Illegal Pharmaceuticals, Counterfeit Goods Seized in Area Search

California Attorney General's Tax Recovery and Criminal Enforcement (TRaCE) Task Force served seven search warrants in the capital region turning up hundreds of boxes of foreign pharmaceuticals and thousands of articles of suspected counterfeit clothing.

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), the California Department of Public Health's Food and Drug Branch, Franchise Tax Board, and Department of Justice eCrime Unit assisted in the June 21, 2016 operation that involved more than 50 agents and investigators.

"The trafficking of counterfeit goods poses a triple threat," said Ryan Spradlin, the special agent in charge who oversees HSI operations throughout northern California. "Such activities deliver shoddy and often dangerous goods into the economy, rob Americans of goodpaying jobs, and generate proceeds that are often funneled back into other criminal enterprises. HSI will continue to work with its enforcement partners to combat the distribution of counterfeit products, like those seized

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The in Sacramento yesterday, that could put unwitting consumers at risk."

"This action was a big blow to the underground economy in Northern California, and that makes yesterday's raid a win for our whole state," said Board of Equalization Chairwoman Fiona Ma, whose district includes West Sacramento, one of the communities where the raids occurred. "I want to thank the hardworking agents and investigators who spent months of painstaking work in shutting down these illegal operations."

"Illegal activities hurt legitimate businesses and inflict unfair costs on law-abiding Californians," said Board of Equalization Member George Runner. "Law enforcement deserves a huge thank you for their ongoing efforts to fight the underground economy."

This warrant follows months of investigation into the sale of illegal foreign prescription and over-the-counter pharmaceuticals and counterfeit clothing by a couple and their adult son. Inside the family's homes and three area businesses - Fashion Moda in North Highlands, Victoria's Health Products in Citrus Heights, and Elena's Health Products in West Sacramento – investigators discovered and confiscated the foreign pharmaceuticals, clothing, and more than \$10,000 in cash.

The Tax Recovery and Criminal Enforcement Task Force (TRaCE) is comprised of public officials from the California Department of Justice, Board of Equalization, Franchise Tax Board, Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, Employment Development Department, Department of Motor Vehicles, Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations, and the Santa Ana Police Department.

The mission of the TRaCE Task Force is to combat organized elements of the underground economy engaged in the manufacture, importation, distribution, and sale of pirated intellectual property, and other economic crimes resulting in the evasion of business, payroll and/or income taxes. Tale of Two Rallies

In 1978. I stood in line for six hours to be among the first to ride the Colossus at Magic Mountain amusement park. In 1980, I arrived to an Orange County cinema six hours early to be the first to see "The Empire Strikes Back." In 1984, on a movie set near Hollywood, waiting six hours beside a talent trailer scored me an autograph from Clint Eastwood.

So when it was announced that Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton were coming to Sacramento to hold political rallies last month, I knew exactly how early I'd need to get in line. If six hours was the sweet spot for a rollercoaster, sci-fi movie and A-list celebrity, then that strategy to optimize a bucket list experience should be sound for the Republican and Democratic presidential candidates. And it was. For Trump's rally at the Sacramento Jet Center and Clinton's at Sacramento City College, I was among the first 25 regular people to brave the elements – near-100-degree heat, profane protesters, line-cutters, etcetera – in hopes of getting as close as possible to the next president

of the United States.

Considering how polarizing the two candidates are, it could very well be that my youngest son and I were the only people outside some of the local media and police to attend both rallies. Doing so guaranteed seeing a future president, and being able to share the dual experience with my youngest voting in his first major election was beyond special. My wife, a social studies teacher at Gold River Discovery Center, was bummed to miss Trump's Wednesday rally due to commitments, but she did make Clinton's Sunday event.

Having attended both, and making observations while wiling away the hours in both lines, I feel qualified to do a compare and contrast of the two political rallies. With no bias, here are my takeaways:

Crowo

Trump: Estimated at 9,600. Standing in the scorching sun caused one person to pass out.

Clinton: Estimated at 1,500. Two people needed medical attention inside the sweltering gym.

Punctuality

Trump: The Republican candidate spoke 15 minutes early.

Clinton: Clinton took to the stage 70 minutes late. No one, including the tardy Democratic candidate, offered an apology.

Protesters

Trump: Dozens of dissenters showed up at Trump's, screaming accusations of bigotry. One guy wearing a hate-mongering sandwich board walked up and down alongside the lengthy cue with megaphones that amplified recorded messages that called Trump's supporters "idiots and a**holes." I heard a little girl, one of many young children in line, ask her mom, "What is that man saying?" I never heard a discouraging word from a Trump backer; the only hate came from those

a sign that read, without asterisks, "F**k Trump – Vote for Hillary."

Clinton: One man quietly held signs saying "BILLARY IS A FRAUD" and "STILL LIKE OIL WARS?" No pro-Trump protesters were spotted.

Warm-Up Speakers

Trump: Former Congressman Doug Ose and Scott O'Grady, the U.S. Air Force pilot who was shot down over war-torn Bosnia and survived by hiding alone in the woods for seven days in June of 1995 before being saved by American forces.

Clinton: Congresspeople Doris Matsui and John Garamendi, Sacramento Mayor Kevin Johnson and his successor, Darrell Steinberg. A new graduate of St. Francis High School, a private institution with yearly tuition of \$17,000, declared Clinton as "the voice of the little people" before telling the audience that she's bound for Santa Clara University, where tuition is \$43,000. Service Employees International Union Local 1000 President Yvonne Walker also spoke, telling the mixed-gender crowd, "If you want to get

barbs Trump would get if he ever said, "If you want to get things done, always go with a man." Last I checked Clinton hadn't disavowed Walker's sexist comment and no men's group has asked for the union leader's resignation.

Patriotism

Trump: An advance speaker led the crowd in the Pledge of Allegiance, which

the thousands did to a large American flag hung especially for the event on the inside back wall of the hanger. Live and recorded patriotic music played for hours before Trump's dramatic arrival by personal jet.

Clinton: No Pledge of Allegiance, no patriotic music, but Mayor Johnson led the crowd in a chant: "... One state, no sweat; two states all set; three states she's our bet; California, better yet!"

Veteran Support

Trump: Two rows of seats at the very front were reserved for veterans. Waiting for them on their chairs were a Trump sign and T-shirt. Once seated, they were offered cold water by volunteers. During the rally they were also recognized for their service.


Clinton: Clinton asked if any veterans were in the crowd

Trump: Besides what was held up by the confrontational and oftentimes vulgar anti-Trump protesters, seen among the crowd were posters that read, "LATINOS 4 TRUMP" and "FBI INDICT CROOKED HILLARY.³

Clinton: Homemade signs were not allowed per Hillary for America rules on the invitation and at the door. However, dozens of campaign-made posters written in red, white and blue paint were handed out by Clinton's staff to members of the crowd standing on risers behind the stage. Campaign staff seemed to match each poster to a desired demographic; e.g., an "I'M WITH HER!" sign went to a man, another reading "RISE TOGETHER" went to a woman. Two young girls behind the podium, perfectly positioned for the cameras, were handed a poster that said "FIGHTING FOR US." Moments later a staffer took that sign away from the girls and gave it to a man three rows up. Based on how choreographed the sign distribution and people placing were, I wouldn't be surprised if someone was concerned about children condoning any type of "fighting."

Despite the hours of investment and standing like veal calves with virtually no mobilization once inside the baking venues, I'd do it all again. And with Clinton's double-digit lead narrowing in the California polls, chances are good that both major candidates will return to the Sacramento area before the November general election. When they do, the sparks will surely fly and I'll be there to see them six hours early.

More than one hundred Rancho Cordova high school graduates will attend their first year of Folsom Lake College free of charge, thanks to the Folsom Lake College/Rancho Cordova College Promise, an innovative grant program recently launched by Folsom Lake College, the Folsom Lake College Foundation, and the City of Rancho Cordova.

Designed to improve access to higher education and degree completion for Rancho Cordova residents, the "Promise" program encourages local high school seniors to further their education and reach their academic goals. This program, the first of its kind in the region, will provide the first year fee-free for any 2016-17 high school graduate who is a Rancho Cordova resident and enrolls in Folsom Lake College full-time for the fall semester of 2017. Eligible students will receive funding that can be applied toward tuition and fees, textbooks, or transportation.

"By partnering with the Rancho Cordova City Council and supportive local businesses, Folsom Lake College can increase access to postsecondary education, which means a well-educated workforce, and one that will inevitably advance the regional economy," said Folsom Lake College President Dr. Rachel Rosenthal.

Modeled after the Long Beach and Ventura College Promise programs, studies have identified

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - that similar programs result in improved student performance and degree/certificate achievement rates as compared to non-Promise students. According to Dr. Rachel Rosenthal, "The findings indicate that Promise students stay in school after their first year at double the rate of non-Promise students. They also are more likely to remain in the local community after graduation. This is truly an investment in our community."

"The FLC/Rancho Cordova College Promise program exemplifies Los Rios Community College District's commitment to providing high quality public higher education where our students live, as outlined in our 2001 plan, 'Educating a Region,' that first planted the seed for the Rancho Cordova Center. We hope to see this unique program flourish and replicated throughout the region," said Los Rios Chancellor Dr. Brian King.

Folsom Lake College has operated for more than 40 years out of several locations in the area. In October 2015, the first permanent location of the Rancho Cordova Center opened, at the corner of Mather Field Rd./Paseo Dr. and Folsom Blvd., and currently serves as an educational hub for this close knit and diverse community. "Many of our students do not have the financial means to attend college," said Rancho Cordova Center Dean Brian Robinson. "The new Promise program will help remove some of those economic barriers."

The Rancho Cordova City Council voted unanimously in support of the program by allocating \$100,000 from the Measure H Community Enhancement Fund. "The Promise program is an innovative way to continue making Rancho Cordova a vibrant community that values education, opportunity, and partnerships," said Rancho Cordova Mayor David Sander. "Rancho Cordova high school seniors have been given a superior opportunity to attend a state-of-the-art college in their hometown and in the midst of potential employers." The Community Enhancement Fund is funded by Measure H, a ¹/₂ cent local sales tax measure that was approved by Rancho Cordova citizens in November 2014 and provides locally-controlled funds for local priorities. The City awarded approximately \$1.8 million in community grants for Fiscal Year 2016/2017.

This project will be implemented in partnership with the Folsom Cordova Unified School District and will include a corporate matching program with initial commitments from Safe Credit Union, VSP Global, and Dignity Health.

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

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Berryhill Flex-Work Week Legislation Defeated in Senate Labor Committee



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Tom Berryhill (R-Twain Harte) announced the defeat, once again, of the California Workplace Flexibility Act. Senate Bill 985, introduced by Berryhill and Senator Patricia Bates (R-Laguna Niguel), is similar to previous workplace flexibility measures defeated in the Senate Labor Committee.

One June 22nd, 2016 the Senate Labor and Industrial Relations defeated SB 985 on a party line vote despite testimony from multiple employers and Human Resource experts that the current system does not give employees and employers the flexibility to devise flexible work schedules.

"As Yogi Berra said, 'It's like déjà vu all over again.' I keep bringing this measure up because there is a problem in our labor law that the Legislature is ignoring. Current law does not allow for some workers to easily make scheduling changes. It is ridiculous that the Legislature refuses to acknowledge this problem and accommodate the needs of our workforce" stated Senator Tom Berryhill (R-Twain Harte)

Under federal law, in California's bordering states, and in nearly every other state except California, it is simple for employers and employees to adopt "alternative workweeks" such as 4-10's, or 3 -12's. Working a four-day workweek can provide for up to 50 extra

days off each year for the average full-time employee. In California, however, the system is complicated, and requires employers to jump through multiple hoops designed to stymie any flexibility. Ultimately this process discourages any possibility of choosing schedule options such as flextime, parttime, job sharing, telecommuting and compressed workweeks.

Current law does not allow for some workers to easily make scheduling changes. It is ridiculous that the Legislature refuses to acknowledge this problem. Tom Berryhill, Senator (R-Twain Harte)

"In a world where many Californians work outside the confines of a 9 to 5 world, it's disappointing that the majority party preferred to maintain the outdated status quo. Despite today's vote, we will continue to support workers who want to achieve a better life/work balance and help the environment. Our economy needs labor laws that reflect the changing reality of work", said Senator Patricia Bates (R-Laguna Niguel), who is a joint author of SB 985.

Employment The Development Department estimates only 2% of the state's employers are currently utilizing the alternative workweek schedule option.

"Statistically it is ludicrous to believe only 2% of California's workers ever need to adjust their schedule to care of a sick loved one, an ailing parent or have a personal situation requiring flexibility. That statistic alone tells the story. SB 985 should fall under the category of improving the lives or our workers and keeps our employers competitive with our neighboring states", Berryhill said.

a five-year pilot project giving employees and employers the ability to adopt a mutually agreeable alternative workweek schedule.

Surveys have shown the biggest threat to an organizations' success is attracting and retaining the best employees. HR professionals believe the best way to recruit good talent is to provide flexibility in the workplace.

"Employees consistently cite increased workplace flexibility as the most desired benefit, including above additional compensation. SB 985 would have fixed an anomaly in the Labor Code and provided increased flexibility to hard-working Californians. Unfortunately, the unions once again denied individual private sector employees greater control over their worklife balance, even though SB985 specifically exempted unionized work forces and even though these unions provide to their members the same benefit they hope to deny to private sector employees. We applaud Senator Berryhill for his leadership in trying to provide much desired work-life balance to California employees through this sensible reform" said Michael Kalt, Government Affairs Director, California Society for Human Resource Management

The measure is supported by a broad pro-business coalition, including: California Chamber of Commerce, California Retailers Association, California League of Food Processors, Society for Human Resource Management, and the California Manufacturers and Technology.

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



How can I stop this pattern? -Renee

Dear Renee,

This is not a healthy situation for anyone involved. By consistently giving or loaning your parents money, you've lost respect for them in the process. The relationship has become strained, and that's a tough thing for anyone to deal with — especially in a parent-child situation. On top of all that, your mom sounds like a travel agent for guilt trips. It seems like she's working you over while implying it's all really for God. That's toxic.

Going into the ministry is an admirable thing. However, I remember a guy in the Bible named Paul who made tents while he conducted his ministry. I'm

paraphrasing, of course, but his line was something like, "If you don't work, you don't eat." He had a job, remember? So, suggesting that someone work outside the ministry while trying to do God's

work isn't mean or unfair. No one should do this to their child, and it's going to be hard to unravel it all and turn it into a respectable situation. I hope everyone will consider sitting down with a mature third party, and developing a situation where you're no longer giving or lending them money.



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

Are you looking to start a news business? Maybe you want to turn a hobby into a payday. But money is scarce, right? Well, I spoke with Roberto Fiebig, President and CEO of Tigre Capital on POPPOFF, and he shared six effective way to raise money for your venture.

- 1) HOW MUCH CAPITAL DO I NEED? Although many resources provide information on starting a business with little or no money in the bank, remember that if something sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Don't be misled by the popular literature. Having little or no capital is a primary reason why businesses fail.
- 2) HOW DO I RAISE NEW CAPITAL? The most common source of startup capital is the business owner him or herself in the form of credit card advances, home equity loans, and loans from family members. Federal and state governments sponsor numerous subsidized loans and grants for startups through the Small Business Administration and its counterparts on the state level.

3) WHAT IS THE VALUE OF MY **COMPANY?** The value of a company is important because it is the basis for determining the "cost" of the new capital when seeking equity additions to the capital structure. Simply explained, a company with a \$1 million valuation and no debt seeking a new capital of \$1 million would be worth \$2 million after the investment. The old owners would own 50% of the new \$2 million company (for their contribution of the old company with a \$1 million value), while the new investors would also own 50% interest for their contribution of \$1 million cash.

4) WHO MIGHT BE INTERESTED IN INVESTING IN MY **COMPANY?** As the amount of the funds needed increases, you will be required to access an increasingly sophisticated investor seeking maximum return for assuming the risk of a new venture. Family and friends are typically the first group sought by business owners seeking capital. They are less discriminating than professional investors, and are more likely to invest due to the relationship than the economics of the business proposal. On the other hand, family investors bring their own set of problems, including the possibility of strained relations if the investment fails.

5) WHAT ARE MY LEGAL **RESPONSIBILITIES TO POTENTIAL INVESTORS?** Generally, business owners seeking funds from individual investors are required to provide forms and specific factual information in understandable language to potential investors so they have the ability to evaluate the investment and determine whether it is right for them. ALIEN INVASION PACKS A BIG WALLOP FOR "INDEPENDENCE DAY"

to the modern generation of cocky flyboys. You know right away that they'll play a pivotal role in a climactic battle.

One of them is the son of Will Smith's character, the brash, hot-tempered Dylan Hiller (Jessie T. Usher), who happens to have a major beef with hotshot fellow pilot and former with drilling to the Earth's center in order to tap into the vital power source of the molten core.

The interesting thing about the aliens is that they are hideous-looking creatures, even more horrific than what might have emanated from the fevered mind of surrealist artist H.R. Giger had he been inclined to expand on the work he did for the "Alien" franchise.

Moviegoers aren't coming to "Independence Day: Resurgence" to admire the set design or the artistic creation of the alien creatures. Action is what is needed, and that's what director Roland Emmerich is committed to delivering.

There's nothing particularly



to have been crafted with the erudite dialogue of a "Masterpiece Theatre" production, are not the intended audience for "Independence Day: Resurgence" and probably should stay home to watch PBS.

But no, many of them will actually venture forth to the multiplex if only so that they may vent their frustrations with director Roland Emmerich's passion for global destruction, and then write a column disparaging the public appetite for this type of summer blockbuster.

As the sequel to "Independence Day" twenty years later, this new adventure may not add much to the pantheon of cinematic annihilation of the Earth. Only recently the capital of Great Britain was leveled in "London Has Fallen" and every so often a "Godzilla" film destroys Tokyo.

Not surprisingly, a disaster film that builds upon the premise that the next alien invasion will be bigger and badder must actually deliver the goods. For starters, several key nations have banded together to colonize the moon with a military base to fight aliens.

One of the heroes of the 1996 battle with the aliens was President Whitmore (Bill Pullman). Now out of office, the former commander-in- chief is seen as a little worse for the wear physically. On top of that, he's haunted by chilling nightmares of a pending alien invasion.

The former president is not alone in having terrible dreams of impending doom. Just now coming out of two decades in a coma is alien expert Dr. Brakish Okun (Brent Spiner), and he's also haunted by similar dreams.

On the lunar military outpost, training exercises are always underway as we get introduced best friend Jake Morrison (Liam Hemsworth).

Meanwhile, Jake's girlfriend is none other than the feisty, pretty daughter (Maika Monroe) of former President Whitmore, and because she's also a trained fighter pilot her role is more than just window-dressing.

Jake's co-pilot Charlie (Travis Tope) is smitten with Chinese pilot Rain Lao (Angelababy), the daughter of the stern high-ranking military officer Commander Jiang (Chin Han).

Combat missions may provide Charlie the chance to swoon over the attractive fellow soldier, but his primary role seems to be exchanging wisecracks with Jake so that much needed comic relief is introduced during the midst of tense action scenes.

While the young may be the bright future of intergalactic warfare, the aging veterans of the first alien war still have major roles. Jeff Goldblum returns as scientist David Levinson, and his meddling father (Judd Hirsch) saves a busload of kids.

As another alien attack is imminent, the only saving grace is that the military leaders have adapted alien technology into their weapons systems. But then, the aliens, under the command of a Queen living in a fortified hive, are even more sophisticated in warfare.

Devastation to Earth is inevitable given that the alien warship now looming in the skies is 3,000 miles wide, a virtual floating continent capable of wiping out entire cities with an ease that even Godzilla would envy.

When not lifting cities into the air only to drop them back down elsewhere, the massive alien spaceship busies itself bright or intellectually stimulating about this sequel, but then, who really cares?

It's all about the thrills of global destruction, and boy, there is plenty of that with entire cities destroyed in the full glory of spectacular visual effects.

"Independence Day: Resurgence" is a rousing salute to fighting back to repel the alien invaders. This is actionfueled summer blockbuster entertainment as it is meant to be: simple fun with lots of thrills, explosions and excitement.



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
