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Protecting the Elderly

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

Over the holidays, many people headed home to spend time with family, possibly with older adult relatives. This may have initiated conversations about protecting finances or other care related issues. Seniors and their families need to be aware of common scams targeting older adults and steps they can take to protect themselves.

"We always encourage people to regularly check-in with older relatives," says Ruth MacKenzie, Sacramento County's Senior and Adult Protective Services (APS) Program Manager. "Twenty-five percent of all cases APS investigates involves financial fraud."

Being the victim of a financial scam is a traumatic experience for anyone, but for seniors who often have limited income and no recourse to recoup a financial loss, it can be devastating. Seniors who fall victim to fraud can lose not only financially, but physically as well.

"In many cases, the financial loss and ensuing investigation takes a mental and physical toll on an older adult and can, sadly, sometimes lead to hospitalization and even death," says MacKenzie.

APS regularly works with law enforcement when scams are perpetrated against seniors. Detective Natalie Medeiros has been with the Sacramento Police Department for 20 years and has investigated many cases involving seniors, including both physical and financial abuse.

Seniors, especially those who have deteriorated health or few family members, are some of the most vulnerable members of our community. According to a study by the Investor Protection Trust, more than 7.3 million Americans over 65 have been victims of fraud.

"Financial abuse can include fraud, theft, and an array of scams, many of which are targeted specifically at older adults," says

Detective Medeiros. "It's important for us, as a community, to give seniors and their families tools to help safeguard against abuse."

It is important to verify all information before sending any kind of monetary payment or allowing access to a residence. A legitimate company who contacts a client for a legitimate purpose will often encourage the client to verify the information the company representative is giving; someone who is attempting to scam an individual will discourage any

attempt to verify information from a source other than them. It might be helpful to keep a list of contact numbers for law enforcement and utilities near the phone, for easy verification in an uncertain situation.

"My best advice is to always verify before allowing entry or sending money," says Detective Medeiros. A quick phone call to ask if a particular utility company has people in the area or if a grandchild is really out of the country can possibly prevent a person from

becoming a victim. Medeiros continues, "Never use a phone number or email address solicitors give you; always get the phone number from a bill or find it online."

If you think you or an older family member may be a victim of a scam call law enforcement or Adult Protective Services at 916-874-9377.

"Error on the side of caution," says MacKenzie. "Reporting sooner rather than later can prevent additional loss."

Obama Plans 2224 New Regulations on US Citizens

AMAC SPECIAL RELEASE (MPG)- Most American were too busy preparing for the Thanksgiving (and Christmas) holiday to have noticed the White House announcement that the president seeks to impose 2,224 new regulations on us in the coming months, according to Dan Weber, president of the Association of Mature American Citizens.

The new rules include 144 regulations that are officially considered to be "economically significant" because they come with a price tag of \$100 million or more each.

"Mr. Obama, in fact, broke his own record set last spring when he announced 136 mega-buck rules, the most ever in history until then. That news came out just before Memorial Day weekend. This time around he told us about the new rules only a few days before Thanksgiving. It appears the president chooses to make these kinds of announcements at some of the busiest times of the year, hoping that few of us will pay attention to the fact that he plans to spend billions of taxpayer dollars," Weber said.

The newest regulatory plan has a total price tag of more than \$92 billion, according to some estimates. But that's just the tip of the iceberg. The Competitive Enterprise Institute says that in 2014 regulations cost American consumers and businesses a staggering \$1.88 trillion in lost economic productivity and higher prices. CEI says the price tag for the average American household was \$14,976

"If that is not enough to warrant Congressional scrutiny, I don't know what is. Government spending, deficits and the national debt are out of control and we all know it, but the cost of regulations and the impact these rules have on our daily lives gets little notice. Perhaps it is because the rules are imposed without benefit of debate. It is about time, therefore, that we encourage those who we elected to be our eyes and ears inside the beltway to do what they were sent there to do-to protect our interests."

The Federal Research Division of the Library of Congress published a study noting that liberals favor government intervention that promotes social, non-economic objectives, while conservatives see government intervention as an intrusion that makes us less competitive.

"The issue of government regulatory authority run-amok is not a political issue. It's an American issue that requires bipartisan attention because we simply can't afford the nearly \$2 trillion dollar price tag," Weber concluded. Source: www.amac.us ★

Foundation Announces Responsive Grants Recipients

Awards Nearly \$80,000 To Local Nonprofits To Conclude Giving Season

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - At the conclusion of the giving season, Sacramento Region Community Foundation (the Foundation) awarded six local nonprofit organizations substantial holiday gifts, granting nearly \$80,000 to support vital community needs region-wide.

Among the Responsive Grants awarded is one that will help adults in the probation system develop the real-world skills necessary for successful reentry into the workforce, another that will provide underserved youth transportation to afterschool programming, and another that will ensure children with hearing loss are offered vital support services in local school districts.

Altogether, the Foundation granted \$78,930 to support a wide assortment of necessary projects across the four-county region at the following organizations:

B Street Theatre; Boys & Girls Club of Greater Sacramento; Children's Choice for

Hearing and Talking Center Sacramento; Short Term Emergency Aid Committee; The Gathering Inn; TLCS, Inc.

Combined with the grants made during the inaugural round of the program in September, the Foundation awarded \$218,224 in grants to 17 nonprofits as part of its Responsive Grants Program this year.

As with all of its efforts, the Responsive Grants Program furthers the Foundation's work to foster a thriving community exemplified by opportunities for all to live in a vibrant economy, benefit from a strong nonprofit sector, live with a sense of dignity, and flourish through the strength of regional diversity.

Taylor Farms Pacific, Inc. Recalls Signature Cafe Traditional Stuffing Due to Potential Undeclared Allergens

FDA SPECIAL RELEASE, CA (MPG) - Taylor Farms Pacific, Inc. of Tracy, California is voluntarily recalling 190 cases of Signature Café Traditional Stuffing because the product label did not identify certain ingredients including soy, milk and wheat. The recalled product was sold in a limited number of Safeway and Pak 'N Save stores in Northern California and Nevada and Vons stores in Fresno, CA; Clovis, CA and Oakhurst, CA.

People who have severe sensitivity or allergies to soy, wheat or milk may run the risk of a serious or life threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products. There are 190 cases of product that could potentially contain the wrong label. This recall only pertains to the Signature Café Traditional Stuffing packaged in a 39 oz. plastic container which bears a UPC number of 21130-08320 with a Use By Date of 12/26/2015 and a Lot Code of TFPV351. The Use By Date and Lot Code are located on the product label on the lid. The product is pre-made and sold from the refrigerated case in the deli section of the store.

No illnesses have been reported to date. This voluntary recall does not apply to any other Safeway or Taylor Farms Pacific, Inc. products. Customers who have purchased the recalled product are urged to discard it or return it to the store for a full refund. 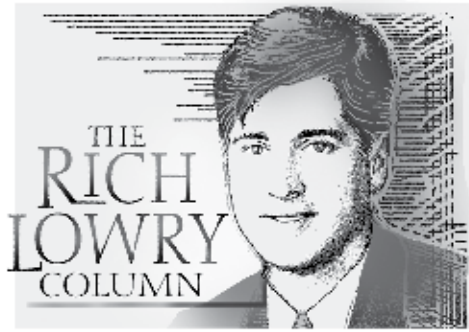
Rancho Cordova residents can recycle their Christmas Trees at no additional cost!

We Aren't the World

To believe his critics, Donald Trump has ripped up the U.S. Constitution and sprinkled its shreds on the smoldering embers of what was once the Statute of Liberty.

He did this, of course, by proposing a temporary ban on Muslim immigration into the United States, which might be the most roundly and fiercely denounced idea in America since the British Parliament passed the Intolerable Acts (in 1774).

There is no doubt about it: Donald Trump's proposal is invidious; not all Muslims are a security risk. It is unworkable; among other things, airlines would have to screen travelers from Europe for their religion. It is imprudent; we don't want to send a message of generalized hostility to Muslims.

But it's not unconstitutional. Trump's detractors, and even some

of his fellow Republicans, can't help making this charge, even though it betrays a misunderstanding, not just of the Constitution, but of the very nature of a sovereign nation.

"We do not discriminate on people based on religion," Ben Carson said in response to Trump's proposal, "that's constitutional, that's in the First Amendment." Of course, he's right. Except the First Amendment isn't a free-floating grant of rights to all of mankind.

We are a sovereign country with the right to exclude whomever we want from coming here. In keeping with this basic attribute of nationhood, a long line of Supreme Court cases have upheld the "plenary power" of the political branches to set immigration policy in any way they please.

We have seen exercises of this plenary power in recent decades. During the hostage crisis, as FrontPage Magazine reported, Jimmy Carter ordered that all nonimmigrant visas from Iran be invalidated and that no more be issued, absent a compelling humanitarian reason. He also mandated that Iranian students in the United States report to the authorities, who queried them about potential radical sympathies. Some students were expelled. Jimmy Carter has not heretofore been known for his fascist tendencies.

It is different, and less disturbing, to target the nationality of potential

entrants, rather than their religion. It is the difference between Trump proposing, say, a temporary moratorium on visas for people coming here from Pakistan and Saudi Arabia -- San Bernardino terrorist Tashfeen Malik was a Pakistani who spent a lot of time in Saudi Arabia -- and a halt to all Muslims. Trump's ban would apply to an Iraqi interpreter who worked alongside U.S. troops, as well as to a harmless Ph.D. from Malaysia.

Still, the braying about the First Amendment from the left is rich. The implicit position of Trump's progressive critics is that the First Amendment doesn't protect all political speech, or cover people with religious objections to gay marriage, or prevent the Obama administration from forcing nuns to sign up for contraception coverage, but it extends to foreigners hoping to gain entry into the United States.

The embedded assumption is that migrating here is some sort of global civil right. Trump may be ignorant and bombastic, but his supporters believe that, if nothing else, he understands that the security and interests of Americans must come first. They know no such thing about his hysterical detractors.

FDA Proposes Tanning Bed Restrictions

Proposes Age And Other Important Safety Measures

FDA SPECIAL RELEASE CA (MPG) - The U.S. Food and Drug Administration recently announced important proposed steps to protect public health by preventing the use of sunlamp products (also commonly known as indoor tanning beds) by minors and reducing the risk of using these devices for adults. The FDA is committed to protecting public health by informing consumers of the risks of indoor tanning.

“Today’s action is intended to help protect young people from a known and preventable cause of skin cancer and other harms,” said acting FDA Commissioner Stephen Ostroff, M.D. “Individuals under 18 years are at greatest risk of the adverse health consequences of indoor tanning.”

Indoor tanning is a known contributor to skin cancer, including melanoma (its most deadly form), and other skin damage. Yet, 1.6 million minors indoor tan each year, increasing their risk of skin cancer and other damage (based on data in the 2013 National Youth Risk Behavior Survey).

According to the American Academy of Dermatology, those who have been exposed to radiation from indoor tanning are 59 percent more likely to develop melanoma than those who have never tanned indoors.

In addition, the effects of exposure to UV radiation add up over one’s lifetime. Therefore, UV radiation exposure in children and teenagers puts them at a greater risk for skin and eye

damage later in life.

The FDA is issuing two proposed rules today. The first proposed rule would restrict use of sunlamp products to individuals 18 and older. In addition, before their first tanning session and every six months thereafter, adult users over age 18 would have to sign a risk acknowledgment certification that states that they have been informed of the risks to health that may result from use of sunlamp products. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, an average of more than 3,000 emergency department room visits occur for injuries related to indoor tanning each year in the U.S. (based on 2003-2012 data).

The FDA also issued a second proposed rule today that would require that sunlamp manufacturers and tanning facilities take additional measures to improve the overall safety of these devices. Specifically, some of the key proposed changes would include: making warnings easier to read and more prominent on the device; requiring an emergency shut off switch, or “panic button”; improving eye safety by adding requirements that would limit the amount of light allowed through protective eyewear; improving labeling on replacement bulbs so tanning facility operators can make sure they are using the proper replacement bulbs, reducing the risk of accidental burns; and prohibiting dangerous device modifications, like installing stronger bulbs, without

re-certifying and re-identifying the device with the FDA.

“The FDA understands that some adults may decide to continue to use sunlamp products,” continued acting FDA Commissioner Stephen Ostroff, M.D. “These proposed rules are meant to help adults make their decisions based on truthful information and to ensure manufacturers and tanning facilities take additional steps to improve the safety of these devices.”

The proposed device restriction would apply to manufacturers and tanning facility operators. There are approximately 18,000 to 19,000 indoor tanning salons and 15,000 to 20,000 other facilities, such as health clubs, spas, and other commercial establishments, that offer tanning services in the U.S. The FDA has information for consumers and businesses via the Division of Industry and Consumer Education (DICE). Also, additional guidance and information for industry is included in the proposed rules.

The proposed restriction and updated performance standards are two of the latest steps the Department of Health and Human Services is taking to reduce the risks associated with skin cancer. In July 2014, the Office of the Surgeon General issued a Call to Action to Prevent Skin Cancer, which included strategies for reducing indoor tanning among minors.

The proposed rules are available online at www.regulations.gov for public comment for 90 days. ★

Willie Mays in a New York Mets uniform. Willie McCovey in a San Diego Padres uniform. Juan Marichal in a Dodgers uniform. Orel Hershiser in a San Francisco Giants uniform. Unbelievably pathetic.

Buckner letting that grounder go between his legs. Norwood's kick going "wide right" in Super Bowl XX. The Raiders' lopsided loss to "Chucky" and his Bucs in Super Bowl XXXVII; and now their 13th straight non-winning season since. Cal's QB Riley running with a No.-1 ranking on the line. Texas in the Rose Bowl. All dripping with pathos.

A tie in a MLB All Star Game. A World Series cancelled. The A's trading Josh Donaldson to Toronto, where he became the next MVP. J. T. Snow out by a mile at home to end a Giants' playoff run. The Florida Marlins winning not one, but two World Series. Dusty handing a game ball to Russ Ortiz in a World Series game that was not over

yet. A certain softball team blowing a 12-run lead in the last inning. There's more.

DeMarcus Cousins getting another "T." The Kings blowing another fourth-quarter lead. Listening to Kings games on the radio. Isaiah Thomas starting for the Celtics. The 1-28 Philadelphia 76ers. Clippers Doc Rivers, Chris Paul and Blake Griffin whining and complaining. The NBA-worst Warriors missing out in the first-ever draft lottery and Patrick Ewing mysteriously winding up in New York. Later, Golden State letting Robert Parrish and Kevin McHale end up in Boston so the W's could select Joe ("barely cares") Barry Carroll. Todd Fuller, not Kobe Bryant. All, oh so pathetic.

Not to mention, "celebration" penalties, preseason football, Ray Lewis or Curt Schilling on TV. Or, "booing" your home team or its players.

As pathetic as that last one is, that's just what happened Sunday at Levi's Stadium. And what made it even more embarrassing --- the 49ers were escorted to the locker room at halftime by a chorus of "boos" in front of a gathering of eight former SF greats that included Joe Montana, Jerry Rice, Roger Craig and Eddie DeBartolo that was to be honored during intermission.

You start to think, just maybe, that after last week's loss at Cleveland you have seen it all. But things kept getting worse for the 4-10 49ers in Sunday's 24-14 (not that close) loss to Cincinnati.

The 49ers' league-worst offense put up some yards, but committed four awful turnovers and most of the team's eleven penalties that totaled 98 yards. Three quick turnovers allowed the Bengals to score three touchdowns over a short span of 4:23 in the second quarter and take a

21-0 lead at the half. Booooo!

Tight end Vance McDonald had two catchable passes slip through his hands and into those of Cincinnati defenders, and Anquan Boldin held onto one but had it stripped from his grasp and returned to the 49ers' 11-yard line.

Don't blame it all on quarterback Blaine Gabbert (30 for 50, 295 yards, sacked four times); he's not getting much help from his teammates. Ugly mistakes continuously dealt self-inflicted wounds on the offense. The team with the fewest first downs in the league kept finding itself in 3rd-and-long situations and converted just two of 14 third downs.

Passes tipped, not caught, intercepted. Undisciplined penalties. Wide receivers' false starts. Receivers running wrong routes. Passes completed just short of first-down markers. A fumble lost. An 18-yard punt. A blocked field goal. As receiver Torrey Smith said, "So who wants to sit there and watch that?"

'Tis the season for giving, but please don't give us anymore of that! Those things just lead to another pathetic thing --- a coach Jim Tomsula press conference (it's not all his fault, either). Give us, instead, some hope for the future. That might mean two more losses to end the season in position for some Grade AA draft choices (Is there another Aaron Rodgers out there?).

Let's gather 'round Charlie Brown's pathetic little Christmas tree and sing "O come all ye 49er Faithful" together, in hopes they don't screw that up, too.

I fear, however, that the way things have been going, there is more to come we have yet to see, and we will "...be done seen about everything when I see an elephant fly." ★
