# Interfaith Winter Shelter Effort Needs Host Sites

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - A local winter shelter effort for the homeless called Interfaith Revolving Winter Shelter, Rancho Cordova, is being planned and sponsored by Rancho Cordova churches to begin this winter. It is similar to one provided the past few years by Sacramento Steps Forward and Volunteers of America, aided by the Interfaith Council of Greater Sacramento.

The idea was conceived after a meeting held by Sacramento Self Help Housing last October led by Ken Bennett of that

organization. Karen Edwards of Sun River Church, and Inez Reyes of St. John Vianney Catholic Church were among those who attended. The idea was to form a local chapter of the group called PATH, People Assisting the Homeless, a family of agencies working together for that purpose.

Edwards and Reyes carried on from there, with the help of others, realizing that something needed to be done, and they would like to be part of it. Sun River Church offered space for meetings, which began in June of this year. The first meeting was attended by 22 individuals representing nine

churches as well as representatives from the City of Rancho Cordova, from the office of California State Assemblyman Ken Cooley, from Serve Sacramento, as well as Bennett from Sacramento Self Help Housing.

The shelter is patterned after one of the same name in Davis, and similar programs exist or are being planned in such towns as Elk Grove, Citrus Heights, and Roseville. The Rancho Cordova program would provide dinner, nighttime shelter, and light breakfast for eight weeks for around 25 people, with families given priority.

## FCUSD Teams to Add Collecting 1,000 Books to Triathlon

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Challenge Rancho Cordova Triathlon not only is attracting athletes, but it also inspired the 25 triathlon participants from the Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) to hold a book drive in conjunction with their running, biking, and swimming.

The FCUSD teams that are made up of school principals, teachers, district management, and support staff are placing collection bins for new or gently used children's books at the FCUSD Office at 1965 Birkmont Drive in Rancho Cordova and in the Rancho Cordova City Hall lobby at 2729 Prospect Park Drive.

"Many of our students are in need and don't own a single book of their own," said Angela Griffin Ankheiyi, FCUSD Community Outreach Coordinator. "Many of these same students struggle to read and are at risk. Our two goals are to finish the race and collect 1,000 books."

The book bins will be at the collection sites through Friday, October 3rd. The books that are collected will be donated to the FCUSD Community Readers program and distributed to students in need.

The triathlon will include a family fun run, race expo, and welcome reception on Saturday, October 4th. On Sunday, October 5th, the triathlon will include a 1.2 mile swim at Nimbus Lake, 56 mile bike ride, and 13.1 mile run that will end at Capital Village in the center of Rancho Cordova. Registration is open to individuals or teams at challenge-rancho-cordova.com.

# Metro Fire Selects Mark Wells New Chief

**MATHER, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (Metro Fire) Board of Directors announced on September 6th their selection of Deputy Chief Mark Wells to be the next Fire Chief. The announcement was made during a special meeting of the Board.

"The Board of Directors is very excited to work with Chief Wells to lead Metro Fire into the future," stated Board President Randy Orzalli. "We are confident that Chief Wells' vision, experience and expertise will ensure Metro Fire remains amongst the most progressive and innovative in the state. Continued strong leadership from the Fire Chief is critical, as we seek to deliver the best possible public safety service within our limited resources."

Last month, Fire Chief Kurt Henke announced his plans to retire in October after 33 years in the fire service. Subsequent to Henke's announcement, the Metro Fire Board of Directors

approved a recommendation from its Executive Committee to conduct an internal search process among the ranks of Deputy Chief to select the next Fire Chief.

Chief Wells' fire service career started with the Citrus Heights Fire District in 1987. His career has progressed through the ranks of Firefighter, Captain, Battalion Chief, Assistant Chief, and he served as the Deputy Chief of Administration since 2011. During the course of his career, Chief Wells served in the Emergency Planning, Special

Operations Division as the coordinator for the Hazardous Materials Response Team and Technical Rescue Team. Chief Wells served with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), California Task Force 7, Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) Team with deployments as a Taskforce Leader, Safety Officer and Rescue Specialist. Additionally, Chief Wells served as the Metro Fire Terrorism Liaison Officer/Coordinator. Chief Wells has a Master's Degree in Security Affairs, Homeland Defense and Security

from the Naval Postgraduate School, in addition to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Health and Safety Studies from California State University, Sacramento and an Associate's Degree in Fire Technology from American River College. As the Deputy Chief of Administration, Chief Wells had oversight of the Human Resources Division, Finance Division and the Information Technology Division. ★

MATHER, CA (MPG) - Arriving at Mather Field by airplane and vintage jeep, ace pilot Clarence “Bud” Anderson was guest of honor at the California Capital Airshow last weekend.

The event saluted more than 100 WWII veteran attendees, whom Congressman Ami Bera called “the greatest nation’s greatest generation.” Among the hundreds of contemporary aircraft at Mather Field, prop-powered fighters from the European and Pacific theaters were soaring war birds. Over two

days, their fly-pasts and barrel rolls delighted 100,000 observers at Mather Airport.

Just three months after the 70th anniversary of D-Day, Colonel Bud Anderson (92) was a timely guest. During missions against the Luftwaffe, the Oakland-born pilot scored 30 aircraft “kills” and was hailed a “Triple Ace.” He remains one of the most highly-decorated officers in US Air Force history. Brigadier General Chuck Yeager once called Anderson “the best fighter pilot I ever saw.” By contrast with WWII aircraft displayed at the show, this year’s headliner was a 2005 US Air

Force F-22 Raptor. The aircraft’s capabilities include supersonic flight, the ability to take off vertically, and to stop mid-air.

Presented by Sacramento County, the show is among the largest of its kind in the United States. The ninth annual expo saluted 100 years of aviation history. The non-profit event donates proceeds to scholarships and educational programs for young people who aspire to careers in aviation, science, math and aerospace. SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA(MPG) - On September 11th, 2001, 343 FDNY Firefighters made the ultimate sacrifice at the World Trade Center. In remembrance, the Sacramento Area Firefighters honored all 343 during Sacramento’s 6th annual 9/11 Memorial Climb at 8 a.m. Thursday morning at the Renaissance Tower, 801 K Street.

The morning began with FDNY’s Lt. Ray McCormack sharing what September 11th

means to him. Firefighters then climbed 110 stories in full turnouts, as did our FDNY brothers. Each firefighter bore the name of a fallen brother, covering their own name on their turnouts. At the conclusion of the climb, the final bell rang as each name was placed on the 9/11 Memorial.

This was truly a solemn event, as we honored men who lost their lives.



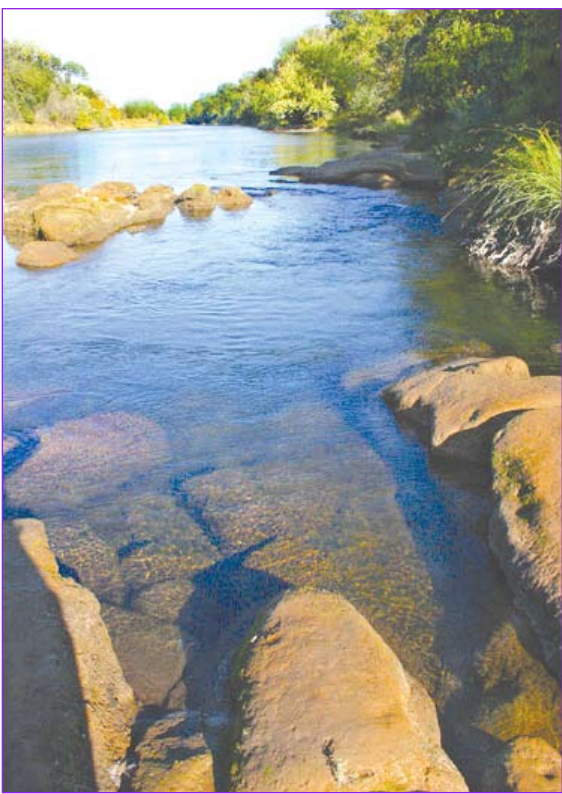
# Preserve the Parkway

# Interfaith Winter Shelter Effort Needs Host Sites

Volunteers from local congregations and the community are to staff the effort.

“I would love to have some volunteers that just are champions of the homeless,” Edward said. “If you are a champion of the homeless, are passionate about serving, this is a great volunteer opportunity.”

Procuring the actual host sites at local cooperating churches, however, is the first priority.

“Without the host sites we don’t have a winter shelter,” said Reyes, who is president of St. Vincent de Paul Conference at St. John Vianney. “The rest of the paperwork, the intake, logistics, we can handle. But the sites we’re really working on.”

At this time, three churches have volunteered sites for the winter shelter. Five more are needed to cover the desired eight weeks.

Edwards said that one of the reasons congregations may be slow to volunteer space is that the whole process might feel confusing to them. However, plenty of help will be available.

“We’ll train them, we’ll give

them ideas,” Edwards said. “We can hold their hand through the whole process so it’s not overwhelming.”

Besides the obvious goal of helping the homeless, another advantage will accrue as congregations of different churches work together for a common cause. It will make it easier to see where the resources are in our community, and who is providing them.

“Together we can have a more holistic approach to serving our community,” Reyes said. “And we can support them in connecting with the resources out there.”

Although health and human services is a Sacramento County responsibility, said Rancho Cordova City Councilman Donald Terry, there are likely to be ways in which the city can help.

“Ultimately this is an effort that was started by our residents and is going to be run by our faith-based community,” Terry said. “These are the kinds of things that get done in Rancho Cordova. They happen because our great citizens and residents want something to happen, and we as a city have learned very well how to

facilitate and be the catalyst for helping things happen.”

The leadership centers on Reyes for logistics of intake and paperwork, Edwards for volunteer training at the congregational level and for fundraising, and Larry Stafford of Cordova Community Council and Cordova Church of Christ for transportation, equipment, and storage.

The statement of Pastor Jimmy Hurd of the Cordova Church of Christ struck a chord with Reyes when he said, “We need to remember that these are not ‘them,’ these are not ‘homeless people.’ These are people like you and me, without homes.”

The next meeting of the Rancho Cordova Interfaith Rotating Winter Shelter will be held at 6:30 p.m., Thursday, Oct. 16th at Sun River Church, 11223 Trinity River Drive, Rancho Cordova. A former Rancho Cordova resident come into my office yesterday and talked about how nice it is to drive down our City streets. That is just one example of “what if we hadn’t voted to incorporate in November 2002.” What would our streets be like or street lights or the garbage pick-ups or our side-walks or our police or the hundreds of abandoned cars if we hadn’t incorporated? We could go on for quite a while with other things that after 11 years we no longer think about.

(1) Street conditions would be what they were before we started repairing and resurfacing our streets after incorporation. Most of you will remember what Coloma Road was like with its chuck holes and the promises we got that repairs were going to be made sometime in the future. On my way to work this morning, I could see the road work being done on Cordova Lane between Zinfandel Drive and Coloma Road, and I know there

are many people who are driving through the work being done on Sunrise Boulevard between Zinfandel Drive and Trinity River Drive.

(2) Streets are now the responsibility of the City and not the County any longer. We are replacing streetlights with new models that will save the City thousands of dollars every year because the new lights will use less electricity. If you see a streetlight out, call City Hall and you will be directed (by a real person) to the department that will take the information and do something about it.

(3) Before we incorporated, there was a Grapevine article about the County. In the article, the County was asked about the sidewalks that needed to be repaired and they answered that it would normally take 15 to 20 years before the repairs could be done. The City has been able to do the work in areas that were dangerous to pedestrians and on walkways in immediate need of repair. In addition, sidewalks have been put in areas where none had existed. And while not all the work we want to do has been completed, we have



been able to take care of most of the 50 years of neglect that we inherited.

(4) After incorporation, one thing that was noticed immediately was the removal of over 600 abandoned vehicles that lined our main roadways and neighborhood streets. Some of the vehicles had tickets on them that were unreadable because the ink had completely faded away.

(5) Our police have been thanked by almost everyone in our City at some time or another because of the safety they brought to Rancho Cordova. Our first Mayor, Dave Roberts who retired as a Lieutenant from the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Department, said that at times before we became a city there was only one patrol car in all of Rancho Cordova.

# Runner Tells DMV to Stop Overcharging Tax

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - George Runner has called upon California’s Department of Motor Vehicles to stop overcharging California consumers when they pay tax on their vehicle purchases.

Runner said, “It’s outrageous that the State of California expects private citizens to do things right that government is doing wrong.”

In a letter to DMV Director Jean Shiimoto, Runner writes: “I find it difficult to understand why your agency would knowingly continue to mischarge taxpayers when the Board of Equalization

has developed an extremely accurate tool for determining tax rates at specific locations.”

The Board’s online tax rate lookup tool, launched in late 2013, enables taxpayers to find a sales tax rate for a specific address.

In his letter, Runner explains that DMV’s problem appears to stem from continued reliance on postal zip codes to determine tax rates. Since a single zip code can include areas with differing tax rates, zip codes are not a reliable way to determine tax.

Runner estimates that in his district alone more than 2.5

million Californians live in zip codes that have more than one tax rate.

Unlike most transactions, the tax rate for a vehicle sale is based on the location provided to DMV by the registered owner, not where the sale took place.

In response to Runner’s letter, DMV staff contacted Runner’s office indicating a desire to address Runner’s concerns but warning a solution could be years away.

Runner said, “I am happy to assist taxpayers overcharged by DMV in obtaining refunds, but they should not be overcharged

in the first place. I don’t want to hear excuses. I want to see change.”

Runner says he will be pursuing additional outreach to taxpayers in his district to alert them to the possibility that they are paying too much tax.

# Cleaning Up Messes Parsonage Style

Throughout the glorious years of our marriage, the Gracious Mistress of the Parsonage and Yours Truly has had few disagreements. I suppose I could count them all on my one hand, but I am not sure if it is my right hand or my left hand so I will just leave it at that.

I hear, of course, of many couples who do nothing but bicker and fight from morning till night. I have always wondered what the purpose of all that was and what it ever accomplished. I think there is a better way to live together.

There are several phrases I have memorized and used throughout the years of our marriage that has kept me in good standing.

“Yes, dear.” “You’re right, dear.” “I’ll do it right away, dear.”

I have found that if I include the word “dear,” with all of my responses it fares better for me.

Of course, I am the kind of person that does not have to be right all the time, which makes me the perfect husband. Admitting you are wrong, even if you do not think you are, is really not the end of the world. In fact, it may be the beginning of a bright new world.

I said “few disagreements,” and I need to explain what I meant by that.

The major disagreements that my wife and I have had throughout the years can be boiled down into one phrase, “It’s a mess.” Usually, actually all the time this phrase is being used, it is coming from the lips of my wife.

Our disagreement is in the definition of “mess.” She has one definition and I have another definition, and the twain shall never meet. Mark my words on that.

If you would come into our

home, you will discover that every room in the house is well organized and very neat. Well, not every room. The one room that does not come up to that criterion is the room in which I occupy. It is my space. My well-organized wife will walk by my room, pause, look in and say, “It’s a mess.”

It took me a long time to realize what she was talking about. If I would ever try to do that I would end up being so confused, they would have to admit me in some rehab facility to clean my mind out.

So, the thing that makes our marriage so blissful is that we have an agreement and that she does things her way and I do things my way. This has been the recipe for blissfulness in our marriage. I do not make her do it my way and she cannot make me do it her way. We both have brains, but they tick after a different tock.

# FCC TV Channel Auction Threatens Free TV in California Cities

**WASHINGTON, D.C.(MPG)** - As a result of the “Spectrum Act” of 2012, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) developed an auction to sell to smartphone operators the TV channels now used by many TV stations. While large market full power TV stations receive some of the proceeds from the auction of their channels, the small Low Power TV and TV translator stations which broadcast over the air to thousands of America’s small communities may have their channels taken from them and will receive no payment whatever. Many of them will go off the air forever as a result.

Because many small TV stations are nonprofit and all operate on shoestring budgets to bring educational programs, emergency broadcasts, news and entertainment to their communities, they

will go silent if they cannot afford the high cost of finding a new channel or a new location, forcing them to relinquish channels their viewers have watched for many years. Worse, this may cause loss of entire groups of rural stations. If the channel is in a daisy-chain translator system, entire networks of up to 20 or more towns can lose access to free antenna TV.

Service from a large city TV station 75 or more miles away may also disappear as most are delivered to viewers by one or more translator stations near the smaller cities. Thus, no over-the-air TV signal in rural areas can be considered safe. Jim McDonald, President of the National Translator Association, stated “Congressional offices, especially in rural districts, want to hear from viewers who are in danger of losing their TV

signals. Viewers who depend on TV in these areas should voice their support of rural over the air television.”

In California, some 800 small stations in widespread areas of the state are vulnerable to these changes. Contacting California’s U. S. Representatives Anna Eshoo, Henry Waxman, or Doris Matsui as well as Senators Dianne Feinstein and Barbara Boxer at their local or Washington offices to insist that the FCC respect rural California citizens in the TV channel auction process will help citizens’ voices be heard in this potential loss of free antenna TV.

# Sacramento County Back in the Black

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento County ended the 2013-14 Fiscal Year \$44 million in the black, recording its third consecutive year of financial improvement. The \$3.7 billion 2014-15 Adopted Budget will be presented to the Board of Supervisors September 9th.

In June during Budget Hearings, the Board prioritized key safety net services including emergency shelter operations, mental health services, homeless outreach and navigation, public health nursing, child abuse prevention, senior financial abuse investigation and prevention, and a myriad of other programs and services for the County’s most vulnerable residents.

Also, with last year’s numbers totaled, and projected revenues assessed, additional funds are being recommended for public safety services including the Sheriff’s Department, Probation, District Attorney, Code Enforcement, Regional Parks, and Animal Care and Regulation.

“Improving economic conditions and additional revenues combined with our fiscal

prudence and restraint will allow us to focus on priorities that serve and protect the public,” said Bradley J. Hudson, County Executive Officer. “Having the funds to finance key programs, increase reserves, and retire debt allow us to plan for stability and continuous improvement in the coming years.”

Critical County activities recommended for additional funds include \$5 million to the Sheriff’s budget, \$650,000 to the Probation Department and \$850,000 to the District Attorney’s Office will address shortfalls identified at June budget hearings; Repayment of \$12.9 million in internal borrowing; Additional Animal Care staff to improve call response and service; Additional staff and fire risk reduction programs in Regional Parks, including the American River Parkway; Community Development projects including enhanced road maintenance, street sweeping, and graffiti removal services, new Code Enforcement Officers and a Community Prosecutor to address problem properties, illegal dumping, and improve the

quality of life in unincorporated neighborhoods; and Additional reserves and contingency funds.

While services are being augmented, the budget acknowledges the fiscal challenges of future years that include increased debt service cost, negotiated salary and benefit obligations, deferred maintenance of County facilities, and \$48.4 million in internal borrowing that remains to be paid Hudson added. The increase in available funds is attributable to controlling costs and an uptick in various revenue sources.

# Supreme Court Asked to Block Sale of High Speed Rail Bonds

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association (HJTA) has petitioned the California Supreme Court to review the high speed rail bond validation case.

After radically changing the bullet train plan promised to voters who approved \$10 billion in bonds in 2008, the State asked the court to approve sale of the bonds anyway. HJTA responded on behalf of all Californians saying the rail plan no longer matches what was promised voters and the State’s request should

be denied. The trial court agreed and denied the State’s request for validation of the bond sale. The Court of Appeals has reversed this decision and HJTA is now asking for intervention by the Supreme Court.

The current plan for high speed rail is nearly twice as expensive as promised and the projected travel times and fares have nearly doubled.

“The state has broken faith with voters, said HJTA President Jon Coupal. “The current rail plan bears no resemblance to the

one put before voters in 2008,”

Similar conduct by a private entity could be prosecuted under California’s bait and switch law which states, in brief, that It is unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association, to make untrue or misleading statements as part of a plan or scheme with the intent not to sell property or services, at the price advertised,” added Coupal. ★

# Rancho Cordova Teen Earns Eagle Scout

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Chris Davis, 17, of Rancho Cordova has just attained his Eagle Scout rank in Capital City District, Boy Scouts of America Troop 325.

The Cordova High School senior said that for his Eagle project he and his volunteers fingerprinted 259 children for their parents’ records. The purpose was to assist the Rancho Cordova Police Department to educate parents about child safety and crime prevention, and provide means to identify children who are lost, kidnapped or found deceased. Chris consulted with then Rancho Cordova Chief of Police Doug Diamond, who helped him understand the requirements and resources needed for his project.

“Chris was able to put things together from there with little help from me,” Diamond said. The former Chief of Police currently holds the same position in West Jordan, Utah.

Chris said he has learned a lot through carrying out his project. “I’ve learned about dedicating time and also delegating,” Chris said, “making sure that you’re not doing everything, so you can get more done at once. It was a lot of responsibility.”

The path to Eagle Scout is not an easy one, requiring a progression through six levels, or “ledges” to the seventh and highest, which is Eagle. In addition, seven challenging requirements must be met. Chris said that it would have been extremely difficult to earn this rank on his own. His parents had been especially helpful.

“It took a lot of getting him places and making sure he had all the materials he needed,” said his mother, Kimberlie Davis. “And then encouraging him to stay focused to get it done, because

as they get more involved in outside activities, and their social life, and working, sometimes it’s difficult to stay focused on getting the Eagle done.”

Out of all Scouts in the United States, fewer than 4 percent reach the Eagle Scout rank, said Adam Laret, who conducted the Eagle Court of Honor and is one of Chris’s former Scout leaders.

“Getting an Eagle Scout is like a three-legged stool,” said Glen Davis, Chris’s father. “It’s the scoutmaster, it’s the boy, and it’s the parents. If one of them falls apart, it usually doesn’t happen, it topples. If you get all three of them together, it’s solid, it’s strong, and that’s what

happened.”

Each Scout troop is sponsored by a church, a school, or another community organization. Troop 325 is sponsored by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, of which Chris is a member.

“In The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints the scouting program is part of what the young men ages 12 to 18 take part in,” said Ryan Sawyer, one of Chris’s Scout leaders. “Chris is uncommonly bright; he is uniquely intelligent,” said Ryan. “As a person he’s a good young man who I could always count on to do the right thing.” ★

# Scam Alert: Local Schools Targeted

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - A business named Scholastic School Supply that first surfaced in Las Vegas, Nevada, is now hitting Sacramento area schools. According to an employee from a high school in Stockton, Calif., the school received a false invoice from Scholastic School Supply in the mail requesting payment in the amount of \$647.50. Knowing they do not do business with Scholastic, they tried calling the number on the invoice but got no answer. Recognizing the signs of a scam, the school did not send payment.

On September 9, 2014, in an email to BBB, a company with a similar name, Scholastic, Inc., issued the following statement:

Scholastic School Supply is not affiliated with Scholastic. It is a company that is illegally using Scholastic’s name and trademark. We only recently became aware of them, but our legal department has demanded that they cease and desist using Scholastic’s name and trademark, which they have agreed to do but have not done yet. In addition, we have been investigating this company and will continue to

do so, and if we determine that this company is allegedly violating any other laws, rules or regulations, we will take prompt appropriate action.

These types of offers have been a perennial problem, such that a law was created to curb these practices but fraudulent operators continue to bilk businesses, government agencies, non-profit organizations and churches. Title 39 of the United States Code, Section 3001, requires that these include a conspicuous disclaimer, in 30 point font, stating, in part, that it is a mere solicitation. BBB reviewed an invoice to a school and the legally required disclaimer was not present.

BBB serving Southern Nevada issued a warning for the scam just last week. As of September 5, 2014 they reported receiving 51 complaints from 22 different states. Schools that are receiving invoices from Scholastic School Supply are urged not to send payment and instead contact the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at http://www.ftc.gov/.

Tips to Avoid an Invoice Scam:

- Verify You Agreed and Owe. Prior to making payment for any product or service, be certain you used the businesses services. Verify the invoice information, addresses, phone numbers, and business names.
- Contact Your Local BBB. To get help and warn other potential victims contact BBB at bbb.org.
- Contact the US Postal Inspector. If you receive this or a similar offer in the mail at https://postalinspectors.uspis.gov/.

# Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

Prostate cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in men aside from skin cancer, and it is estimated one in seven men will develop this disease in their lifetime. Early prostate cancer usually has no symptoms, and studies suggest strong familial predisposition may be responsible for 5% to 10% of the disease cases. The survival rate approaches 100% when prostate cancer is diagnosed and treated early but drops to 28% when it spreads to the other parts of the body.

## Perez Guides Cordova Football to Win

**FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG)** - Unique Perez guided the Cordova High School football team to a 36-7 non-league victory over rival Bella Vista at the Broncos' field on Sept. 5th. The Lancers quarterback threw for two touchdowns and scored two more on the ground. He also rushed for 110 yards against the Broncos' defense. That helped Cordova (2-0) to a comfortable halftime lead. His first touchdown came in the first quarter on a 5-yard quarterback keeper. The Lancers were successful with the 2-point conversion when Perez hit Isaac Black for an 8-0 lead. Perez completed 19-of-24 passes for 258 yards against the Broncos' defense. And half of his yards went to Devin Baldwin, who caught five receptions for 163 yards, and two touchdowns.

"He executed and managed the game just flawlessly," said Cordova head coach Vance Mueller on Perez. Cordova scored its second touchdown on a run from Perez, also in the first quarter. But the 2-point conversion was stopped. However, the Lancers still led 14-0 going into the first quarter.

In the second quarter, the Lancers scored their third touchdown, with the 2-point conversion successful by Ventrell Dyson for a 22-0 halftime lead.

To start the third quarter, the Lancers' Brandon Buck increased the score to 30-0 on the first play from the line of scrimmage, on a 55-yard end around.

For a second consecutive week, the Lancers were successful on offense with a mixture of run and pass plays. "We had a really good mix," Mueller said.

"We played at a faster tempo. We played a real strong game. As a team, we played really well."

After Bella Vista scored its only touchdown in the third quarter that made the score 30-7, Cordova scored its final touchdown in the fourth quarter. Buck had five carries for 63 yards, and Aaron Pierce rushed nine times for 38 yards to guide the Lancers' ground game. Following Baldwin in receiving was Carlos Cuevas, who had five catches for 46 yards.

On defense, the Lancers limited the Broncos to an average of two yards per play on offense. The Lancers' Kurtis Simmons had eight tackles, including five solo, and Jordan Richard seven. Sam Nawalu and Buck had five each. Amos Semaia recorded a quarterback sack.

Today (Friday) Cordova continues non-league action with a home game against McClatchy. Kickoff is scheduled at 7 p.m. ★

# THE BIG DAWG

Todd Gurley leads Georgia into its key SEC East showdown at South Carolina

GEORGIA AT SOUTH CAROLINA

They've only played one game, but the Georgia Bulldogs have been one of the most impressive teams in the nation thus far. Led by arguably the deepest backfield in college football and a talented front seven on defense, Georgia has the look of a team that can compete for a spot in the College Football Playoff. The impending trip to South Carolina doesn't look as treacherous as it did in the pre-season — thanks to the Gamecocks' rough start to 2014 — but playing in Williams-Brice Stadium has been a nightmare in recent seasons for Mark Richt's club. Georgia has lost two straight in Columbia, including a 35-7 debacle two years ago when the Dawgs were 5-0 and ranked No. 5 in the nation. Todd Gurley, then a freshman, was held to 39 yards on 13 carries on that night. Don't expect that to happen again. *Georgia by 10*

WEST VIRGINIA AT MARYLAND

This underrated regional rivalry features two teams that are on the uptick. Maryland won at South Florida, 24-17, last weekend despite committing six turnovers. The Terps, loaded at the skill positions, are poised to surprise in their first season in the Big Ten. West Virginia was impressive in a Week 1 loss to Alabama and followed that with a 54-0 win over Towson. The Mountaineers had won seven straight in the series (over a seven-year stretch) before losing 37-0 in Baltimore last season. This year's game, on Maryland's campus in College Park, should be far more competitive. Both teams are solid at quarterback (though I'd give Maryland's C.J. Brown the edge over WVU's Clint Trickett) and feature quality running backs and wide receivers. Maryland has the advantage on defense. *Maryland by 4*

UCF AT MISSOURI

This game would have more meaning had Penn State not connected on a last-second field goal to beat UCF in Week 1. Still, the Knights are a solid team that should be even better in its second game now that they have settled on a quarterback. Pete DiNovo won the job in the preseason but was ineffective against Penn State. Justin Holman came off the bench and threw for 204 yards and a TD on only 14 attempts. UCF, however, will need to get its running game going

after struggling mightily in Week 1. Missouri very quietly posted a dominating 49-24 win on the road against a dangerous Toledo team. Maty Mauk, an Ohio native, threw for 325 yards and five touchdowns to lead an offense that piled up over 500 yards. I'm not sold on the Tigers defensively yet, but the offense has the weapons to thrive in 2014. *Missouri by 13*

PENN STATE AT RUTGERS

This game might not be too relevant on the national scene, but it's a huge game for both programs. Penn State, re-energized under first-year coach James Franklin, would love nothing more than to run Rutgers off of its home field in a state that is crucial to the Nittany Lions' recruiting efforts. Rutgers, on the hand, needs to protect its home turf — literally and figuratively — as it transitions to the Big Ten. There's an extra layer of intrigue with this game, as Ralph Friedgen, in his first season as Rutgers' offensive coordinator, will be facing his former protégé, Franklin, for the first time. Friedgen has made it clear that he doesn't have much of a relationship with the former "head coach-in-waiting" at Maryland. There will be serious drama in Central Jersey on Saturday. *Penn State by 7*

TENNESSEE AT OKLAHOMA

It's a bit early to make reservations to the SEC title game in Atlanta, but Tennessee continues to show signs that it's on the right path. Butch Jones' young team improved to 2-0 with a 34-19 win over Arkansas State, the second straight solid mid-major opponent the Vols have soundly defeated. Now, however, the real fun begins. Starting with this trip to Norman, Tennessee will play Oklahoma, Georgia, Florida, Ole Miss, Alabama and South Carolina over the next eight weeks. Oklahoma, picked by most prognosticators (including *Athlon Sports*) to play in the College Football Playoff, has done nothing through two weeks to suggest it was overrated in the preseason. The competition hasn't been too difficult (Louisiana Tech and Tulsa), but Trevor Knight has been very sharp at quarterback, and the Sooners have run the ball well despite the loss of five-star freshman Joe Mixon (year-long suspension). *Oklahoma by 17*

PRIME TIME PLAYERS

**James Conner** is off to a terrific start to his sophomore season at Pittsburgh. The 6-2, 250-pound running back rushed for 213 yards on 35 carries to lead the Panthers to a 30-20 win at Boston College on Friday night. In three games, Conner has 366 yards (on a 7.6-yard average) and five touchdowns. ... His

stats weren't quite as gaudy this time around, but BYU quarterback **Taysom Hill** enjoyed another big game in a Cougar win over Texas. The junior from Idaho threw for 181 yards and rushed for 99 yards and three touchdowns as BYU rolled past Texas 41-7 in Austin. ... **Nick Wilson**, a true freshman, rushed for 174 yards on 30 carries in Arizona's 26-23 win over upstart UTSA. Wilson has 278 yards in two colle-

giate games. ... Whether it's Robert Griffin III or Bryce Petty or **Seth Russell** playing quarterback, coach Art Briles' offense continues to pile up points. Russell completed 16-of-25 passes for 438 yards, five first-half TDs and zero INTs while subbing for the defending Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, Petty, during a 70-6 win over Northwestern State. ... **Ameer Abdullah**'s highlight-reel, 58-yard go-ahead

TD with 20 seconds left gave NU a 31-24 win over McNeese State — preserving the Huskers' all-time 11-0 record against FCS opponents. ... Kansas State QB **Jake Waters** threw for 229 yards and rushed for 138 yards and two scores to help the Wildcats rally past Iowa State, 32-28.

STOCK REPORT

Coach Steve Sarkisian has only coached two games since taking over at USC but already boasts a signature win — a thrilling 13-10 victory at Pac-12 rival Stanford. The Trojans, 2-0, lack depth but have elite front-line talent and look to be a legitimate contender in the Pac-12 South.

A high-profile week for the Big Ten got ugly in a hurry. Losses by Michigan State (46-27 at Oregon), Michigan (31-0 at Notre Dame), Ohio State (35-21 vs. Virginia Tech), Northwestern (23-15 vs. Northern Illinois) and Purdue (38-17 vs. Central Michigan) have damaged the league's credibility.

Frank Beamer could be poised for one more run at Virginia Tech. His Hokies recorded the program's biggest win in years, topping Ohio State 35-21 before a record crowd of 107,517 in Columbus. The Virginia Tech defense limited the Buckeyes to 327 yards and forced four turnovers.

Among big-money boosters in Austin, Charlie Strong was not the most popular pick to replace Mack Brown as coach at Texas. Well, don't bother to check Strong's approval rating among those big wigs following a disheartening 41-7 loss to BYU at Royal Texas Memorial Stadium.
