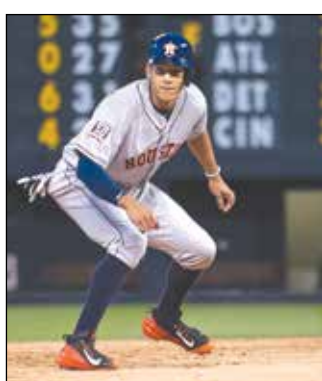

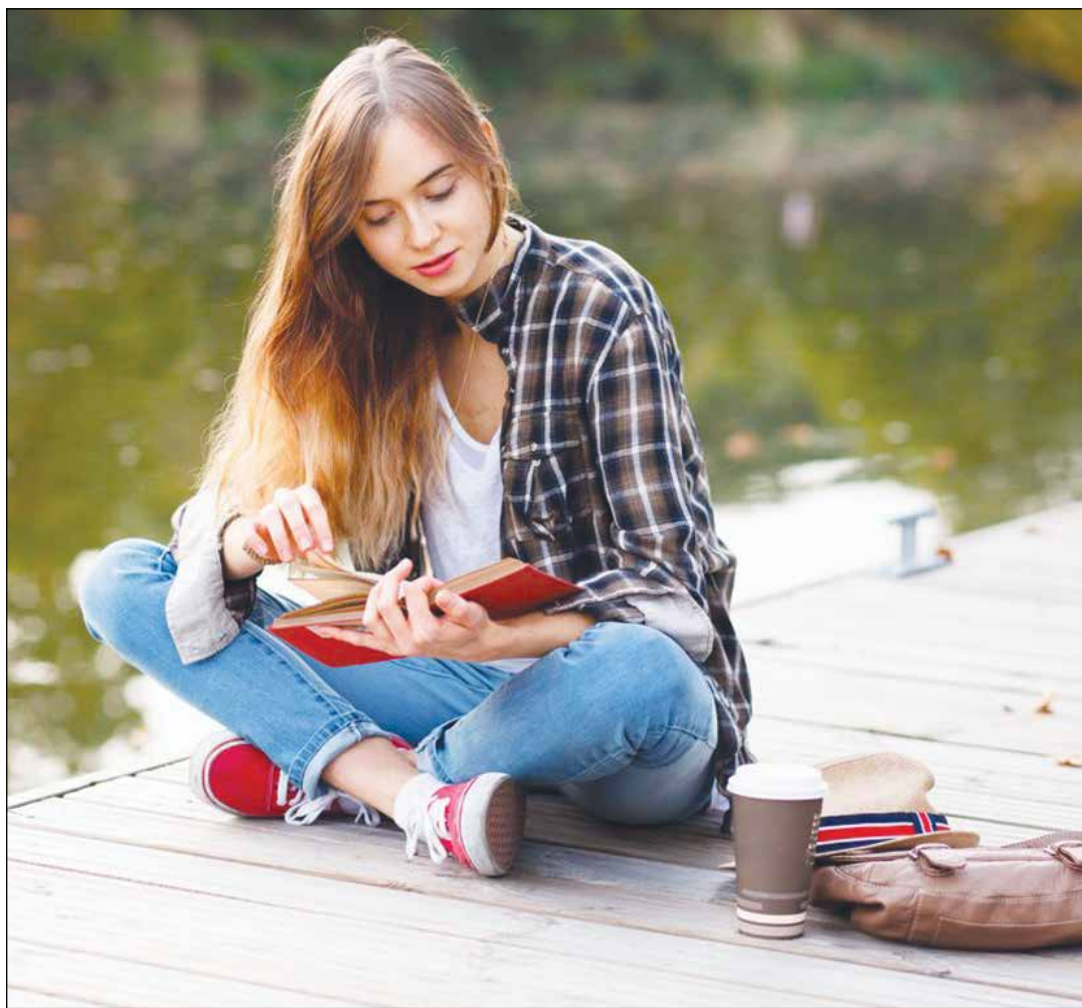
Reading Outside of School Is Very Important for Kids

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (BPT) -

Reading is a fundamental skill people use throughout their lives, and in this digital age reading is more important than ever. When children and tweens read, they improve their reading skills and they also improve their comprehension, knowledge base, concentration, and vocabulary. story of Milan, a high-school girl with a burgeoning modeling career. She's also deaf and struggling with the same insecurities many tweens and teens face. This book is geared toward young adults, making it easy for them to tackle. The book also comes with its own musical soundtrack, allowing your child to enjoy the music as they turn the pages.

- **Start a book club.** Join your tween in what they are reading. Ask them to pick a book you

will both read together and then discuss at the end of the month. This will help keep both of you on task and provide a great way to share mutual interests.

- **Stress reading's other benefits.** Reading offers numerous benefits to your child beyond the purely academic, so make sure they are aware of them. Reading a book also grows their imagination, spurs creativity, entertains, and provides a cost-effective way to kick back and relax after a long day of school. The more

your child sees reading as a reward, the more apt they will be to do it in their spare time.

State Health Officer Urges Californians to Stay Safe in Extreme Heat

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

As temperatures begin to warm up throughout the state, California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Director Dr. Karen Smith advises California residents to prepare themselves for what could be a very hot, dry summer.

"Because this hot spell has come on rather suddenly, many people may be caught off guard by the warm up," Dr. Smith said. "It is important that all Californians take precautions to prevent heat-related illness and stay hydrated."

In areas where air quality is impacted, people with heart disease, asthma, or other respiratory diseases should minimize outdoor activities. Summer schools and programs with children who have sensitive conditions, including heart disease, asthma, and other respiratory diseases should not participate in outdoor physical activity and should stay indoors as much as possible.

Extreme heat poses a substantial health risk, especially in vulnerable populations including young children, the elderly, people with chronic diseases, pregnant women, people with disabilities, and people who are socially isolated. Heat-related illnesses include cramps, heat exhaustion and, most seriously, heat stroke and death. Warning signs of heat-related illnesses vary, but may include heavy sweating, muscle cramps, weakness, headache, nausea or vomiting, paleness, tiredness, or dizziness.

Smith offers the following tips to stay safe in extreme heat. Those lacking air conditioning should go to a cooling center, library, or public place such as a shopping mall to cool off for a few hours each day. Avoid physical exertion/exercise outdoors during the hottest parts of the day to avoid overheating. Reduce exposure to the sun from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. when UV

Volunteers Plant Trees to Provide Native Habitat



Volunteers from the Wildlife Care Association, SMUD, the Sacramento Tree Foundation, Southside Rental Equipment, and Messenger Publishing Group planted 20 trees at McClellan's former-USAF facility to provide shade, native habitat, a windbreak, an onsite outdoor natural education area, and to improve the public appeal of the old tech facility.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A stark contrast between obsolete technology and urgent wildlife care brought volunteers to the non-profit Wildlife Care Association to join SMUD, the Sacramento Tree Foundation, Southside Rental Equipment, and Messenger Publishing Group to transform the former radar dome on the west side of McClellan Park on Saturday, June 13th. The old technology "palace" now houses the non-profit Wildlife Care Association, providing intake, care, and release for displaced or injured wildlife in the Sacramento region.

As part of the long term change at the two-acre site, 20 trees were planted to provide shade, native habitat, a windbreak, an onsite outdoor natural education area, and to improve the public appeal of the old tech facility. A program of SMUD and the Sacramento Tree Foundation, the drought-tolerant native trees offer a natural way to soften the harsh former-USAF facility to meet its current need in providing the essential and unique resource for the region's wildlife. "Gray" or recycled washing machine rinse water will be used to help establish the trees after planting.

Everything from hummingbirds to coyotes in the region is sent to the volunteers at Wildlife Care Association where they are cared for and released back to the environment. Volunteers are always needed, as 98% of the effort comes from caring volunteers, and 88 cents of every dollar donated goes to wildlife recovery and release.



IN MEMORIAM

Rudolph Meingrode Mayer

January 1, 1928 - June 17, 2015

Rudolph Meingrode Mayer died peacefully in his sleep from many terminal illnesses including dementia at Wm Jennings Bryan Dorn VA Medical Center on Wednesday, June 17, 2015, in Columbia South Carolina at the age of 87.

Rudolph is survived by wife Rosa Mae Mayer, sons Conrade and Johnny Michael, daughter Juanita, step daughter Sandra Bowman, granddaughter Meshon Pratt, grandson Donte Mayer, great granddaughter Sadea Riddick, daughter in laws Melody Granger Mayer and Patty Homo Mayer, and sister Vivian Jemison Page. He is preceded in death by his father John D Mayer; mother Annie Mae Dewberry Mayer, sister Catherine Richards, and brother John Mayer.

Rudolph was born on January 1, 1928, at Hillman Hospital in Jefferson County, Birmingham, AL. He graduated from Parker High School in 1946, and immediately enlisted in the Air Force. Rudolph married Rosa Mae Mayer April 28, 1958, at 4:55p.m. in Sumter, SC; never one to put things off until tomorrow, Rudolph and Rosa got married 5 minutes before the courthouse closed for the day!

Rudolph served in the



Air Force for over 21 years. During his time in the military he fought for his country and received many awards including one that stated that he had excellent Character and Efficiency and was favorably considered for the Good Conduct Clasp. Rudolph honorably retired from the Air Force at McClellan AFB in North Highlands, CA. Upon retiring from the military he settled in Rancho Cordova, CA where he lived with his wife and children while going on to work for the Sacramento Army Depot. He remained in Rancho Cordova until 2006 when he moved with Rosa, back to Columbia South Carolina.

Rudolph loved watching football, baseball and boxing, but most of all he loved listening to music from greats like James Brown, Al Green and his all-time favorite Freddy Fender - he wore the grooves off that record! Although Rudolph was


mostly a quite individual, he loved to entertain family and friends. Rudolph and Rosa threw some great parties back in the day! Rudolph also enjoyed watching old westerns and sitcoms including Sanford and Sons!

Rudolph Mayer would do anything for his family, including driving them by himself across country to visit family straight through from California to Birmingham AL and then from there to South Carolina. Rudolph loved his family.

Funeral Services have been scheduled for Saturday June 27, 2015, at 11am, at Leevy's Funeral Home, 1831 Taylor Street, Columbia, SC 29201. A reception will follow at {location}. 

2015 FIREWORKS BUYERS GUIDE

Get the Most Bang for Your Buck

★

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - To those flexing independence on Independence Day by not leaving fireworks to the professionals, have fun and, above all, be safe; we don't want anyone or anything to go up in smoke.


That includes your hard-earned money. When firework stands, run by fundraising non-profits, open for business starting June 28th, consumers will be faced with the usual pricey and patriotic puzzlement. What's new? What's loud? What's colorful? How long does it last? What gives me the most bang for my buck?

Messenger Publishing Group has the answers,

having put every new state-approved firework from TNT and Phantom to the test. Our annual fireworks buyers guide also includes returning favorites that scored at least 4 of 5 stars on a scale that factors performance, value, duration, and distinctiveness. Every firework sold individually in California has been rated for the guide since 2003, so whatever isn't listed wasn't forgotten—it just didn't make the grade. Judges this year included firefighters of Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, Station 65 in Rancho Cordova, where the test was conducted. Fireworks are listed by price, highest to lowest.

Let the sparks fly!

New for 2015



Coral Reef (Phantom), \$49.99 – Phantom's longest-lasting fan fountain. Debuting last season outside California, this 500-gram humdinger wows with radiant colors and clamorous whistles and crackles. Tested nearly identically to TNT's Delirium (see review). *105 seconds.* ★ ★ ★ ★

Fiery Scorpion (TNT), \$24.99 – Pleasing red, white, and bluish sparks mixed with snow pine, lemon, and titanium crackles. Duration should be longer at this price point. *64 seconds.* ★ ★ ★

Neon Galaxy (TNT), \$21.99 – A crackle bassline plays as four tubes, one after the other, emit sparks of green, gold, white, red, yellow, etc. Pretty, but pretty ordinary, even with the decent burn time. *90 seconds.* ★ ★ ★

Zombie Apocalypse (TNT), \$21.99 – Sensational medium-priced fan fountain has large-sized intensity. Promises to have a strong rookie season. *62 seconds.* ★ ★ ★ ★

Phantom Pixie Dust (Phantom), \$19.99 – Possibly the largest and heaviest fountain that burns for just over a minute. Stars and chrysanthemums of purple, lemon, red, silver, gold, and green, and titanium crackles make this good, not great. *66 seconds.* ★ ★ ★

Phantom Uproar (Phantom), \$12.99 (for two) – Unless buying the newest fireworks is important to you, a better two-for-one deal at the same price is Phantom's performance-comparable Twilight Magic fountains, which are prettier, louder, and longer lasting. *33 seconds.* ★ ★ ★

Crystal Skies (TNT), \$9.99 – This year's "Best New Fountain" winner has great height, striking gold glitters and white pines, and loud crackles. Better than many fountains sold at double the price. *68 seconds.* ★ ★ ★ ★ ★

Phantom Treasure (Phantom), \$6.99 – Chrysanthemums of green and gold. Meh. *35 seconds.* ★ ★



Sir Dumps a Lot (TNT), \$6.99 (bag of two) – TNT's all-business response to Phantom's Poopy Pooch (\$5.99 for two), which is being discontinued next year. Both naughty novelties feature an ash "log" that comes out the rear end of a cardboard dog. Scatological joke only works once, so not sure why we need two. One at half the price would merit another star. *20 seconds.* ★ ★

Mano a Mano (TNT), \$5 for four – Sold under different names in 2003 and 2004 (Bandito and Pyro Pete, respectively), this set of four crackle-happy, three-inch fountains isn't really new to the California market. They also clock in 5 seconds less than before. For the same price, consider two Fire Krackle boxes. *13 seconds.* ★ ★

Fireblast Assortment (Phantom), \$199.99 – Phantom has the only new fireworks assortment for the Northern California market this year, and it's all fountains. Among the 24, only three, including the always-impressive Firecracker Fountain, last longer than a minute. It's one of three in the box also sold individually, the others being the new Uproar and the classic Moondance. For the same price, TNT's **The Big Deluxe Assortment** has 23 regular-sized fountains, 42 of the throwaway Flashing Fountains, and 36 Lightning Flashes. A generous 11 fountains burn for over a minute, the best being Fire Destroyers, Devil's Delight, Combustion Chamber, and the one also sold individually — Mad Dog. *Fireblast Assortment: ★ ★*
Big Deluxe Assortment: ★ ★ ★ ★ ★



Best of the Rest (4-5 Stars)

Opening Show (TNT), \$59.99 – Budget permitting, the "Best New Finale" winner of 2012 is a 500-gram must-have. You'll forget the steep price at the 1:40 mark when all fiery heck breaks loose, sure to startle anyone closer than 15 feet away. *130 seconds.*



Apache Firedance Premier (Phantom), \$49.99 – Last season's "Best New Firework" scores with seven effects, including some of the best crackles, strobes, and height on the safe and sane market. *140 seconds.*

Delirium (TNT), \$49.99 – Fan-shaped 500-gram fountain boasts crowd-pleasing intensity and stunning beauty. Granddaddy of all state-approved fan fountains, and the best-selling finale for 10 years running. No wonder Phantom has come out with Coral Reef. *105 seconds.*

Peacock Tail Fan (Phantom), \$34.99 – "Best New Firework" of 2012 builds excitement with each dazzling stage. Works out to 65 cents per second, but the audience's "oohs" and "ahhs" are priceless. *54 seconds.*

Moondance Premier (Phantom), \$29.99 – It's Phantom's value-priced Moondance Fountain on steroids. Terrific height, lots of purple—a real crowd pleaser. *100 seconds.*

Alpha Wolf (Phantom), \$26.99 – Newly discontinued, so get it while you can. Green and purple droplets, gold shower, and crackling stars finale are awesome. No howling whistles despite its name. *83 seconds.*

Funky Monkey (Phantom), \$24.99 – Pyrotechnic primate features red pearls and a solid overall performance. *90 seconds.*

American Spirit (TNT), \$22.99 plus bonus – Fountain of red, white, and bluish stars; gold showers; and decent whistles and crackles makes the cut because it comes with the pleasing 90-second Sizzler Fountain. *80 seconds.*

O-Blivion (TNT), \$19.99 – Lord of the ring-shaped fountains emits multi-colored chrysanthemums with pine and impressive titanium crackles. Sweet burn time. *125 seconds.*

Phantom Phlash Phinish (Phantom), \$18.99 – Phantastic phountain with strong duration, altitude, spread, titanium crackle, and whistle. *108 seconds.*

Mad Dog (TNT), \$17.99 for two – Emits amazing crackles, whistles, and multi-color sparks, but it's the combo deal that keeps this old dog on our list. *80 seconds.*

Serenity (Phantom), \$15.99 – Noiseless fountain opens with lovely lava lamp-like lumps and peacefully pleases with seven colors and white chrysanthemums. *59 seconds.*

King of Bling (Phantom), \$14.99 – Crackles heard during the final third sound just like popping popcorn. Chrysanthemums, whistle, and burn time are majestic for the price. *90 seconds.*

Luminescence (Phantom), \$14.99 – Starts out as a run-of-the-mill multi-effect fountain, but then surprises with an eruption of wide-spreading sparks. One of the best performers of last year's freshman class. *73 seconds.*

Phantom Night Owl (Phantom), \$14.99 – Sadly, Phantom's best internally glowing fountain (eyes and mouth light up) is newly discontinued. Say goodbye (soon) to four loud screeches and an exciting overall performance. *65 seconds.*

Twilight Magic (Phantom), \$12.99 for two – "Best New Fountain" of 2013, now a 2-for-1 item, has three exciting rotations of crackle-and-whistle and wide-spreading sparks. *57 seconds.*

Surfs Up (TNT), \$10.99 – Gorgeous globs lead to a wave of multiple effects and some of the best and widest-spreading titanium rain and crackles for the price. *58 seconds.*

Luck of the Irish (TNT), \$9.99 – Fourteen-year-old classic features gold and silver spray, red and green balls, crackles, and four super-loud whistles. *75 seconds.*

Firecracker Fountain (Phantom), \$9.99 – Lives up to its name with an awesome crackling barrage alongside multi-colored pearls. *76 seconds.*



Phantom Dragon Slayer (Phantom), \$9.99 for two – Solid buy with pretty white, blue, and lemon chrysanthemums; rowdy crackles; and red stars. *66 seconds.*

Lil Red Devil (TNT), \$9.99 for two – Packs plenty of heat for the size and price. Ends strong with wide-spreading titanium crackling sparks. *35 seconds.*

Rainbow Rays (TNT), \$5.99 – Terrific value-priced item, delivering on burn time, height, and crackle. *56 seconds.*

Purple Rain (TNT), \$5.99 for two; and Moondance (Phantom), \$2.99 – Identical little dynamos emit loud crackles, purple pearls, and glittering gold and white sparks. *45 seconds.*

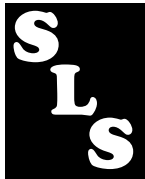

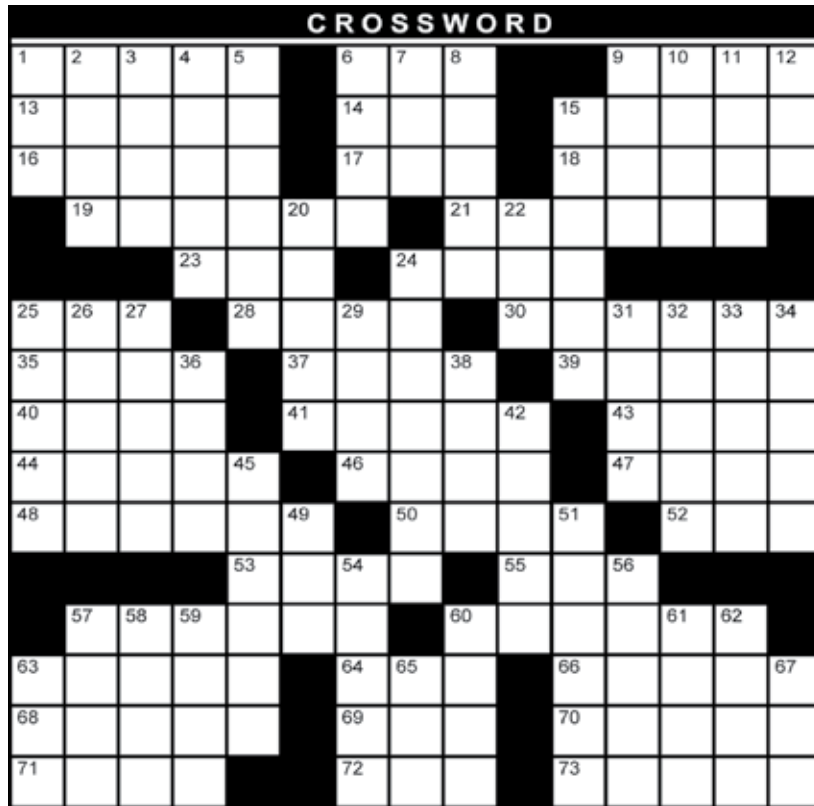

Lancer Gridders Working on Offensive Flow

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Monday, the Cordova High School football team converged onto the Monterey Trail High School’s football and practice fields for the five-day Nor-Cal Skills Camp that concludes Friday, June 26th.

The Lancers are taking part in the summer development camp with host school Monterey Trail, along with Burbank of Sacramento and Vintage of Napa. Monterey Trail, Burbank, and Vintage made the Sac-Joaquin Section playoffs last fall. Cordova went 6-4 overall and 1-4 in the Sierra Valley Conference, missing the post-season by just one game.

“It’s a good test to see how we stack up against playoff caliber programs,” said Cordova head coach Darren Nill. “We are

noticeably smaller and younger than the other teams. But we stack up well against any of them with our passing game.”

That includes building the flow of running the Lancers’ offense that Nill wants to see sustained when the season kicks-off in exactly two months through early November, and, if all goes well, into a playoff berth.

“We got to put our up tempo offense to the test and it worked well; but we have a long way to go to be able to sustain that for 48 minutes,” Nill said.

After Monday and Tuesday’s afternoon sessions, Nill, in his first season as head coach, and his coaching staff are looking for continued improvement in various drills.

“Some players get better when the hats go on and some do not,” Nill said. “Camp is about giving

every player looks and putting your team in situations to test the barriers and push your players through them. We hit some barriers the first couple days and didn’t push through all of them—but we will.”

The Lancers and the other teams at the camp have limited contact drills because of California AB 2127, which puts restrictions on students playing contact sports such as football. The bill was passed last summer.

For Cordova football fans who want to see the Lancers at the camp, they will be on or near Monterey Trail’s football and practice fields from 2:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

A follow-up on the conclusion of the Lancers’ trek at the camp is scheduled to run in the July 3rd edition of the Grapevine, so check back next week. ★

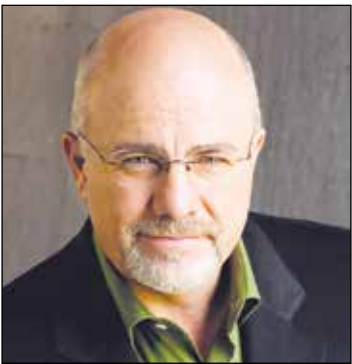
coached our youth basketball teams.

Stay away from interest-only mortgages

Can you explain interest-only mortgages? Are they a good idea?

Dear Dale,

An interest-only mortgage is just

what it sounds like. You’re paying only the interest on the loan, and none of what you actually owe. It’s a good way to stay in debt for the rest of your life, so they’re not a good idea.

Lots of people look at this product and say, “Wow, I’ll get a lower monthly payment, and then I can throw tons of cash at the principal.” Guess what, in most cases it doesn’t work out that way. Why not take out a good 15-year fixed rate mortgage and put a bunch of money toward the principal? Everyone thinks they have a great idea for tricking the system. But the only system that really works is to pay off debt as quickly as you can.

Interest-only mortgages are like adjustable rate mortgages and high fixed rate mortgages — they’re good things to stay away from completely!

rays are strongest, and keep physical activities to a minimum during that time. When working outside, drink plenty of water or juice even if you are not thirsty, and take rest breaks in the shade. Check on elderly who live alone every 24 hours; many may be on medications that increase likelihood of dehydration. Those lacking air conditioning should go to a cooling center, library, or public place such as a shopping mall to cool off for a few hours each day.

To prevent overheating, use cool compresses, misting, showers, and

baths. Get medical attention if you experience a rapid, strong pulse, feel delirious, or have a body temperature above 102 degrees.

Never, EVER leave infants, children, or frail elderly unattended in a parked car – it can take as little as 10 minutes for the temperature inside a car to rise to levels that can kill. Wear a wide-brimmed hat to cover the face and neck, and wear loose-fitting clothing to keep cool and to protect your skin from the sun and mosquitoes. Wear sunglasses that provide 100 percent UVA and UVB protection. Chronic exposure to the sun can cause cataracts,

which when left untreated can lead to blindness.

Liberally apply sunscreen (at least SPF 15) 15 minutes before venturing outdoors and re-apply at least every two hours – sunscreen may reduce the risk of skin cancer, the number one cancer affecting Californians. Sunscreen may also prevent premature aging. In California, employers with outdoor places of employment are required to prevent heat illness in their employees.

On June 19, 2015, Verlander served up hit No. 3,000 for Alex Rodriguez, also a home run...When it comes to freezing out inherited baserunners, none are better than relievers **George Kontos** of San Francisco and **Charlie Furbush** of Seattle. Both have inherited 16 runners and stranded them all...And for the feel-good moment of the week, Tony Gwynn, Jr., playing for the Syracuse Chiefs, the Triple-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals, is hoping to earn a spot on the big league club. But on Father’s Day, a little more than a year after his father’s death, the younger Gwynn hit a walk-off single to defeat the Buffalo Bison.

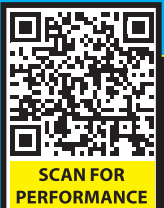

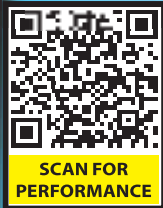
