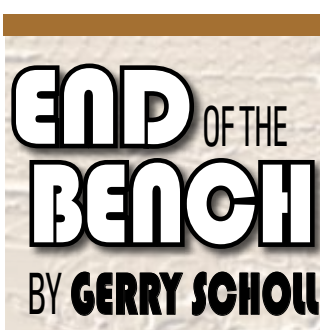

An Inspiration

*Gerrie Walker Celebrates the Publication of Her
Two Tandem Books at The Avid Reader*

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Geraldine Renee' Walker considers herself a "spiritual inspirationalist." And a few quite moments spent alone with her blog or one of her books reveals exactly why.

Friends and family call her "Gerrie" and in her writings she implores everyone to do the same. While Gerrie was born in Los Angeles, Calif., she has lived in Sacramento most of her life.

Gerrie's books came to her almost as a heavenly dictation. After, however, she came to realize—at the ripe of age of 50 no less—the power of giving her soul to the Lord our Savior. A pivotal moment for Gerrie was when she became a member of the New

Thought Movement in April of 2010. She recalls being swept up in an ocean of love, and was so moved that she never looked back.

She was inspired to write while taking a class at her church by one of the facilitators of the class, Lisa Nichols, a participant in the renowned movie "The Secret." Nichols set Gerrie on a course to increase her writing times each day. And once Gerrie started writing...she couldn't stop. "I felt like the words were coming from a heavenly spirit," she recalled.

Sometimes the words would rush over her like a waterfall, other times they would trickle in one word or phrase at time. But they kept coming. Finally, one day Gerrie stepped back from her writings, and saw that

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City Accepts Community Development Block Grant Applications

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is now accepting applications for CDBG services and capital funding. The City anticipates approximately \$400,000 in funding for Fiscal Year 2016-17.

Apart from responding to stated City priorities, special attention in the ranking of applications will be given to the demonstrated capacity of an applicant to administer its contractual obligations, previous experience with CDBG, and ability to leverage other funding that may be required for the completion of the proposed activity or project.

Eligible organizations include non-profits and local government entities. Successful applications will address the housing and community development

needs presented in the City of Rancho Cordova's 2011-2016 Consolidated Plan and must meet the qualifications outlined in this Request for Proposals.

If you are interested in submitting a proposal for consideration, you must complete an electronic application and submit it with all the required documentation by Monday, Feb. 15th, 2016 at 5 p.m., according to the instructions in the application. The online application may be accessed through the City's website at www.CityOfRanchoCordova.org. Select Government, Community Development, Neighborhood Planning & Projects, and Community Development Block Grant.

The City will host a Technical Workshop on the application process, as well as eligibility questions, on Tuesday, Jan. 26th, 2016 from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m. at Rancho Cordova City Hall in the Community Board Room, 2729 Prospect Park Drive.

Only complete applications submitted for eligible activities will be considered for funding. WINTER WATERING TIPS

FOR OUTDOOR LANDSCAPING

Golden State Water Company thanks you, our customers, for the steps you have taken to reduce water use during the drought, and is offering these tips to help you maximize your water-use efficiency this winter.


- ❖ Winter should bring rain and cooler temperatures, presenting an opportunity to turn off irrigation systems.
- ❖ All outdoor irrigation should occur before 8 am or after 7 pm, and should not exceed 10 minutes per station.
- ❖ Avoid watering during and 48 hours following measurable precipitation, and refrain from watering your lawn on windy days to limit overspray and evaporation.
- ❖ Current restrictions for Gold River and Rancho Cordova customers limit outdoor irrigation to one day per week.
- ❖ Install a weather-based smart irrigation controller and water-efficient sprinkler heads.
- ❖ Check to make sure sprinklers are positioned to irrigate the lawn and not your sidewalk, driveway or gutters.

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CRPD and City Seek Accord on Pool Complex

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In what appeared to be a series of misunderstandings, the Cordova Recreation and Park District (CRPD) and the City of Rancho Cordova temporarily abandoned their usual synergistic and cooperative relationship over the Hagan Park Pool Complex Project.

“I’m not pointing fingers at either the District or the City,” said Terri Leimbach, vice-chair of the CRPD Board of Directors. “There was a failure to clearly communicate between the two entities, and I believe that each entity felt they were attempting to communicate, and that the other side wasn’t communicating well enough.”

The channels were open when the process for the project began in 2013, when the dive pool was found to be leaking. Two-by-two meetings were held in which two members of CRPD, two members of the City Council, and staff members from both sides met to discuss the needs for the pool complex.

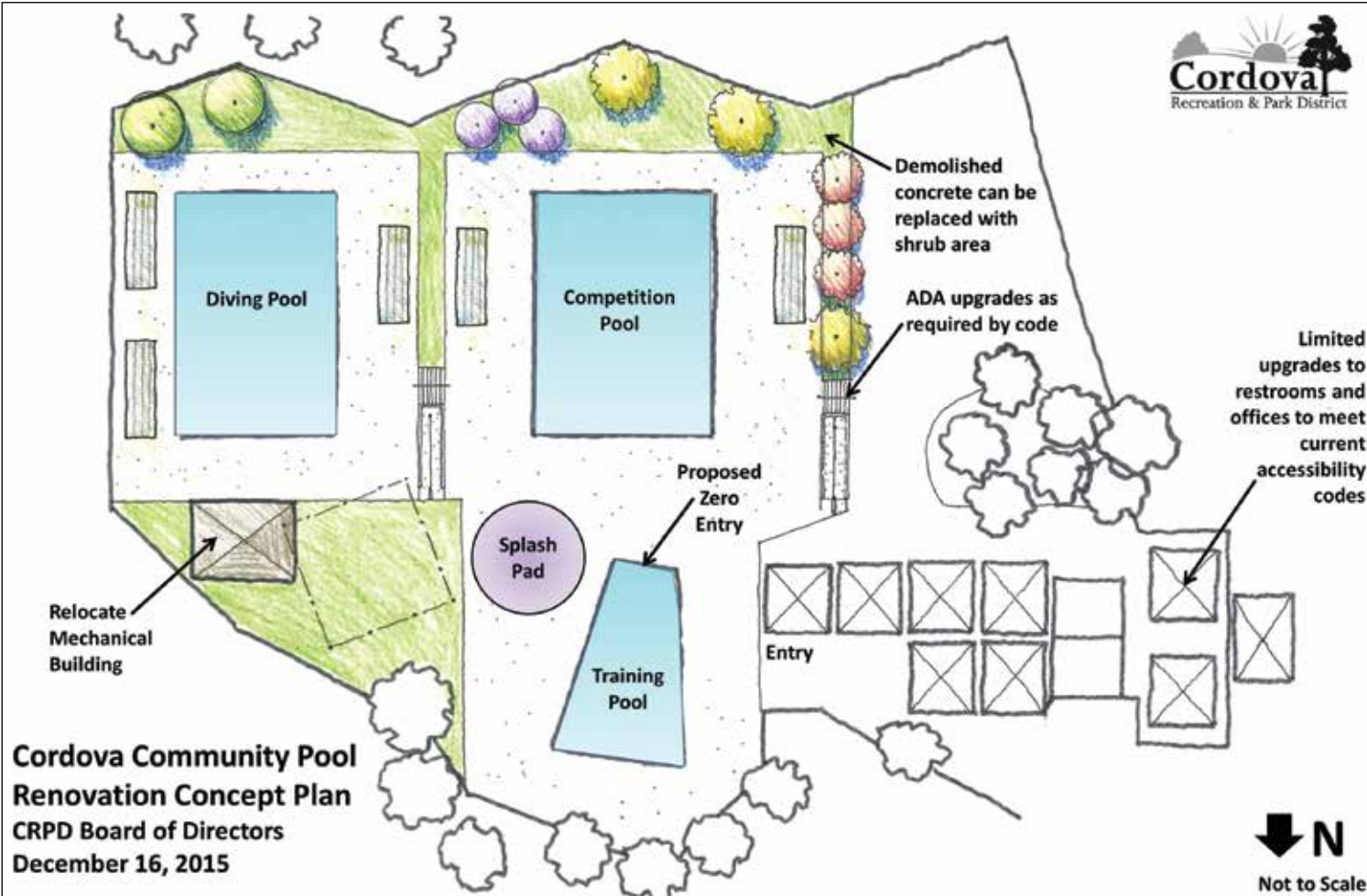
“At that point, we didn’t have Measure H,” said City Manager Cyrus Abhar. “At that point we didn’t know if we would be able

to assist with any funding. They didn’t know. So to their credit, they developed a vision around what they had available, a limited amount of funding.”

When Measure H was passed in 2015, CRPD applied for City funds to add to the 1.2 million they had set aside for the renovation of the pool complex. When the City released their decisions concerning where Measure H funds would be allocated, CRPD’s request was denied. This was a surprise to CRPD; however, District Director Jim Rodems and the Board of Directors regrouped and began looking at the possibility of bond financing to complete their project.

According to Abhar, at the time of Measure H funds dispersal, the City looked at the District’s request for 1.4 million dollars and thought that perhaps the pool complex should be replaced rather than renovated.

“We said, this pool is about 60 years old,” Abhar said. “We now have some funding opportunities from Measure H, so maybe we should do something bigger, something better, something that is more deserving of our community. So we really wanted to expand that vision.”

“What happened, as I recall,” said Terri Leimbach, vice-chair of the CRPD Board of Directors, “is that subsequently a couple of months later [the City] passed a resolution at a City Council meeting in favor of funding for the pool. It was not done at the time of the Measure H application, however.”

The Park District had issues with the unilateral resolution, in particular the formation of a Joint Powers Authority, which would set up a separate governmental agency with control over aquatics, taking it out of CRPD hands. Mainly for that reason, CRPD declined to accept the resolution. CRPD’s decision was met with consternation by some private citizens and the Blue Marlins, a CRPD-sponsored swim team, who took it as a flat refusal of City funds.

“As far as the Joint Powers, we don’t care who has control of the pool, as long as we have a pool that everybody can use and be proud of,” said Joyce Higdon, director of the Blue Marlins.

Some of the issues needing to be worked out include whether the pool complex should be renovated or entirely replaced, how much additional money would be required to replace it, and whether a renovation would allow the pool to meet competitive standards.

Leimbach cited the White House as an example, saying it is over 200 years old, and is periodically renovated. “That doesn’t mean they go in and slap on new wallpaper,” Leimbach said. “They make sure it’s structurally sound, they add utilities. ...A renovation would truly improve the facility, not just

patch the things that are wrong.”

Ancillary areas that need to be addressed are bathrooms, changing rooms, lifeguard shacks, fencing, and landscaping, which are not included in the current plan.

In order to get issues resolved and proceed with the project, CRPD and the City will resume the two by two meetings, Leimbach said. Both entities are anxious to keep moving on the project.

“I think, as a grantor, as an entity that wants to provide the funding, we can have a level of agreement,” Abhar said. “It could be a Memorandum of Understanding, it could be a Joint Powers Agreement, it could be something that we have the assurance and the confidence that this is going to be built in the proper manner.” ★

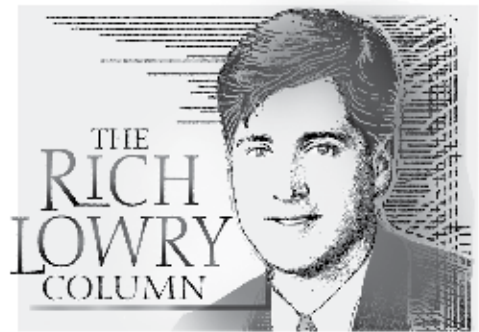
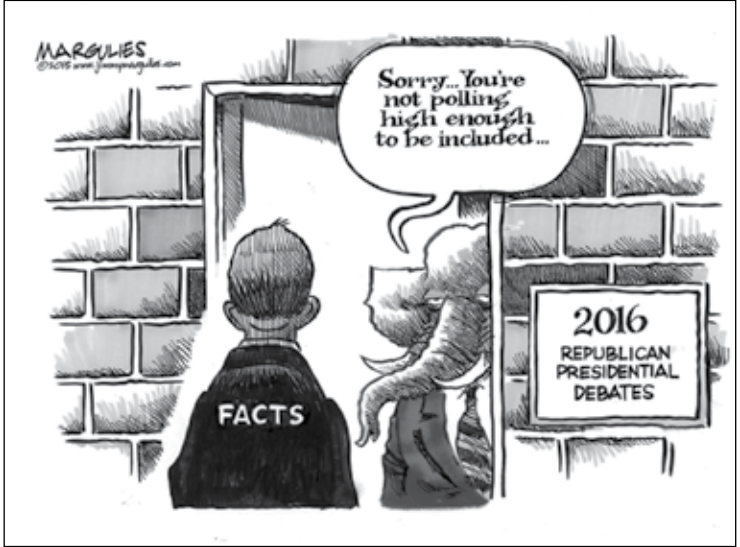
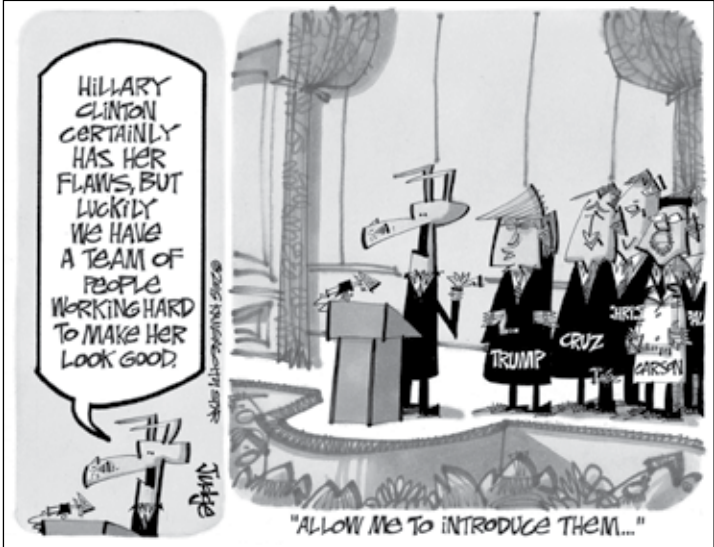


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The Wildlife Refuge Putsch

The Malheur National Wildlife Refuge hasn't heretofore been known as a locus of government tyranny or much of anything else. Saying that the refuge, established in 1908 by Theodore Roosevelt, is in the middle of nowhere makes it sound too centrally located. It is in Southeastern Oregon, about 30 miles from the nearest town of Burns, population 2,722.

Now the Bundy family -- notorious for its standoff with the feds at the family's Nevada ranch last year -- and sundry anti-government protesters have occupied the refuge and pronounced it the staging ground for an offensive against an oppressive federal government. Ammon Bundy vows to stay in the wildlife preserve "for years."

What brought the Bundys to Oregon is the case of the Hammonds, ranchers who were subjected to what appears

to be a vindictive and unnecessary federal prosecution. The case deserves attention and protest, but the Bundys and their allies have brought discredit to the cause with their unlawful occupation of Malheur.

Dwight and Steven Hammond of Harney County were convicted a couple of years ago for lighting two fires on their ranch (for entirely innocent reasons, they maintained) that spread onto federal property, causing negligible damage. The second fire burned all of an acre of public land. For this, they were, amazingly enough, prosecuted under an anti-terrorism statute and sent to jail. They served brief sentences that were less than what's required under the mandatory minimum because the trial judge thought five years for each of them would be wildly disproportionate.

Nonetheless, the government appealed the sentences, and now the Hammonds -- the father, Dwight, is 73, and his son, Steven, 46 -- will serve roughly another four years in prison each. The Oregon Farm Bureau, not hitherto known for its terroristic sympathies, has taken up their case. The prosecution of the Hammonds comes against the backdrop of federal highhandedness and hostility to private economic activity allegedly in the area around the Malheur refuge specifically and certainly in the West generally.

A protest in favor of the family over the weekend drew hundreds, who

peaceably assembled, made their point and dispersed. The Bundys then split off to take over the (unstaffed) headquarters at the wildlife refuge. The Hammonds say the occupiers don't speak for them, and efforts to recruit the locals to join the takeover have been notably unsuccessful.

More sinister is the talk from Ryan Bundy, another of the family's brothers, of potentially resisting by force if law enforcement tries to remove them. One hopes that this is self-dramatizing bluster, which is an occupational hazard of the kind of people who establish revolutionary enclaves. Last year, the Bundy ranch protesters were riven by rumors of imminent government drone attacks -- having evidently mistaken southeastern Nevada for the badlands of Yemen.

The federal government's overweening policies in the West, and the related injustice apparently done to the Hammonds, are serious matters. The proper remedy in a free society of laws is, as always, to be found in peaceful agitation and persuasion, and ultimately the ballot box. Play-acting a revolution will only bring derision -- and should anyone take it too seriously, much worse.

them off counters when no one is looking. Is there a balance between the "absolutely no scraps" guideline and the "live and let live" tendency of some owners?

If you really want to share table scraps with pets, be very selective about what you share and how much. Fresh (not cured) meat, poultry or fish are good. Trim away all fat, and make sure no gravy or seasonings are on the food. Serve pets only a small handful, and if they exhibit any health issues -- excessive vomiting, lethargy or other symptoms -- contact a vet right away.

A healthier option is to prepare a small amount of protein and vegetables separately for your pets as you cook dinner. Leave out seasonings and consider steaming or roasting the food rather than cooking in oil. Cool completely before serving to pets.

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DEAR PAW'S CORNER: Can you feed leftover meal scraps to cats? My boyfriend says no; I say yes, because I've been feeding scraps to my three cats for years. What do you say?

-- Carole in Davenport, Iowa

DEAR CAROLE: Feeding scraps to pets -- dogs or cats -- is not recommended. The main reason is that food prepared for humans often contains ingredients that are harmful to pets, such as onions, garlic, raisins, avocado and many more. Scraps also can contain more fat than pets are used to, creating digestive problems and setting them up for obesity. And leftovers can be high in salt, which can be as detrimental to pets as it is to us.

However -- and this is a big "however" -- table scraps tend to get fed to begging cats anyway by kind-hearted owners or their guests. Or, cats just steal

And Another Thing ...

Winter, Good Will, War and Will Rogers

The weather of the winter of 2016 is wetter (and seems to be colder) than it was during the last four years; and from what we’ve seen, it will continue to be wetter. And even though I have said it before, I hope it will make a real dent in the drought.

I decided to follow the weather info. and most of the rest of this column with something new. At least it was new to me after we joined the Vietnam War Commemoration and became a partner in the effort. The Rancho Cordova Memorial and Veterans Day Committee was recognized as a Commemorative Partner by the Secretary of Defense and The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff on Oct. 2nd, 2013.

One of the facts of the Vietnam War isn’t known by many: it is that veterans who served active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces from Nov. 1st, 1955 to May 15th, 1975, regardless of location, are listed as Vietnam veterans and are eligible to receive the Vietnam Veterans Lapel Pin. “These lapel pins will be presented in a dignified manner

to each Vietnam veteran during public events held in their communities by Commemorative Partners. Accompanying remarks should reflect the nation’s thanks for their service and sacrifice.” This recognition is another way for our nation to recognize, thank, and honor United States Military Veterans who served during the Vietnam period.

Now, on to other things happening in 2016. I received a letter from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, San Francisco Regional Office - Region IX. “Their review of the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report for Program Year 2014 shows that the City has complied with the eligibility and national objective equipments of the CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) program. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - With at least seven weeks hosted and a stable intake site, this year’s Homeless Assistance Resource Team (HART) winter shelter in Rancho Cordova is proving much more effective in getting their guests in out of the cold.

Way of Life Church on Folsom Boulevard near Mountain Mike’s Pizza is providing the intake site, and it has been a godsend. “When HART approached us about being involved, it was just perfect,” said Pastor Michael Tempke. Being right on the main street and already having regular contact with a number of homeless makes the site advantageous. Tempke hopes to continue with the intake site for future winter shelters.

Cordova Church of Christ provides transportation to the host sites from the intake site each evening at 6 p.m. At the host site guests receive a hot meal. At 6 a.m. the next morning the church bus returns the guests to the intake site after a quick breakfast.

Numbers are up decidedly from last year’s shelter, said Inez Reyes, intake coordinator and member of St. John Vianney Catholic Church. As opposed to the starting day last year that only served one or two guests, this year started out with 8 the first day, then 10, then 12. The most recent count during the second week, at the Sun River site, was 27—the cap is 30 guests.

“It’s a comfort to know that 27 people did not sleep on the streets of Rancho,” said HART Winter Shelter organizer Karen Edwards, who is women’s ministry leader at Sun River Church. “We’ve also had a few already be put in housing as a result of Sac Self Help Housing coming each week to do housing counseling.”

Guests must arrive at Way of Life intake site by 5:30 p.m. to be transported to the current host site.

Seven of the planned eight weeks are hosted, but the program is without a host site for the last week of January, the 24th through the 30th.

“We have a church that is providing all the food, paper products, and volunteers to serve and clean up,” said Edwards. “But we need a site and overnight monitors.” The program will have to be suspended for that week if no church comes forward. Edwards can be reached at karen@sunriver-church.com.

One guest, Barry Jones, when asked if he had ever been part of the Greater Sacramento Area winter sanctuary program, which serves up to 108 homeless each night, said he would feel unsafe because of the large numbers and because he wouldn’t know the people. He joined the Rancho Cordova shelter on the second day. Jones said he told himself, “I can actually begin to populate the shelter by my own responsibility, saying [to other homeless], ‘Hey, there’s this place.’ ” In that way he knew many of the guests participating, and felt more protected.

Jones was grateful for the opportunity to get out of the elements. “What I found is that it’s better than having to walk all

night to search all night for a place that I’d feel comfortable bedding down,” Jones said.

Not everyone is fortunate or able enough to get into the shelter. On New Year’s Eve, Tempke said, a homeless man named Pete, who had been to the Way of Life church many times, was found dead of exposure off of Dawes not far from the shelter intake site. The shelter was there and Pete knew of it, but for some reason did not avail himself of it.

“It was very disappointing, but at the same time it was very enlightening for us to understand how important [it is] for us to do what we’re doing,” Tempke said. “Because although we lost Pete, he’s not the first one we’ve lost to the elements that has attended our church. So it confirmed for us that we’re doing the right thing in offering them the opportunity to come inside.”

HART is designating Sunday, Feb. 14th, for their Give One Day fundraising campaign, which encourages people to donate the amount they spend on one day’s mortgage or rent. Defense Leads to Win for Lancers

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At the midway point of the season, the Cordova High School boys basketball team has continued its progress on both sides of the ball. Playing a non-league game at Mira Loma on Jan. 6th, the Lancers hustled that led to an 81-51 victory over the Matadors. Cordova improved to an 8-8 record going into its Sierra Valley Conference opener against Galt earlier this week.

Cordova head coach Fletcher Johnson was pleased with his squad’s efforts on offense and defense in the first quarter. The Lancers jumped out to a 24-13 lead that was based on man-to-man and zone defenses that kept the Matadors in check.

“The guys came out very intense with good defense,” Johnson said. “Outstanding defense and applied pressure in the first two quarters.”

That defense that also included some full-court press, plus breakaway and lay-up shots on offense, continued to build for the Lancers in the second quarter that led to another run over the Matadors, 21-15. That added up to a 45-23 halftime lead.

Cordova continued to have its way on offense and defense in the second half against Mira Loma. The Lancers outscored the host, 36-23, en route to the win.

Three Lancers scored in double figures in the contest; guard DeAnte Wilkins led the way with 19 points. Guards Jason Novik and Damion Baldwin followed with 16 and 10 points each.

Lancers who also scored were

Najee Clark with nine points, Mike Brown seven and Slavik Demchyk six. Teammates Ben Danielyan and William Moore had five points each and Joseph Gomez finished with two.

Conference action

The development of the backcourt in Wilkins, Novik, Baldwin, and Clark has been the key for the Lancers going into conference action. That could be the key against contenders Liberty Ranch (17-0) and Union Mine (11-7).

“I think Union Mine is the team to beat, plus Liberty Ranch,” said Johnson of the Diamondbacks and Hawks.

Cordova won the SVC title last season. But the pressure appears to be on D’backs and Hawks. El

Dorado, along with Rosemont and Galt, could play spoilers in conference play after tough pre-season games and tournaments.

“Looks like everyone pushed (in pre-season),” Johnson said. “It’s going to be a balance of the top four teams.”

Tonight, Friday, Cordova continues conference action when it hosts Union Mine. Then tomorrow, Saturday, the Lancers will take part in the Common Good Classic Tournament that features mostly Sacramento schools playing at San Juan High School. Cordova will play Bradshaw Christian. Both games are scheduled to tip-off at 7 p.m.

The Lancers resume SVC play at El Dorado next Tuesday. Game time is also scheduled for 7 p.m. ★

On Jan. 8th, also a non-league home game, Cordova and Bethel were tied at 43-43 after four quarters. The visiting Lady Cougars outscored the Lancers, 9-6, to win the game in overtime.

Graf led the Lancers with 19 points. Cooper followed with 16, Wilson seven, White five and Reis two.

Cordova 41, McNair 17

In a non-conference road game Jan. 5th, the Lady Lancers jumped out to a 12-2 lead after the first quarter and 20-7 at halftime.

Leading scorers for the Lancers were Graf with 13 points. Jones and White had six points each, Cooper five, Wilson four, Annalise Tate three and Hammond and Reis two each.

Last night, Thursday, Cordova played at Union Mine. Next Tuesday, the Lancers host El Dorado and Thursday, January 21st entertain Liberty Ranch. All three games are scheduled to tip-off at 7 p.m. ★

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Remember those times growing up playing sports when you simply lost your “cool?”

Of course you do --- probably at least as clearly as you remember your finest moments. Losing your cool during competition, under pressure is embarrassing and leaves a long-lasting imprint.

Remember the time when your grammar school team was playing poorly and a couple of bad calls went against you and you slammed the basketball to the floor and drew a technical foul --- and your coach/father pulled you out of the game for the rest of the half? Remember the time you blew it after changing baskets after halftime and shot a ball into the wrong basket?

Remember when you went into your fancy, exaggerated windup and brought your hands down, knocking your cap forward covering your eyes? How about the time you forgot how many outs there were? Or the time you went into your home run trot but missed second base? Or the time you were sure you had the race won and eased up near the finish, only to be nipped at the wire? Or when you were cruising into the end zone and flipped the ball away just before you actually crossed the goal line?

Remember how you felt at those forgettable moments? Of course you do.

There were a number of guys playing in the first round of the NFL playoffs last weekend who made unfortunate memories that they (and their teammates and many others) will never forget.

Start in Cincinnati, where the weather was frigid but so many of the hometown participants couldn’t keep their cool and the Bengals snatched an embarrassing defeat from the clenches of victory, losing to the Pittsburgh Steelers (for a day, that’s Steelers), 18-16, in a wild Wild Card game.

The longtime rivals that despise each other with intense passion went at it in violent, ferocious fashion throughout the day, but it was the visitors maintaining composure while the hosts totally lost it --- literally. Two disastrous infractions in the final

minute by the Cincinnati defense set up a game-winning field goal for Pittsburgh with 14 seconds left, after it appeared the Bengals had the game all but won.

The Steelers had built a 15-0 lead. But, of all people, it was rookie backup quarterback A. J. McCarron who kept it together and led the Bengals from behind and into a 16-15 lead with just 1:50 to go.

The Bengals, who don’t seem to represent the best and brightest the league has to offer, were deliberately stirring things up throughout the contest. Even when trailing, Cincinnati defenders were preening and prancing around uncontrollably, spitting in the faces of their opponents, and taking cheap shots, whenever. Crazed linebacker Vontaze Burfict, a player of much negative repute, was the lead instigator. Caught on camera taunting the Steelers’ sideline, Burfict was described as one “looking for trouble.” He found it.

He’s the same guy that injured Pittsburgh QB Ben Roethlisberger in Week 14 with a dirty, low hit that resulted in a hefty fine and an accusation by Roethlisberger that the blow was intentional. Burfict sent the QB to the sideline hurt again in this game with another (though legal) vicious tackle.

With his team in the lead, Burfict intercepted a Landry Jones pass at the 1:36 mark and was down. But in an act to apparently make it all about him --- which, eventually, it was --- Burfict got up with the ball and ran off the field well into the tunnel with teammates chasing after him.

After relative order was restored, in a protect-the-ball-at-all-costs situation, Bengal Jeremy Hill fumbled on the next play and Pittsburgh recovered at its own 9-yard line. After missing a couple of series, Roethlisberger returned to lead his team downfield, including converting on a fourth-down play with 22 seconds left. He overthrew Antonio Brown on the next play, but Burfict plowed through late with a dangerous blast to Brown’s head (resulting in a concussion that may keep him out awhile), drawing a 15-yard penalty (and, later, a 3-game suspension). During the havoc that ensued, Adam

(formerly Pacman) Jones, another of Cincinnati’s model citizens, drew an additional personal foul penalty that set the Steelers up for the winning 35-yard kick.

On TV, analyst Phil Simms said it was “...disgraceful on so many fronts,” and added, later, that it was one of the “...worst defeats ever imposed on yourself, with the penalties.”

Even the Cincinnati fans joined in the “fun” --- cheering Roethlisberger’s injury, throwing objects on the field, urinating on other fans in the stands, and picking fights that led to at least six arrests. Stay classy Cincinnati.

Things were a bit cooler in Minneapolis --- six degrees below zero at the start of the Seattle-Vikings matchup, the third coldest game in history --- but the Vikes froze up at the finish. With a chance to win at the end, Minnesota coaches elected to play for a field goal. Blair Walsh had converted three kicks earlier, but pulled a 27-yarder to the left with 22 seconds to go for a 10-9 Seattle win.

Houston fans knew it wasn’t very cool that they had Brian Hoyer as their starting QB against red-hot Kansas City and its even-keeled QB Alex Smith (the 49ers would like to have a guy like him). Hoyer blew his cool and had the worst game of his career with four interceptions and a fumble in a 30-0 loss.

Washington players were acting as though they thought they were pretty special while building a 11-0 lead over Green Bay. It should’ve been more, but the guy who believes he is the essence of cool, DeSean Jackson, forgot to make sure the ball crossed the goal line before he went out of bounds on what should have been an easy touchdown. The possession ended with just a field goal and the NFL master of cool, Packers QB Aaron Rodgers, led his team to scores on five consecutive drives and a 35-18 victory.

For the first time in NFL history, all four road teams won the Wild Card games. Most of the fans that paid exorbitant prices to witness the home fiascos first-hand did not think that was cool at all. ★

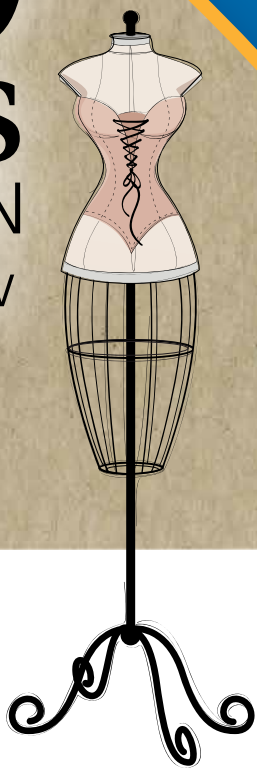
