

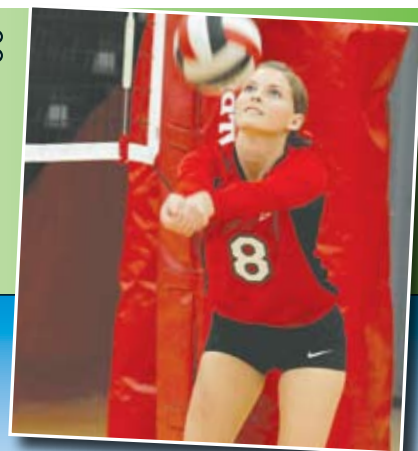

# Arms and Legs are Not a Luxury

**SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG)** - Did I get your attention? If you're reading this article in your community newspaper, you're probably turning the pages to view vital stories, features, and advertisements published to keep you informed of the happenings in your neighborhood. Now, imagine the frustration you would feel if you had no arms or hands to aid you in grasping the pages, the simplest of every day tasks. Imagine that you had an artificial limb to provide you physical freedom, give you self reliance and ability, but that it was propped up on the sofa a few feet away, unable to be utilized. It doesn't fit properly, and your medical insurance won't pay to have it repaired or adjusted because you've used up your allotted yearly or lifetime benefit. For the over two million people in the United States who have suffered the loss of one or more of their limbs, this situation is not unusual and is a harsh reminder that things are just not what they seem within President Obama's Affordable Healthcare Act. In California, it's been given the catchy name Covered California.

The main goal of the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare), signed into law in 2010, was to make health insurance not only affordable but comprehensive for everyone. Federal law contains a set of 10 "essential health benefits" providers must guarantee consumers of individual, small business insurance policies, and government sponsored programs (Medi-Cal). The White House has said repeatedly that these Obamacare guarantees "eliminate substandard policies that don't provide minimum services." States were allowed to craft their own set of essential health benefits, and California even came up with several additional benefits that range from organ transplants for HIV sufferers to Phenylketonuria treatment. Although a minimal allowance for prosthesis is available under the Rehabilitative and Habilitative portion of California's declared essential benefits, there doesn't appear to be an equitable provision for the replacement, repair, and maintenance

## No Tricks, Just Treats at Sunrise Rehabilitation Project Ribbon Cutting

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Candy and a custom-carved pumpkin will add a holiday twist to the Sunrise Boulevard Rehabilitation Project ribbon cutting ceremony on Tuesday, October 28th, at 11 a.m. at 2310 Sunrise Boulevard (west side of I Love Teriyaki). The program will celebrate the completion of the City of Rancho Cordova's part in the Sunrise Boulevard Project.

The \$2.2 million project was completed ahead of schedule on Sunrise Boulevard from Zinfandel Drive to Trinity River Drive. The project included an overlay of rubberized asphalt pavement, ADA upgrades to curb returns, and upgrades to stormwater issues.

"The rehabilitation project not only increased accessibility and safety on busy Sunrise Boulevard but it also added beautification that complements new development in adjacent shopping centers," said Rancho Cordova Mayor Dan Skoglund.

The project is a cooperative partnership between the City of Rancho Cordova and Sacramento County. Sacramento County's part of the project is scheduled to begin in 2015.

## Groundbreaking Scheduled for Mather Veterans Village in Rancho Cordova

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The groundbreaking ceremony for the first phase of the Mather Veterans Village will take place at 10 a.m. on Thursday, October 30th. The building site, 3611 Bleckely Street in Rancho Cordova, is adjacent to the Sacramento Veterans Administration Medical Center at the former Mather Air Force Base.

A special part of the program will be the testimony of James Jacobs, a resident of El Monte Veterans Village in Southern California. VFW Post 10125 in Rancho Cordova will perform the flag ceremony and Doug Shoemaker, President of Mercy Housing California, will be master of ceremonies.

Located on a 3.65 acre site, Mather Veterans Village will provide much needed housing options and supportive

services for local veterans in an ideal location. Phase 1 will consist of building 44 one-bedroom and six two-bedroom permanent supportive homes for disabled and homeless veterans. The existing building, which was constructed on the site in 1952, will be renovated and adapted to provide offices and meeting space. Phases 2 and 3 will include transitional housing and additional

permanent supportive homes.

Construction will begin in December and the first residents are expected to move in by April 2016.

Mather Veterans Village is the result of years of collaboration between Mercy Housing California and Veterans Resource Centers of America, the City of Rancho Cordova, Sacramento County, Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency,

and the Sacramento Veterans Administration Medical Center/VA Northern California Health Care System.

"Rancho Cordova is delighted to have played a role in this project that will bring a wide range of support services for area veterans, including housing, health care, substance abuse counseling, assistance in applying for VA benefits, and employment services," said Rancho

Cordova Vice Mayor Robert McGarvey. "I invite residents and businesses to join in the groundbreaking festivities."

# Two Arrests Made in Homicide on Ambassador Drive

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento Sheriff's Homicide Detectives have made two arrests in a shooting that resulted in the death of a 25-year-old male within the 10700 block of Ambassador Drive in Rancho Cordova on the night of October 18th.

Kavon William Cry, 18, and Omar Lee Talley, 19, were apprehended and booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail for a charge of murder, resulting from the incident.

Homicide Detectives believe the suspects were not known to the victim when they encountered each other on Ambassador Drive at approximately 10:45 p.m. on October 18th.

Detectives believe there is still one outstanding suspect in this case and encourage anyone with any information regarding his identity or whereabouts to contact the Sheriff's Department at (916) 874-5115 or Crime Alert at (916) 443-HELP. 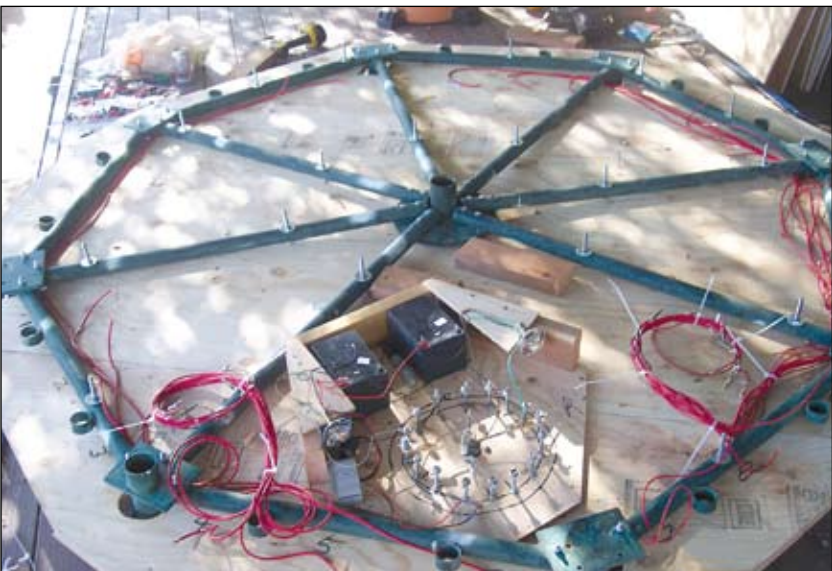

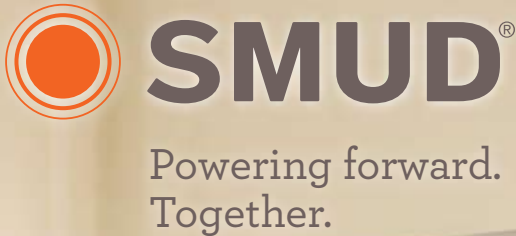

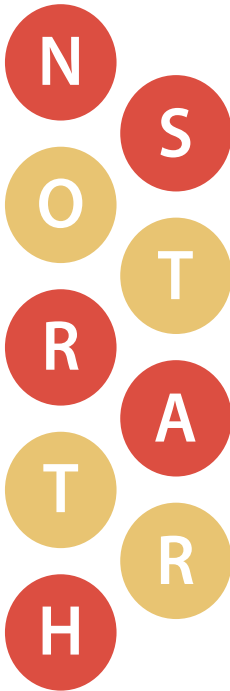

“I could not go to school in my own hometown ... I grew up in Dewey, OK, a town of 2,600 people, but had to go to school in Bartlesville, OK, five miles away, because that is where the black kids went.” These words, conveyed to me by Mr. Vernon Baker, a World War II veteran, speak of the experience of many African Americans who grew up under segregation in the United States.

At the age of 17, Mr. Baker tried to join the U.S. Air Force, but was turned away: “We were told we were not smart enough because we were black.” Mr. Baker eventually settled in the Army and became a member of the 397th Quartermaster Unit, a Unit that served in Southeast Asia and places like Guadalcanal and Bougainville. Mr. Baker transported supplies to the frontline combat troops and worked with graves registration (now called Army Mortuary Affairs). “I served wherever I was needed,” Baker said.

There was a well-known writer during World War II named Ernie Pyle who wrote about our servicemen from the standpoint of the everyday soldier and what he or she was doing to serve in

fighting the war. Pyle’s book, Story of G.I. Joe, was about the infantry soldier and what he endured at the front lines: constant fear, inclement weather, shortages of supplies, and the re-reading of letters that had become so familiar to the soldier that reading them over and over provided a lifeline to home.

Mr. Baker was this kind of soldier. Performing his assigned task in working with graves registration, Mr. Baker faced those fears of being on the front lines while removing a dead comrade from the battlefield so they could have an honorable burial and so that the soldier’s personal effects were sent to the next of kin. According to the U.S. Army Quartermaster’s Foundation website, [www.qmfound.com](http://www.qmfound.com), the role of graves registration had its beginning in the 1800s and has evolved over the years into a highly sophisticated branch of the military service.

Mr. Baker, who attained the rank of corporal, did his basic training in Vancouver, WA, and was assigned to various assignments at Fort Sill in Lawton,

OK. He concluded his service to the United States Army at Fort Leavenworth, KS, with the rank of corporal. Upon leaving his military service, Mr. Baker moved to California where, in 1948, he joined a buddy on a blind date and met the love of his life, his wife Golia. They have lived in the Sacramento area all these years.

It is important that we do not forget those individuals who go off to war to protect our freedoms here at home. The men and women I have spoken with who served in World War II dismiss the idea that they are “the greatest generation;” Mr. Baker and his fellow servicemen and women were simply doing what they felt was the right thing to do: protect their country by joining the Armed Forces, leaving home, and serving wherever they were needed, domestically or in Germany, France, or Japan. Regardless of rank or recognition, these people are heroes who have a significant place in our history.

Thank you, Mr. Baker, for your service to our great country! ★

## California Department of Public Health Establishes Ebola Hotline

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has established an Ebola hotline call center to respond to public inquiries related to Ebola, announced Dr. Ron Chapman, CDPH director and state health officer.

“This hotline has been set up and staffed to answer questions from those concerned about the possibility of Ebola in California,” said Chapman. “Our goal is to be available to eliminate the mystery of this disease and offer the facts to Californians as the situation evolves. This is one in a series of steps we have taken in the last few months.”

The hotline, (855) 421-5921 will be in operation from 8 a.m.–5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

There are currently no confirmed cases of Ebola in California and no suspect cases.

Since the Ebola outbreak began in Guinea, Liberia, and Sierra Leone, CDPH has worked with state, federal, and local health officials to prepare for potential cases of Ebola in California. In August, CDPH launched an informational website compiling information about the outbreak and preparing California health care providers

with guidance and protocols from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). CDPH has developed an interim case report form for reporting suspected cases of Ebola to CDPH and has distributed CDC guidance on specimen collection, transport, testing, and submission for patients suspected of having Ebola.

Last week, CDPH posted interim guidelines for Ebola medical waste management and recommended that all health care facility environmental services personnel and infection control staff work together to develop facility-specific protocols for safe handling of Ebola related medical waste. CDPH has provided these and other documents to health care providers and partners via the California Health Alert Network (CAHAN).

In September, CDPH convened more 1,100 health care and public health workers to urge them to assess their Ebola readiness and conduct drills in their facilities. Last week, CDPH officials held a teleconference with health care providers to discuss the latest news and guidance about handling suspected Ebola cases. CDPH is providing weekly updates to local health officials,

first responders, and health care providers as the Ebola outbreak continues in Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Guinea. CDPH joins with a team of state departments and agencies including California Health and Human Services Agency (CHHS), the Governor’s Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) and the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR), to address all aspects of preparedness for a potential Ebola case in California.

CDPH is also available to provide consultation about suspected Ebola cases to local health departments and health care providers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

# Arms and Legs are Not a Luxury

of artificial limbs.

According to the healthcare cost and utilization project state in-patient database, California leads the country in hospital amputations performed: 14,800 in 2012. Due to this staggering number of new surgeries, California insurance carriers realize providing prosthesis coverage for an amputee who has suffered the trauma of losing a limb is vital. But when there are financial caps put on the lifelong process of actually being able to use the device, it can be devastating. Losing a limb is obviously a permanent occurrence.

During the lifetime of an amputee, the physiology of their severed limb changes due to many different reasons. Since a prosthesis is individually made in the initial stages of loss, any variance in weight, shrinkage of a stump, infection, etc. can cause the device to become ill fitting and useless. Multiple trips to the prosthetist (limb maker) are necessary to correct the problem. Sometimes it even requires more than one artificial limb be crafted within the same year. Because there are financial caps and special rules associated with this ongoing treatment by insurance companies, the likelihood of a complete restoration, repair, or replacement is diminished and an otherwise vibrant, self sufficient member of society is reduced to becoming a slave to their disability, and in some cases, an invalid requiring constant assistance; a costly insurance benefit which IS offered under most California insurance plans. To better understand the demoralizing and hopeless lifelong ramifications that can result from state controlled insurance exchanges placing financial caps, and thoughtless rules on the needs of people who have lost limbs, we can look at New York's lifetime cap.

If an individual suffers the loss of two limbs and requires prosthetics, under the "one limb per lifetime" rule, that person may have to make a choice as to which limb he or she wants to replace with an artificial device. In the event both legs or both arms are amputated, does the patient choose the right or the left, since only one may be paid for? Many children fall victims of accident or illness that result in the loss of a limb. At their young age, they will receive an artificial arm or leg. However, as they grow, the device doesn't grow with them, rendering them in need of additional artificial limbs throughout their life to continue on a path of independence and normalcy. This rule and the practice of "capping," no matter what the level in any state, is cruel and in the long run, due to secondary complications, has the potential to carry excessive expense above what the initial cost would be.



California passed a law in 1986 (10123.7 CA Insurance Commissioner) recognizing that prosthetic limbs need to be covered by private insurance. In 2007, the wording was amended to proclaim that coverage must be "adequate." Unfortunately, it does not stipulate that insurance companies must cover prosthetic devices and ongoing care. According to the Amputee Coalition, this has created a situation where some plans (including many California Kaiser Plans) provide minimal or no coverage for prosthetic devices. By enacting the Insurance Fairness Amputee Act through government legislation, the needs of limbless individuals would be treated as other basic essential care items, guaranteeing amputees receive the attention they deserve at a reasonable cost.

Even with ongoing federal health reform, the Department of Health and Human Services bulletin released earlier this year indicated that prosthetic coverage was included with physician and specific office visits and surgery among other classifications. In simple terms, receiving an artificial limb and the necessary ongoing care that will assure it's useful is put in the same category as going to the doctor when you have the flu or having an appendix removed. This means the same percentage of co-payments and financial caps would come into play. Since an artificial limb can cost between \$5,000 and \$50,000 depending on the type and mobility requirements, the out of pocket expense to an amputee can be prohibitive under this interpretation.

According to the Covered California information

office based in Sacramento, under the Covered California guidelines, the amount of "adequate coverage" provided by private insurance and government health care guidelines is determined by the level of insurance coverage an individual purchases (bronze, silver, or gold plans). The least expensive plan would warrant the most out of pocket expense. In a study performed by the California Insurance Commissioner's office, it was determined that the overall cost to consumers to include comprehensive prosthetic coverage to Covered California's Essential Benefits list would be 16 cents per month, or less than \$2.00 per year. In perspective, paying to insure an amputee can walk or have the use of their arms and hands would cost California insurance consumers less than purchasing 40 pieces of bubble gum within a year's time. It seems like a small price to pay to guarantee the growing population of those who have lost limbs, and future amputees, the right to experience the same life everyone else can. Let's remember that arms and legs are not a luxury. If limbless individuals are not given the opportunity to be independent by offering them the allowance they need, they will have no choice but to rely on other aspects of the medical insurance industry and government sponsored programs to compensate, creating an unnecessary taxpayer burden.

We as California constituents can do something to eliminate Covered California's unfair practice of placing financial caps on the needs of those who have suffered the loss of one or more limbs. The Amputee Coalition, a national organization committed to enriching the lives of America's amputees, has worked to raise awareness of this issue since the passage of the Affordable Healthcare Act (Obamacare) in 2010. They've provided public comments to Health and Human Services (HSS) and the Center for Medicare Services (CMS) as well as to state governors, legislators, and insurance commissioners, emphasizing the importance of including prosthetic and orthotic devices and vital continuing care in the mandated Essential Health Benefits. Four years later, there is little resolve



nationwide. The members of the coalition are working with federal legislators to provide a sign-on letter to members of Congress. The instrument requests that the HHS and CMS offices use the enforcement powers they were bestowed by the Affordable Healthcare Act to include necessary, on-going care to amputees. Join in to make a positive, worthwhile change to a growing population by contacting your elected officials and asking them to "do the right thing." After all, it's an election year in many districts, and politicians should be reminded that voters can't get out to the polls without legs, and they can't punch the ballot without arms and hands.

*Recent cases of interest*

**CASE: Jason Barton Kirkpatrick (10/10/14)**  
**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit**  
District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Jason Barton Kirkpatrick was convicted by jury of 10 counts of second-degree robbery.  
The charges stem from six separate robberies Kirkpatrick committed between May 28, 2013 and June 17, 2013. Kirkpatrick used a replica handgun to rob primarily female employees of small businesses. At the time of the 2013 robberies, he was on parole for a series of robberies he committed in 2006, where he also victimized female employees.  
Kirkpatrick faces a maximum potential sentence of 250 years to life plus 50 years in prison under Department 25 before the Honorable Robert Twiss.

**CASE: Jeremiah Ellington (10/10/14)**  
**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Courtney Martin, Misdemeanor Unit**  
District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Joseph Orr sentenced Matthew Shadle to District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Jeremiah Ellington was convicted by jury of one misdemeanor count of annoying or molesting a child.  
For several years, Ellington worked as an instructional aide at Bradshaw Christian School. Ellington participated in various school-related activities, including overnight retreats and a lunchtime discipleship group with male junior high students. In early June 2012, the grandmother of a student discovered a series of sexually inappropriate Facebook messages from Ellington to her 13-year-old grandson. In subsequent interviews with both school staff and law enforcement, Ellington confessed to having sexual thoughts about the students.  
Ellington faces a maximum potential sentence of 1 year in county jail and will be required to register as a sex offender. Sentencing is set for November 7, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 15 before the Honorable Kevin McCormick.

**CASE: David Allen Thompson (10/10/14)**  
**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit**  
District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Cheryl Chun Meegan sentenced David Allen Thompson to 390 years to life plus 65 years in prison. In July, a jury convicted Thompson of 14 counts of lewd acts with a minor with force involving multiple victims. Thompson was previously convicted in 1996 of a prior strike offense of armed robbery.  
In March 2007, Thompson sexually assaulted a female child family member. Despite his threats that he would kill her if she told anyone, the victim disclosed the abuse to a classmate the following day. She also disclosed that she witnessed Thompson sexually abusing another child under the age of 14 on several occasions.  
Soon after the allegations surfaced, both victims went to live with family out of state. Thompson traveled to one of the victim's home and picked the victim up from her school without the family's knowledge and fled the state. Thompson was stopped for speeding and was taken into custody. He later escaped and remained free for almost a year before his capture at a driver's license checkpoint in 2008. At the time, he possessed false identification and provided the arresting officer with a false name.  
At trial, both victims testified in the face of their abuser. One additional witness testified that when he was approximately 4 or 5 years old, Thompson took him into a chicken coop on more than one occasion and also forcibly molested him.

**CASE: Terry Glen Short (10/10/14)**  
**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Eric Kindall, Homicide Unit**  
District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Terry Glen Short was convicted by jury for the sexual assault and murder of a 13-year-old girl.  
In February 1996, the victim's body was discovered in Florin Creek Park in south Sacramento. She had been sexually assaulted and murdered. DNA evidence was analyzed by the District Attorney's Laboratory of Forensic Services, and Short was identified in 2011 through a DNA cold hit.  
Short faces a maximum potential sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for November 10, 2014 at 8:30 a.m. in Department 61 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - In Monday's Sierra Valley Conference home contest at Lancers Stadium, the Cordova High School boys soccer team posted an 8-1 victory over Union Mine.

In the first half, Cordova (3-3-1 in the SVC, 12-5-1 overall) punched in three goals for a 3-0 halftime lead. The visiting Diamondbacks scored their lone goal in the second half, but the Lancers produced five for the final score.

### Cordova 2, Galt 2

Playing on the road October 15th, the Lancers and Warriors scored a goal each in the first and second halves. "We

were able to make adjustments with (returning players back from injuries) us healthy again," said Cordova head coach Eric McCahon said. "I felt that gave us a pretty good advantage (in the game)."

Lancer forward Anthony Acosta scored both goals with teammate Alexis Vazques recording an assist on one of the goals. "Anthony got on the end of (the ball) and finished it (for the first goal)," McCahon said.

Cordova led 1-0 before Galt scored its first goal. Acosta registered his second goal to give the Lancers a 2-1 lead, but the Warriors responded with their second goal that led to a draw.

"Galt is a very tough team," said

McCahon of the Warriors, who are in first place in the SVC.

The conference is sending four teams into the Sac-Joaquin Section playoffs that begin next month.

"We would like to try to get into second place to possibly host a playoff game," said McCahon, as Cordova is in fourth place behind Rosemont, Liberty Ranch and Galt.

### Rosemont 2, Cordova 1

To close out the first half of conference play at the Wolverines' field on October 13th, Cordova's only goal in the game was from midfielder Alex Casal in the second half. "We came back early in the second half," McCahon said. "It was

a back and forth game."

To end the first half, Rosemont scored a goal for a 1-0 lead. The Wolverines scored their go-ahead goal midway through the second half. Cordova gets another shot at its rival when Rosemont plays at Lancers Stadium on Wednesday, October 29th.

"It's a good, healthy rivalry game," said McCahon of the Lancers and Wolverines, who have been playing each other in many sports since Rosemont opened its doors in the early 2000s.

Next Monday, Cordova will host Liberty Ranch before closing out the regular season against Rosemont. ★

OLE MISS HITS THE BAYOU

Undefeated Rebels will be tested by Les Miles’ improving LSU Tigers

OLE MISS AT LSU

Ole Miss is set to embark on the toughest two-game stretch of its season, with a trip to resurgent LSU followed up with a home date against Auburn. The Rebels will be in a great position — both in the SEC West and on the national scene — if they manage to win both games. LSU has won two straight to even its SEC record at 2–2 — but it’s a bit early to assume this edition of the Tigers is among the elite teams in the league. LSU’s wins have come against Florida (by three points) and at home against an improved-but-not-quite-ready-for-primetime Kentucky team. The Tigers still have issues at quarterback — Anthony Jennings is only 17-of-35 with 230 yards in the last two weeks — and you cannot be one-dimensional against the Ole Miss defense. The Rebels lead the nation in scoring defense (10.6 ppg, seven touchdowns allowed in seven games) and rank third nationally by allowing only 4.2 yards per play. *Ole Miss by 7*

USC AT UTAH

There have been some painful losses in college football this season, none more so than when Utah blew leads of 21–0 in the first quarter and 27–14 in the fourth quarter en route to a 28–27 defeat at home to Washington State. Had the Utes won that game, they would 3–0 in the Pac-12 and alone in first place in the South Division. (We should also point out that Utah’s two league wins came by two points and in double-overtime.) One of the keys to Utah’s surprising early season run has been the emergence of Devontae Booker at tailback. The junior college transfer is averaging 187.7 rushing yards against Pac-12 opponents. USC has excelled against the run — with the exception of the bizarre game at Boston College in which the Trojans gave up 452 rushing yards in a 37–31 loss. In all other games, they have allowed only 103.8 yards, including 58 to Oregon State, 31 to Arizona State and 77 to Arizona. USC’s chances of winning this game are great if it can limit Booker to 100 yards or fewer. *Utah by 3*

MISSISSIPPI STATE AT KENTUCKY

This game looked a lot more appealing a few weeks ago — maybe that’s why CBS tabbed it as the No. 1 game in the SEC — but has lost a bit of its intrigue after Kentucky’s 41–3 loss at LSU on Saturday night. Still, it’s a big game in Lexington, where the locals will be eager to see the Wildcats tangle with the No. 1 team in the nation. Kentucky is 5–0 at home against a soft schedule — South Carolina is by far the best team the Cats have played at Commonwealth Stadium — and could have a hard time finding that sixth win against a backloaded schedule. Mississippi State has passed every test in what has been a magical season to date. This could be a tricky spot, however; Mississippi State has been surprisingly vulnerable on defense — the Bulldogs rank 10th in the SEC, allowing 5.4 yards per play — and Kentucky has some quality playmakers on the offensive side of the ball. *Mississippi State by 7*

OHIO STATE AT PENN STATE

The trajectory of the Penn State program is headed in the right direction, but there have been some growing pains in James Franklin’s first season in Happy Valley. The Nittany Lions have lost two straight games, both in league play, and have looked

bad doing so. The offense has averaged only 240.0 yards per game and 3.5 yards per play over the last two weeks. Scoring points has not been an issue at Ohio State, where the Buckeyes have averaged 56.0 points in the four games (all wins) since the home loss against Virginia Tech. Quarterback J.T. Barrett, who threw three picks against the Hokies, has made tremendous progress during his redshirt freshman season. In the last three games, he has completed 70 percent of his passes, averaged 286.0 yards passing, 85.6 yards rushing and has thrown 11 touchdowns and no interceptions. At this point, either Barrett or Michigan State’s Connor Cook — not Penn State’s Christian Hackenberg — would be the first-team All-Big Ten quarterback. *Ohio State by 20*

WEST VIRGINIA AT OKLAHOMA STATE

Not many people expected these two teams to be 3–1 in the Big 12 at this point of the season. Oklahoma State feasted on an easy early schedule — the Cowboys’ three victims have a combined one Big 12 win — before losing badly (42–9) at TCU last Saturday. The Pokes managed only 258 yards of offense, their fewest since gaining only 109 in a 27–0 loss to Oklahoma in 2009. West Virginia has emerged as a darkhorse contender in the league after its upset win over Baylor on Saturday. The Mountaineers have already played Oklahoma (which has two losses) and Baylor (which they beat), and they get both TCU and Kansas State at home. It would be a stretch to label WVU as a favorite, but Dana Holgorsen’s team should not be ruled out. *West Virginia by 3*

PRIME TIME PLAYERS

**Trevone Boykin** and TCU bounced back from last week’s devastating loss at Baylor in fine fashion, rolling past Oklahoma State 42–9 in Fort Worth. Boykin led the way by completing 26-of-39 attempts for 410 yards and three touchdowns. ... UCLA won at Memorial Stadium in Berkeley for the first time since 1998 — but it wasn’t easy. **Brett Hundley**, a junior quarterback, accounted for 424 yards of total offense (330 passing and 94 rushing) and three touchdowns to help the Bruins edge California 36–34. ... Utah’s **Devontae Booker** continued his push for first-team All-Pac-12 honors, rushing for 229 yards and three touchdowns in Utah’s 29–23, double-overtime win at Oregon State on Thursday night. A junior college transfer from Sacramento, Booker has rushed for 563 yards (on a

6.3-yard average) in the last three games for the 5–1 Utes. ... **Kevin White** has been remarkably consistent for surging West Virginia. The senior wide receiver caught eight passes for 132 yards and two TDs in the Mountaineers’ 41–27 win over Baylor. White has at least 100 yards receiving in all seven games. ... **J.T. Barrett** was outstanding in Ohio State’s 56–17 win over Big Ten newcomer Rutgers. The red-shirt freshman accumulated 367 total yards of offense and accounted for five touchdowns as the Buckeyes won their fourth straight game. ... **DeVante Parker** caught nine passes for 132 yards in his first game of the season to help Louisville beat NC State 30–18. Parker missed the first seven games with a foot injury. ... USC quarterback **Cody Kessler** set a single-game school record by throwing seven touchdown passes as the Trojans beat Colorado 56–28 at the L.A. Coliseum.

Marquise Williams, QB  
North Carolina

North Carolina has been a bit of a disappointment in 2014, but the Tar Heels are getting solid play from quarterback Marquise Williams. On Saturday, the junior threw for 390 yards and four touchdowns and added 73 yards and a score on the ground to lead the Tar Heels to a 48–43 win over Georgia Tech. In the last two weeks — the win over Tech and a 50–43 loss at Notre Dame — Williams has thrown for 693 yards and six TDs and rushed for 205 yards and two scores.

STOCK REPORT

Minnesota is 3–0 in the Big Ten for the first time since 1990 after rallying to beat Purdue 39–38 in Minneapolis. The Golden Gophers are in sole possession of first place in the Big Ten West and already bowl-eligible with an overall record of 6–1. They travel to Illinois next weekend.

Oklahoma outgained Kansas State 533 to 385 but dropped a 31–30 decision at home to Kansas State due in large part to its inability to convert in the kicking game. Michael Hunnicutt missed two short field goals — including a 19-yarder with 3:53 remaining — and had an extra point blocked.

The SEC West has grabbed all of the headlines, but don’t dismiss Georgia as a possible SEC champ. The Bulldogs have seized control of the race in the East and are 2–0 — with convincing road wins at Missouri and Arkansas — since All-American Todd Gurley was suspended.

Gary Danielson of CBS said it best: “This is embarrassing. This is a proud program that played defense for years.” He was referring to Texas A&M, and he said it after the Aggies fell behind Alabama 45–0 in the first half of what ended up being a 59–0 loss in Tuscaloosa.
