CHP Combats Aggressive Driving

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) announced that it is implementing a yearlong, federally funded traffic safety campaign to reduce the number of collisions associated with aggressive driving.

"Every year, speed and aggressive driving plays a role in the death or injury of thousands of people in California," said CHP Commissioner Joe Farrow. "Through this enforcement and education campaign, we seek to curb the number of fatal and injury collisions linked to speeding and other dangerous driving."

With the support of a federal traffic safety grant titled "Reduce Aggressive Driving Incidents and Tactically Enforce Speed (RADIATES) III," the CHP will educate motorists about the dangers of aggressive driving and will take appropriate enforcement action. The primary goal of this grant is to reduce, by 5%, the number of fatal and injury traffic collisions where speed, improper turning, and driving on the wrong side of the road are primary collision factors. To achieve this goal by September 30th, 2015, the CHP will combine enhanced enforcement with an active public awareness campaign, which includes at least 400 radar trailer deployments and a minimum of 300 traffic safety presentations throughout the state.

Speed, coupled with aggressive driving, consistently contributes to the vast majority of serious collisions in California. According to data from the Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System, in federal fiscal year 2011-2012, speed was a factor in approximately 42% of all fatal and injury collisions in the state. That year, more than 26,000 speed-related collisions resulted in the death of 264 people and the injury of more than 38,000 others.

Families Not Glving Up Fight Over Gun Range

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Parents, students, and other community members outraged over an indoor shooting range set to open next door to George Washington Carver High School had a message for the Rancho Cordova city council at a November 3rd council meeting: We're not backing down.

Nina Powers, a senior at Carver, was among the

approximately dozen or so students and parents that protested on the sidewalk in front of city hall late that afternoon before the meeting. Powers is uncertain if she wants to transfer to another school so late into her last year at Carver but said that it was important for her to show support and solidarity with her classmates regardless.

"It's not about me, it's not a selfish concern, it's about others," Powers said. "I'm

concerned for students that come in after."

Powers' mother, Rucha, called the decision by Fite Development Co. to open a shooting range next door to the school in the wake of several school shootings across the country over the past year "in very bad taste." She is especially upset over a lack of public notification and concerned about retrofitting the building.

"This developer has never

been available to answer questions," Rucha Powers said. "We don't have any answers because they never engaged with us."

Derald Langwell, a retired resident and gun owner, thinks the controversy is overblown and based on emotion. He said that he would welcome a shooting range opening next door to Cordova Garden Elementary, where his granddaughter, whom he plans to teach how to shoot, attends school.

"A lot of them don't look at the facts," Langwell said. "You're going to have bad people everywhere. It's a legal business; they're not going to allow these high school kids to come in."

While people on both sides of the controversy agree that there is no guarantee of safety, Langwell said that the city possibly creating new laws will not discourage a determined shooter. However, Rucha Powers said that placing a shooting range next to her daughter's school is obviously a bad idea.

"It seems to be a no-brainer," Powers said. "It's a really irresponsible decision."

The shooting range is still scheduled to open in several months, though city council may pass future ordinances prohibiting similar businesses from opening near schools.

Deliver Your Christmas Cards via the Pony Express

Collection Box at Rancho Cordova City Hall

- Want your holiday cards to have an extra special delivery? Then drop them off at the Rancho Cordova City Hall, 2729 Prospect Park Drive, by Friday, December 5th, and they will be carried by the National California Pony Express Association riders during their annual Christmas Card Ride on Saturday, December 13th.

Your cards should be addressed and stamped with regular postage before depositing them in the collection box in City Hall's reception lobby during regular business hours.

After the ride, the envelopes will be stamped with a commemorative seal and turned over to the U.S. Postmaster for final delivery.

"No additional postage is required, but we welcome donations at the drop box as the event is one of our few fundraisers," said Rich Tatman of Rancho Cordova and President of the California Division Pony Express Association. "We use the proceeds to help maintain



trails and keep the spirit of the horse alive and well."

The ride will begin with a celebration in Folsom, go through Rancho Cordova, and end at Old Sacramento.

Tatman invites the public to "come out on December 13th and look for the riders along the horse and bike trail areas."

9 a.m. - Celebration at Folsom Museum, 823 Sutter Street

10 a.m. - Leave Folsom

11 a.m. - Leave Nimbus Fish Hatchery, near Highway 50 at Hazel

11:35 a.m. - Sunrise Foot Bridge, over American River at Upper Sunrise in Rancho Cordova

12:45 p.m. - Leave River Bend Park, Goethe Park Road

and Jedediah Smith Rec Trail in Rancho Cordova

3:35 p.m. - Arrive at the Discovery Museum in Old Sacramento, 101 I Street

The Pony Express was a private mail service which operated between St. Joseph, Missouri and Sacramento. Started in April 1860, it operated for only 18 months when the trans-continental telegraph began operation. Forty riders in each direction, 190 stations, and 400 station keepers kept the operation working smoothly. Riders were paid \$25 a week and rode 75 miles, changing horses every 10 to 12 miles. Although the Pony Express did not last very long, it is remembered as one of the enduring symbols of the American frontier.

Rancho Cordova Code Enforcement Cars Are Fully Functioning Offices

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova Code Enforcement Officers' five new cars are not only their transportation but also their mobile offices. The vehicles are equipped with laptops that connect to their virtual desktops, LaserJet printers for printing documents, and Bluetooth and USB charging for their phones. All of this allows them to complete assignments on the spot, enabling them to provide fast and efficient customer service that saves time and money for the City and their clients.

Custom designed by the City's Information Technology staff, each mobile office includes a mount for a laptop computer that is conveniently positioned next to the driver's seat. Located behind the front passenger seat is a printer that's within easy reach. A portion of the back seat has been removed to make room for a power inverter that converts 12 volts DC to 120 volts AC to run the printer and a charger for the laptop computer. In addition, using a hardware VPN appliance, the laptop connections are part of the City's network so Code Officers can access their virtual desktops just as if they were in a normal office, access and share

documents, go online, and even receive faxes.

"After a rental housing inspection, I was able to print out a correction list on the spot and give it to the owner. Before, I would have had to go back to the office to do a print-out and then mail it," said Code Enforcement Office Ryan Taylor. "The mobile offices enable us to give faster service while saving time, postage, and administrative costs."

He said that he was able to give an owner a "Notice of Compliance" immediately after a rental house re-inspection. Officers can now receive property manager completion of work records, proof of receipts, and other documentation. The power system is designed to provide needed WiFi connections for 30 minutes after the vehicle is turned off. This allows the officer to maintain a connection while working outside of the vehicle and protect the battery from draining too low. Internet connection is provided via Verizon's 4G LTE service with an external antenna to feed the internal network equipment.

The cars are equipped with a

flashing safety light bar to use when it's necessary for Code Officers to park in or on the street or provide a directional light system at accidents.

The mobile office design was created by Jay Hadley, the City's Information Technology Director, and David McCoy, the City's Information Technology Analyst.

"They told us what they wanted to do on location and we made a design that would accomplish their needs," said Hadley.

He and McCoy also created a breathable back seat covering over the power inverter. "It looks like a regular back seat, but is a mesh fabric so that the control system doesn't get overheated," he commented. Hadley is proud that he was able to design a clean and functional system for City officers to work from.

After seeing one of the outfitted cars, another agency's Code Enforcement Department head said, "Rancho Cordova should be proud to have state-of-the art equipment to better service their residents. Can we get a copy of your design?" ★

Church Fair Offers a Crafty Christmas

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - St John the Evangelist School's annual blowout, A Holiday Show of Hands, will ensure a crafty Christmas to more than 10,000 shoppers.

Holiday and entrepreneurial spirits annually soar as crafters install wares for the first December weekend at the Carmichael campus. In its 36th year, the three-day fundraiser jams Locust Avenue and surrounding streets with shoppers' cars.

Wares are too diverse to list. Suffice to say that whether hand-knitted, jeweled, hammered, or turned from a potter's wheel, if it is tooled with artistry and love, St John's is the place to find it. The fundraiser began when organizer Pat Holbus had seven children at St Johns and supported the school's struggle to keep costs down for working families. That tuition fees are still among the lowest of Sacramento Catholic

and ceramic items. Sallie Gereg (The Mad Tatter) brings handwork from Fair Oaks. Dawn Trew produces hand-painted glass in her Orangevale studio. Mary Donniss

the Show of Hands in tune with the times is the organizers' mission. ATMs are available on fair days, and when temperatures dip, sophisticated hot toddies revive the weary. Because hungry customers are not happy customers, volunteer cooks offer homemade lasagnas and tamales as winter warm-ups.

The fair's own hubble-bubble of industry is heartwarming, too. Knitters' needles click in tempo with Andy Williams—it's the most wonderful time of the year for hat and mitten purchases. "Even if it's cold or raining, customers are determined to enjoy themselves," says Holbus. "They come from all over Northern California; some even drive from out of state. For many, our Holiday Show of Hands is part of a tradition for friends to shop together. It's a weekend that says: hey, it really is Christmastime."

The fair is held at St John the Evangelist School, 5701 Locust Avenue, Carmichael. Hours are 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday, December 6th; 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday. Admission is free. Doors open on the evening of Friday December 5th, allowing preview shopping for a \$3 donation. For further information, call (916) 481-8845 x 216. ★

schools speaks to the event's continuing success. The 1976 debut event hosted 20 vendors. Booths now sell out at 150 spaces and prospective crafters are juried so merchandise is not duplicated.

"Every year, we want a good variety of goods and new vendors to keep the show fresh," explains Holbus. Folsom's Noelle Lask, for example, tools steam-punk trinkets. Placerville's Dianne Newman will offer unique scarves and hats. From Roseville, Catherine Davin markets repurposed glass

is a Christmas crafter from Granite Bay, and Diana Boud annually sells out her much sought Maus Haus line of hand-stitched critters. Contributing vendors also journey from Loomis, Lincoln, Eldorado Hills, Elk Grove, and Citrus Heights to make the fair a holiday treasure trove.

Holbus now has 12 grandchildren, most of whom have attended St John's. Three daughters and friend Carole Czimsky help with year-round fair preparations. Old fashioned goods aside, keeping

Extended Liquor Moratorium Stalls Opening of Family Business

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova city council members recently extended a moratorium on liquor sales within 500 feet of adult businesses, delaying one local couple’s plans to open a family restaurant next door to a strip club.

During public hearing at a November 17th council meeting, Carlos and Carolina Ocampos approached council members, protesting a November 3rd vote to ban alcohol sales for another ten months while city officials complete a study of potential negative effects on the surrounding area on Sunrise Blvd. where the couple had planned to open South Beach Grill. Concerns cited by city staff and council include prostitution, lewd conduct, and drug sales.

The Ocampos feel that they are being used as an example to demonstrate the council’s interest in public safety in light of controversy over the impending opening of a shooting range

next door to George Washington Carver High School.

“I feel like I’m being used as a scapegoat,” Carolina Ocampos said.

The couple’s liquor sales license was approved by the state Department of Alcohol Beverage Control in late August, pending completion of construction. In September, council members voted to establish a 45-day moratorium on alcohol sales near adult businesses. The Ocampos received an email from the Planning Commission informing them of the ban on Oct. 1st, 35 days after they filed for a building permit.

Management for Pure Gold Showgirls, the strip club next door to South Beach Grill, said that they do not expect any problems if the restaurant opens. Amy Ramirez, general manager of Pure Gold’s, said there are more problems with other nearby businesses and thinks that it would be better to ban alcohol sales if there are complaints from the public.

“The previous business that

was here when we moved in ... we never had any problems,” Ramirez said. “[The ban] affects a lot of businesses in Rancho Cordova; it’s just something that I think the council should reconsider.”

Ashley Downton, communications specialist for Rancho Cordova, said in a telephone interview that the city welcomes new businesses but places a high priority on ensuring the community’s safety and interests. An extension of the moratorium gives the city time to examine potential issues and then work to identify solutions, according to Downton.

“Our goal is really to be business-friendly by identifying solutions that will protect the interests of the community and the people that work in Rancho Cordova,” Downton said. “The city is working diligently with the Ocampos to find solutions and bring South Beach Grill to the community.”

If the ban is not lifted, the Ocampos said that they will be forced to file for bankruptcy. ★

Death of Ferdinand the Eastern Bongo

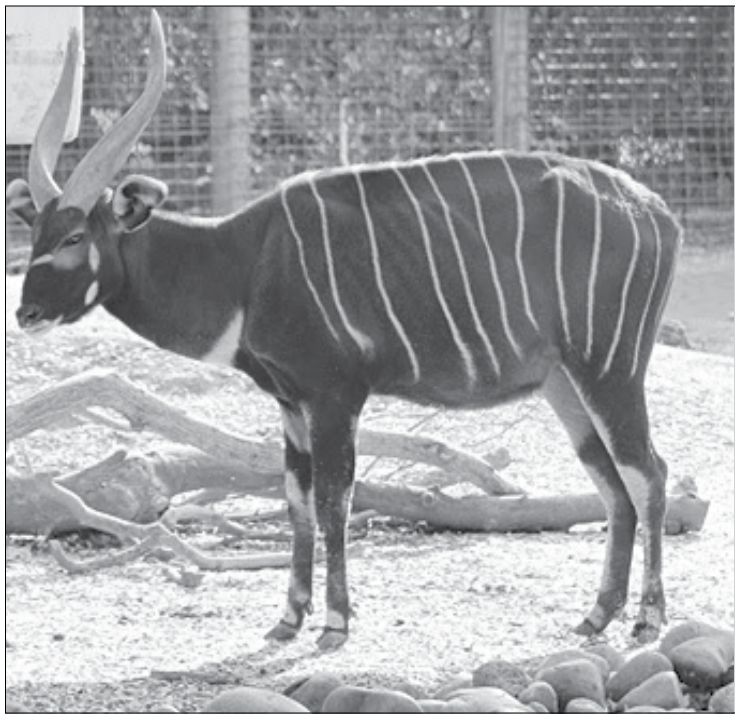
SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

Despite receiving I.V. fluids and treatment for shock, Ferdinand passed away while he was being cared for by the veterinary and animal care staff. A full necropsy will be performed at UC Davis, with test results available in a few weeks.

“One of the kids’ most favorite things to do during our summer camp is to go behind the scenes and feed carrots to our majestic bongo,” said Ann Geiger, Education Director at the Sacramento Zoo. “Our animals provide so many wonderful memories and stories that children will take with them long after they have visited the Zoo. Our bongo will be missed by young and old alike.”

Ferdinand was born at the Gladys Porter Zoo in 2009 and arrived at the Sacramento Zoo in June 2012. As a gentle and calm bongo, he was popular amongst visitors and adored by Summer Camp kids. Aply named after the bull in the children’s story “The Story of Ferdinand,” he would rather smell the flowers than fight.

The Eastern Bongo is a large,

African forest antelope found in Kenya. The Eastern Bongo has a chestnut colored body, white body stripes, banded legs, large ears, and two spiral horns. They mostly live in isolated populations in the lowland forests of Kenya.

Eastern Bongos are considered critically endangered; it is estimated that there are fewer than 250 individuals left in the wild. The bongo’s natural range has been drastically

reduced over the past few decades. The largest threat to this species is the loss of habitat caused by growing civilization. For more than 20 years, the Sacramento Zoo has actively participated in the Association of Zoos and Aquariums Eastern Bongo Species Survival Plan® to cooperatively manage this endangered population in accredited institutions.

Kings Break Ground on World-Class Arena

Historic Groundbreaking Takes Place as the Kings Tip Off 30th Season in Sacramento

new annual visitors to downtown, and \$11.5 billion in regional economic impact over the next 35 years.

“This is a historic day in the City of Sacramento,” said Mayor Kevin Johnson. “We’ve reached a great milestone in this incredible journey that has been nearly 10 years in the making. Today, we are putting shovels in the ground which means we are putting people back to work. We’ve said from the beginning that this was bigger than basketball. This project is the catalyst in our years long effort to revitalize our downtown, creating 4,000 permanent jobs and over 11,000 construction jobs, while energizing our City and our region. I’ve never been prouder of my hometown and more hopeful for our future.”

To honor the past while celebrating the future, the Kings highlighted unique memories and experiences from several Sacramento youth.

“When I was eight years old, I danced in front of my first huge crowd during halftime of a Kings game,” said Tejah Teat. “That performance gave me the confidence to pursue my dreams and eventually win a national contemporary dance title. The project also includes a state-of-the-art practice facility, administrative offices and up to 1.5 million square feet of ancillary development.

AECOM, who is renowned for designing some of the most state-of-the-art sports and entertainment venues in the world, is the ESC’s lead architect, while ICON Venue Group is serving as the project manager, and Turner Construction is the lead builder. All architectural design work will occur in Sacramento to ensure ongoing local input in the design process.

Today’s groundbreaking of the new ESC also coincides with the Sacramento Kings regular season home opener, which will commemorate three decades of Kings basketball in Sacramento. The celebratory home opener will kick off with an immersive visual show that transforms the court into a 3D projection screen highlighting the team’s rich history. Original owners and former Kings players from the 1985 inaugural team will be on hand to commemorate the team’s storied past and celebrate its bright future.

2014 Cordova Football Season Review

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Cordova High School football coach Vance Mueller felt that the turning point that led to the Lancers' first winning season in eight seasons happened in July. The Lancers were taking part in a football camp at Monterey Trail High School in Elk Grove where Mueller and his coaching staff watched in disbelief of how their players performed at the full-contact camp.

"We were scrimmaging against Monterey Trail, Inderkum (both still alive entering the second round of the Sac-Joaquin Section Division I and II playoffs, November 21st), and Burbank, and realized that there's a whole other level we're trying to get to," Mueller said.

The post-camp discussion he had with the players was a clear message that the Lancers better shape up or ship out before the home and season opener against Pioneer of Woodland. The message was well received.

Cordova and Pioneer battled to put the ball into the end zone in the first game. The Lancers survived as they pulled out a 14-7 win. That was followed up by victories over rival Bella Vista, McClatchy, Johnson, and Foothill.

"Our first goal was to try to go undefeated in pre-season," Mueller said. "We were excited about what we accomplished."

Then Cordova entered Sierra Valley Conference action with its homecoming game against Galt, with a perfect 5-0 record. The Lancers extended their winning streak to six games, 1-0 in the SVC as they punished the Warriors, 36-8.

Leading the Lancers' offense was junior quarterback Unique Perez, who completed 111 of 184 passes for 1,588 yards and 16 touchdowns. The junior's favorite targets were Devin Baldwin, who hauled in 41 receptions for 831 yards and seven touchdowns. Baldwin was followed by Ventrell Dyson, Jeremiah Russell, Isaac Black, Carlos Cuevas, and Aaron Pierce, all of whom combined to score 13 touchdowns. In the ground game, Cordova was paced by Aaron Pierce, Seth Trujillo, Brandon Buck, and Andre Nevels.

On defense, Cordova was led by middle linebacker Jordan Richard who led the team in tackles this season with 77. Richard was followed by defensive end Vincent Spikes who had 66, and then by Buck, Kurtis Simmons, Amos Loto, Matthew Giles, and Sam Nawalu.

But the wins stopped, as well as a chance to earn a section playoff berth, as the Lancers fell in their

final four conference games. In two of those contests, Cordova lost by less than two touchdowns. Although the Lancers finished 1-4 in the SVC and 6-4 overall, they produced the program's first winning season since the 2006 season when Cordova went 6-4 and 3-2 in the SVC plus a playoff berth.

Lancer fans were treated to a very hungry football team that turned the corner this season. Mueller was pleased with the improvement his team made over a five-month timespan. And he also feels the program can only get better. Some of the players expected to return for the 2015 season are Perez, Black, and Giles.

"We're going to have high expectations (for the 2015 season)," Mueller said. "The talk around campus is the kids (returning and sophomores moving up to varsity next year) are ready to get going. They're excited to get back into the weight room." ★

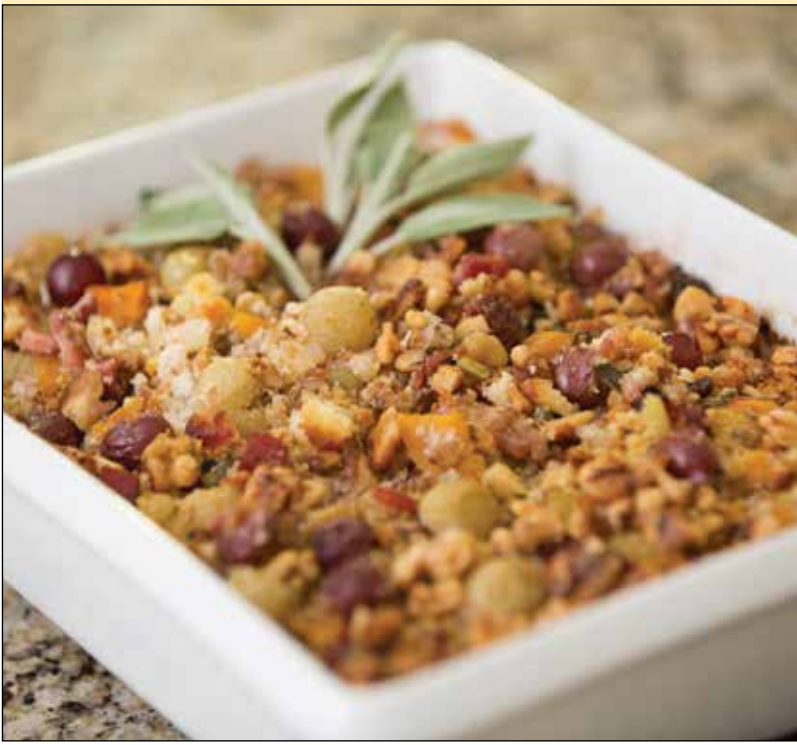
A Tasty Tradition

Helpful Tips for the Perfect Holiday Turkey

- When shopping for your turkey, look for one with a pop-up timer.
- To thaw your turkey, keep it in the refrigerator based on its weight. For example, it should remain in the refrigerator for 24 hours for every 5 pounds. To thaw quickly, place it in the sink and cover with cold water, changing the water every half hour per pound.
- Once the turkey has thawed, always refrigerate or cook immediately.
- When you’re ready to cook, baste the bird with extra virgin olive oil. Place turkey with the breast up on a rack in a shallow roasting pan in an oven preheated to 325°F. Loosely cover turkey with foil to prevent over-browning.
- The turkey is done cooking when the meat thermometer reads 180°F, or if the red stem on the pop-up timer is up and the drumstick feels soft or moves easily.
- Always allow the bird to rest for at least 20 minutes for easy carving.
- Present your turkey on a platter with a fresh and colorful garnish, such as California grapes.



Cornbread Dressing with Roasted Grapes, Walnuts and Pancetta
Servings: 12

- 2 cups red seedless California grapes
- 2 cups green seedless California grapes
- 2 cups cubed butternut squash
- 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- 6 ounces diced pancetta
- 3/4 cup sliced celery
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 5 cups coarsely crumbled cornbread (either store-bought or prepared from a mix), toasted
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped walnuts, toasted
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh sage
- 1 cup reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted
- 3 tablespoons white balsamic vinegar
- 1 egg, beaten

Preheat oven to 400°F. Toss grapes and squash cubes together in large bowl with oil, salt and pepper, to taste. Spread in single layer on baking sheet and roast for about 20–30 minutes, until grapes have begun to slightly shrivel and squash is tender. Set aside.

Heat large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat and cook pancetta until it begins to brown slightly. Add celery and onions and cook until tender and onions are translucent, about 5–6 minutes. Add garlic and cook for one minute more. Remove from heat.

In large bowl, combine cornbread, pancetta mixture, grapes, squash, walnuts, sage and salt and pepper to taste, if desired. Set aside.

In medium bowl, whisk together broth, butter, vinegar and egg. Pour over cornbread mixture and toss well to combine.

Spray 9-by-13-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Spoon dressing evenly into dish. (At this point, you can either bake immediately or cover and refrigerate overnight to bake the next day.)

Bake, covered with foil, at 350°F for 20 minutes. Uncover and bake another 20 minutes, or until warmed through and golden brown.
