It's Time to Get
Your Hands Dirty

Teach Your Children to Be Good Stewards

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (BPT) - Growing your own garden is a popular pastime that cuts grocery bills and puts fresh produce within arm's reach. But to parents it's so much more than that. Gardening is a trending family activity that provides plenty of teachable moments, and it also promotes positive characteristics like self-reliance and stewardship of the earth.

"You don't have to be a green thumb to start a garden at home," says Kevin Bryant, a garden enthusiast and director of national marketing at Tractor Supply Company. about nature and each other in the process."

The recent self-reliant movement sweeping the country is highly appealing to families. Plus, growing basic vegetables, fruits, and herbs at home is a viable option whether in the city, suburbs, or rural areas. In fact, 29% of Americans obtained locally grown food in the past year from a home

garden, according to a national Tractor Supply survey—and interest appears to be on the rise.

Furthermore, many families have a deep desire to improve their children's comprehension of nutrition and food resources. A whopping 89% of American parents agree with the statement "My children need a better understanding of where their food comes from," the survey found.

Now is the ideal time to start planning your garden. Consider these four steps to ensure your family gets the most out of their gardening time together:

1. **Research plants:** The region where you live will dictate which seeds you should plant and when. It's best to select high-yielding plants that you know will be successful, particularly if you have a

New Limits on
Landscape Watering

SSWD Unveils Rebate Programs
to Help Customers Conserve

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD) has adopted new outdoor watering restrictions that limit landscape irrigation to two days per week on specific days and times.

The new watering guidelines are designed to further encourage water reductions in light of the severe drought plaguing California and new directives from the Governor and State Water Resources Control Board to reduce water use. SSWD is required to reduce its water use by over 30%.

Effective immediately, outdoor watering is limited for all District customers to two days per week according to the following schedule:

- Addresses ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) can water on Tuesday and Saturday
- Addresses ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8) can water on Sunday and Wednesday

Customers are allowed to water on their designated day before noon or after 8 p.m.

"People can make a big dent in their household water use by limiting landscape watering, which is where most water use occurs," said Greg Bundesen, SSWD's water conservation supervisor. At a typical home, most water use goes to watering lawns and outdoor landscaping, and about 30% of that is lost due to over-watering and evaporation from wind and sun.

"By taking immediate action to limit landscape watering, SSWD customers can maximize water savings during the coming peak temperature and water use months. Summer presents our best opportunity to achieve the ambitious conservation targets set by the state," Bundesen said.

In addition to the new watering guidelines, SSWD is also unveiling a suite of new incentive programs to help customers reduce water use, including the following rebates:

- Turf Replacement ("Cash for Grass") for 50 cents per square foot (up to \$1,000) for replacing thirsty lawns with low-water use plants
- Irrigation Efficiency Upgrades (up to \$300) for replacing existing spray sprinklers with more efficient rotary nozzles and drip irrigation

- **June 12: *Batman* (PG 13, 1989).** Millionaire philanthropist Bruce Wayne (Michael Keaton) fights crime in Gotham City disguised as Batman, a costumed hero who strikes fear into the hearts of villains. But when a deformed madman, who calls himself “The Joker” (Jack Nicholson), seizes control of Gotham’s criminal underworld, Batman must face his most ruthless nemesis ever while protecting both his identity and the beautiful reporter Vicki Vale (Kim Basinger).
- **June 19: *Spiderman* (PG 13, 2002).** Spiderman centers on student Peter Parker (Tobey Maguire) who, after

being bitten by a genetically altered spider, gains superhuman strength and the spider-like ability to cling to any surface. He vows to use his abilities to fight crime, coming to understand the words of his beloved Uncle Ben: “With great power comes great responsibility.”

mission of creating a bicycle-friendly America for everyone.” The BFC program is revolutionizing the way communities evaluate their quality of life, sustainability, and transportation networks, while allowing them to benchmark their progress toward improving their bicycle-friendliness. With this impressive round, there are now 350. “Developing safe, convenient bicycle access is a priority for Rancho Cordova,” said Rancho Cordova Mayor Robert McGarvey. “This has great benefits for existing residents, and it will help us attract new families in our neighborhoods and

young professionals for our employers.” The Bronze Level BFC award recognizes Rancho Cordova’s commitment to improving conditions for bicycling through investment in bicycling promotion, education programs, infrastructure, and pro-bicycling policies. Steven Pas is a member of the citizen advocacy group, Bicycle Advocates for Rancho Cordova (BARC). As an engaged member of the bicycle access planning process, Pas said, “Rancho Cordova staff proved they truly wanted our input by incorporating the ideals presented to them in their outreach neighborhood meetings and committee meetings, by BARC members and

others, into the city’s master plan, then making those ideals a reality.” The BFC program provides a roadmap to building a Bicycle Friendly Community, and the application itself has become a rigorous educational tool in itself. Since its inception, more than 800 distinct communities have applied, and the five levels of the award—diamond, platinum, gold, silver, and bronze—provide a clear incentive for communities to continuously improve. Homicide on Lincoln Village Drive/Viking Drive

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At approximately 9:30 p.m. on the night of June 6th, Rancho Cordova Police Department officers responded to reports of a shooting at the corner of Lincoln Village Drive and Viking Drive. When they arrived, officers discovered a black male in his early 40s who had been shot at least one time in the torso. Medical personnel transported the shooting victim to the hospital where he was immediately taken into surgery.

The following morning, June 7th, the shooting victim succumbed to his injury and is deceased.

Sheriff Homicide Detectives are taking over the investigation of this shooting, which is now a homicide investigation. Preliminary information from the incident has revealed no suspect description or motive at this time. Detectives are asking anyone with information relating to this incident to contact the Sheriff's Department at (916) 874-5115 or Crime Alert at (916) 443-HELP. The victim's identity will be released by the Sacramento County Coroner's Office, pending notification to next of kin.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - At approximately 2:30 p.m. on Monday, June 8th, multiple callers reported a grass fire at Jackson Road and Sunrise Boulevard. Metro Fire's Copter 2, Dozer 1, five engines, and four water tenders responded to quickly put a line around the fire and stop further spread. The fire was reported as contained in less than 20 minutes, with a total of three acres burned. No structures were threatened, and no injuries were reported. The cause of the fire is currently under investigation.

Vegetation is extremely dry and ready to burn. Please do everything you can to prevent fires from starting. Use outdoor power equipment in the early morning cooler hours of the day, and ensure cigarettes are disposed of properly.

Medical Cannabis Bill Passes Assembly with Historic Consensus

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On Thursday, June 4th, the California State Assembly took historic action in passing AB 266, medical cannabis legislation, on a bipartisan vote of 60-8, with at least 17 Republican members in support. The measure provides long overdue statewide regulation of medical cannabis that protects local control and public safety, and advances patient protection with maximum potency and health and safety standards.

Jointly authored by Assembly Members Rob Bonta, Ken Cooley, and Reginald Jones-Sawyer, AB 266 is supported by the League of California Cities and the California Police Chiefs Association, two groups that have traditionally opposed most attempts at any cannabis regulation, including medical cannabis. It is also supported by United Food and Commercial Workers, a major labor union.

The measure is the result of a collaborative effort between authors of competing bills that have now merged into a single vehicle. Originally AB 34 (Bonta and Jones-Sawyer) and AB 266 (Cooley) were separate bills. Recent discussions between the authors, strongly urged by Assembly Appropriations Committee Chair Jimmy Gomez, resulted in one bill containing components of both measures. The authors of AB 266 represent diverse parts of the state (Oakland, Rancho Cordova, and Los Angeles), each with their own perspectives and priorities related to medical cannabis policy.

League of California Cities Executive Director Chris McKenzie remarked on the League's continued engagement in this important policy: "While this bill remains a work in progress, we will continue to monitor it closely to ensure that it continues to protect local governments' ability to fully regulate medical cannabis businesses within their borders. We are encouraged by the bill's requirement of local permitting as well as state licensing in order for these businesses to operate within the law. The League will continue to work with the authors, our partners, the California Police Chiefs Association, as well as other stakeholders to improve this measure as it goes forward."

Chula Vista Police Chief David Bejarano, president of the California Police Chiefs Association, agrees that the bill is an important step forward: "We are pleased the bill has cleared the Assembly and we look forward to working on finalizing language that addresses stakeholder concerns."

Assembly Member Bonta commended how legislators and stakeholders worked together: "I am proud to work with my colleagues and stakeholders of all perspectives on this unprecedented effort. I am confident that our collaborative efforts on AB 266 will successfully ensure that we establish necessary standards and protections for patients, the environment, and the public related to the medical cannabis industry."

Assembly Member Cooley also stressed the ways in which

this legislation reflects the various priorities of medical cannabis regulation: "I am very pleased that the Assembly voted AB 266 out today with bipartisan support. Throughout this process, my colleagues and I have worked to find consensus on issues of local control, public safety, and appropriate regulation of the medical cannabis industry. Today's vote recognized that hard work sends a strong message that California is trying to solve problems in a collaborative, effective, and accountable manner."

Assembly Member Jones-Sawyer noted the work of the stakeholders as the bill moves forward: "We are very glad that law enforcement and local governments are supporting our efforts. They are an essential partner in regulating the medical cannabis industry. We look forward to continuing to work collaboratively with all the stakeholders to ensure that AB 266 creates a regulatory system that respects the interests of local government while still providing a consistent statewide structure."

Assembly Member Tom Lackey of Palmdale, a former California Highway Patrol officer who was an original co-author of AB 266, made it clear that he remains its staunch advocate. Lackey urged his colleagues to support the measure, arguing that "this bill actually tightens medical marijuana standards" and that it "gives us more ability to control an industry that's out of control."

Almost 12 years ago, there were so many things that needed to be done before July 1st, 2003, when we would be recognized as an equal with the other cities. We took the eight months from November 2002 to July 1st, 2003, to prepare to hit the road running. Our City Hall, while temporary, was being equipped to offer service to the citizens of the newest incorporated city in the State of California. It was rather ironic that we had to drive to the oldest incorporated city in the state (the City of Sacramento) to reach the county government building to get our city services. In 19 days, we will have our 12th Birthday and Anniversary as a “new” city.

Many of the readers of the Grapevine Independent have heard some of this story before, but many haven’t because our population has increased by almost 26% since incorporation. Many of today’s Rancho Cordova citizens weren’t here when our long journey came to its great finish and we became the 478th incorporated city in the State of California. The

The Path to Cityhood

City of Rancho Cordova began a new journey in 2003. The first 12 years of that new journey has seen us grow, learn, and mature.

The short version could start when I became a member of the joint committee of the Cordova Community Council and the Cordova Chamber of Commerce in 1978. That effort was stopped because that was also the year that prop 13 passed and new cities wouldn’t receive any property tax. That was corrected by legislation, and George Burnash began another incorporation committee in 1983, which I joined. There was not enough community support to continue at that time, however, so that committee ended.

There was legislation in 1985 that stirred the pot again though, because it said that if there were any new cities in Sacramento County, it would be up to the county to decide how much (if any) property tax would be transferred to a new city. In January 1986, I filed with the Sacramento County Local Agency Formation Commission and began the Rancho Cordova Incorporation Committee to fight it. George Burnash joined that committee too, and while we weren’t able to stop that bill, we were able to amend it. We had many people who joined that Incorporation Committee during the 17 years

it took for that committee to get cityhood on the ballot. I believe all of us are happy with our results. Twelve years as a city and citizens are proud to say they are residents of the City of Rancho Cordova.

It used to be an important news story that Rancho Cordova had become a city. The media has changed focus, and that is kind of sad. If you watch the news on TV and see the media’s poor grammar and spelling, it can drive a person slightly crazy. I received an email the other day about how proofreading is a dying art. For example: “Man Kills Self Before Shooting Wife and Daughter.” That was noticed by a friend of mine in the SGV Tribune the other day. My friend called the Editorial Room and asked who wrote it. It took two or three readings before the editor realized that what he was reading was impossible. They put in a correction the next day.

If you see something that really looks wrong, go ahead and let them (me included) know. Our children see many of the same mistakes we see, and unless they are shown the mistake, they will repeat the same errors.

From Mayor Bob McGarvey, God bless, and see you next time. ★

Choosing a Home Blood Pressure Monitor

Dear Savvy Senior,
Can you offer me any tips on choosing a home blood pressure monitor? I just found out I have high blood pressure, and my doctor told me I need a monitor for the house so I can keep an eye on it.
Shopping Around

Dear Shopping,
Almost everyone with high blood pressure or prehypertension should have a home blood pressure monitor. Home monitoring can help you keep tabs on your blood pressure in a comfortable setting. Plus, if you’re taking medication it will make certain it’s working, and alert you to a health problem if it arises. Here are some tips to help you choose a good monitor.

Types of Monitors
The two most popular types of home blood pressure monitors on the market today are (electric and/or battery powered) automatic arm monitors, and automatic wrist monitors.

With an automatic arm monitor, you simply wrap the cuff around your bicep and with the push of one button the cuff inflates and deflates automatically giving you your blood pressure reading on the display window in a matter of seconds.

Wrist monitors work similarly, except they attach to the wrist. Wrist monitors are also smaller in size and a bit more comfortable to use than the arm monitors, but they tend to be a little less accurate.

To help you choose the best

- monitor for you, here are several things you need to check into:
- **Fit:** Using a cuff that’s the wrong size can result in a bad reading. Most arm models have two sizes or an adjustable cuff that fits most people. Make sure your choice fits the circumference of your upper arm.
 - **Accuracy:** Check the packaging to make sure the monitor has been independently tested and validated for accuracy and reliability. You can see a list of validated monitors at dableducational.org.
 - **Ease of use:** Be sure the display on the monitor is easy to read and understand, and that the buttons are big enough. The directions for applying the cuff and operating the monitor should be clear.
 - **Extra features:** Many monitors come with additional features such as irregular heart-beat detection that checks for arrhythmias and other abnormalities; a risk category indicator that tells you whether your blood pressure is in the high range; a data-averaging function that allows you to take multiple readings and get an overall average; multiple user memory that allows two or more users to save previous readings; and computer connections so you can download the data to your computer.
 - **Portability:** If you plan to take your monitor with you while traveling, look for one with a carrying case.

Where to Shop
You can find blood pressure

monitors at pharmacies, medical supply stores or online, and you don’t need a prescription to buy one.

The price will typically range anywhere from \$30 to \$120 or more. Unfortunately, original Medicare does not pay for home blood pressure monitors unless you’re receiving dialysis at home. But if you have a Medicare Advantage plan or a private health insurance policy it’s worth checking into, because some plans may provide coverage.

Some of the best arm monitors as recently recommended by Consumer Reports include the Rite Aid Deluxe Automatic BP3AR1-4DRITE; iHealth Dock BP3 (requires an Apple iOS device); Omron 10 Series BP786; A&D Medical UA767F; and the ReliOn BP200. And the top recommended wrist monitor is the Omron 7 Series BP652.

After you buy a monitor, it’s a good idea to take it to your doctor’s office so they can check its accuracy and teach you the proper techniques of how and when to use it.

Some other helpful resources include the National Clearinghouse for Long-Term Care Information (longtermcare.gov), and your State Health Insurance Assistance Program (shihtalk.org), which provides free counseling.

Our Community Needs Measure H Funds

From Jerald Drobesh:

Our Rancho Cordova Community needs Measure H funds to construct a large historical museum to help build tourism for our city’s economy and to promote community pride. I would recommend that someone on the city staff be assigned to check on local land available for lease or sale that would support a large two-story building to be used for a Rancho Cordova Community Historical Museum. If possible, such a museum would be located near a light rail station in the community.

Cost for land, building, and operating expenses would be difficult to estimate at this time, but I recommend a building for lease be found right away and to get started NOW. We are the only large city in the area without a city history museum and we probably have some of the best history in all of California. Many historical items are now in storage and may soon be lost to

the community.

The Rancho Cordova area played a large part in the early gold rush days of 1849 and the 1850s. Over the years, a lot of gold was removed from our city soil. Some of that gold might still be right under our feet.

We also have the first railroad line west of the Mississippi, following along Folsom Blvd and still in operation through our community. Early farmers in the area also grew citrus crops, which were shipped by train back east in the 1800s, becoming a brand new industry. Farmers here in Rancho Cordova grew all types of crops because the soil was river bottom and rich in nutrients. This helped to establish Rancho Cordova’s early community history.

Many early gold miners who couldn’t make it turned to farming and brought their families from the East Coast back to our area and became a large part of community history. We also had the pony express

come to our area. Years later, in the early 1920s and 1930s, the Lincoln highway came through the Rancho Cordova area and became a large part of the historic first paved road running from coast to coast. We also had Mather Air Force Base build in 1917 during World War I, which became a big part of the community along with Aerojet and the development of the Moon Rocket.

These are just some of the important historical parts of our city. I feel it’s important to keep our community history alive for ourselves, our children, and our grandchildren. We must not make the mistake of letting our community history end up in the Sacramento County dump! Do I have your vote?

- small garden. Your local extension service is a great resource.
2. **Decide on size:** If you have a large backyard, a bigger plot might be a good option and allow you to grow a wider variety of plants. If you live in the city or a restricted area, container gardens or garden boxes are a great option for herbs, flowers, and some vegetables. Don't bite off more than you can chew during the first year; starting small increases the likelihood of success, and you can always increase the size next year.
3. **Go shopping:** Once you have a general idea of your garden's size, location, and types of plants you'd like to grow, it's time to take the family shopping. Visit a store, such as your local Tractor Supply, for seasoned advice, tools, soil, seeds, fertilizers, and pest control. You can also find all the supplies necessary for raising backyard chickens, which offer a great way to eliminate backyard pests and boost the health of your garden. Additionally, the kids will love tending to the flock.
4. **Make time together:** Children love to get their hands dirty, so involve them in every step of the gardening process, from tilling the soil to harvesting the produce. Set a schedule for watering and weeding to teach kids responsibility. Be sure to keep an open conversation about their observations and try to answer their questions. If you don't know all the answers, explore and learn together.
- "Getting outdoors, growing a garden, and learning about the land is one of the best things families can do during the warm-weather months," says Bryant. "Plus, kids are more likely to eat fruits and vegetables when they help grow them in their own backyard. That's a win all around."

Bankruptcy Aftershocks

Dear Dave,

What are the long-term effects of declaring bankruptcy?
Brittany

Dear Brittany,

One of the biggest aftershocks of filing bankruptcy is that it stays on your credit report for years afterward. A Chapter 7 filing, which wipes out everything and gives you a clean slate, stays on your report for 10 years. Chapter 13, which is a repayments plan, and Chapter 11, another type of large bankruptcy or business bankruptcy, both stay on your credit bureau report for seven years. Another big problem is that it can follow you around when it comes to applications or when you apply for different types of licenses. Many of these ask if you've ever filed bankruptcy. It doesn't ask if it's still on your credit report; it will ask if you've ever filed bankruptcy. If you have, you'll have instances for the rest of your life when you have to admit it and explain it all over again. So, it's an emotional scar that follows you around for a long, long time.

Too many bankruptcy filers never really recover from their financial distress because they never learn new and better ways to manage their money. That's why I recommend people do everything they can to avoid bankruptcy. It's not an easy do-over; it's a last-resort kind of thing. And in the vast majority of situations it's just not necessary.

Honor and Respect for the United States Flag Shows in Its Folds

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - June 14th is Flag Day. Most people are aware that at military ceremonies and on holidays such as Memorial Day and Veterans Day, there are flag folding ceremonies. At the funeral of a veteran, an American flag is folded by two people in a very precise way and given to the next of kin.

It is thought that the practice was likely developed during Word War I when patriotism was high and the United States flag was universally embraced as a national symbol. The custom of folding the flag into the shape of a triangle bestows unique honor and respect.

A lot of thought and even some history has gone into the folding of the flag. This explanation comes from the American Legion.

Meaning of Flag-Folding Program

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our great country was originally founded. The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing states our veterans served in uniform. The canton field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted only when draped as a pall on the casket of a veteran who has served our country honorably in uniform.

In the U.S. Armed Forces at the ceremony of retreat, the flag is lowered, folded in a triangle fold, and kept under watch throughout the night as a tribute to our nation's honored dead. The next morning, it is brought out and, at the ceremony of



reveille, run aloft as a symbol of our belief in the resurrection of the body.

Symbols for the Folds of the Flag

The **first** fold of the flag is a symbol of life. The **second** fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life. The **third** fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks who gave his or her life for the defense of our country. The **fourth** fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as times of war for His divine guidance. The **fifth** fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The **sixth** fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God,

indivisible, with liberty and justice for all. The **seventh** fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic. The **eighth** fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother for whom it flies on Mother's Day. The **ninth** fold is a tribute to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty, and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great was molded.

The **10th** fold is a tribute to father, for he too has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first born. The **11th** fold, in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The **12th** fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

The source and the date of origin of this flag-folding procedure is unknown, however some sources attribute it to the Gold Star Mothers of America while others to an Air Force chaplain stationed at the United States Air Force Academy. Others consider it to be an urban legend. It is provided as a patriotic service to all.

Because of graduations and post-graduation parties prior to the game, Anderson opted to hold a mini-practice two hours before Saturday's game. A pre-game motivational speech

seemed to have lifted the South to dominance.

"All the kids hit the ball very well," Anderson said.

"Everything went to plan and everybody got a couple of times at-bat. I had fun."

El Dorado's Matt Smith, who

went 4-for-4 at the plate, was named the South's Outstanding Player. The North's Steve Robinson of River Valley of Yuba City earned the same award.

After the game, Anderson was recognized for his commitment and dedication to youth of Sacramento and Greater Sacramento.


Last month, Anderson was dismissed as CHS's baseball coach by the school's administration, which told him that the program needed to go in another direction.

A former administrator at CHS, where he also served as Cordova's athletic director and teacher, Anderson has received about a half-dozen offers to coach baseball and softball at Sacramento-area high schools. He's also been offered an opportunity to coach in a Sacramento-area community college baseball program starting spring 2016.

Anderson said he plans to make his decision as to where he'll be coaching toward the end of summer going into fall. ★

END OF THE BENCH

"An' a One, An' a Two, An' a Three"

Three's a crowd, or Three's Company. A three-dollar bill, or three coins in the fountain. Three little kittens, or three little pigs. Three Stooges, Three Amigos, Three Musketeers, three blind mice. Richard III, The Three Tenors, My Three Sons. The Three Fates, the Three Faces of Eve. Three times a lady. Three Doors Down, Led Zeppelin III (our favorite), Three Dog Night.

"One" may be the loneliest number (though it really should be glad it is not a "zero"), but "three" has always had a great ring to it and has been extremely popular lately. Threes are everywhere. It's a three-ring circus.

Most notably, of course, is the horse, American Pharoah, that raced to the winner's circle for the third time, winning the 147th Belmont Stakes, Saturday in New York, to become the first Triple Crown champion since Affirmed in 1978. It was a sight to behold, as the 3-year-old colt left little doubt by pulling away down the homestretch.

Three has been an iconic number in sports. Winning a Triple Crown in baseball (leading the league in batting average, home runs and RBI in the same season) has always been considered an utmost fantastic accomplishment. When Detroit's Miguel Cabrera did it in 2012 it was the first time in the American League since Boston's Carl Yastrzemski in 1967. No one in the NL has done it since 1937.

Other than around here, where everybody knows Willie Mays wore No. 24, and with the possible exception of Jackie Robinson's No. 42 that has been so honored in recent times, the most recognizable uniform number of all time in baseball is probably No. 3, worn by Babe Ruth. In auto racing, it's all about the No. 3 car of the late Dale Earnhardt, Sr. The most

identifiable of all the Super Bowls is likely No. III, because New York Jets flamboyant quarterback Joe Namath predicted that his upstarts, fresh out of the former AFL, would upset the NFL's powerhouse Baltimore Colts and did, 16-7. Three is sacred in hockey --- three goals by the same player equaling a "hat trick," prompting fans to cast away their hats upon the rink.

Tennis superstar Novak Djokovic is stuck on three. He has won three of the four majors among the sport's Grand Slam, but failed again Sunday in his third French Open final in four years, falling to Stan Wawrinka in four sets. During the awards ceremonies, Djokovic, beloved in the game as a classy, great champion, received a remarkable standing ovation that must have lasted...about three minutes.

Casey McGehee, whom the three-time World Series champion Giants acquired during the off-season to fill the hole at third base, has been down to Triple A Sacramento (where he hit well above .300) and brought back up to the big club, but remains a prime candidate to hit into a triple play at some point.

Three is a glorified number in basketball. If we dare to say "Three-peat" here, we are probably going to owe Pat Riley some money. You had the "Big Three" of the Miami Heat, LeBron James, Dwayne Wade and Chris Bosh, that went to four straight NBA finals and won two titles. LeBron's favorite song is "Gimme Three Steps," and he oftentimes takes them.

But, most important, is the three-point field goal that actually first came into being during the renegade days of the old American Basketball Association in 1967. In 1976, the ABA merged with the NBA,

bringing in its four top franchises, and the three-point shot was adopted three years later. The game was changed forever.

The Golden State Warriors have a deep connection to the three-point-shooting part of the game. MVP point guard Stephen Curry is being hailed as possibly the greatest shooter of all-time as the result of his recent exploits. His father, Dell Curry, made 1,245 threes, shooting at a .402 clip through his long career, and first-year head coach Steve Kerr (who has five championship rings as a key role player for title teams in Chicago and San Antonio) is the all-time leader in three-point accuracy at .454.

Steph Curry broke his own record for three-pointers made in a season this year by fourteen, making 286. The team led the league in three-point shooting percentage at .398. Individually, Curry ranked third, fellow Splash Brother, Klay Thompson, was fourth and Harrison Barnes 12th. But, in the overtime win against the Cavaliers in Game 1 of the Finals, the Brothers combined to make only 5 of 15. In the Game 2 OT loss, the pair plus Barnes made only 6 of 31.

The hope is that things will even out. If Curry can overcome setting records for most threes taken and missed in a Finals game (hitting only 2 of 15 in Game 2), and find the range again from beyond the arc, and lead his team to three more wins and a championship, Warriors fans will dance until a quarter to three, until they are three sheets to the wind.

Tips for Fishing Heavy Cover

A mistake a lot of fishermen make when flipping and pitching is dropping the bait on the outside edge of the structure or cover, and that spooks any resident bass. Instead, drop it right at the base.

Most fishermen naturally don't want to get hung up, but you have to get over that if you are going to improve your flipping and pitching skills and begin catching bass in heavy cover. Most of the time you will find that the thickest spots are holding the biggest fish, so this is where you should put your first flip or pitch.

Practice flipping and pitching at a target around your house so when you are on the water you have the confidence you need to put your lure where you need to. Then you won't have to worry about getting hung up as much. Besides, you aren't fishing where you can catch big fish if you aren't losing a few lures.

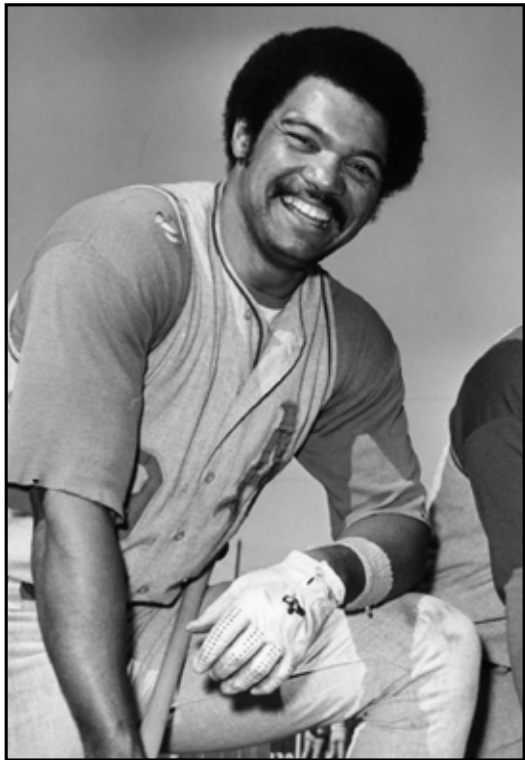

The struggling A’s were more than happy to hear the Mets call Steve Chilcott’s name to begin the second draft in history. Best of the 2000s: Justin Verlander, Detroit Tigers, 2004

3 Robin Yount, Milwaukee, 1973
The Hall of Famer edges out long-time teammate and fellow Hall member Paul Molitor, who was taken third four years later. Best of the 2000s: Evan Longoria, Tampa Bay Devil Rays, 2006

4 Dave Winfield, San Diego, 1973
The big outfielder was drafted in the NFL and both the ABA and NBA. Best of the 2000s: Ryan Zimmerman, Washington Nationals, 2005

5 Dale Murphy, Atlanta, 1974
Tough call over Dwight Gooden and Buster Posey. The Giants’ catcher will likely earn this spot in a few years, but if his career ended today, he would fall short. Best of the 2000s: Buster Posey, San Francisco, 2008

6 Derek Jeter, New York Yankees, 1992
Clearly, this presents the classic argument of best performance on the field vs. the most significant impact on the game. Barry Bonds was an awfully good player, but was never as revered or considered the “face of the game” as Jeter was. Best of the 2000s: Zack Greinke, Kansas City Royals, 2002

7 Frank Thomas, Chicago White Sox, 1989
Clayton Kershaw is not in the Hall of Fame yet, so this goes to the big tight end from Auburn, who quickly became the Big Hurt and a Big Star in Chicago. Best of the 2000s: Clayton Kershaw, Los Angeles Dodgers, 2006

8 Todd Helton, Colorado, 1995
The greatest player in Colorado history once started at quarterback at the University of Tennessee with Peyton Manning on the bench. Best of the 2000s: Mike Leake, Cincinnati, 2009

9 Kevin Appier, Kansas City Royals, 1987
Appier has four more wins and six fewer losses than Barry Zito. Best of the 2000s: Mike Pelfrey, New York Mets, 2009

10 Ted Simmons, St. Louis, 1967
I’ll take Simmons’ complete game over Mark McGwire’s power. Best of the 2000s: Madison Bumgarner, San Francisco, 2007

11 Andrew McCutchen, Pittsburgh, 2005
I’m taking the Pirates’ center fielder over Greg Luzinski and Max Scherzer. Best of the 2000s: Max Scherzer, Arizona, 2006

12 Kirk Gibson, Detroit, 1978
The All-America wide receiver from Michigan State delivered one of the most dramatic home runs in history in the 1988 World Series—but not for the team that drafted him. Best of the 2000s: Jered Weaver, Anaheim Angels, 2004

13 Paul Konerko, L.A. Dodgers, 1994
Konerko hit just four of his 439 career home runs for the team that drafted him. Manny Ramirez was a nice pick by the Indians at this spot as well. Best of the 2000s: Chris Sale, Chicago White Sox, 2010

14 Jason Varitek, Seattle, 1994
After making this terrific pick, the Mariners dealt Varitek AND Derek Lowe to the Red Sox for Heathcliff Slocumb. Best of the 2000s: Jason Heyward, Atlanta Braves, 2007

15 Jim Rice, Boston, 1971
Condredge Holloway, Roger Quiroga, Ed Kurpiel and David Sloan were among the 14 players chosen before Rice in 1971. The Hall of Famer spent his entire career with Boston, winning an MVP trophy in 1978. Best of the 2000s: Chase Utley, Philadelphia, 2000

16 Lance Berkman, Houston, 1997
Berkman joined Craig Biggio and Jeff Bagwell as a full-time member of the Killer Bs in 2000. Best of the 2000s: Nick Swisher, Oakland A’s, 2002

17 Roy Halladay, Toronto, 1995
Doc Halladay is second in wins, strikeouts and shutouts on the Blue Jays’ career lists. Best of the 2000s: Cole Hamels, Philadelphia, 2002

Wilson played center field and batted leadoff for the Royals’ AL pennant winners in 1980 and ’85. Best of the 2000s: Sonny Gray, Oakland A’s, 2011

19 Roger Clemens, Boston, 1983
As great as Clemens was for the Red Sox, he couldn’t reverse the curse in Boston. Best of the 2000s: Shelby Miller, St. Louis, 2009

20 Mike Mussina, Baltimore, 1990
Mussina should be in the Hall of Fame one day, and could easily be joined there by Torii Hunter, drafted at No. 20 by the Twins in 1993. Best of the 2000s: Trevor Plouffe, Minnesota, 2004

AROUND THE HORN

Baseball fans in Boston were treated to a rare occurrence last week. Oakland relief pitcher **Pat Venditte**, a switch-pitcher, tossed two shutout innings against the Red Sox. Venditte, who was signed as a minor league free agent in the offseason, is no circus sideshow. He is for real. The reliever was called up on Friday and arrived at Fenway Park just after the game had started. He came on in the seventh inning and faced three batters, giving up a single to Hanley Ramirez before inducing a double play off the bat of Mike Napoli. He sat down the Red Sox in order in the eighth. The final hitter he faced was switch-hitter Blake Swihart. Venditte had to announce which hand he would throw with before each batter, electing to face Swihart right-handed. He struck out the Boston catcher, who was batting left-handed...The Texas Rangers haven’t exactly enjoyed great success with first-round picks in their history. But recent picks **Joey Gallo** (supplemental in 2012) and **Chi Chi Rodriguez** in 2013 have achieved early success this month for the Rangers. Gallo homered in his first two games, falling a triple shy of a cycle in his debut. Rodriguez has begun his career with 14.2 scoreless innings over his first two starts, including a complete game shutout at Kansas City in his second start. His next start will be June 11 at Oakland...St. Louis manager Mike Matheny may want to carefully schedule starts for pitcher **Lance Lynn**. In seven starts on four days’ rest this season, Lynn is 1-3 with a 4.68 ERA and a 1.465 WHIP. When given an extra day or more to recuperate, Lynn is 3-1 with a 0.87 ERA and 1.065 WHIP...On June 7, **Gregor Blanco** of the Giants was intentionally walked twice. That was the first time a Giants player had been intentionally passed twice in one game since Buster Posey on Sept. 18, 2012. And that begs the question as to who was the last Giants player to be walked three times intentionally in one game. Barry Bonds, you say? That would be incorrect. It was 41-year-old shortstop Omar Vizquel on May 11, 2008...The **Baltimore Orioles** just completed 22 games in 21 days. They won seven of the first 12 batting .253 with a 3.33 ERA. Over the final nine games, the O’s won just three, batting .229 with a 3.97 ERA.

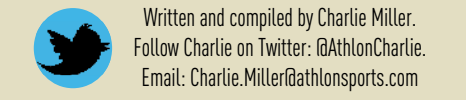
