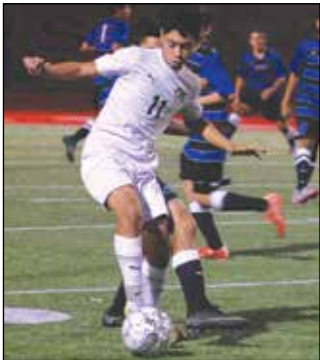

Halloween Candy Buyback

Local Dentist Aiming at Saving Teeth and Treating Troops



The week after Halloween, dentist Jose Juarez will be buying back Halloween candy and donating it to U.S. troops through Operation Gratitude. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - For those who dread seeing their children gobble down all that Halloween candy, pediatric dentist Jose Juarez has an alternative. He will buy back up to five pounds of candy at \$1 per pound and send it in a care package to our troops via Operation Gratitude—and include toothbrushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, and floss as well. His office at 2340 Sunrise Blvd., Suite 25, in Rancho Cordova will accept the candy during office hours Monday through Friday following Halloween.

The mission of Operation Gratitude is "to lift the spirits and meet the evolving needs of our active duty and veteran communities, and provide volunteer opportunities for all Americans to express their appreciation to members of our military."

This is not the first time Juarez has

participated in the buyback/donation program, but it is the first time since opening his Rancho Cordova office in February. He joined in the program before with the dentists at his previous office in Stockton. "We did get many people bringing candy in, so I'm hoping to have that same success here at this office," Juarez said.

Juarez's grandfather was a major in the Army, and Office Practice Manager Danielle Mendoza has had several family members in the military. Mendoza's father was in the Marines, and her brother and sister in the Army; her brother is still on active duty. "They've actually received those boxes from the candy buyback," Mendoza said. "I can tell you right now, from their experience, it's like gold to them."

Smile Kingdom Dental is a unique dental office experience for children and youth of all ages up to 19. The entire office is decorated in

knight and castle style, with the reception area serving as the entrance. New patients start out in the Enchanted Forest and if any "sugar bugs" are found, they receive treatment in either the Knight Room or the Princess Room. Everything is calming and non-traumatic. Televisions in the ceiling provide movies above each treatment chair.

"I use a very unique local anesthetic unit called Wand STA," Juarez said. "It's very fitting for our office, because we're in a castle, so I refer to it as a magical wand whenever I numb up a child's tooth." He said the unit provides a painless, stress-free alternative for anesthetic.

While his previous office included multiple dentists, this office is a single-doctor one, allowing for familiarity and consistency in treatment for children. Juarez has lived in Rancho Cordova for eight years, and he and

Physicians Warn of Halloween Eye Risk

Over-the-Counter Contact Lenses Could Contain Dangerous Chemicals

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Every Halloween, costume contact lenses fly off the shelves as people look to accentuate their outfits with those appealing visual accessories. These non-prescription lenses, however, can cause potentially blinding infections.

To help prevent eye damage and vision loss, the California Academy of Eye Physicians and Surgeons (CAEPS) and the American Academy of Ophthalmology (AAO) are warning costume shoppers about over-the-counter decorative lenses after a recent study found that several varieties tested positive for chlorine and other harmful chemicals.

"While Halloween costumes complete with over-the-counter contact lenses can be fun, many people do not consider the possible damage these seemingly harmless accessories could be doing to their eyes," said Leah Levi, MD, CAEPS president. "We take Californians' vision very seriously, so we believe the safest way to avoid any potential loss of vision or eye damage is to avoid costume contacts altogether."

Research published in September found the potentially harmful substances in three types of cosmetic contact lenses produced in Ireland, Taiwan, and South Korea. Iron was found in four pairs of lenses. One pair seeped chlorine after a routine rinse, prompting concern from researchers about toxicity to the eye. The chemicals likely come from colorants used to tint and create playful patterns on the lenses. The study also noted that colorants printed or pressed onto some decorative lenses create an uneven texture. Those rough surfaces could scratch the eyes, potentially allowing in bacteria that can cause infection and even blindness.

Four of the five lenses in the study are not available legally in the United States because they are not approved by the US Food and Drug Administration. Despite

Once again, the Whole Foods Marketplace at the Palladio in Folsom played host to the Whole Lotta Brews Festival. The fundraiser offered over 75 different stations where guests could sample beer, wine, and food from throughout the region. Local Sacramento entertainers The Used Blues Band set the backdrop for a perfect autumn night. The \$30-\$40 ticket price gave eventgoers a small tasting mug where free beer samples could be taken from each of the tents. Among the many tasting stations was River City Brew. River

City Brew was kicked out of the old Westfield shopping center to make way for the new stadium, and are now anxious to move into their new location, coming soon to the Milago Center on Marconi and Fair Oaks. “We’re really excited about moving and all the extra space the new location has to offer,” said the pourer at the booth. But while they may be in transit, the quality of their beer hasn’t suffered. Other notable local breweries included the American River Brewing Company and Track 7 Brewing Company. Both had tasty IPAs to offer. The IPAs were the trend at the majority of the booths, featuring red, white, American, and European IPAs.

Last year, the festival raised over \$27,000, a number that is sure to be topped this year because the event expanded. An upgrade from last year was a larger row of portable toilets, allowing patrons to do more socializing and less standing in line. Another feature was the cornhole game, where patrons could compete by throwing a bean bag into a hole on a plank of plywood from 27 feet away. Cornhole is a common game at tailgate gatherings and barbecues. Finally, one could swing by the Fork in the Road Foods tent to grab a full-size spicy chicken sausage or the Chicago Fire tent to get some thin-crust pizza. ★

Ken Cooley Honored as One of Three Legislators of the Year

Assembly Member Recognized for His Leadership in Passing Regulatory Framework for Medical Marijuana that Protects Local Control, Public Safety, and Patient Access

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

Recently, Assembly Member Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) received one of three Legislator of the Year Awards from the League of California Cities during the organization’s 2015 Annual Conference and Expo in San José. The top honor was given to Assembly Member Cooley for his leadership in passing the League-supported Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act.

Along with Assembly Member Cooley, the League also recognized Sen. Jim Beall (D-San José) for his long-term commitment to transportation issues and his efforts in the most recent legislative sessions to provide a new, sustainable source of funding for California’s state highway and local streets and road system and Assembly Member Luis Alejo (D-Watsonville) for his dedication to advancing legislation that would restore a redevelopment tool for local communities.

Assembly Member Cooley, a former League first vice president and Rancho Cordova mayor and council member, agreed in late 2014 to serve as author of AB 266, the League and California Police Chiefs Association’s sponsored medical marijuana regulatory framework legislation. AB 266 ultimately became authored by Assembly Member Rob Bonta (D-Alameda) and became part of a legislative package that comprises AB 243 (Wood) and SB 643 (McGuire). This package is known as the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act and is on Gov. Jerry Brown’s desk awaiting action.

League President and Scotts Valley Council Member Stephany Aguilar helped present the award to her former

colleague on the League board of directors. “I am honored to recognize Ken for his vision and leadership in crafting such a solid framework for medical marijuana. His work on this critical issue was instrumental in ensuring that the framework contains strong provisions, which protects the public, local control, and patient safety and access.”

Assembly Member Cooley: “I’m honored to be named League of Cities’ Legislator of the Year. When I agreed a year ago to author the League’s medical marijuana bill, my aim was not simply to support strong local control. I also felt that I could help bring this issue to a successful end after its repeated failures and such a breakthrough would strengthen the institution for future challenges. With the support of the League of California Cities we were able to meet both of those goals this year and I am so very proud of what we have accomplished.”

Steering AB 266 through the various committees of the Assembly with energy and vision, Assembly Member


Cooley played a significant role in the drafting and amending of this legislation to ensure it retained the strong local control and public safety provisions that were absolutely imperative for the League’s and California Police Chiefs Association’s continued support. He never wavered in his support of the legislation or in his desire to collaborate with his fellow legislators on this important issue.

The final package of bills:

- Protects local control by ensuring that local jurisdictions have control of regulating local medical marijuana facilities in partnership with the state;
- Protects public safety by providing uniform security requirements and a well-defined set of criteria for state licensing, including a clear universe of disqualifying felonies and a framework for the vetting of license applicants;
- Protects public health with uniform health and safety standards; and
- Ensures patient safety with quality assurance protocols requiring random sample testing by certified laboratories for all medical marijuana sold in California.

Founded in 1898, the League of California Cities is an association of California city officials who work together to enhance their knowledge and skills, exchange information, and combine resources so that they may influence policy decisions that affect cities. The League’s mission is to restore and protect local control for cities through education and advocacy to enhance the quality of life for all Californians.

his wife have four daughters, ages 1 to 13. “They were actually my motivation for doing this particular motif for the office,” Juarez said. “[Children] come in and they don’t have the feeling this is a dental office...It’s almost like being in a different world for them.”

The field of pediatric dentistry was a positive and easy choice for Juarez, and he has loyal patients from his Stockton practice who

come all the way to his Rancho Cordova office for treatment.

“It was just a passion that I have for serving the community, for taking care of children in a very atraumatic environment, where they actually look forward to their dental appointments,” Juarez said. “I love what I do, every single day. Day in, day out, this is not work for me.”

Mendoza said that on the Operation Gratitude website the Smile Kingdom Dental was the

only participating dentist listed in Rancho Cordova. Mendoza has two children, ages 10 months and 4 years. “Honestly, they can’t wait to come back,” Mendoza said. “They get kind of upset when I get to go to the castle every day and they don’t.”

that sales restriction, many decorative lenses of unknown origin can be bought online. Around Halloween, they often crop up for sale at beauty parlors, flea markets, or even gas stations. The problem is that contact lenses not approved by the FDA may be made with materials that can harm the eyes by causing corneal ulcers or other corneal irritations or infections (keratitis). These conditions can result in scarring that impairs vision or causes blindness. For this reason, both Academies advise against wearing decorative lenses without a prescription.

"You can't be sure what you're getting when you buy over-the-counter contact lenses, which can be very dangerous to your eyes," said ophthalmologist Thomas Steinemann, MD, spokesperson for the AAO. "If you want decorative contact lenses, get a prescription or steer clear of them. It's not worth the risk to your vision."

Costume Contact Lens Safety Guidelines

To safely wear decorative contact lenses this Halloween or any time of year, the California Academy of Eye Physicians and Surgeons and the American Academy of Ophthalmology recommend following these guidelines:

- Only buy decorative contact lenses from retailers who require a prescription and sell FDA-approved products.
- If you don't already have a contact lens prescription, obtain a valid prescription and eye exam from an ophthalmologist—a medical doctor who treats eye conditions and diseases—or an optometrist.

- Even those who don't require lenses to correct their vision need to get examined and fitted for the right size plano (zero power) cosmetic contacts by an eye health professional. Ill-fitting lenses can scratch the surface of the eye, creating an opening for infection.
- Redness, swelling, excessive discharge, pain, or discomfort can signal eye infection. If you have these symptoms, immediately see your prescriber. Eye infections can cause blindness if left untreated.

While he was there, he was called to treat the soldiers who were injured by a roadside bomb. He raced to do everything he could to help those in need. One soldier, who was the most seriously injured, was standing at death’s door. The medic stood beside him at that door, and with all his skill and knowledge, he pulled that soldier away from death’s door. He saved him from having to take his last breath. After treating our troops, he went on and helped the Iraqi men, women, and children who were also injured by that terrorist’s bomb. The medic continued to help them until his supplies were gone, and all he had left was a prayer. Then he gave them that too. True story.

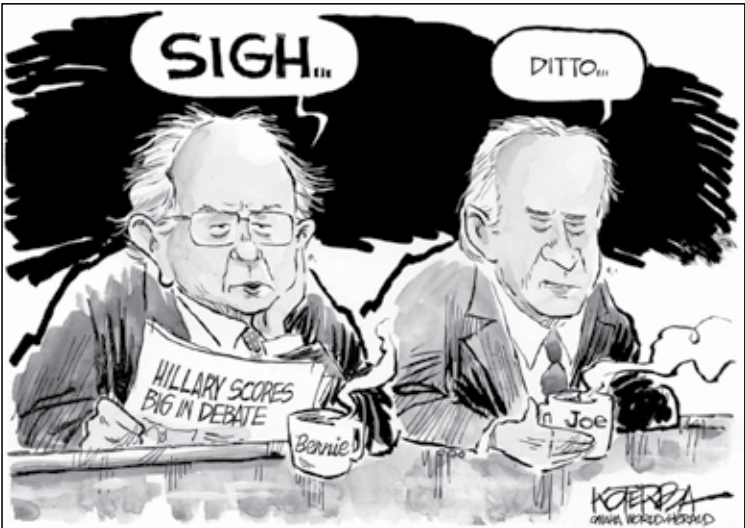

Bernie’s Foolish Crush on Sweden

Scandinavia is the American left’s Shangri-La. It is the land of social democracy and of all good things. It is the answer to any objection that new welfare benefits can’t be adopted here: *But look how well they work in Sweden.*

Bernie Sanders reverted to this article of faith when challenged over his socialism at the recent Democratic debate. He invited America to sit at the knee of Scandinavia. “I think we should look to countries like Denmark, like Sweden and Norway,” he said, “and learn from what they have accomplished for their working people.”

There are a couple of things wrong with the left’s romance with these countries, as Swedish analyst Nima Sanandaji notes in a recent monograph. It doesn’t fully appreciate the sources of Nordic success, or how Scandinavia has turned away from the socialism so

alluring to its international admirers.

The first thing to know is that Scandinavia is inhabited by Scandinavians, a hardworking, responsible people who have had high levels of social trust and cohesion for a very long time. These are splendid qualities. As Sanandaji points out, Scandinavia already had high life expectancy and other health indicators before it expanded its welfare state, and already had more equal societies.

No one remembers, but Scandinavia wasn’t always a watchword for social democracy. Indeed, Sweden was such a free-market success story that Republicans should be citing it in their debates. It started as a poor country in the late 19th century, then achieved takeoff under a dynamic capitalist system into the middle of the 20th century. Its boom coincided with the time when its taxes were lower than in the U.S. and the rest of Europe.

When Bernie Sanders and his ilk hold up Scandinavia as an exemplar, they are really thinking of a couple of decades beginning in the early 1970s when Sweden and others got their full Sanders on.

In Sweden, the effective marginal tax rate topped 100 percent in some circumstances. There is a reason that IKEA founder Ingvar Kamprad fled the country in 1973. Sweden instituted a scheme to confiscate corporate profits and hand them over to labor

unions. The idea was, in the words of a Swedish economist, to have “a market economy without individual capitalists and entrepreneurs.”

This was about as logical as it sounded -- and delivered predictable results. The socialist golden years weren’t so golden for economic performance. Entrepreneurship plummeted. Job creation and wages sputtered.

The Scandinavian story the past few decades has been a turn against socialism. Taxes have fallen, and markets have been liberalized. Kamprad returned to Sweden.

If no one will mistake these countries for Texas, they allow enough economic openness to stay vibrant. “Scandinavian countries,” Sanandaji writes, “compensate for high taxes and labor market rigidities by following liberal policies in other areas, such as business freedom and openness to trade.” Denmark, of all places, is ranked 11th on The Heritage Foundation’s index of economic freedom, right above the United States.

Nothing will undermine the left’s faith in the Scandinavian model, but Bernie Sanders could learn a thing or two from the reformers in the countries that he so admires.

Do Charity Events Really Help Pets?

DEAR PAW’S CORNER: A local pet charity is going to hold a Halloween-themed pet walk, where participants bring their dogs in costume to parade along a local street. My question is, do these kinds of charity events really help pets in need? They just seem like chichi see-and-be-seen social gatherings without any real purpose. -- Dan in Long Beach, California

DEAR DAN: Charity events can do a tremendous amount of good for pets in need. Besides donations of food, blankets and other items, most shelters and nonprofits need cold hard cash in order to function. These events can raise quite a bit of money.

Many pet owners join in walks like these just for fun, and I think that’s fine. They’re proud of their pet and want to show it off, and it’s a great chance to socialize (as long as the dogs can handle large crowds).

However, if you’re also concerned about how your donation will be used, it doesn’t hurt to do some research first. What exactly does the charity support? (Some fund pet rescues or local shelters; others advocate for seniors and their pets, and so on.) How much of its funding goes directly to the cause being supported?

You can find the answer through watchdog groups like Charity Navigator (www.charitynavigator.org/), Guidestar (www.guidestar.org/Home.aspx) or the Wise Giving Alliance (www.give.org/). You also can check an approved nonprofit’s 990 tax forms from the IRS to see how efficiently donations are used.

If you’re still skeptical, save those funds and donate them directly to your local shelter, where you can ask someone how that money is used, and it generally travels the shortest path toward helping animals in need.

Sacramento County DA Reports

Recent cases of interest



CASE: Alex Bruno
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Morgan Gire, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

The Honorable Marjorie Koller sentenced Alex Bruno to 61 years to life in prison. On June 26, 2015, a jury convicted Bruno of two counts of attempted murder, each with enhancements for causing great bodily injury and discharging a firearm causing great bodily injury.

In September 2012, Nick Stevenson was at a family birthday party at their south Sacramento home. Alex Bruno disliked the Stevenson family and went to the house to get his girlfriend, who was at the party. As Bruno and his girlfriend pulled away from the house in their car, Bruno fired shots through the rear window. Mr. Stevenson was struck in the abdomen, critically injuring him. A 16-year-old friend of the family was struck in the back and seriously injured as he turned to run away from the gunfire.

The car Bruno was driving was recovered a week later. The District Attorney’s Laboratory of Forensic Services matched broken glass found inside the door frame of the car to the glass left at the scene. Witnesses were initially reluctant to identify the shooter, but ultimately came forward to identify Bruno, who remained at large for several months before his arrest.

DATE: October 22, 2015
CASE: Monica Njoku & Monterio Roberts

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Thomas Asker, Homicide Unit

Forty-five-year-old Monica Njoku and 43-year-old Monterio Roberts were convicted by jury of second-degree murder. The jury also found true a use of a deadly weapon allegation for Roberts.

Monica Njoku owned a house, which she rented out to single parents with dependents. On November 16, 2014, she demanded one of her tenants and the tenant’s baby leave the house immediately. Another tenant, Edward White, protested and told Njoku she had to give the tenant at least a 3-day notice, which led to a heated argument.

Njoku called her brother, Monterio Roberts, and her sister-in-law to come to the house. Roberts threatened Mr. White and Njoku began harassing the female tenant. When Mr. White called 911, Njoku locked Mr. White’s 2-year-old son out of the house. Roberts then pulled out a switch blade knife and attacked Mr. White. Njoku and her sister-in-law then jumped into the fight. Mr. White was stabbed three times in the torso. He died at the hospital from internal bleeding.

Roberts faces a sentence of 16 years to life in prison. Njoku faces of sentence of 15 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for January 8, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 16 before the Honorable Marjorie Koller.

DATE: October 16, 2015
CASE: William Joseph Dexter
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Domestic Violence Unit

The Honorable Richard Couzens sentenced 18-year-old William Joseph Dexter to 7 years in prison. On September 21, 2015, Dexter pled no contest to robbery with great bodily injury.

On July 2, 2015, a 73-year-old female victim went to the Raley’s supermarket. A teenage girl approached her in the parking lot and asked if she would give her a ride to her grandfather’s house. The victim agreed, but she needed to pick up her prescriptions first.

When the victim came back out to the parking lot, Dexter had joined the teen. The victim drove the pair through several nearby neighborhoods due to confusing directions from Dexter and his accomplice. The two also asked her to drive them to multiple houses.

During the drive, Dexter beat the victim with a crowbar, striking her numerous times on the head, arm, and hand causing great bodily injury. When the victim crashed the car, they stole her phone and ran from the scene. The victim suffered head injuries requiring 13 staples and a serious hand injury.

Believe It If You Want

It was just a few weeks before spring training preceding the 1969 baseball season when Frank McGraw returned to his high school to participate in an alumni basketball game. Little did anyone realize that what was about to transpire would be a lead-in to an eventual turning point in baseball lore. Better known as Tug, McGraw had been up and down from the minor leagues over his first three seasons with the New York Mets, but unbeknownst to him or anyone else, he was on the cusp of greatness. That fateful day --- January 10, 1969, before a sparse gathering at tiny Memorial Center Gym at St. Vincent's High School in Vallejo, Ca., --- was to be a day that would fuel McGraw's remarkable Major League Baseball career. It was the final alumni game for boys' basketball at the old school, that was transitioning to an all-girls school the next year, as a new high school for boys was being constructed --- the end of an era for the Saints, but the beginning of a new one for McGraw and the Mets. Not nearly as proficient on the basketball court as he was on the pitcher's mound, McGraw was in for a long night. The 6' 0" lefty was matched up on the floor against a lean, long-armed, 6'1" leaping point guard that could deal and shoot a little bit over the top. It was a clear mismatch, since there were no fastballs, curveballs or screwballs involved. The two players went after it in spirited, good-natured fashion for much of the game. McGraw managed to score just a pair of field goals and two free throws, while his counterpart scored 11 points and set up his teammates time and again for a lopsided 69-42 victory over the former Hilltoppers. McGraw (father of country singer Tim McGraw) grew

increasingly flustered and frustrated throughout the game. As hard as he tried, he just wasn't able to get much accomplished on the floor against the quick-handed, slashing guard of the Saints, and could be heard grumbling and muttering something to himself repetitiously all the while. After the final horn sounded, the players gathered on court to shake hands and congratulate one another. When Tug and his nemesis for the night met, the lanky victor just had to ask, "Mr. McGraw, I couldn't help noticing you were mumbling something out there during the game. What was that?" McGraw paused. He took a long, deep breath and his chest welled up with a sudden fortitude. He looked the youngster in the eyes with a soul-piercing sincerity and calmly, but firmly, said, "Ya Gotta Believe. Ya Gotta Believe." Going forward, McGraw would keep his personal mantra close to the vest...for a while; about four years. As the 1969 MLB season unfolded, McGraw's previously woeful Mets evolved into the Miracle Mets. A National League expansion team in 1962 (losing 120 games), the Mets had been a perennial bottom-feeder until their Amazin' Mets season, when they rose from the depths to go 82-39 to bypass the Chicago Cubs and finish first in the East at 100-62 in the first year of division playoffs. The Mets beat Atlanta in a three-game sweep to advance to their first World Series and defeated Baltimore in five games. McGraw came into his own as that season progressed, finishing 9-3 with 12 saves and a 2.24 ERA. Famously, the Mets would return to the Fall Classic in 1973. The team was mired in last place in the East that season in late August when a clubhouse meeting was

called. His competitive fires roaring deep inside and sensing similar frustrations to those he had felt so long ago on an inconsequential night on the hardwood, McGraw interrupted the proceedings and stirred things up with a sudden outburst... "Ya Gotta Believe!" he cried out. As any baseball fan worth a worn out resin bag should know, that call became a rallying cry for those Mets. The Mets went 27-12 down the stretch to take the division with a mere 82 wins. They clinched it with a McGraw save against the Cubs. Tug believed and went 5-0 with 12 saves and a 0.88 ERA over the final five weeks. With Willie Mays on the roster in his final season and Yogi Berra managing the troops, McGraw got the save over the Cincinnati Reds to clinch the NL pennant and the Shea Stadium scoreboard read, "Well you better believe." But the mighty Oakland A's dynasty of that era beat the Mets in a seven-game World Series. The Mets won it all in 1986 and now they are back again after dealing more misery to the Cubs. The Cubs just don't believe, because of the Curse of the Goat. The Cubs won back-to-back Series, but haven't won again since 1908. As the story goes, the Chicago owner, named Murphy, would not allow a fan to bring his goat, named Murphy, to a game at Wrigley Field and the fan cursed the Cubs forevermore. The Cubs faced the Mets this year in the playoffs and a guy named (Daniel) Murphy was unbelievable for New York. He homered in six straight play-off games, including all four in a sweep over Chicago for which he received the NLCS MVP Award. The Mets meet repeat American League champion Kansas City in this year's World Series. Which team believes in itself more? The one that wins, of course ★

Costly Mistakes for Cordova Football

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A week after losing a tough two-point Sierra Valley Conference home game, the Cordova High School football team was looking to bounce back on the road at El Dorado High. In their Oct. 23rd conference road game in Placerville, the Lancers trailed 19-14 with nine minutes left in the third quarter. But the host Cougars roared their way to a 36-14 win over Cordova (1-2 in the SVC, 4-4 overall). The loss is the Lancers' second consecutive in conference play. Now with two home games left, Cordova is in a must-win situation to earn a Sac-Joaquin Section playoff berth. Last Friday's game had the Cougars control the line of scrimmage on offense that led to 368 yards on the ground. "I thought their offensive line controlled our defensive line pretty well," said Cordova head coach Darren Nill. Before El Dorado scored its touchdowns to secure the win, Cordova had many offensive drives that ended with penalties. "We had a receiver that jumped up and gave a first down sign

and they (referees) threw a personal foul penalty, which ignited a much-needed first down," Nill said. "I had a holding call that killed a drive. I had a cheap shot after a 35-yard run 20 yards away from the play that cost us 15 yards. Uncharacteristic dropped passes. We kept shooting ourselves in the foot." Before the night was over, Cordova committed five turnovers; three interceptions, a

fumble and bad snap on a punt. "That certainly played a role," Nill said. "They (El Dorado) are a good team, no doubt about that." Leading the Lancers' offense was quarterback Unique Perez, who completed 27-of-36 passes for 317 yards and two touchdowns. He also led the team in rushing with 10 carries for 66 yards. Both of Perez's TD passes landed into the hands of wide receiver Devin Baldwin, who had 16 receptions for 203 yards. Lancer teammates Angel Garcia had six receptions for 49 yards and Isaac Black 3-44. Cordova finished with 401 combined yards. In the frosh/soph game, Cordova posted a 36-0 win over the Cougars. The Lancers improved to 2-1 in the SVC and 7-1 overall. Tonight, Friday, Nill and the Lancers will host SVC foe Union Mine (2-1 in the SVC, 5-3), which trailed Liberty Ranch 28-21, but lost 35-21. Kickoff for the SVC game is scheduled for 7:15 p.m. ★

Owls on the big stage

Temple hosts Notre Dame in the biggest game in school history

NOTRE DAME AT TEMPLE

Temple is nationally ranked for the first time since 1979 thanks to a 7-0 start highlighted by a Week 1 victory over Penn State. The Owls also have two decent road wins, at Cincinnati and East Carolina, but their four other wins have come against some of the worst teams in the nation — UMass, Charlotte, Tulane. Notre Dame clearly will be the best team Temple has played to date. The Fighting Irish have one loss, by two points at Clemson, and have wins over Texas, Virginia, Georgia Tech, Navy and USC on their résumé. Temple has been getting it done with the top defense, at least statistically, in the AAC, but it must be noted that the Owls allowed 557 yards to Cincinnati, 438 to UMass and 378 to East Carolina. Notre Dame features more firepower than any of those three teams. *Notre Dame 31-17*

STANFORD AT WASHINGTON STATE

Washington State, which lost at home to Portland State in Week 1, is playing meaningful games in the second half of the season for the first time in the Mike Leach era. The Cougars have won three straight Pac-12 games, including two on the road (Oregon and Arizona) and actually control their own destiny in the Pac-12 North. Tough tests await, however, starting with this week's visit from Stanford — another team that suffered a puzzling Week 1 defeat (at Northwestern). Since returning to the West Coast, the Cardinal have played as well as any team in the nation, reeling off six straight wins in very impressive fashion. Running back Christian McCaffrey has played his way into the Heisman discussion, and his team looks to be a legitimate contender to win the national title. *Stanford 37-21*

NORTH CAROLINA AT PITTSBURGH (THURSDAY)

The most important game in the ACC Coastal Division to date pits two of the most surprising teams in the nation. North Carolina has won six straight since losing to South Carolina in Week 1. The Tar Heels, as usual, are scoring a bunch of points, but the story in Chapel Hill has been the improvement of the defense under new coordinator Gene Chizik. Through seven games, UNC is allowing 350.0 yards per game and 4.9 yards per play, down from 497.8 and 6.5 last season. Will Muschamp (Auburn) and John Chavis (Texas A&M) were the two most celebrated defensive coordinator hires in the offseason, but Chizik has had the biggest impact. Pittsburgh has quietly jumped out to a 6-1 start (4-0 in the league) under first-year coach Pat Narduzzi. The Panthers' four league wins, however, have come by an average of 4.3 points, and their four victims have a combined four ACC wins. *North Carolina 31-21*

FLORIDA VS. GEORGIA (JACKSONVILLE)

Nothing will be official, but the SEC East title is basically on the line Saturday in Jacksonville. Florida is 4-1 in the league, with its lone loss by seven points at LSU. Even in defeat, Treon Harris passed his first test in his first start after Will Grier's suspension, throwing for 271 yards and two TDs and, most important, no interceptions. With a strong defense and potent running game, Florida can still be a very good team if Harris takes care of the ball. Georgia's once-promising season has taken several wrong turns in the past month. The offense has played well in only one SEC game, a 52-20 victory over South Carolina. The Bulldogs scored only two offensive touchdowns against both Vanderbilt (a win) and Tennessee (a loss); they scored only one TD against Alabama, and that was on an 83-yard run with the Tide holding a 38-3 lead; and then, two weeks ago, they were held without a TD in a 9-6 win over Missouri. The point? Georgia's offense is not very good right now. *Florida 27-17*

OLE MISS AT AUBURN

Left for dead after losing by 13 points to Memphis two weeks ago, Ole Miss is back in play in the SEC West after a surprisingly easy 23-3 win over Texas A&M on Saturday night. The Rebels, who have been decimated by injuries in recent weeks, outgained the usually potent Aggies 471-to-192 and were never threatened. Now Ole Miss controls its own destiny, thanks to an early season win at Alabama.

Auburn, picked by many (including *Athlon Sports*) to earn a spot in the College Football Playoff, appears headed toward a last-place finish in the SEC West. The Tigers dropped to 1-3 in the league with a 54-46 loss in four overtimes at Arkansas, and they still have games at Texas A&M and vs. Georgia and Alabama. *Ole Miss 31-21*

OKLAHOMA STATE AT TEXAS TECH

Oklahoma State is flying about as far under the radar as possible for a Power 5 team that has yet to lose a game this late in the season. The reason is pretty clear: a lack of quality wins. The Pokes are 4-0 in the Big 12, with three of the wins coming against teams that are a combined 0-11 in the league (West Virginia, Kansas State and Kansas) and the other over Texas by three points. This might be a really good team, but it's hard to get too excited at this point. Texas Tech is a very predictable 2-3 in the Big 12, with wins over the league's two worst teams (Iowa State and Kansas) and losses to the three best teams (TCU, Baylor and OU). The Red Raiders will have an opportunity down the stretch to make a move in the league standings. *Texas Tech 44-37*

HEISMAN RACE

1. **Leonard Fournette, RB, LSU** Fournette enjoyed another productive outing, rushing for 150 yards on 26 carries in the Tigers' 48-20 win over WKU. He did, however, fail to have a carry of at least 25 yards for the first time this season.
2. **Trevone Boykin, QB, TCU** The Horned Frogs had the week off. Boykin ranks second nationally with 425.6 total yards per game and is second in the nation in yards per pass attempt (10.2).
3. **Derrick Henry, RB, Alabama** Henry rushed for 143 yards on 28 carries and two touchdowns — including the game-winner with 2:24 remaining — to lead Alabama to a 19-14 win over Tennessee.



4. **Christian McCaffrey, RB, Stanford** McCaffrey was brilliant in the Cardinal's 31-14 win over Washington, rushing for 109 yards and one touchdown and catching five passes for 112 yard and a score. He ranks first in the nation with 259.7 all-purpose yards per game.
5. **Dalvin Cook, RB, Florida State** Cook was held to 82 yards and one TD on 17 carries as the Seminoles fell from the ranks of the unbeaten with a 22-16 loss at Georgia Tech. He still ranks second nationally in rushing (148.1 ypg) and is averaging 8.2 yards per carry.

PRIME TIME PLAYERS

In a battle of highly regarded West Coast quarterbacks, UCLA true freshman **Josh Rosen** outdueled Cal's Jared Goff, throwing for 399 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions in the Bruins' impressive 40-24 win over the Golden Bears on Thursday. ... NC State running back **Matthew Dayes** rushed for a career-high 205 yards (on only 16 carries) and scored two touchdowns in the Wolfpack's 35-17 win at Wake

Forest. ... USC sophomore **JuJu Smith-Schuster** caught eight passes for 143 yards and a TD to lead USC to a 42-24 win over Utah at the L.A. Coliseum. ... Freshman linebacker **Cameron Smith** was the star of the USC defense, intercepting three passes, including a 54-yard return for a score in the second quarter. ... Oklahoma's **Samaje Perine** had his most productive game of the season, rushing for 201 yards and four

touchdowns in the Sooners' 63-27 win over Texas Tech. Perine, who rushed for 1,713 yards as a true freshman, has topped the 100-yard mark only twice in 2015. ... **Tyler Ervin** became the first player to rush for at least 250 yards two times this season after running for 263 yards on 36 carries in San Jose State's 31-21 win over New Mexico. In late September, the senior rushed for 300 yards against Fresno State. ...

Connor Cook threw for 398 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions in Michigan State's 52-26 win over Indiana. ... USF quarterback **Quenton Flowers** rushed for 201 yards and three touchdowns and added 97 yards passing to help the Bulls top SMU 38-14. ... **Dak Prescott** competed 25-of-35 passes for 348 yards, rushed for 117 yards and accounted for six total touchdowns in Mississippi State's 42-16 win

STOCK REPORT

A Washington State has played its way into the Pac-12 title race by winning three straight league games for the first time since 2003. The Cougars, who are 3-1 in the Pac-12 after a 45-42 win at Arizona, host Stanford (5-0 in the league) on Saturday in the biggest game of the Mike Leach era.

V After showing signs of life in recent weeks — a five-point loss at Florida State followed by a 10-point win over Virginia Tech — Miami hit rock bottom with a 58-0 loss at home to Clemson. It was the worst defeat in the history of a program that claimed five national titles between 1983-2001. Head coach Al Golden was fired on Sunday.

A Colorado snapped a 14-game losing streak in Pac-12 play with a 17-13 win over Oregon State in Corvallis. The Buffs, who are 4-4, likely will need to win seven games to become bowl-eligible because they play 13 games in the regular season. They could qualify with a 6-7 mark if not all bowl slots are filled.

V Texas A&M's offense was held to 192 total yards, by far its worst effort of the season, and the Aggies failed to score a touchdown in a surprisingly one-sided 23-3 loss at Ole Miss. Sophomore quarterback Kyle Allen completed only 12 passes and averaged a paltry 2.6 yards on his 34 attempts.
