Rancho Cordova Business to Business Event

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Thursday, August 21st, the City of Rancho Cordova hosted a well-attended Business to Community and Business to Business Expo at City Hall. The event has grown so much since last year that business booths filled the large expo space inside the building and overflowed to the back parking lot. People happily walked from booth to booth sampling food, networking, catching up with friends, and enjoying a late summer day in the good company of Rancho Cordova residents and business representatives. The local wild turkeys even made an appearance.

The Rancho Cordova Business Exchange is a business to community and business to business expo that brings together businesses from throughout the region. Food vendors, schools, community service businesses, and more were represented at the mixer, including Sugar Bake Cupcakes, SJVC Junior College, William Jessup University, Hannibal's Catering and Events, the Sacramento Children's Museum, and Costa Vid Fresh Mexican Grill.

One of the booths represented the Community Readers K-3 Literacy Project of the Folsom Unified School District, which is dedicated to giving local, underprivileged children a good start in school and in life by exposing them to reading at a young age. According to Community Outreach Coordinator Angela Griffin Ankhelyi, many children are not only exposed to little or no reading at home, but are exposed to a very limited vocabulary in general. By age two, low-income children are six months behind in language development compared to higher income children. By

Raley's Supermarket Settles Civil Environmental Case

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - District Attorney Jan Scully joins 25 other California district attorneys in announcing that West Sacramento-based Raley's supermarket was ordered to pay \$1,599,000 in civil penalties, costs and supplemental environmental projects, as part of the settlement of a civil enforcement prosecution, which includes a final judgment and permanent injunction. Raley's cooperated with the prosecution team throughout the investigation into their unlawful practices.

The judgment is the culmination of a civil enforcement lawsuit filed in San Joaquin County to stop the supermarket chain from unlawfully transporting and disposing of retail hazardous waste. The lawsuit claimed that more than 130 Raley's supermarket stores

improperly stored, handled, and disposed of hazardous waste and pharmaceutical waste products into company trash bins. Instead of being sent to authorized disposal sites, hazardous wastes and contaminated materials were being unlawfully transported to area landfills. Additionally, the lawsuit alleges that Raley's failed to take sufficient steps to preserve the confidentiality of their pharmacy customers' information.

As a result of the prosecution,

California Raley's supermarkets modified existing policies and have

adopted new policies and procedures designed to eliminate the disposal of retail hazardous waste products and pharmaceutical waste into store trash compactors for eventual disposal into local landfills not equipped to handle such wastes. Hazardous waste produced by California Raley's supermarkets through damage, spills, and returns is now being collected by

state-registered haulers, taken to proper disposal facilities, and properly documented and accounted for.

In addition, the settlement requires Raley's to dispose of or destroy all confidential customer medical information in a manner that preserves the confidentiality of the records.

In addition to devoting resources to California environmental compliance with regard to hazardous waste identification, classification, storage,

transportation, and disposal, Raley's has agreed to purchase five mobile freshwater purification systems to provide safe drinking water to local communities in California in times of emergency or other pressing need. The mobile freshwater purification systems will be located in Placer, El Dorado, Sonoma, Sacramento and Contra Costa counties, but will be available for use by other counties within the state. ★

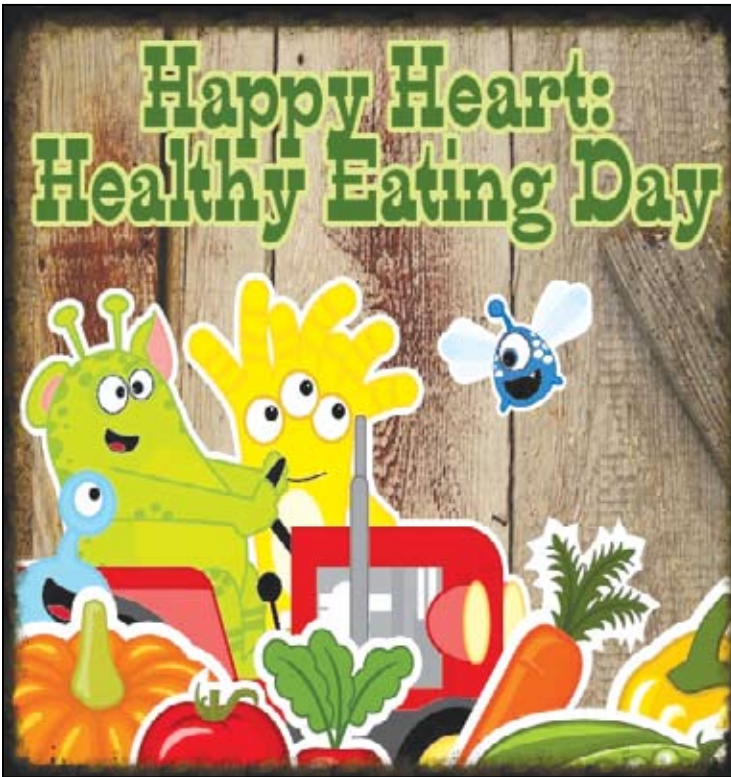

Most of the people who live in California live in cities. Many people feel more comfortable when they are part of a community and agree (most of the time) that they have rights to live by. As it says in our Declaration of Independence, “That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men; deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed.” There are four cities in California that I have talked about in the past – Wildomar, Menifee, Eastvale, and Jurupa Valley – that incorporated after Rancho Cordova incorporated. There are two pieces of legislation that I have been watching very closely and both have finally been approved by both houses of the State Legislature and sent to the Governor for his signature.

SB 69 will return the vehicle license fee revenue to those four cities. Jurupa Valley had 47% of its budget taken away one day after incorporation.

California Cities

That was when the State was taking revenue from as many sources as possible because it couldn’t balance its budget. AB 1521 will give cities, counties, and special districts the money they had begun receiving after they annexed property which had residents on it. At any rate on Friday of last week, SB 69 and AB 1521 were finally sent to the Governor’s desk for his signature.

I hope the Governor will be able to see the tremendous support these four cities received from both houses of the Legislature and that the Governor will remember the eight years he was Mayor of the City of Oakland. He knows first-hand that the elected public servants of our cities are the government officials who the people trust the most. It would be a shame if the Governor vetoes these bills. Please write, email, and call the Governor’s office and let them know that your city, The City of Rancho Cordova, is the best example of what the people can accomplish when given a chance.

This article is mainly focusing on legislation for local government and what we hope the State will pass on to the people. There are many other bills, of course, which other people

and organizations are for or are against – and that is only right. But cityhood can do so much to help its citizens. While there are a few cities that have given cities a black eye, all you have to do is to look our city and see what can be done for the good.

November 4th is Election Day this year. And it is everyone’s right and responsibility to vote. That will be mentioned again, but in a few weeks you will receive your sample ballot of who and what you will be deciding on. Don’t let the chance to vote go by without your voice being heard. Remember that one vote can make a difference. When you voted in 2012 for the three City Council Members for Rancho Cordova, David Sander received over 12,000 votes. Thank you for the more than 10,000 votes you gave me, but the other two candidates who received over 7,000 votes each, were initially separated by three votes. And after the recount, the final decision for the new Council Member was only eight votes. Yes, your vote definitely counts. ★

age five, they are more than two years behind in language development, and children who do not read well by the end of third grade are four times as likely to not graduate from high school on time.

Community Readers K-3 Literacy Project trains volunteers

No experience is necessary: training is provided, the mentoring sessions are 30 minute scripted programs twice a week for six weeks, and staff will always be present. If

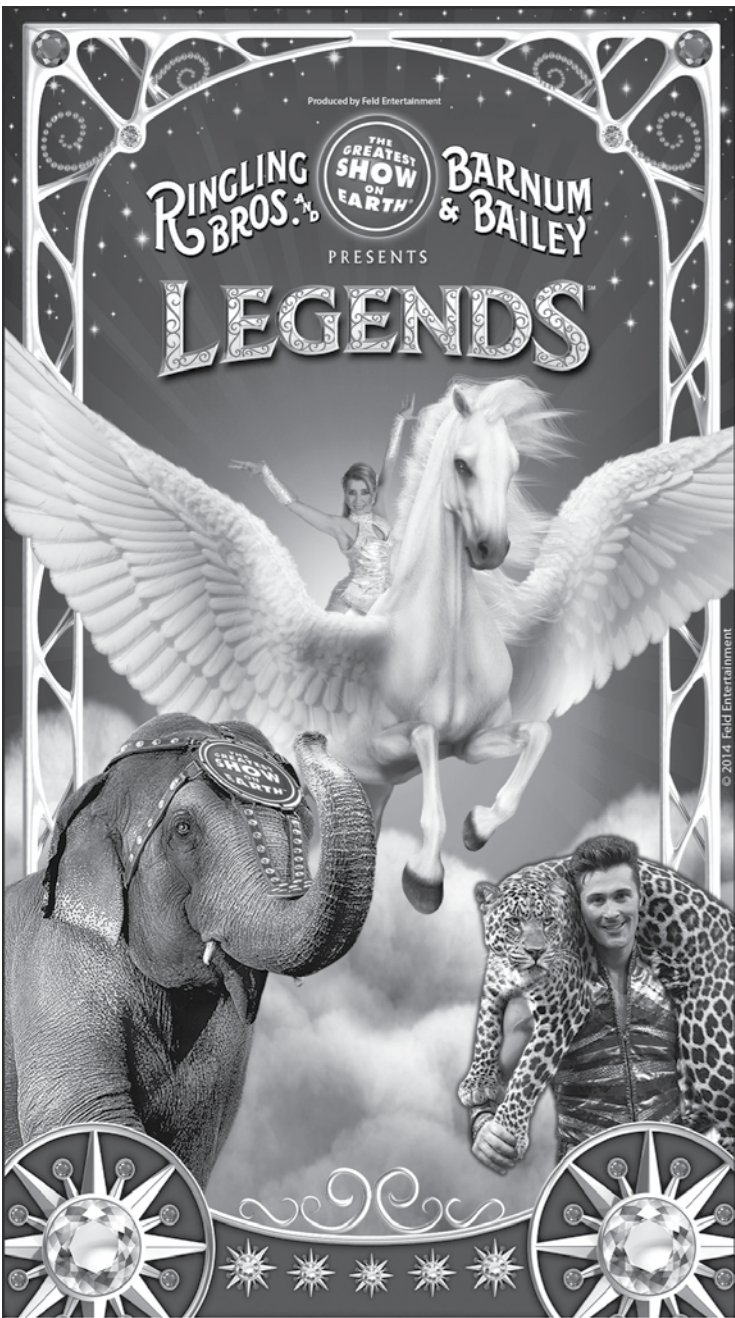

Positive Thinking

Does positive thinking really work? Have you tried it and been disappointed? Do you find your thoughts drifting to the negative even though you try to make them positive?

Positive thinking is extremely powerful. It is essential to goal achievement. Positive thinking begins the process of attracting the circumstances and people you need in order to get where you want to go. Positive thinking is a crucial component of problem solving.

If you haven't had great success with positive thinking, you are likely discouraged. Even if you may not have realized the results you had hoped for, what's the alternative? Negative thinking?

Although you may be skeptical about positive thinking, no one can claim negative thinking is preferable.

Since negative thinking will certainly exacerbate any problems, you have nothing to lose by thinking positively. Positive thinking has benefits without any negative side effects.

Negative thoughts are displaced with positive ones. Many people have far more negative thoughts than they realize. Start by monitoring what you think about. Supplant each negative thought with a positive one. For example, replace I can't with I can, it won't work with I'll find a way to pull it off, I don't know how with I'll find a way, and I don't want to fail with I'll be successful.

Changing your thoughts is a continuous process. Even the most positive people have negative thoughts. However, they catch themselves and immediately engage in positive replacement.

With practice, your positive thoughts will far outnumber any negative ones and the negative ones will be more readily displaced.

Although positive thinking is great, two additional components are required in order to realize its full, unlimited potential. Your positive thoughts must be accompanied by a positive plan and positive action. Your positive thoughts will facilitate plan formulation and motivate you to take action.

Your plan is the roadmap that delineates the steps required to attain your goal. A goal can be something you want to accomplish, a problem that needs to be solved, or an obstacle to be overcome.

A common pitfall is to make each step in your plan too large. It's hard getting started on a big step. Make sure you divide each big step into smaller, more manageable segments. By so doing, you reduce the likelihood of becoming overwhelmed.

If you have problems formulating a workable plan, tap into your positive thinking. Direct your mind to discover a workable plan. Leave you mind open to all possibilities. Be patient. An idea or inspiration can come at anytime,

from anywhere.

A plan is dynamic. It can be modified as needed at any time. You can add, change, or eliminate steps. Your positive thoughts keep your mind receptive to any alterations you'll need to make.

Once your plan is in place, you must take action. Without action nothing happens. Start with the first step in your plan. It doesn't matter how small the step might be, getting started is what's imperative. Procrastination is particularly debilitating when you want to get started. The longer you delay taking action, the longer it will take before you see results.

After the first step, take the next one. Continue taking action until your goal is accomplished. If you get side tracked, stumble, or suffer a setback, just get back on course. As long as you keep moving forward, you will ultimately be successful.

Begin with positive thoughts. Next create a positive plan. Then take action. Utilizing this combination strategy enables you to accomplish more than you previously thought possible.

Court Finds That Workforce of Fedex Ground Drivers Are Employees, Not Independent Contractors

Could Be Liable for Hundreds of Millions of Dollars in Drivers' Operating Expenses and Wages

Report from Full Court Press Communications

OAKLAND, CA - On August 27th the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeal ruled that a class of 2,300 individuals working for FedEx Ground was misclassified as independent contractors instead of employees. As a result, FedEx may owe its workforce of drivers hundreds of millions of dollars for illegally shifting to them the costs of such things as the FedEx branded trucks, FedEx branded uniforms, and FedEx scanners, as well as missed meal and rest period pay, overtime compensation, and penalties. The case, known as Alexander v. FedEx Ground, covers employees in California from 2000 - 2007. The ruling can be found on the Leonard Carder website at leonardcarder.com.

Judge Fletcher's majority opinion was very clear on the question of whether these workers are employees or independent contractors, stating "We hold that plaintiffs are employees as a matter of law under California's right-to-control test."

The court's decision is the most recent in a series of cases that have methodically proven that FedEx Ground's independent contractor model is built on the legal fiction that its drivers are in business for themselves. The Ninth Circuit decisively rejected that claim. The court's finding in Alexander that drivers in California are covered by California's workplace protection statutes not only impacts one of FedEx Ground's largest workforces but could influence the outcome in over two dozen cases nationwide in which FedEx Ground drivers are challenging the legality of their independent contractor classification. Millions of packages are delivered every day across the state under the control, direction, and supervision of FedEx Ground.

In addition, many trucking companies have been operating under a similar model in which they classify their drivers as independent contractors.

"FedEx Ground built its business on the backs of individuals it labelled as independent contractors, promising them the entrepreneurial American Dream," said Leonard Carder Attorney Beth A. Ross who is a national leader on cases covering the exploitation of workers by mischaracterizing them as independent contractors. "However, as Judge Trott said in his concurring opinion, not all that glitters is gold."

FedEx now requires its so-called contractors in California to hire a secondary workforce of FedEx drivers, who do the same work as the plaintiffs under the same contract. The Alexander decision calls into question FedEx's strategy of making plaintiffs the middle men between the secondary workforce of drivers and FedEx.

"We have heard of many instances where the secondary drivers are earning such low wages that they have to rely on public assistance to make ends meet," said Ross.

Background on the everyday experience for FedEx Ground drivers includes:

- FedEx Ground drivers were required to pay out of pocket for everything from the FedEx Ground branded trucks they drove (painted with the FedEx Ground logo) to fuel, various forms of insurance, tires, oil changes, maintenance, etc. as well as their uniforms, scanners and even workers compensation coverage.
- In some cases workers were required to pay the wages of employees who FedEx Ground required them to hire to cover for them if they were sick or needed a vacation, to help out

during the Christmas rush, and in some cases to drive other FedEx Ground trucks.

- After paying these expenses, a typical FedEx driver makes less than employee drivers at FedEx Ground's competitors like UPS, and receives none of the employee benefits, like health care, workers compensation, paid sick leave and vacation, and retirement.

- In addition, their employment was subject to the whims of FedEx management and FedEx Ground's decisions on staffing and routes left the employee drivers stuck with expensive long-term truck leases on FedEx branded trucks.

The drivers' attorney Beth Ross added, "Nationally, thousands of FedEx Ground drivers must pay for the privilege of working for FedEx 55 hours a week, 52 weeks a year. Today, these workers were granted rights and benefits entitled to employees under California law. To be clear, the Ninth Circuit exposed FedEx Ground's independent contractor model as unlawful."

Among the noteworthy elements to emerge from the litigation, FedEx Ground's practices take advantage of workers and are anti-competitive. FedEx Ground's so-called "contractors" do the same work as UPS and U.S. Postal Service drivers for substantially less pay and without benefits. This plays out in two distinct ways. FedEx Ground saves money and harms drivers and the public by avoiding employment taxes and workers' compensation insurance, and complying with all other workplace protections.

Ross added, "This ruling will have seismic impact on this industry and the lives of FedEx Ground drivers in California." ★

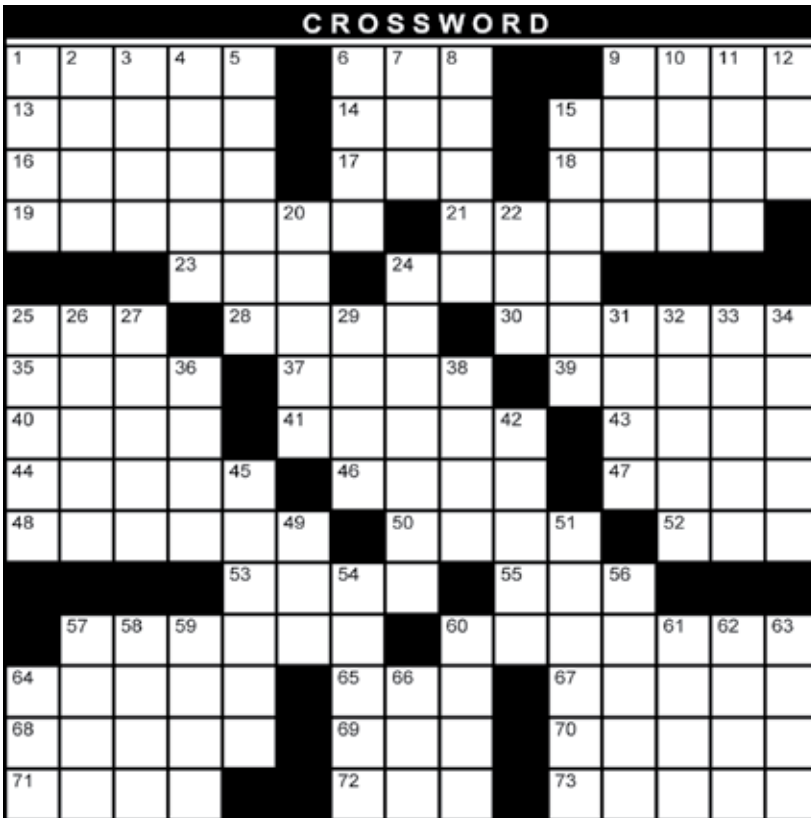

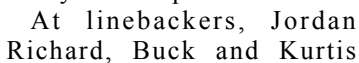

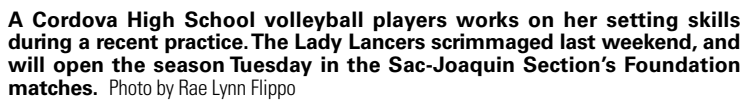

Best Trades in Each NL Franchise's History

Over the years, Hall of Famers and All-Stars have been acquired via trade, and often times for very little in return. Some of these trades were made to stave off impending free agency, to dump salaries, or just misjudgment on the part of front offices. Here are the best deals in the history of National League franchises. The AL will come next week.

Atlanta
John Smoltz for Doyle Alexander (Detroit, 8/12/87)
Smoltzie won 210 games for the Braves and saved another 154. The Braves were interested in building for the 1990s, and the 36-year-old Alexander was not in their plans. The trade also worked out for Detroit in the short term as Alexander was 9-0 in 11 starts with a 1.53 ERA helping the Tigers to the AL East title. But Detroit searched for an ace throughout the 1990s.

Arizona
Luis Gonzalez for Karim Garcia (Detroit, 12/28/98)
Gonzo was a five-time All-Star in his eight seasons in Phoenix and is the franchise's all-time leader in just about every offensive category. Garcia hit .236 in 104 games for Detroit.

Chicago
Ryne Sandberg and Larry Bowa for Ivan de Jesus (Philadelphia, 1/27/82)
The Cubs received a Hall of Fame second baseman who was the NL MVP in 1984. De Jesus hit just .239 in three seasons in Philadelphia, but was a part of the 1983 NL champs.

Cincinnati
Joe Morgan, Cesar Geronimo, Denis Menke, Ed Armbrister and Jack Billingham for Tommy Helms, Lee May and Jimmy Stewart (Houston, 11/29/71)
Hall of Fame second baseman Morgan would have been enough, but Geronimo became a Gold Glove center fielder for the Big Red Machine and Billingham averaged 32 starts over six seasons with 87 wins. He made six postseason starts and was 2-0 with a 0.36 ERA in the World Series.

Colorado
Carlos Gonzalez, Huston Street and Greg Smith for Matt Holliday (Oakland, 11/10/08)
It chapped somewhat to lose Holliday, but he was determined to leave via free agency. Grabbing CarGo made it worthwhile for the Rockies.

Los Angeles
Carl Crawford, Josh Beckett, Adrian Gonzalez and Nick Punto for Ivan de Jesus, James Loney, Allen Webster, Rubby de la Rosa and Jerry Sands (Boston, 8/25/12)
This was clearly a financial move by the Red Sox to clean out some clubhouse trouble, and the Dodgers were able to take on three megacontracts.

Miami
Mike Lowell for Todd Noel, Mark Johnson and Ed Yarnall (NY Yankees, 2/1/99)
In six full seasons in Miami, Lowell averaged .273 with 22 bombs and 88 ribbies. He went .276-32-105 in the championship season of 2003.

Milwaukee
Ted Simmons, Rollie Fingers and Pete Vuckovich for David Green, Dave LaPoint, Sixto Lezcano and Lary Sorensen (St. Louis, 12/12/80)
No question that the Brewers would not have won the AL East in 1982

without Simmons, Fingers and Vuckovich. The Cardinals won three pennants in the 1980s without much help from any of those guys.

New York
Keith Hernandez for Neil Allen and Rick Ownbey (St. Louis, 6/15/83)
This was a tough trade to sell to St. Louis fans in 1983, and even more difficult to justify today. Hernandez was a key to the Mets' title in 1986 and division winner in 1988. In the first four and half years after the trade, Hernandez won five Gold Gloves, batted .306 and finished second, eighth and fourth in MVP balloting. Allen and Ownbey were hardly factors for the Redbirds.

Philadelphia
Steve Carlton for Rick Wise (St. Louis, 2/25/72)
Lefty won 20 games for St. Louis in 1971, but was perceived to be a problem in contract discussions, so he was shipped to Philadelphia where he won 241 games and whiffed more than 3,000 in 15 seasons while capturing four Cy Young awards. He led the Phillies to five division titles and two World Series appearances, winning one. Wise won 16 games in each of his two seasons in St. Louis.

Pittsburgh
Andy Van Slyke, Mike Dunne and Mike Lavalliere for Tony Pena (St. Louis, 4/1/87)
Van Slyke and Lavalliere became two cornerstones of the Pirates' three division titles from 1990-92. Pena helped St. Louis to the 1987 World Series, but batted just .214 that season and .248 over three years in St. Louis.

San Diego
Trevor Hoffman, Andres Berumen and Jose Martinez for Rich Rodriguez and Gary Sheffield (Florida, 6/24/93)
Sheffield helped the Marlins to the 1997 World Series title, but played in just 150 games over his first two full seasons in Florida. Hoffman collected 552 saves for the Padres on his way to more than 600 for his career.

San Francisco
Christy Mathewson for Amos Rusie (Cincinnati, 12/15/1900)
This trade involved two Hall of Famers. Rusie was 29 at the time and had won 234 games for the Giants. He was 0-1 with a 8.59 ERA in three appearances with the Reds. Mathewson was a brash 20-year-old with no major league experience and proceeded to win 373 games for the Giants.

St. Louis
Lou Brock, Jack Spring and Paul Toth for Ernie Broglio, Doug Clemens and Bobby Shantz (Chicago Cubs, 6/15/64)
At the time, St. Louis fans lamented giving up ace Broglio. But Cardinals fans have been celebrating this deal since about, oh, Sept. 30, 1964, the first day the eventual '64 world champs were in first place all season.

Washington (Montreal)
Dennis Martinez and John Stefero for Rene Gonzales (Baltimore, 6/16/86)
Having compiled a 108-93 record in Baltimore, Martinez had fallen out of favor. He resurrected his career in Montreal, going 82-57 with a 2.81 ERA from 1987-92, making three All-Star teams.

- .514** On-base percentage in August for **Jon Jay** of the St. Louis Cardinals.
- .314** Batting average for Justin Morneau of Colorado and Ben Revere of Philadelphia, tied for first in the National League. The current mark would be the second-lowest for a NL batting title since 1900. Tony Gwynn won the 1988 batting title with a .313 average. The next-lowest is Terry Pendleton's .319 mark in 1991.
