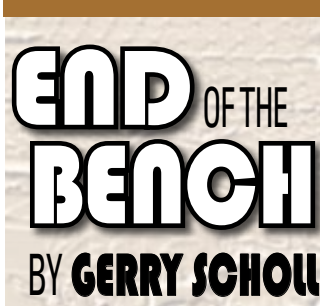

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A bombardment of fireworks lit up the skies topping off a two-day Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Celebration that attracted big crowds into Hagan Park for the annual summer-time bash.

The celebration kicked off on July 3rd and ramped up on Independence Day, featuring a wide array of activities that included a 5K run, hometown parade, festival, concerts, and fireworks.

The event, presented by the Cordova Community Council, drew big crowds, despite midday temperatures that topped 100 degrees.

July 4th activities got off to a quick start with the All America City 5K Run down Coloma Road, with hundreds of runners heading through Hagan Park. Presented by Rancho Cordova Immersion, the race wound its way

through neighborhoods along the American River and finished down the parade route.

As the run wrapped up, the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Parade began its journey down the same route as thousands lined the streets to cheer them on. Rancho Cordovan of the Year Amy Hiramoto, a longtime Rancho Cordova resident who has dedicated herself to children's causes, was Grand Marshal and led the parade atop the Mills One antique fire engine.

The parade included music by the Cordova High Fourth of July Marching Band, the Guardian Knights, and the Rancho Cordova River City Concert Band, which played aboard a trailer pulled by the Sacramento Sheriff's Department, among others.

Homemade floats, bunting-covered church entries, flag-waving scout groups,

**Leadership Rancho
Cordova Recruiting for
Class X, 2015-2016**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Leadership Rancho Cordova (LRC) launches a new class on a year-long exploration of the city this fall, and the search is on for eager students.

The mission of the LRC program is to develop community leaders, activists, visionaries, and advocates dedicated to the future of Rancho Cordova through all levels of community engagement.

The purpose of the program is to develop and engage leaders committed to making a difference in Rancho Cordova.

In the spirit of developing community leaders, the program, which is offered by the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce, enters its 10th year and now boasts more than 150 alumni—many currently serving in community leadership roles throughout the city and region.

The next class of approximately 25 students will be selected to represent a broad mix of backgrounds, ages, ethnicities, and employment—a key ingredient to a successful leadership program, according to Rachele Burton, Chair of the program's governing board.

“Community leadership and engagement can be complex, and we want to encourage and support a pool of local people who have taken the time to dig deep and study the many layers of Rancho Cordova,” said Burton.

Class X begins in October with a kick-off reception at City Hall, followed by a two-day retreat to immerse themselves in leadership fundamentals and begin the team-building process.

In November, the class begins monthly “modules” and explores topics such as the state of volunteerism, local government, arts and culture, education, land use and economic development, recreation and tourism, and public safety in Rancho Cordova, along with leadership lessons that pertain to each sector.

The group will also develop and execute a class project—the signature of their class. Past class

New Job Training Center in Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Young adults, parents, and community members who are completing their education now have a clearer pathway

to pursuing their futures.

The Folsom Cordova Sacramento Works Training Center recently opened in Rancho Cordova to provide

a natural transition between Folsom Cordova Unified School District's (FCUSD) Adult Education programs and free job training resources provided by the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership (FCCP) and Sacramento Works.

This partnership provides the access and support necessary for adults and youth to maintain their momentum on the pathway to success. The training center, located at 10826 Gladsten Way, offers free computer access for job-seekers, soft skills training, career-specific technical trainings, resume preparation assistance, and more. The center's goal is to increase the self-sufficiency of vulnerable families by

obtaining the skills and support needed to become employable.

During a recent ribbon-cutting event, local welder Briareos Coe said he was indebted to the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership's job-training assistance, which included his first welding class. After being previously incarcerated, he found it difficult to find a job. Now he's celebrating his one-year work anniversary.

“I went in to get skills to help build a life, but they gave me a lot more than that,” Coe said. “I love everything about my life now.” For more information, contact the FCCP at (916) 361-8684.

Freedmen’s Bureau Project to Make African American Records Available

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - When Linda Bradley of Sacramento got together with her sister and cousins to plan their family’s first reunion in the 1990s, she told the others that at family reunions someone always presents family history. They looked at her and said, “Okay, that will be your assignment.”

That was the beginning for her. “It went beyond just researching for the reunion,” said Bradley. “I’m still researching today. It became like a legal addiction.”

Bradley is a member of the African American Genealogical Society of Northern California, Inc., and is instrumental in the annual Sacramento African American seminars that take place every March at the Sacramento FamilySearch Library on Eastern Avenue. On June 19th, she was there to attend the broadcast of a press conference from the California African American Museum in Los Angeles. The broadcast announced the launch of the Freedmen’s Bureau Project for

the indexing and online publishing of records of an estimated four million African Americans from the Civil War era.

In 1865, the government-created

Freedmen’s Bureau gathered information to help with the transition of newly freed men and women and created over a million documents that when indexed can facilitate genealogy and family history research. FamilySearch, a nonprofit organization sponsored by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, purchased copies of these records from the National Archives and Records Administration, “which has carefully preserved and protected them for the American people,” said Elder D. Todd Christofferson of the Church’s Quorum of the Twelve Apostles.

“What one also sees in these records is triumph and hope and resilience,” Christofferson said at the conference. “What a great testimony to the sheer will and determination of this generation

of people who had so little, yet rose to freedom and dignity.”

For Bradley and others, the indexing will facilitate use of Freedmen’s Bureau records.

Researchers will only need to put the name into the search field in FamilySearch to bring up all records related to that name. Indexing will be done largely by African American researchers nationwide. The goal is to complete the work in time for the opening of the Smithsonian’s National Museum of African American History and Culture in late 2016. The Afro-American Historical & Genealogical Society and the California African American Museum are also collaborating with FamilySearch and the Smithsonian for this project.

Bradley delights in learning about her family members as individuals. She has created a large binder with the stories and records she has discovered, and she has more materials waiting to be organized. She considers it a living project with no end, a fascinating obsession.

“I have the 1865 marriage certificate for my grandfather’s grandfather,” Bradley said. “I also got where he initially bought one acre of land in Louisiana.” She has found microfilmed documents as far back as 1853 for the same person. “I got his parents, him with his siblings, in an 1853 estate probate record for the estate of one of the slave-holders. They listed the family valued at \$4,900.”

African American researchers will get first chance to index records. Technical assistance is available at the Sacramento FamilySearch Library at 2745

Eastern Avenue, located behind the LDS Church. According to Gordon and Janet Orchard, associate directors of the Library, in 2014 there were 7,600 visits and the site has over 80 trained volunteers to help patrons. “When you do indexing, it makes you on fire and it makes you excited to do it,” said Janet Orchard.

Besides the voluminous resources available at the Sacramento FamilySearch Library, the LDS church has family history centers at individual meetinghouses located throughout the Sacramento area. The family history center in the Rancho Cordova/Gold River area is at 1100 Cordova Lane in Rancho Cordova. It is open from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Rancho Cordova Receives \$2.5 Million for Veterans Housing

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova is one step closer to providing housing options and supportive services for local veterans. A \$2.5 million deferred loan from Proposition 41 and the Veterans Housing and Homeless Prevention Program will help close the gap in funding needed for Phase 2 of the much anticipated Mather Veterans Village project in Rancho Cordova.

Construction for Mather Veterans Village began in 2014 on a 3.65 acre site at 3611 Bleckely Street, adjacent to the Sacramento Veterans Administration Medical Center at the former Mather Air Force Base. Phase 1 of the Mather Veterans Village includes 44 one-bedroom and six two-bedroom supportive housing units together with offices and meeting space.

“I am happy to see Rancho Cordova and the Mather Veterans Village get this funding,” said Rep. Ami Bera, who worked with federal agencies to secure more Veteran housing vouchers for the Sacramento region. “Our veterans deserve our unwavering support for the sacrifices they’ve made, and the Mather Veterans Village will provide local veterans with critically needed housing options and supportive services. This project serves as a model for how to provide quality care for our veterans and honor the men and women who have served our country, and I applaud all of the

partners who have made it happen.” The City of Rancho Cordova continues to seek additional funding for Phase 2 of the project. This phase will include transitional housing for 46 men and women in dormitory-style lodging and support services including counseling, job training, medical assistance, group and individual therapy, and a healing environment.

“There is a great need for supportive housing for homeless and disabled veterans in Rancho Cordova and the surrounding region,” said Rancho Cordova Mayor Robert J. McGarvey. “Rancho Cordova is proud to be able to provide a new home for veterans who have served our country. This new funding will ensure we can continue to make our dream a reality by providing more housing and support services. I look forward to welcoming the first veterans in April 2016.”

Proposition 41 was approved by voters on June 3rd, 2014, and included the enactment of the Veterans Housing and Homeless Prevention Bond Act to authorize \$600 million in bonds to fund the acquisition, construction, and rehabilitation of multifamily low-income permanent and supportive housing for homeless and low-income veterans and their families.

Jerry Brown Signs SB 277 Vaccination Bill

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On June 30th, Governor Jerry Brown signed SB 277, which will make immunizations mandatory for children enrolled in public and private schools. Brown’s signing of the bill marked the last hurdle needed to make the bill into law. Required vaccinations will include diphtheria, hepatitis B, haemophilus influenzae type b, measles, mumps, pertussis (whooping cough), poliomyelitis, rubella, tetanus, and varicella (chickenpox). The law will

exempt children from immunization if the doctor deems it necessary because of medical reasons, but will put an end to personal belief exemptions.

Governor Brown released a statement regarding his choice to sign the bill, writing, “After carefully reviewing the materials and arguments that have been presented, I have decided to sign this bill... While it’s true that no medical intervention is without risk, the evidence shows that immunization powerfully benefits and protects the community.” ★

Rosie’s Country Kitchen: Something for Everyone

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rosie’s Country Kitchen first opened in August 2002 after Ravi Cheema and his family bought the property. At the time, the family also owned another restaurant in Roseville. After a few months, though, it became too much for the family to operate both restaurants. Subsequently, the family leased the property to other relatives. After 10 years, the lease was up for Rosie’s, so Cheema and his family decided to run Rosie’s Country Kitchen again.

Rosie’s Country Kitchen is a family-owned business, currently run by Cheema and his family. Because the family runs the business, Cheema explains, “We can keep our prices low and have 100% control over food pricing.”

Cheema has a background in engineering but his passion is cooking and customer service. “I love making sure my customers are taken care of. I am consistently asking them

how their breakfast or dinner was as well as making sure that they have everything necessary to make their meal more enjoyable.”

He is very involved in every aspect of the business, handling everything from bussing tables to cooking and everything in between. Cheema was

inspired to become a restaurant owner because he loves people and he loves cooking. “It feels good to do both.” His passion for the work translates into an intense dedication.

Compared to similar restaurants, Rosie’s Restaurant has one very unique feature. Besides American food, they also serve traditional Indian food, too!

Although the restaurant’s name doesn’t suggest an expertise in Indian food, some of the favorite Indian dishes served at Rosie’s are the beef biryani and chicken curry.

Another best-selling dish at Rosie’s Restaurant is their four-egg omelet. “We use real eggs, not the liquid kind. We use a good portion of meat and hash browns in each plate. We also make country potatoes

with our house seasonings. In fact, customers who live far away will come to our restaurant just to get our country potatoes because it is delicious. We also make great homemade biscuits and gravy from scratch, and our hamburgers are always pretty big at ½ pound,” said Cheema.

Brad Chapdelaine, who lives in Montana but comes to Rancho Cordova to visit his father, said that they celebrated his daughter’s 14th birthday by going to Rosie’s. In fact, Chapdelaine approached the interviewer at Rosie’s to rave about the food and service.

“Anytime I come to this area, I visit Rosie’s because they have the best breakfast. Hash browns came out in four minutes and they were perfect. I almost don’t want to put [the

restaurant] on TripAdvisor with high ratings because I’m afraid the restaurant will get too crowded when I come in. My grandfather and grandmother used to come in the restaurant all the time,” said Chapdelaine.

The restaurant offers junior and senior menus to please the most discriminating palates, and popular items include the junior hamburger and the senior ½ sandwich with soup combo. “We cater to the general public, especially the seniors since we have many of the traditional home country kitchen items,” said Cheema.

The restaurant also offers daily specials, including ham and eggs at \$4.99 and steak and eggs at \$7.99. “We also offer beer and wine. If you like to have a mimosa for breakfast, we can make this drink for you to have with your meal.”

Local farmers markets get a boost from Rosie’s since Cheema and his family like to buy fresh vegetables from local growers.

Cheema has big plans for the restaurant, explaining, “With the college newly built right across the street, we plan to renovate the restaurant to give it a 70s country-style vibe. We plan to put in new upholstery, carpets, etc.”

The renovations will be done in the next month or so. The restaurant will be closed during remodeling but only for a few days. They will post advance warning of the days they will be closed for remodeling so that customers are not inconvenienced.

Rosie’s Country Kitchen is open seven days a week from 6 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and is located at 10273 Folsom Boulevard, Rancho Cordova, CA 95670.

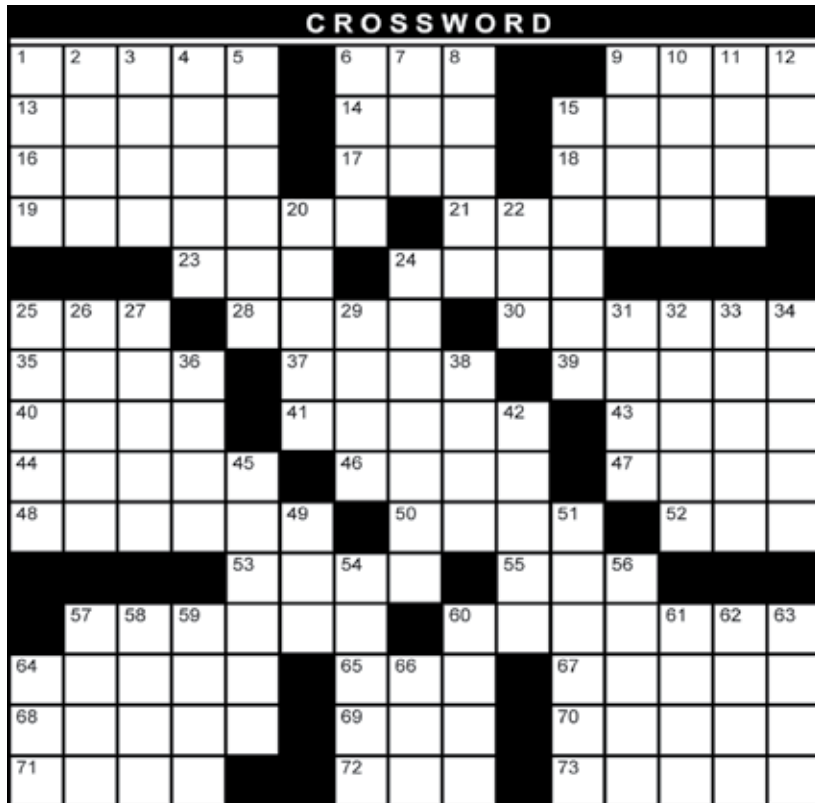

Feet, Feats, Fetes and Defeats

We have watched many feats of strength through the years, but it was the strength of feet that captured the imagination of a record 25.4 million viewers in the United States on Sunday.

This time around, it was the U.S. women’s soccer team—not men in tights—that escaped and prevailed with victory, as it brought home its third FIFA World Cup title while avenging its loss of four years ago by defeating Japan, 5-2, in Vancouver. Their feet did not fail them this time.

The record audience was the largest to ever watch a soccer game of any kind in the U.S. and bypassed the numbers for this season’s NBA Finals, which was its largest audience in 16 years. National pride, as it does when the Olympics competitions come around, has a lot to do with the big results, but, nevertheless, the rise in interest in the World Cup event is astounding.

From little more than a curiosity when it began in 1991 until now, the Women’s World Cup has commanded attention on the international stage. In turn, over time, the event has been an important factor that helped spur new interest and bolster participation in girls’ and women’s sports.

When the U.S. won the inaugural tournament in 1991 in China by edging Norway, 2-1, in the final, many of this year’s stars were just venturing into youth soccer. They might not have known who Michelle Akers (10 goals in the ‘91 tournament) was, but they do by now. The awareness explosion came in 1999, when Mia Hamm and Kristine Lilly led the U.S. team to its second World Cup title, defeating China (5-4) on penalty kicks. That victory created one of the most memorable visuals of all time in women’s sports when Brandi Chastain pulled off her jersey (as the men customarily have done) and celebrated on the pitch in her sports bra after scoring the clinching goal before a delirious 90,000-plus fans at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. It’s history, and now this team has made more history.

After losing the last final in 2011 to Japan on penalty kicks, the U.S. squad rebounded in the rematch and took control early, relentlessly attacking and scoring four times in the first 16 minutes of the match. Carli Lloyd, whose name will be first in the minds of young female soccer players going forward, scored three times, including the first two goals and the fourth, a 50-yard blast from the midfield line that caught Japan’s goalie off guard. She scored six goals in the tournament. Abby Wambach (14 career World Cup goals), Alex Morgan (Cal), Julie Johnston (Santa Clara), Hope Solo, Lauren Holiday, Christie Rampone, Megan Rapinoe all left imprints in the hearts of the stars of the future.


There have been discussions of another possible first for a women’s sports team, a ticker-tape parade through the Canyon of Heroes down Broadway in New York City for these champions.

Even sports fans that have scoffed at soccer over the years for what they perceived as a dull, boring, slow-moving, low-scoring exercise were won over. Besides, what else was there on the tube?

You could have seen some NASCAR racers or Tour de France cyclists crashing all over themselves. You could’ve watched Serena Williams beat up on her older sister, Venus, once again in the early rounds at Wimbledon. There was some forgettable golf tourney on—and the big golf news was off the course, involving the foot of that sport’s No. 1 player, Rory McElroy, who ruptured an ankle ligament playing... soccer...with friends and is doubtful for the upcoming British Open. Or, you could have followed the last-place Oakland A’s as they continued to play last-place baseball.

And, what could be worse than watching your defending World Series champion Giants falter through a six-game losing skid? Having to listen to the ESPN television crew broadcast the sixth straight defeat, that’s what! We may be homers here, but even Kruk and Kuip seem less biased for the Giants than the national crews are biased against the Giants. You could count on one hand the good things said about the champs. And what’s with the extended interview with Max Scherzer of the Nationals and the week-old story of his no-hitter that was accompanied by too much dugout buffoonery while the Giants All-Star catcher, Buster Posey, was taking his at-bat in a close game? The winner between the total pitch count and the number of times analyst Curt Schilling said “I” was too close to call. What is he doing on a broadcast anyway? Unofficial polls reveal that a lot of people don’t care much for him, including \$75 million worth of taxpayers in the state of Rhode Island.

Or, maybe it’s just the losing that is getting to us—with the skid reaching seven games after the injured, short-handed, tired Giants again had their unfavorable travel schedule jerked around and had to play Sunday night back east, then fly 3,000 miles in the morning for a home game the next night, which they lost. The agony of defeat feeds on negativity. Too much bad karma surrounds this team right now. Maybe they just need a preacher (Hunter Pence) to come in and make things right again, or a reflexology expert to give them all foot massages. ★



The Dodgers are 11-6 in his starts, but scored just three, two (twice), one (twice) and zero runs in those losses...The **last 10 regular season no-hitters** were thrown by National League pitchers in NL ball-parks. Felix Hernandez's perfect game in 2012 is the last by an American Leaguer. Only one of the last 13 no-hitters featured games with a DH...On June 30, the **Oakland A's** lost to Colorado 2-1, which lowered Oakland's record to 6-20 in one-run games this season. According to Baseball-Reference.com, only the Boston Braves in 1935 have been worse in the modern era. The Braves were 7-31 in one-run games and finished the season 38-115...Hitters have yet to figure out young Seattle lefthander **Mike Montgomery**. In his first seven starts, he's allowed just 34 hits and 13 walks over 50 innings. His best two outings were back-to-back shutouts. The first whitewash was a five-hit, no-walk performance in a win over Kansas City. That gem was followed by a one-hitter with only four walks at San Diego. With another hat tip to Baseball-Reference.com, it must be noted that Montgomery is the sixth pitcher in the divisional era with two shutouts in his first six career games. Since you asked, the other five are Pedro Astacio (Dodgers), Burt Hooton (Cubs), Steve Rogers (Expos), Wayne Simpson (Reds) and Jeremy Sowers (Indians)... The **San Francisco Giants'** six-game slide last week could be traced to walks and strikeouts. The Giants batted just .230 but struck out 48 times and drew just seven walks. San Francisco pitchers walked 25 and whiffed just 28 while posting a 5.63 ERA in sweeps at the hands of **Miami** and **Washington**... I want to preface this story by explaining that I know from personal experience that the walk I am going to tell you about is unique. I am forming a team called “Sal’s Pals,” and we will walk in the upcoming Fab 40s 5K Run/Walk on Saturday, July 25th at East Lawn Memorial Park Cemetery to benefit the Alzheimer’s Association. Proceeds from this event support local caregivers and research. Started eight years ago, this 5K Run/Walk is the only such event that begins—and ends—in a cemetery!

Besides the unique event setting, the 5K is an outlet for those people who have, or have had, a loved one affected by Alzheimer’s disease. The many caregivers who you see walking in honor of, or in memory of, a loved one is a powerful reminder that people are dealing with very stressful situations that may affect multiple generations of a family. Caregiving and the responsibilities that go along with this 24/7 work takes its toll on the caregiver, and many times they need an outlet and a change of scenery. The Fab 40s 5K event is just one

such outlet available to the community of caregivers, and one that is appreciated.

Alan Fisher, President of East Lawn, recalls the first Fab 40s 5K: “I saw hundreds of people gather in the cemetery early for our first event. Now, seeing families come together for a common cause on that one special day each year, knowing that what we’re doing is both increasing awareness and providing financial assistance to the Alzheimer’s Association, is truly a wonderful thing. East Lawn strives to connect with the community in helpful and meaningful ways throughout the year.”

The essence of why people support this particular 5K was summed up when one family had gathered around their mother, who was afflicted by Alzheimer’s disease, and started singing “You are My Sunshine” to honor her. I was one of many who had tears in their eyes at that moment, obviously a moment that will not be forgotten. Such displays of emotion carried on well beyond this inaugural event. East Lawn went on to construct a permanent memorial on their grounds. Alan said to me, “We constructed this memorial on which the names of our cherished loved ones can be

inscribed. For me it’s personal, as my own mother, Evelyn Fisher, is now remembered there. Her name was placed on the wall after her passing in 2013.”

The 5K Run/Walk meanders throughout the local neighborhood (the “Fabulous Forties”), past East Portal Park, and then returns to East Lawn for the finishing mile. Along the route, you are cheered on by the neighborhood, you get to take in the beauty of the area, and you get to see the architecture and beauty of the grounds at East Lawn Memorial Park—which are second to none in the entire region. Here is your chance to visit a cemetery for reasons other than the usual ones. In fact, families will often first participate in the 5K and then go and visit the site where a loved one or friend is interred at East Lawn.

New Bicycle and Pedestrian Project

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A new bicycle and pedestrian improvement project is proposed in the Cordova Vineyards neighborhood. The City of Rancho Cordova invites citizens to a public meeting to discuss the project on Tuesday, July 14th at 5:30 p.m. at Rancho Cordova Elementary School, 2562 Chassella Way.

The proposed project includes new sidewalks, crosswalks that are ADA accessible, and Class III bike routes. The City’s goals are to create safe

routes for students and residents in the neighborhood to walk or bike. These streets are already used frequently by pedestrians and bicyclists to travel to and from Rancho Cordova Elementary School and throughout the surrounding area.

The City has secured a \$1.5 million grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation’s Congestion Management and Air Quality
