Cycling Fundraiser Benefits Research

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On May 30th, families, cyclists, and food enthusiasts will gather for the sixth annual rideATAXIA NorCal, a single-day, multi-route cycling fundraiser to benefit the Friedrich's Ataxia Research Alliance (FARA). The Friedrich's Ataxia Research Alliance is a nonprofit dedicated to research leading to treatments and finding a cure for Friedrich's ataxia (FA). Founded by Sacramento native Kyle Bryant, rideATAXIA provides hope and a way to take action in the face this debilitating disease for many local young adults living with FA.

Kyle Bryant, 33 years old, carefully holds the straps on his bike helmet in each hand as he concentrates to align the buckle before snapping it in place. This simple act requires his full attention because at age 17, Kyle was told by doctors that he would lose his abilities over time, would soon be in a

wheelchair, would lose the ability to take care of himself, and would likely die a premature death due to heart failure. Kyle was diagnosed with FA, a degenerative neuro-

muscular disorder with no treatment or cure.

FA causes a progressive loss of coordination and muscle strength and can also include life-threatening heart conditions, diabetes, and severe scoliosis. Symptoms usually start between the ages of 5 and 18, and most young people diagnosed with FA require mobility aids such as a cane, walker,

or wheelchair by their teens or early 20s.

Growing up in Northern California, Bryant excelled at many sports but slowly lost the ability to participate as FA progressed and affected his mobility. Although scared for his future, he was determined to move forward and went on to graduate from the University of California, Davis in 2005 with a degree in civil engineering. It was at UC Davis where he first met a researcher who was investigating FA—someone who understood the devastating disease and was working on a way to treat it. "It was the first time I was filled with hope," said Bryant.

At that point, it was unsafe for Bryant to ride a bicycle. Filled with optimism, he decided to put a stop to the loss of the activity he cherished. He took back control, purchased a recumbent trike, and resumed his riding with passion. In 2007, Bryant

SMUD Rate Increase Expected Over Next Two Years

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento-area residents recently weighed in on a utility rate increase proposal at several public workshops hosted by the Sacramento Municipal Utility District. If the increase is approved, residential and business customers could see their bills increase 2.5% in 2016 and another 2.5% in 2017, according to SMUD.

Citing the need to meet Governor Jerry Brown's renewable energy mandate deadline, SMUD would use the extra finances to cover the cost of energy supplies and other operating and maintenance expenses necessary for the project. Signed into law in 2011, Brown's energy mandate requires all California utilities to produce at least 33% of their energy from renewable sources such as wind and solar by 2020.

Julie Lezie, a SMUD customer who attended the May 13th workshop, said she was frustrated by the increases, particularly a \$16 system infrastructure fixed cost that has steadily increased since its establishment in 2012.

"It started out as \$5... Now it's \$16," Lezie said during public comment. "Where's it going to top out? For me, it's a third of my bill."

SMUD officials said that the infrastructure fee is a realignment of costs and rates for servicing customers, and will top out at \$20 in 2017. Before the fee, SMUD said there was a similar charge that only covered a fraction of their \$36 monthly service costs to customers.

Lezie said the fee is unfair since she has been proactive to conserve energy. "I feel like I'm being penalized," she said. "The more I conserve, the more I pay. It's a fixed cost I have no control over."

SMUD is also considering implementing a "time of use" charge for all customers. If approved, customers would be charged more for energy use during peak hours from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. during the summer. However, officials say that customers could see their bills go down from the new rate structure.

The SMUD Board of Directors will hold a public hearing for the rate increase proposals on June 18th at 6 p.m. inside SMUD's headquarter, located at 6201 S Street in Sacramento. ★

Sacramento District Attorney Calls for Community Engagement

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Speaking off the cuff in an easy and direct manner, Sacramento District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert addressed attendees at the Rancho Cordova May Luncheon at City Hall. Schubert said that she loves being District Attorney. "I mean it, seriously," she said, "if I won the lottery today I'd show up tomorrow." The voters elected Schubert last November when Jan Scully retired after 20 years as DA.

"It's been interesting because I keep having to say, 'I'm not Jan Scully,'" Schubert said. "And that's a hard one because they are tough shoes to fill."

Schubert produced a fast-paced roller coaster of stories, cases, and anecdotes. She told what she and the office are concerned with and what she is proud of, what she cares about,

and what she has planned for the future.

After listening to Schubert, and from what she knew before, city council member Linda Budge called Schubert an "incredible woman, and obviously a very strong prosecutor."

Schubert said that her passion is forensic DNA. "It is, in my opinion, not only the greatest tool ever given to law enforcement to find the truth, but the greatest tool ever given in the criminal justice system," Schubert said, "because it allows us the ability to find the guilty and exonerate those who are not guilty."

Schubert was instrumental in starting the Sacramento County District Attorney's Cold Case Homicide Unit in 2002, and one of the first cases the unit looked at was the murder in Rancho Cordova in 1972 of 12-year-old Shannon Ritter. The only thing left to analyze, Schubert said,

was the cigarette butt found in the apartment where the girl was found. "We don't typically solve murders with cigarette butts, but

that cigarette butt solved that murder," Schubert said. Nearly 35 years old, it was the oldest

Use Birds of Prey to Control Pesky Rodent Populations

- Rats, mice, and voles are commonly sighted around homes and businesses this time of year. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) encourages Californians to let nature control rodent populations by actively protecting their natural predators—owls, hawks, falcons, eagles, and vultures—rather than using poisons to eliminate pests. Environmentally friendly tactics (such as providing tall trees that raptors favor) will encourage these birds of prey to hang around your yard and remove rodents for you.

Most raptors use the same nest for many years and some even pass from one generation to the next. Bald eagles are known to have used the same nest as long as 35 years. That makes them an excellent long-term control for rodent populations in the immediate area.

During breeding season, a family of five owls can eat as many as 3,000 rodents. You can encourage them by hanging a nest box on your property, but please don't do that if you or any of your neighbors are using anticoagulant rodenticides. Remember that poisoned rodents can poison the predators, scavengers, and pets that eat them.

Even though the state Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) have restricted public access to the most dangerous rodenticides, all rodenticides—including the types still available to consumers—are poisons that can kill wildlife, pets, and children.

More wildlife could be saved if people would use sanitation, removal, and exclusion to keep rodents out of homes and reduce their numbers. Like most animals, rodents will congregate and multiply where food is available and they feel safe. The easiest way to discourage them is to remove or modify anything that could make

them comfortable. Sanitation is the first step to controlling rodents. For example, follow these helpful tips:

- Keep your home and yard neat and clean. Don't give rats places to hide.
- Remove objects and plants that rodents can hide under, such as wood piles, debris, construction waste, dense vegetation, and ground-covering vines like ivy.
- Pick up fruit that has fallen from trees as soon as possible.
- Secure your garbage in a tightly sealed can.
- Seal water leaks and remove standing water that can attract unwelcome animals, breed mosquitoes, and waste water.

To remove unwelcome rodents, set traps in secluded areas where they've been seen or are likely to travel: close to walls; behind objects; in dark corners; and on ledges, shelves, fences, pipes, and garage rafters. In areas where children, pets, or birds might go, put the trap inside a box or use some kind of barrier for their safety. Check traps daily and wear disposable gloves when removing rodents from traps. Place them in a sealed

plastic bag and then into your garbage bin for weekly collection. Wash your hands after handling traps or rodents, even when using gloves.

Once you've removed mice and rats from inside the building, seal the entries they used to get in: openings where cables, wires, and pipes enter buildings and cracks or holes in the foundation, walls, and roofs. Rodents can squeeze into holes as narrow as 1/2 inch diameter. Use hardware mesh and concrete, plaster, or metal whenever possible. At the very least, stuff stainless steel or copper pot scrubbers or Stuf-fit copper mesh wool into the spaces. All of these are sold online and at hardware and dollar stores.

If you feel you must use rat poison, please carefully follow the label directions for all rodenticides. Only use them in small treatment areas indoors or right against building walls in tamper-resistant bait stations, never out in open field or garden areas where they're most likely to reach wildlife and pets. 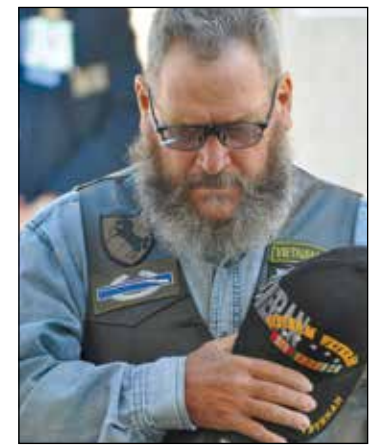

and his family decided to raise much needed awareness and funds for FA research by cycling 2,500 miles from San Diego to Memphis—and so ride ATAXIA was born.

Since then, Kyle has grown ride ATAXIA into a marquee fundraising program of FARA, creating a nationwide series of multi-route cycling events presented by Outback Steakhouse to benefit FARA in Dallas, Northern California, Chicago, Philadelphia, and Orlando. In 2014, ride ATAXIA welcomed over 2,300 participants and raised over \$800,000 to advance FA research, bringing total fundraising to \$3 million since its inception.

"Starting ride ATAXIA was a way that we could take action, moving my family and me out of a place where we felt alone, helpless, and threatened," said Bryant. "Cycling allows me to take back control and feel empowered, and now that feeling is shared with others."

Through ride ATAXIA, local young adults Ashley Hartigan, Sean Baumstark, Megan McCandless, and Sean Mazerers can join Kyle in moving forward towards treatments and a cure as they directly support FA research while maintaining coordination and muscle strength by training for this milestone ride.

Ashley Hartigan, 19 years old (Fair Oaks, CA): Ashley Hartigan was diagnosed with Friedreich's ataxia at the young age of nine. FA has turned the everyday activities most people

take for granted into daily challenges for her. As difficult as the disease is, Ashley refuses to let it rob her of her spirit, making the most of every day and inspiring those around her.

Sean Baumstark, 34 years old (Sacramento, CA): Diagnosed with FA at the age of 25, Sean Baumstark is determined to defy all odds against him and inspire thousands of others to do the same. Sean teamed up with Kyle as part of "The World's Toughest Bike Race," the 3000 mile Race Across America, which he and Kyle finished in eight days, eight hours, and 14 minutes. In 2013, Sean founded the organization and movement, determined to improve the quality of life for those jeopardized by disease or disorder through athleticism and physical achievement.

Megan McCandless, 28 years old (Rancho Cordova, CA): Megan McCandless was diagnosed with FA when she turned 19. She is now 28 and faces many daily obstacles that FA brings, including being easily fatigued, muscle weakness, slurred speech, dropping things, falling, and not having the energy to do the activities she loves. Megan and her family are raising awareness and money for FA research to nip this disease in the bud.

Sean Mazerers, 23 years old (Woodland, CA): Sean Mazerers was diagnosed with FA at the age of 16, but is still going strong. Although his abilities have changed since he was

first diagnosed, he doesn't let having FA define him as a person. Mazerers said, "It can be hard at times knowing that it can never be the same, but you have to make the best out of what you have. I choose not to let FA stop me from doing what I love to do or slow me down with everyday life." Mazerers' family and supporters are riding at ride ATAXIA NorCal as part of Team Sean. Team Sean is full of supporters who are all fighting to make a difference to find a cure.

City Participates in Groundbreaking Cooperation Protocol Policy

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Greater Sacramento Area Economic Council (Greater Sacramento) is pleased to announce that 15 Sacramento Region communities including the City of Rancho Cordova have come together to develop a framework for a new regional model for working together as one market to strengthen the organization's foundation as it builds our assets and competitive position, markets our value proposition, and creates a reputation as the best and easiest market to do business in California. The private sector is dedicating unprecedented time, energy, and financial support, and local jurisdictions are investing at an increased per capita investment level and have adopted a new model of collaboration never before seen in the Sacramento Region and rarely achieved in other U.S. markets.

The Trans-Pacific Partnership and the Death of the Republic

"The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government."

-- Article IV, Section 4, U.S. Constitution

A republican form of government is one in which power resides in elected officials representing the citizens, and government leaders exercise power according to the rule of law. In *The Federalist Papers*, James Madison defined a republic as "a government which derives all its powers directly or indirectly from the great body of the people . . ."

On April 22, 2015, the Senate Finance Committee approved a bill to fast-track the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), a massive trade agreement that would override our republican form of government and hand judicial and legislative authority to a foreign three-person panel of corporate lawyers.

The secretive TPP is an agreement with Mexico, Canada, Japan, Singapore, and seven other countries that affects 40% of global markets. Fast-track authority could now go to the full Senate for a vote as early as next week.

Fast-track means Congress will be prohibited from amending the trade deal, which will be put to a simple up or down majority vote. Negotiating the TPP in secret and fast-tracking it through Congress is considered necessary to secure its passage, since if the public had time to review its onerous provisions, opposition would mount and defeat it.

Abdicating the Judicial Function to Corporate Lawyers

James Madison wrote in *The Federalist Papers*, "The accumulation of all powers, legislative, executive, and judiciary, in the same hands . . . may justly be pronounced the very definition of tyranny. . . . "Were the power of judging joined with the legislative, the life and liberty of the subject would be exposed to arbitrary control, for the judge would then be the legislator. . . ."

And that, from what we now know of the TPP's secret provisions, will be its dire effect.

The most controversial provision of the TPP is the Investor-State Dispute Settlement (ISDS) section, which strengthens existing ISDS procedures. ISDS first appeared in a bilateral trade agreement in 1959. According to *The Economist*, ISDS gives foreign firms a special right to apply to a secretive tribunal of highly paid corporate lawyers for compensation whenever the government passes a law to do things that hurt corporate profits -- such things as discouraging smoking, protecting the environment, or preventing a nuclear catastrophe.

Arbitrators are paid \$600-700 an hour, giving them little incentive to dismiss cases; and the secretive nature of the arbitration process and the lack of any requirement to consider precedent

gives wide scope for creative judgments.

To date, the highest ISDS award has been for \$2.3 billion to Occidental Oil Company against the government of Ecuador over its termination of an oil-concession contract, this although the termination was apparently legal. Still in arbitration is a demand by Vattenfall, a Swedish utility that operates two nuclear plants in Germany, for compensation of €3.7 billion (\$4.7 billion) under the ISDS clause of a treaty on energy investments, after the German government decided to shut down its nuclear power industry following the Fukushima disaster in Japan in 2011.

Under the TPP, however, even larger judgments can be anticipated, since the sort of "investment" it protects includes not just "the commitment of capital or other resources" but "the expectation of gain or profit." That means the rights of corporations in other countries extend not just to their factories and other "capital" but to the profits they expect to receive there.

In an article posted by Yves Smith, Joe Firestone poses some interesting hypotheticals:

- Under the TPP, could the US government be sued and be held liable if it decided to stop issuing Treasury debt and financed deficit spending in some other way (perhaps by quantitative easing or by issuing trillion dollar coins)? Why not, since some private companies would lose profits as a result?
- Under the TPP or the TTIP (the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership under negotiation with the European Union), would the Federal

Reserve be sued if it failed to bail out banks that were too big to fail?

Firestone notes that under the Netherlands-Czech trade agreement, the Czech Republic was sued in an investor-state dispute for failing to bail out an insolvent bank in which the complainant had an interest. The investor company was awarded \$236 million in the dispute settlement. What might the damages be, asks Firestone, if the Fed decided to let the Bank of America fail, and a Saudi-based investment company decided to sue?

Abdicating the Legislative Function to Multinational Corporations

Just the threat of this sort of massive damage award could be enough to block prospective legislation. But the TPP goes further and takes on the legislative function directly, by forbidding specific forms of regulation.

Public Citizen observes that the TPP would provide big banks with a backdoor means of watering down efforts to re-regulate Wall Street, after deregulation triggered the worst financial crisis since the Great Depression:

- The TPP would forbid countries from banning particularly risky financial products, such as the toxic derivatives that led to the \$183 billion government bailout of AIG. It would prohibit policies to prevent banks from becoming "too big to fail," and threaten the use of "firewalls" to prevent banks that keep our savings accounts from taking hedge-fund-style bets.
- The TPP would also restrict capital controls, an essential policy tool to counter

destabilizing flows of speculative money. . . . And the deal would prohibit taxes on Wall Street speculation, such as the proposed Robin Hood Tax that would generate billions of dollars' worth of revenue for social, health, or environmental causes.

Clauses on dispute settlement in earlier free trade agreements have been invoked to challenge efforts to regulate big business. The fossil fuel industry is seeking to overturn Quebec's ban on the ecologically destructive practice of fracking. Veolia, the French behemoth known for building a tram network to serve Israeli settlements in occupied East Jerusalem, is contesting increases in Egypt's minimum wage. The tobacco maker Philip Morris is suing against anti-smoking initiatives in Uruguay and Australia.

The TPP would empower not just foreign manufacturers but foreign financial firms to attack financial policies in foreign tribunals, demanding taxpayer compensation for regulations that they claim frustrate their expectations and inhibit their profits.

Preempting Government Sovereignty

What is the justification for this encroachment on the sovereign rights of government? Allegedly, ISDS is necessary in order to increase foreign investment. But as noted in *The Economist*, investors can protect themselves by purchasing political-risk insurance. Moreover, Brazil continues to receive sizable foreign investment despite its long-standing refusal to sign any treaty with an ISDS mechanism. Other countries are

beginning to follow Brazil's lead.

In an April 22nd report from the Center for Economic and Policy Research, gains from multilateral trade liberalization were shown to be very small, equal to only about 0.014% of consumption, or about \$0.43 per person per month. And that assumes that any benefits are distributed uniformly across the economic spectrum. In fact, transnational corporations get the bulk of the benefits, at the expense of most of the world's population.

Something else besides attracting investment money and encouraging foreign trade seems to be going on. The TPP would destroy our republican form of government under the rule of law, by elevating the rights of investors—also called the rights of "capital"—above the rights of the citizens.

That means that TPP is blatantly unconstitutional. But as Joe Firestone observes, neo-liberalism and corporate contributions seem to have blinded the deal's proponents so much that they cannot see they are selling out the sovereignty of the United States to foreign and multinational corporations.

Measure H Funds for Paper Mache Contest

From Jerald Drobesh:

My idea would put Rancho Cordova on the map for tourism and community support for the Arts. It would be called "The Rancho Cordova Community Paper Mache Figures Contest and Festival." It would be organized by city employees, individuals, and community groups. The city would pay for (through Measure H funds) supplies, materials, training, and education on how to make a Paper Mache figures out of chicken wire, old newspapers, and flour paste with needed paint for finishing the figures chosen.

The contest could be open to anyone in the Rancho Cordova community, including individuals, community groups, and all local schools. Each idea for a figure would have to be approved by a chosen committee who would set the rules such as size of figure, theme, etc. The committee would be chosen by the City Council and myself. I would suggest that Pam Hobday (Rancho Cordova Consultant) and Mindy Cuppy (Rancho Cordova City Clerk) would head up the committee.

The contest could be held in Hagan Community Park and, if successful, moved to Mather Airport, depending on the turnout. The best time of year to hold the festival would be April or May so children are still in school and the weather is good.

This idea is based on a very large and successful festival held in a small town in Spain called Valencia. It is called "The Fallas Festival;" held in March each year, it was originally intended to celebrate the "Feast of San Jose," the patron saint of carpenters. My wife and I went to the museum there that held all the festival winners from years past. According to their contest rules, all the non-winning entries are burned in a large fire on the last day of the festival each year.

The idea is also based on a very large Paper Mache dinosaur built by the children of my school (The Farmhouse Daycare Preschool) years ago. The kids loved it, and it was bigger than a large car. Rancho Cordova school kids of all ages will love this idea. It could also include a Festival Community Parade if the idea gets community

support, as I believe it will. The parade would include all entries. After the festival, instead of burning all the entries, the figures would be displayed throughout the community at City Hall, schools, banks, and other approved facilities.

Some figures could even be recycled and their materials could be used to create new objects or figures that would be built to last. The materials could be mixed with cement and reinforced steel rods. These larger art objects could be created by community volunteers from throughout the Sacramento region and could be a boost to local art at low cost. This new permanent artwork could be placed outside at the zoo, Fairytale Town, regional parks, and Sacramento International Airport. These pieces of art could put the region on the tourist map—if done well. It could be called "Jerry's Recycled Art."

I have more ideas for this festival, but time is of the essence—so let's get started!

case in Sacramento County history to go to trial. "A 1972 murderer was brought to justice because of the DNA in that case," Schubert said.

One of the things that bothers Schubert is the lack of opportunity to provide input on legislation before it is passed. "I guess partly because we're here in Sacramento. ... I want public safety to have a voice not only in the community but in the legislature," Schubert said. She cited Proposition 47 as an example. "Everybody knows Prop 47 was passed overwhelmingly by the voters. It now has reduced a number of felony crimes to straight misdemeanors."

Schubert said that law enforcement people will tell you that as a result of Prop 47 you're going to see an increase in property crimes. "To me, it's kind of simple," she said. "If there's no consequence, why not just steal?" A property theft of

under \$950 now receives only a citation.

Before the passage of Prop 47, those arrested in California for a felony and booked at a County jail had to give DNA. A side effect of Prop 47 is that the many drug and theft crimes are now classified as misdemeanors, so law enforcement can no longer collect that DNA. "The data that we know from the Department of Justice is that there is a very high correlation between theft and drugs, and solving violent crimes," Schubert said. "So it has been a significant, significant burden upon us." While she can see the difficulties, Schubert is quick to point out that "it's the law; we're going to follow the law."

There is a community-government relations division in the DA's office, and Schubert hopes it will help provide for more interaction. "Public safety is not just about cops and prosecutors," Schubert said, "it's about

the community, and we need the community engagement."

With 24 years of law enforcement experience, Schubert comes to the District Attorney position well prepared, with many successful prosecutions for such crimes as sexual assault, child abuse, domestic violence, and homicide. She was Prosecutor of the Year in 2007 and an instructor for POST for over 15 years, teaching classes throughout California on homicide and cold case prosecution. These are only a few of her many accomplishments in her field.

A resident of Rancho Cordova with her husband Bob for 43 years, Meada Cashatt enjoyed the luncheon and listening to the new DA. Afterward she said about Schubert, "I think she's really a level-headed person. ... She knows what's legal and what's illegal, the problems and her priorities. I think it's clear that she's a good person." ★

New Community Park Planned in Cordova District

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Another community park is in the permitting stage for the Cordova Recreation and Park District, among notable capital improvement projects.

The 20-acre Heron Landing Park is proposed near Sunrise Boulevard and Justinian Drive; it will be the 10th community park in the district. The park will be built in two phases. Phase One will focus on the main features, including sports fields and courts, play equipment, and a splash pad.

Park Planning and Development Manager Laura Taylor said they're still on track to begin construction in the fall. The project will take about a year to complete.

"It already has been a high growth area," said Taylor. "So we're able to build this with the impact fees that were collected from the development that has already occurred. They provide for more active recreation and large gathering places. They typically have off-street parking without impacting neighborhood streets. They tend to have facilities that can be scheduled

for specific events."

Many of the district's community parks also include large buildings for events, including a 10,000-square-foot facility for Heron Landing Park, which would be the focus of Phase Two. But Taylor said start of construction is likely to lag several years while park development funding from new housing accrues and/or supplemental funding sources are secured.

"It acts as a meeting place for surrounding neighborhoods and communities," Taylor said. "We also have programs we can do there, classes in the evening. We may have a pre-school program. It definitely helps create more of a sense of community. Different clubs can call up to reserve a room."

Meanwhile, at Hagan Community Park, the district is awaiting word on a State Parks funding application to upgrade the nearly 50-year-old Cordova Community Pool. District staff are also researching and pursuing other funding options, including Rancho Cordova's Measure H grant program.

Taylor said it continues to be a district priority, with a lot of

resident concerns. "There are other groups that are interested in having that pool repaired and renovated," she said. "They're also looking at making applications for Measure H funds to do add-ons above and beyond what we expect to do." Taylor said the hope is to start work by March 2016, with completion by September 2016.

"We want to increase the play value," she said. "Right now there's a training pool that we want to add a zero-depth entry to. It would be ideal for younger kids, one and a half to six years old. And also add a splash element in the deep end."

District officials have stated that during last year's drought conditions they reduced the amount of water used within the parks and on the ball fields by 15-20%. The State Water Resources Control Board recently approved much larger cuts, with the maximum reduction ordered for the Golden State Water District at 36%, compared to 2013.

Taylor said park grass is already getting yellow and brown in some spots. "We will still be applying water to it," she said. "But it'll just be to sustain

life, as opposed to keeping it lush and green."

This year, the district said it's implementing a strategy of inspecting, testing, and retrofitting the irrigation systems within park and streetscape

areas. That includes replacing older nozzles in existing irrigation heads with more water-efficient nozzles, replacing worn-out solenoid valves, replacing drip irrigation lines with low-flow sprinkler heads,

and adjusting irrigation heads to target green spaces and not hard surface areas like sidewalks and asphalt.

The spray parks and splash park will remain open because they use recirculated water. ★

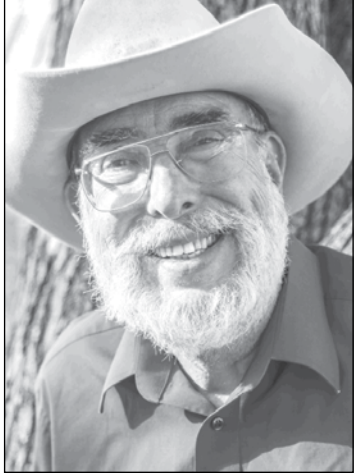

Strong Finishes for Lancer Track and Field

TURLOCK, CA (MPG) - The Cordova High School (CHS) track and field program had one of its best showings in post-season in ages at the Sac-Joaquin Section Division IV/V meet at California State University, Stanislaus on May 21st.

For the boys, Cordova's D'Mitre Jones became the first Lancer to capture a D-IV/V section title by taking first place in the 400 meter races at 49.30 seconds. Jones and each Lancer who placed in the top five in their respective events advance to the section's Masters Meet.

The next section champion was Lady Lancers' Julia Gulchuk, who won the triple jump at 34 feet, 7.5 inches.

The Cordova girls added another D-IV/V title when the 4x400 meter relay team of Marissa Smith, Lanyija Clark, Erica Wilson, and Cauje Curney raced past Sierra Valley Conference (SVC) foe El Dorado with a time of 4 minutes, 4.5 seconds.

Second place finishes for the Lady Lancers were Julissa Reis in the shot put with a toss of 36 feet, 5.5 inches. Smith was clocked at 58.37 in the 400 meters and the 200 at 25.81.

Brandon Lincoln was fourth in the shot put for Cordova,

with a final toss of 44 feet, 10.25 inches.

The Lancer boys' 4x100 team of Jones, EJ Turner, La Terio Norse, and Treyvon Warren ran their fastest time this season at 43.77 seconds for a fifth place

finish. Jordan McGuire competed in the 1600 meter race, also taking fifth at 4 minutes, 30.11 seconds. Clark was also fifth in the 400.

As a team, the Cordova boys took second place. The Lady

Lancers took second place behind SVC foe El Dorado with 48 points.

"In my 19 years, this is the first time both teams have brought home hardware in the same year," said Cordova girls'

track and field coach Shane Jackson, who is also the school's athletic director. "For the boys, this marks the first time they have finished in the one of the top spots since 2002."

The top four finishers in each event or individuals who meet or surpass the state's qualifying mark in his/her event advance to the California Interscholastic Federation State Track and Field Championships at Veterans Memorial Stadium in Clovis on June 5th and 6th. ★

Upside Down, Inside Out

When with little or no notice your whole world is suddenly turned upside down --- everything abruptly goes topsy-turvy on you --- it can rattle you to your very core.

It can happen in the blink of an eye in sports; one wrong move can send your fortunes reeling.

It almost happened to your beloved Golden State Warriors in Monday night's playoff game in Houston, won by the Rockets behind James Harden's amazing 45-point outburst, 128-115, to send the Western Conference finals back to Oakland with the Warriors holding a 3-1 lead.

The tectonic plates beneath Warriors Nation shifted dramatically when star Stephen Curry was sent hurtling out-of-control through the air on a play in the second quarter and he crashed to the floor, rolled over and laid face-down along the baseline for several minutes. It was nobody's fault, just a basketball play with an unfortunate result. The raucous Rockets' crowd was hushed. This could be a serious injury for the NBA's MVP, the heart-and-soul of an exciting team trying to win its first title in forty years.

For Warriors fans watching on television, all of their greatest fears, the worst-case scenarios, flashed through their minds. If Curry is done the team is done and all hopes are doomed, the title shot.

Thanks to ESPN showing the play --- Curry trying to chase down Houston's Trevor Ariza on a fast break, leaping high into the air going for a pump-fake, then flipping over Ariza's body and crashing down on his head and back with his precious shooting arm awkwardly beneath him --- over and over and over and over again, Warriors fans had ample time to assess the potential damages.

It could be a broken left wrist, a broken right arm, a

hyper-extended elbow, a dislocated shoulder, a spinal or neck injury, a concussion, or all of the above. Curry could be lost for the duration of the playoffs. The game, the series, the championship opportunity could all be lost. It could be a career-threatening injury and Curry could be lost for good. At times like that, fans usually hope for the best but expect the worst first, because they have been through them many times before.

There were two Forty Niners Hall of Fame quarterbacks --- Joe Montana, back injury, never quite the same; and Steve Young, yet another concussion, done; a super, two-sport star and Oakland Raiders running back Bo Jackson, drastic hip injury, done; all-star caliber Giants catcher Mike Matheny; concussion, done; just to name a few.

Fortunately, sometimes the athletes can overcome. When 49ers linebacker NaVorro Bowman suffered a horrible knee injury in the NFC Championship Game after the 2013 season, fans surely thought the game and the chance at a Super Bowl were wiped out (they were), and had to wonder if they would ever see Bowman in uniform again. After missing all of last season, he's back at practice, but will he return to form? When Buster Posey's ankle was mangled by a brutal blow from the Marlins' Scott Cousins in 2011 fans knew the season would be lost and wondered if they would ever see Posey behind the plate again. Obviously, Posey made it all the way back to lead the Giants to two more World Series championships. (Cousins hasn't appeared in a MLB game since 2013 and was released by Texas this spring).

Sometimes such dire straits can bring out the best of what's inside through drive and determination. A player or team can rise above rather demoralizing circumstances

to recover and perform.

The Boston Red Sox trailed the New York Yankees 3-games-to-1 in the 2004 ALCS before a last-ditch rally spurred them on to four straight wins and, eventually, to the breaking of the "Curse of the Bambino" by winning their first World Series since 1918. Joe Montana led Notre Dame to a 35-34 comeback win in the Cotton Bowl in 1979, after trailing Houston, 34-12, in the fourth quarter. In 1984, Doug Flutie and Boston College defeated defending national champion Miami, 47-45, on Flutie's last second "Hail Mary" pass to Gerard Phelan that traveled more than 60 yards into the wind. In the 1992 AFC Wild Card Game, Frank Reich replaced Buffalo's injured starting QB Jim Kelly and rallied the Bills from a 35-3 deficit to a 41-38 overtime win over the Houston Oilers in the greatest comeback in NFL history. In 2002, the S. F. Giants were on the verge of clinching the World Series, holding a 5-0 lead over the Angels in the seventh inning of Game Six before.....forget that one!

This time, with Curry in the locker room being evaluated, Warriors coach Steve Kerr huddled up his troops and told them, "...this is an opportunity for us... the game is changed now...there's a weird vibe in here...take care of our business as a group...gather ourselves...we have a chance..."

The other Splash Brother, Klay Thompson, who has been struggling with his shooting touch in this series while being preoccupied with defending Harden much of the time, quickly hit a pair of three-point shots to trim what was once a 25-point lead to thirteen. But even after Curry, thankfully, returned in the fourth quarter, it was too much Harden and too much hot shooting by the Rockets. ★

McCahon Earns Model Coach Award

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Cordova High School (CHS) varsity boys' soccer coach Eric McCahon was recently recognized for what he has done for

the Lancer program on and off the field.

McCahon, who has been running the program since 2003, is one of six recipients of the Sac-Joaquin Section Model Coach Award. Shane Jackson, the school's athletic director, and Assistant Principal Michele Brown nominated McCahon for the award.

How to Find River Crappie

Finding crappie in rivers can be a whole lot easier if you remember that crappie rarely challenge the main flow of a river. They prefer to use eddies, slack water, and cover that breaks the current.

Speckled perch will spawn out of current in areas that warm more quickly than the main flow, with peak spawning at 66 to 70 degrees water temperature.

Vertical cover that extends from the river bottom to above the surface provides good holding places for crappie in rivers with heavy current. The heavier the current the wider the cover must be to hold them.

In rivers with slower current, trees, brush and stumps become more important as crappie holding areas. Crappie will almost always use the down current side of cover.

There have always been players dazzling fans as 20-year-olds, but there seems to be more players in their early 20s starring in the majors now than ever before. If I had to win a World Series in 2015 with only players age 25 and younger, this would be my 25-man roster. For clarity, this is based on ages as of Opening Day this season.

Lineup

C Sal Perez, Kansas City

The Royals' backstop is a veteran of the under-25 team, and still has no competition. He leads all catchers with 42 hits and is batting .292.

1B Anthony Rizzo, Chicago Cubs

The sweet-swinging first baseman has embraced a leadership role for the young Cubs.

2B Jose Altuve, Houston

The 2014 AL batting champ is about 35 points off of last year's average, but he's carrying a .360 on-base percentage and leads the AL with 14 steals.

SS Andrelton Simmons, Atlanta

He's hitting below .250 but has 16 hits for extra bases and has scored 29 runs. No one can hang with Simmons defensively.

3B Kris Bryant, Chicago Cubs

Even though the Cubs delayed his season by a few weeks, Bryant is tied with Rizzo for the team lead with 29 RBIs. I'm impressed by the youngster's .391 OBP.

OF Bryce Harper, Washington

A few years ago when Harper and Mike Trout were recalled within 24 hours of each other, the national debate on who would be the better superstar trended about 55 percent to Harper. Now that he is injury-free (and perhaps a bit more mature), Harper may rival Trout's production in every facet of the game.

OF Mike Trout, Los Angeles Angels

His 2015 numbers are still working their way

toward the top of stats lists, but there's no denying Trout as one of the best players—if not the best—in the game.

OF Giancarlo Stanton, Miami

No one hits baseballs farther than Stanton. Just ask the fans in Los Angeles.

Bench

1B Eric Hosmer, Kansas City

With a .311 average and .910 OPS, his numbers fall just shy of Rizzo's.

2B Kolten Wong, St. Louis

Wong came of age in last year's playoffs and is still improving his consistency at the plate.

SS Jose Iglesias, Detroit

A month ago, Iglesias may have been our first choice at short. Late in April he was hitting .397 but has batted only .241 in his last 17 games.

3B Manny Machado, Baltimore

Machado is on pace for his career best average, on-base and slugging percentages.

OF Yasiel Puig, Los Angeles Dodgers

Puig is still Mr. Excitement in Los Angeles and is learning to channel the excitement into more positive plays and fewer negative ones. The Dodgers certainly hope that his hamstring injury won't linger much longer.

OF Joc Pederson, Los Angeles Dodgers

The young center fielder has more than replaced Matt Kemp defensively and has a higher average and OPS than Stanton.

Rotation

Madison Bumgarner, San Francisco

His numbers this season don't measure up with the others on this team, but his performance last October proved his value in big games.

Shelby Miller, Atlanta

Miller has become the Braves' reimbursement for the 2003 Adam Wainwright trade. Miller leads the majors with a 1.50 ERA.

Sonny Gray, Oakland

The Oakland ace keeps getting better. He's 5-2 with a 1.77 ERA for the worst team in baseball.

Michael Wacha, St. Louis

The big righthander is quickly growing into Adam Wainwright II. He's 7-0 with a 1.87 ERA.

Gerrit Cole, Pittsburgh

Already the Pirates' ace, Cole has 63 punchouts in just 57 innings.

Bullpen

Trevor Rosenthal, St. Louis

The Cardinals' closer is coming off of a 45-save season and is 14 of 15 this season.

Jeurys Familia, New York Mets

Familia owns 13 saves and 24 strikeouts with just 11 hits and four walks allowed.

Jake Odorizzi, Tampa Bay

Odorizzi's WHIP of 0.961 is second among starters only to Miller on this roster of young pitchers.

Trever Bauer, Cleveland

He's had five starts of six or more innings with one run or less, and just three wins to show for his work in those games.

Nick Martinez, Texas

The Rangers are 8-1 in his starts this season.

Danny Salazar, Cleveland

His ERA is a bit high at 3.50, but he is 5-1 and has 60 Ks and has given up only 38 hits and nine walks in 43.2 innings.

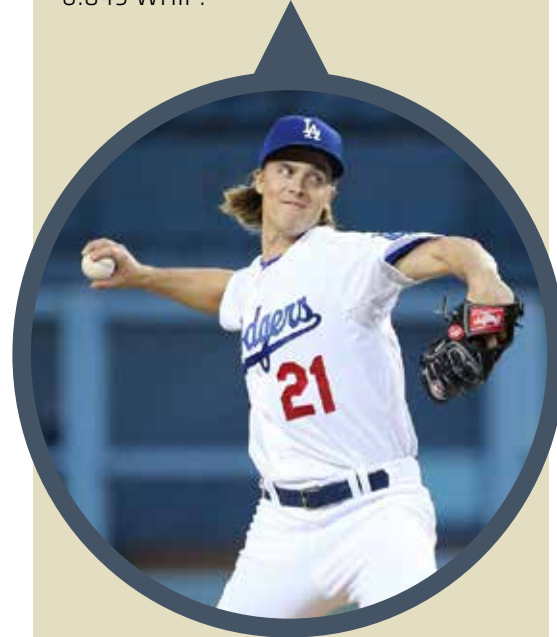
AROUND THE HORN

The American League Central has become the most powerful division in baseball, and it continues to improve. The quintet (Kansas City, Detroit, Minnesota, Cleveland and Chicago) is an aggregate 21 games over .500 and the Indians and Twins are enjoying an upswing. The only other division with a winning record is the National League West, which is two games better than .500...**Hunter Pence** of the Giants has been back in the lineup almost two weeks now. And no one has enjoyed his presence more than **Brandon Belt**. The Giants' first baseman is batting .375 with a 1.226 OPS in games with Pence in the lineup. In the eight games the two have played together, Belt has seven extra-base hits, nine runs and eight RBIs...Not that offense has been a huge problem for the **Boston Red Sox** this season, but designated hitter **David Ortiz** is batting just .109 against lefties with a .107 on-base percentage. He's slugging just .164. For his career, Big Papi is batting a respectable .264. Ortiz isn't the only Boston batter struggling. In April, **Hanley Ramirez** hit .293 with 10 homers and 22 RBIs in 21 games. Through his first 19 games in May, Ramirez is batting .229 without a home run or even a single RBI...On the opposite end of that spectrum, **Prince Fielder** of the Texas Rangers was off to one of the best starts of his career this season. Through 31 games he was tearing up American League pitching at a .333 clip with a pair of homers and 14 ribbies. In only 13 games since then, the Prince has six homers, 18 RBIs and is batting .415...After playing part-time for three seasons, Philadelphia infielder **Freddy Galvis** posted a .218 career batting average. Now with a chance to play everyday with the trade of longtime shortstop Jimmy Rollins, Galvis is hitting .305...The Cleveland Indians' trio of **Corey Kluber**, **Danny Salazar** and **Trevor Bauer** is the anchor of the Indians' team. Over their last eight starts, the pitching staff has combined for a 1.98 ERA and a 0.922 WHIP and won six of the eight games...If you're looking for the next manager to be fired (and who isn't?) **Bryan Price** of Cincinnati and **John Gibbons** of Toronto are good bets. Both teams have underachieved during their respective tenures. **Walt Weiss** of Colorado, and perhaps, **Robin Ventura** of the White Sox and **Lloyd McClendon** of Seattle are feeling a little heat as well...And for a little history, @AceballStats informs us that the great **Ted Williams** reached base safely four times in 283 games. That's 44 more than the 239 in which he didn't reach base safely.


