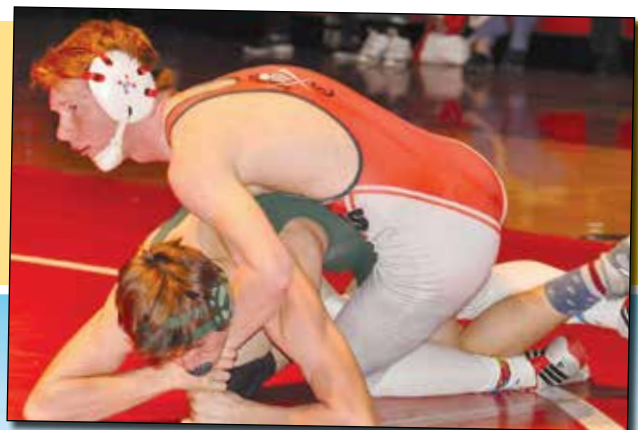

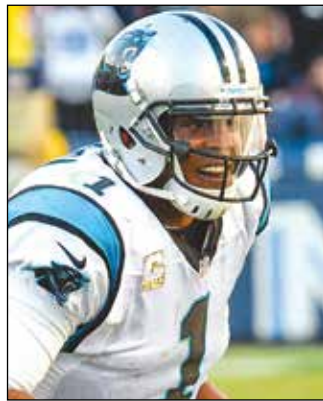

Rancho Cordova Library Opens Veterans Resource Station

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A Rancho Cordova Police Department motorcycle brigade opened the ceremonies on Jan. 29th as a full and enthusiastic crowd watched, then piled into the community meeting room to hear from library officials, community leaders, and service providers.

Rancho Cordova is the third Veterans Resource Station in the Sacramento Public Library System, joining Southgate Library and the downtown Central Library. Library Director Rivkah Sass said that the two previously opened stations have set the standard. When the State Library suggested a third, Sass didn't hesitate. "I called Jill," Sass said.

"I knew Jill Stockinger (supervisor) and the staff at the Rancho Cordova Library, as well as city officials from the City of Rancho Cordova, and the whole community, would do exactly what you're doing here this morning," Sass said. "You're here, supporting our work to support people who've done so much to keep us safe, to protect us, and to make our country stronger."

Mayor David Sander said the purpose of the incorporation of Rancho Cordova was to raise standards, create more opportunities, improve our quality of life, raise

our property values, and that pursuing these things has improved the energy and climate of cooperation in our community. "This sort of [program] came to be because someone recognized the energy here in Rancho Cordova," Sander said.

Besides the library's Rivkah Sass and Jill Stockinger, local public figures and service providers speaking at the event included County Supervisor Don Nottoli, Rancho Cordova Mayor David Sander, city council members Robert McGarvey and Linda Budge, California State Assemblyman Ken Cooley, Congressman Ami

Bera's field representative Matthew Ceccato, LINC/CalVet coordinator Bobbi Park, Volunteers of America veterans services representative Blanche Scroggins, and librarian/author James Scott.

The theme that ran through the whole event was thanks to the veterans. Ceccato presented a proclamation from Ami Bera supporting the library, the veterans, and the opening of the Veterans Resource Station. "I get to stand with leadership and government of the City of Rancho Cordova, I get to stand with the Sacramento Public Library system and we together salute our veterans," Ceccato said.

The camaraderie among the veterans attending the event was evident, as was the good will surrounding everything that occurred. "It's good to exchange stories and be amongst veterans who know how it's been to be in the trenches, that have been in war, and have gone through the bad times and the good times in the military," said veteran Omar Hernandez.

Hernandez served in the Navy, VAQ 117 Night Hawks, attached to the USS Enterprise. He found his present living quarters through the Volunteers of America.

Besides those important supportive aids to housing, employment, education, and health services, veterans can also find out more about fun things such as the Writing Workshop for Veterans coming up in March, April, and May, and a yoga class that is available without cost at the Sacramento VA Medical Center for veterans and family members.

Albert P. Rogel, veteran of World War II who served in Europe, turned 90 last December. He was glad to see the resource station open. "I'm very enthusiastic about it," Rogel said. "I'm hoping that it works out well so that I can use it, too."

The Rancho Cordova Library at 9845 Folsom Blvd., Sacramento, is open Tuesday through Saturday with hours depending on the day. For more information about the Veterans Resource Station, visit the library or e-mail veteranvolunteer@gmail.com.

It was just Groundhog Day. According to the news media, Punxsutawney Phil in Punxsutawney Pennsylvania didn't see his shadow, and according to folklore, the spring season will come early. I guess we'll see how accurate Punxsutawney Phil's prediction will be, but I don't care as long as the rainy weather keeps coming. I still have that weather rock I've talked about awhile back, and it is still pretty accurate. reservoir is at 104 percent of its average level this time of the year, while Shasta is at 76 percent, Oroville is at 66 percent, and Trinity Lake is at 40 percent. Even though the rain may come down and help everyone, man or beast, the state still wants everyone to preserve 25 percent of water again this year. I don't mind being cautious about using water and not wasting it. Funny how differently we think of water today because of the drought. Just five years ago, no one had a second thought about washing your car with water just going down the driveway. After all, there will always be lots of water. Right?

Our special workshop and the regular City Council meeting on Monday covered a lot of territory. We started with the Community Enhancement Fund Special Meeting and how great it has been to help many people with Measure H money that wouldn't have been possible before. We still have to wait until March 31st, 2016, before we finish the first year. And the State Board of Equalization will not give us all the figures for April 1st, 2015, to March 31st, 2016, until August of 2016. Oh well. We will have a good estimate of what we can do as we learn more efficient ways of using Measure H, or Community Enhancement Funds. Most of the checks that were handed

out last night during the City Council Meeting involved different schools and programs that needed help. It is great to be a part of a new way that our City can be of assistance to the people of Rancho Cordova.

Did you ever see how a person has left a mess behind them and just left it for someone else to clean up? Now it doesn't have to be a big mess, but not cleaning up after your little dog is really something no one else should have to do. Items like that can build up quickly if many people follow that bad example. And another thing that bugs me is when people knock things down on the floor in a store and don't have the decency to pick them up. I don't know how many millions of dollars are lost in broken merchandise in stores, but being lazy increases the cost to all of us. That happened the other day, and I decided to respond in this column.

And another thing I noticed awhile back when I was with my youngest son in his truck. I suddenly realized that road rage has been on road signs for years, and I didn't notice it. Maybe you didn't either. It looks like this, "CROSS TRAFFIC!" People get very cross while on the road.

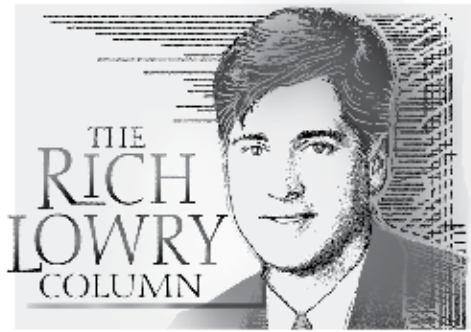
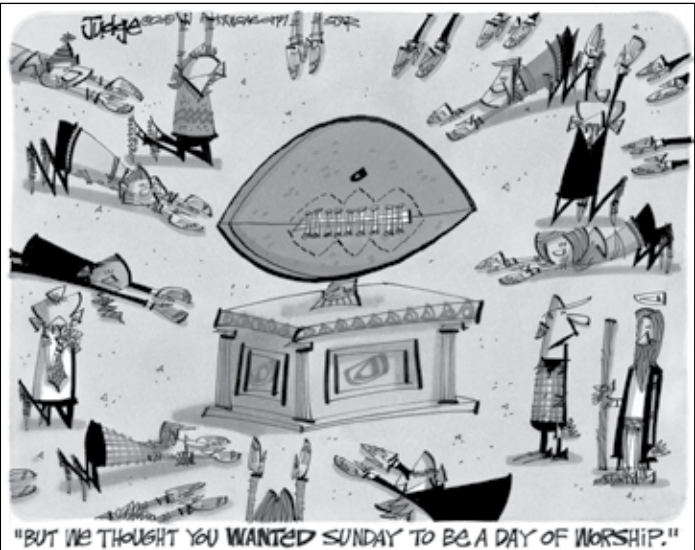

The Battle for the Soul of the Right

At the moment, the Republican establishment is relevant to the presidential-nomination battle only as an epithet.

The fight for the Republican nomination isn't so much a vicious brawl between the grass roots and the establishment as it is a bitter struggle between traditional conservatism and populism that few could have foreseen.

Conservatism has always had a populist element, encapsulated by the oft-quoted William F. Buckley Jr. line that he would rather be governed by the first 2,000 names in the Boston phone book than by the Harvard faculty. But the populism was tethered to, and in the service of, an ideology of limited-government constitutionalism.

The fight between Ted Cruz and Donald Trump is over whether that

connection will continue to exist, and whether the conservatism (as represented by Cruz) or the populism (as represented by Trump) will be ascendant. Cruz did all he could as long as possible to accommodate Trump, but now that the fight between them is out in the open, the differences are particularly stark.

Cruz is a rigorous constitutionalist. He's devoted much of his career to defending the Constitution and has argued numerous cases before the Supreme Court. Trump has certainly heard of the Constitution, but he may know even less about it than he knows about the Bible.

Although Cruz is more flexible than his reputation suggests, he has the long baseline of consistency that you would expect from a genuine believer in a political philosophy. Trump has a few long-running themes and bugaboos, but has been all over the map on almost everything and sometimes will meander from one position to another within the same answer, in keeping with his lack of ideological anchor (and limited knowledge of policy).

The two have completely different political styles. Trump is instinctual and has a roguish charm, whereas Cruz is earnest and tightly disciplined. If almost everything about Trump is unconventional, Cruz is outwardly a very traditional politician.

The irony of Cruz's position now is that, despite all his outsider branding, he is not getting savaged by the establishment. It is Trump who calls him a hypocrite and a liar. It is Trump who says he's a nasty guy and a maniac with a temperament problem. And it is Trump, of course, who constantly raises doubts about his eligibility to serve as president.

If you guessed a key event in the nomination fight would be the "othering" of the most potent tea-party conservative in the country by a billionaire businessman with a long trail of liberal positions and a history of praising President Barack Obama -- well, then, you forecast the GOP race perfectly.

In short, Cruz is under assault from a segment of the anti-establishment, although Cruz takes every opportunity to portray himself as the victim of the machinations of dastardly political insiders. The reality is that the establishment is sitting on its hands, agonizing over whom it loathes least, Trump or Cruz, while the fight between populism and conservatism rages.

The battle for the soul of the GOP is now a battle for the soul of the right.

Finicky Cats Stage Hunger Strikes

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: I'm writing in regards to your recent column about the causes of finicky eating in pets. My two cats don't like liver or the smell of liver. However, most wet cat food contains chicken or beef "byproducts," which usually means some amount of liver. If my cats smell liver in their food, they just won't eat it, and will go hungry and meow about it -- usually in the middle of the night.

By trial and error, I have found about five or six different cans they really like to eat. However, some days they gobble the food down and other days they go on a hunger strike, even with foods they liked the last time. When that happens, I pick up the bowl and smell it. Every single time it smells like liver, and I have to throw it out.

They also like variety in their wet food, although I

never have had to switch their dry food.

I wish cat food manufacturers would not add any liver at all, but almost all cat food has byproducts in it. I hope my experience helps your other readers.

Bera & Peters Urge FDA to Act to Reduce Drug Prices

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-07) and Congressman Scott Peters (CA-52) are leading a group of 29 members of Congress to urge the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to take steps to reduce the sky-rocketing costs of generic prescription drugs.

In a letter to the FDA, they ask the agency to take two common sense steps to address loopholes that limit competition that permits some drug companies to charge exorbitant prices for generic drugs.

The average wait time for a new generic drug to be approved is nearly four years. In 2014, more than 1,400 generic drug applications were filed and not one was approved. Bera and Peters are asking the FDA to expedite the review process for new generic drugs to increase

market competition. Without any competition to drive down prices, a drug company can charge an excessive amount, like in the case of Martin Shkreli and Turing Pharmaceuticals.

The letter also asks the FDA to examine its Unapproved Drugs Initiative in response to concerns that over-regulation has unintentionally increased prices. This initiative aims to ensure that all drugs on the market before FDA regulation are safe, but Bera and Peters are asking that the program focuses on drugs that pose a serious safety risk, citing the fact that the program has pushed common and long-term treatments off the market, leading to price spikes.

“Americans should be able to access quality, affordable prescription medication,” Bera said. “Competition is critical to maintaining reasonable pricing and the backlog in generic

drug applications, as well as the unintended consequences of the Unapproved Drugs Initiative, has created opportunities for some irresponsible drug companies to make a lot of money while Americans suffer. This is not acceptable. We urge the FDA to take these common sense steps to help increase competition and lower drug costs.”

“Making our generic drug approval process faster and more efficient will increase competition and provide consumers with more affordable options,” Peters said. “This is especially important to the long-term and critically ill who might be taken advantage of by companies like Turing and Valeant who choose to drive up prices because they know these patients don’t have anywhere else to turn for the medicine they need.”

A Crisis Worse Than ISIS? Bail-Ins Begin

While the mainstream media focus on ISIS extremists, a threat that has gone virtually unreported is that your life savings could be wiped out in a massive derivatives collapse. Bank bail-ins have begun in Europe, and the infrastructure is in place in the US. Poverty also kills.

At the end of November, an Italian pensioner hanged himself after his entire €100,000 savings was confiscated in a bank “rescue” scheme. He left a suicide note blaming the bank, where he had been a customer for 50 years and had invested in bank-issued bonds. But he might better have blamed the EU and the G20’s Financial Stability Board, which have imposed an “Orderly Resolution” regime that keeps insolvent banks afloat by confiscating the savings of investors and depositors. Some 130,000 shareholders and junior bond holders suffered losses in the “rescue.”

The pensioner’s bank was one of four small regional banks that had been put under special administration over the past two years. The €3.6 billion (\$3.83 billion) rescue plan launched by the Italian government uses a newly-formed National Resolution Fund, which is fed by the country’s healthy banks. But before the fund can be tapped, losses must be imposed on investors; and in January, EU rules will require that they also be imposed on depositors. According to a December 10th article on

BBC.com:

“The rescue was a ‘bail-in’—meaning bondholders suffered losses—unlike the hugely unpopular bank bailouts during the 2008 financial crisis, which cost ordinary EU taxpayers tens of billions of euros.

“Correspondents say [Italian Prime Minister] Renzi acted quickly because in January, the EU is tightening the rules on bank rescues—they will force losses on depositors holding more than €100,000, as well as bank shareholders and bondholders.

“...[L]etting the four banks fail under those new EU rules next year would have meant ‘sacrificing the money of one million savers and the jobs of nearly 6,000 people.’”

That is what is predicted for 2016: massive sacrifice of savings and jobs to prop up a “systemically risky” global banking scheme.

Bail-In Under Dodd-Frank

That is all happening in the EU. Is there reason for concern in the US?

According to former hedge fund manager Shah Gilani, writing for Money Morning, there is. In a November 30th article titled “Why I’m Closing My Bank Accounts While I Still Can,” he writes:

“[It is] entirely possible in the next banking crisis that depositors in giant too-big-to-fail failing banks could have their money confiscated and turned into equity shares....

“If your too-big-to-fail (TBTF) bank is failing because they can’t pay off derivative bets they made, and the government refuses to bail them out, under a mandate titled “Adequacy of Loss-Absorbing Capacity of Global Systemically Important Banks in Resolution,” approved on Nov. 16, 2014, by the G20’s Financial Stability Board, they can take your deposited money and turn it into shares of equity capital to try and keep your TBTF bank from failing.”

Once your money is deposited in the bank, it legally becomes the property of the bank. Gilani explains:

“Your deposited cash is an

unsecured debt obligation of your bank. It owes you that money back. If you bank with one of the country’s biggest banks, who collectively have trillions of dollars of derivatives they hold “off balance sheet” (meaning those debts aren’t recorded on banks’ GAAP balance sheets), those debt bets have a superior legal standing to your deposits and get paid back before you get any of your cash.

“Big banks got that language inserted into the 2010 Dodd-Frank law meant to rein in dangerous bank behavior.”

The banks inserted the language and the legislators signed it, without necessarily understanding it or even reading it. At over 2,300 pages and still growing, the Dodd Frank Act is currently the longest and most complicated bill ever passed by the US legislature.

Propping Up the Derivatives Scheme

Dodd-Frank states in its preamble that it will “protect the American taxpayer by ending bailouts.” But it does this under Title II by imposing the losses of insolvent financial companies on their common and preferred stockholders, debtholders, and other unsecured creditors. That includes depositors, the largest class of unsecured creditor of any bank.

Title II is aimed at “ensuring that payout to claimants is at least as much as the claimants would have received under bankruptcy liquidation.” But here’s the catch: under both the Dodd Frank Act and the 2005 Bankruptcy Act, derivative claims have super-priority over all other claims, secured and unsecured, insured and uninsured.

The over-the-counter (OTC) derivative market (the largest market for derivatives) is made up of banks and other highly sophisticated players such as hedge funds. OTC derivatives are the bets of these financial players against each other. Derivative claims are considered “secured” because collateral is posted by the parties.

For some inexplicable reason, the hard-earned money you

deposit in the bank is not considered “security” or “collateral.” It is just a loan to the bank, and you must stand in line along with the other creditors in hopes of getting it back. State and local governments must also stand in line, although their deposits are considered “secured,” since they remain junior to the derivative claims with “super-priority.”

Turning Bankruptcy on Its Head

Under the old liquidation rules, an insolvent bank was actually “liquidated”—its assets were sold off to repay depositors and creditors. Under an “orderly resolution,” the accounts of depositors and creditors are emptied to keep the insolvent bank in business. The point of an “orderly resolution” is not to make depositors and creditors whole but to prevent another system-wide “disorderly resolution” of the sort that followed the collapse of Lehman Brothers in 2008. The concern is that pulling a few of the dominoes from the fragile edifice that is our derivatives-laden global banking system will collapse the entire scheme. The sufferings of depositors and investors are just the sacrifices to be borne to maintain this highly lucrative edifice.

In a May 2013 article in Forbes titled “The Cyprus Bank ‘Bail-In’ Is Another Crony Bankster Scam,” Nathan Lewis explained the scheme like this:

“At first glance, the ‘bail-in’ resembles the normal capitalist process of liabilities restructuring that should occur when a bank becomes insolvent....

“The difference with the “bail-in” is that the order of creditor seniority is changed. In the end, it amounts to the cronies (other banks and government) and non-cronies. The cronies get 100% or more; the non-cronies, including non-interest-bearing depositors who should be super-senior, get a kick in the guts instead....

“In principle, depositors are the most senior creditors in a bank. However, that was changed in the 2005 bankruptcy law, which made derivatives liabilities most

senior. Considering the extreme levels of derivatives liabilities that many large banks have, and the opportunity to stuff any bank with derivatives liabilities in the last moment, other creditors could easily find there is nothing left for them at all.”

As of September 2014, US derivatives had a notional value of nearly \$280 trillion. A study involving the cost to taxpayers of the Dodd-Frank rollback slipped by Citibank into the “cromnibus” spending bill last December found that the rule reversal allowed banks to keep \$10 trillion in swaps trades on their books. This is money that taxpayers could be on the hook for in another bailout; and since Dodd-Frank replaces bailouts with bail-ins, it is money that creditors and depositors could now be on the hook for. Citibank is particularly vulnerable to swaps on the price of oil. Brent crude dropped from a high of \$114 per barrel in June 2014 to a low of \$36 in December 2015.

What about FDIC insurance? It covers deposits up to \$250,000, but the FDIC fund had only \$67.6 billion in it as of June 30, 2015, insuring about \$6.35 trillion in deposits. The FDIC has a credit line with the Treasury, but even that only goes to \$500 billion; and who would pay that massive loan back? The FDIC fund, too, must stand in line behind the bottomless black hole of derivatives liabilities. As Yves Smith observed in a March 2013 post:

“In the US, depositors have actually been put in a worse position than Cyprus deposit-holders, at least if they are at the big banks that play in the derivatives casino. The regulators have turned a blind eye as banks use their depositors to fund derivatives exposures....The deposits are now subject to being wiped out by a major derivatives loss.”

Even in the worst of the Great Depression bank bankruptcies, noted Nathan Lewis, creditors eventually recovered nearly all of their money. He concluded:

“When super-senior depositors have huge losses of 50% or more,

after a “bail-in” restructuring, you know that a crime was committed.”

Exiting While We Can

How can you avoid this criminal theft and keep your money safe? It may be too late to pull your savings out of the bank and stuff them under a mattress, as Shah Gilani found when he tried to withdraw a few thousand dollars from his bank. Large withdrawals are now criminally suspect.

You can move your money into one of the credit unions with their own deposit insurance protection; but credit unions and their insurance plans are also under attack. So writes Frances Coppola in a December 18th article titled “Co-operative Banking Under Attack in Europe,” discussing an insolvent Spanish credit union that was the subject of a bail-in in July 2015. When the member-investors were subsequently made whole by the credit union’s private insurance group, there were complaints that the rescue “undermined the principle of creditor bail-in”—this although the insurance fund was privately financed. Critics argued that “this still looks like a circuitous way to do what was initially planned, i.e. to avoid placing losses on private creditors.”

In short, the goal of the bail-in scheme is to place losses on private creditors. Alternatives that allow them to escape could soon be blocked.

We need to lean on our legislators to change the rules before it is too late. The Dodd Frank Act and the Bankruptcy Reform Act both need a radical overhaul, and the Glass-Steagall Act (which put a fire wall between risky investments and bank deposits) needs to be reinstated.

Meanwhile, local legislators would do well to set up some publicly-owned banks on the model of the state-owned Bank of North Dakota—banks that do not gamble in derivatives and are safe places to store our public and private funds. ★

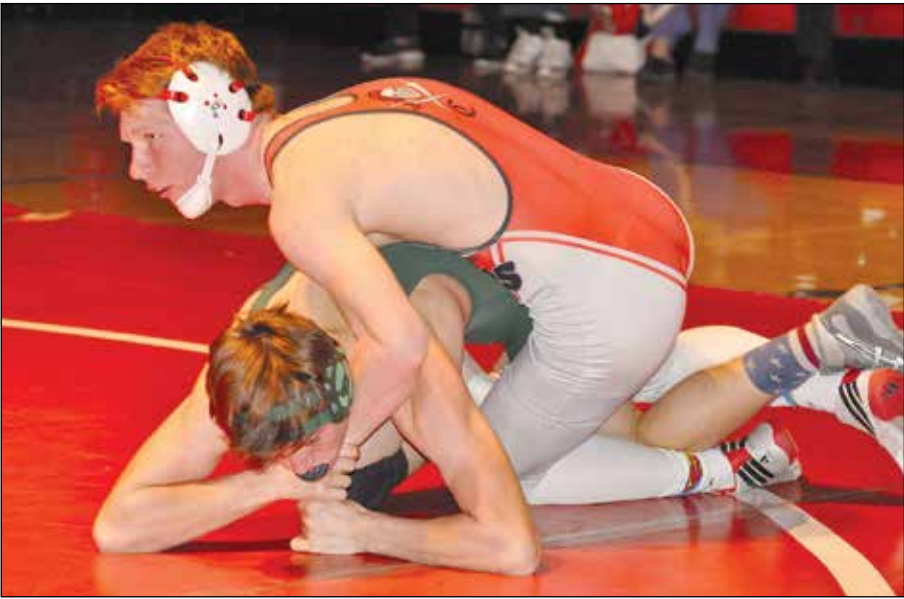

Junior Derrek Burton had a technical pin (beating his opponent 15-0) in the 132 lb. class. Winning on points were Junior Angel Frost at 126 lbs. and Junior Tyriq Seymore at 160 lbs. Sophomore David Khudateplov put in a very tough fight only to lose by a couple of point in the waning seconds.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - After finishing the first half of Sierra Valley Conference action early last week, the Cordova High School boys basketball team opened the second half against Galt at home.

The Lancers' consistent pressure on defense in the second quarter broke open a close game that led to a 64-49 win over the Warriors on January 28th. Cordova remains in second place in the SVC at 6-1 and 14-10, one game back behind first place Liberty Ranch, which is 7-0 and 24-0.

Then Cordova used a variety of zone defenses to shutdown Rosemont in the third quarter. The result was holding its visitors to four points and rallied to take a 58-32 lead.

Dressed like a million-dollar baby complete with her tiara and Miss Universe sash, recently-crowned Pia Wurtzbach (are they sure they have the right girl?) made an appearance at Super Bowl Opening Night at SAP Center in San Jose on Monday to dance around a little bit with some players from the Carolina Panthers and Denver Broncos and act like a reporter (all for a handsome price, of course).

Known in the past simply as Media Day, this prelude to the golden anniversary of the biggest game in the universe also was dressed up to the point of making it a three-hour, prime-time television show undoubtedly watched (for some inexplicable reasons) by millions. You could just order some items online: Goldie the Bear wearing a Super Bowl vest or a commemorative shopping bag for \$25; a golf towel for \$10; a polo shirt for \$32; and so on. It would almost feel like being at the game. Or, you could wait a few months and look for the stuff in the dollar bin at Target.

There also is the free Super Bowl City mob scene on the Embarcadero where you can risk getting trampled to death for the chance to view from afar an assortment of musical acts, or visit the Fan Energy Zone (if you have any energy left by the time you get there). But, if you haven't made it down there by now to get involved, you likely are going to miss out. Maybe you should plan better and start saving up for the next time Jed convinces the NFL powers-that-be to

make a return trip to San Francisco/Santa Clara.

When they do come back maybe they could be a little more creative with the attractions at Super Bowl City that the low-budget fans could enjoy. You could win a free sample of Viagra if you can throw a football through a tire. They could hold a raffle for a chance to be a video-replay official for a real game, but you must be able to flip a coin properly and to determine what is a "catch" and what is not a "catch."

How about a virtual-reality setup where fans could find out what it feels like to be hit by Ronnie Lott and Lawrence Taylor at the same time, or to be buried under a ton of scratching, clawing, stinking, sweaty, slobbering humanity and receive free concussion treatment on site. Maybe not.

PASSING THE TORCH?

Manning looking to go out on top, but Newton’s time may be now

Old-school Peyton Manning vs. new-school Cam Newton. There is plenty more to Super Bowl 50 than just the quarterback matchup, but it’s tough to avoid it.

Fair or not, how history views Manning will be largely defined on Sunday night. And while Newton has time to define his legacy beyond this Super Bowl, his many critics are just waiting for him to stumble on the big stage.

Still, this game will come down to so much more than how the quarterbacks play. For just the third time this century, both teams rank in the top six in the NFL in yards allowed. Defense may well end up ruling the day.

DENVER BRONCOS (14-4)

OFFENSE: The biggest question heading into the Super Bowl is whether or not Peyton Manning has one more decent game in him. The days of him carrying a team are long gone; the Broncos just need him not to kill them. In his first nine starts this season, Manning threw 17 interceptions. Denver went 7-2 in those games in spite of him. Since returning during the second half of the regular season finale, Manning has not thrown a pick in 78 attempts, and obviously Denver has not lost. The Broncos may not be winning because of him, but at least he’s not making it harder on them.

Thing is, Denver is not winning because of its running game either — at least not in the postseason. The Broncos are averaging 108 yards rushing in the playoffs, which is just about where they were during the regular season (107.4, 17th in the NFL). In fact, that average appears to be a magic number for them: When the Broncos have rushed for more than 108 yards, they are 9-0. When they rush for fewer, they are 5-4. Before winning with just 99 rushing yards in the AFC title game, Denver had not won a game with a below-average rushing attack since Oct. 11. Getting to 108 won’t be easy: Carolina ranked fourth in the NFL against the run this season, allowing just 88.4 yards per game.

DEFENSE: At first glance, it looks as if the defense must force at least a couple turnovers for the Broncos to win. For one thing, the offense may need a short field to score points. More importantly, Denver is 13-1 when it forces even one turnover and 1-3 when it fails to take the ball away.

But it would be a mistake to think that this is a defense that lives and dies by the big play. The Broncos allowed the fewest yards in the NFL during the regular season (283.1 per game), and led the league in both pass defense (199.6 yards per game) and yards allowed per rush (3.3). Against Aaron Rodgers and the Packers in November, Denver had no takeaways but allowed just 140 total yards in a 29-10 win. While the turnovers and sacks (52, first in the NFL) fill the highlight reel, this is a sound defense play in and play out. Other than Ben Roethlisberger, no one has thrown for 300 yards against Denver this season, and the Broncos haven’t given up more than 120 yards rushing in a game since Week 2.

It will likely require another dominant performance to beat Cam Newton and the Panthers, but the Broncos have that kind of game in them.

COACHING: After failing to advance past the Divisional Round of the playoffs in two tries with Houston, Gary Kubiak has the Broncos in the Super Bowl in his first season in Denver. Defensive coordinator Wade

Phillips put together a great plan to stop Tom Brady and the Patriots, but he didn’t have to worry about New England running the ball. The Panthers are much more balanced and present a different challenge. He better come up with something, though: Carolina has been held under 27 points just once since September.

CAROLINA PANTHERS (17-1)

OFFENSE: Panthers quarterback Cam Newton is the NFL’s MVP in every sense of the label. While he has thrown for more yards in a season before, never has he been so dominant. His 35 touchdown passes were a career high and one off the league lead. He threw just 10 interceptions, a career low despite his most passing attempts since his rookie season. And he chipped in 636 yards and 10 touchdowns on the ground, helping Carolina to the league’s No. 2 rushing attack (142.6 yards per game). Running back Jonathan Stewart rushed for 989 yards in 13 regular season games, and he has 189 yards in the postseason so far. While he is unlikely to have a huge day against Denver’s defense, expect Stewart to get 18-20 carries to keep the Broncos’ pass rush from teeing off and set up play-action.

Newton’s favorite target by far has been tight end Greg Olsen (77 rec., 1,104 yards in the regular season). While Olsen is not as physically imposing as New England’s Rob Gronkowski, he will still pose a big challenge to the Denver defense. The Broncos are banged up at the safety spots, and Gronkowski caught eight passes for 144 yards in the AFC title game. The Panthers would like to get Ted Ginn back on track, as well. Since catching six touchdown passes over three games in December, Ginn has just three catches total in his last three games.

DEFENSE: More than Denver, Carolina thrives on turnovers. The Panthers led the NFL with 39 takeaways during the regular season and have added nine more in two postseason games. Linebacker Luke Kuechly has returned an interception for a touchdown in both of the last two games and could wreak havoc with Denver’s short passing game when he drops into coverage. Carolina has other ballhawks as well. Safety Kurt Coleman had seven interceptions during the regular season and added two more last week against the Cardinals, while Josh Norman returned two of his four picks for scores during the season.

Carolina ranked fourth in rushing yards allowed and seventh in yards per rush against during the season, but opponents often fell behind quickly and had to abandon the ground game. Opponents have attempted at least 25 rushes against the Panthers only six times this season. Five of those times, they gained at least 115 yards on the ground; the sixth time was in Carolina’s only loss. If Denver gets one-dimensional, it plays into the Panthers’ hands.

COACHING: Head coach Ron Rivera appeared to solve what was perhaps Carolina’s biggest worry in the NFC Championship Game. The Panthers escaped with victories several times despite blowing big leads during the regular season, and they nearly blew a 31-0 halftime lead in the Division Round of the playoffs. They finally put two dominant halves together against the Cardinals to earn the trip to Super Bowl 50, but maybe a close game isn’t so scary: While Denver is 11-3 in games decided by eight points or less, Carolina is 8-1.

Panthers offense vs. Broncos defense

Carolina poses a unique threat on offense. No team ran the ball more, but Cam Newton gives the running game an added dimension that defenses must respect. And selling out to stop the run is dangerous given that Newton tied for second in the NFL with 35 touchdown passes.



While Denver’s pass rush took center stage in the AFC title game against New England, the Broncos have been just as good stopping the run all season. No team gave up fewer passing yards, and Denver allowed just 3.3 yards per rush, also tops in the NFL.

Wade Phillips came up with some new looks for Tom Brady two weeks ago, and he will do the same for Newton. The Panthers will move the ball some, but they will have to work for it.

Who has the edge: Denver

Broncos offense vs. Panthers defense

No team faced more pass attempts this season than the Panthers. The trend has continued in the playoffs as opponents have run 28 times and passed 89 against Carolina. That’s what happens when you jump out to huge leads.



Denver hasn’t run the ball nearly as well as most expected coming into the season, but it’s not for a lack of trying. The Broncos are averaging more than 30 rushing attempts per game in the postseason, and that must continue for them to have a chance.

With a league-best 24 interceptions, the Panthers are a defense built to take advantage when the opponent has to throw. If Peyton Manning is forced to try to win this one with his arm, it won’t end well for the Broncos.

Who has the edge: Carolina

So who wins the game?

This has the makings of a defensive slugfest. Denver held both Ben Roethlisberger and Tom Brady under 20 points to get here. Carolina has punched both of its playoff opponents in the mouth early. The Panthers then dictated that the game be played on their terms, right into the hands of their ballhawking on defense. Something has to give.



As long as Denver takes care of the ball and stays balanced, this will be a 60-minute game. It may be Cam Newton’s time, but the Broncos are going to make him earn it. We’re betting he does.

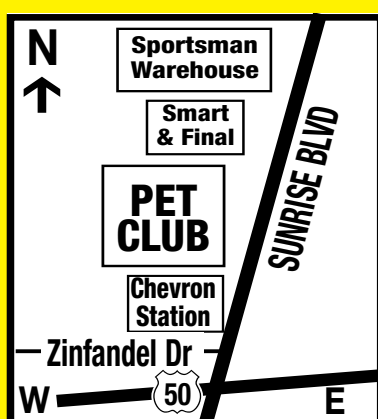
