City Leaders Brave the Shave for Children's Cancer Charity

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - It's every parent's nightmare: your child is diagnosed with cancer. At best, your child faces months, if not years, of grueling and painful treatments. At worst, your son or daughter becomes one of the thousands of children who succumb to the disease each year. Cancer is the leading cause of disease-related

death among children and adolescents in the United States. And while childhood cancer rates have been on the rise over the past few decades, the number of children who survive it has also risen. According to the American Cancer Society, survival rates have increased from 58% in the 1970s to over 80% today, due in no small part to advancements in treatment and research.

Scholarship Opportunity Available for Graduating Seniors

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In 2011, Zak Ford established the Daniel Campbell Ford Scholarship in the Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD).

The scholarship, named in honor of Ford's great-grandfather Daniel Campbell Ford, is awarded to two graduating seniors planning to continue their education at a two-year or four-year college or university. One student is awarded the scholarship from the Rancho Cordova community and one student is awarded the scholarship from the Folsom community. The award amount per student is \$1,000.

In addition to offsetting some of the financial costs of college, the scholarship aims to give students a greater appreciation for a family member or other person who has made a sacrifice to provide them with greater opportunities in life.

Daniel Campbell Ford was a coal miner in Tennessee with only a second grade education when he started his family a century ago. Daniel wanted more opportunities for his children and desired that each would receive a quality education. He sold everything he could and moved his family to California, arriving with little more than a dream. Despite his lack of formal education, Daniel always encouraged his children to take advantage of their educational opportunities. Ford was proud that all 11 of his children graduated from high school—this rate would have

Top Volunteers Take a Bow

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Amy Hiramoto, the longtime Rancho Cordova volunteer who has kept the Kids Day in the Park flame burning for more than a quarter century, was honored as the Rancho Cordovan of the Year during a Dr. Suess-inspired gala, "Oh, the Places We'll Go," at Rancho Cordova City Hall on Friday, March 13th.

Hosted by Good Day Sacramento anchor Ken Rudolph, the 16th Annual Community Volunteer Awards honored eight recipients in various categories for volunteerism above and beyond the call of duty while the Cat in the Hat, Grinch, Thing 1 and 2, and other Seuss characters made it a party. The event was produced by the Cordova Community Council.

The event was highlighted by a show-stopping presentation by 20 Sunrise Elementary School students performing pieces from "Suessical the Musical" under the direction of their teacher, Trevor Harding.

Rancho Cordovan of the Year is something of a lifetime achievement award and, in the case of Hiramoto, recognizes years of volunteer service in the Rancho Cordova community that started decades ago and continues today.

Hiramoto has been in the forefront of professional and volunteer efforts aimed at improving the lives of Rancho Cordova children for decades. She has serving children in volunteer positions related to health, education, and more.

Hiramoto represents Rancho Cordova families on the Folsom Continued on page 2

City Leaders Brave the Shave for Children’s Cancer Charity

Foundation has been raising money for just such advancements, providing grants that fund research and clinical trials, supportive care for survivors and their families, and scholarships for medical students and new doctors pursuing careers in children’s oncology. And they’ve been doing so in a distinctive way that has raised over \$100 million since 2005: by shaving heads in solidarity with the kids who have lost their hair to their cancer treatments.

On the Monday before St. Patrick’s Day, city leaders in

Rancho Cordova City Council Member Donald Terry had his head shaved by volunteer stylist Marlene Flores at the St. Baldrick’s “Brave the Shave” fundraiser. “What better way to get a spring trim in and help remind people about these kids who are fighting really horrible diseases,” he said. “What better way to honor them than to step up with the rest of my community and do this?”

Rancho Cordova came together to put on their own head-shaving event at City Hall. Spearheaded by Zak Ford, Folsom Cordova Unified School District board member, and Rancho Cordova City Council Member Donald Terry, the event raised over \$12,000 for the St. Baldrick’s Foundation. “Shaving my head is just a minor thing [in order] to bring attention and financial

assistance to address this horrible disease. It’s something that no kid should have to go through,” said Ford. “Last year when I had first thought of this, I was going through the list of children that are St. Baldrick’s honorees—former childhood cancer patients—and there were numerous kids, about five or six, from our own community. In fact, one that goes to my son’s school even shared a name with my son; they’re both ‘Tommys.’ It really kind of hit home and I decided to do it.”

Terry, who heard about the event last year a little too late to participate himself, was determined to play a part this year. “I asked some of our staff if they could help us coordinate this [shaving fundraiser] and they did all of this in three weeks! We moved a team that was going to be down in midtown Sacramento and got them to agree to be down here and asked our community to step up and help support us in making this small gesture to raise awareness of kids who are fighting something really, really big.”

Approximately a dozen people stepped up to support the effort, including Melody Granger-Mayer, Civic Engagement Specialist with the Cordova Community Council, who raised nearly \$3,500 in 10 days. “As an adult, I can’t even imagine what children must go through when they have cancer, not understanding at that young age what’s really happening to them. I figure the least I can do is cut my hair for a good cause and hopefully help those children having to go through something like this.”

Cordova Unified School District oversight committees for Measures M, N, and P and has served on community and school panels focused on healthcare access for low income Rancho Cordova families.

She spent many years serving families for the Folsom Cordova Families Services division and is a member of the Cordova Community Council Board of Directors. She was part of the award-winning All-America City team and more.

But Hiramoto is probably best known for her unwavering dedication to Kids Day in the Park, an annual Rancho Cordova tradition that is part entertainment, part education for families of young children, offering a broad range of resources to more than 5,000 participants every April. The 26th Annual Kids Day, again chaired by Hiramoto, is slated for April 25th in Hagan Park.

“There is only one Amy Hiramoto,” said Rudolph when presenting the award. “She gives of herself freely to her community in countless ways. She was nominated by many in the community who believed this recognition as a local treasure is long past due.”

Hiramoto was among eight Rancho Cordova volunteers and organizations to be honored at “Oh, the Places We’ll Go.” Other honorees included the following people and organizations:

Local Scout Works His Way to Eagle

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At the Boy Scout Court of Honor on March 14th, Del Campo High School senior Brandon Singer (17) received his Eagle Scout rank in the Boy Scouts of America, Troop 325. He worked his way up through the ranks from the age of eight, earning 39 merit badges as well as the World Conservation Award, On My Honor, Historical Trails Award, BSA Lifeguard, and Thomas S. Monson Award. “I did everything that I could to be active in Boy Scouting,” Brandon said, “so it wasn’t hard for me because I lived it.”

Paul Anderson, local contractor and a Scout leader for 30 years, presented the Eagle Scout badge to Brandon. “Any boy who gets through an Eagle nowadays has pretty much figured out how to do things in life,” Anderson said. “In order to accomplish an Eagle project, you learn how to be a project manager, which is a skill that just about everybody needs in their job—how to lead people and how to organize things.”

Brandon’s Eagle project improved the area surrounding the Mather Navigator Memorial, which represents the men and women of the United States Air Force who trained as navigators at Mather Air Force Base throughout World War II and beyond. With nearly 90 volunteers, Brandon created a new path with a safer entrance and better wheelchair access, removed the entrance to the old path, added a culvert for proper drainage, and laid new bark around the memorial’s center walkway. The group also put up a plaque indicating the monument’s use as a sundial. The project logged 250 service hours for the actual site work.

Donations of materials fully supplied the project needs. Contributors included Sacramento County, Lowe’s, River City Rentals, and Cascade Rock.

“Paul Anderson was my go-to guy,” Brandon said. “He’s done this several times and he gave me a lot of good pointers on how to do everything throughout my Boy Scouting career. He’s really been a very strong model for me.”

Brandon also benefited from previous experience working with his dad, Scott Singer, who was in landscaping. “He’s very motivated,” Scott Singer said. “Once he sets his mind to doing something, he does it wholeheartedly and not halfway.”

Brandon’s mom, Holly Singer, helped him all the way through, mostly by being a driving force. “It was just something he has looked forward to for a very long time,” Holly Singer said. “It was my pleasure and honor to be by his side to help him.”

Brandon’s grandfather, Donald McCann, also influenced him in many ways. He was a Marine for 35 years and passed away in 2011. “My grandpa was, is still, pretty much my hero,”

Brandon said. “I spent more time with him than almost anyone else, and he drove me to do everything right the first time. I just want to be the man that he was.”

Each Scout troop is sponsored by a church, a school, or another community organization. Troop 325 is sponsored by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on Cordova Lane, of which Brandon is a member. He plans to fulfill a two-year mission after high school. The church will assign him either to a location in the United States or to another country, and he may need to learn a new language. “I know that through it I will be blessed and the lives of others will be,” Brandon said.

Currently, Brandon is a commander in charge of 115 cadets in Air Force Junior ROTC; when he returns from his mission, he hopes to join the Air Force as a pararescue specialist. College is also part of his future goals.

“Of all the boys that I’ve seen over the last almost 30 years go through the scouting program, Brandon is one of the most dynamic and self-motivated boys that I’ve dealt with,” Anderson said. “I couldn’t recommend him higher.” ★

The task force will develop an actionable plan that includes tools and resources for NLC members to engage candidates and position NLC as the “go to” resource for candidates and campaign staffs for city issues. The task force will also lead NLC’s participation at both national political conventions and in the transition to the next administration. “It’s an honor to have been chosen to serve on this important panel,” said Vice Mayor Sander. “It’s imperative for all of us that city issues play a role in the

election of our next President, as the vast majority of Americans live in cities or rely on them for economic support.” Vice Mayor Sander was elected to the first Rancho Cordova City Council when the City incorporated in 2003. He served as Mayor in 2007 and 2012 and as Vice Mayor in 2006, 2011, and 2015. He represents the City of Rancho Cordova on the NLC Board of Directors, Transportation and Infrastructure Steering Committee (Past Chair), First Tier Suburbs Steering Committee and General Committee (Past Chair), and as a Leadership Fellow. Vice Mayor Sander is also the Vice Chair and Board Member of the National Civic League Board of Directors and serves on the League of California Cities Board of Directors in addition to many other regional and local committees. Vice Mayor Sander is the Principal and Founder of Sander and Associates, a scientific consulting/development firm that specializes in medical and scientific projects. He received a

Ph.D. in Molecular and Cellular Biology from Tulane University and did undergraduate work in physics, math, biology, and chemistry at Saint Louis University in St. Louis, MO. Vice Mayor Sander and his wife, Dr. Margaret Parsons, a dermatologist, have lived in Rancho Cordova since the 1990s. One autumn afternoon my twin sister and I were ripping up the soil in my grandmother’s fallow garden. We were only five-years-old, and my sister, in her clod-crushing zeal, miscalculated the distance at which I was standing from her. I was summarily whacked on top of the head with a garden hoe.

Two distinct memories fill my mind about that moment: First, the warm, oozing of blood running into my left ear; and second, the sight of my Medicare-receiving, apron-wearing grandmother running, yes, running, from the house to scoop me into her arms.

There were no ambulances in my hometown. There was no real emergency room. There was no 911 service. Even if these things had been readily available, it wouldn’t have mattered. My grandmother didn’t own a phone or drive a car.

My aunt, who lived next door, called my parents at work. They arrived in record time and whisked me away to the office of Dr. Jerry Barron, one of only three doctors in town. Dr. Barron, sadly, was a community acknowledged quack, but on this afternoon he was the only option. See, Dr. Thompson did not work on Wednesdays, and nobody really visited Doc Hill anymore, not unless it was a matter of life and death.

Young mothers had lost all confidence in Doc Hill after he allegedly reported to his clinic



early one morning to deliver a new born baby boy, drunk as the proverbial skunk. The delivery was without complication, but the subsequent circumcision was a disaster.

So it was with great trepidation that I was passed with a gushing head wound into the hands of Dr. Barron, the silver-haired idiot. I was dragged to an examination room where Dr. Barron separated me from my parents, asking them to remain in his clinic lobby. He, his two nurses, and an office receptionist held me down to place a dozen stitches in my scalp.

I twisted and turned, convulsed and screamed, begging someone—anyone—to explain what was happening. They continued their work, never saying a word to me. Finally, I screamed at the top of my lungs, “Will someone please talk to me!”

Apparently that was the magic phrase. Dr. Barron and his team of tormentors actually stopped what they were doing. He looked me in the eyes, finally explained what they were trying to do, how long it would take, and how much it would or would not hurt. I then lay perfectly still, the doctor only moving my head occasionally, until the procedure was complete. I only needed someone to listen to me.

Listening is largely a lost art. Medical professionals run us through their offices like cattle through a chute. Politicians stubbornly ignore our voices. Our children discount our counsel. Our spouses cannot recall

the conversation we had just this morning. Trusted friends won’t lift a gaze from their glowing capacitive screens to look us in the eyes.

As I get older I understand more and more why Jesus often said, “He who has ears let him hear,” before uttering some mind-blowing instruction. Because for the most part, we do not use those two fleshy instruments attached to the sides of our heads.

At no time in human history has there been more opportunity or more tools to communicate; we’ve come a long way from beating drums and smoke signals. Still, most of our advances have been on the speaking side, rather than the listening side.

I wonder what would happen in our homes, office cubicles, classrooms, doctor’s offices, church sanctuaries, and houses of legislation if we who have ears took the time to actually use them. We just might begin to appreciate, rather than vilify, those on the other side of the aisle. We just might find that the world would grow a little quieter, a bit more peaceful.

We just might find that those we have long ignored actually have something worth saying. We just might discover the greatest advancement in the history of human communication - the ability to not say a single word.

Neighborhood Traffic Management Program Is Working

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - What the City of Rancho Cordova describes as a “tool box” for addressing traffic concerns on residential streets appears to be working well. The Neighborhood Traffic Management Program was established in 2006 as a way for residents to request calming measures, and the program continues to keep staff busy.

Request forms can be filled out online or mailed to the city. The forms should outline the concern, what street and/or intersection is affected, and the time of day the problem occurs. A petition with one signature of support from each of 10 households must then be obtained. The name, address, and contact information of residents who sign the petition is also required with the signatures.

The petition is sent to assistant civil engineer Ben Chan. He said they’re still getting quite a few requests, with speeding as the top concern.

Requests normally take a few weeks to process and include a

survey that takes about a week. The survey establishes a ranking system, which features points and other relevant information such as traffic speeds and volumes, accident frequency, if any, and distance from schools. Each street is scored and the street with the higher score is ranked with scores from other petitions. Survey results and rankings are then sent to residents.

Chan estimated that less than half of requests end up getting calming devices. Among the reasons, he said, “Not enough traffic going through that street. ... Speeding, on average, doesn’t surpass 25 miles an hour. No accidents.”

A Neighborhood Traffic Safety Committee, which also includes three local residents, reviews all requests. Chan said different levels of devices are applied, depending on the concern. “We have used striping to narrow down the lanes, also medians,” he said. “We’ve used several types. But the most common ones are speed humps.”

But speed humps can

be problematic for emergency vehicles where a quick response can make the difference between life and death. “We have a representative from fire, another representative from the police,” Chan said. “And they’ll chime in also. We have a hump that’s more gradual.”

Ballots are sent to residents, property owners, and businesses within the affected area to gauge support for the traffic-calming plan. At least 67% must approve it with a minimum of 25% returning ballots.

If the plan is approved by residents, it must still get final approval from the City Council, which appropriates funding. Funding sources include voter-approved Measure A and gas taxes.

Other calming devices that have been used include a narrowing of central islands, traffic circles, and roundabouts. “Some of these streets we have re-surveyed and have shown a reduction of speed,” said Chan. Usually only a few devices are constructed each year, but Chan believes they’ve been effective.

Improving Safety on Coloma Road

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Drivers and pedestrians will soon experience a safer and more efficient operation of Coloma Road in Rancho Cordova with two new projects.

Coloma Traffic Signal Interconnect Project: Work has begun on the Coloma Traffic Signal Interconnect Project that will upgrade all traffic signals on Coloma Road from Folsom Boulevard to Sunrise Boulevard. Using new technology, the City of Rancho Cordova will have the ability to remotely time and control the traffic signals depending on traffic flow.

“Coloma Road is used heavily by drivers, bikers, and pedestrians—especially during rush hour,” said Project Manager Chris Boyer. “The Coloma Traffic Signal Interconnect Project will give us the ability to provide better coordination of traffic signals to maintain a good level of safety

and service to commuters.”

The City has upgraded technology at other major intersections to accommodate traffic flow, including the intersection at Sunrise Boulevard and Folsom Boulevard.

New Traffic Signal at Aramon Drive: The City of Rancho Cordova will install a new traffic signal at the intersection of Coloma Road and Aramon Drive to improve safety.

The intersection was ranked high for car accidents and incidents involving pedestrians traveling to and from surrounding neighborhoods.

“The new signalized intersection will provide a safe way for pedestrians and bikers to cross Coloma Road and drivers to commute in Rancho Cordova,” said Boyer.

Both projects are anticipated to be completed by summer 2015. Construction will take place Monday through Friday

between the hours of 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. There will be minimal lane closures and noise during the construction period.

The U.S. Department of Transportation’s Highway Safety Improvement Program is fully funding \$740,000 for the interconnect project and \$430,000 for the intersection. The goal of the federal program is to achieve a significant reduction in traffic fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads.

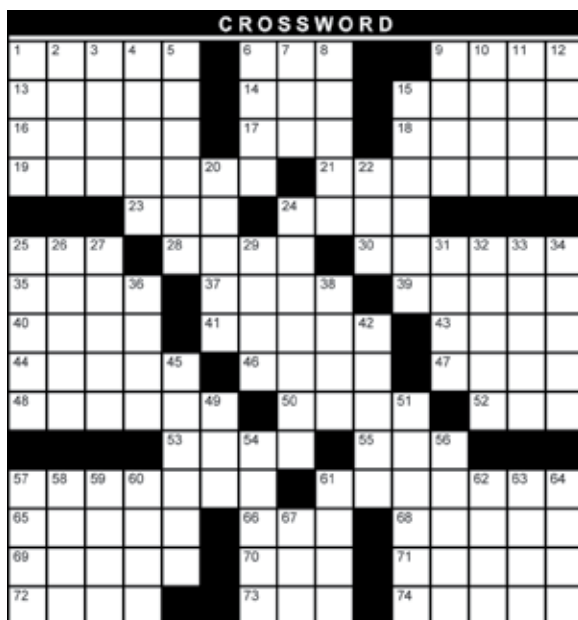

Don't Use It or Lose It

*Californians Believe in Conserving Water, Drought or No Drought
Residents are Willing to Make Significant Changes to Their Own Water Use*

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - As California enters a fourth year of drought, a new statewide poll reveals that the vast majority of Californians (90%) are willing to make significant changes to conserve water both inside and out, and more than 80% believe it's important to conserve water regardless of whether the state is in drought or whether conservation is mandated by local water agencies.

The statewide poll of 801 registered voters—commissioned by the Association of California Water Agencies in partnership with the statewide conservation education program Save Our Water—also found that more than 80% of Californians view the drought and water shortages as “extremely” or “very” serious problems. Some 86% of polled residents believe that California is in a state of persistent water shortage.

The polling also indicates that Californians nearly universally agree that the drought is the most pressing problem facing the state and is more concerning than the economy, education, health care costs, and taxes.

“California is indeed a dry state that can expect to see persistent droughts in its future. This polling underscores the fact that a vast majority of Californians understand this new normal,” said ACWA Executive Director Timothy Quinn. “But the poll also shows that an overwhelming majority

of Californians are willing to significantly change their water usage whether we are in a drought or not. This is a sea change in public opinion and bodes well for our future.”

Mark Cowin, director of the Department of Water Resources, noted that the poll indicates over three-quarters of Californians have been getting the message about the state's ongoing drought. DWR is a partner with ACWA in the Save Our Water program.

“Clearly, Californians understand the magnitude of this drought,” said Cowin. “Just as important, they understand that they can help California cope through the collective power of individual actions. If we all shut off sprinklers, make the effort to fix a leak, and urge friends and neighbors to do the same, it will make a difference.”

The poll of registered voters was conducted February 22nd through March 1st by the polling firm Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates (FM3). Its findings arrive as the State Water Resources Control Board prepares to act on proposed new emergency water conservation regulations today and extend existing ones as the state remains locked in a grinding fourth year of drought. The Sierra snow-pack is at record low levels and January was among the driest months on record.

“This poll's findings stand out among our many years

of tracking water issues in California,” said Dave Metz, principal and president of FM3. “We've never seen such a huge majority recognize the severity of the water crisis as well as such a large group that views the water problems as ongoing and warranting continued conservation.”

Metz noted that 83% of those polled said conserving water is “extremely” or “very” important whether or not water agencies are requiring water conservation, suggesting that, for Californians, “conserving water has become more of a core value than simply a reaction to regulations, restrictions, or other external factors.”

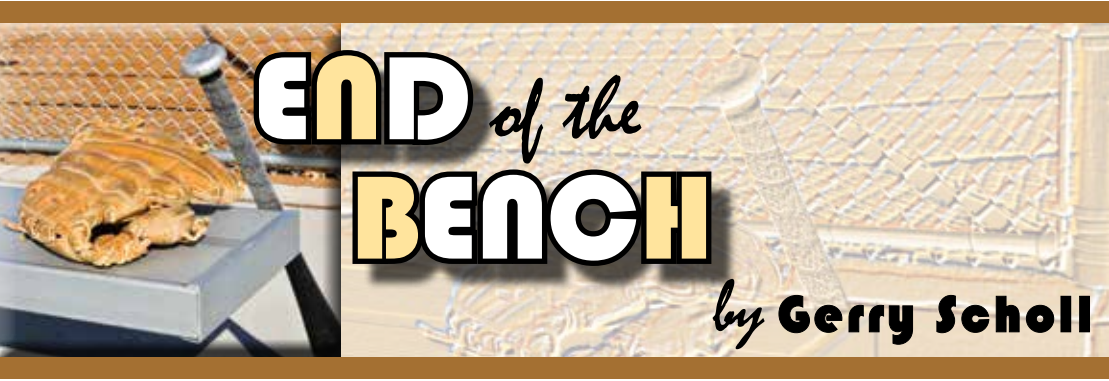
Rosemont 8, Cordova 1

The Kings' Reign of Confusion

It is art for art's sake. Art for whose sake? It's just art, for Pete's sake!

Who would have ever thought that Winnie-the-Pooh's little buddy Piglet would be the talk of the town? But after some shmoozin' with the Koons, that cute porker's snout is in everybody's business.

It looks like it is a done deal. When the Sacramento Kings open their new downtown arena for the 2016 season it will be none other than a somewhat distorted, giant-sized, unreasonable facsimile of Piglet waiting there to greet the patrons on opening night. It will come to you all courtesy of the decision to put \$8 million into the pockets of contemporary artist Jeff Koons for creation of

this new "masterpiece" of art.

Koons and his team's productions have found many a prestigious home around the world. But his works have received mixed reviews — and Koons has been labeled with wide-ranging tags from genius to tacky commercial artist. The sculpture's "masterpiece" tag will forever be a matter of debate. The forces that be want to upgrade the artsy image of Sactown. Sacramento will never be confused with Florence, Italy; Piglet will never be confused with the Statue of David; the Kings' arena will not be mistaken for Santa Maria del Fiore.

What is not debatable is that once the Kings' franchise was saved for the city the owners, the organization and its

backers have grabbed the reigns of momentum and run with it — right downtown. And now they are making one more profound statement with this pricey work of art that they believe will become an "iconic image for the city." This used to be known as a "Cowntown," but now, we suppose, nothing says Sacramento like a pig with his nose in the air. The beauty, as they say, will be in the eyes of the beholders, but the price tag will also be on their minds. (Never mind that DeMarcus Cousins is guaranteed more than seven times that much over the next four seasons).

Sacramento Bee columnist Marcos Breton enlightened his reading public on the "basic facts" of the financial

machinations involved, noting that much of the money will come by way of a "few of the richest people in town." He failed to enlighten them to the idea that their money could be better spent. Breton thinks that objections to the expenditure are matters of misplaced anger — right, misplaced smack dab in the middle of downtown!

Apparently, there is a law on the books requiring that on all projects built with public money two-percent of the construction budget must be spent on art — which raises two questions: 1) Is Piglet art? 2) What is art?

For the answers we decided to seek out the opinions of minds much greater than our own. (Blessed be Google). We found a list of quotes on the subject that went on, and on, and on, and, undoubtedly, could go on infinitely. Everybody who thinks, or ever thought, they were anybody had something to say about art. Reading on and on, the head was spinning not knowing just what to make of it all. It seemed as though art is a contradiction within itself — meaning one or more things to the artist, but something different to each other viewer.

One thing seemed for sure, "Without art the view of the world would be incomplete," (Conrad Fiedler), because

through the lengthy list was used almost every idea imaginable — nature, individualism, passion, lies and truths, soul, expression, imitation, consciousness, escape, heart, craft, vision, manifestation, imagination, reflection, emotion, transformation, illusion, spirituality, enlightenment, influence, transcendentalism, foodforthesoul...

"Enough has been said about art already." (Gregori Gillespi). That guy may be right, because the head is pounding from trying to sort it out. Art is confusion organized through the complicated mind of the floundering artist, confounding us all.

Or, "Art is what everyone knows it is," (Benedetto Croce), which is a fancy way of saying what they always say in sports, "It is what it is."

Kings owner Vivek Ranadive thinks Piglet "will be a symbol of hope and optimism;" sort of along the lines of "a cultural and social glue...(art) has served to reinforce our relationship to each other." (Eric Fischl).

Meanwhile, Koons may be thinking, "Art is anything you can get away with." (Marshall McLuhan).

The defenders of the sculpture think that, ultimately, it will provide positive inspiration and will help create a greater sense of community.

There are others who can think of eight million reasons why Piglet will not be inspiring children growing up in some of the desperate pigsty corners of the Sacramento metro area. It should not be said that the city shouldn't spend any money on art, but priorities should dictate a more appropriate disbursement of available funds.

It has been said that Koons' "Coloring Book" collection is "intended to capture a child's ecstatic enjoyment of the world," and that Piglet was "inspired by a child drawing outside the lines in a coloring book over the character Piglet."

Who is inspiring whom? There are philosophical differences in play.

There are likely thousands of children in the area that are not particularly enjoying their world these days, and may never get an opportunity to experience the aura of Piglet. They probably would be inspired, however, by some funding for food, shelter, clothing, some coloring books and some brand new boxes of crayons. There would be great art in providing that; that is real life — no imitations.

There is still a need to be even more creative. "Art is a pigment of your imagination." (Darcy Gerdes).★

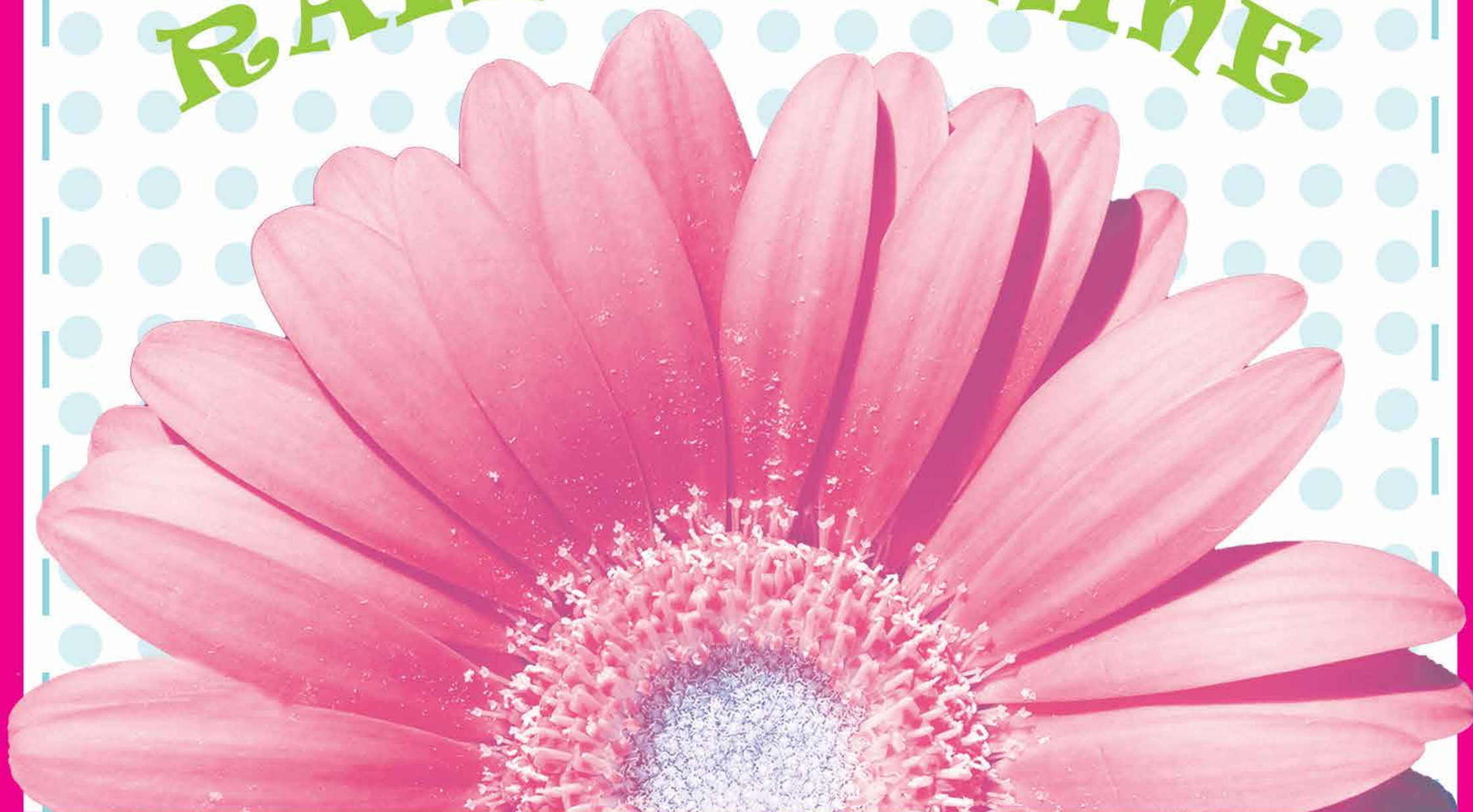
