## Coolley Legislation to Combat Homelessness Approved by Assembly, Moves to State Senate

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Assemblyman Ken Cooley's rapid rehousing bill, AB 870, received bipartisan support on June 5th as it passed out of the State Assembly. AB 870 supports "rapid rehousing" principles by creating a pilot program and allocating \$2 million over two years to this end to four counties, to be selected by the Department of Housing and Community Development.

"Rapid rehousing focuses on quickly moving people and families—who oftentimes have experienced some sort of crisis—into stable housing," said Assemblyman Cooley. "The evidence demonstrates that when someone has a safe and secure place to live as they address other issues they may be facing, their long-term outcomes are measurably better."

Homelessness is a large problem in California. The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development estimates that California has approximately 136,000 homeless persons, or about 22% of the entire country's homeless population. The same study indicated that there are more than 15,000 homeless veterans in California.

AB 870 creates a pilot program to be administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development with \$2 million in funding over two years. When selecting participants, the Department shall prioritize counties that have demonstrated success in utilizing rapid rehousing principles. Several counties in California already have experience offering rapid rehousing services and are well equipped to utilize any additional funding provided.

"These pro-active measures actually reduce costs to municipal governments because it eases dependence on emergency services, and homeless shelters are able to accommodate more families," said Assemblyman Cooley. "I'm particularly grateful for the outspoken support of Assemblymember William

# California Moves Forward with Cannabis Regulations that Protect Consumers and Workers

*After Nearly 20 Years, Broad-Based Support to Bring “Wild West” Industry Under the Law*

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - AB 266, which would provide long-overdue consumer and worker protections in the California medical marijuana industry, passed the state Assembly by a 50 to five vote. The legislation is being carried by Assembly Members Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) and Rob Bonta (D-Oakland).

AB 266 would:

- Call on the California Department of Industrial Relations to develop training and certification standards for workers in the industry
- Create standards for testing and labeling of medical marijuana products
- Enable certification of testing laboratories and establish guidelines for onsite testing
- Finally give consumers confidence that they know what they are buying and will get what they pay for.

“Polls show that most voters think these types of standard protections are already in place in the medical marijuana industry,” said Jim Araby, executive director of UFCW Western States Council, which supports AB 266. “It is time to finally establish the regulatory framework that will reward law-abiding businesses in this important and growing California industry.”

# The Crocker Art Museum Presents ‘David Ligare: California Classicist’

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)**

- This summer, the Crocker Art Museum presents a major retrospective exhibition featuring nearly 80 works by Monterey-based contemporary artist David Ligare.

The exhibition, called “David Ligare: California Classicist,” will be on view June 7th through September 20th. A self-proclaimed Classicist, Ligare (born 1945) creates perfectly ordered still life, landscape, architectural, and figurative paintings that occupy their own poetic world. Although often grouped with California’s Photorealists, the very unreality of Ligare’s paintings and his underlying interest in antiquity belie such a label, and the perfection of his unblemished subjects and hyper-purity of his paint application seem more unearthly than real. In achieving these qualities, Ligare looks to the ancients for guidance and references the formal relationships found in Classical sculpture and architecture. And yet his paintings are firmly based in the specifics of California—and the Monterey region in particular—allowing Ligare to create art that is richly layered, broadly universal, and yet specifically of our time and place.

In addition to his Classical themes and compositions, it is light that most brings unity to Ligare’s world. Having grown up in Southern California, he developed a vision of light shaped by his nearly constant proximity to the Pacific Ocean. After attending the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles, he moved north, living for a time in Big Sur and Santa Barbara. He then settled permanently in Monterey County, where he began to fully embrace Classicism.

Since the late 1970s, Ligare has used his considerable technical skills and historical knowledge to create what he calls, “the literate

Defying contemporary conventions, he seeks out ancient ideas that inform our modern world and shared humanity. In so doing, concepts are as important to the artist as paint. “Making paintings is a passion for me,” he explains, “but it is a passion of ideas rather than just pigment. I believe deeply that art can make a difference in the way we view the world and in the way we act in it.”

The exhibition is accompanied by a catalogue of the same title, co-authored by the Crocker Art Museum’s associate director and chief curator Scott A. Shields, Ph.D. The catalogue showcases Ligare’s admiration

for the ancients and his love of California through revelatory essays, a chronology, and more than 200 reproductions and photographs. Ligare and Shields will be featured speakers at a public symposium at the Crocker Art Museum on Saturday, July 18th.

The Crocker Art Museum was the first art museum in the Western U.S. and is one of the leading art museums in California today. Established in 1885, the Museum features one of the country’s finest collections of Californian art, exceptional holdings of master drawings, a comprehensive collection of international ceramics, as well as European, Asian, African, and Oceanic art. The Crocker is located at 216 O Street in downtown Sacramento. Museum hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday; 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Thursdays. Every third Sunday of the month is “Pay What You Wish Sunday” sponsored by Western Health Advantage. **SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Lady Antebellum will be playing at the Toyota Amphitheatre (2677 Forty Mile Road, Wheatland, CA 95692) on Thursday, June 25th as part of their Wheels Up 2015 Tour. Lady Antebellum will be headlining the show, with Hunter Hayes and Sam Hunt in the lineup.

Lady Antebellum has been playing together for almost nine years; this August will mark the ninth anniversary of their very first show together. In an interview with Messenger Publishing Group, Hillary Scott described the friendship that anchors the band as “a real summer camp vibe.” Scott explained that she and bandmates Charles Kelley and Dave Haywood grew up watching VH1’s *Behind the Music*, so they were very familiar with the all-too-typical story of successful bands breaking up over petty arguments and egotistical posturing. “So we just learned how to talk to each other, to compromise,” said Scott.

When Scott, Kelley, and Haywood began writing songs together, Scott said, “It was like I had met my musical best friends,

my brothers.”

After nine years of performing together, Scott said, “We’ve grown up together. ... When we started, none of us were married, we didn’t have any kids. ... There have been a lot of life changes. My husband, Chris, is the drummer now, and our little girl is with us every weekend for the shows that we do. We have a much bigger traveling crew. With every milestone, everything becomes clear, and it’s all sweeter because we built our family together. It makes the really hard, long days not as hard because our families are together. We get to call this our work, our job, which is weird because it doesn’t feel that way—it’s our dream.”

Scott attributes their success to their passion for the work, explaining, “It’s all about work

ethic. You must be willing to work hard, harder than everyone else. And you have to put yourself in the right places. ... The center of whatever you’re passionate about is where you need to be. And you need to know that there’s always more to learn, you can always learn something new from anyone you meet, whether it’s what to do or what not to do; you have to push yourself to grow.”

Over all these years together, after many albums and a variety of accolades, Scott still likes to look back at the path they have all traveled together: “It’s fun to look back; it’s like going back and reading an old diary or journal. We pour our own lives into these albums, into these songs, so it’s like traveling down memory lane and seeing where we were in our lives. It’s good to look back at where you’ve come from; it gives you the clarity to see where you can go.”

## CEQA Exemptions for Everyone... Except Vital Water Projects

No one needs to be reminded that California is in the midst of one of the worst droughts in decades, if not centuries. Out of this crisis comes Assemblyman James Gallagher (R-Yuba City) with an excellent idea. Assemblyman Gallagher introduced AB 311, intended to expedite vitally needed water storage projects in our state, in short, give these projects the same legal framework protections that were granted to a number of public projects in California, including football stadiums and basketball arenas.

According to press reports, during the committee hearing on AB 311, Chairman Williams displayed his arrogance when he said that if people want to push such proposals they should identify a “specific project” and bring both sides together to identify mitigation measures impacting the project.

Chairman Williams knows, given his own voting record, that the process by which projects are granted final environmental approval in California was hijacked by the environmental community long ago. In fact, things have gotten so litigious

in our state that the Legislature has moved to give a broad array of projects (public and private) exemptions from this burdensome and often exceedingly costly process.

Examples of total exemptions from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) include a wine train in Napa, state prisons, right-of-way acquisitions for low-speed commuter trains between San Francisco and San Jose, conversion of rental mobile home parks to “resident initiated” subdivisions or condominiums for mobile homes, local coastal programs or long-range land use development plans by the California Coastal Commission, the repair of critical levees of the State Plan for Flood Control as specified, certain railroad grade separation projects, certain seismic retrofit projects for existing local bridges, and even projects for restriping of streets or highways to relieve traffic congestion.

But wait...there’s more! During the 2013-2014 legislative session, another exemption was granted by the Wizards Under the Dome! Projects so badly needed, given our current state of crisis, that one must wonder what took so long to be enacted.

AB 417 by Assemblyman Jim Frazier (D-Oakley) granted a statutory exemption from the requirements of CEQA for “bicycle transportation plans.” It should be noted that Chairman Williams wholeheartedly supported this exemption by voting three times in support of the Frazier measure. Twice on the Assembly floor and once while simply a member of the Assembly Natural Resources Committee that he now chairs.

Chairman Williams knows the reason Assemblyman Gallagher shouldn’t name a specific project. The state water bond that Chairman Williams voted in favor of in the closing days of the 2014 session specifically gives the California Water Commission the responsibility to identify projects that meet the requirements for bond funding. The streamlining process of Assemblyman Gallagher’s bill could only be applied once a project is selected by the Commission. But if the Chairman is incapable of remembering which exemptions or streamlining measures he supported for the betterment of our state, then maybe he should step down and let someone more competent sit at the head of the class. ★

# Where Have All the Fathers Gone?

Around this time of the year, my thoughts wander back to my father. He has been gone quite a spell but his memory lingers. I often wonder what he would think of what is happening in our world today if he were to come back.

I grew up with a father who believed in being the father. I confess he was not always right all the time, but what he said was law in our house. That is, of course, unless his wife contradicted him. Then it was time for us kids to seek sanctuary outside where we could not hear what was going on.

I cannot help but believe that some of the problems we are having in our society today would not be such a problem if we had fathers. How many families are there where children grow up not knowing their father? No wonder they have no respect for authority.

Although my father was not a very well educated person, he knew how to use the Board of Education on the Seat of Learning for all of us children. Some of the stuff he did back in “the day,” would bring him some real legal problems today.

For example, my father believed he had the right to be judge, jury, and executioner concerning the things in his children’s life, with no appeal to a higher authority.

In the kitchen hanging next to the door to go outside was a very interesting parenting tool, at least in my father’s eyes. It was a paddle with a religious inscription, “I Need Thee Every Hour.” The inscription was quite true to the reality of life in our home.

Spanking was a routine exercise in our home. My father had the idea that if you were in trouble in school you were also in trouble at home. He had this fantastic idea that the teacher was right and I was wrong. I guess he knew me and that I could take a

little bit of truth and spin it into a lie. I wonder who I learned that from...

Several times I got in trouble at school, which involved a spanking down at the principal’s office. The first time this happened, I well remember walking into the kitchen and saw my father standing there holding in his hand that infamous paddle. Within a few moments, the paddle was doing its duty and I was doing the “paddle dance.”

After the paddling, my father sat down with me and said, “Okay, what trouble did you get into at school requiring the principal to paddle you?”

I wished he had asked me before the paddling, because now I had no incentive whatsoever to lie. Looking back, maybe that was the whole purpose of the paddling.

I well remember one time out in the backyard I did something requiring parental action. My father looked at me and said, “Go get me a switch. You need to be taught a lesson.”

At the time, I thought it was funny, however, after the fact I could see no humor whatsoever in it. I went to get the “switch,” according to my father’s instructions and came back with a twig. I thought it was funny, but my father had no sense of humor about this. In a few moments, my sense of humor evaporated because my father went and got a switch, which is a whole lot different from a twig, just ask my backside.

Ruminating over these things, I tried to figure out how many spankings I actually got during my lifetime. Let me just say, it was significant. More than that, it taught me respect for authority.

I wonder if some of these young people getting into trouble today ever had a spanking. Of course, today that is completely against PC. My father did not believe in PC, but he did believe emphatically in BS

(Back Side). I think if parents today would focus more on BS than PC, things might be a lot different.

Today, people think those old-fashioned spankings represent cruel and unusual punishment. However, if you look at this generation that has not had an old-fashioned spanking, I think the evidence speaks for itself.

To spank or not to spank, that is the dilemma today. Most gravitate towards the “not to spank” aspect, unaware that they are creating a lot of damage for the next generation.

I must say that my father was not too much interested in what we call “love” today. He was more interested in respecting authority. In fact, as I think about this, when you are respecting authority you are exhibiting love. People today do not know how to love because they do not know how to respect authority.

I think if some of these youngsters could spend a week with my father and his infamous “paddle,” they would grow to respect authority. Unfortunately, there is no authority figure in most homes today. Even those homes that have fathers are coerced into believing the father has no real significance in the family.

All I can do is to quote a famous psychologist, “How’s that working?”

Well, how is that working? The wisest man in the world, Solomon, said, “For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son in whom he delighteth,” (Proverbs 3:12).

True love always corrects that which is wrong, especially in the person they love.

How boring. I thought of all the great people I had met over the years by getting to know them through air

The minister, the lawyer (yes, he was very interesting), the young entrepreneur, the business guy buried in acquisitions, the young woman traveling to take care of her father’s estate after he had passed away just after her last visit two weeks earlier. They have all been traded for an iPod.

When you fly over the USA, you get

a perspective lost in a daily world of iTunes and reality TV, traffic jams and taxes, PTA meetings and mowing the yard. You see all the space. You see the cities, the communities, the homes, all filled with people with their own individual lives full of loves, attitudes and latitudes, daily problems and worries, desires and dreams, and wants for a better tomorrow. Every one of them different, and just like you.

**Gettysburg on Memorial Day**

Most years I attend local ceremonies for Memorial Day, but this year it would be different. My one request this trip back to Pennsylvania was to have time to visit Gettysburg again.

It was 1991 the last time I had been on the hallowed grounds of Gettysburg. It was an off day for tourists then, thankfully. Overcast weather, mid-week, humid and un-inviting. Perfect for a singular roamer on an unfamiliar quest. There was opportunity to walk through battlegrounds where you weren’t supposed to go. It was a day that changed my life.

Grief was in the mist. It was in the trees. It lined the rocks. You could feel it finding its way through the stilled grass. Six generations and it was as real as the days all those men fell in battle.

Alone, aware, quiet, and still. The lingering cries of casualties, cries for their mothers and wives and children, were imminent and obvious as the ripples of water on a disturbed pond. It was all so overwhelming I was grateful to be alone. The awe of the desperate sacrifices of so many was deafening. It was coupled with the knowledge of the ignorance of most who have never even studied what happened in this small island of glory, and such waste, in the history of our nation.

Compelled to move, but slowly and with reverence, I walked the cemeteries. Reading every monument tribute to the fallen, taking it in as the numbers began to have faces and families, taking in the moments that the lives changed

forever. I couldn’t help but think every high school class should take this trip as a requirement to graduate into adulthood. It would change a society.

And then I found Spangler’s Spring. It was as if I were behind the eyes of another, yet so familiar, man. It is impossible to describe the sensations of déjà vu, the waves of memory files opening up from a time when you know you died here in a surprise skirmish, one minute joking with other gray uniformed men, the next your face and body hitting the ground with a permanent thud so certain as the pain of torn flesh screamed to the heavens. It was then, and it was now. My body reacted with such trembling and fear that I looked around again as if another attack were looming.

It lasted for about three minutes. And then a peace came over me like the heavens had opened up to assure me all was well. All was well.

This year, 24 years later, a return was necessary. My wife and I toured the new tourist center, watched the new films, enjoyed the exhibits, had a quick lunch, and began our own driving tour.

As we found our way to the cemetery, the Memorial Day parade was just ending. Hundreds had come to visit and pay respects. We walked the grounds and took in the monuments, the history, and the importance.

Unknown, unknown, unknown after unknown. Number after number. Finding “1” on a small headstone at the end of a long-circled row near the road had me stop, and pray for “1.” It has been a long-practiced personal ritual upon visiting cemeteries to speak aloud the names of the souls displayed on headstones. It gives them a brief and temporary vibratory resonant life again. Somehow, in spirit, it acknowledges their life among us just one more time.

My wife and I found our way around a number of the monuments, then took to the car to drive the battlefields. At one point, we came upon a small group that had taken a small guided tour. The tour guide explained to them exactly how the battle had been planned, and then executed. He explained how this one battle on this one day in history General Lee was driven back and defeated, changing the history of the Civil War and our nation. Aware, you could still hear the canons firing.

We then looked up Spangler’s Spring. She did not know about my previous visit and experience. I just had to know by returning. When we arrived, I was

absolutely certain it was not a one-time phenomenon. The reaction this time was not violent, overwhelming, fearful, or regretful. It was a completion, a completion of a cycle that now drives me every day to do more and be more to preserve our nation.

As a nation, we have to get this right. We have to get this right. Are we at another crossroads due to years of poor leadership? We are a nation built upon all those who have come before us. We are built upon a belief in God, family, and country. We used to stand for something. And now we sit in dull ignorance in front of televisions and watch ourselves be misled by those who do not care about the will of the people.

**We Forget**

We forget too often the sacrifices of all those who have come before us to build our country. We forget all those who have fought in battles to preserve our way of life. We have not heard the buzzing of bullets around our heads. We have not heard the canons fire upon us. We have not lost limbs or loved ones.



Every monument gave the numbers. Every number had a name.

We do not know all that our fathers, grandfathers, or forefathers have done to try to give us a better life. We certainly do not know all that our neighbor’s father, grandfathers, or forefathers have sacrificed. We just know that our neighbor’s stereo is too loud and they park too close to our driveway for our liking.

Memorial Day is on our calendars for a reason. Father’s Day is on our calendars for a reason. Our nation’s Independence Day is coming up, and it is on our calendars for a reason.

Take the time on Father’s Day to appreciate all that your father and the fathers of your family and your neighbor’s family have done to give us this great community and nation.

Take the time this Independence Day to show your appreciation to the people who hold this nation together, those around you. Take the time to appreciate all those military and military families who have sacrificed more than we know to provide us the safety in which we live.

This Independence Day show up, remember the many sacrifices for freedom, give thanks with great gratitude, and love this nation more. ★

After his Cleveland Cavaliers dropped Game 5 of the NBA Finals in Oakland, Sunday, LeBron James made a point of reminding everyone that he is still King.

"I feel confident because I'm the best player in the world," James said, during his remarks at the post-game press conference. "It's simple."

King James continued to put up incredible numbers in the series, posting his second triple-double (40 points, 14 rebounds, 11 assists), though his team headed home for Game 6 trailing 3-2 to your Golden State Warriors, one loss away from elimination.

"I don't put a ceiling on what I am capable of doing," James added. "I gotta do a better job."

James has been flashing his brilliance throughout the series in so many ways. It is hard to imagine that he could do much more than having a direct hand—either through scoring himself, or assisting his teammates—in 70 of the Cavs' points in Sunday's 104-91 loss.

## Cordova Football Prepares for New Season

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - On the Lancer Stadium turf Tuesday afternoon, members of the Cordova High School football team were keeping busy. At the north end of the field, quarterbacks threw passes to wide receivers. Some 30 yards away, offensive lineman worked on blocking techniques.

Then the two groups united near midfield to run plays in 7-on-7 action. The Lancers' offense was led by returning quarterback Unique Perez, a senior who tossed for 1,695 yards and 17 touchdowns and rushing with 633 yards last fall. One of his targets in Tuesday's practice was Devin Baldwin, who hauled in 42 receptions for 886 yards and seven touchdowns, also last season.

The duo and the bulk of the 46 players at Tuesday's practice hustled under the eye of

first-year Cordova head coach Darren Nill, who served as defensive coordinator last season. The Lancers' defense allowed one touchdown per game in the first six games of the season. Cordova finished with a 6-4 record, which is its first winning season in more than five years.

"We've been seeing about 38, 39 regularly," said Nill of the number of players who have turned out for practices since the school year ended toward the end of last month.

Nill and his coaching staff are implementing the same offensive and defensive philosophies that were used under former head coach Vance Mueller, who led the Lancers the last three seasons. Mueller, a former Los Angeles Raiders fullback from the mid-1980s to the early 1990s, resigned in January for personal reasons.

"There's some new tweaks," explained Nill. "We're going to

have the majority of it in this week."

That is because next week Cordova will be one of four high schools taking part in a football camp at Monterey Trail (MT) High School of Elk Grove. The Lancers will join host MT, plus Burbank of Sacramento and Vintage of Napa, at the camp that will have limited contact drills because of California AB 2127, which puts restrictions on students playing contact sports such as football.

"The camp has been modified," said Nill, who said he's been informed by those running next week's camp that it will also be known as a "quick whistle" camp. "We'll hike the ball and the whistle will blow two seconds later. All of the quarterbacks and running backs are red-shirted."

Cordova will open its season on August 28th with a non-league game at Pioneer of Woodland.

### Fly Fishing Gear Every Beginner Needs

Learning to fly fish is no harder than any other kind of fishing if you start with the proper equipment.

Fly lines range from 1 weight to a 12 weight. The larger the line number, the larger the line size and the larger the fly you can cast with it.

Level lines are the same diameter throughout their length, and are fine for casting short distances but not delicate presentations.

Double-taper lines taper at both ends, allow a more delicate presentation, and are best for short to medium cast. Weight-forward lines have larger diameters the first 30 feet. They cast well at all distances and cast larger, more wind-resistant flies better.

For most situations, an 8 1/2' or 9' rod with a single action reel is best. If you fish small streams, go to a 7 1/2' or 8'. Line weights your rod will handle will be marked on the shaft.

Buy the best rod you can afford, and it will result in less frustration and more fun in learning how to fly fish.

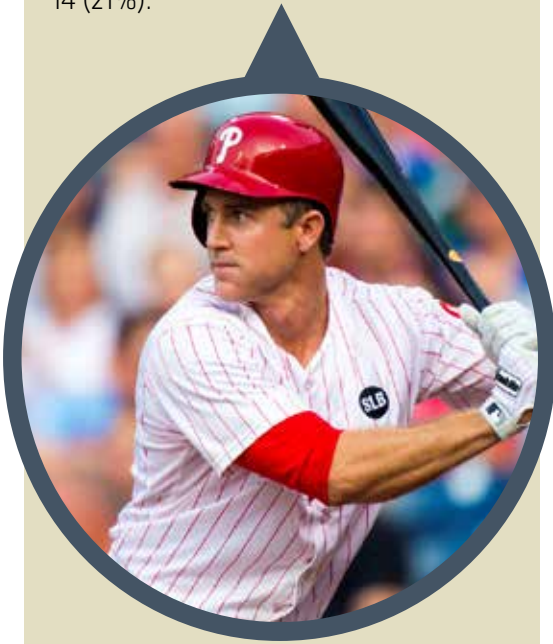
AROUND THE HORN

Earlier this week, the San Diego Padres announced the firing of manager **Bud Black**. Black, who had led the Padres since 2007, was named National League Manager of the Year in 2010. That season the Padres finished two games back of the Giants in the NL West and one game behind the Braves for the wild card. After several acquisitions over the winter, San Diego entered this season with high expectations. It's difficult to assert that the club underachieved. The front office didn't have an adequate solution at shortstop, there was no real center fielder and the rotation was a bit thin. Black will not likely be out of a job very long...Pittsburgh's speedy outfielder **Gregory Polanco** has come to the plate this season 32 times with a double play in order. He has yet to ground into a twin-killing...Last week, San Francisco's **Chris Heston** tossed a no-hitter against the New York Mets. It was the first no-hitter of his young career, but it was the third no-hitter caught by **Buster Posey**, who also caught no-nos by **Tim Lincecum** and **Matt Cain**. Since expansion in 1961, only one catcher, **Jason Varitek**, has caught more than three no-hitters. And during that time, only three pairs of batterymates have combined on more than one no-hitter: **Sandy Koufax** and **John Roseboro** for the Dodgers in the 1960s, **Steve Busby** and **Fran Healy** of the Royals in the 1970s, and more recently **Homer Bailey** and **Ryan Hanigan** of Cincinnati...From the middle of the 2010 season through 2014, the **Atlanta Braves** were 82-0 when they scored as many as eight runs. Yet this season, the pitching staff has managed to cough up enough runs for the club to lose four times when posting as many as eight runs. The Braves are 7-4 this season with a snowman on the board.
