Water Rules Take Effect

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -The State Water Resources Control Board has implemented new water restrictions as of July 15th. Residents are prohibited from the following activities: Using water to wash down hard surfaces like driveways; Using a hose to wash a motor vehicle unless the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle; Watering outdoor landscapes that cause runoff to walkways, roadways, and adjacent properties; Using potable water to fill a fountain or decorative water feature unless the water is recirculated.

Sacramento County Water Agency Customers

To conserve water, Sacramento County Water Agency implemented water restrictions on August 1st that limit their customers in Rancho Cordova to specific watering days and times. For information on the new restrictions, visit www.waterresources.saccounty.net/scwa or call (916) 875-7246.

Assistance League of Sacramento Purchases Building



Assistance League of Sacramento, a local 46-year old nonprofit organization serving children, women, and families, has purchased its first building to house its philanthropic programs and retail business. This larger retail space will expand the charity's ability to generate revenue, which represents over 60% of the funding used to bring services to the neediest segments of our area.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assistance League of Sacramento (2528 Yorktown Avenue) has purchased the property located at 2751 Fulton Avenue to house its philanthropic center, administrative offices, and retail business. This community based philanthropic organization serves over 20,000 individuals each year in the Greater Sacramento area.

This permanent home will allow the organization adequate space to operate its eight philanthropic programs, which service local school districts, hospitals, senior residences, and emergency and youth social services. It will also provide administrative headquarters and a permanent home for its resale retail business.

Assistance League Thrift Shop has operated from three leased locations in its 27 years of continuous business operation. This larger retail space will expand the charity's ability to generate revenue, which represents over 60% of the funding used to bring services to the neediest segments of our area. Assistance League provides school clothing for over 5,000 children in four local school districts each year.

Partnering with Wells Fargo Bank, the property will undergo renovation and is not expected to be operational until sometime in 2015. Greg Thomas, senior vice president Cornish Carey, has worked with the organization for over three years to purchase a property in the Arden-Arcade area suitable for both administrative offices and a retail business. Thomas said, "This is an ideal location in the Fulton Avenue corridor. It is close to the schools served by Assistance League. The proximity between the revitalization of Town & Country Village & Mueller Corner (Fulton and Marconi) and Kuni Auto (Fulton and El Camino) will boost Assistance League's ability to provide quality services to those in need."

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Red Bench Entertainment will retell the classic story of the four March sisters in three performances of Little Women. The company will perform the 1800s novel by Louisa May Alcott at the 24th Street Theater/Sierra 2 Center, 2791 24th Street, Sacramento, at 7 p.m. Friday and Saturday, August 15 and 16, and 2 p.m. Sunday, August 17.








dollars every year because of theft, but how much money is lost every year because of breakage? Now I include many things into that one word - breakage because I couldn't think of a better one. When someone drops clothes off a rack and doesn't take the time to pick them up, chances are that piece of clothing could be torn or snagged and won't be sold. A glass is dropped, a lamp is knocked down, food hits the floor, etc. and that business, which often already has a narrow profit margin, can only write off some of the loss: loss from theft and loss

from breakage. I have been talking about those who dump garbage, throw trash away, or those who leave damaged goods in their wake. Picking up a piece of paper that someone else dropped or paper that was blown there by the wind is easy because it stands out like a sore thumb. Many people are leaders and don't even know that they are. They show they care through example and don't mind attacking a problem by doing something about it – simply picking up trash counts. But other people like to think of themselves as leaders as long as nothing needs to be done AND they have been around for a long time. 

Sacramento Resident Among the First Human West Nile Virus Fatalities This Summer

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The first People 50 years of age and older two deaths of the summer due to West Nile virus infection have been confirmed by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH, announced Dr. Ron Chapman, CDPH Director and state public health officer. The first was a senior citizen from Sacramento County. The second was an adult from Shasta County.

"These unfortunate deaths remind us that we must protect ourselves from mosquito bites to prevent West Nile virus and other mosquito born infections," said Chapman. "West Nile virus activity is greatest during the summertime."

West Nile virus is transmitted to humans and animals by the bite of an infected mosquito. The risk of serious illness to most people is low. However, some individuals—fewer than one percent—can develop a serious neurologic illness such as encephalitis or meningitis.

have a higher chance of getting sick and are more likely to develop complications. Recent data also indicate that those with diabetes and/or hypertension are at greatest risk for serious illness.

To date in 2014, West Nile virus has been detected in 36 California counties.

CDPH recommends that individuals prevent exposure to mosquito bites and West Nile virus by practicing the "Three Ds:"

DEET – Apply insect repellent containing DEET, picaradin, oil of lemon eucalyptus or IR3535 according to label instructions. Repellents keep the mosquitoes from biting you. DEET can be used safely on infants and children 2 months of age and older

DAWN AND DUSK -Mosquitoes bite in the early morning and evening so it is important to wear proper clothing and repellent if outside ca.gov

during these times. Make sure that your doors and windows have tight-fitting screens to keep out mosquitoes. Repair or replace screens with tears or holes

DRAIN – Mosquitoes lay their eggs on standing water. Eliminate all sources of standing water on your property including flower pots, old car tires, rain gutters, and pet bowls. If you know of a swimming pool that is not being properly maintained, please contact your local mosquito and vector control agency.

Sacramento County Expresses Opposition to State Delta Plan

Sacramento County Special Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

-This week, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors formally submitted comments challenging the findings of the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) state environmental impact report (EIR) and federal environmental impact statement (EIS). Of significance, the comments expressed the frustrations of many residents with a plan to build twin tunnels and take additional water from the Sacramento Delta.

A recognized expert on water issues and elected representative of Sacramento's Delta communities, Supervisor Don Nottoli expressed, "The BDCP proposes to irreversibly change, and in many instances, permanently destroy the generations-old socioeconomic fabric and physical landscape of the Delta."

"Constructing massive twin tunnels won't produce any more water, but make no mistake, it will leave a legacy of negative impacts on the Delta, its economy, and its people. The BDCP doesn't solve California's water problems and sacrifices the Delta to benefit others. Simply, this is not acceptable, and never will be."

Among the many flaws in the environmental reports, the County noted that there are major negative impacts to the lives of county residents, the local economy, and natural resources in and around the Sacramento River, the Delta itself, and south Sacramento County communities where twin tunnels are slated for a 10-12 year construction project.

The Supervisors cited the following significant impacts that the planning document either inadequately addresses or ignores altogether: Direct/indirect impacts to existing legacy communities and agriculture from long-term construction activities and project operations; Uncertainties surrounding future water project operations and how these operations will impact

water supplies; Impacts to the roadway/transportation network from construction activities; Impacts from the conversion of agricultural land to habitat; Economic and social impacts to the local Delta communities from the long term displacement of businesses and residents; Impacts to Airport operations; and, Impacts from changes to drainage pattern changes resulting from project construction.

Next, federal and state agencies tasked with reviewing comments will evaluate and consider the comments submitted by stakeholders, including, non-governmental organizations, individuals, and governmental entities. It is important to note that given the huge volume of comments submitted, the evaluation process will take several months at best. It is anticipated that a Final Draft document will be prepared following the evaluation process.

Get Back Up



We all face challenges and have to deal with adversity. What should you do when you stumbleand fall? Get back up. Failure only occurs when you quit.

How do babies learn to walk? Their success is far from instantaneous. They fall down after their first attempt. Then they get back up and fall again. This process is repeated hundreds of times. As infants, we all learn to walk by simply getting up one more time than we fall down.

When you fall, there will be no shortage of people attempting to comfort you with an endless list of reasons why it's OK to give up. Don't listen to them! All you need is one reason to get back up. Throughout history, there has never been a single accomplishment by anyone who has remained down.

Getting back up isn't easy. It requires lots of effort. Repeated falls drain your energy. When you feel down and out, you must do whatever it takes to get back on your feet. Failure only occurs when you stay down.

Feed your motivation by maintaining a focus on your goal. Visualize all of the benefits you will accrue once an objective is attained. Imagine how you will feel and act once you have reached your destination. These strategies direct your mind to work non-stop to get you to where you want to be.

Seek help, guidance, and encouragement from those who are where you want to be. You don't have to know them personally. You can read what they write or what others write about them. Look for inspirational stories in the media and online. Keep in mind that regardless of the challenges you may be facing, other people have also been

through them and have found solutions.

Make your steps as small as necessary when getting back up. Maintain a forward focus. Avoid getting caught up in the past. Learn from your mistakes. Don't turn them into anchors that hold you down.

Don't blame anyone else when you fall. Don't feel sorry for yourself. Don't become angry or resentful. Negative emotions such as bitterness weigh you down, making it very difficult to get back up. Don't fixate on what you think you don't have, concentrate on what you do have.

Developing an attitude of gratitude wards off bitterness.

It's never too late to get back up. It doesn't matter how long you have been down or what your age is. Each day is a new beginning filled with unlimited opportunity. So whatever challenges come your way, trip and fall as you may, just get up one more time than you fall, and all will be OK.

BOE Notifies California Retailers of Upcoming Visits

Retailers throughout the state are receiving letters from the California State Board of Equalization (BOE) notifying them about upcoming visits from Statewide Compliance and Outreach Program (SCOP) teams. The visits are intended to educate retailers about properly reporting sales and use tax, increase compliance with tax laws, and maintain outreach efforts to assure taxpayers that the state's tax system is fair and equal for all Californians.

The BOE is mailing letters to 8,539 business owners in the area including Sacramento (95827).

SCOP teams conduct doorto-door, in-person visits in the zip code areas they cover. It is important for retailers to understand that the BOE asks only business-related questions, and does not inquire about personal financial information. Businesses found to be operating without a seller's permit are provided instructions on how to register with the BOE, as well as information about other

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - necessary licenses. Home-based businesses are not visited.

Since 2008, SCOP has visited 489,056 businesses statewide to verify that retailers are registered and to ensure noncompliant businesses do not have an unfair advantage over registered businesses that are reporting their sales and use taxes and/or fees to BOE.

The BOE has found that more than 98 percent of the California businesses are operating with the correct permits. However, noncompliance contributes to more than \$2 billion in uncollected sales and use taxes that make up part of the state's "tax gap" - the difference between the amount of taxes owed and the amount paid, negatively impacting all state taxpayers.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Monday marked the first day of practice for the new season for the Cordova High School varsity and junior varsity football teams. Cordova will host Capital Christian in a scrimmage on Saturday, Aug. 23rd. Both varsity and junior varsity teams will start at 9 a.m.

On Friday, Aug. 29th, Cordova will open its 2014 season with a non-league home opener against Pioneer of Woodland. Three of the Lancers' non-league games will be played at home; McClatchy visits Friday, Sept. 12th, and Johnson stops by Friday, Sept. 19th. Cordova will play at Bella Vista the week after its game against Pioneer and at Foothill of Sacramento on Sept. 26th.

The Case for Clayton Kershaw for MVP

It has been 45 years since a pitcher won the MVP in the National League. Bob Gibson, with his amazing 1968 season featuring a 1.12 ERA, was the last to be honored with the most prestigious award in the senior circuit. Only three times since 1968 have pitchers finished in the top three. In 1969, Tom Seaver was runner-up to Willie McCovey; reliever Mike Marshall, who appeared in 106 games, was third in 1974; and Greg Maddux finished third in 1995.

So, suffice it to say that pitchers haven't received much consideration over the years for NL MVP. But here's why 2014 could be different.

NO CLEAR CANDIDATES

Offense is down across all of baseball this season, and few players have distinguished themselves in the National League. And those that have risen above have also suffered significant injuries that will derail their candidacies. Troy Tulowitzki of Colorado has posted some gaudy numbers this season. But recent injuries have sidelined him, he toils for the worst team in the league, and many voters will consider his stats artificially boosted by playing home games at Coors Field in the thin air of Denver. Paul Goldschmidt - first baseman for the second-worst team in the NL - was putting together another stellar season before a broken hand sidelined him for the remainder of the year. Reigning MVP Andrew McCutchen of Pittsburgh was almost single-handedly willing the Pirates back into the hunt when a broken rib put him on the shelf temporarily. It's likely the center fielder will avoid a stint on the disabled list, but his effectiveness while recovering will be limited.

RAW PITCHING STATS

Despite missing six starts early in the season, there are five significant pitching categories in which the Dodgers' lefthander leads the National League. He's tied for first in wins with 14, and he's alone in first in ERA (1.78), WHIP (0.86), opponents' OBP (.233) and opponents' OPS (.528). For good measure, he also stands alone at the top in complete games (5), K/BB (8.58), K/9 IP (10.76) and fewest pitches per inning (13.8). And sabermetricians love this guy as well. He's tops in the NL in WAR at 5.9 and leads several other categories. Obviously, there is a quarter of the season left to play, and the landscape could change dramatically. But for now, Kershaw is the most valuable player in the NL.

HALO EFFECT

In case you happen to be in the camp that doesn't appreciate bestowing MVP honors on pitchers, consider Kershaw's effect on his team when he doesn't pitch. (It's pretty clear the effect he has when he's on the hill.) Through Aug. 10, manager Don Mattingly has used an average of 2.2 relievers to cover 2+ innings the day before Kershaw starts. In Ker-

shaw's starts, 1.8 relievers cover just over an inning per start. The day after the lefty pitches, it takes three relievers to cover three innings. So, Mattingly isn't reluctant to use his bullpen the day before Kershaw is scheduled, and he has a rested pen the day after.

The Dodgers' lefthander is clearly the best pitcher in the majors now, perhaps the best player in the NL.

JUST WIN

Of course, the most important stat of all is winning. And the Dodgers do that with regularity when Kershaw is on the mound. Los Angeles is 16-3 in his 19 starts, just 51-49 when he others

start. And consider that the "others" include Zack Greinke, Josh Beckett and Hyun-Jin Ryu among others. Not bad company, but they aren't in Kershaw's class.

So why do so many people seeking wealth creation get it wrong, rushing into solutions without first mastering the skills needed? According to Hamilton, it's because we have been taught things about wealth that are not or are no longer true. The first challenge for most is unlearning the five biggest myths of wealth.

1) Myth: You can get wealthy by going into debt to buy assets that will give you positive income so you can no longer have to work for a living.

TRUTH: You've just dug a hole, not a river. All income needs to be managed, which means you need to know how to manage a team and experts who can manage your portfolio of

TRUTH: Success comes from growing teams, not streams: multiple teams of income.

3) Myth: Wealth comes when you sell out: Plan an exit strategy where you can work hard now and earn the money later.

TRUTH: Don't strive to make a pie so you can sell it. Own the bakery so you can bake as many pies as you want, sell some, and keep the rest.

4) Myth: The path to wealth begins by being your own boss and choosing what you do and when you do it.

TRUTH: Wealth comes from not being your own boss, but from choosing who your boss

5) Myth: The hero's journey is the nature of entrepreneurship and comes from putting everything on the line for your big idea. Big risks achieve big rewards.

TRUTH: From climbing Mount Everest to going to the moon, the most heroic journeys are the ones that minimize risk: the ones in which you progress deliberately, testing and measuring each step before you take it to stay on the path to success.
