

Bringing World Cultures into the Local Classroom

Sacramento Children's Museum Educates Students About Diversity with New Program

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is one of the most diverse communities in the Sacramento region. Time magazine has recognized Sacramento as being America's Most Diverse City. It is estimated that over eighty four languages are spoken at the local schools. Schools must be aware of this diverse population and work to develop an understanding of the perspectives of children who come from different backgrounds.

The Sacramento Children's Museum in Rancho Cordova partners with local schools to educate students about cultures around the world. The museum has

launched a new Cultural Connections On-The-Go (CCOTG) program. By providing a variety of direct experiences, through classroom hands-on activities, the Children's Museum believes that a child can learn while having fun. Their new CCOTG Trunk Program features the countries of China and Mexico.

Teachers are encouraged to "rent" trunks for each country, free of charge. Each trunk contains five lessons, interactive activities, and all of the supplies that are required to teach students about different cultures. This is accomplished with hands-on activities which include information about the culture and its holidays.

Chinese New Year was celebrated in the

second grade classroom at White Rock Elementary School. The activities included learning how the people of China approach the New Year. This is done by singing a song with a traditional Chinese New Year greeting and making a paper lantern.

Additional activities include discovering the history of silk and firecrackers and how these products are created. The students will take a look at the Chinese food culture, and learn about brewing tea. The proper way to hold and eat with chopsticks is shared. Part of CCOTG Trunk Program also includes hearing the legend of the first Chinese dragon, and joining in a dragon dance with a drum background.

Looking for Teen Leaders to Volunteer

Sacramento Children's Museum Is Searching for Talented Teens to Help Inspire Others

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Children's Museum in Rancho Cordova is recruiting 15 to 18-year-old high school students. The volunteers will take part in a leadership and teaching program aimed at young children up to the age of eight.

The stated goal of the museum is to "inspire, create, and explore" and the volunteers will facilitate the various education-based programs.

"Children will learn while they play," Customer Service Advisor Dustin Perry said. "The volunteers will assist mostly weekends while school is in session, possibly some Friday evenings."

The teen volunteers will participate in a 40-hour program over a four month period to give very young children hands-on science and art experience and a chance to exercise their imaginations.

The teens are asked to commit to 40 hours over a four month period to expose young children to science, art, and story times.

Five volunteers attended the kick-off orientation session to learn their duties. West Campus High School students Alexis Dunbar and Lynzie Baca, Walnut High School student Samantha Eckhoff, and Antelope High School students Joey Perry and Collin Le plan to take advantage of the community service opportunity. More teenagers are expected to step forward in the coming weeks. "We hope to have a total of ten teen volunteers by the end of this month," Museum fundraiser Megan Toland said.

"Community service is an ever increasing requirement for high school students," Sacramento Children's Museum Executive Director Sharon Stone Smith said. "They can gain a deeper understanding of responsibility, creativity, and follow-through that will benefit them in their future professional life."

Megan Toland says she envisions the facility as "a happy place" where kids can stretch their imaginations and learn how things work in a hands-on environment under the guidance of the teen volunteers.

Phase 1 of Veterans Village Scheduled for Completion

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Mather Veterans Village, located on the former Mather Air Force Base, has been in the works for at least ten years, and Phase 1 is now approaching fruition. Anyone driving by the Veterans Village, located only a block from the VA Hospital in Mather, can clearly see the L-shaped building that houses Phase 1's 50 permanent housing units.

"If you haven't had a chance to drop by and see the progress that's been made, please do so," said city council member and former Mayor Robert McGarvey, speaking at the Rancho Cordova Library recently. "It's really going forward, and we're looking forward to getting this done."

First scheduled for February,

SACOG Swears in New Board Leadership

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - This morning the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) Board of Directors swore in City of Roseville Vice Mayor Susan Rohan as the 2016 SACOG Board Chair and Sacramento County Supervisor Phil Serna as Board Vice Chair.

“I am looking forward to leading the exceptional group of regional leaders that comprise the SACOG Board. We have much work to do, including adopting the region’s Metropolitan Transportation Plan and Sustainable Communities Strategy. I have had the opportunity to be an active member of the SACOG board serving on the Land Use and Natural Resources Committee, and chairing the Innovations Task Force. The SACOG Board and staff have built a national reputation for leadership, collaboration,

creativity—and will continue to live up to that reputation in 2016,” said Rohan.

First elected to the Roseville City Council in 2010, Rohan has served as vice mayor and mayor, and was re-elected in 2014. She is the founder and owner of a public affairs consulting business. Previously, she was the Vice President of Government and Environmental Affairs for the Del Webb Corporation, a member of the Roseville Public Utilities Commissions from 2007-2010, served on the Roseville Community Standards Visioning Committee, and was a member of the Placer County Economic Commission. Rohan’s strong commitment to public service and business excellence is exemplified through her various awards, including 2014 Woman of the Year Award by

the California Legislature for Assembly District 4, 2013 Salvation Army Spirit of Caring Award, Roseville Chamber of Commerce Award, and Placer County Economic Development Board private Sector Business Award. Rohan is natively from Nebraska and attended the University of Nebraska. She and her family have lived in Roseville since 1988.

SACOG Vice Chair Phil Serna added, “I am humbled that my colleagues from around our region have placed their confidence in me. I welcome the opportunity to help lead the organization and carry out SACOG’s mission.”

Supervisor Phil Serna was elected to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors in 2010 and re-elected in 2014. A native Sacramentan, he attended California State University Sacramento before

receiving his Masters in City and Regional Planning from Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo. In addition to being a County Supervisor, Serna serves on a number of other boards and commissions including chairing the Sacramento First 5 Commission, the Sacramento Regional Transit District, and the Sacramento Area Flood Control Agency. In 2013, California Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. appointed Serna as the first ever Sacramento area representative to the California Air Resources Board. He is passionate about sustainable transportation and land use planning, public health, social services, public safety, and environmental protection.

Using Your Mind

Tiffany Paige is the founder of the Artisan Mind. Paige’s company “artfully connects the heart and mind of individuals living with Alzheimer’s disease and other dementias.”

I recently caught up with Paige as she was managing her schedule, in going from one art show to another. “My grandfather paid for my art education that took me from Southern California to Paris, France,” said Paige. “He always asked what I was going to do with my degree.”

As Paige saw her grandfather slip into the grasp of dementia, she knew what she had to do: use her art training to help those who suffer from Alzheimer’s disease.

The Artisan Mind concept inspires people with dementia to share their emotions and feelings and encourages in the sharing of pleasant memories. In fact, KVIE, the public television station that covers the Sacramento area, is going to feature Paige and her work on an upcoming broadcast in February. Still, it took her a while to recognize the best way to work with those with dementia.

“I realized my subtle approach in introducing various colors and scenes to a person with dementia got far greater positive results than someone who just tried the traditional engagement guidelines.” Translation: alternate ways

in working with Alzheimer’s sufferers was needed, and, as Paige mentioned “art needs to be part of a personal care plan for these people.”

Paige features her work at various locations throughout the Sacramento Valley, including the Crocker Art Museum, the California Museum, and the California Automobile Museum. Paige is also a regular guest at many Memory Care Facilities in the area, conducting her educational classes.

As a way to consistently improve her product, Paige documents the reactions of participants to her art work and then relays this information to the people who are

supervising their care. Any positive information she provides not only makes caregiving easier, it makes her work all worthwhile.

The Artisan Mind is a non-profit, 501 c-3 business that seeks the financial support of individuals and companies to allow Paige’s work to continue to make a positive difference in our local community. 


Working-Class Zeros

We live in the age of working-class discontent, which, if it wasn’t obvious before, has been made plain by the passions roiling 2016 presidential politics.

The media’s preferred description of the average Republican voter has often been “the angry white male.” This was crudely simplistic and meant to be pejorative. If the press wants to update the descriptor, it should refer to “the despairing white male.” Or more accurately, the despairing white working class.

White working-class life in America has been in a slow-motion disintegration for decades, and it shows. The white working class is an archipelago of hopelessness. It is in a funk about the economy (almost 80 percent think we are still in a recession) and, more fundamentally, the American future.

According to the American Values Survey conducted by the Public Religion Research Institute, only about 40 percent of the white working class say the country’s best days are ahead. This is not only lower than college-educated whites (53 percent), but much lower than blacks (60 percent) and Hispanics (56 percent). It is astonishing to think that the white working class has a dimmer view of the nation’s future than blacks, who have been historically discriminated against and still lag badly on almost every socio-economic indicator.

As noted by the National Journal’s acute analyst Ronald Brownstein, a survey for The Pew Charitable Trusts picked up the same finding a few years ago. It asked people whether they expected to be better off in 10 years. Whereas two-thirds of blacks and Hispanics said “yes,” only 44 percent of whites without a college degree said the same.

We are conditioned by the media to be obsessed with race, when class is an increasingly important divider. (No one ever earnestly says on a cable-TV show that we need to have “a conversation about class in America.”) The class divide among whites shows up again and again on questions about the fairness of the country.

The American Values Survey finds that white working-class Americans distrust institutions like the government and business more

than college-educated whites do; they are more likely to think that their vote doesn’t matter because of the influence of wealthy interests; they are more likely to think that hard work doesn’t necessarily lead to success.

There is a sense among working-class whites that America has gone off the rails, and has been that way for a long time. Sixty-two percent of them say American culture has gotten worse since the 1950s.

Besides the economic battering that lower-skilled workers have taken in recent decades, the working class is increasingly disconnected from the institutions that lend meaning and hope to people’s lives: marriage, the workforce, churches and other institutions of civil society.

They believe that the long-standing American promise of a country where children are better off than their parents has been betrayed, and they sense that their time is past -- a sense reinforced by a pop culture that tends to consider them afterthoughts, or fitting subjects for mockery.

Although smaller than it once was, the white working class remains about 40 percent of the electorate. Its travails can’t -- and won’t -- be ignored.

Dog Is Afraid of Cats

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: My mixed breed dog, “Jessup,” is absolutely terrified of my two cats. As soon as he notices both of them in the room with him, he yelps and runs off to another room with his tail between his legs. I have never seen any other interaction between them, good or bad. Jessup is a rescue dog, and I wonder if something in his past is causing this. Is there any way to get him past his fear of cats?

DEAR JAMIE: I suspect the same thing: Jessup had a bad experience with a cat in the past, and the memory still brings up fear.

I don’t know that he can ever completely get past that fear, but perhaps you can reduce his flight reaction. If the cats aren’t at all bothered by his presence and are generally

pretty mellow (for cats, anyway), you can try to desensitize Jessup somewhat.

Do this by gradually reintroducing all the pets into one room. You’ll need a helper for this. First, bring in Jessup and command him to sit or lie down and stay next to you. Keep a supply of treats in your pocket.

Next, have your helper bring in one of the cats, cradled in their arms or, if necessary, in a carrier. They should sit down across the room where Jessup can see them. If and when Jessup begins to react, tell him to sit and stay. Give him a treat if he obeys.

Do this for only a minute or so at first, and gradually extend the time each day. Avoid getting frustrated. If you can get Jessup to stay just a short time by your side and then calmly leave the room, that would be a big victory.

Elections, Rain, and Transportation

Transportation is a very important part of our City planning. Just look at the appearance of Folsom Boulevard as it goes through Rancho Cordova. In addition to how beautiful Folsom Boulevard is today compared to what it used to be, it is much safer for pedestrians, bicyclists, and all of the vehicles that use that very important boulevard. There are plans for the future that will help pedestrians get across the road easier and safer, as well as make it safer for drivers. For example, looking at the traffic that is on Sunrise Boulevard every day, when the Rancho Cordova Parkway (between Sunrise Boulevard and Grant Line Road) and the interchange are completed, there will be a big sigh of relief by the people who will be able to use that alternate route and will not get jammed on Sunrise like traffic is today. That won't be done tomorrow, but with the numbers of people who live and work here increasing every day, our transportation plans are constantly evolving.

Another election year is here, and I was reminded by one of our staff members that

it is your responsibility to keep your records up to date at the Registrar of Voters Office. If you have changed your name or changed your signature so differently than it was when you last registered to vote at the Registrar of Voters office, it may invalidate your signature. For example, if you now print instead of sign and/or you use your left hand instead of using your right hand anymore, then it would be a significant change. Anyone who makes such an alteration in their signature needs to re-register to vote. And our City Council election in 2012 is a prime example of how important your vote is. The election for the third Council seat was finally decided by only 8 votes. Many of you will remember that election, but there have been a few thousand more people who now live in the City of Rancho Cordova than there were in the election of 2012. "Those who stay away from the election think that one vote will do no good. 'Tis but one step more to think one vote will do no harm." - Ralph Waldo Emerson

The rain has stopped for a few days, and now we are told it may be a couple of weeks between storms. I heard in the news that the "Bureau of Reclamation," the agency that decides on whether to release more water out of Folsom Dam or not, decided to let some of

the water out of the reservoir in order to keep the water at its normal level for this time of the year just in case of a heavy storm (or storms). The rules regarding the current amount of water to be released were written in 1986 when we received four inches of rain one day, and then four more inches of rain the next day. Folsom was filled to the top because of that storm, and water is based on that type of storm. I just hope that since it is not even the middle of February yet, we will receive the rain we need and the water in Folsom Dam will be where it should be at the end of the rainy season.

Going back to elections again, there is another thing to think about. Hopefully we will have a good turn out when the election comes around this coming November, and the voice of the people will be heard. If many people don't vote, they may receive what President Abraham Lincoln said, "Elections belong to the people. It's their decision. If they decide to turn their back on the fire and burn their behinds, then they will just have to sit on their blisters."





The Children's Museum has embraced the City of Rancho Cordova's diversity by launching its Cultural Connections program at the museum. The

water recapture system," said Reed Flory, reinvestment and housing opportunities manager for the City of Rancho Cordova. "The water will be used to irrigate on-site landscaping."

Rick Sprague, a regional vice president with Mercy Housing California, expects new residents to begin moving in between April 1 and April 15 of this year. "Once the project receives its Certificate of Occupancy, anticipated end of March/very early April, occupancy by residents will begin immediately."

As for how the qualifying veterans will be located, Sprague said, that process is being coordinated and organized by Veterans Resource Centers of America. Interested veterans may contact VRC directly

at their office at 7270 East Southgate Dr., Sacramento, or call (916) 393-8387.

Phase 2, Flory said, will be scheduled once Phase 1 is complete. It is possible, however, that work on Phase 2 and possibly even Phase 3 could begin by the end of this year. Phase 2 includes 48 transitional beds to be located on the second floor of the old officers' quarters, and Phase 3 will be the construction of 50 more permanent housing units in another L-shaped building similar to the unit now approaching completion.

The City of Rancho Cordova, in a related subject, is searching for a location for all of the veteran organizations to come together, someplace stable where files can be kept, phone calls received, and meetings held. "We don't really have a

headquarters," McGarvey said. "Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, and all the rest of them, there is no place really for them to go."

In addition, McGarvey said that many cities have a plaque, a wall, or a monument that lists names of local veterans. Rancho Cordova does not currently have anything of that sort. "That's something I'm going to be working on this coming year and ahead," McGarvey said.

Mather Veterans Village, McGarvey said, is a joint project of the Veterans Administration, Sacramento County, the City of Rancho Cordova, Mercy Housing, and "three or four other veteran organizations that have been helping us with this and are all part of this thing." ★

D-Fence and Offense Wins Championships

So which is it? We've heard it a million times that "defense wins championships," but you cannot win anything without at least a little offense in the mix.

Certainly, offense was at a premium Sunday in Super Bowl 50 at Levi's Stadium, where the Denver Broncos' defense led the way in a 24-10 upset over the Carolina Panthers.

Teams with top defenses have been winning the most recent Super Bowls, but over the last eight title games offenses have averaged just under 30 points.

Denver's offense didn't have to do much. The Broncos' defense scored on a fumble recovery and set up "drives" of minus-1 and 4 yards that resulted in 10 points. Denver's 11 first downs and meager 104 passing yards and 194 total yards was just enough. It could be argued that -- without including turnovers -- Carolina's defense was the better defense. Carolina earned 21 first downs and 315 total yards.

One thing is for sure, dominating defenses (unless that is the thing you love most) lend themselves to aesthetically displeasing football. This not-so-Super-Bowl featured 15 punts, a sub-.500 pass completion rate, seven fumbles (four lost), six turnovers, 12 sacks, 18 penalties for 153 yards, four out of 29 possible third-down conversions and a 3.9 yards-per-play average. Great D combined with lousy O equals: Ugly!

This was a matchup between the top-rated Denver defense and the top scoring-offense of Carolina. But Carolina's defense had created the most turnovers (39) during the regular season, added nine more in two playoff games and had a plus-20 differential, while Denver's D had created 27, but the Broncos also gave up 31. It was the Panthers' four inopportune turnovers that proved to be the difference in their loss.

Some have claimed that the latest version of Denver's Orange Crush defense was the greatest defense of all time, even though if Carolina had not coughed up three fumbles the Panthers' D might have been seen as the better one on this day.

Besides that, there's the 1985 Chicago Bears, widely considered to have possessed the most dominating defense ever. That unit allowed only 12.4 ppg. and had two playoff shut-outs (combined 45-0 score) before stifling the New England Patriots 46-10 in Super Bowl XX, led by Hall of Fame linebacker and former Forty Niners head coach Mike Singletary and defensive coordinator Buddy Ryan's famed "46 defense." The Bears held the Patriots to minus-19 yards in the first half and a total of seven yards rushing for the game. Watching highlights of that Super Bowl along with ESPN's recent "30 for 30" show about that team, it's easy to say the Broncos were not even close. And, how about Pittsburgh's Steel Curtain, the 49ers' great defensive teams, or the original Orange Crush?

Interestingly, the Panthers entered the game as the No.-2 rushing team this season at 142.6 per game, but facing Denver's No.-3 rushing defense they elected to open things up and attack the Broncos' No.-1-ranked pass defense instead. That's the same tactic the Patriots tried in 1985; it failed both times.

There is no defense for Panthers QB Cam Newton's poor-sport behavior post game. After bringing great joy to his teammates with his enthusiastic histrionics and "Dabbing" dance throughout Carolina's 17-1 mark going into the game (while many others took offense to him having a bit too much fun), "Superman" was out of character after the game. His short, terse answers and abrupt departure from his press conference were not well received. Combining that with his failure to pounce on a fumble late in the game, rather than "Dabbing," his reputation went into "Moon Walk" mode, sliding backwards.

Meanwhile, Broncos QB Peyton Manning's "rep" received a boost, winning his second Super Bowl while on his way out with his probable retirement, after becoming the oldest (39) QB to start a Super Bowl. His "rep" as a product "rep" also received a boost, as he deftly made it clear that he drinks Gatorade before a game and celebrates victories

with his good buddy Weiser. "The Sheriff" is quick on the draw.

Your Golden State Warriors, on the other hand, would be quick to tell you that the best offense is a great defense, but everyone else would tell you it is the Warriors' offense that is the best defense because other NBA teams simply cannot keep up. The Warriors fast-paced offense led them to last season's title and has been paving the way to their record-setting mark of 46-4 through Monday, with league-leading (by wide margins) statistics of 115.4 ppg. and 42.7% three-point shooting.

Good offense, alone, is surely not the answer. As analyst Jerry Reynolds often says about Sacramento, offense is not the problem for the Kings. They rank third in the NBA at 106.9 ppg., but are last in defense, allowing 109.1. Commentator Doug Christie recently stated one of his "keys to the game" for the Kings was "basketball." --- meaning both offense and defense.

Slipping farther from their shot at the eighth and final playoff spot in the Western Conference has led to the conversation that coach George Karl's head coaching position is in jeopardy. Will the dysfunctional Kings soon be under the guidance of their ninth coach since the 2006-07 season? That's a record-setting pace. They say it is easier to replace the coach than the players, but it might be time for the Kings to consider the alternative. And who would want to coach this team?

Actually, the Kings' coach-of-the-year job may be a most desirable one. You could sign on, coach a horrible roster of incompatible, indifferent players, lose a lot of games, get fired long before your contract expires, get paid an enormous sum for your short stint, and join 49ers former coach Jim Tomsula on a remote tropical isle somewhere and while away the hours discussing the tremendous benefits of being a losing professional coach.

As for deciding which is more important to winning ways --- offense or defense --- for the most part, you usually need both, so we will always remain on...de fence. ★

McCarty Announces Legislation to Establish Concussion Management Protocol for Youth Sports Leagues

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- On Feb. 4th, 2016, Assemblymember Kevin McCarty (D-Sacramento) announced legislation which would help protect youth sports participants from severe injury by requiring the same protocols to be in place as those in place for high school athletes.

In 2014, the Boston University School of Medicine conducted a study that found former NFL players' who began playing football before age 12 "demonstrate significantly greater impairment" than those who started playing later in life. The study published by the research journal Neurology points out that the years between 10 and 12 years of age are considered an important stage of brain development.

"As parents, we have a responsibility to be aware of sport related injuries for our children and I feel that our youth sports leagues should also be obligated to ensure proper procedures are followed to protect our children," said Assemblymember McCarty. "This measure aims to create greater oversight and protection for our young athletes at an early age."

"This bill will help close many loopholes

in concussion management at the youth sports level, and help protect our most vulnerable athletes by providing similar safeguards that are afforded to high school and college athletes. As sponsors, the California Athletic Trainers' Association applauds Assemblymember Kevin McCarty and enthusiastically supports this bill, as it will further our goal to protect athletes and the physically active," said Mike Chisar, governmental affairs committee chair, CATA.

Sports-related concussion became a national topic when Dr. Bennett Omalu, an epidemiologist at UC Davis, reported on the results of an examination of the brain of a former football player. Dr. Omalu discovered clumps of tau proteins which, upon accumulation, impair brain function. Dr. Omalu's exhaustive work on the subject and his efforts to raise awareness of football-related brain injuries sparked the NFL to approve a medical timeout for athletes who are presenting symptoms of a concussion. This measure will be introduced later this month.


