

A Collection of Critters on Canvas

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - "Critters" is the theme for the second art exhibit of the year at Rancho Cordova City Hall. The exhibit, which depicts a variety of living creatures, welcomed all human creatures for the artists' reception on Thursday, April 14th. The exhibit will be available to view at City Hall from through July 16th.

City Hall shows are juried. For Critters, prize-winning artist Sandra Lindblad served as the single juror. In a juried show, submissions are evaluated by a judge or a panel of judges who decide which works of art will be admitted and which will not. Lindblad is from Grass Valley and her work as an animal portrait artist made her a natural choice to jury this show.

Out of the 126 artworks considered, Lindblad selected 101 pieces by a total of 55 different artists. The submissions covered a wide range of skill and expertise. "There were paintings that were definitely exceptional," Lindblad said. "Then there were some pieces in there that the artist needed to work on their craftsmanship a bit more, they were just starting out." As far as rules for selection, Lindblad said the only hard and fast rule was that the work had to show some sort of living creature.

A jurist looks for craftsmanship, presentation, design, value, and color, and sees how the artist handles the medium. All of those criteria are important and Lindblad contrasted it with what she called a "schlock job," one in which, for example, frames might be in bad shape, mat discolored, or craftsmanship appears to be seriously inadequate. In addition, in any show with limited space, including this one, some works cannot be included because of lack of space, or because an

artist submitted multiple works and other worthy artists need to have a turn.

There were some works that Lindblad would consider favorites. In any group of artwork, Lindblad said, "the favorite ones would be such as when you walk into a room and your eye just goes to that. Then you look around and your eye goes back to that."

Lindblad has created art all of her life, and has two Bachelors of Fine Arts from the Art Academy University in San Francisco. She has recently juried a show featuring animals for the Sacramento Center of Fine Arts and currently has paintings in two international shows. Her artwork has won prizes including a \$500 award

CRPD Passes Resolution, City Withdraws Offer of Funding

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At a Special Meeting called by the Cordova Recreation and Park District Board of Directors the District outlined the chief details of their Resolution 15/16-47 concerning the Cordova Community Pool Renovation, and listened to timed comments by Rancho Cordova City Manager Cyrus Abhar, City Attorney Adam Lindgren, and interested citizens Dan Lynch, Mary Nesel, Joyce Higdon, and Susan Roa.

Public notice of the meeting on Sunday evening at 5 p.m. met the legally required advance notice for Special Meetings of 24 hours, and included a copy of the resolution, which was made available at the meeting as well. Mayor David Sander and Vice Mayor Donald Terry responded with a letter that was also distributed at the meeting. Due to the short notice and the fact that

four city council members were out of town on Monday the representatives for the City were City Manager Cyrus Abhar and the City Attorney. The meeting was convened at 5:30 p.m., Monday, April 11th, at the Hagan Community Center on Chase Drive.

The result of the resolution was, in effect, that the District would proceed with the pool renovation without further negotiation and outlined the processes they would follow. Bob Thurbon, District counsel, presented the broad details of the resolution, which Board members said provided an answer for each of the deal points the City had requested in March.

The City did not agree that their points had been met with the resolution, and the Mayor and Vice Mayor's letter stated the following. "If CRPD decides to move forward with the process as proposed by their staff, we will be recommending to the City Council that the City formally withdraw its current offer of funding and direct staff to

not consider any future funding requests for this project."

All District Board members were present at the meeting: Chairperson Rick Sloan, Vice Chairperson Terri Leimbach, and

members Inez Reyes, Michael Yearwood, and Brian Danzl. The resolution was passed unanimously.

Leimbach said that the resolution answered the City's requirements. "They had every right to say, 'Listen we can't guarantee you funding until we see a new design and bid process,' and so the District said, 'Okay, we will do that.'"

District Administrator Jim Rodems felt that the Board made the right decision, saying that the City said they would be able to come to an agreement in 30 days. "We gave them a significant amount of time beyond that and we just couldn't come to an agreement," Rodems said. "I think the Board felt they needed to move on this project, it's been held up long enough."

Previous two-by-two meetings of two District Board members—two City Council members, and members of their respective staffs—had resulted in an impasse in

Book Talk With Local Author

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Under pen name Heidi Schussman, Rancho Cordova resident Heidi Gilbert has recently published her second novel, “El Tiburon,” a drug trafficking conspiracy story set in Guatemala. She will talk about this and her first novel, “Counterpart,” at the Rancho Cordova Library’s Book Talk taking place from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m., Saturday, April 23rd. The library is at 9845 Folsom Blvd. in Sacramento.

Schussman’s novels follow the relationship and lives of African American/Japanese doctor Janet (Sport) Warrick and CIA agent Sean McGee. Both books are in the genre of political conspiracy thrillers, though the publisher of “El Tiburon” classified the book as an ethnic romance.

“The thing that’s fun about them calling it a romance is that they are a married couple,” Schussman said. “It’s nice that they recognize that as still being a romance.”

Schussman’s father and nephew are police officers, her niece is a medical board investigator, and another nephew is a DOJ undercover agent, which gives her an inroad to information on crime. She herself spends time on the gun range. She and husband, Joe Gilbert, travel four to six weeks each year, and spend most of their time interacting with people in the countries they visit. “It’s not like a tour, it’s very real,” Schussman said. The couple made two extended trips to Guatemala in the past.

The book also goes extensively into a community of people that survive by living in the garbage dumps in Guatemala City. Around 11,000 people, 6,000 of whom are children, live off the food and by selling recyclables and other things that they find.

“It’s not uncommon, but it’s horrible,” Schussman said. “The people there are called Guajeros and the Guatemalans hate them.”

In this book, however, they are the heroes, shielding Sport when she escapes from the drug cartel, and saving her life.

In her day job, Schussman is a physical therapist and director of rehab for a skilled nursing facility at Gramercy Court in Sacramento. She and her husband are both alumni of Cordova High School and have been married for 28 years.

Schussman introduces a lot of factual information in her books. “I really feel strongly that you should come away from a book edified, you should come away from it with new knowledge,” Schussman said.

Joe Gilbert said he’s very proud of his wife, explaining that it takes a lot to write a book. Not only does she do a good job on the book, but she is ready to do whatever is necessary to see the work published.

“I don’t know how many people are out there who are authors, who maybe have great material, but they just don’t have the follow-through,” Joe Gilbert said. “Heidi’s one of those people if she wants something she’s willing to do the work that it takes to get it, and she’s not afraid of that.”

Although he has always been impressed with his wife’s writing, Joe Gilbert said that he is always glad to hear from so many people that they agree.

“El Tiburon is about an area that she and Joe visit often,” said Bob Cashatt of Rancho Cordova. “Her back story is realistic and she obviously researches her subject. I do think that she has a future as a writer.” Cashatt worked in military intelligence himself before his retirement.

Al Rogel, the 2016 Rancho Cordova Volunteer of the Year, said that Schussman gave him a copy of “El Tiburon” at the January celebration of his 90th birthday.

“It’s amazing the amount of crime between Mexico and America, and other countries [in Central America],” Rogel said. “It’s just unbelievable, but it exists, and her book covers it pretty well. I read a lot of books and this one is certainly unique. It’s a pretty exciting little book.”

Schussman is now working on a novel set in Costa Rica and Nicaragua. The working title is “Pirates.” Release date for that book is currently unknown. ★

CHP Officer Critically Injured After Assault With a Vehicle

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On April 7th, 2016, at approximately 1:05 pm, North Sacramento CHP Motorcycle Officer Michael Ericson encountered a 2001 Ford F350 pickup truck in the center divider of westbound Interstate 80, east of Madison Ave. The driver intentionally assaulted Officer Ericson with the 2001 Ford F350 pickup truck and fled the scene.

The pickup truck was abandoned in a construction zone westbound I-80, near Northgate Boulevard where a second pickup truck was stolen. The driver again fled westbound I-80 where CHP officers located and initiated a pursuit of the stolen pickup truck. As the pursuit traveled through Solano County, CHP deployed a spike strip disabling a rear tire. The suspect stopped the stolen pickup truck on westbound I-80, east of Lyon Road, where he was taken into custody by CHP.

The suspect was identified as Austin Barry Scott, 28 years of age, of Reno, Nevada. He was transported by ambulance to the North Bay Medical Center. Scott exhibited the symptoms of drug intoxication at the time of the arrest. It was determined the 2001 Ford pickup truck, used in the assault on Officer Ericson, was reported stolen in Reno, NV on 4/7/2016. Following a medical clearance, Scott was transported for questioning by investigators and subsequently booked into Sacramento County Jail on the following charges:

- P.C. 664/187 – Attempted Murder
- P.C. 245 – Assault With a Deadly Weapon

- V.C. 2800.2 – Evading Arrest
- P.C. 496d– Possession of Stolen Vehicle(s)
- V.C. 10851(A) – Vehicle Theft
- V.C. 23153(E) – Driving Under the Influence of Drugs

As a result of this assault, Officer Ericson sustained major injuries and was transported by air ambulance to U.C. Davis Medical Center. At this time, he is in critical condition. Officer Ericson is a 17 year veteran of the CHP. He has worked in San Francisco, Napa, Solano, and North Sacramento. He has been assigned to the North Sacramento Office for the past 6

years. Officer Ericson is a U.S. Marine veteran. He is engaged to be married and has two sons.

A Statement from Officer Ericson’s Family:

“We would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone for the outpouring of support in light of this horrible attack. The amount of support we have received has been overwhelming and very much appreciated. Thank you all for your compassion and love that you have expressed for Mike. All of the support makes a time like this easier and we know it will help Mike heal faster and make a full recovery. Thank you.”

Officer Ericson remains in critical, but stable, condition.

“We have a long history of working collaboratively on many projects together,” Abhar said. He expressed the City’s “deep sense of frustration and regret that CRPD did not provide for adequate public process and public input and public debate over such an important decision. We are clearly very puzzled about the urgency of this action tonight and why it had to happen tonight, and why it couldn’t happen next Wednesday when they have the regular Board meeting.” ★

Workshop Celebrates Fair Housing Month

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - April is Fair Housing Month, and marks the 48th anniversary of the Fair Housing Act, which was passed one week after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in April 1968. To help mark this date, Project Sentinel, in coordination with the Homeless Assistance Resource Team (HART) and Sacramento Self Help Housing (SSHH) is offering a Fair Housing Workshop. It will take place at 6:30 p.m., Tuesday, April 19th, at Cordova Church of Christ, 10577 Coloma Road.

Project Sentinel, headquartered in Santa Clara, was established soon after the Fair Housing Act was passed. The organization investigates complaints of housing discrimination and serves to educate both landlords and tenants about housing discrimination issues.

“Individuals who experience discrimination, that’s a great injury that tends to stay with them for most of their lives,” said Catherine Bonanno, fair housing coordinator for Project Sentinel. “There are many studies on how it affects children. An informed population can help to make sure that housing discrimination is no longer occurring in our community.”

Karen Edwards, one of the coordinators of the Rancho Cordova HART, said that speakers at the workshop will include an attorney who specializes in fair housing as well as representatives from the Renters Helpline that is run by SSHH.

“We have a great opportunity here to encourage and help those with housing challenges,” Edwards said. “And for all of us, knowing about fair housing will inform how we continue to help those in Rancho Cordova who may be facing homelessness.”

One of the subjects being

touched upon at the workshop is a new monitoring program from HUD called Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing. “This is a great opportunity for members of the community to really be heard about issues that they’re facing in their community,” Bonanno said. “It will give us the opportunity to inform the community about how they can be involved in this process and really make it a comprehensive report so that, in the end, the federal government will hear what is needed in the Sacramento area and all the minds put together hopefully can find some ways really to achieve more fair housing and, in addition, more equal access in our communities.”

Lauren Juskelis of San Diego is on a one-year-program with Americorps VISTA working with Community Outreach Coordinator Ken Bennett at SSHH. Juskelis graduated in economics from Colorado College in Colorado Springs.

“The event is not only open to you if you rent an apartment, it’s not only open to you if you’re struggling, it’s not only open to you if you’re a landlord,” Juskelis said. “We really encourage everyone to come because, who knows, you might meet someone someday who has a question about their rights. I think the more well educated everyone is, the better off we all are.”

City staff will review each application according to the application criteria and prioritization method listed within the Fiscal Year 2016/2017 Grant Application Process and Criteria document.

The City anticipates the initial ranking will be distributed with the agenda for the April 18th, 2016 Regular City Council meeting. If you aren’t signed up to receive automatic

notifications when council meeting agendas are posted, you can do that by visiting www.CityOfRanchoCordova.org and selecting “E-Notification” in the top toolbar. During this meeting, the City anticipates that applicants will not be asked to present. The City intends to cover the results of staff’s initial review of applications.

At the May 2nd, 2016 and May 16th, 2016 Regular City Council meetings, the City may invite applicants to present their project and may make selection recommendations to Council. It’s possible that funding decisions could be made as soon as June

6th, 2016. City staff intends to notify all applicants of the funding decisions made by June 30th, 2016.



And Another Thing ...

Recap of the Cap-to-Cap, and Thoughts Thereof

Last weekend and part of this week, I went to the Capitol-to-Capitol program, or, as it is also called, the “Cap-to-Cap.” This is the 46th Cap-to-Cap, quite an accomplishment for the Sacramento region. There are about 300 to 400 representatives from the six counties in the Sacramento region: Sacramento, Placer, El Dorado, Yolo, Sutter, and Placer. Some of the representatives have been going on the trip for 20 or 30 years, but I have only gone about ten times.

We have had representatives from our fair city participate in the program every year since cityhood. Some Rancho Cordovans have been able to go as members of our Chamber of Commerce, special districts, or businesses. For example, one of the businesses is Sutter Health, which helped

sponsor the 46th annual Cap-to-Cap. Many who are able to come to Washington D.C. and talk to their members of the House and the Senate are able to accomplish quite a few things. But the most important thing, in my opinion, is to get an understanding at the Congressional level of what is needed at the local level.

Someone once said, “All government is local.” Many people have used that quote, but the best I have been able to find so far is that that quote was supposedly coined by former Democratic House Speaker Tip O’Neill in the 1930s. Now whether it was Tip O’Neill who said it or not, he definitely understood that to get things accomplished for folks back home you had to understand and accept compromise. Whether it was give-and-take when buying a car, or give-and-take when getting a bill passed in Washington D.C., you will rarely get everything you want. I’ll show you what I mean by discussing the FAST Act.

FAST Act stands for: Fixing America’s Surface Transportation. It was introduced in January of 2015,

went through the House Ways and Means Committee, and was passed by the House. Then it went through the Senate Finance Committee and was passed by the Senate in July of 2015. The two houses of Congress then resolved their differences and passed the bill on December 3rd, 2015, and it was signed by the President the next day.

Now that may seem like a long time to pass a bill, but that bill covers five years — Fiscal Year 2016 to Fiscal Year 2021. Until that was passed, transportation was financed a few months at a time. So I guess Congress learned that to get something accomplished you have to compromise and resolve some of your differences. Heaven knows our highways have been in dire need of compromise by Washington D.C. for quite a while.

And another thing...even though this is an election year, let’s hope that more needed legislation can be passed by the 114th Congress (2015-2016).



Does the 'Bathroom Bill' Protect Privacy Rights? Asks the AMAC

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - North Carolina's so-called "bathroom bill" is causing quite a stir pitting defenders of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender communities against folks who think only ladies should be allowed in the Ladies' Room and only men should be allowed in the Men's Room.

"The law supposedly violates the rights of individuals with alternative sexual preferences, particularly anatomically correct men who see themselves as women and women who wish they were men. But what about the rights of the rest of us? Americans overwhelmingly seek a modicum of privacy when we need to use the toilet or take a shower or use the locker room to change into gym clothes? The way a person thinks of himself or herself sexually is not an issue. Their thoughts are theirs alone as are the thoughts of traditionalists who find it intrusive and offensive to be forced to use communal bathrooms, shower rooms, and locker rooms," according to Dan Weber, president of the Association of Mature American Citizens.

Weber said he was sad to see the amusement with which such a sensitive issue was greeted when New York Governor Andrew Cuomo banned state travel to North Carolina earlier this week in protest to the bathroom bill. "Challenging an individual's right to privacy when using a bathroom, as Mr. Cuomo is doing, is no laughing matter."

North Carolina Governor Pat McCrory insists that the law is not discriminatory. The law does not take away or infringe on anyone's rights, he said. However, he added: "Would you want a man to walk into your daughter's shower, and legally be able to do that? I happen to disagree with that."

Meanwhile, McCrory's office quickly distributed a Fact Sheet pointing out, among other things, that the law does not limit or prohibit private sector companies from adopting their own set of bathroom rules. Nor does it leave the LGBT community without protections. In addition, private businesses have the right to allow mixed use bathroom, shower, and locker facilities.

Weber believes that "them versus us" politics is behind the fuss. After all, why have the CEOs of major companies doing business in North Carolina banded together to



challenge the law. In fact, 80 companies including Charlotte, NC-based Bank of America, Apple, Google, Facebook, and PayPal, for example, signed a somewhat threatening letter hoping to put economic pressure on the state. Why would they take such a high-profile stance since the law does not impose any new rules on their businesses? They are free to set their own bathroom policies as they see fit.

So, why was the law passed in the first place? According to the Governor's Fact Sheet: "The bill was passed after the Charlotte City Council voted to impose a regulation requiring businesses

to allow a man into a woman's restroom, shower, or locker room if they choose. This ordinance would have eliminated the basic expectations of privacy people have when using the rest room by allowing people to use the restroom of their choice. This new local regulation brought up serious privacy concerns by parents, businesses, and others across the state, as well as safety concerns that this new local rule could be used by people who would take advantage of this to do harm to others."

Disney’s Latest ‘Jungle Book’ an Instant Classic

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - If it was paid to just an animated Disney classic, respect from the new live-action adaptation of “The Jungle Book” would be impressive enough. But under the tender, loving care of director Jon Favreau (“Elf,” “Iron Man”), the latest remake procreated by Walt Disney’s golden vault generously hands out nods of admiration and deference to other source materials.

Foremost is Rudyard Kipling’s cherished collection of stories. Dating back to 1893, these tales introduced readers to the adventures of Mowgli, an abandoned “man-cub” who is raised by wolves in the Indian jungle. Secondly are the countless species of animals that adhere to what the Bombay-born English writer called the “law of the jungle,” a general moral code to maintain order in the wild.

Innumerable as adaptations of the Indian jungle-set adventure are, film-wise as early as 1942, the world should make room for at least one more. The blend of CGI animals and landscapes with a real-life Mowgli (newcomer Neel Sethi, the film’s only non-animated character) is not only seamless, but the fact that the entire movie was “filmed in downtown Los Angeles,” as a title card at the close of the end credits reads, makes this wildly entertaining, fast-paced picture even more astounding.

Fans of Disney’s beloved 1967 animated treasure should rejoice; the new iteration isn’t one of those cash cow-exploiting modernizations, but a high-tech homage to the family movie that gave us such classic tunes as “The Bare Necessities,” “Trust in Me,” and

“I Wan’na Be Like You.” In fact, each of those songs is dusted off in one fashion or another — maybe not as magically and comically as when fun-loving Phil Harris, slithering Sterling Holloway and swinging Louis Prima lent their pipes, but Bill Murray, Scarlett Johansson, and Christopher Walken fit in nicely for a darker, more realistic version right for these times.

Perhaps “The Jungle Book” (opened April 15th) can thank “The Lion King” for preparing audiences for a less-silly version of what we grew up with. A flashback of when Mowgli becomes orphaned at the claws of merciless Bengal tiger Shere Khan (Idris Elba) is similar in nature to

when Simba loses his dad Mufasa in that other jungle-set Disney movie. But scarier run-ins lay ahead as the sage black panther Bagheera (Ben Kingsley) guides a reluctant Mowgli to the “man village” to lead a more normal life now that he’s 10-years-old and, more importantly, is on top of Shere Khan’s hit list. This rendering of King Louie, the self-proclaimed “jungle VIP,” is also more foreboding this go-around as a Bornean orangutan-resembling Gigantopithecus (picture a Tang-colored King Kong) deliciously voiced by Walken playing up his off-kilter, New York tough guy speech pattern. 4 ½ of 5 Stars. ★

For Once in Your Life, Dream Big

Imagine that you have made it. You are on the pitcher’s mound making your Major League debut before a packed house facing your team’s archrival.

You have been pitching since you were a young boy with this as your dream, and at one point you thought you might never pitch again.

A ligament in your right arm failed you and reconstructive Tommy John surgery derailed your hopes and career path a couple of seasons ago. But you have worked so hard to make it all the way back and now you are here --- in the Big Leagues.

Twenty-one members of your family have traveled across the country to witness your first performance on the grand stage.

It’s going much, much better than you could ever have believed that it might. Inning after inning you’re mowing them down, allowing just three walks and not a single hit, while the defense has helped out with a couple of great plays and you’ve got a 2-0 lead. Into the eighth inning you still have a no-hitter going in your first start in the majors. Wow! Unbelievable!

You get the first hitter out but allow your fourth walk and reach the dreaded 100-pitch mark doing so. Here comes your manager to remove you from the game...

That was the scenario as it unfolded for Los Angeles Dodgers rookie Ross Stripling Friday night at AT&T Park in the opening home series for the San Francisco Giants. There’s no telling just what Stripling was thinking as first-year manager Dave Roberts strode slowly to the mound, but if that were you, you might think, “Wow! Unbelievable! How the heck can he take me out of this game right now?”

So many thoughts would race wildly through your mind...

“Get back in the dugout and let me go after this. I’ve had their number all night. Give me another batter, another fifteen pitches. I can do it. I can get a

double play and start fresh in the ninth; let’s see how it goes. My stuff is still good. I feel great. I’ve been through so much to get here and I have this chance to ... oh, c’mon...don’t take me out!”

After the game had eventually been decided in the Giants’ favor, 3-2 in the 10th inning on Brandon Crawford’s walk-off home run, Roberts defended his move with Stripling, saying it was a “no-brainer.” No kidding. What was he thinking? Even Giants fans booed when Stripling was taken out. The kid had a chance to do something that had only been done once before in MLB history, 124 years ago.

The only pitcher to hurl a no-hitter in his Major League debut was Bumpus Jones of the Cincinnati Reds in 1892. But Jones would win only one other MLB game in his short career after that. That is the sort of thing that Roberts was afraid of happening with young Stripling.

The fear of injury to an investment has made a monster out of pitch count in modern baseball. Would another 15-20 pitches for Stripling have been the cause of irreparable harm? No one will ever know. Will his early departure and the ultimate outcome of the game be the cause of irreparable mental instability going forward? We’ll have to wait and see.

As Stripling watched from the dugout in anguish, reliever Chris Hatcher took to the hill and promptly surrendered catcher Trevor Brown’s first major league homer that tied the game, 2-2, and set things up for the only other hit in the game for the Giants, Crawford’s winning blast off Joe Blanton (he’s still hanging around?).

Later, Stripling played the part of the good, young soldier, defending Roberts’ move as “the right call.” What else is the rookie going to say? The only reason Stripling even got the opportunity to start a game is because of injuries to other front-line starters. With his performance, maybe he has a chance to stick around. Is he

going to challenge the decision of his manager? No.

The game will long be remembered for what might’ve been as well as for what happened. The decision will long be debated. Was it best to protect the young pitcher’s health by removing him after 100 pitches, or should he have been given the chance to make history?

Thank goodness the Golden State Warriors did not take their cue from the Dodgers’ Roberts. The “Dubs” have been having some mighty big dreams of their own and have been chasing them relentlessly.

Among the multitude of records the defending NBA champion Warriors have chased down this remarkable season is the most sought after --- the all-time wins mark of 72 victories held by the Michael Jordan-led Chicago Bulls of 1995-96.

The Warriors tied the mark Sunday by winning on the road in their personal House of Horrors and outlasting the San Antonio Spurs, 92-86, in a high-level clash between the two top NBA powers. The Warriors pulled ahead after a rugged, low-scoring defensive battle in the first half behind 37 points from reigning MVP Steph Curry.

It was the first home loss of the season for the 65-15 Spurs. The win ended a 33-game losing streak at San Antonio for the Warriors which dated back to 1997, before Spurs star Tim Duncan was drafted. The Warriors were set to face the Memphis Grizzlies in Oakland Wednesday night in the final game of the regular season with a chance to set the all-time wins record of 73.

There also has been much debate going down the stretch run about whether or not the Warriors should be resting their star players more often in preparation for the post-season. That tactic has been implemented sparingly, because the Warriors’ players have embraced the opportunity of a lifetime to dream big and fulfill the dream. ★


