RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Get ready to take a trip around the world, but there's no need to pack any luggage and no passport is required. Rancho Cordova's international festival—iFest—returns for an eighth year on Saturday, May 16th from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Village Green Park, 3141 Bridgeway Drive. Admission to iFest is free.

City Approves General Plan Amendment for Connector Expressway

MATHER, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is the fourth Capital SouthEast Connector Joint Power Authority (JPA) jurisdiction to adopt a general plan amendment supporting implementation of the expressway project south of Highway 50.

The amendment was unanimously approved by the Rancho Cordova City Council at its Monday, May 4th meeting.

The 34-mile Connector Expressway will connect Interstate 5 south of Elk Grove to Highway 50 at the new Silva Valley Parkway interchange just east of El Dorado Hills. Its planned alignment in Rancho Cordova is along Grant Line Road between Jackson Highway (State Route 16) and White Rock Road.

General plan amendments in the JPA jurisdictions will ensure consistent Connector design and implementation across the entire alignment.

In Rancho Cordova, the amendment also recognizes the Connector Expressway as an approved city project and reserves land for its construction.

Sacramento County in May 2014 and Elk Grove in March 2015 approved general plan amendments supporting Connector implementation, and Folsom in August 2014 approved a Connector-related amendment to the Folsom Plan Area Specific Plan.

The Connector's first phase, envisioned to be completed between 2018 and 2023, includes four continuous lanes; expanded at-grade intersections; a separated path for pedestrians, bicyclists, and equestrians; and right-of-way preservation for the project's full build out.

The project's second phase includes interchanges and additional HOV lanes in some segments and would be completed as demand necessitates and additional funding is made available.

Relax and take a free bicycle-powered “pedicab” ride, learn about animals from around the globe, and take a look at “Wheels of the World”—a collection of cars from around the planet.

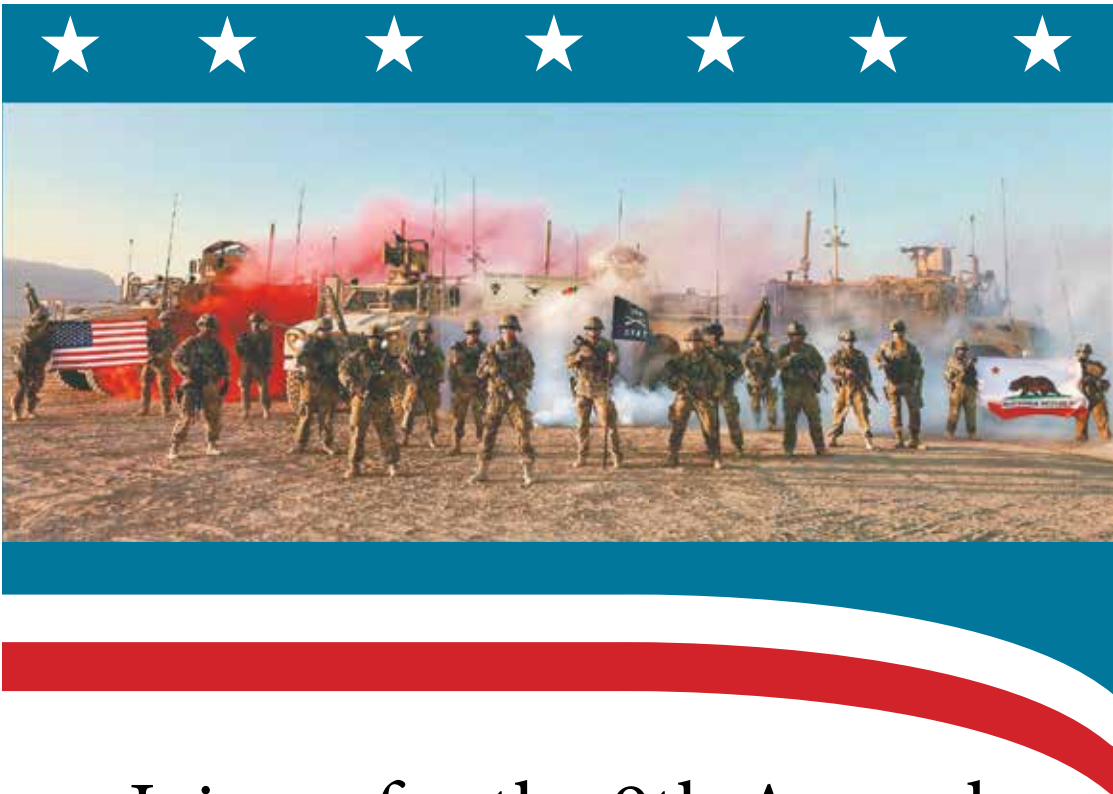
New Power Gurneys: Safer for Patients, Better for Emergency Responders

MATHER, CA (MPG) - As the National Obesity Foundation has pointed out, “Obesity rates in the U.S. have reached alarming levels.” Because of this, back injuries caused by lifting patients have also significantly increased. Keeping patients safe while reducing the number of injuries has become a serious concern for Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (Metro Fire).
With a lifespan of roughly seven years, most of Metro Fire’s gurneys were in need of replacement. By transitioning their fleet to a new state-of-the-art gurney system, Metro Fire will reduce back injuries while increasing service capabilities to the public. This innovative technology includes a wider gurney with a capacity for larger patients, coupled with a hydraulically operated Power Load installed

inside the ambulance. With a simple press of a button, the entire gurney is lifted hydraulically. The wider footprint of the gurney provides increased stability for patients.
Assistant Chief Maurice Johnson said, “Metro Fire responded to over 62,000 EMS calls in 2014. Providing a safer transport for these patients, at the same time protecting our paramedics, is another way Metro Fire is leading the industry.” All 27 gurneys have been replaced; installing the Power Load system in the 35 medics has begun and is on track to be completed by August.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - After a very difficult task of judging applications, the Live Your Dream and Ruby Awards were selected and awards given out at the Soroptimist International of Rancho Cordova and Gold River's (SIRCGR) recent award reception.

Two Live Your Dream Award winners were selected. The first, Margaret "Annie" Parella of Sacramento, is a single mother who is presently studying to become a certified gemologist. Annie has overcome and survived every obstacle imaginable from being orphaned at an early age to homelessness, substance abuse, and abusive relationships. "Tenacity is Annie's middle name," said Club President Julie Schaffer. The second Live Your Dream award was given to Tammy Ballard. Tammy, a single mother of two children, has overcome childhood verbal, mental, and physical abuse and lives with an illness that can be debilitating. Tammy attends American River College with the goal of getting an English degree. She would love to write a book that inspires women to overcome their adversities.

The Ruby Award was given to Kelly MacMillan, who currently serves as the executive director of the Susan G. Komen for Northern California, which is committed to fighting breast cancer by raising dollars for local community-based programs to educate, screen, and diagnose women who otherwise could not afford it. With over 20 years of professional fundraising and fund development experience, Kelly also served for four years as the executive director of Save Our Selves, a community-based nonprofit organization that provided support, survivorship, education, and advocacy services to women affected by breast cancer and their families. Kelly served as the director for Community Affairs for the Center for Violence-free Relationships. The Center is dedicated to building healthy relationships, families, and communities free from sexual assault and domestic violence through education, advocacy, and services in western El Dorado County.

"Our club is extremely proud of all our award winners. We are confident that they will achieve and exceed the goals they have set for themselves," said SIRCGR Awards Chair Sheryl Longsworth.

The ultimate goal of the Live Your Dream Award is to help head-of-household women improve their economic status by preparing them to enter or re-enter the workplace. Unlike other award programs, the Live Your Dream awards can be used for books, childcare, transportation, or any other expense that will help a woman reach her educational goal. The Ruby Award honors women who have worked to improve the lives of women and girls through their professional and/or volunteer work.

From Farm to You: Sac County Food Scene

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Whether you love a good burger and a sizzling basket of garlic fries or you prefer a lightly braised salmon with a fresh apple walnut salad, Sacramento County has the food your taste buds crave. As America’s Farm-to-Fork capital, “foodies” and those interested in unique cuisine are finding favor in the River City where the food scene is growing.

One of the most popular up-and-coming food scenes is the food truck. Sacramento Mobile Food (SacMoFo) holds events almost daily throughout the county, where food trucks present a variety of cuisine options, such as the weekly Truckin’ Tuesday lunch meet-up at 15th and Capitol in the Rose Garden. From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Tuesday, people crowd around trucks for Thai cuisine, boba, burgers, ice cream, smoothies, tacos, specialty hot dogs, and kettle corn, to name a few. According to SacMoFo, 28% of people who see a food truck decided to purchase from that truck. Nevertheless, food trucks are more than just good food; they also support the local community by purchasing local

products and produce.

If gourmet is more your style, Sacramento has walking food tours. The Gourmet on K Culinary Walking Tour leads people on a tour to discover what is “hot” at local restaurants that specialize in Farm-to-Fork ingredients. The tour takes participants to different stops along downtown K Street, offering tastings of items like locally sourced kale greens with apples, walnuts, and a house dressing, or even desserts like green tea French macaroons.

Every year Sacramento County also has a wide variety of food-focused festivals. The Courtland Pear Fair has been a Delta tradition since 1972. With pear pies, jams, preserves, and more, it is a great way to taste sweet, delicious pears from the beautiful Sacramento River Delta. Fair Oaks features the Chicken Festival every year, celebrating the Fair Oaks’ history in citrus groves and olive orchards. With great food, vendors, and history, this festival is a great way to taste what makes Sacramento County so unique.

Sacramento County’s Farmers Market season has begun and for those who want to really get

up close and personal with their local foods, Sacramento County has roughly a dozen certified farmers markets. With at least one market hosted nearly every day of the week, people are welcome to meet the producers and farmers who grow the food we consume. With access to fresh seasonal produce and goods, farmers markets are the ultimate in farm-to-fork experience.

On September 26th, 2015, Sacramento will celebrate the annual Farm-to-Fork Festival. This festival aims to spread awareness about the region’s local food production, consumption, and sustainability. People can experience live music; cooking demonstrations; a kids’ zone; interactive booths from local grocers, farmers, and ranchers; and most importantly, local food, wine, and beer from regional eateries. This year’s event is expected to exceed the 35,000 attendants reported last year and is a great way to share the area’s diverse food cultures utilizing locally grown items. One More Sober Grad Could Make a Difference

If a graduate drinks too much, it can mean trips to the emergency room, arrests, and even sexual assault. Your son or daughter could put themselves and their friends in real danger. Ask them to consider if this is any way to celebrate.

Research shows that parents do make a difference. Talking with your child about alcohol now could help prevent a life-changing mistake. Tell your graduate to play it safe and party right.

The Surgeon General has reported that life expectancy has improved over the last 75 years for every age group except for

the one that includes high school seniors. Their death rate is higher than it was 20 years ago due to alcohol-induced crashes.

Signs of alcohol poisoning can include mental confusion, stupor, coma, inability to arouse, vomiting, slow or irregular breathing, hypothermia or low body temperature, or bluish or pale skin. It can lead to permanent brain damage or death. A person showing any of these signs requires immediate medical attention. Don’t wait; call 911 if you suspect alcohol poisoning.

Graduation is a time to celebrate. But before your graduate parties, take the time to talk with him or her about alcohol—it just

may save a life!

The population of the City of Rancho Cordova last year was 67,841, and this year it is 69,112. That is an increase of 1.9%, which makes us the fastest growing city in the Sacramento Region. Elk Grove was next with 1.4%, and according to the Sacramento Bee, Colfax’s population decreased from 2,000 to 1,994, or -0.3%. Numbers can be very interesting, and educational, and frustrating, and also lifesaving when the right numbers are given to the team that is searching for an address or a location on a map and helps them find someone who is lost. Sometimes numbers are interesting and helpful when you learn that there were 528 people who attended the 18 Town Hall meetings we held to ask what the people thought would be a good use of the 1/2 cent sales tax they approved. There were some people who

were’n’t part of the 61% of voters who voted for the sales tax. A gentleman the other day was not sure when I told him about some of the good suggestions that we were presented at the meetings. He said, “We’ll see.” I hope he watches what is accomplished.

Numbers are of course educational at school when you learn how to add and subtract in the first and second grade. The teaching of math today is quite different than the way we learned in the past. Today, Riverview STEM Academy is going so much faster in how the teachers are teaching math to children. Numbers to them are worked into science, technology, engineering, and math and will help them understand so much more. Like Louis Armstrong said in his song, “I hear babies crying, I watch them grow, they’ll learn much more than I’ll ever know...”

The year is going by much faster than seems possible when you look at the calendar. Only a couple of weeks and the school year will be done for some students. That includes K-12 and college too. The fifth month of the year is half way

gone, and in a little more than a month, the longest “day” of the year will be here. Then we will wonder where it went. Just numbers again, when you think about it...

There are other numbers that we see and hear about every day, and those numbers are the amount of water you are supposed to stop using. I have a problem when some people say we need to let the grass and the trees die in Northern California but spend \$25 billion to build the peripheral canal/twin tunnels to move the Sacramento River to L.A. Numbers like that bother me because we teach our kids about sharing, and yet... Oh well, we will have to see how it all works out this coming year. For now, pay attention to the numbers that affect our lives: checkbook, how much water comes out of sprinklers, how much rain, how many miles a gallon your car gets, how much your job pays, and it goes on and on. Numbers in our city will change as the years go by, and if we pay attention, we will like the end results.

Progress Reported in Reducing Rancho Cordova Blight

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - If you’ve driven along Folsom Boulevard recently, you may have noticed more landscaping and spruced up properties—a welcome sight for developers as well as motorists. Despite the state’s abolishment of Redevelopment Agencies over four years ago, Rancho Cordova officials and businesses report steady progress in reducing blighted properties around town. The city says these areas may include brown fields, aging commercial corridors, and rundown and unsightly neighborhoods. A Redevelopment Agency was formed in late 2004, about a year and a half after the city was incorporated. That gave local governments the ability to capture a greater share of property taxes; 2,580 acres were targeted, including on Folsom Boulevard. After an area was declared a redevelopment project area, the share of taxes that had gone to schools was frozen. All of the tax revenue growth from that point until the redevelopment area expired,

usually in 50 years, went back to the redevelopment agency. But, still facing huge state budget deficits in 2011, Governor Brown argued that the state should no longer fund the program because those public dollars could be better spent on education and law enforcement. Rancho Cordova’s Economic Development Manager, Amanda Norton, said redevelopment allowed them to fund some great projects, including the Los Rios Community College District satellite campus, which is scheduled to open in the fall. Norton said the city has needed to be more creative and innovative, including utilizing grant money. “Luckily, we have an award-winning code enforcement department,” she said. “Between them and our neighborhood services, they’ve really stepped up to assist with any blight or graffiti or trash. They assure that all that gets picked up, which normally we would have been able to use redevelopment dollars to do all of that. We’re really fortunate—especially with the use of our new mobile app—that residents

definitely reach out to us and let us know if they see anything. It’s such an easy tool to get people out there and get things cleaned up sooner rather than later.” Norton said Folsom Boulevard has been the main focus, including what she calls a “refresh” of a shopping center at Zinfandel Drive. “And that was actually when the economy kind of hit a low point,” she said. “Then some firms were able to come in and purchase those properties and are now moving forward with plans to revitalize them.” Norton said a Business Improvement District is also being discussed for Folsom Boulevard. “They would agree to tax themselves, and it goes to themselves,” she said. “And they use that as a group for cleanup efforts, additional security patrols, and marketing. So that’s another tool that could be utilized.” Norton said a loan program for business façade improvements is also being considered. The manager of the Folsom Boulevard Walmart, Tony Amirkhas, has noticed the

difference to the business climate from the recent improvements, including an increase in sales. “We were able to reinvest in brand new shopping carts, as well as our employees,” he said. “A lot more people have been hired. Everything’s starting to fall back into place. The businesses are ecstatic about it.” Amirkhas appreciates the city’s generous reinvestment. He said they have a real good relationship with local government officials and law enforcement. “Obviously, businesses want to drive successful earnings and we want a great shopping experience,” he said. “The local community always gives feedback. We have meetings frequently with local businesses and city officials as well.” Amirkhas said more businesses are filling up empty storefronts. “Nobody wants a place of business in the area that’s not successful,” he said. “You also see an increase in traffic. You have more people stopping through, especially with the area directly off the 50 freeway. It’s a great location.” ★

Drone-Related Bill Receives Unanimous Support

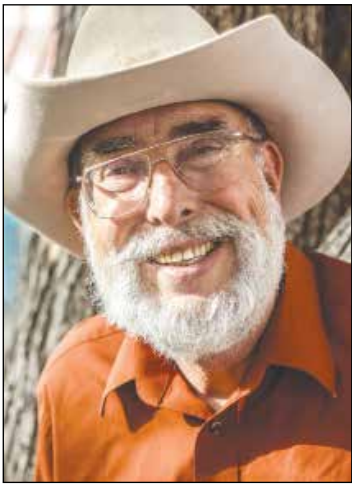
Privacy Package Continues to Move Forward

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado Hills) announced that one of his California Privacy and Consumer Protection Act bills related to schools and drone use—Senate Bill 271—passed the Senate Floor with unanimous, bi-partisan support. “As drone technology gains in popularity amongst the public, the potential for misuse and abuse will grow along with it,” said Senator Gaines. “This bill

has the sole intent of protecting our schools and children from potential harm and I look forward to its continued support in the Assembly.” Senate Bill 271 safeguards children from kidnapping, harassment, stalking, or a host of other potential harm by making it illegal to fly drones over public schools grades K-12 during school hours. The bill also makes it illegal to capture images of the campus during

school hours or during extracurricular activities. This bill is intended to stay ahead of the technological curve by providing a safeguard for children while they are at school and provides an important layer of privacy to students at a place that should be a sanctuary. Anderson Now Out as CHS Baseball Coach

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - For the last 45 seasons, Guy Anderson has proudly served as the Cordova High School (CHS) varsity baseball coach.

During that time, Anderson has accumulated 927 wins, second most among California high school varsity baseball coaches. He's also won multiple league/conference crowns that included last year's Lancer squad winning the Capital Athletic League. Cordova has also captured five Sac-Joaquin Section titles during Anderson's tenure.

Anderson has an impressive coaching resume. He has received Hall of Fame inductions on national and regional levels. In addition, Anderson has worked at the campus as a teacher, the school's athletic director, and assistant principal. Combined, he's worked 52 years at CHS.

But during a May 8th meeting with the school's administration during an end-of-the-season evaluation, Anderson, 82, was terminated as baseball coach. He said Principal Dan Anklam requested Anderson's resignation from the at-will, year-to-year coaching position. When Anderson refused, he was dismissed.

Anderson said Anklam told him that the program was going in a different direction. The long-time coach feels that the

decision was influenced by some parents over treatment of players, using his old-school method that has been very successful in recent years, including last season—plus the 1970s, '80s, and '90s when Cordova fielded powerhouse squads.

"I'm shocked," said Anderson of his dismissal. "I thought we came off a great season the year before (last year). You don't get 927 wins without doing a pretty good job."

Anderson strongly feels that the administration could've

handled it in a better manner. He pointed out he would've resigned if he had three or more consecutive losing seasons.

This season, the Lancers went 6-21 overall with a 1-14 record in the Sierra Valley Conference. There were 12 players on this year's team, but no junior varsity squad. But since 2011, Anderson's teams have posted winning records.

During the season, Anderson suspended one player from the team for disciplinary reasons. His mother arrived at the CHS's diamond, throwing her son's jersey onto the field and cursing Anderson, the coach said.

He also noted that she later apologized to other players and parents for her outburst, but not to Anderson. His coaching

style was discussed with the Folsom Cordova Unified School District's Board of Trustees last week.

On his Facebook profile the day of his firing, Anderson wrote, "Here is what's on my mind. Two hours ago (meeting held early afternoon) after 45 years of coaching baseball at Cordova High School, I get fired by a principal that never visited one of my practices and only attended one game. Reason, going in a different direction. Championship(s) in 2014, 6 and 21 (overall team record) in 2015 (and) 927 wins in 45 years."

Anderson has received support from many parents, former players, and coaches through phone calls and social media such as Facebook and Twitter. "I've

got people coming out of the woodwork I don't know and displayed to me on social media," Anderson said.

Cordova High School Assistant Principal Michele Brown made a statement via email regarding Anderson's dismissal: "The primary concern we have for the program right now is the current level of student engagement and participation. We also take into consideration that we have experienced a decline in student participation."

The administrator further stated that "student engagement is the single most important factor for evaluating school athletics, and we believe now is the time to start rebuilding the program."

Brown spoke highly of Anderson and his services as administrator, teacher, and coach over the years at Cordova. "We recognize and are grateful for Coach Anderson's decades of service and achievements at Cordova High and in the community," said Brown, "and he has helped countless young people achieve on the field and beyond."

Anderson is more than positive that he will be coaching on a high school or college baseball diamond next spring. ★

Without Sonny Gray (4-0, 1.65) the A's, in last place through Monday at 12-22 and already nine games behind the Houston Astros (that's right, the Astros!), would be mired even deeper in the AL West cellar with absolutely no hope of getting out. Way to go this time Billy Beane.

Meanwhile, the San Francisco Giants' offense has been hurting but they have been able to tread water waiting for injured star outfielder Hunter Pence to fully recover from a broken arm in spring training. He may be close to completing his rehab with the Giants' new minor league affiliate, your Sacramento River Cats. Starting pitchers Jake Peavy and Matt Cain are also still missing in action.

The lengthy injury list is always just part of the deal. Like the rest of us, those people just have to play through the pain. They think that they are hurting now; just wait until they try getting out of bed thirty years or so down the road. ★

“Put Me In, Coach”

The Cubs’ David Ross Makes a Memorable Showing on the Mound

There is nothing in baseball quite like the sight of a position player taking the mound. Typically, this happens in blowouts when a losing manager doesn’t want to tax his bullpen in a losing cause.

Last week, Chicago Cubs manager Joe Maddon called on veteran catcher David Ross to pitch the eighth inning at Milwaukee in a game the Cubs were trailing 12-4 and had already used four relievers to get through three innings.

The soft-tossing Ross, who has never taken the mound before in the majors, didn’t touch 80 on the gun, but threw just 11 pitches, nine for strikes, and retired the Brewers in order. Hector Gomez hit a deep fly to center for an out. Scooter Gennett pinch-hit for Ryan Braun and grounded out to third as the Cubs employed a defensive shift. Adam Lind followed with another groundout to second.

Ironically, the first home run of Ross’ career came off of first baseman Mark Grace, who was pitching for the Arizona Diamondbacks. The then-25-year old Ross stretched the Dodgers’ lead to 19-0 with two outs in the ninth inning.

Ross and his Chicago teammates had a little fun with his foray on the mound, and the overworked Cubs’ bullpen was saved an inning of work.

I couldn’t help but look back at some notable mound appearances by position players.

Over the years, there have been a handful of meaningful appearances. In 2011, Philadelphia’s second baseman Wilson Valdez pitched a scoreless 19th inning against the Reds and was rewarded with a run in the bottom of the inning for the win. It was the first time since 1921 that a winning pitcher had started a game at another position.

Valdez’s win wasn’t cheap. He faced the heart of the Cincinnati lineup. He retired reigning MVP Joey Votto on a deep fly to center, then hit Scott Rolen (not hard enough to hurt him, but with Rolen you never know), retired Jay Bruce on another deep ball to center and got pitcher Carlos Fisher on a popup.

Some of the impromptu appearances ended in disaster. In 1993, Jose Canseco of the Rangers entered a 12-1 game in Boston as Texas manager Kevin Kennedy wanted to save his bullpen. Three walks, a hit and three runs later, Canseco would injure his elbow, ultimately costing him the last half of the season.

Other appearances weren’t rewarded with wins, but the embar-

rassment/moral victory element can’t be overlooked. In 1988, Jose Oquendo of St. Louis was asked by manager Whitey Herzog to toe the rubber in the 16th inning of a 5-5 game against the Atlanta Braves. Seemingly waving the white flag, Herzog calculated that losing a game would not be as bad as losing an entire pitching staff, potentially costing more losses in coming days.

But Oquendo managed to get through the 16th unscathed after giving up a leadoff double to Ken Griffey Sr. followed by an intentional walk to Gerald Perry and a single to Ozzie Virgil, as Griffey was thrown out at home by rightfielder Tom Brunansky.

The utility infielder-turned-pitcher turned the Braves away in the 17th on one hit, the 18th on two walks before the Braves finally got to him in the 19th, plating two runs on a two-out double by Griffey after a pair of walks.

While Oquendo was saddled with the loss, the Braves were saddled with the stigma of needing four innings to score off a middle infielder on the mound.

Among the oddities of the game, Atlanta’s Rick Mahler, who made 34 starts that season, pitched eight shutout innings for the win after entering the game in the 12th. Oquendo threw 65 pitches, walked six (two intentional) and struck out one (Mahler). St. Louis pitcher Jose DeLeon entered the game as the leftfielder at the same time Oquendo moved from first base to pitcher. DeLeon and Brunansky swapped from left to right 11 times, presumably to keep DeLeon out of harm’s way as much as possible. They each made a putout during the position swaps, but DeLeon was in left when Griffey hit the game-winning double over his head. Andres Thomas and Ron Gant were each 0-2 off Oquendo. Perry was intentionally walked twice.

It is rare for position players to be in line for a decision, and most likely are stuck with losses. But there have been a few winning emergency pitchers in recent seasons. Brent Mayne of the Colorado Rockies tossed a scoreless frame on Aug. 22, 2000, as the Rockies defeated the Braves, 7-6, in 12 innings. Mayne was the 10th pitcher used by the Rockies and had a dicey inning. After retiring pinch-hitter Tom Glavine on a comebacker and Walt Weiss on a fly ball, Rafael Furcal singled and Andruw Jones walked to bring up Chipper Jones, who grounded out to third.

Adam Melhuse, who was pinch-hitting for Mayne in the bottom of the 12th, singled in the winning run. So Mayne, a backup catcher, was good enough to be an emergency pitcher, but was removed for a pinch-hitter with the game on the line.

As if the **New York Mets** don’t have enough pitch- ing, prized prospect **Noah Syndergaard** has been called up and is expected to make his major league debut on Tuesday, May 12, at Chicago’s Wrigley Field. The young righthander is 3-0 with a 1.82 ERA and 0.944 WHIP over five starts at Triple-A Las Vegas this season...The **offensively-challenged New York Yankees** have been playing well over the last three weeks, winning 17 of 23 games. During that stretch, the club has batted a pedestrian .255 and scored 4.5 runs per game. But the pitching has been up to the task, posting a 2.99 ERA with 197 strikeouts and just 178 hits allowed. The bullpen has been especially ef- fective with six wins, 19 holds and 13 saves with just one blown save during that time... Last season, the **Chicago White Sox** ranked ninth in the majors with 466 extra-base hits. Through Sunday, the Sox had managed just 62 hits for extra bags, ranking last in the majors. Through the same number of games last year, the Sox had 93...Speaking of extra bases, only five teams this season—the **Braves, Dodgers, Car- dinals, Yankees and Blue Jays**—have at least one extra-base hit in every game this season...It appears that teams have noticed that Toronto’s cleanup hit- ter, **Edwin Encarnacion**, is struggling this season, batting just .242. Even without an established No. 5 hitter, the Blue Jays have yet to receive an inten- tional pass, the only team without one this season... Lest you think that the effect of specialized relievers and the emphasis on the bullpen in recent years isn’t having an effect, note that the batting average off of **starting pitchers** this season is .259, but just .234 off of relievers...If **Kyle Lohse of Milwaukee** gives up another seven home runs, he will become just the 51st member of the 300 home runs allowed club. He will make his next start this weekend...The **St. Louis Cardinals** at 8-6 are the only National League team with a winning record on the road...Over the past seven games, **Toronto catcher Russell Mar- tin** is hitting .556 with a 1.684 OPS. He has socked four home runs and four doubles, raising his season average from .185 to .293...The **Colorado Rockies**, quickly becoming the worst team in the majors (once again), ended the week with a nine-game losing streak during which the pitchers posted an 8.96 ERA. The Rox were outscored 76-31.
