in new costs, which is almost entirely passed on to small businesses and the self-employed who purchase coverage in the fully insured marketplace.

According to Congressman Bera, “The HIT is not adding value - it is just adding cost. It impacts small businesses more than anyone, and it hits working families especially hard. That’s why I worked with a bipartisan majority in Congress that voted to suspend the tax for 2017 and continue to push for delaying its implementation.”

Kasey Cotulla, of River City Printers talked about the impact that implementing the HIT would have on his business of more than 50 employees: “Health care costs are right up there with paper and payroll in terms of their impact on our costs. The health insurance tax adds to our costs without

adding any value. It just impacts what we are able to do for our employees in terms of payroll and benefits.”

The Health Insurance Tax is one of the largest tax increases included in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), which is projected to raise \$159 billion in the first 10 years.

The Stop The HIT Coalition represents the nation’s small business owners, their employees

and the self-employed who are actively working to repeal the Health Insurance Tax. Since the Coalition’s formation in 2011, it has grown to include more than 35 national organizations, representing millions of small business owners across the country.

Cal Fire Local 2881 Firefighter Discusses Fair Pay for Firefighters

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - CAL FIRE Local 2881 represents the 6,500 firefighters of CAL FIRE. They answer more than 400,000 calls per year with professionalism and integrity. However, CAL FIRE firefighters are in crisis.

“Today (August 16th) I did the most difficult thing I’ve ever had to do as a firefighter,” said CAL FIRE firefighter Steve Mueller. “While I look forward to protecting my neighbors and working hard with my colleagues, I didn’t enjoy talking publicly about how our pay lags drastically behind other departments.”

California’s independent Human Resources Salary Report reveals that CAL FIRE firefighters make 30-90% less than firefighters from California’s top twenty-five fire departments. A fifteen-year veteran of CAL FIRE can make more money, and with less responsibilities, as an entry-level firefighter at a local department. Three months ago, CAL FIRE had a 50% no-show for the promotional Fire Captain test.

Entry-level firefighters make only minimum wage. In five years, due to compaction within the Department, they will make as much as mid-level firefighters. The compaction and overlapping of pay negatively impacts morale among firefighters and

robs our men and women the incentive to promote.

“I love fighting fires and the camaraderie on the job but, it is important that our pay at least be competitive with other fire departments,” said Mueller.

Mueller mentioned that firefighters will be at the State Capitol at 11AM on Monday, August 22nd to protest the pay disparities.

The men and women of CAL FIRE will always answer the call and it is an honor to protect our neighbors. We hope to work cooperatively with the Administration to find a viable solution. ★

Celebrity Reflection Mirrors Excellence

By David Dickstein

Ground chuck makes for a delicious burger, but if you're the type of consumer who will spend a bit more for the quality of sirloin, let me introduce you to premium cruising. I'm assuming you've never had the pleasure as only 15 percent of American adults have ever cruised at all, let alone treat themselves to the "better" class of cruise lines in the good-better-best marketing model. After taking 19 voyages on "good" ships, I finally tasted the sweet life of "better" and it was delicious.

What a difference spending 25 percent more makes. That was the takeaway after this self-paying travel writer took a 10-day Italy & Greek Isles cruise aboard the Celebrity Reflection out of Rome. Don't get me wrong: Carnival, Royal Caribbean, Norwegian and other Big Ship-category players generally offer a solid product at economical fares. In fact, the ship, crew and service were so good on the new Carnival Vista in May, at times it felt like premium-class cruising. But on the Celebrity Reflection, with few exceptions, there was zero interruption of excellence.

Celebrity is to Royal Caribbean what Lexus is to Toyota. Premium ships, marketed as a more personalized alternative for an upper-middle-class demographic, are typically smaller, and that holds true here; the 3,046-passenger Reflection is the newest and largest in Celebrity's fleet, yet dwarfed by every Royal Caribbean ship launched in the past decade. The next generation of Celebrity ships is scheduled to debut in 2018, and it has big hulls to fill thanks to the feature-rich Solstice class now gracing many of the Seven Seas. When Reflection debuted in 2012, it immediately set itself apart from its four older siblings with an

of shipboard buffets, yet things only went higher from there.

Two-level Opus is the main dining area. Elegance with-

out pretentiousness, a vibe running throughout much of the ship, welcomes all passengers. Like the main dining rooms on less expensive competition, Opus' menu includes prime rib, salmon, pork chops, escargot –

in quality, taste and flavor, and nontraditional. Breakfast selections include a smoked salmon and asparagus frittata, and for dinner, it's out with heavy béarnaise and in with a truffle vinaigrette on cuts of tender steak. Not all is perfect in Blu, however. One evening's dessert menu contained a misprint: It said the to-die-for Café Pot de Crème has no sugar added. Yeah, I'll believe that when I see Nacho Cheese Doritos on my sushi.

Of the Reflection's specialty restaurants, the most unique is easily Qsine (\$45 cover), serving up a whimsical "dining journey" that begins with ordering from iPads and ends with picking your own chocolate-covered strawberry from a field of grass strapped to your "tour guide" (don't call them servers at Qsine). In between are the shareable courses of tasty tapas you selected, but how they come out is out of your hands in this guided journey. When the effervescent Nathan scampered to our oceanview table, bringing with him a tray of sig-

fresh seafood, and Sushi on Five (a la carte pricing).

Put Down the Fork

In between meals are many non-caloric ways to get your fill, starting with the impressive array of entertainment. "Broken Strings" is a standout production show, featuring a talented, tireless and attractive cast singing and dancing to music from this actual decade – a rarity on cruises. Mainstage shows still feature a live band, and consider yourself fortunate if trombonist Mike Daigau is your cruise's band director. The affable "Big Mike," who just left the Reflection for a new contract

Sheriff Scott Jones Proposes New Transparency Rules On Campaign Finances

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sheriff Scott Jones recently announced three proposed changes to campaign finance rules that would allow more transparency on donations to federal election candidates and their donors.

“More has to be done to root corruption out of politics and expose conflicts,” said Sheriff Scott Jones. “As Congressman - just as I’ve done as Sheriff - I will be proactive in ensuring transparency and accountability in government. That’s why I’m proposing three simple rules that will help increase transparency in our election process. Campaign finance rules are stricter than ever but most of the rules are based on reporting processes that are out of date. Making these three simple changes to the FEC’s disclosure rules will help the public understand where political money is coming from so voters can hold their candidates accountable in real time.”

Sheriff Jones’ proposed new transparency FEC rules include:

Implement FEC Reporting to Disclose Family Members of Federal Candidates and Elected Officials

Voters should know if wealthy families are trying to buy a seat in Congress. A simple requirement for campaigns to indicate if donors are relatives of federal candidates or elected officials would provide much needed transparency for voters interested in who is funding campaigns that affect their lives.

More Frequent Reporting Of Contributions

As running for federal office continues to require more and more fundraising, campaigns should disclose large donations daily throughout the entire campaign, not just in the final days before an election. As major contributions enter the door, voters should have the chance to see who is funding campaigns in real time.

Impose Proactive Steps To Prevent “Straw Donors”

Campaigns must work with the FEC to proactively prevent straw donor schemes that undermine the democratic process. For all first-time max out donors, campaigns would make a simple “best effort” to ensure the donor knows the rules surrounding federal donations. This includes donating in someone else’s name, receiving a reimbursement for a donation, or using corporate money.

*Defendants Convicted for Massage Parlor Robbery
30-Year Career Criminal Sentenced for Attempted Murder
Defendant Sentenced for Multiple Sexual Assault, Kidnap Charges*

DATE: August 12, 2016
CASE: ,Devonte Graham, Ira Swanson & Daquan Cooper
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Devonte Graham was convicted by a jury of second-degree murder, along with an allegation that he intentionally discharged a firearm causing the victim’s death. Graham and co-defendants Ira Swanson and Daquan Cooper were also convicted of two counts of second-degree robbery, personal use of a firearm during the robbery, and being felons in possession of firearms.

On December 15, 2014, Graham, Swanson and Cooper entered a massage parlor on El Camino Avenue. All three defendants produced handguns and pointed them at two women who were working at the business. Swanson repeatedly struck one of the victims in the head with his handgun while demanding property from her. Graham struck the second victim in the head with his handgun. The defendants fled with stolen cash and property to a waiting SUV outside. When Graham didn’t want to give any of the stolen money to Jemahl Loharsingh, who was outside in the SUV during the robbery, the two got into an argument. Graham then shot Loharsingh five times, killing him.

Graham has a prior 2011 strike conviction for residential burglary. Swanson has a prior 2012 strike conviction for robbery. Cooper was on probation for felony gun possession at the time of this offense.

Graham faces a maximum potential sentence of 70 years to life in prison. Swanson faces a maximum potential sentence of 30 years, 4 months in prison. Cooper faces a maximum sentence of 20 years, 4 months in prison. Sentencing for all three defendants is set for September 9, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 38 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras.

DATE: August 12, 2016
CASE: David Richard Cingcon (Case Number: 15F00349)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sydne Christensen, Felony Prosecution Bureau

The Honorable Sharon Lueras sentenced David Richard Cingcon to 79 years to life in prison. On May 5, 2016, a jury convicted Cingcon of attempted murder and also found true the allegations that he intentionally discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury and was a felon in possession of a firearm. The Court also found that he had three prior ‘strike’ convictions involving serious and violent

felonies, including one for assault with a deadly weapon.

The victim considered Cingcon a friend and regularly spent time at Cingcon’s house. Cingcon accused the victim of stealing money from him. The victim denied the theft and assured the defendant that he would never steal from him. Cingcon then pulled out a handgun, pressed it against the left side of the victim’s head and shot him. Cingcon fled the scene and left the victim in the house to die. The bullet entered just below the victim’s temple and exited his back, fracturing three vertebrae, leaving bone fragments in the spinal canal, resulting in partial paralysis.

DATE: August 16, 2016
CASE: Steven Porter (Case Number: 15F07324)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Jones, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Kevin McCormick sentenced Steven Porter to 336 years to life in prison. On July 20, 2016, Porter pled no contest to kidnap for purposes of rape, four counts of forced oral copulation during a kidnapping and while armed with a knife, two counts of rape during a kidnapping and while armed with a knife, assault with a deadly weapon, two counts of criminal threats to cause death or great bodily injury while armed with a knife. Porter also admitted to a strike prior, a five year prison prior and a one year prison prior.

On December 3, 2015, the female victim was working alone inside a 76 gas station in Citrus Heights. Porter entered the store, took out a knife, and forced the victim to exit the store while threatening to stab her if she didn’t comply. Porter forced the victim to walk at knife point about a half mile to a trailer where he lived. He then repeatedly sexually assaulted her and forced her to perform sex acts on him. After the assault, the victim convinced Porter to let her leave by agreeing to be his friend and not press charges. She memorized the street address and contacted police, who were able to quickly arrive at the location where they observed Porter outside holding the knife he used to assault the victim. Surveillance video, the victim’s identification of Porter in a photo lineup, and DNA evidence conclusively proved Porter was the assailant.

Porter’s criminal history includes a 2006 prior strike conviction for assault with a deadly weapon and a 2001 conviction for stalking with intent to cause fear.

Lancers Return Experience on Both Sides of the Ball

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - For the past 10 days, members of the Cordova High School football team has been battling each other in various drills in practices.

But tomorrow, Saturday, the Lancers will see different faces.

Cordova will host Capital Christian in a controlled scrimmage at Lancer Stadium at 9 a.m. Cordova head coach Darren Nill and his assistant coaches will have an opportunity to evaluate their players on offense and defense.

Last season, Cordova went 4-6 overall and 1-4 in the Sierra Valley Conference. But this season, the Lancers are looking to earn a Sac-Joaquin Section playoff berth.

The Lancers' spread offense will be directed by sophomore quarterback Xavier Johnson, taking over for three-year starter Unique Perez, who set many school passing records during his career as a Lancer. Perez graduated last spring. Johnson's back-up will be senior Justin Martin, who will also see time as one of the Lancers' wide receivers.

"I think the difference is Xavier can see the read game better than Justin," said Nill of his two signal callers. "I still think both are going to get a lot of playing time. Just because we're giving the reps to Xavier that Justin is done. His (Martin) main job is to push Xavier, who can't let up now just because he's getting the No. 1 reps going into the first scrimmage. I think Justin is constantly improving every day."

The two quarterbacks will have many weapons to throw the ball. One of them is wide receiver Angel Garcia, who accounted for

a good portion of the Lancers' touchdowns last season. Another wide out is Alvin Banks, one of four sophomores on the squad. He made the all-tourney team for Cordova, which won the 7-on-7 Rosemont passing tournament two months ago.

More wide outs for the Lancers are senior Elijah Morgera and junior Tyreke Tate. And those are just to name a few wide receivers for Cordova.

"We're just going to wear people out," Nill said. "We can sub continuously at receiver. We're going to break some people in the second half (of games)."

On the ground, running back Deante McCullough is expected to carry the ball quite often for the Lancers.

"He has a fifth gear that burst

and we haven't seen at the school in years," said Nill of McCullough, who rushed 16 times for 110 yards and one touchdown as a junior last year.

Other Lancer running backs are Terrell Johnson and Kenny Haney, both seniors. Nill refers to Haney more of a power back who could be opening holes for the running game.

"Kenny will run you over," said Nill of Haney. "He's not looking for a hole; he's looking to put you on your back."

Another running back for the Lancers is junior Kelechi Njoku.

On the offensive line, Cordova will use a tight end in Isaiah Wimberly, a senior who is an even 6-foot and 180 pounds.

"Fifteen percent of the time, we'll be in a tight end position,"

said Nill of using Wimberly in certain situations.

Guiding the line also include left tackle Zariahn Zimmer, who stands 6'2 and 290 pounds; left guard Fidel Romero; center in sophomore Austin McCoy; right guard Joseph Salcedo, a junior who started as a sophomore last year, but broke his leg in the Lancers' first game last season; and right tackle Michael Gonzalez (6'1, 190), who, along with Zimmer, started last year.

A preview on the Lancers' defense will be in next Friday's issue.

After Saturday's scrimmage, Cordova begin preparations for its home and season opener against Rio Americano one week from today, Friday, Aug. 26th. ★

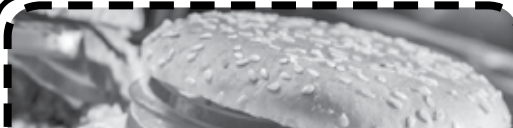

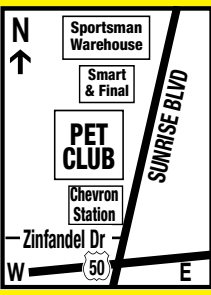
