




## Pasta Feed **Fundraiser** RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -

- •Creating pillowcase dresses for girls in developing countries to discourage human traffickers
- •Raised money to purchase 40 Solar Cookers for Sudan refugee families

"It's so important that this fundraiser is a success so we can continue doing the projects we do each year as well as offer new projects like "Project B-You-tiful," which is an after school workshop for middle school girls, as well as expand existing projects to serve more people," says club President Romel Billeci. 

# Halloween at Hagan

Once upon a time, said Emily Butler, executive director of Sacramento Splash, the entire Sacramento Valley would have been covered with vernal pools. Now, Mather Field is one of the last bastions of the vernal pool environment in the area, maybe even in the world.

vernal pools remained," Butler said

With an enthusiasm that occasionally brought a tremor to her voice, Butler told the group assembled at City Hall about vernal pools-temporary wetlands that occur in a Mediterranean climate in which the pools fill with rain in the winter, and shrink in the hot, dry summers. A particular bee thrives in this environment. It collects pollen only from one species of flower, then burrows down into the ground to lay eggs. The larvae lie dormant until that specific species of flower is blooming. Many other forms of life are indigenous to the vernal pools.

Sacramento Splash was founded by Emily Butler's mother, Eva Butler, not only because she was a scientist and interested in vernal pools, but also because of the science program provided in elementary schools.

gram," Emily Butler said. "It's supposed to be the best of the best, but in 5th grade the entirety of our science curriculum consisted of watching 'Free Willy' once before we left on vacation." Splash now presents almost 90 sessions in their program on vernal pools for public elementary schools. Twelve of those are in Rancho Cordova this school year.

the eyes of kids who would never get these things otherwise," Emily Butler said. "It's very valuable, and it's only possible because we focus on public schools."

Just a generation or two ago, kids played outdoors as a matter of course. "When I talk to people from my mother's generation, it's very rare I find somebody who doesn't say, 'Oh, totally, I used to catch salamanders in the ditch behind my uncle's place," Emily Butler said. Nowadays such an inherent relationship with nature often does not happen.

The essence of Splash boils down to three main goals: The first is to build bridges to nature; the second, to inspire elementary school students to get into the science pipeline and to help alleviate the serious shortage in the United States of engineers and scientists; and lastly, to foster environmental stewardship. As Emily Butler said, "It's about experiencing it, it's about learning about it, and then it's about coming back and saying,

In the Splash program, each child takes on the identity of one of the critters of the vernal pool environment, and learns about it in detail. The kids identify so fully with their own critter that when they go out to Mather Field they call each other by that name.

ceed through three stations, starting with the microscope station, where "we have little live aquatic critters under each of 12 microscopes," Emily Butler said.

The second station is the critter station where there are frogs, toads, salamanders, snakes, rabbits, voles, turtles, and more. "They're all rescue animals, and they have some reason why they can't live in the wild," said critter keeper Lu-Anne Spencer-Hartle.

The third station is the watershed model where kids learn about how to prevent water pollution.

The outdoor exploration that comes next is the crux of the whole experience. "This is where you get the kids out into nature's outdoor classroom. They get to dip into the pool, see what they can catch," Emily Butler said.

Dan Anklam, principal of Cordova High School and a former biology teacher, said that emphasis on standards-based education killed science in elementary school because testing is in math and English.

"Thank you for what you're doing," Anklam said. "We always said, science is a verb."

they are really stepping up in a way that I've never experienced in any other community, because they really want arts here.'

Besides the walls of art, show openings at City Hall generally include something extra, such as the best creatively made hat contest at the last opening. This time, the reception featured performance art by three Hoyt sisters: Tabitha, 16, Kaitlin, 13, and Jacalyn, 12, who presented a Haunted Tea Party in CosPlay. CosPlay, Smith explained, is short for costume play. Each sister was artistically dressed and made up and posed at a table with a Mad Hatter type tea set.

The four art shows a year are sponsored by the Cordova Community Council, and Smith specifically mentioned the importance of its efforts and also the work of Rancho Arts, with all the various art programs that they each support throughout the city. Smith teaches art for the Sacramento City School District and also classes at Michaels in the Target shopping center. She recently received a grant to do a mural with the Sacramento Special Education system. She teaches occasional free workshops at the library, as well as giving private lessons and classes.

In September, Smith was one of 20 artists chosen from around the world by Golden Artist Colors, Inc., to participate in a workshop for seven days in New Orleans.

"Not only did I get there and get an education, but I got to meet these incredible people who are doing the same thing I do, in terms of community workshops and growing our art culture here," Smith said. "It was probably one of the most educationally stunning weeks of my life."

Artists attended from Brazil, Netherlands, Wales, Canada, Mexico, and the United States.

They have generously given me a little taste of everything, so now I can share it with Rancho Cordova," Smith said. "That's pretty exciting, because there are only 20 of us all over the world, and we're Rancho Cordova, and we have it."

There are several of Smith's students with paintings in the Fall Show. One of them is Izze Greene, 17. Izze attends Cordova High School and has been interested in art ever since she was old enough to draw and paint. She is apparently following in the steps of Leonardo da Vinci in that she is a creative generalist. Among the other media she works or wants to work in are sculpting, wire work, papier-mâché, mixed media, photography, filmmaking, writing, fashion, and languages. Right now she is learning Japanese. "It's pretty confusing, but it's fun," she said.

Izze has been taking art classes at Michaels for a while. "When Victoria came in I wanted to go to more of her classes, because she's a really great mentor and she has a lot to teach everyone," Izze said.

You can see the varied artwork hanging at Rancho Cordova City Hall from now through Jan. 17th, 2016.

## **Regional San to Open Recycled Water Fill Station**

New Fill Station to Offer Free, Recycled Water for Residential and Commercial Users

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On September 30th, 2015, Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District (Regional San) will open a Recycled Water Fill Station at the Sacramento Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant in Elk Grove. Regional San will offer residential and commercial users the opportunity to get a free, environmentally responsible and safe water supply to irrigate lawns, gardens, and landscaping, or for dust control or other permitted uses.

Initially, this program will be limited to the first 500 users to sign up, and is expected to run until the rainy season sets in, possibly through October, while Regional San gauges the logistics and popularity of the program. "With the extended drought, conservation of potable water supplies is more important than ever. The new recycled water fill station is just one component of our sustainable water recycling program, which aims to reduce the region's dependence on precious groundwater and surface water," said Prabhakar Somavarapu, district engineer for Regional San. Regional San plans to reopen the fill station in spring 2016 and hopes to increase participation, based on findings from the current year.

The Recycled Water Fill Station Project will feature several connection bays for users to fill approved containers or commercial water trucks. Interested users must sign up in advance of the September 30th facility opening at www.regionalsan. com/fill-station. Participants must live in, and use the recycled water in the Regional San service area. Participation is limited and requires completion of a permit application and a brief training session.

program currently provides up to 3.5 million gallons per day of tertiary-treated recycled water to irrigate to a number of parks, street medians, and commercial and school sites in the Laguna West, Lakeside, and Stone Lakes developments in Elk Grove, in partnership with the Sacramento County Water Agency.

It is easy for me to conceive and see this time of year with color. We begin to prepare for the colder weather and the rain falling in the valley, and we begin to changealong with the weather. Dolly Parton said, "The way I see it, if you want the rainbow, you gotta put up with the rain." 



### The House **Republican Meltdown**

At least they aren't brawling the way they do in the South Korean parliament -- at least not yet.

House Republicans have over the past month seen their speaker, John Boehner, announce his imminent resignation under pressure and his heir apparent, Kevin McCarthy, suddenly give up on trying to succeed him -- all while the party enjoys a comfortable majority and faces no external threat from Democrats.

The Republican nervous breakdown is entirely self-inflicted. Understanding the House caucus is less Politics 101 than scorpions in a bottle. The right of the caucus hates and distrusts the leadership, while most of the rest of the caucus hates and distrusts the right, and no one has the standing to bring all sides together in a semblance of unity.

With McCarthy, the current majority

leader, shocking the political world by giving up his speaker bid, it's not clear who can pick up the pieces. Some even speculate (although this is far-fetched) that Republicans will have to go to Democrats to forge a bipartisan coalition to fill the office, which would be a humbling concession that Republicans aren't capable of governing the House on their own.

McCarthy is a pol's pol who has good personal relations with other Republicans. He had a strong majority of the caucus backing him for speaker, but that wasn't enough. He needed to get 218 votes on the House floor, a threshold that gave the several dozen members of the conservative House Freedom Caucus the ability to block him. It is this blocking power that the group has used again and again in legislative fights to frustrate the leadership. The right made Speaker John Boehner miserable, and ultimately ousted him in a demonstration of the power of a determined legislative faction.

No one is blameless in the House Republican civil war. The leadership is so unpopular with the grass roots because it has been unimaginative and timid, and the right of the caucus is correct to want to prod and challenge it.

Of course, there are limits to what even the shrewdest congressional

leadership can achieve when the other party controls the White House, but House GOP leaders never advanced a substantive alternative agenda on major issues and weren't willing to push the envelope in their fight with the president over his executive abuses. Both the House and Senate leadership were mostly content to restore "regular order," a priority that could inspire only a few subcommittee chairmen.

On the other hand, the right in the House has had a clearer view of what it opposes than of what it supports, and often has seemed willing to burn the place down in the cause of symbolic purity.

We're still a long way from the sort of chaos that gripped the House in 1855, when the politics of slavery scrambled congressional politics such that it took months and more than 100 ballots to get a new speaker. Eventually, someone among House Republicans will have the credibility and creativity to get to 218, perhaps when exhaustion with the internecine warfare takes hold.

One only hopes that no one starts throwing chairs before then.

dogs, including service and military dogs, and other rescued pets that have become an inspiration to pet advocates.

Unlike responsible breeders, puppy mills have destructive breeding practices, and care can be brutal: for example, they'll attempt to produce as many litters of popular dog breeds as possible, exhausting and often physically abusing breeding dogs, selling the best and mistreating the rest. Mill dogs often are kept in tiny, dirty cages, with little to no medical care.

Puppy mill rescues gain access to and liberate such dogs, try to have the mills shut down, and provide care and rehabilitation for the rescued dogs. They'll also try to find homes for dogs that are able to be adopted, but sadly, many are unable to live with a family. Hopefully, through legislation and continued vigilance, puppy mills can become a thing of the past.






## **AUTUMN TIPS FOR OUTDOOR LANDSCAPING**

- SAVE YOUR TREES: Capture the water that runs while your shower warms up, and use it to water your trees.





# **CORDOVA SPORTS Cordova Football Suffers First SVC Loss**

**BANCHO CORDOVA. CA (MPG)** - On its final offensive drive at Lancer Stadium on October 16th, the Cordova High School football team appeared to be headed toward its second consecutive Sierra Valley Conference victory over Liberty Ranch's squad.

Instead, the Lancers lost a tough 28-26 contest to the Hawks. Cordova (1-1 in the SVC, 4-3) had the ball on Liberty Ranch's 15-yard-line with two minutes and two seconds left in the game.

"What coach wouldn't want to be in that position," said Cordova Head Coach Darren Nill.

Lancer quarterback Unique Perez threw a touchdown pass on the drive. But the Lancers were called for illegal motion that pushed the ball back to the Hawks' 20. Two plays later, another TD pass was thrown, but the Lancers were hit with another yellow flag, this time for offensive pass interference. That pushed the ball back to the Lancers' 30 yard line.

Then a pass was thrown that the Hawks intercepted, getting the ball back and ending the Lancers' chances of winning the game.

'We took what they gave us," Nill said. "We were moving the ball fairly well...just fell a little short."

All of the Lancers' losses have been by a combined eight points.

"That's tough," Nill said. "They were going to run the ball, we were going to pass. They are extremely good at what they do."

Cordova finished with 415 total offensive yards; 351 in the air. Liberty Ranch had 547 total offensive yards with 515 on the ground.

The Lancers came out with an oddman defensive front against the Hawks.

"That seemed to slow them down a bit," Nill said. "I don't think they were

prepared for it. We caught them offguard a little bit. I think that helped keep the score close."

"We held our own," said Cordova Head Coach Eric McCahon after the game. "But we were just a little out of sorts tonight. This is a tough place to play."





**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Rancho Cordova legends were honored by the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association with a new sports tradition on October 17th. The first ever inductions into the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame was held at City Hall and attracted a full house of over 350 attendees. The event was hosted by the ever-entertaining Ken Rudolph from Good Day Sacramento.

The Rancho Cordova Athletic Association was formed in 2013 to foster lifelong values of good sportsmanship, teamwork and healthy active lifestyles through development of excellent youth sports facilities and organizations, positive coaching, and access to play for all.

To be elected to the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame, inductees were judged to have attained significant achievements in or contributions to athletics, as well as exhibiting high standards of character and sportsmanship.

The event was organized by the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association in partnership with the Cordova Community Council. Congratulations to the Hall of Fame selection committee and the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association organization. The event was truly an inspiration to the entire community.

Rancho Cordova Sports luminaries inducted included:

•1975 Lancers Football Team: Considered by many to be the best football team to ever come out of this part of the country, the '75 Lancers was the State Team of the Year and was close to being a mythical national champion. Cordova went 102-6-1 in the 1970s, which was not only the best record in the state, but the best in the nation. •Guy Anderson: One of the winningest coaches in high school baseball history, Anderson led the Cordova Lancers team for 45 years as varsity coach and a National High School Hall of Fame inductee.

- •Chris Bosio: A Cordova High School baseball notable pitcher, Bosio went on to play Major League Baseball including a no-hitter in 1993 for the Seattle Mariners against the Boston Red Sox. He is currently a pitching coach for the Chicago Cubs.
- •Christy Bowles: At Cordova High School, Bowles was an area Hall of Fame softball catcher, a MVP field hockey player, and area Hall of Fame Female Athlete.
- •Rod Connors: A Cordova High track standout, Connors was a State Meet 400 Meters winner. His 1975 USC freshmen mile relay record still stands.
- •Duane Fidel: A Cordova High wrestling standout, a three-time Delta League and three-time Sub Section wrestling champion.
- •Dewey Guerra: (Deceased) Considered by some to be the greatest high school football coach in the country, he was the head coach of the 1975 Lancers and led Cordova to 10 straight championships.
- •Doug Hawkes: (Deceased) The longtime Grapevine Independent newspaper publisher and sports writer, Hawkes' "Sports on the Eastside" column was a constant chronicle of Rancho Cordova athletics and sports history for decades.
- •Geoff Jenkins: A Cordova High School baseball standout who also played football and basketball. Jenkins was a first round draft pick for the Milwaukee

Brewers and also played for the Philadelphia Phillies.

- •Helen Klein: A nationally-recognized senior ultra-marathoner, Klein was in the inaugural class of the Sacramento Running Association Hall of Fame, with dozens of ultra-marathons and records to her credit.
- •Ron Lancaster: A coach who was also part of the 1970s Cordova High Football juggernaut, Lancaster's storied career began in Rancho Cordova where he went 59-3 and won four Section titles.
- •Randy Lerch: A Cordova High School baseball pitcher, Lerch played professional baseball for the Milwaukee Brewers, Philadelphia Phillies, Montreal Expos and San Francisco Giants from 1975 to 1986.

e •Jerry Manuel: A three-sport star

in football, basketball and baseball. Following a six-year MLB career he went on to managing the Chicago White Sox, where he earned "Manager of the Year" honors.

- •Clarke Massey: (Deceased) A longtime Cordova High School coach in football, track and cross country, Massey coached the defensive line of the 1979 champion football Lancers, and 10 straight track championships at Cordova High.
- •John McCants: (Deceased) McCants was a legendary Cordova High School Coach in basketball, swimming and track, who helped launch girls' high school sports at Cordova High, particularly in the sport of softball.
- •Mike McCullough: Cordova High School grad McCullough earned

a full ride basketball scholarship to Utah State and has risen to the top of the NBA's Miami Heat—not as a player, but as a businessman.

- •Max Miller: Miller coached for 28 years within the Sac-Joaquin Section, compiling a 254-90-4 record as the head coach. His 1985 Cordova team was a Sac-Joaquin Section championship winner and was the Section's first 14-0 football team.
- •Laurie Salo: Salo followed up her Cordova High softball career at UC Davis where she was named to the All Region First Team in both 1986 and 1987. She was the Dr. Hubert Heitman Female Athlete of the Year winner in 1987.
- •Joel Smith: Smith is the most decorated Cordova High triple jumper in history, and still holds records at the high school and college level.

and San Francisco Forty-Niners and Green Bay Packers.

- •Gerald Willhite: At Cordova High, Willhite was a wrestler, graduating in 1977. Hewent on to play football for San Jose State and was drafted in the first round by the Denver Broncos, playing for them in Super Bowl XXI.
- •Kevin Willhite: A 1981-82 Cordova High track and football star, Willhite was one of the greatest running backs in California prep history, rushing for 4,901 yards and scoring 72 touchdowns.
- •Colette Winlock: From the Cordova High School Class of 1973, Winlock was a standout among female athletes. She won a full ride track scholarship to California State Hayward where she was a two-time All American. She was inducted into the Cal State East Bay Sports Hall of Fame in 1996.
- •Max Venable: A multi-sport ath- •Larry Wolfe: Wolfe was a Lancer

- lete at Cordova High, Venable was a star of the 1975 Lancer Football team. While he excelled in all sports, he turned down football scholarships to sign with the Los Angeles Dodgers. He also played for the San Francisco Giants and other teams.
- •Seneca Wallace: Wallace lettered in football and basketball at Cordova High where he won multiple football honors. He was drafted into the NFL in 2003, and has played for the Seattle Seahawks, the Cleveland Browns, New Orleans Saints,

baseball star who went on to Sacramento City College and headed for Major League Baseball in 1971. A third baseman, he played for the Minnesota Twins and Boston Red Sox.

 Reggie Young: A high school All American, Young was a threeyear starter for legendary teams that went 35-1, including the 1975 Lancers where he played as a sophomore. He played two years for the University of Oregon. ★



Every so often the search for something reasonable to watch on television must be undertaken. But, as usual, the search fails to disclose any worthwhile results, and we resort to falling back into sports for entertainment, even if all there is to choose from is a playoff baseball blowout between two teams we care little about, or some sloppy NFL game between two losing teams from the East Coast.

We get so easily frustrated scrolling through the guide. Channel, after channel, after channel gets a shake of the head. A bunch of run-of-the-mill cops-and-robbers series...a few over-acted courtroom dramas...some "shocking" doctor/hospital shows...several dumbed-down talk shows...some "introspective" panel bits...too many unrealistic reality shows... much too real news programs... a wide assortment of HGTV-type stuff that only make you jealous and hungry...sitcom and old movie reruns...and on and on they go...

We seem to always go back to the games. But, then, they aren't as inspiring when your teams aren't playing, are just plain lousy or out of contention, or happen to be on their bye week. You might consider turning the tube off (??) and do some reading, but it's too early in the evening to fall asleep. You just want to lay on the couch like some rotting log and soak up some kind of nonsense that will, at least, keep your attention.

You know what they oughta do for people like us? They oughta take some of the ideas from all of those other TV shows and combine them with sports themes, and see what might become of that.

They could have a cop show that has some crazy star football player that kills a former teammate; or one that has a player that keeps disturbing the neighborhood with a lot of wild parties that result in some sexual assaults; or, in part two of that episode, that fella has a friend with a gun fetish that races off to practice in the morning after a drunken all-nighter and crashes his car into a tree, and then both guys get arrested and kicked off the team.

They could have a courtroom drama in which, let's say, a former Olympic track and field champion --- and let's spice it up and make him a double-amputee named... uh, Oscar --- murders his beautiful model girlfriend on Valentine's Day. But with some lame excuses and technicalities through the long, drawn out process, the guy gets off easy by being convicted only of manslaughter, and is sentenced to one year in prison and four years of house arrest that he will spend living luxuriously in his uncle's mansion, with the freedom to leave to go to church (!!!) or to work (back on the track?). You can just feel the venom oozing from the family of the deceased victim.

The back-story would reveal that our guy --- call him, Lamar --- was found passed out from an overdose of some recreational drugs in a love-ranch brothel somewhere in Nevada. After days of hand-wringing, Lamar slowly opens his eyes and comes to, and the family rejoices in "his unrelenting strength and faith in God" that pulled him through. Okay.

How about a stupid talk show panel of simple-minded baseball players dressed in suits that are too tight --- name it Dr. Pete --- talking about their own insecurities, saying things like, "I have a PhD in getting booed," and mixing in some nervous chuckles and insincere fistbumps. (You'll need a laugh track).

Reality shows would be easy... A Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback, a spoiled brat, isn't making it in the NFL and his teammates can't stand him. He goes into alcohol rehab for too short of a stint. He comes back, but doesn't play very well as a backup. He gets into a roadside fight with his drunk "girlfriend" and somebody calls 911. The pair give conflicting accounts and the police allow them to drive away together. Or, a basketball superstar who thinks he is Superman gets busted at the airport with a gun in his carry-on bag. Or, a Hall of Fame basketball coach going through a divorce as a result of his persistent infidelities has his current program under investigation for soliciting "strippers" (?) to entertain recruits at a party in his school's athletic dormitory. Or, a couple of high school football players attack an official on the field during a game under orders from one of their coaches.

An investigative report might uncover that a part-owner and general manager of a money-skimping Major League Baseball franchise is among the top-ten worst violators of water-saving policies in a drought-stricken state on his multimillion dollar estate in a gated community, far from the madding crowd.

## Sacramento County **DA Reports** Recent cases of interest

#### CASE: John Matta

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Sheri Greco, Homicide Unit

Fifty-four-year-old John Matta was convicted by jury of the first-degree murder of his mother.

On May 18, 2014, John Matta killed 75-year-old Janet Matta in their Antelope home. Matta beat and choked his mother to death. She died from blunt force trauma and asphyxiation. John Matta had a documented history of elder abuse against his mother.

Matta faces a sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 17, 2015, at 3:00 p.m. in Department 39 before the Honorable David Abbott.

#### CASE: Jason Wymer

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Forty-four-year-old Jason Wymer was convicted by jury of multiple sexual assault and exploitation charges.

In January 2013, a citizen tried to text a photo of her 8-year-old daughter to a family member. The photo was instead received by Jason Wymer, who was unknown to the sender. Wymer began texting the sender requesting more photos and began communicating in a sexually explicit manner to who he thought was an 8 year old. The FBI began an investigation, which revealed thousands of images and videos of child pornography taken from 2010 to 2011 in Sacramento and San Joaquin counties. The images included children and toddlers engaged in sexual acts with adults. Several images showed a 3-year-old child being sexually abused by Wymer and co-defendant Stormy Mollissa Myers.

Wymer faces a maximum potential sentence in excess of 100 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 20, 2015, at 11:00 a.m. in Department 38 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras.

Thirty-five-year-old Stormy Mollissa Myers pled guilty to committing a sex



act with a child under 10 years old and committing lewd acts upon a child. Pursuant to the plea agreement, Myers will be sentenced to 15 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for February 26, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 38 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras. Myers will also plead to federal charges of sexual exploitation of a minor.

CASE: Hector Caballero & Damian Flores

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Kari Reeve, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

Twenty-year-old Hector Caballero was convicted by jury of first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit a crime. Twenty-five-year-old Damian Flores was convicted of second-degree murder and conspiracy to commit a crime. The jury also found gun and gang allegations true for both defendants.

Caballero and Flores are Norteños gang members. On November 23, 2013, they walked the neighborhood of their rival Sureños gang confronting individuals they thought were members. They approached Ricardo Guerro and asked if he was a Sureño. Mr. Guerro said he was not a gang member, and he was not intimidated by them. Perceiving this response as disrespectful, Caballero shot him twice. The victim died almost instantly.

Once incarcerated, both defendants attempted to send notes to fellow gang members directing them to intimidate and threaten witnesses. The notes were eventually confiscated by law enforcement.

Caballero has two prior strike convictions, both gang related felony assaults. Flores has a prior strike conviction, a felony assault with a firearm.

Both defendants face a maximum potential sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for November 5, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. in Department 26 before the Honorable Curtis Fiorini.
